A-State is facing its third consecutive Sun Belt Conference West Division opponent after most recently falling at Louisiana and Texas State by a combined nine points. It will carry a 3-6 overall mark into the contest, needing a win in each of its final three regular-season games to secure at least a .500 record for the 10th consecutive season. South Alabama also enters the game having dropped its last four contests and holding a 3-6 overall record. Although the Jaguars are just 2-4 in Sun Belt play, they currently stand in second place in the West Division.

HEAD COACH BLAKE ANDERSON: Blake Anderson, a 19-year coaching veteran at the NCAA FBS level who also coached in an NJCAA National Championship game, was named the Red Wolves' 30th all-time head coach on Dec. 19, 2013. Anderson led the Red Wolves to Sun Belt Conference championships in 2015 and 2016, as well as six consecutive winning seasons and six bowl-game appearances (2019 and 2017 Camellia Bowl, 2018 Arizona Bowl, 2016 Cure Bowl, 2015 New Orleans Bowl, 2014 GoDaddy Bowl) during his first six years leading the program. Under his direction, the Red Wolves have set 12 new single-season records, including average yards total offense (494.8 ypg in 2017), total offense (6,174 yards in 2014) and points scored (520 in 2015). Following the 2019 season, Anderson received the Capital One Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award and was named the Grant Teaff Coach of the Year, presented annually by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.

FAST START: Out of 30 all-time head coaches at Arkansas State, Blake Anderson became one of just four to win at least seven games in his first season (2014) at the school. The other head coaches to win at least seven games in their first season as head coach at A-State were Bryan Harsin (2013), Gus Malzahn (2012) and Hugh Freeze (2011).

SEVEN YEARS RUNNING: Blake Anderson is the only head coach in Arkansas State history to win 50 or more games over his first seven years at the school. Additionally, he is one of just three head coaches at A-State to ever direct the program to at least 50 wins in 85 or fewer games -- Bennie Ellender won 52 times over his 76 total games between 1963-70, and Bill Davidson collected his 50th victory in 82 games from 1971-78.

SUSTAINED SUCCESS: Head coach **Blake Anderson** is one of 13 active FBS coaches who have won 50 games all at the same school. Gary Patterson heads the list with 173 career victories at TCU.

50 WIN CLUB: Blake Anderson collected his 50th career victory as A-State's head coach with the Red Wolves' 59-52 victory over Georgia State on Oct. 15, making him one of four head coaches in school history to win 50 games at the school. He joined Larry Lacewell (1979-89), Bill Davidson (1971-78) and Bennie Ellender (1963-70). Anderson needs one more victory to tie Davidson for the third most wins in school history out of the program's 30 all-time head coaches.

DOUBLE DIGITS: Thirty-nine (39) of the Red Wolves' 50 wins under head coach **Blake Anderson** have come by 10 or more points. At the same time, six of their 11 single-digit victories under Anderson have been posted over the Red Wolves' last 14 outings dating back to last season. Last year, A-State collected the program's most single-digit wins (5) in one year since the 1982 season when it also had five. Arkansas State has outscored its opponents 2,109-1,080 in the 50 wins under Anderson for a 20.6-point average scoring difference.

CLIMBING THE LADDER: Blake Anderson has led the Red Wolves to a pair of Sun Belt titles and collected 37 league wins along the way, which are the second most ever by any of the conference's all-time head coaches.

CHANGE OF PLANS: Arkansas State didn't announce Central Arkansas and Kansas State as additions to its 2020 schedule until Aug. 7 and 12, respectively. The Red Wolves were originally slated to play a home game against Howard on Sept. 12 and a road game at Michigan on Sept. 19 before the two contests were canceled. A-State's original schedule called for it to alternate road and home games throughout the regular season for the first time in school history.

A-STATE ADDS UIW TO 2020 SCHEDULE: The Arkansas State Athletics Department announced last week that a December 12 home game against the University of the Incarnate Word has been added to the football team's 2020 schedule and also that the Red Wolves' Sun Belt Conference contest against ULM was rescheduled for Dec. 5. . . The addition of UIW gives A-State a pair of December games at Centennial Bank Stadium and three consecutive home contests to conclude its regular-season competition. As of now, the Red Wolves are slated to host South Alabama on Nov. 28, ULM on Dec. 5 and UIW on Dec. 12 . . . The UIW contest replaced A-State's game against Tulsa, which was postponed earlier this year and unable to be rescheduled during the 2020 season. The Red Wolves' game against the Warhawks was previously announced for Dec. 12, but moved up a week to accommodate Sun Belt Conference scheduling . . . Arkansas State will play Southland Conference-member UIW for the first time in school history. The outing is currently the Cardinals only game this fall, but they have a six-game spring schedule slated to begin Feb. 20 against Sam Houston State.

THE ARKANSAS STATE-SOUTH ALABAMA SERIES:

Arkansas State holds a 6-2 all-time record against South Alabama in the Sun Belt Conference series that dates back to just 2012. Five of the eight meetings have been decided by 10 points or less, including last season when the Jaguars won 34-30 in Mobile.

A-STATE vs THE SUN BELT: Arkansas State has won 57 of its last 77 Sun Belt Conference games (.740 winning percentage) to run its all-time record in the league to 89-56. The Red Wolves hold their most all-time victories against ULM with 27. A-State has defeated every team in the conference since the football league was formed in 2001. Along with ULM and Louisiana, A-State is one of three teams that have been a part of the conference

ence since its inaugural football season.

DOWN THE STRETCH: Arkansas State is set to play its final three regular-season games at home for the first time since 1998. Additionally, A-State will play two regular-season games in the month of December for the first time in school history and its Dec. 12 game versus UIW will be the latest date the Red Wolves have ever played a regular-season game.

HOME SWEET HOME: Arkansas State has strung together 15 consecutive years (2005-19) with a winning record at Centennial Bank Stadium dating back to 2005. The Red Wolves are now 70-18 (.795 winning percentage) since the 2005 season. The Red Wolves actual on-field record all-time at Centennial Bank Stadium is 162-81-1 since it opened in 1974. A-State's six home wins in 2011 were its most since 1985. The 2011 season also marked the last time the Red Wolves went undefeated at Centennial Bank Stadium.

ON THIS DATE: Arkansas State holds an unblemished 4-0 record all-time when playing on Nov. 28. The Red Wolves claimed their first victory on the date in 1946 with a 30-12 home win over Central Arkansas. They most recently played on Nov. 28 in 2015, defeating New Mexico State in Las Cruces by a 52-28 score. A-State defeated Jackson State 35-32 on Nov. 28, 1987, in the FCS (I-AA) playoffs, while also knocking off North Texas 30-26 at home in 2009.

RED WOLVES NOVEMBER: Dating back to the 2011 season, Arkansas State holds a 28-8 record over its last 36 games played in the month of November. The Red Wolves had won nine consecutive games in the month before dropping its 2019 regular-season finale against South Alabama.

AN A-STATE VICTORY WOULD . . . : improve its record to 29-8 over its last 37 games played in the month of November . . . improve its home record versus South Alabama to 5-0 and run its all-time record against the Jaguars to 7-2 . . . guarantee the Red Wolves at least a .500 record at Centennial Bank Stadium for the 16th consecutive season . . . move Blake Anderson into a tie with Bill Davidson for the third most all-time victories by an A-State head coach.

FOR STARTERS: Twenty-two (22) A-State players made their first career start with the Red Wolves over the team's first nine games of the season. The total includes nine offensive and 13 defensive players.

