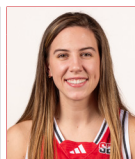

Destinee Rogers is entering her second full season as head coach of the Arkansas State women's basketball program. She was named the eighth all-time head coach on March 13, 2022, after completing the 2021-22 season - her third on staff - as the team's interim head coach.

2022-23

Rogers' first full season at the helm ended with a 13-19 overall mark and 6-12 ledger in conference play, but the Red Wolves finished strong with wins in seven of their last 11 contests. In that final stretch run, A-State reached the quarterfinals of the Sun Belt Conference Tournament for the first time since 2017, winning two games at the league tourney for the first time since 2015.

Under her guidance, guard Izzy Higginbottom garnered Sun Belt Conference Newcomer of the Year honors, becoming the first A-State player since 1999 to earn the honor. Higginbottom was among the league's top offensive threats, leading the team in scoring (16.0), assists (3.4) and steals (1.8), while shooting a school-record 91.1 percent from the free-throw line. Higginbottom was also the first A-State player since Aundrea Gamble (2015-16) to exceed 450 points, 95 assists and 50 steals in a season.

2021-22

In her first game as the team's interim head coach on Dec. 14, Rogers made history as the first African-American female head coach to win a game in school history, defeating Mississippi Valley State 81-47. With her hiring as the team's full-time head coach, she made even more history, becoming the first African-American woman head coach in A-State Athletics history.

Under her watch, A-State won six of her first seven games at the helm, including a 3-1 start to Sun Belt Conference play before losing leading scorer Keya Patton to a season-ending injury. Despite having one of their most dynamic players sidelined with an injury, the Red Wolves remained competitive down the stretch of the regular season as they dropped only one contest by more than double digits before closing with an 82-75 road victory at eventual Sun Belt Conference tournament champion UT Arlington.

Rogers guided guard Laurn Pendleton to Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year laurels - just the second player to earn the honor in program history and the first since 1997.

2019-21: ASSISTANT COACH/ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH

The Strong, Ark., native joined the A-State women's basketball program in 2019 as an assistant coach before being elevated to associate head coach in 2020. Rogers also owns experience as a head coach at the high school level in the state of Arkansas, serving as the girls' head coach at El Dorado High School from 2016-19. During those three seasons, she guided the Wildcats to a 52-28 record, including a 21-8 mark in her first season with a state semifinal finish.

BEFORE ARKANSAS STATE

Rogers' first full-time coaching assignment came at her alma mater of Central Arkansas, where she also was a three-year starter at point guard for the Sugar Bears. She helped UCA to a 78-45 ledger in her time as an assistant coach, including 45-18 in the final two seasons. She helped recruit and develop two Southland Conference Players of the Year, a Southland Conference Freshman of the Year and eight all-league players.

Following her playing career at UCA, Rogers spent four seasons on the bench for the Sugar Bears with one season as a graduate assistant (2012-13) and three more as an assistant coach (2013-16). In the 2015-16 season, Rogers helped guide the Sugar Bears to their first NCAA Tournament and a program record 28 wins, regular-season record 26 victories and Southland Conference program record win total of 16.

A three-year starter at UCA, Rogers finished her playing career averaging 7.4 points, 3.2 assists and 2.3 rebounds per game with more than 100 3-point field goals to her credit. She helped UCA to the 2012 Southland Conference Championship and was the floor general when the program made its first Division I postseason appearances, hosting UAB in the 2011 WBI and traveling to Oklahoma State in the 2012 WNIT.

Lizzie Nessling is entering her fourth season on the Arkansas State women's basketball staff. She joined as an assistant coach prior to the 2020-21 season after two seasons as an assistant at Seward County CC in Kansas.

The Chicago native has been a key part of recruiting impact players over the past three seasons, and was promoted to the title of Associate Head Coach by first-year head coach Destinee Rogers entering the 2022-23 season.

In the 2019-20 campaign, her final year at SCCC, Nessling helped coach Seward to a 25-7 mark and the Region VI tournament semifinals. She aided in coaching two WBCA All-Americans, while also being responsible for recruiting both 2019-20 KJCCC Co-Freshmen of the Year (Tianna Johnson and Leilani Augmon). In the summer prior to the 2019-20 campaign, Nessling was selected to coach in the NJCAA Top 40 Showcase.

In 2018-19, she helped guide the Lady Saints to a Jayhawk West Conference Championship, Region VI Runner-up, NJCAA Sweet 16 appearance and a regular-season No. 2 finish in the national poll with a 30-4 overall record. She also took part in coaching multiple all-region and all-conference players.

Prior to Seward, Nessling spent two years as an assistant at University of Saint Mary in Leavenworth, Kansas, where the Lady Spires won 37 games in her two years, reaching the semifinals of the KCAC Tournament in both seasons.

As a player, she was a two-time captain for Lincoln University's women's basketball team where she received the "Glue Guy" Award for two straight years and was recognized as the True Blue 2016 Athlete of the Year her senior year. 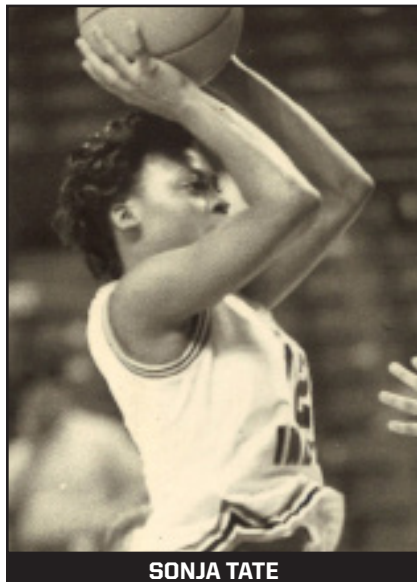
Aundrea Gamble was the only player in Sun Belt Conference history to win the Women's Basketball Student-Athlete of the Year award three times and also became just the second female athlete in A-State history to win the SBC's overall Student-Athlete of the year in 2015-16. In addition she was just the second female athlete to be nominated for the NCAA Woman of the Year award in 2015-16.

Gamble earned four All-America honors in her three-year playing career at A-State. During her junior season she became just the second player in program history to reach All-America status when the WBCA named her an honorable mention All-American. She also garnered CollegeSportsMadness Mid-Major First-Team All-America status that same season.

As a senior she led the Red Wolves to their third-straight WNIT berth and was named to the CollegeSportsMadness Mid-Major All-America third team. She also became just the second student-athlete in school history (male or female) to be named to the NCAA Senior CLASS All-America squad, finishing as a second team honoree.

