### KNIGHTS INSIGHTS

- This season marks Tim Chastonay's 25th as the head coach of Bellarmine. He is the longest-tenured coach at the university.
- Bellarmine and Louisville are meeting for the second straight season, with the 2022 campaign marking the Knights' third in Division I. Last season, the Cardinals captured a 1-0 win in double overtime at Dr. Mark & Cindy Lynn Stadium.
- Bellarmine opened the season Thursday with a 2-2 stalemate against Evansville at Owsley B. Frazier Stadium. The Knights faced deficits of 1-0 and 2-1 before rallying to level the contest each time they got behind.
- It was a heated match between Bellarmine and Evansville. Both the Knights and Purple Aces received four yellow cards each. Evansville's head coach, Marshall Ray, was issued a red card.
- In his first collegiate game, Cooper Forcellini scored his first collegiate goal. The freshman midfielder found the net in the 35th minute against Evansville, tying the contest at 1.
- Junior midfielder Jack Fischer recorded his first career assist on Forcellini's goal. Junior defender Brock Pope also assisted on the play, marking the second helper of his career at Bellarmine.
- Bellarmine was 0-for-3 on penalty kicks last season. Against Evansville, the Knights missed a PK in the 64th minute. Junior forward Nolan McGrath finally snapped the streak of futility by burying a PK in the 80th minute. McGrath and Pope are Bellarmine's leading returning goal scorers with three apiece last season.

## HEAD COACH TIM CHASTONAY

Tim Chastonay has been the head coach of the Bellarmine University men's soccer team since 1998 and is the winningest coach in program history along with being the longest-tenured coach in all of Bellarmine athletics.

The 2022 campaign marks Chastonay's 25th as head coach.

The fall 2021 campaign saw Bellarmine win its first-ever game in the ASUN Championship as the Knights rallied to defeat FGCU 2-1 in the quarterfinals. Bellarmine spent five weeks in the Atlantic Region rankings. Three Knights were honored with ASUN All-Conference awards.

The spring of 2021 marked Bellarmine's first season in Division I and the ASUN Conference, and Chastonay and his squad wasted no time in making their mark. The Knights secured the top seed from the North Division in the ASUN Championship after going 3-1 in league play. Bellarmine finished the season ranked No. 9 in the Atlantic Region by the United Soccer Coaches. Chastonay was voted ASUN Coach of the Year after guiding his team to a memorable inaugural D1 campaign that included four All-Conference acknowledgements and an All-Region laurel (Jonas Skulstad).

Prior to Bellarmine's arrival in D1, Chastonay built a 208-164-41 record over 22 seasons in Division II. He amassed over 120 victories more than the program's next winningest coach. Chastonay led Bellarmine to a Great Lakes Valley Conference Tournament berth in 12 of the last 13 years in D2, the final one of which ended with the Knights hoisting the championship trophy and sealing a bid in the NCAA II Tournament. All five of Bellarmine's D2 All-Americans (Ross Hopkins, Brad Barraclough, Tomas Bernedo, Micah Linscott, Eddie Williamson) have been produced during Chastonay's tenure.

The 2019 campaign, the last in D2, marked the most successful in program history for Bellarmine, which did not lose a match until the Sweet 16 of the NCAA II Tournament. The Knights went 16-1-5 overall and 10-0-4 in the GLVC. Both win totals set new program records. Along with an undefeated regular season, Bellarmine captured the GLVC Tournament title following a 3-2 victory over McKendree and secured its first-ever NCAA II Tournament berth. The Knights built a 30-game unbeaten streak bridging the 2018 and 2019 seasons and finished the year with a No. 13 national ranking. Bernedo, Linscott and Wil-

liamson earned All-America accolades from the D2CCA, and Bernedo became the program's first GLVC Offensive Player of the Year.

Bellarmine finished 12-5-2 in 2018. At the time, the Knights tied both the most overall wins and the most conference victories (nine) in program history. Bellarmine finished second in the league and earned the No. 2 seed in the GLVC Tournament, where the Knights advanced to the finals. Skulstad became the program's first GLVC Defensive Player of the Year honoree.

