Devils Prepare for Pac-12 Battles in the Bay Area

TEMPE - After coming up short of a couple of upsets against the Southern California schools on the first weekend of Pac-12 play, Arizona State heads to Northern California this weekend, looking to stop a three-match slide and win its first conference match of 2019.

The task doesn't get easier as the Sun Devils not only hit the road for this weekend's contests, but also have defending national champion No. 5 Stanford and 14th-ranked California awaiting them in the Bay Area.

"Cal and Stanford this weekend are a couple more great challenges for the team on the road," associate head coach Matt Langley said. "Those matches last weekend were tough and even though we didn't come away with the wins, they were good for the team. This weekend will be just as tough, so it's a chance to see how well we can rebound."

ASU has only defeated Stanford twice in program history with its last win coming fairly recently, back at Whiteman in 2016. The lopsided series history is a trend with the Cardinal, though, as it has been one of the most dominant programs in NCAA athletics in its 44-year history. Stanford has more NCAA titles (19) and undefeated seasons (10) than it has seasons with five or more losses (8).

On the other side of the Bay, 14th-ranked Cal is enjoying its best start to a season since 2017. One of their six wins came against the Sun Devils earlier in the season, but the Bears will likely see a different ASU squad hit the courts at the Hellman Tennis Complex Saturday.

"This time around, it'll be a different look," Langley said. "Last time we had a couple of injuries and this time we're anticipating that they'll be playing and that adds a different dynamic to our team makeup."

In their last meeting, the Devils were shorthanded for singles play with Lauryn John-Baptiste, Sammi Hampton and Sasa Klanecek out. Hampton and John-Baptiste have returned to the regular lineup, and the latter is heading into the weekend fresh off her third career Pac-12 weekly honor.

When the Bears visited Tempe last season, the Devils shut them out 4-0 in dominant fashion to record their first win over Cal in seven years.

The first match of the weekend will be against the Cardinal in Palo Alto at 1:30 p.m. PT. ASU will cross the Bay for a Saturday Showdown in Berkeley at noon. Results will be available on the hosts' respective websites, and a recap will be posted following the conclusion of the matches.

John-Baptiste Snags Pac-12 Weekly Honor

After a dominant weekend against opponents from UCLA and USC, Sun Devil sophomore Lauryn John-Baptiste has been named as the Pac-12 Women's Tennis Player of the Week, the conference announced Tuesday.

The honor is John-Baptiste's third in her short tenure as a Devil as the England international earned two as a freshman for ASU back in 2018.

John-Baptiste opened the weekend with a doubles win on court one with her All-American doubles partner Ilze Hattingh.

The No. 6 duo in the nation outlasted UCLA's top doubles squad No. 16 Bolton/Hart, 7-5, to help ASU take the doubles point. John-Baptiste would go on to upset No. 10 Elysia Bolton in singles play on court two, besting the Bruin frosh in a comeback three-set win, 3-6, 6-4, 6-2.

Saturday's match against USC started the same for John-Baptiste/Hattingh as they handled No. 13 Valdes/Kulikov, 6-2, on court one.

John-Baptiste took on Rianna Valdes on court two and picked up wins in back-to-back outings for the first time this season.

The weekly honor is ASU's first on the women's side this season.

Last Time Out

Despite securing the doubles point to jump into early leads against No. 6 UCLA and No. 14 Southern Cal, the Sun Devils came up short in their Pac-12 openers dropping the match to the Bruins 4-2 and suffering a heartbreaker to the Trojans 4-3.

The losses were highlighted with a phenomenal weekend of play from Lauryn John-Baptiste who won both of her singles matches and combined with Ilze Hattingh to win two doubles matches as well. For her outstanding play, she was named as the Pac-12 Player of the Week.

Alicea/Hampton won both of their doubles matches on court three against the LA schools to help put the Devils into the driver's seat heading into singles play.

While John-Baptiste picked up the only singles win Friday, Savannah Slaysman snapped her four-match winless streak Saturday to put ASU within a point of topping the 14th-ranked Trojans.

The Opposition: Stanford and California

Both of the Bay Area schools have proven to be a thorn in ASU's side in the past as each program owns a large lead in the series history.

Stanford has been the more dominant of the sides, owning a 56-2 record against the Devils. But Stanford has been at the top of the NCAA for decades, losing more than six matches only once in its 44-year history. The Cardinal once went more than 12 years between home losses and have won 27 conference titles.

Current head coach Lele Forood has been in charge in Palo Alto since 2001 and has accumulated more than 400 wins and nine NCAA team titles in her tenure.

This year, the fifth-ranked defending champions are on the title hunt again and have the roster to do it with eight women ranked in the ITA top-125.

An hour north in Berkeley, Amanda Augustus is in her 12th season leading her Alma Mater.