For her career, Gamble finished fourth on the A-State career scoring list with 1,932 points and is tied for second with 479 assists. She ranks eighth all-time with 200 steals and is second with eight 30-plus point performances.

Gamble won the SBC Player of the Week award on Feb. 15, 2015 for the seventh time in her career, the most in A-State history. The McKinney, Texas, native also finished as just one of 10 active players in the NCAA to score over 1,600 points, grab 400 rebounds and dish out 400 assists in a career. She registered double figure scoring in 89 of the 102 games she played in and also scored 15 or more points in 77 of those games and 20 or more points in 53 games. She also finished with 11 career double-doubles.

Sonja Tate, who played at A-State from 1989-93, is arguably one of the best basketball players to ever put on an Arkansas State uniform. She remains the leader in six statistical categories and scored 2,312 points in her career, the most of any men's or women's basketball player in school history.

She set the single-season scoring record at A-State with 820 points during the 1992-93 season and owns the top-five single game scoring performances in school history. She remains the only A-State women's player to have scored 40 or more points in a single game, a feat she accomplished five times, including a 50-point performance against Louisiana-Lafayette during the 1992-93 season. Tate connected on 95 three-pointers during the 1992-93 season, an school record that still stands. She pulled down 327 rebounds that season, the most of any player in a single season.

The West Memphis, Ark., native is third on the program's all-time career rebounding charts with 1,006 and is the career leader in steals with 402. She owns the top-two single-season steals records with 125 during the 1992-93 season in 114 swipes during the 1991-92 campaign.

Tate also remains the only player in school history to record a quadruple double, finishing with 29 points, 14 rebounds, 10 assists and 10 steals in an 86-59 victory at Mississippi Valley State Jan. 27, 1993. Later that season, she led A-State to a 67-54 win over SMU and earned MVP honors in the National Women's Invitation Tournament.

Following her freshman season, she was named Co-Newcomer of the Year in the American South Conference. She earned All-American South Conference honors as a sophomore and All-Sun Belt Conference honors as a junior and a senior. Prior to her senior season, she was named preseason first-team All-America by Dick Vitale's Basketball Magazine and following the season was named Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year and a Kodak All-American.

She was also an All-American track and field athlete while at A-State, and remains in the top-10 in program history in six events. She set the school record in the heptathlon in 1994 with 5,247 points, a mark that remains at No. 2 today.

The former guard was inducted into the Hall of Honor in 2004, two years after finishing her WNBA career with the Minnesota Lynx, where she was a three-year starter. During her time with the Lynx, she led the team in minutes played, assists and steals and was among the top-three rebounders on the team. She also played professionally in France, Russia, Spain, and with the American Basketball League.

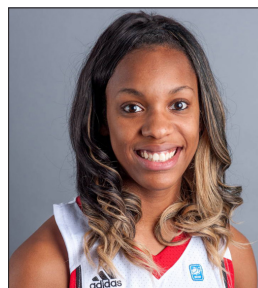

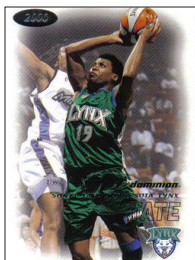

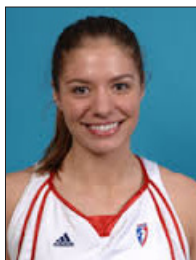

Arkansas State has a rich history when it comes to sending players to the professional ranks. The Red Wolves have sent players to the WNBA, ABL, Israel and Europe, as well as Mexico. The most notable of A-State pro alumni is former assistant coach Sonja Tate who played in multiple countries overseas, in the ABL and later in the WNBA for the Minnesota Lynx. Tate's career spanned four countries and two professional leagues in the United States. To date, she is the only Arkansas State women's basketball to have played in the WNBA.

More recently, three-time Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year Aundrea Gamble was invited to participate in training camp with the Los Angeles Sparks in the summer of 2017. Gamble spent a month with the Sparks and played in a pair of preseason games before being let go before the start of the regular season.

The Red Wolves have continued to produce talent that is coveted around the world. Most recently Ashley Olvera, who played at Arkansas State from 2011-13, signed to play professionally in Israel, joining former forward Shay Scott as the last two Red Wolves to continue their careers overseas. Scott played at A-State from 2008-11 and signed to play after the conclusion of her senior season.

In 2007, a pair of A-State greats were invited to the WNBA Pre-Draft Camp in Cleveland, Ohio. Adrienne Davie and Rudy Sims were each invited to the camp that offered coaches and general managers from all 13 WNBA teams an opportunity to evaluate the top young players from around the world in advance of the 2007 WNBA Draft. Davie was later invited to the Connecticut Sun's training camp but was let go before the start of the 2007 WNBA season.

Tanisha Johnson, who lettered in 1999 and 2000, also spent time overseas in several professional leagues in the early part of the century. Julie Hagood took part in the WNBA Pre-Draft camp in 2000 and was part of the USA Team Trials in Colorado Springs, Colorado, in the summer of 1999. Tate also took part in the USA Trials prior to the start of the start of her senior season in the early 1990s.

Davie and Sims finished as one of the top freshman duos in the country and helped A-State return to the postseason for the first time in three years.

March 27 Championship (Amarillo, Texas) SMU 67-54 W

Arkansas State University put a national championship in its pocket here Saturday night.

The Lady Indians knocked off Southern Methodist University, 67-54, to win the 25th annual National Women's Invitation Basketball Tournament. It was the 300th game in the tourney's history.

All-America guard Sonja Tate, who was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player, and All-Sun Belt Conference forward Shyla Tucker, also named to the all-tournament team, paced the Lady Tribe.

Tate, who played all 40 minutes, capped a marvelous career with 26 points--13 in each half--and also claimed 16 rebounds against SMU. In the three NWIT games, played the last three days, she notched 90 points and 36 rebounds.

For her ASU career, the 5-6 Tate ended up with totals of 2,312 points, 1,006 rebounds and 402 steals. Plus, she set an NWIT record with 14 three-pointers for the tournament.

Tucker, a 5-11 junior, tallied 19 points against the Lady Mustangs. Thirteen of those came in the clutch, after SMU had rallied midway in the second half to erase an eight-point ASU halftime lead.

Tucker's all-tournament state included 52 points and 22 rebounds.

A-State, which closed the season with a 25-8 record, equalled its winningest season ever--the 25-7 mark of last year. Byt last campaign's 25 wins only had the tage of third-place finisher in the WNIT.