NON-CONFERENCE RECAP: With its 50-27 win over UCA on Oct. 10, A-State improved to 2-1 in non-conference games. In the process, the Red Wolves secured at least a .500 non-conference record for the third consecutive season, fourth time under head coach **Blake Anderson** and sixth time over the last 10 seasons, but just the seventh time since to FBS status in 1992 (1995, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2018, 2019, 2020). A-State posted a winning non-conference record (3-1) in 2018 for the first time since 1995 (3-2).

THREE ROAD OUTINGS START 2020 SEASON: Arkansas State played its first three games on the road this season for the first time since 1999. Records also indicate that in addition to 1999, the 2020 season marks just the second time in school history that A-State played its first three games on the road. The Red Wolves didn't play their first home game until Oct. 10, which was the latest date for an A-State home opener since Oct. 14, 1950.

THE NOMINEES ARE...: As selected by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA), the four nominees for the Reveal Suits National Team of the Week included Arkansas State after the Red Wolves defeated Kansas State 35-31 in Manhattan on Sept. 12. Fellow Sun Belt member Louisiana earned the weekly award after defeating No. 23 lowa State 31-14 in Ames.

POWER PLAY: With its 35-31 road win over Kansas State, the Red Wolves collected their first win over a Power 5 conference opponent since defeating Texas A&M 18-14 in 2008. It also marked their second win over a Power 5 team since moving to FBS status in 1992. In the process, A-State handed Kansas State its first defeat in a home opener since a loss to North Dakota State in 2013. The Red Wolves' victory also marked just the eighth

time an opponent had defeated K-State over the Wildcats last 84 regular-season non-conference home games.

PRESEASON ALL-SUN BELT: Including three firstteam and three second-team selections, A-State placed six players on the Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference Team. Representing the Red Wolves on the first team were senior offensive lineman Jarrett Horst, senior wide receiver Jonathan Adams Jr. and junior kicker Blake Grupe. A-State's second-team choices included senior offensive lineman Jacob Still, senior defensive lineman Forrest Merrill and junior safety Antonio Fletcher. The Red Wolves' six selections tied Coastal Carolina for the third most in the conference, while Appalachian State placed a league-high 10 different players on the preseason team. Louisiana followed with nine players appearing on the team and 10 total selections.

BOWL ELIGIBLE: Arkansas State has obtained bowl eligibility status each of the previous nine years (2011-19) and 12 times over the previous 15 seasons. Arkansas State has become bowl eligible in 10 games or less each of those seasons. Since moving to FBS status in 1992, the earliest A-State ever became bowl eligible was in 2011 when it was 6-2 through eight games.

BOWL STREAK: Arkansas State has made a school-record nine consecutive bowl-game appearances (2011-19), which is the third longest streak in the Group of 5 and ranks 14th in the nation among all FBS programs.

DECADE BY DECADE: The Red Wolves won 79 games from 2010-19, which were the most in a decade in a program history. Five of A-State's all-time 12 conference titles also came during the 2010s. The Red Wolves .617 winning percentage (79-49) last decade was the second highest for a decade in program history. Arkansas State had a .627 winning percentage (66-39-1) from 1970-79, including two 11-0 seasons (1970-75). The program's third best winning percentage (.609) for a single decade came from 1960-69 (54-34-4). A-State had nine winning seasons last decade, by far the most for a decade in program history. The previous record for winning seasons in a decade was six in the 1960s, 1970s and 1980s.

NINE STRAIGHT: Arkansas State has secured a winning record in a school-record nine consecutive seasons (2011-19). The next longest streak was six straight seasons from 1912-17. The Red Wolves piled up 75 victories from 2011-19 for its most over a nine-year span in the program's 106-

year history.

ELITE COMPANY: Arkansas State is one of just four teams in the nation to win at least five conference titles and appear in nine bowl games since 2011, joining Alabama, Clemson and Oklahoma. The Red Wolves won the Sun Belt title in 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015 and 2016 and hold the 14th longest active streak in the nation for bowl game appearances with nine.

106TH SEASON: Arkansas State kicked off its 106th season of football Sept. 5 against Memphis at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium. A-State holds a 484-498-37 record since the inaugural season and has played in 17 bowl games. A-State did not field a team from 1942-44 due to World War II. Arkansas State also didn't have a team in 1918 as World War I was ending.

SUN BELT CHAMPS (5 of 9): The Red Wolves most recently won back-to-back Sun Belt titles in 2015 and 2016, compiling a 15-1 league record over that span. A-State also won the league title 2011-13, making it one of just two programs in league history with at least five SBC titles. The other is Troy (2017, 2010, 2009, 2007, 2006).

400-PLUS: Arkansas State has hit the 400-yard to-

tal offense mark 59 times over its last 86 games (69 percent) since 2014, which was *Blake Anderson*'s first season as head coach. The Red Wolves have posted 400 or more yards total offense in 23 of their last 29 games.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD: The Red Wolves have posted at least 30 points in 74 of their last 115 regular-season games (64 percent) dating back to the 2011 season. The Red Wolves have won 58 of their last 68 games (85 percent) when scoring at least 30 points.

RACKING UP THE YARDS: Arkansas State recorded a season-high 654 yards of total offense last week at Texas State for the eighth most yards in school history for a single game. The Red Wolves went over 600 yards in a game for the second time this season, raising their season average to 478.2 yards per game that ranks as the second highest in school history.

RECORD BREAKERS: During the Arkansas State-Georgia State game that saw the two teams combine for the most points (111) in Centennial Bank Stadium history and tie the fifth most in Sun Belt history, the Red Wolves put up passing numbers that ranked among the best in both A-State and Sun Belt history. BUSTING LOOSE: True freshman running back Lincoln Pare has shown the ability to come up with explosive plays out of the backfield this season, recording the two longest runs of the season for the Red Wolves and averaging a team-best 6.2 yards per carry. Pare scored on a 48-yard touchdown run against Appalachian State, while also posting a 58-yard rush against Kansas State that is the third longest play of the year (rush or pass) by the Red Wolves.

OVER 1,000: Senior running back **Jamal Jones** went over 1,000 career rushing yards during A-State's game last week at Texas State after producing his first career 100-yard game. He finished

the outing with 106 yards on the ground and a touchdown, giving the Red Wolves a 100-yard rusher for the second consecutive game.

ABOVE AVERAGE: Sophomore wide receiver **Jefferson Foreman** recorded a career-high 148 receiving yards against Texas State last week, but even more impressive was that he did it on just three receptions to give him a school-record 49.3 yards per reception.

HITTING THE CENTURY MARK: Freshman running back Lincoln Pare not only ran for a career-high 121 yards against Louisiana on Nov. 7, it marked the first time an A-State player hit the 100-yard rushing mark in since Marcel Murray recorded 175 yards against ULM on Nov. 2 of last season.

TOUCHDOWN STRIKE: Junior quarterback **Logan Bonner** has thrown at least one touchdown pass in six games this season and in nine of 13 career games as a starter, including eight outings with multiple touchdown passes. During his 12 starts

since 2019, he has posted 23 touchdown passes and has 24 for his career. He has completed at least one touchdown pass to 10 different receivers, including Omar Bayless (7), Jonathan Adams (5), Kirk Merritt (3), Dahu Green (3), Brandon Bowling (2), TW Ayers (1), Corey Rucker (1), Giles Amos (1) Reed Tyler (1) and Christian Booker (1).