Cal puts four women in the ITA top-125, with two women in the top-25 alone.

When the Devils and Bears last met in January down in Columbia, South Carolina, Ilze Hattingh had match-point on No. 25 Julia Rosenqvist and freshman Samantha Alicea took No. 115 Katerina Stlouklova to a third-set on court four.

In the past 34 years, Sheila McInerney has seen a vast amount of change at Arizona State, from new athletic directors, new head coaches, schools added to the conference, and numerous renovations to athletic facilities. Through the countless changes across Arizona State, McInerney has continued to lead the women's tennis program in a successful direction heading into her 34th season.

In Arizona State's history, no coach has the number of accolades that Sheila McInerney has accumulated during her 34-year tenure as a Sun Devil. Since her first season as head coach in 1985, Sun Devil women's tennis has won 512 matches, advanced to 32 of 33 NCAA Tournaments, including 31 straight, and has finished each season in the top 38 nationally. That's the second most wins by any Arizona State coach in school history. In the 2016 season, McInerney was named the Southwest Region Coach of the Year by the ITA, as well as the Pac-12 Coach of the Year. She also was awarded the 2016 ITA Meritorious Service Award, which is given to an ITA coach who has gone "above and beyond" in their commitment and contributions to the ITA and college tennis in general.

In recent years, Arizona State's tennis program has continued to thrive on and off the court. On the court, the Sun Devils have 87 wins against ranked opponents since 2008. Leading the way for the tennis program have been 47 All-Americans and 43 All-Pac-12 student-athletes. Of these integral players in Arizona State's history, there have been 40 players ranked in the Top 50 of the singles season-end ranking and 23 in the Top 25 of the doubles season-end ranking.

In the classroom, McInerney has recruited bright student-athletes. She has had four Academic All-Americans, 45 ITA Scholar-Athletes (since 2002), and 80 Academic All-Pac 12 student-athletes (since 1991). Of those 45 ITA Scholar-Athletes, four were named in 2015 – Alexandra Osborne, Aubria Solares, Gussie O'Sullivan and Cassidy Jump. Her players have had majors such as Bioscience, Business Management, Criminal Justice and Criminology, English, Journalism, Kinesiology, Marketing, Political Science, and Sociology.

McInerney has also been fundamental in helping players' development to reach high achievements in the NCAA. Among the achievements include Jacqueline Cako named Arizona State Female Athlete of the Year (2013), Michelle Brycki awarded Cissie Leary ITA National Sportsmanship Award (2012), Kelcy McKenna selected as the Pac-12 Post-Graduate Scholar (2011), four singles and four doubles All-Americans since 2009, 14 players ranked in the singles season-end ranking and seven doubles teams ranked in the doubles season-end ranking since 2009.



Prior to coming to Arizona State, McInerney served as assistant women's tennis coach at the University of Southern California during the 1983-84 season, in which the Trojans were NCAA finalists. In addition to her success as a collegiate coach, McInerney has traveled with various USTA junior and national teams. At the 1986 Goodwill Games, McInerney coached the team to gold and silver medals. In 1987, she led the U.S. Pan American Games doubles squad to a gold medal.

McInerney attended USC, where she captained the Trojans during her senior season. The four-time All-American also was a four-time Trojan Spirit Award winner, as voted by her teammates. The Trojans won three national championships during McInerney's collegiate career, and she was the national collegiate doubles runner-up three times and a singles semifinalist in 1977. McInerney collected a half-dozen USTA national titles and was a member of the 1977-80 USTA Junior Federation Cup team. As a professional, she played on the major international tour, earning a world ranking in the top 75. McInerney competed at three grand slam venues -- Wimbledon, French Open and the U.S. Open where she reached the round of 32. She also served a short term as assistant pro at the highly acclaimed L.A. Tennis Club.

McInerney earned a bachelor's degree in public relations from the University of Southern California in 1980. A member of the Dean's List at USC, she won the USC Postgraduate Scholarship Award, the USC Junior Student-Athlete and Senior Student-Athlete awards.

Head coach Sheila McInerney announced in 2015 that Matt Langley would join the program as an assistant coach and in 2017, Langley was named associate head coach.

Langley joined the Sun Devils from Middle Tennessee State University, his alma mater, where he most recently served as assistant coach for its women's tennis program. At MTSU, Langley helped coach the Blue Raiders to one of their best seasons in program history, recording a 19-5 overall record, 7-1 in Conference USA competition.

A member of the MTSU men's tennis team from 2009-12, Langley was a two-year co-captain and three-time Sun Belt Conference Champion, earning two Most Outstanding Player honors at the Sun Belt Conference Championships. Langley also recorded three career appearances at the NCAA Championships.

Langley graduated from MTSU with a degree in exercise science, and was a two-time Academic All-
