## **2016 ULM WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES**

### **Q**UICK HITS

- -This is the first Sun Belt Conference game that ULM will play in the 2016-17 season
- -The Warhawks have a team of newcomers in the 2016 season. The team boasts seven newcomers. Two of which are transfers and five are freshman. The ULM returned only five from the 2015 roster.
- -E.J. Oak has been a coach for the Warhawks for 26 year. Before taking on her role as a coach, Oak played four year as an Indian (then the Northeast Louisiana University Indians) from 1982-1986. Oak accumulated 2,208 points in her career and helped her team reach the NCAA tournament in 1982, 83 and 84. In 1984 the team became the first at ULM to make the Final Four.

## IN THE PROS

-Alayshia Hunter, a member of the Warhawks team from 2012-2015, has gone on to compete as a professional athlete. Hunter started her pro career at Eintracht Braunschweig. During her senior year at ULM she average 11 points per game, 5.5 rebounds per game, three blocks per game and was named to the All-Sun Belt Team in 2016.

## **Head to Head**

**Arkansas State** 

The last 10 wins in the series have fallen in favor of the Red Wolves. The longest win streak against Arkansas state for the Warhawks was seven games. That seven game streak spanned from 1983-86. The teams have faced each other dating back to 1983. The teams became conference opponenents in 2006. The Red Wolves lead the way in Jonesboro with a record of 13-5.

The last nine wins in the series have been snagged by the Trogans. The teams first played each other in 1999 and Little Rock holds a 22-3 record over the Warhawks. ULM's last win over Little Rock was in 2012. Two of the three wins that the Warhawks hold were in Monroe.

## **Non-Conference Schedule**

The Warhawks had a total of 11 non-conference schedule games in the 2016 season. The last time that ULM had a winning non-conference schedule was in 2015 with a 6-3 record.

The Warhawks finished the 2016-17 non-conference schedule 3-8. The three wins coming from Centenary, LSUA and Houston Baptist. The Warhawks played Houston Baptist for the first time in school history.

### Vs Houston Baptist (W 77-65)

- -The Warhawks held the Huskies to zero field goals over the final 2:28 of the game. In that final stretch, Houston Baptist put ULM on the free throw line seven times to hand the Warhawks 10 of their final 12 points of the night for the Warhawks first road win of the season.
- -Alexis Collins put up career numbers and led the Warhawks with a game-high 33 total points in the contest. Collins shot 69 percent from the floor (11-of-16) and recorded only one blemish at the line (11-of-12). The junior filled out her stat line with one assist, two steals and two defensive rebounds.
- -ULM held the Huskies to a shooting percentage below 40 percent over the final two quarters of the game. The Warhawks finished the night shooting 44.6 percent (25-of-56) compared to HBU's 39.3 percent shooting (24-of-61).

### Vs Rice (L 50-93)

-Rice outscored ULM in the first guarter 21-7 as the Owls tallied a field goal percentage of 66 percent (10-of-15) in the quarter compared to the Warhawks' 18 percent (3-of-16) in the same frame. That trend continued through the remainder of the contest with final shooting percentages of 61 percent (39-of-64) for the Owls and 29 percent (17-of-58) for the Warhawks.

## Vs McNeese (L 52-78)

- -McNeese shot 53 percent in the opening quarter and jumped out to a 10-point lead after the first 10 minutes, and then extended the advantage when they held ULM to just eight points in the second quarter en route to the 18 point halftime advatage.
- -Two Warhawks finished in double digits, led by Andreanna Jackson's team-high 14 points. Jackson finished the night shooting 6-of-16 from the floor, while the senior also pulled down four rebounds in the contest.
- -Logan Oestreich also finished in double-figures scoring, notching 11 points on 4-of-4 shooting from the floor. The freshman also pulled down a game high of seven rebounds, including five on the defensive glass.

## Vs Ole Miss (L 40-97)

- -Ole Miss started things off with a 24 point run and the Warhawks were unable to make up the difference as the Rebels went on to a 97-40 win.
- -Gabriella Cortez was the only Warhawk to score double digit points, finishing with 16 points on 5-of-9 shooting from the floor. Four of her field goals were three-point shots.

