AMHERST ATHLETICS

Amherst College has the oldest athletics program in the nation, dating back to a compulsory physical fitness regimen that was put in place for all students in 1860. Today, over a third of the student body participates in varsity sports and eighty percent are involved in intramural and club sports teams.

With 27 intercollegiate athletic teams, Amherst College student-athletes have successfully blended academics and athletics for decades. In addition to capturing 13 NCAA Division III team championships - including 11 in the past 11 years - and 78 NCAA individual titles, Amherst student-athletes have also excelled in the classroom - earning 35 prestigious CoSIDA Academic All-America selections, including 21 selections since 2008.

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2018-19 MEN'S BASKETBALL SEASON PREVIEW

AMHERST, Mass. – It would be fair to say that Amherst College men's basketball slid under the radar for a good portion of last season, but when the dust settled the Mammoths had defeated two nationally ranked teams on the final weekend and were the #1 seed in the New England Small College Athletic Conference (NESCAC) tournament.

Head Coach David Hixon, entering his 42nd season, is hoping that a young and talented Mammoths team can follow a similar blueprint in the 2018-19 season, which tips off Friday night with the Ken Wright '52 Invitational tournament.

While Amherst (17-9 in 2017-18) graduated their two leading scorers, the rest of the returners have ample playing experience, which has allowed them to move quickly through their preseason practice plans.

"We're a bit young, and a little bit of an unknown if you asked people in the NESCAC who features for Amherst," said Hixon, who surpassed the 800-career win plateau at the end of last season. "It's a great group of kids, though, with a great work ethic and they have all worked on what we have asked them to and have come back better." The 3-person senior class features the primary big men for Hixon's offense in Joseph Schneider and team captain C.J. Bachmann, as well as forward Dylan Groff. Schneider, who had a team-leading 40 blocks as well as 135 rebounds last year, was a big reason why the Mammoths were the top team in the country in field goal percentage defense, allowing opponents to shoot just 37.1% from the field.

Bachmann will be joined by Josh Chery '20 as a co-captain for the coming season. Chery emerged late last year, making the game-winning shot in the NESCAC quarterfinals against Bowdoin, and has continued to work on his shot this offseason. Returning sophomores Grant Robinson and Garrett Day anchor the guard position. Robinson had a breakout rookie year, averaging 9.4 points, 3.4 assists and nearly a steal per game. Fans of the Mammoths will get to see Robinson and Day share the



court more often this year.

Returning from an ACL injury, Timmy McCarthy '21 will get the chance to play to his full potential this year. In just eight games, Timmy was 17-37 (45.9%) from behind the three-point line. Fellow sharpshooter Tommy Mobley '20 shot 34.8% from long range, averaging nearly 4.5 points per contest. Eric Sellow '20 and Fru Che '21 each averaged more than eight points a game last year and provide talent and versatility in the lineup. Sellow averaged nearly six rebounds and 1.5 assists per game, while Che provides an athletic presence who can defend, run the floor and has improved his shot.

DJ Diabate '20 and Griffin Gerwig '20 each enter their sophomore seasons with more experience in Hixon's system.

The group of returners travelled to Italy and Greece a few months ago to play exhibition games against semi-professional European teams, and Hixon was impressed by the play and the composition of the unit. "It's a really interesting group. They are fun, young and they get the fact that they need to play harder than other teams to win," said Hixon. "I like that we are very deep – we could have three guys slot in at every position, so I see us surviving foul trouble."

Adding to the group will be four incoming

first year student-athletes. Will Phelan (Quincy, Mass.) has already proven to be a threat at the top three positions in the lineup. Devonn Allen (Danvers, Mass.) is a strong defender and shooter at the guard spot while Michael Schretter (Ridgewood, N.J.) adds good height and depth down low.

Luka Duranovic is a swing player from Serbia, one of the first true International students that Hixon has brought in. A strong player who can get to the basket, Duranovic was offered a spot on the U-16 team for Serbia, but opted to pursue an education in the United States and has proven to be an organized and diligent student and a serious basketball player who works hard on his game.

Amherst opens their season with seven games at home before the end of the year. Non-conference games include Babson, Emerson, Lasell and Westfield State in addition to the opening tip off against Framingham State and either Kean or MCLA. Conference play starts on Friday, January 4th at home against Trinity. The Mammoths will host Williams on January 16th in a Little Three matchup and will begin February with home games against Tufts, Bates and Wesleyan before closing out the regular season at Williams and Middlebury on February 8th-9th.

