Before arriving at ASU, Hill spent the previous four seasons as the head coach of the University of South Florida, leading the Bulls to three consecutive AAC team championships and a No. 17 final ranking among Division I programs this past season. USF advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the third straight season in 2016 after qualifying just twice in 10 previous campaigns prior to Hill's arrival.

Prior to his time at South Florida, Hill had two successful stops at a pair of nationally ranked SEC programs in Mississippi State and Alabama. Hill will be the Sun Devil program's first head coach since Lou Belken led the program from 1983 through 2008.

The 2016 Bulls reached a program-best ranking of No. 13 in the nation before finishing in the Top 20 at No. 17. Hill coached two-time All-American Roberto Cid to a ranking of No. 2 in the nation, the best ranking of any tennis player, men's or women's, in program history. USF also played one of the toughest schedules, notching 16 wins over ranked opponents and playing just four matches against unranked foes.

In 2015, Hill guided the Bulls to their best finish as USF advanced to the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA tournament after winning their second-straight conference championship while Oliver Prammings earned Most Outstanding Player honors.

The Bulls won the inaugural American Athletic Conference tournament in 2014 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Hill coached Cid to the first-ever All-America honor in USF history as he made an impressive run in the NCAA singles tournament.

An accomplished recruiter, Hill took over the USF program and immediately brought in five players in his first recruiting class that were either ranked among the top 100 juniors in the world or had already earned professional ATP points. His 2013 and 2016 recruiting classes were both ranked in



the top 10 in the nation.

Additionally, Hill oversaw the start of a capital fundraising campaign geared toward a \$3 million renovation of the tennis facility and personally helped secure over half a million dollars toward that goal.

During Hill's five years as an assistant coach at Mississippi State, he helped the Bulldogs improve from a No. 58 ranking in 2008 and a No. 72 ranking in 2009 to top 20 finishes in his final two seasons, including a No. 11 final ranking in 2012 – the program's best finish since 1998. The Bulldogs posted the program's best record (20-7) since that same 1998 squad went 21-5.

MSU earned a No. 20 final ranking in 2011 after producing a 14-9 record, while winning the SEC Western Division title with an 8-3 mark. Hill was instrumental in helping five Bulldogs to All-SEC honors, while supporting Per Nilsson to SEC Coach of the Year honors. He was recognized for his efforts by being named ITA Southern Region Assistant Coach of the Year and SEC Assistant Coach of the Year.

Hill's recruiting prowess shined with the Bulldogs as he served as the team's recruiting coordinator, bringing in seven players that were either ranked in the top 100 among the world's juniors or became ranked in the top 125 players in the country upon arriving at Mississippi State. His 2009 recruiting class was ranked 13th in the nation.

While at MSU, Hill and the Bulldog staff had one of just three programs with five singles players ranked in the Top-75 nationally while his efforts in promoting the team helped grow the fan base by over 600 percent with the Bulldogs ranked in the top 5 nationally in average attendance during the 2009 and 2011 seasons.

Prior to joining the Bulldogs' staff, Hill served as a volunteer assistant coach at Alabama for two seasons. He helped the Crimson Tide improve from a No. 56 final ranking the season before he joined the staff to a No. 14 ranking in 2007, his second year with the program. Hill helped coach five nationally ranked players and helped Alabama reach two NCAA Tournaments during his stint, including a trip to the round of 16 in 2007.

A native of Holt, Mich., Hill earned a degree in business marketing with a specialization in professional tennis management from Ferris State University in 2005 and a master's degree in human performance from Alabama in 2007. Also a member of the tennis team while at Ferris State, Hill helped lead the Bulldogs to the NCAA Division II quarterfinals for the first time in school history.

STAFF BIOGRAPHIES



MICHAL KOKTA // ASSISTANT COACH

Kokta joined Matt Hill's staff after a two-year stint at Purdue where he was instrumental in helping the Boilermakers improve their record from 4-20 to 17-10 in the span of a year.

Prior to his appointment at Purdue Kokta was at Baylor where he served as volunteer coach at his alma mater for three seasons. During his three seasons, Baylor captured a pair of Big 12 Conference regular season titles and won the Big 12 Championship in 2014. The Bears advanced to the Round of 16 at the NCAA Championships in 2012 and 2013, followed by a quarterfinal appearance in 2014.

Prior to his collegiate career Kokta was ranked as high as No. 8 in singles and #3 in doubles in the ITF's juniors rankings. He reached the semifinals of the Australian Open juniors in singles, the semifinals of Wimbledon juniors in doubles, and was the European junior doubles champion. After juniors, Kokta was ranked as high as #356 ATP in singles and #480 in doubles.



DOM COTRONE // VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT

Cotrone is a volunteer assistant for the Sun Devil men's tennis program and a former USF tennis standout.

The Bradenton, Fla. native played under Coach Hill during the 2016 season. Cotrone became the second All-American in USF history, advancing to the round of 16 at the NCAA singles tournament during his senior season while posting a 13-7 singles record.

Cotrone played in tandem with current Sun Devil Justin Roberts, with the two recording a 16-5 record in tandem during his final season at South Florida

Cotrone amassed a 10-19 singles record and 30-15 doubles record on the pro circuit, notching four professional doubles wins. Two wins came in 2015 at the USA F18 Futures and USA F22 Futures, while Cotrone recorded the other two in 2016 at the Italy F30 Futures and USA F37 Futures.

PROGRAM HISTORY

- Began as a club sport in 1902, making it the second oldest sport to be played on ASU's campus, following only by football (1897).