"I don't have any idea how to explain what kind of a feeling this is," said head coach Jerry Ann Winters. We've had a tremendous team the last two or three years but could never get over the hump. We've always come up just a little short--except this time. I guess the best way to say it is what the girls told me in the dressing room: 'We finally got one coach.'"

A-State trailed only once against SMU, 2-0 at the start. They followed Tate's lead and pushe dto a 9-2 edge, fell back to a 17-all tie and then manged the eight-point halftime lead, 31-23.

SMU began creeping back in the second half, going on a 12-6 run during the first eight minutes. ASU went cold to contribute to the Lady Mustangs' cause.

Kim Brungardt had a conventional three-point play--inside basket and ensuing free throw--to tie the score at 41-all with 9:34 to play.

It was 43-43 when Tucker entered the picture--from an extended breather on the bench--and scored nine points over the next six minutes.

With freshman Crystal Tausan also involved offensively, ASU forged a 52-43 command with less than six minutes showing. SMU never got closer than seven the rest of the way, as ASU's three T's--Tate, Tucker, Tausan--kept hitting inside baskets and free throws.

"I finally felt comfortable when the clock showed less than a minute and were up by 15," Winters said. "It was grueling--just like the other two games we had here. SMU just wouldn't go away and let us get on with our mission. We had to do it."

SMU, the tournament's eight-seed and upset-winner in the opening round over top-seed UNLV, closed its season with 20-10 mark.

Leading SMU were Brungardt with 20 points and Shannell Thomas with 12.

Tucker finished with five of ASU's 15 steals.

- A crowd of 10,892, the largest ever at First National Bank Arena, watched the Red Wolves defeat the University of Arkansas 98-84 in the 2005 Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT).
- A-State has posted an undefeated mark at First National Bank Arena three times: 1991-92 (9-0), 2004-05 (11-0) and 2015-16 (12-0).
- The Strength and Conditioning Room was unveiled in the summer of 2008, featuring new weights, lighting, floor and wall coverings and entrance doors.
- The A-State women's basketball program has amassed a 338-123 (.733 winning pct.) at First National Bank Arena
- Prior to the 2009-10 season, the men's basketball, women's basketball and women's volleyball locker rooms along with the film room were renovated.
- The basketball court was resurfaced and repainted prior to the 2014-15 season, featuring the large Red Wolves logo at center court and A-State logos just outside the two lane areas. The new Sun Belt Conference logos were painted in each lane the summer of 2013.
- A newly-integrated video display system was installed in October of 2013. The display system, manufactured by Daktronics, consists of four identical LED video displays measuring 12 feet high by 26 feet wide mounted in each of the arena's four corners.
- Official opening of First National Bank Arena was July 11, 1987, with the National AAU 17-and-under boys basketball championships. Team Acadiana of Lou-

- isiana defeated the Arkansas Wings 87-68 in the first game and Joe Harvell of the Arkansas Wings scored the first points.
- The multi-purpose indoor arena seats 10,563 for basketball games and 11,704 for concerts.
- The First National Bank Arena facility was completed in 1987 and took three years to build at a cost of \$19 million, \$15.3 million of which was provided by the state.
- The first public event at First National Bank Arena was A-State Commencement ceremonies in May of 1987.
- The first A-State women's contest held at First National Bank Arena occurred versus Indiana State on Nov. 30, 1987. A-State defeated Indiana State 70-63 with A-State's Charlotte Fields scoring the first points.
- The first A-State men's games held at First National Bank Arena was against Memphis on Dec. 5, 1987. The Tigers defeated A-State 60-59 in front of 10,766 fans. Sylvester Gray of Memphis scored the first points in the game and Bobby Collins scored the first points for A-State.
- Over the Summer of 2015, crews finished the installation of all new chair back seating and railing throughout First National Bank Arena.
- Prior to the 2021-22 season, a new court was laid at First National Bank Arena (p. 101).

The Arkansas State University women's basketball program moved into a new home prior to the 2009-10 season following a complete locker room renovation. The A-State women's basketball locker room expanded not only in size, but underwent comprehensive remodeling.

Among the several highlights to the renovated A-State women's basketball locker room was an increased locker area featuring brand-new custom lockers for each student-athlete. These individualized lockers include each women's basketball student-athlete's name, jersey number, hometown and photo.

A player's lounge with Red Wolves logo embroidered leather couches and wide-screen high definition television along with several computers for student-athlete use are other amenities to make the 'Red Wolves Experience' unique.

The locker room also features newly-remodeled shower facilities and new custom marker boards for use by the Red Wolves' coaching staff. The walls are adorned with custom A-State graphics as well as new carpeting covering the floors with custom-made Red Wolves logo rugs.

STRENGTH & CONDITIONING

The main Arkansas State University strength and conditioning area features 70 work stations, flooring, flexibility area, power area, speed area, cardiovascular area, training equipment, Olympic weightlifting platforms, air and heating system and training security measures.

First National Bank Arena also includes the state-of-the-art Strength and Conditioning Room used by the A-State basketball teams, which was remodeled prior to the 2008-09 season. The upgrades included all new weights, new floor covering, wall covering, lighting and entrance doors.

The project was completed at a cost of approximately \$150,000 with a large portion of the funding coming from a generous contribution from the Clopton Clinic of Jonesboro.



ATHLETIC TRAINING

The Arkansas State Sports Medicine Department operates five athletic training rooms on campus. First National Bank Arena is the home for all men's and women's basketball, women's volleyball, and indoor track and field competitions and practices.

Located in First National Bank Arena is a 2,000-square foot athletic training room which is fully equipped to provide all the necessary pre and post-practice treatment. The Tim and Terri Langford Sports Medicine area has undergone recent changes and construction such as new tables, flooring, ceiling, paint and offices.

ARKANSAS STATE ATHLETICS FACILITIES



Arkansas State's athletics programs compete in top-of-the-line facilities.

Centennial Bank Stadium, which opened in 1974, has evolved into a beautiful stadium which seats over 30,000 fans. The stadium has undergone a "Centennial Expansion" construction project that covers 40,000 square feet, including the press box and concourse. Construction on a two-level 66,500 square foot operations center in the north end zone was also completed prior to the start of the 2019 season.

The 192,000 square-foot First National Bank Arena is a multi-purpose facility that is home to the A-State basketball, volleyball and indoor track and field teams.

Coaches and student-athletes moved into a new \$2.7 million track and field complex in spring 2004. It contains a newly-resurfaced eight-lane 400-meter track and can be set up for two NCAA venues.

Three local country clubs graciously allow A-State men's and women's golf programs to utilize their facilities for practice and play.

