SUN DEVILS HOST REBS, DOGS AT WHITEMAN

TEMPE – Arizona State will welcome UNLV for the second straight season, and the Gonzaga Bulldogs to the Whiteman Tennis Center for the first time this weekend, looking to continue a solid start to the 2018 campaign.

“It’s nice to be back at home and I think both teams are going to give us a really good challenge,” coach Sheila McInerney said. “UNLV was ranked pretty high last year and they played a good match against us here. They’ve got three starters from last year back and they did quite well at the kickoff in Berkeley beating Mississippi State and had a close loss to a good Cal team.”

The Devils have had a successful run against the Rebels in their history, winning all 19 of the matchups and five since 2000. The last time UNLV came to Tempe, the Sun Devils dropped just one match on their way to a 6-1 dual match win last March.

“Gonzaga went up to Michigan and played tough,” McInerney said. “They got a singles win and two of the other games went to three sets so they certainly played Michigan about as tough as we did. We’re expecting some challenging matches.”

The Bulldogs will play UNLV Saturday in Tempe before their first ever matchup with the Devils Sunday morning.

Last season, the Zags rolled through the WCC with a 7-2 record and fell in the final to No. 11 Pepperdine, but put two individuals and a doubles pairing on the al-WCC team.

Not to be outshined, head coach Kevin Cory’s Rebs managed to also make a run to the final in their conference tournament before being stopped by the Spartans of San Jose State.

Once again, the Devils will likely be led by sophomore Ilze Hattingh on court one, who has battled her fair share of elite talent already in this young season.

“There’s very little difference between our one and our six, we’re a really solid, even team,” McInerney said. “But I think Ilze has a little more experience than some of the others because she’s played a lot internationally. We can flip the lineup around a little bit and we’ll see how the season plays out.”

Although Hattingh is 1-4 on the season, three of her four defeats have come against women ranked in the top-35 nationally, and her loss to No. 89 Ida Jarlskog nearly went to a third-set tiebreak.

TEAM NOTES

RANKINGS UPDATE

A split in Stillwater against No. 18 Oklahoma State and RV TCU helped the Sun Devils jump two spots in the latest Oracle/ITA ranking to No. 20.

Over in the first USTA poll of the season, Arizona State debuted at No. 22, but was still the fourth-highest ranked team in the Pac-12.

The agreed No. 1 team in the nation, Stanford, leads the Pac-12, while UCLA and Cal slot in at Nos. 13 and 14, respectively. Washington debuted in the poll for the first time this season at No. 24.

The first individual and doubles rankings of 2018 will be released next month, and the Devils currently have one active representative on the list in No. 83 Savannah Slaysman, but she isn't expected to be the only one for long after a blazing start to the season from freshmen Lauryn John-Baptiste (5-1) and Sasa Klanecek (4-2).

Three of John-Baptiste's wins this season have been against ranked opponents, including a No. 23 Felicity Maltby of Texas Tech.

THE ROAD TO 500

Sun Devil head coach and American tennis legend Sheila McInerney has been the epitome of consistency and success, having made 30-straight NCAA tournaments, all while at ASU.

She is the joint-longest tenured coach in school history, and is closing in on yet another career milestone with the Sun Devils: 500 career wins.

The stellar record can be attributed to a consistent run of 12-straight seasons with records above .500, and only two losing seasons since she was handed the reigns in 1985.

McInerney entered 2018 with 495 dual match wins, winning 63 percent of her matches since 1985, and moved to 497, including a win over No. 24 TCU. She is currently sixth on the list for most wins by a coach in ASU history, and 14 wins away from the top-five.

FANTASTIC FRESHMEN

The 2018 version of the Sun Devils is a young one with three freshmen expected to play pivotal roles in ASU's success this season, and so far they have stepped up to the challenge.

Lauryn John-Baptiste has led the way for the freshman group, getting off to a hot start to singles play by rolling through the Michigan Invitational and scoring three wins over ranked opponents so far.

Slovenia's Sasa Klanecek dropped her first two matches of the season, but has won her last four and has four doubles wins on the season with senior Nicole Fossa Huergo.

Although the duo of freshman Tereza Kolarova and Savannah Slaysman fell in the squad's dual match opener, ASU's No. 28 doubles duo already has a win this season over another top-25 opponent from the Michigan Invitational in early January.

Kolarova also recorded the first singles point of the season for the Sun Devils against Northern Arizona as she took care of her opponent on court five 6-0, 6-1, and has since picked up one more win and nearly swept Marie Norris of TCU before the match was declared unfinished.

GET TO KNOW THE ZAGS

The 2018 Gonzaga Bulldog women's tennis team is led by 14-year head coach D.J. Gurule, and came into the year after one of the greatest seasons in school history that ended with a runner-up finish in the WCC Championships.

This season, the Zags have wins over Montana State and Brown, and fell to No. 10 Michigan at Michigan in the opening round of the ITA Kickoff Weekend.

GET TO KNOW THE REBS

It's a short drive across one time zone for the Rebels from the bright lights of Las Vegas to Tempe, so for the second time in as many seasons, head coach Kevin Cory is bringing his Rebels to The Valley to square off.

The Rebs return three starters from a season ago that saw them make a run to the MWC title match and finish 18-8 overall.

They only dropped four matches from beginning of March until the end of April last year, including a defeat to Arizona State, and they come into this year's matchup at 3-1 with their only loss on the year coming at the hands of No. 11 Cal in Berkley, 4-3.