### Vs Northwestern (L 65-67)

- -A late three-pointer by Northwestern in the final 30 seconds was the difference as the host Demons defeated the visiting ULM women's basketball team 67-65 on Sunday afternoon in what was a back-and-forth battle from beginning to end.
- -Both teams had nearly identical nearly identical shooting percentages from the floor (NSU 43.4 percent, ULM 43.3 percent). The Warhawks shot a game-high 60 percent as a team in the second guarter and took a two-point deficit into the locker room (32-30 NSU).
- -ULM had four players score in double digits

### Vs LA Tech (L 53-73)

- -Louisiana Tech put up an eight-point run after holding only a one-point lead over the Warhawks. The Lady Techsters only extended their lead after that as the game went on. Louisiana Tech put up 26 points in the third guarter with a field goal percentage of 56 percent (10-18) compared to the Warhawks 12 points in the frame.
- -Andreanna Jackson was the Warhawks leading scorer with 17 points. Jackson put up 5-9 field goals with three being from behind the arch.

## Vs LSU Alexandria (W 73-61)

- -The Generals cut the scoring deficit to four points via a layup with 2:52 left in the game. The Warhawks defense stepped up and held LSUA scoreless to close the night while going on an 8-0 run to close things out. Six of the final eight points were made at the free throw line by ULM.
- -Three Warhawks landed in double digits: Alexis Collins (11), Carissa Moody (17) and Gabriella Cortez (25) -Although she didn't land in doube digits in points, the senior recorded a double-double with 10 blocks and 15 (5-10) rebounds. Carissa Moody recorded the teams other double-double on the night with 17 points and 10 (1-9)
- rebounds.

## Vs Nicholls (L 54-73)

- -Tied at 14-all, Nicholls State went on a 15-4 run to give the Colonels an 11-point lead in the second quarter. The Warhawks were unable to make up the difference as Nicholls State grew its lead throughout the remainder of the contest.
- -Gabriella Cortez finished with a career-high 31 points and posted the only double-double for the Warhawks with 11 total rebounds. Cortez shot 10-of-14 from the floor, knocking down five three-point baskets. The junior also added three assists to her stat line.
- -Stephanie Ratliff grabbed 13 of ULM's 36 total rebounds as she finished with two offensive and 11 defensive rebounds.
- -ULM outrebounded Nicholls 36-30, and pulled down 28 defensive rebounds as a team.
- -ULM shot 85 percent from the free throw line as the Colonels gave the Warhawks 15 total chances at the line. ULM limited Nicholls at the line with only seven chances.

## **Arkansas State**

**ULM 64, ASU 78** Feb. 13, 2016

Monroe, La. — Arkansas State was able to counter each of ULM's offensive bursts, and the Red Wolves won 78-64 over the Warhawks on Saturday afternoon in Fant-Ewing Coliseum.

This may sound really odd, but we are encouraged what w just saw," head coach Jeff Dow said. "There were times where we could have let it get away from us. There's a reason Arkansas State is undefeated in the Sun Belt and have a 20-3 record."

The Red Wolves (20-3, 14-0 SBC) closed the first guarter on ar 18-5 run after back-to-back layups had given ULM a 6-5 lead The first of those came after Ashley Aune tipped a pass on the press to Aundrea Davis at half-court, who then finished with a bucket from the left side.

Khadija Brown-Haywood's three-pointer at the 3:48 mark of the second quarter gave Arkansas State a 38-18 lead, its largest to that point, but ULM held the Red Wolves off the board for the remainder of the half to trail just 38-25. Brown-Haywood had a game-high 29 points.

We never stopped competing," Dow said. "We had kids in fou trouble, but from an offensive standpoint, the last three quarter we shot 46, 54 and 58 percent. It gets tough when you're struggling, but I was encouraged."

The Warhawks (9-14, 3-11 SBC) posted another 7-0 run at the end of the third guarter that got them within 54-43. Journee Beard got credit for the ending. Her moves on the defensive end forced an errant pass that Alayshia Hunter grabbed and ther nailed a three-pointer in front of the home bench on the ensuing possession.

. Dow was also more than complimentary about his guards' play. "Aundrea has been playing really well of late," he said. "She i finding ways to make plays on both ends of the floor and has been a spark plug defensively. Every now and then she gets ir the paint or knocks down a three.