J.A. "Ike" Tomlinson Stadium-Kell Field serves as the home to Red Wolves baseball. Built in 1993, the stadium received complete lighting in 1996, 206 field level seats were added for the 2008 season and a new scoreboard was installed in 2011.

A-State's newest women's program, bowling, competes in the Jonesboro Bowling Center, where a new locker room, lounge and pro shop have been constructed.

The Red Wolves' soccer and track and field teams utilized the same stadium for the first time in school history during the 2014-15 season, as the soccer field was relocated as part of the track facility.

A-State has also completed a new women's soccer and women's tennis facility, which houses both squads' locker rooms, training room, offices and more. New tennis courts were also completed in 2016 as well.

Facilities have received a number of facelifts over the last decade, making sure that the athletics department's "front door" and other sports areas possess a first-class appearance.

Also included in the upgrades have been renovations inside the A-State Football Facility and weight rooms, locker rooms and training rooms at both Centennial Bank Stadium and First National Bank Arena, where new seating has also been installed.

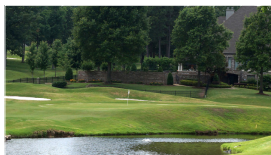

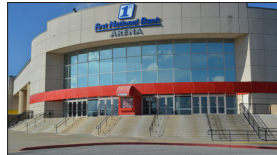

ACADEMICS

The Arkansas State University women's basketball program's commitment to academics is a significant one. All of the necessary tools and resources for A-State student-athletes to achieve academic success is provided. This includes academic tutoring and mentoring, learning skills assessments and strategies, course management assistance, degree program advisement and career development.

The Arkansas State University Athletics Department announced a \$400,000 gift from Charles Luter that was used to enhance the athletics' academic facility, at a press conference held at the newly named Charles Luter Family Academic Success Center in September of 2008.

The Academic Success Center serves as a foundation for structure, discipline and organization for the education of all A-State student-athletes. The facility, coupled with innovative programs and equipment, currently houses the academic support staff, tutors, computer labs, a resource room, study areas, tutorial rooms, small group study centers and a large conference room.

Among the most recent and noticeable modifications to the Charles Luter Family Academic Success Center is a new foyer housed in a brick and rock exterior that, along with new landscaping, gives the entrance to the building a modern look and creates a stronger image. The actual foyer has a large Red Wolves logo embedded in a terrazzo flooring that greets visitors as they enter the building. A receptionist office now also connects to the lobby area, which holds all-new furniture and a plaque recognizing Charles and his wife, Kay.

A restructuring of the academic resource center, now known as Dawson's Den, has occurred, including a wallwrap celebrating academic success that is clearly visible for student-athletes working in the computer lab. Additionally, tutorial rooms and computer-work stations have been upgraded in this area, which also displays pictures of the most recent A-State graduates.

The names of the latest members of the Athletic Director's Honor Roll are also showcased in Dawson's Den. The area is named after Scott and Kay Dawson, longtime supporters of Red Wolves' athletics.

RED WOLVES LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

It is well-known that collegiate athletics departments across the country place a common emphasis on graduation, but Arkansas State has taken it a step further with its Red Wolves Leadership Academy that provides additional resources intended give its graduating student-athletes the best opportunities for job placement after their time as a student.

The Red Wolves Leadership Academy continued to strengthen with a study abroad component added in 2015 to foster global awareness, which is often cited by employers as a positive attribute they seek. During summer 2015, Arkansas State student-athletes took part in the first study abroad program offered by any university and their athletics department in the nation. The Red Wolves took the groundbreaking step by sending the group of student-athletes to London on a faculty-led academic program.

The program goes hand-in-hand with the Red Wolves Leadership Academy, designed with the sole purpose to obtain job placement for student-athletes upon graduation. For A-State Athletics, this is just one of the many ways it all comes back to providing the Red Wolves with the most comprehensive experiences possible to be successful in life.

Research conducted by UC Merced backs up what the A-State Athletics Department believes – adding the study abroad component to the Red Wolves Leadership Academy puts its student-athletes among the most desirable employees in the nation coming out of college and helps create global citizens. The UC Merced research also showed that 97 percent of study abroad students found employment within 12 months of graduation, while only 49 percent of college graduates found employment in the same period.



A Carnegie Research 2 university, Arkansas State University is the second-largest university in the state, and a leader in innovation and collaboration. A-State hosts the first osteopathic medical school in Arkansas, the New York Institute of Technology's College of Osteopathic Medicine, and opened the first U.S.-style residential campus in Mexico in fall of 2017. With its Discover 2025 Strategic Plan as its guide, A-State is engaged in creating new collaboration opportunities including the Center for No-Boundary Thinking, the recently established Institute for Rural Initiatives, and exploring a public-private partnership to bring the first College of Veterinary Medicine to the state. A-State is home to more than 13,000 current students from across America and around the world, and proud to have over 100,000 alumni who are #AStateMade.

Undergraduate experiences are highlighted for the last decade with the Create@State spring conference. Create@State participants have an advantage in achieving the graduate school of their choice, including continuing to advanced degrees at A-State. Research opportunities alongside our faculty are common at A-State with a student-driven research project launched by NASA to the International Space Station in 2022.

A-State begins its second decade offering online curriculum and course work, and remains the largest provider of 100% online degree programs based in the state with 99 degree programs and 18 more set to launch in the upcoming academic year.

Combined with hosting the region's first convention center, the Red Wolf Convention Center and Embassy Suites hotel, a one-mile radius on the A-State campus serves as the cultural hub of the region with the largest concert venue, First National Bank Arena, as well as the largest concert hall and theatre located at Fowler Center.

The Bradbury Art Museum is the region's leading visual arts facility. Arkansas State's Heritage Sites program operates four nationally or internationally known museum locations including the Johnny Cash Boyhood Home and the Hemingway-Pfeiffer Museum. And, the Arkansas State Museum located adjacent to the Dean B. Ellis Library is home to the only accredited natural history museum on a university campus in our state.

Among our academic divisions, the Neil Griffin College of Business is the first named college, and is home to the Delta Center for Economic Development, the Bob Wood Sales Leadership Center, the Women's Leadership Center, and one of the top rated online MBA programs in the region.

One of the region's centers of excellence in media and communication, Arkansas State's School of Media and Journalism is home to an accredited media programs whose students regularly take home national awards, the oldest NPR-member radio station west of the Mississippi (KASU) and a century-long tradition of a student-run newspaper, The Herald.