TOUCHDOWN STRIKE (PART II): Including seven of the last eight games this season, sophomore quarterback Layne Hatcher has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 17 of 20 career games. Additionally, he has thrown at least two touchdowns in 13 outings and has 41 career touchdown strikes, which are the sixth most in school history. He has thrown at least one touchdown to nine different receivers, including Omar Bayless (11), Jonathan Adams (10), Kirk Merritt (9), Brandon Bowling (5), Dahu Green (2), Lincoln Pare (1), Giles Amos (1), Jefferson Foreman (1) and Reed Tyler (1).

TAG TEAM: Through seven games, the A-State quarterbacks combo of Logan Bonner and Layne Hatcher is averaging 342.9 passing yards per game that would be the fifth highest average of any single quarterback in the nation. They have also combined for 27 passing touchdowns that would be the second highest total in the country. Between the two of them, they have 555 career completions for a combined 7,335 yards and 66 touchdowns.

SPREADING THE WEALTH: A-State has 18 players who have recorded at least one reception this season. Through nine games, that is already three more players who caught a pass for the Red Wolves than they had for all of last season. The Red Wolves have seen at least seven players catch a pass in every game this season and at least nine post a reception in six of nine outings, including a season-high 10 against Kansas State, Coastal Carolina and Appalachian State. A-State has 10 players with at least five catches this year, while it had eight players with at least five for all of last season.

ADAMS EARNS SECOND SBC WEEKLY HONOR: Senior wide receiver Jonathan Adams Jr. was tabbed the Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Week for the second time this season on Monday, Oct. 19. Also named the league's offensive player of the week on Sept. 14, Adams tied the school record for receptions in a game with 15 catches for a career-high 177 yards and two touchdowns during the Red Wolves' 59-52 victory over Georgia State last Saturday.

ON A ROLL: Senior wide receiver Jonathan Adams Jr. has posted at least five catches in each of A-State's first nine games and his 7.8 receptions (70 total) per game ranks ninth in the nation. Dating back to the 2017 season, the Jonesboro, Ark., native has caught multiple passes in 24 consecutive games. Adams posted 15 receptions against Georgia State that tied J.D. McKissic (2013 at Missouri) for the school record. He has 157 career receptions that are the fifth most in school history.

IN THE NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT: Biletnikoff Award Watch List member Jonathan Adams Jr. put together one of his best career games on a huge stage during the Red Wolves' 35-31 win at Kansas State. He was catapulted into the national spotlight, garnering interviews from media members such as Reggie Bush with FOX and multiple national awards. Following his performance that included eight catches for 98 yards and a career-high three touchdowns, he was named the national Player of the Week by the Maxwell Award and 247Sports and Offensive Player of the Week by Athlon Sports and the Frisco Bowl. He was also tabbed the Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Week.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

A LOSS ON THE PLAY: Dating back to the 2015 season, the Red Wolves have posted at least five stops behind the line of scrimmage in 55 of their last 64 games. A-State has ranked among the top 40 teams in the nation four of the last six seasons (2015-20) in tackles for loss.

IMPRESSIVE FIRST START: Making his first career start at A-State on the defensive side of the ball, defensive end TW Ayers posted a career-high 10 tackles, which also included a career-best 1.5 tackles for loss and a sack against Louisiana on Nov. 7. Ayers has posted at least one sack in three of the last four games and his 4.0 total for the entire year are tied for the

ninth most in the Sun Belt Conference.

THE NATION'S LEADER: Senior linebacker **Justin Rice** has recorded 16.0 tackles for loss this season that are the most in the country. He has posted at least one stop behind the line of scrimmage in six games and 2.0 or more in five outings. Rice also has 7.0 sacks on the year that rank second in the Sun Belt Conference, while his 7.3 tackles per game is the 10th best average in the league.

NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior line-backer Justin Rice was named the Walter Camp FBS Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 11 after recording 12 tackles, 4.0 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks during A-State's 50-27 win over Central Arkansas. Rice, who posted career-best totals for both tackles for loss and sacks, is the first A-State player to ever be named a Walter Camp national player of the week.

DEFENSIVE STAND: Arkansas State limited Kansas State to 374 yards total offense (5.4 yards per play) and 91 rushing yards (2.3 yards per attempt). The last time A-State held a Power 5 conference opponent to less than 374 yards total offense was Missouri in 2015, when the Tigers posted 288 yards. K-State's rushing output was the lowest by an A-State opponent from a Power 5 conference since at least 2000.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

HANSON EARNS SBC WEEKLY HONOR: Redshirt freshman punter Ryan Hanson was named the Sun Belt Conference Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 12 after posting new season-best numbers for punts (5), yards (260), average (52.0), punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line (3) and longest punt (69 yards) during A-State's victory over Central Arkansas. His 52.0 average per attempt was the best by a Sun Belt player this season and ranked as the fifth best in school history for a single game.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Junior kicker **Blake Grupe** was named the Sun Belt Conference Special Teams Player of the Week after connecting on his only field goal try and converting all three of his extra point attempts to finish the Red Wolves' season opener at Memphis with six points. Grupe earned the recognition for the third time of his career, also collecting the honor twice last season as a sophomore.

KICKOFF RETURNS: Junior wide receiver **Roshauud Paul** has posted 23 kickoff returns for 544 yards, giving him a 23.7 average per return that ranks as the 28th highest in the country and second best in the Sun Belt Conference. Paul's top return this season covered 45 yards at Kansas State. The Red Wolves top kick returner last season, Kirk Merritt, finished the season with 415 yards and a 27.7 average per return that ranked as the fourth highest in school history.

Sept. 5, 2020 | Liberty Bowl: 4,537 | Memphis 37, A-State 24



MEMPHIS, Tenn. (9/5/20) - A - In the 2020 season opener, Arkansas State dropped a tough 37-24 decision at Memphis at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium.

A one-score contest through two and a half quarters, Memphis (1-0) scored twice in the third to pull away for a three-score lead, although A-State (0-1) made a late push to cut it to 13 with under five minutes to go.

"We had a few opportunities to make it interesting and just missed those really good chances — we had an opportunity to tie it up and we let them off the hook a couple of times," head coach Blake Anderson said. "We really did not tackle well at all and have to do a better job of wrapping up. There were some miscommunications defensively, which we thought could be a concern with as many new bodies as we have there. Offensively, we didn't match up great against how big they were up front."

The Red Wolves tallied 424 yards on offense, with 299 coming in the passing game in a combined performance from Logan Bonner (14-of-23, 133 yards and one touchdown) and Layne Hatcher (13-of-20, 166 yards). Dahu Green hauled in five passes for a career-high 99 yards to lead A-State receivers. Jamal Jones led all A-State rushers with 64 yards on 15 carries. Lincoln Pare also racked up 33 yards on just five carries in his collegiate debut.

Memphis racked up 502 yards of total offense, including 275 through the air from Brady White, who completed 26 of 36 passes and tossed four touchdowns. Rodrigues Clark was the game's leading rusher, churning out 105 yards on 20 carries with a score.

Defensively, A-State was led by Jarius Reimonenq, who posted a career-best night with 11 tackles (2 for loss). The A-State defense also record-

ed at least 5.0 tackles for loss for the 49th time over the last 56 games. Memphis was led by Quindell Johnson's eight tackles, while Xavier Cullens and Sylvonta Oliver each grabbed an interception.

In the game's opening possession, Bonner led the Red Wolves on a 12-play, 75-yard drive that set up a one-yard score by Ryan Graham. The Tigers then responded with a 12-play drive on their first possession, with White finding Sean Dykes from 12 yards out. Dykes was the game's top receiver, hauling in 10 passes for 137 yards and a pair of touchdowns on the night.