In 2017, Chastonay's Knights tied a then-program record with nine GLVC wins. Bellarmine's 11 overall victories were one shy of the program record at the time. The biggest highlight of the season came when Bellarmine defeated second-ranked and Final Four-bound Rockhurst, 2-1. Williamson was named GLVC co-Freshman of the Year.

From 2009-12, the Knights posted double-digit wins in every season. Bellarmine had one of its best seasons ever in 2012 as Chastonay's Knights went 10-5-3 overall and 9-3-3 in the GLVC. In 2010, Bellarmine finished 10-5-2 and the Knights achieved a No. 18 national ranking. That season came on the heels of an 11-win campaign in 2009 and, two years before that, the Knights tied a then-program record with 12 wins. Hopkins became the program's first All-American in 2009 after garnering second-team honors from Daktronics. Hopkins and Barraclough both reaped All-America recognition in 2010.

Chastonay, who was voted GLVC Coach of the Year in 2005, also led Bellarmine's women's program as the head coach (1998-09) for 12 seasons, guiding the program to its first-ever appearance in the NCAA II Tournament in 2009.

Prior to coming to Bellarmine, Chastonay was a successful high school coach in Louisville at Eastern High School. He spent four seasons at the lead of the Eagles soccer team, where he compiled a 71-19-2 record including winning the 1996 Kentucky state championship and finishing the season ranked nationally in the top 25. For his accomplishments that season, he was named the KHSAA Soccer Coach of the Year.

A 1993 Bellarmine graduate, Chastonay was a four-year member of the soccer team, where he helped lead the Knights to a GLVC runner-up finish three times. As a senior, he was named to the All-GLVC team and also received Bellarmine's Silver Knight award for athletic achievement and sportsmanship.







## 2022 BELLARMINE SEASON OUTLOOK

The Bellarmine University men's soccer team is still riding that wave.

In 2019, the Knights delivered a thunderous grand finale of a season in Division II, rattling off an unbeaten regular season, capturing the GLVC Tournament title and advancing to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA II Tournament.

Bellarmine followed with an auspicious debut season in D1, securing the top seed from the North Division and an automatic berth to the ASUN Tournament semifinals. Last year, the Knights advanced to the semifinals again, notching their first-ever D1 postseason victory with a 2-1 quarterfinals triumph over FGCU.

Instead of taking their lumps, the Knights are nearly even from a record standpoint after two years in the NCAA's highest level, totaling an 11-12-2 mark.

"We feel like we are in a good spot after only two years in D1," said Bellarmine Coach Tim Chastonay, who's entering his 25th season guiding the program. "We have made two trips to the ASUN Conference Tournament semifinals and had a big win over FGCU this past year. Our overall record is very good as well. You are always going to be judged on wins and losses, but we also look at the individual development of players. The guys are working hard at becoming better players and this has helped in the success of the program overall."

"Overall, I was pleased with the progress our team made last season," added Chastonay, whose squad went 7-8-2 in 2021. "In only our second season at the D1 level, we went out and challenged ourselves against some very good opponents. We were competitive every time we took the field and gave ourselves a chance to get a result."

There is something of a changing of the guard with Bellarmine this season after the graduation of several players who made significant contributions to the landmark 2019 team and beyond. Midfielder Micah Linscott was a D2 All-American and departed tied for 10th in program history in career goals (30). Goalkeeper Connor Range was a four-year starter and D2 All-Region selection. Midfielder Greg Fischer might as well have been known as "The Captain." Defender Nate Girao was an impact reserve as a freshman and a starting lineup mainstay thereafter, earning ASUN All-Conference accolades last season.

"We lost some great players to graduation," Chastonay said. "We could never replace those guys but hope our younger players learned and improved by competing with them daily. Many of our players will see their roles expand this season and have been waiting for this opportunity. We don't necessarily go into the season with a bunch of guys having big college minutes, but these guys are hungry to make a name for themselves."