A-State's College of Nursing and Health Professions is nationally known with collaborative arrangements with NYIT's on-campus medical school. The College of Engineering and Computer Science is home to the Hytrol Materials Handling Laboratory. The College of Education and Behavioral Science operates the one of the largest early childhood services systems in the region.

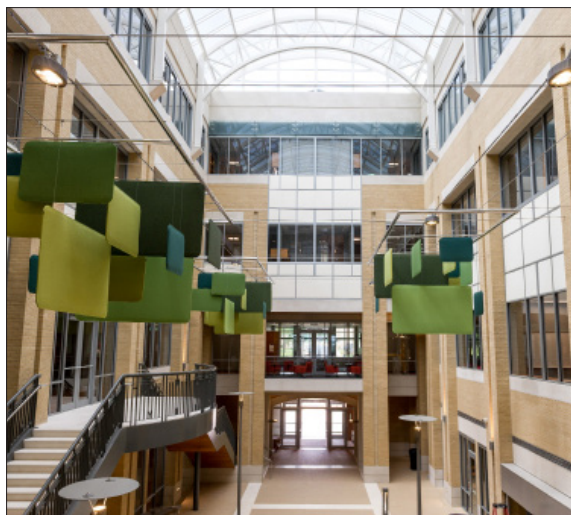

A-State is the home of the Red Wolves, an FBS Division I athletics program, highlighted by making nine consecutive bowl appearances, back-to-back triple crown conference track titles for men and women, 14 consecutive NCAA bowling championship appearances including national runner-up in 2021, and recently earning both the Bubas Cup (awarded to the Sun Belt Conference's top all-sport award) as well as a record high student-athlete GPA in the same season. Arkansas State sponsors 16 varsity sports teams, including football, cross country, basketball, golf, indoor track, outdoor track and baseball for men; women athletes compete in soccer, outdoor track, cross country, indoor track, bowling, tennis, basketball, volleyball and golf. A-State also sponsors nationally competitive club sport teams like rugby, softball, competitive cheer and dance, and Esports that have earned national titles or national runner-up titles in recent years.





Jonesboro, home of Arkansas State University, weighs in as the largest city in Northeast Arkansas. As a matter of fact, if you form a triangle by connecting Little Rock, St. Louis and Memphis, Jonesboro stands out as the largest metropolitan city in what amounts to a 17,000 square mile triangular area.

Jonesboro is a great city of over 70,000, and is always ready to welcome incoming A-State students from the moment they arrive in town. The booming community has matured over the past half century into a regional center for cultural, educational, industrial, commercial, agricultural, communication, transportation, recreational and medical interests. It contains almost every convenience of a big city and every comfort of a small town.

The community is alive with cultural events such as the art exhibitions, theatrical and musical productions, not only on campus but in the city itself through the Jonesboro Fine Arts Council, NEA Foundation of Arts, the Forum and Northeast Arkansas Symphony.

Jonesboro is also the medical hub of northeast Arkansas and southeast Missouri, with two major hospitals and countless medical professionals. The city is also a shopping mecca, offering a modern business district as well as quaint downtown antique shops and restaurants.



One of the five largest cities in Arkansas, Jonesboro is located between the vast and fertile Mississippi River and the cultural and scenic richness of the Ozark Mountains. It is nestled about 70 miles west of Memphis, Tennessee, on the gentle slopes of Crowley's Ridge.

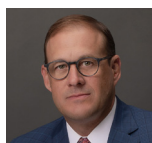

INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS COMMITTEE

The Intercollegiate Athletics Committee (IAC) was formed in the spring of 1997. The IAC reviews and makes recommendations on issues involving the welfare of student-athletes, the role of athletics in campus life, and the athletics program's compliance with the university, conference, and NCAA regulations; serves as a search advisory committee for key athletics program personnel; reviews the role of existing and potential sports programs; and reviews the athletics budget. The committee reports to the Chancellor.



Dr. Charles L. Welch serves as president of the Arkansas State University System and as one of the state's leading advocates for higher education. He is also Past Chair of the Board of Directors of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities, a Washington, D.C.-based higher education association of nearly 400 public colleges, universities, and systems, and he serves on the Board of Directors of the American Council on Education.

Dr. Welch was named the second president of the ASU System in November 2010 and officially began his new position in April 2011. He is the youngest person to ever serve as president or chancellor of an Arkansas community college and is the youngest university president in Arkansas.

During his tenure, Dr. Welch has hired new chancellors for all seven of the system's campuses. Among the system's major expansion initiatives under his leadership are the merger of Mid-South Community College in West Memphis (now ASU Mid-South); the opening of NYIT College of Osteopathic Medicine at Arkansas State; opening of a \$100 million privately funded A-State campus in Queretaro, Mexico; the merger of College of the Ouachitas in Malvern (now ASU Three Rivers); and the merger of Henderson State University in Arkadelphia. Additionally, the ASU System office was relocated to Little Rock and expanded to enhance its statewide exposure and position in higher education leadership

at the State Capitol.

He is co-chair of the executive council of the Arkansas Department of Higher Education. He previously served as president of Henderson, chancellor of the University of Arkansas Community College at Hope; vice chancellor for academic affairs at ASU-Beebe; and dean of university studies at Pulaski Technical College. Dr. Welch also worked at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock and has served as an instructor of education and political science at three different colleges in Arkansas.

A native of Jonesboro, Dr. Welch was a first-generation college student and the first member of either side of his extended family to receive a graduate degree. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science from the University of Arkansas, where he served as president of the student body. He received a Master of Arts degree in political management from George Washington University and a Doctor of Education degree in higher education administration from UALR.

Dr. Welch is past president of the Arkansas Association of Two-Year Colleges and served as chairman of the board of the Arkansas Association of Public Universities. He serves on the Board of Directors for Goodwill Industries of Arkansas, is a former board member for the Arkansas Sheriffs' Youth Ranches, and was inducted into the Arkansas Boys State Hall of Fame. *AY Magazine* named Welch as one of the "Powerful Men of 2013", and in 2005, *Arkansas Business* selected Welch to "40 Under 40," which profiled 40 "intriguing business and political leaders under age 40." His experience in the governmental affairs arena includes serving as a White House intern and on the staffs of U.S. Sen. David Pryor and then-U.S. Rep. Blanche Lincoln.

Dr. Welch and his wife, Mandy, are the parents of three daughters: Wheatley Grace, Emma Caroline, and Ava Claire.



ARKANSAS STATE CHANCELLOR DR. TODD SHIELDS

An academic administrator, a nationally known scholar and an unabashed champion for students, staff and faculty, Dr. Todd Shields was named the fourth appointed chancellor and the 14th individual to lead Arkansas State University.