A-State then took a 14-7 lead late in the first, when Isaiah Azubuike scored his first career touchdown on a one-yard score to cap off an 84-yard drive. Memphis evened things up on the ensuing drive when Clark scampered 14 yards for the score.

The Tigers scored again with 24 seconds left in the first half when White connected with Calvin Austin for a nine-yard touchdown pass in the corner of the end zone. That play capped off a nine-play, 80-yard drive that took under two minutes to set up the go-ahead score and gave Memphis a 21-14 halftime lead.

On the third play of the second half, Detravion Green picked off a White pass to give A-State prime field position inside the Memphis 30. That set up a 28-yard field goal by Blake Grupe to cut the deficit to 21-17 with 11:05 left in the third.

Memphis then took advantage of a short field on an A-State onside kick attempt, with White tossing an eight-yard strike to Damonte Coxie to make it 27-17. On A-State's next possession, the Tigers recovered a fumble near midfield and scored six plays later when White found Dykes for a seven-yard score to make it a 34-17 Memphis advantage going into the fourth quarter.

The Tigers added three more to open the fourth with a 26-yard field goal by Riley Patterson to make it 37-17 with 11:43 to go. A-State broke the scoring drought with a 12-play, 84-yard drive capped off by a one-yard strike from Bonner to TW Ayers with 7:42 to go to make it 37-24. That score was the first of Ayers' career, while also being the first catch of his career.

"I felt like we could've made it a game in the second half, there was just no momentum going our way and they controlled the clock and the line of scrimmage," Anderson said. "I'd have liked to see us score right there at the end and put the onside team out there and see what happens. This week is going to be big for us. We have to get better. I thought we played hard, you just didn't see that huge burst we've seen in the past. Memphis is a good team and they hardly made any mistakes all night."

Sept. 12, 2020 | Snyder Stadium: 11,041 | A-State 35, Kansas State 31



MANHATTAN, Kan. (9/12/20) – In front of a national broadcast audience, Arkansas State delivered a statement win at Bill Snyder Family Stadium, defeating Kansas State 35-31 behind a career-high three touchdown grabs by Jonathan Adams, Jr.

A-State (1-1) held the Wildcats (0-1) to just 91 yards on the ground and committed just four penalties in the contest. The Red Wolves also overcame a pair of turnovers and held K-State to 1 of 11 on third down in the victory, which was the program's first over a Power 5 conference foe since defeating Texas A&M 18-14 in College Station in 2008 – the second for A-State since moving to FBS status in 1992.

"It was fun, but not surprising," head coach Blake Anderson said. "We believed all week we could win this game. We didn't play great and still won it, they just kept believing and kept playing. I thought we were competitive in every phase – not perfect, but competitive. Guys stepped up all over our defense and made plays today."

Logan Bonner and Layne Hatcher split quarterbacking duties again for the Scarlet and Black, with both tossing a pair of scores. Bonner completed 17 of 28 passes for 204 yards, while Hatcher was 6-of-8 for 61 yards, but came through in the clutch by tossing the game-winner to Adams with 38 seconds to go. Adams caught eight passes for 98 yards, while Rashauud Paul racked up 77 yards on four catches.

Jamal Jones led all rushers with a career-high 95 yards on just 16 carries for a 5.9-yard average. Lincoln Pare was right behind him with 65 yards on four carries with a long of 58.

Defensively, Elery Alexander and Jaden Harris tallied nine tackles apiece, while Fred Hervey and TW Ayers each notched a sack.

For Kansas State, Skylar Thompson completed 17 of 29 passes for 259 yards and two scores. Chabastin Taylor led the Wildcats with 98 yards on four grabs.

The Wildcats struck first on their opening drive after an A-State three-and-out, with Thompson finding Phillip Brooks for a 17-yard strike. A-State responded with a scoring drive on the next possession when Bonner connected with Adams from two yards out to even it up at 7-all with under 10 minutes left in the first.

Kansas State then scored 14 unanswered on a pair of seven-play drives. After

an interception by Will Jones II on the A-State 45 and a strong goal-line defense by the Red Wolves, Deuce Vaughn plunged the ball over the goal line for a three-yard score with 13:29 to go in the half. Thompson then tossed his second touchdown pass of the day, connecting with Briley Moore for a seven-yard score to cap off a 92-yard drive.

A-State cut the deficit with the final score of the first half at the 6:50 mark when Jeff Foreman fired a strike on a double-pass play to Paul, who waltzed into the endzone untouched for a 48-yard score. K-State held a 21-14 lead at the break.

After a 54-yard Kansas State punt placed the Red Wolves on their own 23 with under five minutes left in the third, Hatcher piloted the A-State offense on a 77-yard drive that was highlighted by a tremendous 58-yard dash by Pare that put the Scarlet and Black inside the red zone at the K-State 14. A one-yard rush and then five-yard offside penalty moved the Red Wolves to the Kansas State 8-yard mark, where Hatcher then found Giles Amos on a short pass up the middle to tie up the contest at 21.

A Kansas State drive ended on a missed 47-yard field goal, handing possession over to the Red Wolves on their own 29 with 14:49 to go. With a surgeon's precision, Bonner led the A-State offense on a remarkable drive. Facing a 4th-and-5 on the Kansas State 34, Ryan Hanson fired a deep pass to Adams that fell incomplete, but a pass interference call gave the Red Wolves a fresh set of downs on the 22. On the next play, A-State dug into its back of tricks for a double-reverse pass from Paul to Bonner, who skied for the catch at the 5. Two plays later, Bonner found Adams for a one-handed grab to put A-State ahead 28-21 with 11:49 left.

The Wildcats evened things up at 28-all on the next drive, capping off a 10-play, 55-yard drive that ate up over five minutes of game time with a 5-yard rush by Harry Trotter with 6:35 remaining. Kansas State then moved ahead by three when Blake Lynch drilled a 35-yard field goal with 2:31 to go after a three-and-out by the Red Wolves.

Hatcher then trotted onto the field with A-State needing three to tie and a touchdown for the lead. The Little Rock native led the offense on a well-executed two-minute drill that started off with three rushes by Jones for 32 yards, followed by a 21-yard pass to Brandon Bowling that put the Red Wolves at the 12 with a fresh set of downs.

Two plays later, after Hatcher fell on a loose ball for a five-yard loss, it was Adams who found pay dirt for the third time in the ballgame, giving the Red Wolves a 35-31 lead with 38 seconds left.

The Wildcats took over on their own 37, looking to escape with the win, but that effort would be stopped short by the Red Wolves defense just past the 50, handing A-State its first victory over a Power 5 opponent since 2008.

Oct. 3, 2020 | Brooks Stadium: 5,000 | Coastal Carolina 52, A-State 23



CONWAY, S.C. (10/3/20) – Arkansas State dropped a 52-23 decision to Coastal Carolina at Brooks, S.C. in both team's Sun Belt Conference opener.

A-State (1-2) held the ball for just over 18-and-a-half minutes in the contest, while the Chanticleers (3-0) took advantage of long scoring drives to earn the win, holding the ball for over 41 minutes in the contest.

"We were concerned all week coming into this game about what I though their offense was capable of in terms of keeping us of balance and the quarterback's ability to throw the ball," head coach Blake Anderson said. "I think (Coastal Carolina coach Jamey Chadwell) does a good job with their system. We have to give them a lot of respect, we knew they had the ability to do what they did today. Obviously, I expected us to play better defensively. I felt like we had some mismatches in the back end that we could exploit with our offense, but we didn't run the ball well at all today and it made us really one-dimensional. We were really poor on third down on both sides of the ball. They were almost in a 60 percent conversion rate while we were in the thirties and that is not typical of our offense by any means and our defense couldn't find a way to get them off the field."