### GOALKEEPER

While Range departed, Matthew Brozovich is no stranger to big games or delivering big performances over the past two seasons. The

senior is a two-time ASUN Defensive Player of the Week and last season went 2-2-1 with three shutouts (tied for fourth in ASUN), a 0.55 goals-against average and .842 save percentage over six appearances.

Redshirt sophomore Lukas Tharp and redshirt freshman Micah Mattes are also back. Alex Lindewirth is a promising freshman who's seen action in the preseason. Senior Trevor Massa is a transfer from nearby Spalding who was the 2019 SLIAC Defensive Player of the Year.

"Matthew has proven he can be successful at this level," Chastonay said. "Lukas and Micah have been around and continue to provide great depth. Freshman Alex Lindewirth comes in with a great youth soccer background and has been impressive in preseason. Trevor was a late addition and his four years of successful college play is a big boost and will make things even more competitive."

### DEFENDER

Bellarmine largely has a proven backline, one of the most obvious strengths of the team heading into the season. Sophomore Rikard Cederberg, an ASUN All-Freshman Team selection, started every game last season, and senior Jackson Kirn started all but one.

Junior captain Brock Pope was an ASUN All-Tournament Team honoree who tallied three goals and an assist last season. Senior Joey Gladys appeared in every game last season and logged nearly 1,000 minutes.

Senior Tim Dapore, junior Niall Grimley, redshirt sophomores Christian Fischer, Peyton Fosnough and Zachary Smith, redshirt freshmen Ty Been and Teagan Dunne, and freshmen Bennett Kirn, Jeffrey Cox and Kuker Nodler along with senior transfer Thomas Stickley from Fairfield are all possibilities on the backline.

"Across the backline, we do bring back some players with good college experience," Chastonay said. "Rikard and Jackson have played big minutes at center back. Niall saw some action last season and looks ready to play a bigger role. Ty, Christian, Bennett and Jeffrey are also options at center back."

"Brock and Joey return in the wide back positions, and both have been very good defenders for us in the past. Teagan, Peyton, Tim, Zachary and Kuker are all competing for time at the wide back spots as well. Transfer Thomas Stickley brings experience to the position and could be asked to play in the back as well."

### MIDFIELDER

In the holding midfield, senior Camden Dunne (one goal, one assist) started every game last season. Sophomore Brendan Schoemehl earned extended minutes in the latter half of last season. Senior Rahim Shalash is a captain, fellow senior Bruno Soria is another threat, as is freshman Collin Folds.

"Camden returns to play one of the defensive midfield spots and has seen a good deal of

playing time over his first three seasons," Chastonay said. "Rahim, Brendan and Bruno have all seen time in the past and should see their roles expand this season. Collin will be in the mix as well."

On the wings, senior Haziq Zed (one goal, one assist) was a 2020 ASUN All-Conference selection. Junior Jack Fischer appeared in 15 games last season. Senior Brandon Barrera, junior Omar Sanyang, redshirt sophomore Andrew Blank, redshirt freshman Jackson Marks and freshmen Calle Sjoborg and Cade Morgan bolster the outside midfield slots.

"Haziq has proven in the past he can be a dangerous player in the attacking third, and Jack saw an expanded role last season from his first year and should see an even bigger role this year," Chastonay said. "Jackson, Andrew and Omar are all healthy and could see time this year. Brandon has seen time in the past and could see more minutes this season. Calle and Cade will provide some good depth on the outside this season."

The attacking midfield is unproven but promising, with redshirt freshmen Ben Griffis and Santiago Ibarreche and freshmen Cooper Forcellini and Tate McCrery in the fold.

"The attacking midfield position has some great options," Chastonay said. "Ben has developed nicely and looks ready to play. Cooper has looked good so far and is a very good playmaker. Santiago and Tate can play in the attacking midfield and will provide good depth."