- From 1903 to 1931, men's tennis was undergoing a metamorphosis from a club sport to an intercollegiate sport, as seen in 1913 when there was a competition in both. In that year, the Tempe Normal team lost a dual match to the University of Arizona while the interclass senior team won the cup for the third year in a row.

- In 1932, Arizona State Teachers College (ASTC) became part of the Border Conference and hired its first full-time coach, Earle Pomeroy. Pomeroy led the Bulldogs to a 7-3-1 record the following year, the first winning tennis season in ASU history.

- Unclear or nonexistent records typify Arizona State's experience in the Border Conference. However, coach's Pomeroy and Marlowe Keith each posted back-to-back fourth place finishes, Pomeroy in 1941 and '42 and Keith in 1957 and '58.

- Charles Roach (1951-52), Fred Hickernell (1951-53) and Bob Gilbert (1952-54) were stalwarts in the Sun Devil lineup during the Border Conference days.

- Moved into the WAC in 1963 under coach Ted Bredehoff, who also coached wrestling at Arizona State from 1962-71.

- Among numerous others, former Sun Devil All-Americans John Fort (1971) and Mark Joffey (1975) helped ASU accumulate a 253-107-1 (.700) record in the WAC.

- Sent four singles players and two doubles teams to four NCAA Championships in a row (1973-76).

- Marty Pincus coached the men's tennis team to three first-place finishes in the WAC (1975, '76, '78). In 1976, the Sun Devils posted their best NCAA finish ever-fifth.

- During the Pincus era, ASU compiled a 161-31 (.839) record, giving him the second-highest winning percentage among coaches of NCAA-sanctioned sports at ASU.

- Entered the Pacific-10 Southern Division in 1979.

- As ASU men's tennis entered the 1980s, Myron McNamara was named head coach and Gary Donnelly was just beginning his ASU tennis career. Donnelly, who played under the watchful eye of ASU's current head coach Lou Belken at Scottsdale Racquet Club, went on to achieve fame as a doubles finalist at Wimbledon in 1986. He also competed in the doubles semifinals at the 1985 U.S. Open and the 1987 French Open. His singles career has been highlighted by his appearance in the round of 16 at the 1985 U.S. Open.

- Lou Belken was named head tennis coach in 1983. He is the second-winningest coach in the Sun Devil annals with 144 victories. In 1988, Belken's Devils, led by Doug Sachs, posted 18-9 record, a fourth-place finish in the conference (ASU's best ever), and an 11th-place finish at the NCAAAs. ASU was ranked 11th in the nation and the Sachs earned All-American accolades.

- Dave Lomicky and Joel Finnigan won the 1989 U.S. Amateur doubles championship, while future Sun Devil Chris Gambino reached the semifinals in singles action.

- In 1990, ASU had four national champions: Finnigan, Lomicky, Brian Gyetko and Ross Matheson. Finnigan captured the U.S. Amateur singles crown, while Lomicky won the 1990

National Amateur Indoor singles championship. Gyetko was crowned the Canadian National singles champion and Matheson earned the Scottish National singles and doubles titles.

- In 1991, Belken led the Sun Devils to their best season ever during his reign, compiling a 21-10 record, and a quarterfinal berth at the NAATs. Brian Gyetko, who in 1990 became the first ASU tennis player to earn All-American acclaim in singles and doubles in the same year, duplicated the feat in 1991. Gyetko reached the quarterfinals of singles action at the NAATs (the farthest advancement by an ASU player since Mark Joffey in 1975) and the round of 16 in doubles with Lomicky.

- In 1995, Sargis Sargsian became the first Sun Devil to win the NCAA Tournament, defeating USC's Brett Hansen in the finals 3-6, 6-3, 6-4. It was Sargsian's fourth collegiate Grand Slam title, which was more than any other player in collegiate tennis history.

- The 1997 doubles tandem of Ed Carter and Sergio Elias entered the first round of the NCAA championships with an at large bid, and proceeded to defeat the second-seeded team from Fresno State 6-3, 6-4. The duo went on to the second round of the championships, but was defeated.

- The 1998 Sun Devils earned a NCAA postseason berth for the eighth time in the past 11 years. Additionally, ASU posted its biggest win in several seasons, knocking off No. 6 ranked USC, 4-3.

- Earning its first big to the round of 16 team championship since 1995, ASU's 1999 team steamrolled its way through regional play only to fall to Illinois in the quarterfinals. The doubles team of Ed Carter and Jeff Williams earned All-American acclaim after finishing 10th in the country. Senior Gustavo Marcaccio advanced to the Pac-10 singles final for the first time since Sargis Sargsian in '95. The Sun Devils also recorded the school's first victory over UCLA, a 4-3 decision in Tempe.

- In their first season back since 2008, the Sun Devils amassed a 14-11 record and a NCAA tournament berth. ASU bowed out in the first round after a 4-0 loss to No. 18 Baylor, but senior Michaël Geerts represented the first Sun Devil since before 2004.

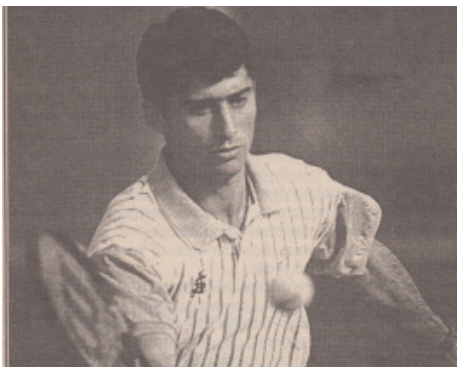