He spent many years at the University of Arkansas where he rose through the ranks to serve as dean of the largest academic unit in Fayetteville. Shields' depth of academic administrative experience spans from department chair to research centers and from deanships of individual colleges to divisions touching all corners of the university. His two most recent academic appointments, dean of the Graduate School and International Education (GSIE) and dean of the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences, illustrate his leadership strength.

One of Shields' signature contributions to UA was the creation of a School of Art within the college, bolstered by significant endowment gifts to fund construction of a new campus space that serves as a partnership with the city of Fayetteville. A \$120 million gift from the Walton Family Charitable Support Foundation established the School of Art, with a following \$70 million total in support from the Windgate Foundation for the 154,600-square-foot Windgate Studio + Design Center, which anchors a new art district redevelopment south of the campus core on Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard. He also secured \$90 million in software and equipment gifts to programs throughout the

Fulbright College.

As the dean of GSIE, Shields collaborated with administration, deans, faculty and staff in every college at UA. He also served as a leader for Fayetteville's Rome Center, a campus hub in the Italian capital. Among the key achievements as graduate dean was increasing overall graduate school enrollment and the number and diversity among international students. During this time, Shields was also responsible for overseeing reviews of all programs across the campus, involving him in a wide range of academic areas from business to education, from architecture to the health professions.

Shields played a pivotal role in the creation of the Diane D. Blair Center of Southern Politics and Society, serving as the founding director of the interdisciplinary research center. Building upon his previous experience as the associate director of the Fulbright Institute of International Relations, the Blair Center became an established resource for programing, curriculum, research and polling for the state and region. Shields followed his time as department chair and Blair Center director with a year as the associate dean of the President William Jefferson Clinton School of Public Service in Little Rock.

He began his academic career as an assistant professor in political science at Arkansas in 1994, and was promoted to associate professor in 1999. He joined the Fulbright Institute of International Relations as its associate director in 2000, and in 2005 became a full professor in political science. For eight years, he also concurrently chaired the political science department at UA.

Concurrent with his time at the Clinton School, Shields was first appointed interim dean in 2010-11, then permanent dean of GSIE the following academic year. Along with the graduate school, he also supervised international students, study abroad and sponsored international programs on the UA campus.

In 2013, Shields was named interim Fulbright dean, then the permanent dean in



July 2014 where he led the college until departing UA to become chancellor at A-State. Fulbright College's three schools, 16 academic departments and 10 research centers span 30 academic programs.

Among numerous achievements during his time as the Fulbright dean was the creation of the Fulbright College Student Success Center. Some of the key retention-based programs included Destination Arkansas Blackboard Assignment to provide orientation to all first-year students, Strategies for Success (S4S) which was a zero-credit course offered to all UA students who fell into academic probation in their first semester to create a plan to improve their academics, and a Life Strategies and Career Awareness Course to improve student achievement. One of the key outcomes of the Student Success Center was a reduction of low grades and failure rates in the college's core courses and increases in first year retention.

He is the co-author of three significant books related to electoral politics: *The Long Southern Strategy: How Chasing White Voters in the South Changed American Politics* (2019); *The Persuadable Voter: Wedge Issues in Presidential Campaigns* won the 2009 Robert E. Lane Award for the best book in political psychology; and his first book *Money Matters: Campaign Finance Reform and Congressional Elections* was published in 1999. He is also an editor on six other books, has published more than 40 articles and made more than 50 presentations in his research areas of data analytics, public opinion, and election strategies. His efforts have also resulted in more than \$25 million in grants and research support as a principal or co-principal investigator.

He was recently appointed by Governor Asa Hutchinson to serve on the newly reinstated Arkansas Commission on the Status of Women where he serves as co-chair of the subcommittee on research and writing alongside A-State Graduate School Dean Cherisse Jones-Branch.

Shields earned a Bachelor of Arts in political science and a Bachelor of Arts in psychol-

ogy in 1990 at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio. He continued his education at the University of Kentucky where he received his Master of Arts in political science in 1991 and his Ph.D. in 1994. In addition, Shields participated in Ohio State University's Summer Institute in Political Psychology in 1993 and Harvard University's Management Development Program in Higher Education in the summer of 2006.

He and his wife, Karen, have two adult children, Savvy and Dane.

Jeff Purinton, a highly-respected, veteran athletics administrator, was announced as Arkansas State's Vice Chancellor for Intercollegiate Athletics on May 4, 2022, becoming the 12th athletics director in school history.

Purinton's positive impact on the Red Wolves' athletics department during his first year at the helm has been evident, reflecting the same energetic and passionate approach to intercollegiate athletics he has applied throughout his career. Following a 15-year tenure at the University of Alabama, where he spent the last seven years as the Crimson Tide's Executive Deputy Director of Athletics, Purinton arrived in Jonesboro and immediately began establishing a culture of success and transparent communication while building his administration and addressing major multimedia and apparel contracts that required prompt attention.

He successfully navigated the transition, hiring key personnel to fill executive and senior-level positions within the development, marketing, finance and compliance areas while restructuring internally to create more effective and efficient work flow and production. During the same time, he renegotiated lucrative agreements with multimedia rights holder LEARFIELD and adidas while also entering a partnership with Amplify to create a holistic revenue solution designed to serve Red Wolves fans.

In addition to committing resources and implementing new initiatives to improve competitive and academic performance, Purinton achieved his goal to strengthen communication and relationships with new and existing fans, donors and alumni through strategic plans by both the Athletics Department and the Red Wolves Foundation. He created monthly "State of the Pack" newsletters and then expanded it to include the Red Wolves' first live and interactive web event open to the public.

Purinton also brought back A-State's coaching caravan tour and rebranded it "Howl on Wheels," spearheaded improved communication by the Red Wolves Foundation and reimagined special

donor events and fan-engagement opportunities, such as turning the football team's spring game into an all-day "Pack Day" celebration. Under his direction, A-State continues to formulate new ways to enhance the game-day experience for all its sports.

His emphasis on the student-athlete experience has been just as strong, meeting both traditional needs and those associated with the Cost of Attendance (COA), Name Image and Likeness (NIL) and transfer-portal era. Not only did he create A-State's first position with a designated "NIL Initiatives" component, he has given the Red Wolves' Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) more ownership and flexibility to improve annual events such as the student-athlete "Welcome Back" and "State Awards" events, which were met with enthusiasm.