### FORWARD

Redshirt junior Nolan McGrath registered three goals and two assists last season. Redshirt sophomore Chris Shust found the net multiple times in the preseason. Junior Alex Kyrkjeide is a transfer from Quinnipiac.

"Nolan has seen his role increase each season and should see an expanded role this year," Chastonay said. "Chris continues to develop and will also see good minutes. Alex has good college experience and could play as a forward, attacking midfielder or out wide."

Bellarmine's 2022 slate consists of 16 games, 10 of which will unfold at Owsley B. Frazier Stadium.

"Although we have enjoyed some success, we are still getting accustomed to D1 soccer," Chastonay said. "The players and coaches continue to learn what it takes to be a success at this level. We have some great programs in the ASUN, and they are models for what we hope to achieve."

"The ASUN should be very strong again this season. The top teams from last year bring back very good teams. From top to bottom, it is a very competitive conference. I think our squad will be looking to secure a spot in the ASUN Tournament for a third consecutive year."

## IMMEDIATE IMPRINT

Buoyed by a final season in Division II in which it went unbeaten in the regular season, captured the GLVC Tournament title and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA II Tournament, Bellarmine established competitive play in Division I from the outset two years ago. In their inaugural season in the NCAA's highest level, the Knights went 4-4 overall and 3-1 in the ASUN while stunningly securing the North Division's top seed in the ASUN Championship. Last season, Bellarmine delivered another solid campaign, going 7-8-2 overall and 2-4-1 in the league. The biggest highlight came in the ASUN Championship, where the sixth-seeded Knights captured their first-ever D1 postseason victory by rallying for a 2-1 quarterfinal win over third-seeded Florida Gulf Coast University.

## TAKING NOTICE

Bellarmine has achieved a top-10 ranking in the United Soccer Coaches' Atlantic Region rankings in each of its two seasons in Division I. Last season, the Knights spent five weeks in the regional rankings, topping out at No. 3. Bellarmine was also regionally ranked for most its inaugural D1 season, climbing to as high as No. 2 before finishing the year at No. 9.

## STRONG BACKING

Bellarmine has a healthy amount of seasoning on its back line. Last season, Rikard Cederberg became the first player in program history to earn ASUN All-Freshman Team accolades. He was the team leader in minutes played at 1,567. Senior Jackson Kirn ranked third with 1,469 minutes. Junior Brock Pope battled injury but still logged 1,164 minutes and added further value to the team on set pieces, posting three goals and an assist while garnering ASUN All-Tournament Team plaudits along with an ASUN Defensive Player of the Week award.

## PROVEN BETWEEN THE PIPES

Although Connor Range graduated following a decorated career, Bellarmine also received crucial performances in goal from Matthew Brozovich over the last two seasons. In the Knights' first year in the ASUN, Brozovich earned consecutive ASUN Defensive Player of the Week acknowledgements. Last season, he went 2-2-1 over five starts and six total appearances while carrying a 0.55 goals-against average and .842 save percentage. Brozovich, now a senior, tied for fourth in the ASUN in shutouts last season with three. He enters the season with a 4-3-1 career record with four shutouts, a 0.78 goals-against average and .800 save percentage.

## BIG SHOES TO FILL

Bellarmine will be without its top-two goal scorers from last season in Micah Linscott and Juan Ballas, who netted four goals each in accounting for half of the team's 16 goals on the season. Linscott was a 2019 Division II All-American and finished his storied career tied for 10th all-time in the program record book for goals scored with 30. Ballas was a two-time ASUN All-Conference selection. In addition, the Knights lost their leading distributor in set-piece maestro Greg Fischer, who notched a team-high five assists last season and finished his career tied for third on the program's career assist list with 22. Pope and junior forward Nolan McGrath are the team's leading returning scorers after tallying three goals apiece last season.