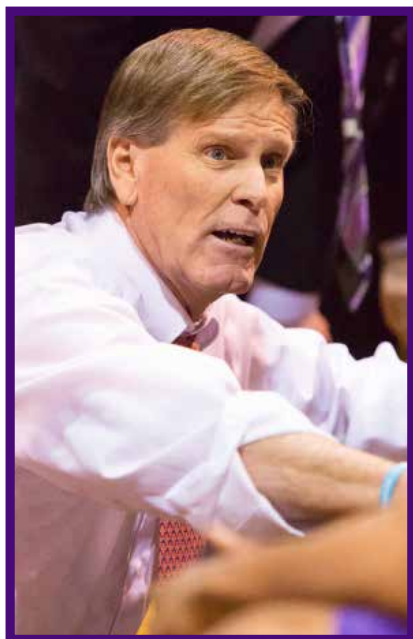

HEAD COACH DAVE HIXON

Entering his 42nd season, three-time National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Northeast Region Coach of the Year and two-time NABC National Coach of the Year, David Hixon '75, has molded the Amherst men's basketball program into one of the best in the nation.

With an 801-288 overall record, Hixon's .735 winning percentage is the fifth highest in NCAA Division III men's basketball history, while his 801 wins are third most all-time among Division III coaches and 25th among coaches in all divisions. Hixon's teams have also won more NESCAC titles than any other team in the conference (7), and became the first program to win three straight from 2012-14.

Hixon has led his alma mater to 19 NCAA Tournaments, with 10 of those appearances resulting in a trip to at least the national quarterfinals. Amherst has advanced to the NCAA Semifinals on seven occasions, notably capturing national championships in 2006-07 and 2012-13, and reaching back-to-back Final Four's in 2012-13 and 2013-14.