A-State's quarterbacks combined for 28-of-44 passing for 349 yards and three touchdowns. Layne Hatcher completed 12-of-23 for 184 yards and a score while Logan Bonner was 16-of-21 for 165 yards and two touchdowns. Of the Red Wolves' 385 total yards, 349 came through the air. Brandon Bowling was the game's top receiver, hauling in seven catches for 115 yards and two scores. Jonathan Adams, Jr. grabbed six passes

Lincoln Pare was the leading rusher for the Scarlet and Black with 18 yards on six carries. Defensively, Elery Alexander tallied a game-high 10 tackles, while Anthony Switzer grabbed an interception in the third quarter.

In 80 plays, Coastal Carolina racked up 539 yards of offense (322 passing, 217 rushing) with Grayson McCall completing 20 of his 29 passes for 322 yards and four scores. Jaivon Heiligh was his top target, as the wideout grabbed seven catches for 93 yards. CJ Marable led on the ground with 63 yards on 15 carries.

A-State struck first with 5:38 left in the opening quarter when Bonner hit Dahu Green on a 33-yard pass to put the Red Wolves ahead 7-0. On the next play from scrimmage, the Chanticleers evened it up on a 72-yard pass from McCall to Isaiah Likely at the 5:26 mark.


About three minutes later, Bonner connected on a scoring pass again, this time to Brandon Bowling from 21 yards out to make it 14-7 A-State. Early in the second, CCU tied it up again with Marable scoring on a 12-yard run to cap off a 10-play, 75-yard drive that ate up five and a half minutes of game clock.

Coastal Carolina picked up a 42-yard field goal by Massimo Biscardi to lead 17-14 with 10:28 to go in the half. The Chanticleers added another score late in the quarter when Marable scored on a three-yard pass from McCall with less than a minute to go in the half. The score wrapped up a long 18-play, 94-yard drive that took 8:38. CCU led 24-14 at the half.

With 6:57 to go in the third, the Chanticleers added to their total with a 14-play, 83-yard drive that took nearly eight minutes, capped off by a three-yard pass from McCall to Kameron Brown. A-State then tacked on three early in the fourth when Blake Grupe sent a 42-yard field goal through the uprights with 14:05 to go.

Coastal Carolina then scored 14 unanswered on a six-yard strike from McCall to Heiligh followed by a 15-yard rush by Shermari Jones, making it 45-17 with 6:16 remaining. A-State rounded out its scoring for the day when Hatcher found Bowling for a 44-yard score with 5:07 to go. Braydon Bennett capped off the day's scoring, finding the end zone on a 35-yard run with 4:12 left.

Oct. 10, 2020 | Centennial Bank Stadium: 4,561 | A-State 50, UCA 27



JONESBORO, Ark. (10/10/20) – Despite being engaged in a defensive showdown and facing a 6-2 deficit early, offensive fireworks eventually showed out, as Arkansas State won a 50-27 shootout versus Central Arkansas at a rainy and windy Centennial Bank Stadium.

Battling heavy rain in the first half and high wind gusts the entire game, it took around 20 minutes for the A-State offense to take off. But when the Red Wolves (2-2) began to click offensively and defensively, they did so to the tune of outscoring the Bears (2-3) 42-7 through the second and third guarters.

UCA scored 14 unanswered early in the fourth, but A-State managed to pick up late defensive stops and a score late to put the contest out of reach. With the win, A-State improved to 33-14 all-time in home openers and has now won its home opener in 13 of the last 16 seasons.

A-State's first five drives only gained 86 yards, but on the next five, the Red Wolves churned out 407 yards, finishing with 573 total on the day. The Scarlet and Black's 50 points was a season high and went over the 500-yard mark for the first time since recorded 525 versus FIU in the 2019 Camellia Bowl.

Logan Bonner and Layne Hatcher combined to complete 21 of 38 passes for 392 yards and six touchdowns, which was a season high and tied for the second-most in a single game in program history. The Red Wolves' running backs churned out 181 yards on 36 carries. Through the air, Jonathan Adams, Jr. led with six catches for 101 yards while Dahu Green caught six balls for 94 yards. Both receivers grabbed a pair of touchdowns. Four different A-State receivers caught touchdown passes on the day.

Justin Rice led A-State defensively with 12 tackles (4 TFL), including three sacks and a key QB hurry that resulted in a fourth-quarter interception by Antonio Fletcher. In the punting game, Ryan Hanson had a tremendous afternoon, averaging 52.0 yards per kick with punts of 69 and 64 yards, with three of his five punts landing inside the 20.

UCA quarterback Breylin Smith completed 24 of 49 passes for 302 yards and two scores while also throwing a pair of interceptions. Tyler Hudson was the leading receiver for the Bears, hauling in 12 catches for 154 yards. Lujuan Winningham grabbed three touchdowns as part of a four-catch, 93-yard performance. On the ground, the Red Wolves held the Bears to just 78 yards on 37 carries for a 2.1-yard average. Kierre Crossley was UCA's leading rusher with 83 yards on 17 carries. As a team, UCA totaled 411 yards of offense.

After forcing a three-and-out on UCA's first possession, the Red Wolves drove it all the way down to the UCA 5 before being forced to kick a 22-yard field goal. Blake Grupe's kick was kicked right into the line and recovered by Dre Matthews, who returned it all the way to the A-State 23. UCA moved the ball down to the 19 before Hayden Ray put the Bears on the board first with a 36-yard field goal at the 8:07 mark.

A-State's first second-quarter drive came to a halt after falling short on a fourth-and-short try at its own 29. UCA then took over but only advanced four yards before Ray trotted out for a 42-yard field goal attempt. The kick sailed through the uprights to put the score at 6-2 with 10:44 to go in the half.

On the next drive, Hatcher led the Red Wolves on a 13-play, 75-yard scoring drive that was capped off by a four-yard toss to Adams in the back of the end zone on fourth down to give A-State a 9-6 lead with 5:22 left in the half. Marcel Murray opened that drive in a big way, dashing 36 yards across midfield.

A-State scored again about two minutes later, this time on the defensive end, when Samy Johnson picked off a pass by Smith and returned it 60 yards for the touchdown, making the Red Wolves' lead 16-6 with 3:14 to go in the half. The pick six was A-State's first defensive touchdown of the season and the first since Nov. 16, 2019 versus Coastal Carolina (Caleb Bonner – 66-yard INT return).

 $After \ a \ fumble \ recovery \ by \ Dari \ Davenport \ on \ the \ first \ play \ of \ A-State's \ next \ possession, Smith \ found \ Winningham \ for \ a \ 23-yard \ score \ at \ the \ 1:31 \ mark \ to \ make \ it \ 16-13 \ Red \ Wolves.$

The Red Wolves responded on the next drive with an 8-play, 73-yard series that resulted in a 15-yard pass from Hatcher to Bowling, who dove over the pylon for the score. His touchdown made A-State's lead 23-13 at the half.

On the first play of the second half, Bonner connected with Reed Tyler for a 32-yard gain into UCA territory, followed by a 24-yard scamper by Lincoln Pare down to the UCA 19. The drive ended with Bonner finding Green just across the goal line for a touchdown to make it 30-13 with 13:40 remaining in the third. The Bears then looked to respond with a score, driving all the way down into A-State territory. Smith then found Hudson, who made it to the Red Wolves' 15 but the ball was stripped by Anthony Switzer and recovered by Elery Alexander to hand possession back to the Scarlet and Black.