During his first year alone at A-State, the Red Wolves earned six conference championships, collected a top-50 finish in the women's Capital One Cup standings, posted the second highest finish among all Sun Belt Conference schools in the LEARFIELD Director's Cup standings, and claimed national runner-up honors in women's bowling. A-State made multiple NCAA postseason appearances on its way to recording its sixth highest finish in the history of the Director's Cup.

The Red Wolves' have performed at a high level academically under Purinton and his academic-support staff with over 200 student-athletes earning a spot on the Athletics Director's Honor Roll during both the fall 2022 and spring 2023 semesters. The 210 appearing on the list this past spring represented 70 percent of all student-athletes, while 62 of them earned a 4.0 – the most for a spring term in over a decade. At least nine teams produced a 3.0 or higher GPA, and the football program compiled a 3.14 team mark that was the highest in program history.

Purinton has received high marks to managing coaching transitions as well. Carrying out one of his first major acts as VCIA, he tabbed Bryan Hodgson, regarded as one of the top recruiters and assistant coaches in the nation with 15-plus years of experience at the collegiate level, to lead the Red Wolves' men's basketball program. The hire was met with high acclaim both nationally and by the A-State fan base, generating more than 1.55 million impressions on social media.

Purinton has and continues to serve on many prestigious committees, acting as a strong voice for student-athletes and intercollegiate athletics at the national, conference and campus levels. His first year at Arkansas State saw him appointed to the Sun Belt Conference's Women's Basketball Strategic Communications Committee, and he also serves on multiple Arkansas State University strategic planning committees.

Purinton continues to evaluate and process information to strengthen A-State's national brand, and has already established a strong foundation

for the future success of A-State Athletics.

In addition to Alabama, Purinton's path to Jonesboro also included professional stops working with the Orange Bowl Committee (2006-07) and the Florida State Athletics Department (1994-2006) while also having a national presence on multiple college football committees.

Purinton served as Alabama's Executive Deputy Director of Athletics after being elevated to the position in 2021, he also held Deputy AD (2019-21), Executive Associate AD (2018-19), Senior Associate AD (2015-18) and Associate Athletics Director for Football Communications (2007-15) titles during his time with the Crimson Tide.

While operating as Executive Deputy Director of Athletics, Purinton was the sport administrator for football as well as the men's and women's golf programs after previously overseeing men's basketball. Additionally, he supervised several departments within athletics, including human resources, marketing and trademark licensing and was the liaison to Crimson Tide Sports Marketing, Alabama's LEARFIELD property.

When current Alabama Director of Athletics Greg Byrne was hired to lead the Crimson Tide in 2017, Purinton was charged with the creation and implementation of the department's new strategic plan. He served on the leadership group that helped develop and launch the department's new fundraising initiative (The Crimson Standard) with a 10-year goal of raising \$600 million. The first phase of the campaign included renovations to both football locker rooms, the Sports Science Center at the Mal M. Moore Athletic Facility, Rhoads Softball Stadium, as well as recruiting and premium areas at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

Alabama football won six national championships in Purinton's time at UA and took home numerous team and individual national awards. Widely known as one of the best venues in college football, Purinton oversaw the revision of the football game-day production in 2017, improving the overall atmosphere and interaction from the crowd at Bryant-Denny Stadium. Part of that process included the implementation of new LED stadium lighting in 2019, which received positive reviews from both the players and fans.

In March of 2019, Purinton assisted Byrne in the search for a new head men's basketball coach that resulted in the hiring of Nate Oats from Buffalo. In Oats' second season at Alabama (and first full season), the 2020-21 team won both the regular-season and Southeastern Conference Tournament championships for the first time in 30 years and later advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 and finished No. 5 in the final national rankings. Herb Jones was named SEC Player of the Year and earned All-America honors, while Oats was voted the SEC Coach of the Year. The 2021-22 squad once again advanced to the NCAA Tournament. In 2018, the Tide men's basketball team received

an NCAA Tournament bid for the first time since 2012 and earned its first NCAA win since 2006.

In addition to working with several of Alabama's successful athletics teams, Purinton was the department oversight to one of the top LEARFIELD/IMG College groups in the nation in Crimson Tide Sports Marketing. CTSM was selected as the 2017 LEARFIELD Property of the Year after setting record-highs in revenue generation. Alabama has also ranked in the top two in royalties generated among the Collegiate Licensing Company's partner institutions each of the last 11 years and was No. 1 in five of the last six seasons.

In 2021, Alabama football's social media accounts each eclipsed the 1 million follower threshold, becoming the only college athletics team to reach this feat on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram. Combined, Alabama athletics social channels generated north of 1.1 billion impressions in 2020. With ties to social media and some of the other external units, Purinton is on the department's committee responsible for Alabama's plan for name, image and likeness and assisted with the creation of The Advantage, a comprehensive program that provides Tide student-athletes with the education and tools necessary to build and elevate their personal brands.

Purinton was hired at Alabama in the summer of 2007 as the Associate Athletics Director for Football Communications, handling all external areas of the program for Coach Nick Saban. He has coordinated each of the 12 ESPN College GameDay visits to Tuscaloosa as Alabama has hosted the show more than any other school during that time frame. In addition to building and maintaining relationships with national media and the marketing/promotion of Crimson Tide football, Purinton helped strategize and implement plans for the Crimson Caravan (spring booster tour). He was promoted to oversee all external areas within the department as well as the Crimson Tide Celebrity Golf Tournament beginning in June of 2015.

In 2006, Purinton was hired by the Orange Bowl Committee (OBC) as the Director of Media Relations and Communications. That year, the OBC eclipsed attendance and revenue goals for the Basketball Classic, Fan Fest, Pregame Tailgate Party and Fed Ex Orange Bowl (Louisville versus Wake Forest). Purinton also produced a weekly Orange Bowl radio show and a television program that featured the bowl-sponsored youth football initiative. He led planning for the 2009 BCS National Championship Game which included a \$14 million media budget.

Prior to the Orange Bowl and Alabama, Purinton spent more than a decade at Florida State University working in various roles in the athletics department. He began as a student assistant in sports information during his undergraduate years, and followed up as a graduate assistant in

1998. He was promoted to a full-time role as assistant SID in 1999, where he worked directly with two of the winningest coaches in college history in Head Football Coach Bobby Bowden and Head Baseball Coach Mike Martin. In addition to the baseball and football SID duties, Purinton was the travel advance coordinator for the football program from 1999-2006.