"Chelsea has been playing the point a little bit as well and she was saddled with four fouls. That affects their minutes and hov effective they can be. For Journee to play 22 minutes and walk away with no turnovers is a positive as well."

ULM will embark on its second four-game road trip of the year, beginning with a 5:30 p.m. Thursday night game at Texas State

## Inside (and beyond) the Box Score

-The 36 points in the paint were ULM's most since having 38 in the win against Troy (Jan. 21).

-The team's 17 assists were its most since having 18 in that Troy contest as well.

-ULM allowed just 26 rebounds, tied for the lowest by an opponent since Little Rock had 26 on Jan. 9.

-The Warhawks were 7-for-12 (58.3 percent) from the field in the fourth quarter. Its best showing was a 10-for-15 (66.7 percent) mark in the third guarter of the season opener.

-Stephanie Ratliff tied a career-high with eight points, last set in the season opener. She was 4-for-4 from the field. Her three blocks tied a career-high she had set twice already on the year.

Daja Chase dished out seven assists. It was more than just a career-high for the sophomore; it was the most by any Warhawk in a game this season.

-Lauren Marker made her only three-point attempt and knocked down both of her free-throws. The five points both set a new personal-best and came in a 2:10 span.

## Vs Grambling (L 54-59)

- -Tied at 48-all with 7:38 to play, Grambling closed the game on an 11-6 run as ULM was able to tally just four points over the final 2:15 of action.
- -Stephanie Ratliff posted the teams only double-double with 16 rebounds and 14 points
- -There were two other Warhawks who posted double digit points in Alexis Collins (14) and Andreanna Jackson (11) -ULM outrebounded Grambling by a 50-39 overall margin, pulling down 32 defensive rebounds (64 percent).

## Vs Arkansas (L 46-92)

- -First road trip of the season
- -Arkansas made its largest advance on 18-4 in the third quarter. The Razorbacks continued to advance their score by as much as 48 befor closing out the game 92-46.
- -Lauren Marker and Stephanie Ratliff played 20 minutes or more with no turnovers.
- -Alexis Collins was the only Warhawk in double digit points as Stephanie Ratliff grabbed 10 rebounds
- -The Warhawks finished the night with 27 turnovers as a team, which turned into 21 Grambling points off those miscues.

## Vs Centenary (W 83-39)

- -Season opener
- -ULM advanced its lead with a 17-0 run that would extend its lead to 18. Centenary was not able to close the gap as the Warhawks advanced their lead to as much as 52.

# Jeff Dow

## Head Coach • Third Season at ULM

Jeff Dow was hired in May 2014 as ULM's sixth women's basketball head

Dow holds an all-time record as a head coach and as an assistant coach of 480-286 (.627) and a record of 245-140 (.636) as a head coach. As a head coach and as a first assistant, Dow has compiled twelve 20-win seasons, seven NCAA tournament appearances, four postseason WNIT appearances and six conference championships. In the eight years just prior to his inaugural season at ULM Dow averaged over 23 wins per season with an overall record as a head coach of 187-57 (.766) and a record of 117-29 (.801) in conference. All told before arriving at ULM Dow averaged over 20 wins per season as a head coach while amassing an overall record of 221-106 (.676).

Dow put forth a solid first impression in his first year in Monroe, leading the Warhawks to their most overall and conference wins since the 2010-11 campaign. This accomplishment came in spite of replacing the top four scorers from the previous two seasons due to graduation. Three of the Warhawk victories came against teams that went on to participate in post-season tournaments. In the final RPI computer rankings ULM finished ahead of schools in the Pac-12, Big East, Mountain West and American Athletic Conference. Statistically the Warhawks finished first in the Sun Belt Conference in free throw attempts per game and offensive rebounding percentage. The Warhawk women would also finish ranked 3rd in the 11team Sun Belt in attendance highlighted by a crowd of over 3500 against in-state rival University of Louisiana Lafayette, a figure that hadn't been reached since February 3, 1994. Senior post Sharnice Brooks garnered second team all-Sun Belt honors by racking up more points and rebounds in her senior year alone than she had in her first three years combined.

Off the floor during the 2014-15 school year the Warhawk program thrived academically as eight players were either named to ULM's Dean's List (>3.5 GPA), the Sun Belt Conference's Commissioner's List (>3.5 GPA) or the Sun Belt's Academic Honor Roll (3.0-3.49 GPA).