The Red Wolves turned that ensuing drive into points, as Hatcher led the offense on a six-play drive capped off by a 22-yard completion to Adams that made it 37-13 with 8:19 left in the third. On that drive, Green had two key catches for 56 yards while a 15-yard scramble by Hatcher set up the scoring pass to Adams. UCA then drove it 69 yards down to the A-State 1, where the Bears failed on a fourth-and-goal attempt at the 1 as Smith recovered his own fumble at the 6.

With his back to his own end zone, Bonner found Giles Amos for a 65-yard reception that gave A-State a fresh set of downs at the UCA 30. Four plays later, Bonner connected with Green in the back of the end zone for the fourth consecutive score for the Red Wolves. Grupe's extra point was no good, as A-State took a 43-13 lead into the fourth.

Central Arkansas broke the scoring drought with 13:32 left in the contest when Smith found Winningham for the touchdown that made it 43-20 A-State. The Bears then recovered an onside kick to regain possession, which resulted in another scoring pass – this time a 31-yard strike from running back Marshun Douglas to Winningham to make it 43-27 with 11:32 to go.

After forcing a three-and-out, UCA regained possession with a chance to trim the lead once more, driving inside the A-State 30. Smith then faced immense pressure from the Red Wolves' defense, being sacked for an 11-yard loss by Rice and then tossing a hurried pass right into the arms of Fletcher at the 18. Fletcher's pick turned into points, as Bonner piloted a six-play scoring drive resulting in a 56-yard touchdown pass to Corey Rucker to make it 50-27 with 5:14 left. That would round out the scoring for the day, as a 69-yard punt by Hanson pinned the Bears deep in their own territory, where the game would end.

Oct. 15, 2020 | Centennial Bank Stadium: 5,496 | A-State 59, GSU 52



JONESBORO, Ark. (10/15/20) – Arkansas State set two single-game passing records in front of a national TV audience, passing for a school-record 551 yards and firing eight touchdown passes en route to a thrilling 59-52 victory over Georgia State.

The Red Wolves (3-2, 1-1 Sun Belt Conference) and Panthers (1-2, 0-2) battled back-and-forth offensively all night, combining for 1,192 yards – 865 through the air – and 59 first downs. The two teams also combined for 14 touchdowns and 172 total plays (Arkansas State 96, Georgia State 76). The teams traded scores for seemingly the entire night, accounting for seven ties and 10 lead changes, as neither team held more than a touchdown lead in the contest.

Jonathan Adams, Jr. grabbed a career-high 15 catches, tying J.D. McKissic's single-game record, to go along with a career-high 177 yards. Dahu Green was equally potent with nine catches for 172 yards. The duo accounted for four of A-State's eight touchdowns. Brandon Bowling also caught six passes for 91 yards and a touchdown. Five different Red Wolves caught touchdown passes on the night, including Lincoln Pare's two scores and one from Reed Tyler.

A-State's quarterback tandem of Logan Bonner (18-28, 197 yards, 3 TD) and Layne Hatcher (21 of 28, 332 yards, 4 TD) had a tremendous night passing, completing 39 of 56 passes for 529 yards and seven touchdowns to no interceptions. Roshauud Paul also completed a 22-yard pass for a score. With the eight total touchdown passes, A-State tied the Sun Belt Conference record for touchdown passes in a single game. Over the last two games, Arkansas State has passed for 14 touchdowns to no interceptions.

In total, the Red Wolves amassed 609 yards (551 passing, 58 rushing) while going 3 of 4 on fourth-down attempts. A-State recorded 34 first downs, which tied the school record. In the red zone, the Scarlet and Black was nearly perfect, converting four of its five opportunities inside Georgia State's 20.

Defensively, Justin Rice led the Red Wolves with eight tackles while Vidal Scott and Forrest Merrill each recorded a tackle for loss. Georgia State's Jontrey Hunter led all players with 10 tackles.

Georgia State totaled 583 yards of offense (314 passing, 269 rushing) on the night. Cornelius Brown IV threw for 314 yards on 18 of 35 passing and three scores for Georgia State, with all three scoring passes going to Sam Pinckney, who hauled in six catches for 146 yards. Tucker Gregg led a GSU ground game that pounded out 269 yards on 41 carries and three scores, churning out 142 yards on just 14 carries. Brown also contributed with 83 yards and two scores on 13 carries.

A-State's defense came out strong, forcing a three-and-out, where a bad snap to the punter was recovered at the Georgia State 5. Three plays later, Bonner found Tyler in the back of the end zone for a three-yard scoring pass to make it 7-0 at the 12:58 mark in the first.

Georgia State responded with 4:34 left in the first, turning to the ground game to tie things up at 7. A punt by Hanson was downed at the 1, but Brown led the Panthers on a five-play, 99-yard drive that began with a 56-yard run into A-State territory by Gregg. Four plays later, on fourth-and-2, Brown scampered 35 yards into the end zone, diving over the pylon. A-State then reclaimed the lead with 3:20 remaining in the first when Hatcher found Green for a 49-yard touchdown pass to make it 14-7.

The Panthers tied it with 12:11 left in the half when Bonner fumbled on a sack at the GSU 28 and GSU's Blake Carroll scooped up the loose ball, taking it 74 yards for the score. A-State reclaimed a 21-14 lead with six minutes remaining when, on fourth-and-2 from the GSU 42, Bonner sent a deep pass to Adams, who leapt over his defender and hauled in the touchdown pass.

Brown then found the end zone again on the ground, this time from 11 yards out to tie it up at 21 with 4:29 to go in the half. To begin that four-play scoring drive, Brown found Jamari Thrash for a 57-yard pass inside the A-State 20. Hatcher then led the Red Wolves on an 11-play scoring drive that was capped off by a diving catch in the end zone by Green to make it 28-21 with 48 seconds left. Georgia State tied it up once again at 28 with 14 seconds left in the half when Brown connected with Pinckney on a 21-yard pass. At halftime, the game was tied at 28.

To open the second half, the Panthers took advantage of a turnover on downs to lead 35-28 when Brown found Pinckney again, this time on a 36-yard strike. The Red Wolves tied it up at 35 on the next drive when Bonner connected with Bowling for a 16-yard score with 8:21 to go in the third. A-State then reclaimed the lead at 42-35 when Hatcher found Pare on an eight-yard pass with 6:21 left in the quarter to cap off a three-play, 53-yard drive that included a 45-yard pass to Green that set up the touchdown on the next play.

Georgia State tied it up again at 42 when Tucker Gregg scored on a seven-yard rush with 4:44 left in the third. A-State claimed the lead once again with 2:36 left when Blake Grupe drilled a 39-yard field goal. GSU then took a 49-45 lead at the start of the fourth on a 31-yard pass from Brown to Pinckney. The lead then changed hands again when Hatcher found Adams for a 32-yard score with 12:40 to go to make it 52-49 A-State.

The Panthers tied it up at 52 with 6:55 remaining on a 29-yard field goal by Noel Ruiz. On the ensuing drive, A-State took a 59-52 lead when Paul found Pare on a reverse pass for 29 yards with 4:23 to go. The score marked a school-record eighth touchdown pass of the night for the Red Wolves that also tied the Sun Belt Conference record for touchdown passes in a game.

With 2:04 left in the game, A-State's defense picked up the key stop it needed, halting the Panthers on fourth down to regain possession and wind out the clock.