HEAD COACH SHEILA MCINERNEY



In the past 33 years, Sheila McInerney has seen a vast amount of change at Arizona State, from new athletic directors, new head coaches, schools added to the conference, and numerous renovations to athletic facilities. Through the countless changes across Arizona State, McInerney has continued to lead the women's tennis program in a successful direction heading into her 33rd season.

In Arizona State's history, no coach has the number of accolades that Sheila McInerney has accumulated during her 33-year tenure as a Sun Devil. Since her first season as head coach in 1985, Sun Devil women's tennis has won 495 matches, advanced to 31 of 32 NCAA Tournaments, including 29 straight, and has finished each season in the top 38 nationally. That's the second most wins by any Arizona State coach in school history. In the 2016 season, McInerney was named the Southwest Region Coach of the Year by the ITA, as well as the Pac-12 Coach of the Year. She also was awarded the 2016 ITA Meritorious Service Award, which is given to an ITA coach who has gone "above and beyond" in their commitment and contributions to the ITA and college tennis in general.

In recent years, Arizona State's tennis program has continued to thrive on and off the court. On the court, the Sun Devils have 86 wins against ranked opponents since 2008. Leading the way for the tennis program have been 45 All-Americans and 41 All-Pac-12 student-athletes. Of these integral players in Arizona State's history, there have been 40 players ranked in the Top 50 of the singles season-end ranking and 21 in the Top 25 of the doubles season-end ranking.

In the classroom, McInerney has recruited bright student-athletes. She has had four Academic All-Americans, 45 ITA Scholar-Athletes (since 2002), and 80 Academic All-Pac 12 student-athletes (since 1991). Of those 45 ITA Scholar-Athletes, four were named in 2015 – Alexandra Osborne, Aubria Solares, Gussie O'Sullivan and Cassidy Jump. Her players have had majors such as Bioscience, Business Management, Criminal Justice and Criminology, English, Journalism, Kinesiology, Marketing, Political Science, and Sociology.

McInerney has also been fundamental in helping players' development to reach high achievements in the NCAA. Among the achievements include Jacqueline Cako named Arizona State Female Athlete of the Year (2013), Michelle Brycki awarded Cissie Leary ITA National Sportsmanship Award (2012), Kelcy McKenna selected as the Pac-12 Post-Graduate Scholar (2011), four singles and four doubles All-Americans since 2009, 14 players ranked in the singles season-end ranking and seven doubles teams ranked in the doubles season-end ranking since 2009.



Prior to coming to Arizona State, McInerney served as assistant women's tennis coach at the University of Southern California during the 1983-84 season, in which the Trojans were NCAA finalists. In addition to her success as a collegiate coach, McInerney has traveled with various USTA junior and national teams. At the 1986 Goodwill Games, McInerney coached the team to gold and silver medals. In 1987, she led the U.S. Pan American Games doubles squad to a gold medal.

McInerney attended USC, where she captained the Trojans during her senior season. The four-time All-American also was a four-time Trojan Spirit Award winner, as voted by her teammates. The Trojans won three national championships during McInerney's collegiate career, and she was the national collegiate doubles runner-up three times and a singles semifinalist in 1977. McInerney collected a half-dozen USTA national titles and was a member of the 1977-80 USTA Junior Federation Cup team. As a professional, she played on the major international tour, earning a world ranking in the top 75. McInerney competed at three grand slam venues -- Wimbledon, French Open and the U.S. Open where she reached the round of 32. She also served a short term as assistant pro at the highly acclaimed L.A. Tennis Club.

McInerney earned a bachelor's degree in public relations from the University of Southern California in 1980. A member of the Dean's List at USC, she won the USC Postgraduate Scholarship Award, the USC Junior Student-Athlete and Senior Student-Athlete awards.

Matt Langley

Head coach Sheila McInerney announced in 2015 that Matt Langley would join the program as an assistant coach and in 2017, Langley was named associate head coach.

Langley joined the Sun Devils from Middle Tennessee State University, his alma mater, where he most recently served as assistant coach for its women's tennis program. At MTSU, Langley helped coach the Blue Raiders to one of their best seasons in program history, recording a 19-5 overall record, 7-1 in Conference USA competition.

A member of the MTSU men's tennis team from 2009-12, Langley was a two-year co-captain and three-time Sun Belt Conference Champion, earning two Most Outstanding Player honors at the Sun Belt Conference Championships. Langley also recorded three career appearances at the NCAA Championships.

Langley graduated from MTSU with a degree in exercise science, and was a two-time Academic All-American and ITA Scholar-Athlete.



Ebony Panoho is a graduate student assistant for the Sun Devil women's tennis program and former Sun Devil tennis standout. The Brisbane, Australia native won the Pac-12 doubles championship in her senior season with teammate Alexandra Osborne to give ASU its first conference doubles title. She once partnered with 2003 U.S. Open champion Andy Roddick for a mixed doubles exhibition match.



Alexandra Osborne recently graduated from Arizona State after an illustrious career on the court for the Sun Devils. Along with claiming ASU's first ever conference doubles title, Osborne earned the Bill Kajikawa Female Athlete of the Year Award during her senior season, and earned the honor of ITA scholar athlete in 2016 as a junior. She is a native of Sydney, Australia.



Lindy Kyger is the Sun Devils' athletic trainer. She joined ASU this past fall after graduating from the University of South Carolina with a degree in athletic training in 2017. Kryger was born in Pennsylvania, grew up in Massachusetts. She will graduate in 2019 with a master's in higher and post secondary education.