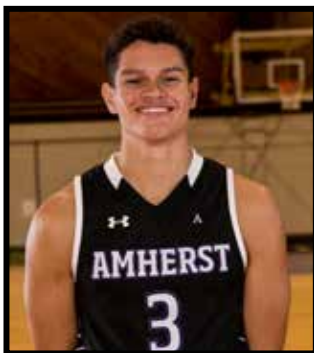

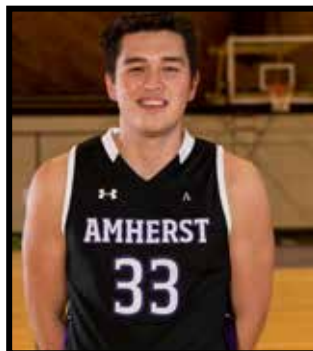

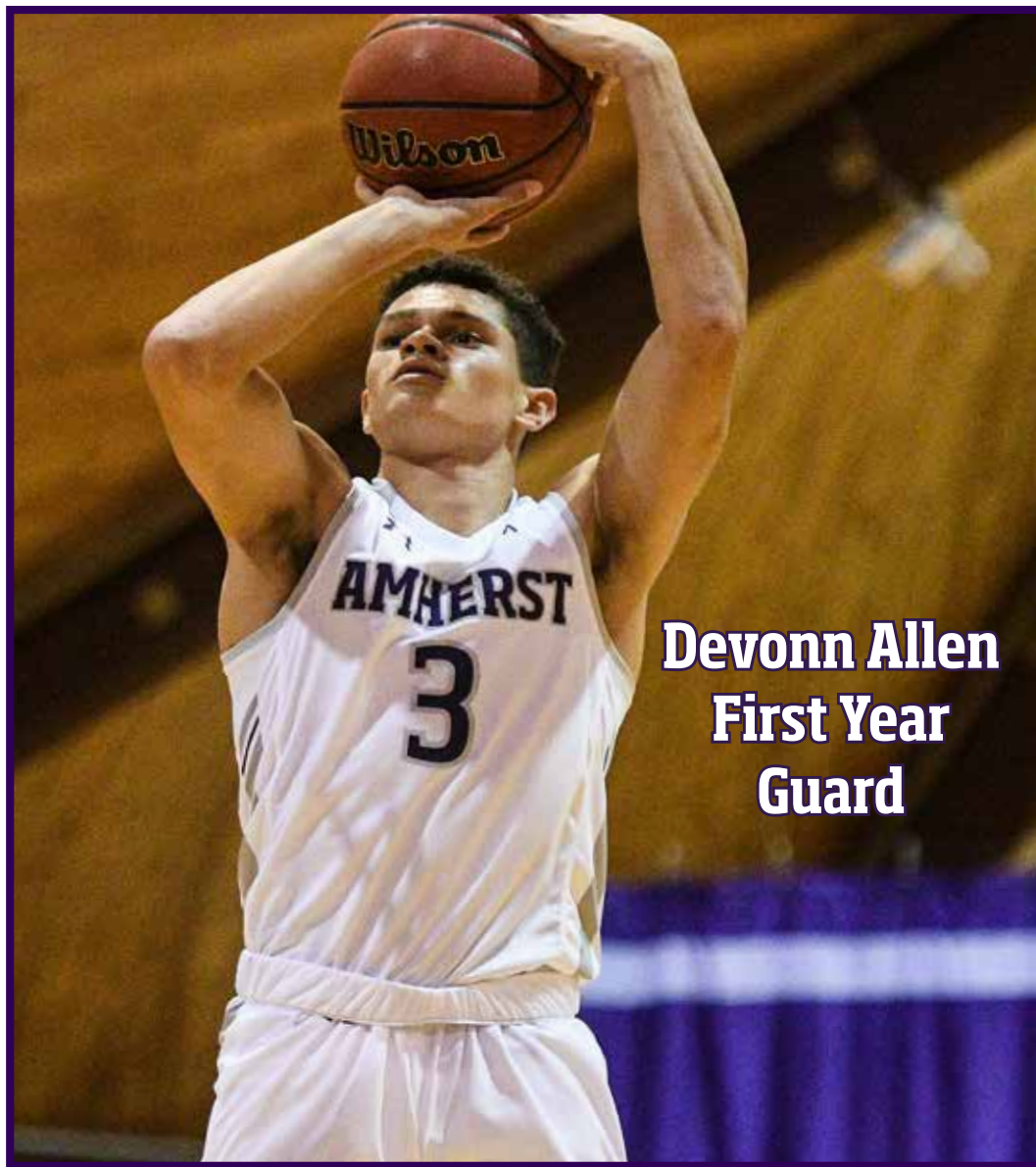

AMHERST GAME NOTES

SETTING THE SCENE

Amherst (20-4, 7-3 NESCAC) is the No. 3 seed for the second time in three years and will host a quarterfinal for the fourth straight season. Amherst has been in every NESCAC Championship and owns seven titles. The Mammoths enter the tournament having won six of their last seven games and will host No. 6 Wesleyan (16-8, 6-4 NESCAC), the 2018 NESCAC Runner-Up, in a rematch of last year's semifinal played at LeFrak.

The Cardinals are the No. 6 seed for the first time since 2015 and are in the NESCAC Championship for the fifth straight year. Wesleyan is 2-2 against Amherst in NESCAC postseason play. Amherst and Wesleyan split a pair of games this season, with Wesleyan winning 62-60 in Connecticut on January 12 and Amherst claiming a 61-60 victory at home on February 5.