Oct. 22, 2020 | Kidd Brewer Stadium: 2,100 | App State 45, A-State 17



BOONE, N.C. (10/22/20) – A 31-7 halftime deficit was tough to overcome for Arkansas State, as it dropped a 45-17 decision at Appalachian State on a Thursday night at Kidd Brewer Stadium.

The Red Wolves (3-3, 1-2 Sun Belt Conference) allowed 24 unanswered to end the first half and, despite trimming the deficit to 14 in the third quarter, could not get past the Mountaineers (3-1, 1-0). App State out-gained A-State 521-to-368 in the contest, including churning out 305 yards on the ground. The Scarlet and Black found most of its production through the air to the tune of 295 yards, but it was the ground game that found the end zone.

"Obviously not how we wanted it to go," head coach Blake Anderson said. "We knew they were a good football team with a lot of veterans. They're really big and physical on both fronts, and that's where it started and ended today. They owned both lines of scrimmage and we knew that was something that we were going to have to do a better job than we have the last couple of weeks.

"I'm really proud of how they battled in the second half – our goal was to win the second half and we came up a little short on that. To get stops and continue to play, we have to build off that. It gives us a chance to keep getting better and we still control our own destiny. We just have to play better than we did tonight."

Jonathan Adams, Jr. was once again a threat for A-State, hauling in six catches for 134 yards as the game's leading receiver. Dahu Green, Brandon Bowling and Reed Tyler all caught three while Jamal Jones caught two. Five other players caught passes on the night for a total of 10 different pass-catchers for the Red Wolves.

A-State's quarterbacking tandem of Logan Bonner and Layne Hatcher combined to complete 22 of 41 passes for 295 yards and an interception.

Jeff Foreman also fired a pass, but it was intercepted. On the ground, the Red Wolves scored twice with touchdowns by Jamal Jones and Lincoln Pare, but only managed to manufacture 73 yards. Pare was the team's leading rusher with 46 yards on five carries while Ryan Graham had seven carries for 37 yards.

For the Mountaineers, Zac Thomas completed 16 of 23 passes for 216 yards and four scores while also being a threat on the ground with 82 yards on seven carries, including a 60-yard scamper. Daetrich Harrington was the game's top rusher with 137 yards on 18 attempts. Malik Williams was the top receiver for App State, grabbing six catches for 78 yards and a score. Christian Wells also caught a pair of Thomas' touchdown tosses.

Defensively, CJ Harris led the way with eight tackles (two for loss) while TW Ayers tallied the lone sack. A-State's defense forced three fumbles, recovering one. The Mountaineers got a game-high nine tackles each from Shaun Jolly and Trey Cobb, with D'Marco Jackson nabbing a pair of interceptions.

App State struck first when Thomas connected with Wells on a 46-yard strike, but the Red Wolves evened things at 7-7 on an 8-yard rush up the middle by Jones. On the next drive, the Mountaineers reclaimed its lead on a 55-yard run by Harrington to end the first quarter with a 14-7 lead.

The Mountaineers then opened the second quarter with a five-yard scoring toss from Thomas to Mike Evans to cap off a lengthy 17-play drive and make it 21-7. The scoring drive ate up six-and-a-half minutes of clock between the late first and early second quarter.

After Blake Grupe missed a 24-yard field goal try, A-State regained possession on a fumble recovery by Booker Ficklin at the end of a 39-yard rush by Marcus Williams, Jr. Elery Alexander punched the ball free, after which Ficklin fell on it at the Red Wolves' 27. A failed fake punt attempt then turned the ball back over to the Mountaineers, who stretched their lead out to 24-7 on a 39-yard field goal by Chandler Staton with 4:39 left in the half.

Appalachian State added another touchdown with just over a minute left in the half when Thomas found Malik Williams for a 16-yard score. After 24 unanswered points, the Mountaineers led 31-7 at halftime.

The Red Wolves defense forced a 3-and-out, then the offense went on a 13-play drive that ended with a 34-yard field goal by Grupe to make it 31-10 with 9:36 left in the third. A-State then tacked on another score with 2:08 left in the third on a 48-yard touchdown run by Pare to make it 31-17. Thomas then broke the 10-0 scoring run with a 60-yard scramble that extended App State's lead back out to 21 at 38-17. The Mountaineers closed out the night with Thomas' fourth touchdown pass, this one to Wells for 20 yards at the 8:22 mark to make it 45-17.

Oct. 31, 2020 | Centennial Bank Stadium: 6,757 | Troy 38, A-State 10



JONESBORO, Ark. (10/31/20) – An early 14-0 deficit was tough to overcome, as Arkansas State dropped a 38-10 decision to Troy at Centennial Bank Stadium.

The Red Wolves (3-4, 1-3 Sun Belt Conference) cut it to a two-score contest in the third quarter, but a pair of fourth-quarter touchdowns by the Trojans (4-2, 1-2) put the game out of reach.

"I'm very frustrated and very disappointed," A-State head coach Blake Anderson said. "I felt like with the energy we had all week and how physical and competitive practices were that we would play much better, but we're really struggling to get that from the practice field and meeting rooms to the playing surface. We've had times where guys had tough matchups, but I thought this week our matchups were way better. We're capable of playing much better than we did, and that's where the frustration comes in. I'm really proud of how the defense played in the second half, with the exception of the touchdown at the end. That's something to build on, but that's two weeks in a row, offensively, that we had too many empty possessions. We have to continue to learn and improve, that's really the only answer."

Troy outgained A-State 487 to 379, including 419 yards through the air while A-State countered with 271 passing yards and 108 rushing. The Red Wolves' quarterback duo of Logan Bonner and Layne Hatcher completed 28 of 49 passes, with Hatcher going 11-

of-20 for 166 yards and a touchdown. Jacob Free connected on 33 of his 45 passes for 419 yards and two scores.

Lincoln Pare was A-State's leading rusher, racking up 90 yards on just 12 attempts for a 7.5-yard average. Kimani Vidal led Troy in rushing with 58 yards on 17 rushes and a touchdown.

Troy's Kaylon Geiger was the game's top receiver, hauling in eight catches for 126 yards. Vidal also grabbed eight passes for 77 yards. Brandon Bowling led A-State with six catches, while Dahu Green posted a team-high 75 receiving yards on four catches.

Defensively, Justin Rice was the game's top tackler with 14 tackles and three tackles for loss, including two sacks. Troy was led by Jayden McDonald's eight tackles.

On the game's opening drive, Troy struck first on a 29-yard strike from Free to Luke Whittemore to cap off a seven-play opening drive. The Trojans added another with 5:39 in the first when Free found Reggie Todd all alone in the end zone for a 34-yard score to make it 14-0.

A-State got on the board with 9:10 to go in the first half when Blake Grupe drilled a 39-yard field goal. The Trojans responded with three on their next drive on a 35-yard field goal by Evan Legassey to make it 17-3. Troy added another score with 41 seconds to go in the half on a six-yard rush by Free to make it 24-3 at halftime.

The teams exchanged punts to open the second half with A-State starting its second possession of the third quarter on its own 11. Hatcher turned to the air, completing passes of 49 and 35 yards to Green and Jonathan Adams, Jr., to give the Red Wolves first and goal on the Troy 3. On second down, Hatcher found Adams for the score to make it a two-score game at 24-10 with 4:55 left in the third.

After the Red Wolves forced another Troy punt, the offense took over looking to cut into the deficit more, but on third and 7 from the A-State 30, Bonner was sacked by Richard Jibunor and fumbled the ball. Darrell Starling then picked up the loose ball, returning it 20 yards for the score to make it 31-10 Trojans with 7:34 to go.