## CHAMPIONSHIP MINDSET

Over the summer, Bellarmine freshman Cooper Forcellini and his Kansas-based Sporting Blue Valley Academy '03 squad captured the 2022 James P. Maguire Cup, which is the most prestigious national championship in youth soccer and dates back to 1935. Forcellini was one of the driving forces of the run to the national title. A central attacking midfielder and team captain, he started every match and was recognized as Top XI of the tournament. Between state, regionals and nationals, the team went 14-0 in the tournament. In the national title game, Sporting Blue Valley Academy '03 defeated Maryland Celtic 1-0 at the ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex in Orlando, Florida. Forcellini's dad, Shawn, coached the team.

## PRESEASON PICKS

Bellarmine was predicted to finish eighth out of nine teams in the ASUN preseason coaches poll. Defending ASUN Tournament champion Lipscomb is a heavy favorite to repeat after receiving all eight possible first-place votes and 80 total points. Central Arkansas was voted runner-up with 66 points followed by FGCU (third, 58), Stetson (fourth, 55), Liberty (fifth, 40), North Florida (sixth, 33), Jacksonville (seventh, 32), Bellarmine (eighth, 30) and Queens (ninth, 11). Bellarmine, Central Arkansas and Stetson joined Lipscomb in the ASUN Championship semifinals last season.

## OLD FOES

Before entering Division I and the ASUN, Bellarmine competed in Division II's Great Lakes Valley Conference. This season, the Knights will take on three former GLVC rivals in Northern Kentucky (Sept. 2, home), Purdue Fort Wayne (Sept. 20, home) and Southern Indiana (Oct. 4, home), all of whom made the transition to D1 just as Bellarmine did. Northern Kentucky's first season in D1 came in 2012-13, Purdue Fort Wayne's was 2001-02, Bellarmine's was 2020-21 and Southern Indiana's is this year. The Knights captured a 1-0 overtime win at Purdue Fort Wayne last season, and prior to that, defeated Northern Kentucky 1-0 at home in an exhibition game. Bellarmine last met Southern Indiana in 2019, posting a 5-1 home win over the Screaming Eagles.

## BRAIN TRUST

Bellarmine earned the United Soccer Coaches' Team Academic Award for the fifth straight year and has garnered it every year except for one since 2007. The acknowledgement recognizes squads that posted a team GPA of 3.0 or higher for the 2021-22 academic year. The Knights combined for a 3.33 team GPA. Bellarmine had 31 members distinguished on the ASUN Honor Roll.

## OWSLEY B. FRAZIER STADIUM



In the fall of 2007, Bellarmine University dedicated the \$5.1 million Owsley B. Frazier Stadium on campus.

Seating approximately 2,000, this state-of-the-art facility is the home of Bellarmine's men and women's soccer programs, track and field, women's field hockey and men's lacrosse. The artificial field surface is named Joseph P. and Janet A. Clayton Field and was installed by the Motz Group.

The track facilities include an eight-lane dual-durometer polyurethane poured surface provided by the Benyon Sport Surfaces, as well as three long jump pits, two pole vault areas, a high jump pit and a water steeplechase pool. In May 2010, a throw area was added across Newburg Road

which includes two throwing areas for shot put, javelin, discus and hammer throws.

On Feb. 20 of 2010, the plaza area of the stadium was named after the late men's lacrosse coach Jack McGetrick. The Jack McGetrick plaza houses the locker rooms, concessions and restrooms for the stadium. McGetrick started the lacrosse program at Bellarmine in 2004 and is well known throughout the lacrosse community.

Owsley B. Frazier Stadium was put on the national stage several times. On Dec. 2-4 of 2010, Bellarmine and the Louisville Sports Commission hosted the 2010 NCAA Division II Fall Festival. During the festival, the semifinals and finals of both the men's

and women's soccer were held at the stadium. Bellarmine hosted the same event from Dec. 4-6 of 2014.

In May 2012, Owsley B. Frazier Stadium hosted the semifinals and finals of the NCAA II women's lacrosse championship in conjunction with the Spring Championship Festival, also hosted by Bellarmine and the Louisville Sports Commission.