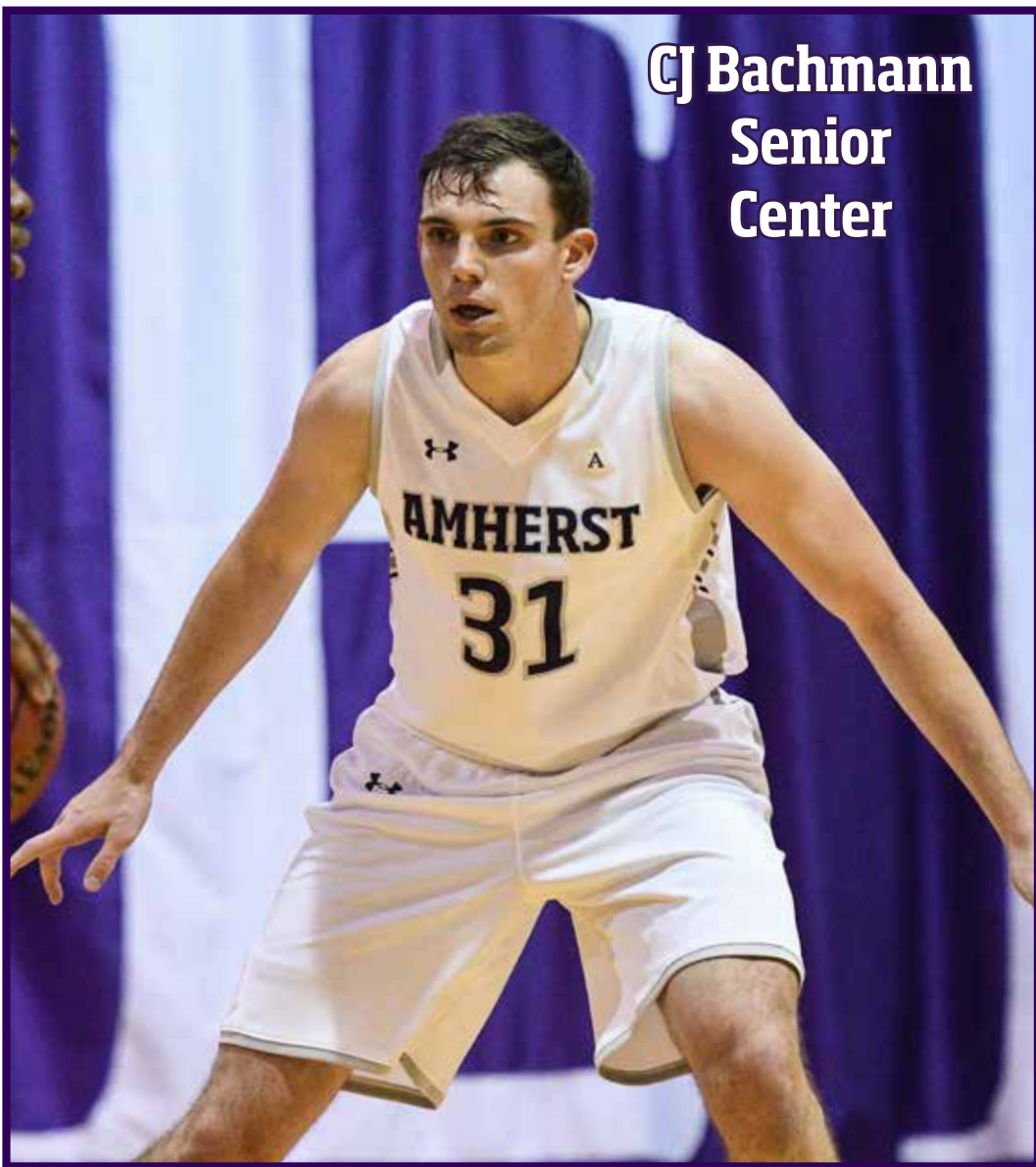

AMHERST GAME NOTES

SETTING THE SCENE

Amherst and Wesleyan square off in a Little Three contest that does not count towards the NESCAC standings. Amherst has already defeated Williams (63-62) in their non-conference Little 3 game on January 16th at LeFrak. Wesleyan has won the Little 3 each of the last two years and had a share of the title with Amherst in 2015-16. Prior to that, Amherst won the outright title for four consecutive years.

Wesleyan has lost their last two contests, both in conference play. They fell 75-71 on the road at Tufts on January 26th, then suffered a 75-69 home loss to Trinity last Friday night.

The teams are meeting for the second time this season. On January 12th in Middletown, Amherst overcame a 31-18 halftime deficit to tie the game at 60 in the final seconds, but Austin Hutcherson took the inbounds pass and drove the length of the court before knocking down the game-winner with three seconds to play as the Cardinals won 62-60.

Last year in Waltham, Amherst defeated Brandeis 102-82 behind 18 points from Garrett Day.