Dow's second year at ULM featured the first winning record against nonconference opponents for the program since the 2009-10 season. The Warhawks nearly pulled off an epic win but fell in overtime on the road to SEC foe Louisiana State. The Warhawks would later go on to defeat Sun Belt Conference champion Troy. For the second consecutive year a senior post would be named second team all-Sun Belt as Alayshia Hunter received the honor after finishing fifth in the Sun Belt in scoring and field goal percentage, sixth in rebounding and seventh in blocked shots.

Academically the Warhawks fared well again as seven players were named to ULM's Dean's List, the Sun Belt Conference's Commissioner's List or the Sun Belt's Academic Honor Roll. Senior point guard Aundrea Davis was named to ULM's President's List for achieving a 4.0 GPA for the spring 2016 semester.

Prior to beginning his tenure at ULM he was also one of the most successful coaches in Indiana University of Pennsylvania (IUP) history, compiling a five-year record of 108-40 (.729) from 2008-13 at the helm to go along with a record of 65-21 (.756) in conference. Dow guided the Crimson Hawks to the NCAA Tournament three times and won the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) championship in 2009. Dow coached the Crimson Hawks to a No. 7 ranking in the WBCA Coaches Poll in 2008-09. He also got them to No. 19 in 2009-10, No. 17 in 2011-12 and No. 12 in 2012-13.

In the postseason, Dow garnered first round victories in the 2009, 2012 and 2013 NCAA Division II tournaments. He was also the first head coach in school history to win 20 games in his debut season and to win 10 or more games in the PSAC West Division in five consecutive seasons. During his tenure at IUP Dow recruited and/or coached three players that were named All-Americans in Jahzinga Tracey, Sarah Pastorek and Lindsay Stamp. Off the court, Dow had a combined 63 student-athletes earn IUP Dean's List honors and 33 were named PSAC Scholar Athletes.

Dow went to IUP from Anderson University (S.C.) where he tallied a record of 79-17 (.822) and his teams earned trips to the NCAA East Region tournament each season. In his three years at the helm (2005-08), Dow was one of just eight head coaches to lead his program to at least one NCAA Division II tournament victory in three consecutive years. He led Anderson to two Conference Carolinas regular season titles and one postseason championship in 2005-06. His 2005-06 squad led all NCAA Division II schools in scoring at 83.5 points per game. Dow held an astounding 52-8 (.867) record in conference play and also posted a 40-2 home record in three seasons. While at Anderson Dow recruited and/or coached three players that were named All-Americans in LaShonda Chiles, Deidra Langston and

In his final season at Anderson in 2007-08, the program finished in the top-10 in the country in win-loss percentage, scoring defense, rebound margin and scoring margin and was ranked as high as No. 12 in the WBCA national poll. For his team's accomplishments, Dow was selected the Conference Carolinas Coach of the Year. In his first two seasons Dow's Anderson squads were ranked 13th and 17th respectively in the WBCA national poll.

Prior to Anderson, Dow held the first assistant position at Colorado State (2002-05), Santa Clara (2000-02), UC-Irvine (1996-99) and New Mexico State (1992-96). Collectively during his time at those four universities they had an overall record of 218-134 (.619) and a combined conference record 122-65 (.652). Over the course of those twelve seasons Dow's teams made five appearances in the NCAA or postseason WNIT tournament and won two regular season conference championships. During his tenure at NMSU as the post coach Dow coached 3-time Big West Conference Player of the Year, 1995-96 All-American and former WNBA player, Anita Maxwell. The 11-4 record that UCI posted in Big West Conference play in 1997-98 is the most wins that the program has achieved over the past twenty one seasons.

Dow's first head coaching job came at the age of 24 at Texas A&M University-Kingsville in 1990-91. His team was picked to finish last in the preseason poll in his first year, but Dow propelled them to a third-place showing and reached the semifinals of the Lone Star Conference Tournament. As the Lady Javelinas coach Dow recruited and/or coached Patricia Rivers and Karen Weiss who were named WBCA All-Americans under Dow and were later inducted into the university's athletics hall of fame.

Dow started his career as a graduate assistant at the University of Oregon in 1989-90. He earned a Bachelor's degree in psychology and physical education in 1988 and his Master's in physical education in 1991 from