In total, Purinton worked with 12 bowl teams at FSU including the 2000 Sugar Bowl where FSU defeated Virginia Tech to win the 1999 national title. He made two trips to the College World Series as the SID for the Seminole baseball program (1999 and 2000). In the 1999 season with FSU baseball, Marshall McDougall set the NCAA record with six home runs in a single game, and that team went on to finish runner-up at the national championship. From 2004-06, Purinton was the primary Sports Information Director for football.

Purinton has served on several College Football National Championship Game media coordination committees while working at Alabama and the Orange Bowl and was a member of the College Football 150th Anniversary Committee. He has successfully helped promote four Heisman Trophy winning campaigns (Chris Weinke at Florida State; Mark Ingram, Derrick Henry, DeVonta Smith at Alabama) along with a Campbell Trophy winner (Barrett Jones at Alabama).

Purinton is a member of the National Association of Collegiate Director of Athletics and the Football Writers Associate of America. He was a 2019 NEXT UP honoree by CollegeAD and was selected to attend the NACDA AD Mentoring Institute (2017 & 2019) and the Lead1 Institute (2018). From 2016-17, Purinton served as the athletics department coordinator for the University's United Way campaign.

A native of Palatka, Fla., Purinton received his bachelor's degree in sports management and master's in athletics administration at Florida State University. He and his wife Julie have two daughters, Jillian and Josie.

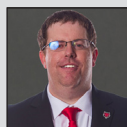

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FACILITIES: Media facilities in First National Bank Arena consist of an area at floor level on the east side of the court for radio and television broadcasters and a designated area for reporters on the concourse level in the northwest side of the arena (Blue portal). A television-film booth located high on the east side of the arena. There is also a Media Room located on the west side open to the press before, during and after games. Admittance to these areas is by special credential issued only by the A-State Athletics Media Relations Office.

CREDENTIALS: Credentials for home games are provided to those members of the media who are covering the game in a full working capacity. Requests with names should be submitted in writing on company letterhead. Passes will be mailed to valid applicants as long as time permits; otherwise, passes may be claimed at the Media Entrance on the east side of the arena (Lower Green Entrance). Spouses, dates, children and non-workers are NOT permitted in the media areas. Passes must be displayed at all times, and A-State reserves the right to revoke passes and privileges at any time due to misrepresentation or misconduct. Requests for road game credentials may be made through the A-State Media Relations Women's Basketball SID or through the host institution SID.

PARKING: A limited number of parking spaces are available to members of the media on a paved lot adjacent to the Media Entrance (Lower Green Entrance) on the east side of the arena, Lot "A". Parking is on a first-come, first-serve basis for women's basketball games.

ENTRY: Media representatives with proper A-State issued credentials will be allowed entrance ONLY at the Media Entrance (Lower Green Entrance) on the east side of First National Bank Arena. This is also the main entry to the athletics offices and is adjacent to the Media parking area.

GAME SERVICES: Programs, notes, reference guides, statistical packets, and live statistics (Stat Broadcast) are provided. Complimentary light refreshments and food will be available before and throughout the game.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Photographers are not allowed to shoot from in front of the team benches nor from the catwalk above the floor (for security, insurance and safety reasons). Along the end lines, photographers must stay behind the broken line and clear from the free throw lane. Credentials are required to shoot from courtside. Certified photographers of newspapers, magazines, wire services and TV stations must request passes in writing. No credentials will be issued to freelance photographers.

INTERVIEWS: Head Coach Destinee Rogers will be available in the media room after each game, following a brief team meeting. A-State student-athletes will also be available by request at this time. The A-State women's basketball locker room is CLOSED to the media following games. 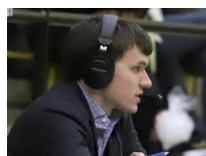

INJURY INFORMATION POLICY: A student-athlete's protected health information is protected by federal regulations under either the Health Information Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) or the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (the Buckley Amendment) and may not be disclosed without either the student-athlete's authorization under HIPAA or their consent under the Buckley Amendment. Authorized/consented injury information pertaining to a student-athlete shall be released to the media through the Athletics Media Relations Department after being authorized by the athletic trainer. It's also appropriate in post-game or weekly press conferences for head coaches to announce team injury updates. It's the policy of the Department of Athletics to provide accurate information on injuries and not withhold injury information from the media. Team physicians may be available to offer explanation on injuries if requested by the athletic trainer. Any sideline or locker room report made to the media shall be made by an athletic trainer, team physician, or a media relations staff representative.

RADIO: Radio broadcasts of Red Wolves women's basketball will be on the EAB Red Wolves Sports Network and will also be available over the Internet. Cade Carlton is entering his third season as the voice of A-State Women's Basketball. The visiting team's "official" radio station, as designated by the visitors' SID, will be permitted origination privileges. A courtesy line is provided courtside. Any questions regarding broadcasts or the use of facilities should be directed to Caleb Garner, Director for Media Relations.

DIRECTIONS TO FIRST NATIONAL BANK ARENA

FROM MEMPHIS INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT:

Start going toward the Airport Exit on Winchester Road. Bear right on Plough Boulevard for 1.4 miles. Take ramp onto I-240 West toward I-240 Little Rock/Downtown for 2.6 miles. Continue on I-55 North for 6.1 miles. Take the St. Louis/Little Rock exit on I-55 North and go 24.4 miles. Take exit 23B/Marked Tree/Jonesboro onto US-63 for 0.5 miles. Continue on US-63 North for 41 miles. Take ramp toward Caraway Road/Red Wolf Boulevard for 0.2 miles. Bear right on Red Wolf Boulevard and go 2.2 miles. Turn left on Aggie Road and then take a right on Olympic Drive and First National Bank Arena will be on the left. Parking is available to members of the media on a paved lot adjacent to the Media Entrance on the east side of the arena, Lot "A".

FROM LITTLE ROCK NATIONAL AIRPORT:

Leaving the airport on East Roosevelt Road go 0.3 miles and continue on Annie M. Bankhead Drive for another 0.4 miles. Turn left to take ramp onto I-440 East toward I-40 for 11.3 miles. Take the Jacksonville exit onto US-67 North and go 96.5 miles. Turn right on AR-226E and go 11.7 miles. Turn right on Co. Road 203. Turn left on US-49 for 6.5 miles. Take ramp onto US-63 South and go 2.7 miles until taking the Stadium/Red Wolf Boulevard exit for 0.2 miles. Turn left on Red Wolf Boulevard and go 2.2 miles. Turn left on Aggie Road and then take a right on Olympic Drive and First National Bank Arena will be on the left. Parking is available to members of the media on a paved lot adjacent to the Media Entrance on the east side of the arena, Lot "A".