Troy took over on downs with just under six minutes left in the game and closed out the contest with a 10-play scoring drive capped off by an eight-yard rushing touchdown by Vidal to make it 38-10 with 26 seconds left.

Nov. 7, 2020 | Cajun Field: 5,585 | Louisiana 27, A-State 20



LAFAYETTE, La. (11/7/20) – Arkansas State put together a late fourth-quarter touchdown drive and converted a two-point conversion to pull into a tie with Louisiana, but the Ragin' Cajuns scored the game-winning touchdown with 1:13 remaining to escape the Sun Belt Conference West Division matchup with a 27-20 win at Cajun Field.

True freshman running back Lincoln Pare posted his first career 100-yard rushing game to lead Arkansas State's (3-5, 1-4) offense that accounted for 423 yards total offense, while Louisiana (6-1, 4-1) finished with 440 yards.

A-State Junior kicker Blake Grupe posted the game's initial six points, connecting on a pair of first-half field goals that accounted for the only scoring in the first half. The Red Wolves' held the ball for 11:30 of the contest's first 15 minutes, which was its largest time of possession for any quarter this season.

The Red Wolves limited Louisiana to just 108 yards total offense in the first half while posting its first shutout for an entire half since holding Texas State scoreless in the second half of the two team's meeting last season.

However, Louisiana found the end zone on its first possession of the second half on a 33-yard touchdown run by quar-

terback Levi Lewis to take a 7-6 lead just 1:22 into the third quarter. The Ragin' Cajuns added to their lead with 5:56 left in the third on 52-yard pass from Lewis to Dontae Fleming, bringing the score to 14-6.

The Red Wolves responded with a six-play, 51-yard touch-down drive early in the fourth quarter, pulling within 14-12 with 10:37 remaining. Senior running back Jamal Jones capped the drive with a four-yard run, but A-State was unable to even the score on a failed two-point conversion pass.

Louisiana pushed its lead back to eight points, 20-12, with a pair of field goal before the Red Wolves would pull even again with 2:24 left in the fourth. Layne Hatcher found senior wideout Brandon Bowling on a 47-yard pass, and the sophomore quarterback then hit senior receiver Jonathan Adams Jr. on a two-point conversion pass to tie the game at 20-20.

Louisiana's ensuing possession proved to be the difference, though, as Elijah Mitchell put the Ragin' Cajuns ahead for good on a two-yard touchdown run with 1:13 to play. The Red Wolves were able to move the ball to midfield on its final possession, but the drive stalled with three consecutive incomplete passes for an interception by Mekhi Garner sealed the outcome.

Pare led A-State's rushing attack with 121 yards on a career-high 22 carries, while junior quarterback Logan Bonner had a team-high 127 passing yards. Adams hauled in eight receptions for 95 yards to lead all A-State receivers.

Defensively, A-State was led by defensive end TW Ayers, who enjoyed a career-best night with 10 tackles and a sack. Sophomore cornerback Samy Johnson was responsible for the Red Wolves' only turnover gained, registering his second interception of the season.

Nov. 21, 2020 | Bobcat Stadium: 5,218 | Texas State 47, A-State 45



SAN MARCOS, Texas (11/21/20) – Arkansas State held a lead late, but a Texas State touchdown with 34 seconds to go lifted the Bobcats to a 47-45 shootout win over the Red Wolves.

The Red Wolves led by as much as 11 in the fourth quarter, but the Bobcats outscored A-State 21-7 in the last 11-and-a-half minutes to escape with the win.

"I thought we had opportunities to go snatch the ball where we weren't confident enough to go make the play," head coach Blake Anderson said. "It was a challenge all day defensively. Texas State had a good plan coming in, offensively, and we knew they could come in and score points through the air. We got them in a position where one stop might have won the game and we have to find a way to come up with that stop. I thought we were more balanced and had opportunities to move the chains and win the game there at the end. The guys played hard and we had a great week of work, but that only gets you to the field. You have to find ways to execute."

A-State outgained Texas State 654-505, with 462 yards coming through the air and 192 on the ground. The Red Wolves' defense held the Bobcats to just 62 yards on the ground. The Scarlet and Black converted 10 of 18 third-down opportunities while tallying 30 first downs.

Through the air, A-State's quarterbacks passed for 462 yards on 27-of-48 passing and four touchdowns. Layne Hatcher connected on 10 of his 22 attempts for 254 yards while Logan Bonner completed 17 of 26 passes for 208 yards. Both passers tossed a pair of touchdowns. A pair of A-State receivers eclipsed the 140-yard mark, with Jeff Foreman hauling in three passes for 149 yards and Jonathan Adams, Jr. catching 10 passes for 141 yards and two scores. Jamal Jones was the game's leading rusher with 106 yards on just 16 carries for a 6.6-yard average and notched his first career 100-yard game.

Brady McBride completed 32 of 45 passes for 443 yards and five scores for Texas State, while Marcell Barbee and Jah'marae Sheread catching a team-high six

passes. Jeremiah Haydel led in receiving yardage with 94 yards on five receptions. Texas State struck first on the game's opening drive to lead 7-0, with McBride finding Javen Banks for a 40-yard score. The Bobcats tacked on three more on a 41-yard field goal by Seth Keller to make it 10-0 with 6:28 left in the first.

A-State got on the board with 3:47 to go in the opening quarter on a 40-yard field goal by Blake Grupe, capping off a seven-play, 65-yard drive. Texas State led 10-3 after one quarter.

The Red Wolves evened it up to start the second quarter, with Bonner firing a pass towards a sliding Adams, who hauled it in with one hand just before it hit the turf for a 13-yard strike. Grupe's extra point was good to tie up the contest at 10-10 with 12:53 left in the half. On the next drive, Texas State reclaimed a 17-10 lead on a 47-yard pass from McBride to Haydel and then took a two-score lead of 24-10 when McBride found Trevis Graham, Jr. for a 14-yard touchdown strike with 9:56 left in the half.

A-State cut the deficit to 24-17 with 5:04 to go when a 1-yard rush by Marcel Murray capped off a 12-play, 75-yard drive. The Red Wolves then tied it up at 24-24 with 16 seconds left on a one-handed leaping grab by Adams from Hatcher. Adams' second score of the day ended a 91-yard drive. The Bobcats then led 27-24 at the half on a 48-yard field goal by Keller as time expired.

The Red Wolves took a 31-27 lead in the third quarter when Hatcher connected with Foreman on an 84-yard strike. A-State then kept the Bobcats out of the end zone on a failed fourth-and-goal try on the 4-yard line and began another scoring drive that took nearly six minutes off the clock between the third and fourth quarters.

With 13:50 left in the contest, Bonner ended the 13-play, 96-yard drive with an eight-yard pass to Giles Amos to stretch A-State's lead to 11 at 38-27. The Bobcats then cut the Red Wolves' lead to 38-34 on a five-yard pass from McBride to Barbee with 11:39 to go.

Texas State reclaimed the lead at 41-38 when McBride found Graham for a 15-yard strike with just over seven minutes remaining. On the Red Wolves' next drive, A-State chewed up over five minutes of clock en route to taking a 45-41 lead on a 12-play drive ending in a one-yard rush up the middle by Jones with 1:43 to go.

On the Bobcats' next drive, McBride led a seven-play drive that ended in a six-yard rushing touchdown by Calvin Hill with 34 seconds left. However, the deficit was just two at 47-45 after Keller's PAT was no good. A-State had time for one final possession but turned the ball over on downs to end the game.