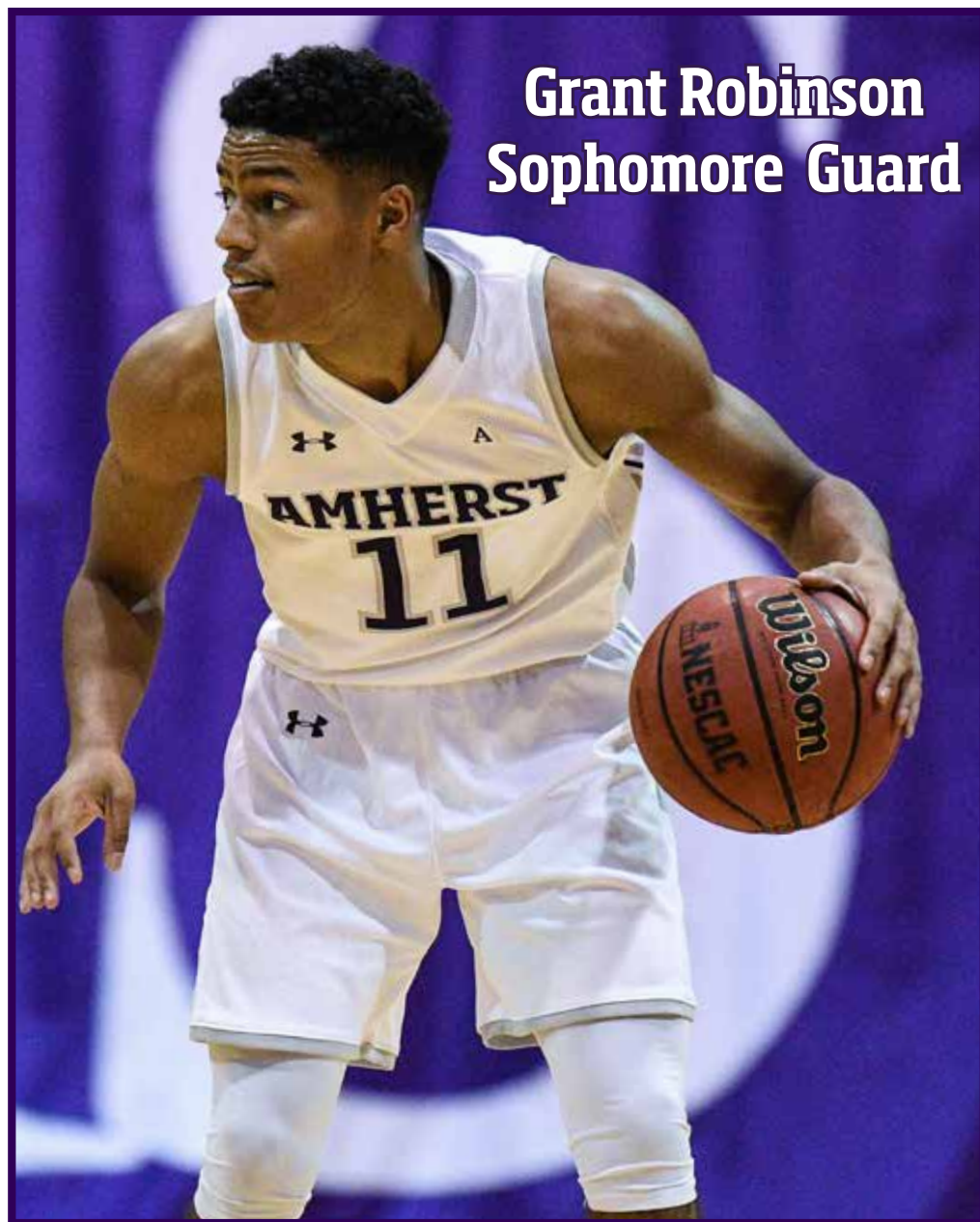

Kenneth Trude Wright '52

This weekend's invitational tournament is named for Kenneth Trude Wright '52, a three-sport athlete during his days at Amherst College. Wright played football and baseball, but made his athletic mark on the basketball court. Beginning in 1950, the starting forward was a force to be reckoned with, spending three years on the varsity team. Reported The Student during his senior year, "Wright tied for the individual scoring leadership in his sophomore season and has effectively tossed his familiar one-hander off the right ear for the two succeeding campaigns."



on a wide range of fields, from partnerships in ad agencies to directorships of corporations, clubs and volunteer organizations. He would eventually serve as the director of Chicago-area fundraising programs for the Republican Party, and as the vice chairman of the Illinois Finance Committee for future president Ronald Reagan.

When his memorial service was held on September 1, 2000, Wright was remembered for the positive outlook he brought to the basketball team and to Amherst life in general, an attitude he carried with him through everything else that he did. "He approached business as he did everything else – an underlying seriousness of purpose tempered with a quick wit and keen sense of fun," classmate Nick Evans '52 wrote of Wright in an obituary that appeared in the Class Notes section of the alumni magazine. "Ken's many Amherst friends remember him as being much more than an athlete. Yes, he was a great basketball and baseball player, and quick off the line in freshman football. But Ken had so much spirit, imagination and fun inside him that every encounter on campus was upbeat."

After graduating, Wright entered Stanford Business School, then served three years in the U.S. Navy. His professional endeavors touched
