#### KNIGHTS INSIGHTS

- Bellarmine and Louisville are meeting for the third straight season in Dr. Mark & Cindy Lynn Stadium, and the third time in the Knights' four-year Division-I era. In 2021, neither team scored until the 105th minute, when the Cardinals netted the golden goal in 2OT. Last season, U of L scored in the 11th minute and added another in the 29th, setting the pace for an eventual 3-0 win.
- Tim Chastonay is back at Bellarmine for a 26th season patrolling the sideline. Chastonay is the longest-tenured coach at Bellarmine and has piled up 225 career wins. He was the spring 2021 ASUN Coach of the Year. In 2019, BU's final year in D2, he guided the Knights to the GLVC Tournament title and the Sweet 16.
- Bellarmine's 2023 schedule is road-heavy. Louisville represents one of 10 road games in 15 regular-season contests. The Knights open this year with three road matches, the first of which came Thursday at Evansville and resulted in a 1-1 draw.
- Bellarmine was predicted to finish fifth of eight teams in the ASUN preseason coaches' poll. Lipscomb, the reigning regular season and ASUN Tournament champion, was tabbed as the favorite.
- Matthew Brozovich amassed a season-high 10 saves in goal last season against Louisville. The senior was named ASUN Preseason Goalkeep-

- er of the Year and to the Preseason All-ASUN Team. Brozovich finished last season with a 1.04 goals-against average, .754 save percentage and five shutouts.
- Brock Pope joined Brozovich on the Pre-season All-ASUN Team. The senior defender was a unanimous selection. The Texan is a two-time ASUN All-Tournament Team recipient and collected two goals and an assist last season.
- Juan Ballas rejoined Bellarmine after playing last season at Oregon State. A fifth-year senior, the forward earned second-team All-ASUN accolades as a sophomore and junior. Ballas has 14 career goals. As a freshman, he was responsible for the game-winning goal in BU's 3-2 victory over McKendree in the 2019 GLVC Tournament finals.
- Defender Jackson Kirn and midfielder Rahim Shalash, a co-captain, join Ballas as starters who returned for a fifth college season after utilizing a Covid year. Kirn is the leading returner in minutes (1,566 last season) and played the entire game in the opener against Evansville. Shalash tallied two assists last season and had a helper against the Purple Aces.
- Calle Sjoberg is a redshirt freshman midfielder who scored in his collegiate debut against Evansville.
- Louisville made a statement in its season opener, knocking off No. 16 Tulsa 1-0 at home.

## OWSLEY B. FRAZIER STADIUM



In the fall of 2007, Bellarmine University dedicated the \$5.1 million Owsley B. Frazier Stadium on campus.

Seating approximately 2,000, this state-of-the-art facility is the home of Bellarmine's men and women's soccer programs, track and field, women's field hockey and men's lacrosse. The artificial field surface is named Joseph P. and Janet A. Clayton Field and was installed by the Motz Group.

The track facilities include an eight-lane dual-durometer polyurethane poured surface provided by the Benyon Sport Surfaces, as well as three long jump pits, two pole vault areas, a high jump pit and a water steeplechase pool. In May 2010, a throw area was added across Newburg Road

which includes two throwing areas for shot put, javelin, discus and hammer throws.

On Feb. 20 of 2010, the plaza area of the stadium was named after the late men's lacrosse coach Jack McGetrick. The Jack McGetrick plaza houses the locker rooms, concessions and restrooms for the stadium. McGetrick started the lacrosse program at Bellarmine in 2004 and is well known throughout the lacrosse community.

Owsley B. Frazier Stadium was put on the national stage several times. On Dec. 2-4 of 2010, Bellarmine and the Louisville Sports Commission hosted the 2010 NCAA Division II Fall Festival. During the festival, the semifinals and finals of both the men's

and women's soccer were held at the stadium. Bellarmine hosted the same event from Dec. 4-6 of 2014.

In May 2012, Owsley B. Frazier Stadium hosted the semifinals and finals of the NCAA II women's lacrosse championship in conjunction with the Spring Championship Festival, also hosted by Bellarmine and the Louisville Sports Commission.

## HEAD COACH TIM CHASTONAY

Tim Chastonay has been the head coach of the Bellarmine University men's soccer team since 1998 and is the winningest coach in program history along with being the longest-tenured coach in all of Bellarmine athletics.

The 2023 campaign marks Chastonay's 26th as head coach.

After coming close its first two seasons in the NCAA's highest level, Bellarmine in 2022 achieved a winning record (6-4-8) for the first time in the Division-I era. The Knights earned a berth in the ASUN Championship semifinals for the third consecutive season after defeating Stetson in PKs in the quarterfinals. Four players garnered ASUN All-Conference laurels.

The fall 2021 campaign saw Bellarmine win its first-ever game in the ASUN Championship as the Knights rallied to defeat FGCU 2-1 in the quarterfinals. Bellarmine spent five weeks in the Atlantic Region rankings. Three Knights were honored with ASUN All-Conference awards.

The spring of 2021 marked Bellarmine's first season in Division I and the ASUN Conference, and Chastonay and his squad wasted no time in making their mark. The Knights secured the top seed from the North Division in the ASUN Championship after going 3-1 in league play. Bellarmine finished the season ranked No. 9 in the Atlantic Region by the United Soccer Coaches. Chastonay was voted ASUN Coach of the Year after guiding his team to a memorable inaugural D1 campaign that included four All-Conference acknowledgements and an All-Region laurel (Jonas Skulstad).

Prior to Bellarmine's arrival in DI, Chastonay built a 208-164-41 record over 22 seasons in Division II. He amassed over 120 victories more than the program's next winningest coach. Chastonay led Bellarmine to a Great Lakes Valley Conference Tournament berth in 12 of the last 13 years in D2, the final one of which ended with the Knights hoisting the championship trophy and sealing a bid in the NCAA II Tournament. All five of Bellarmine's D2 All-Americans (Ross Hopkins, Brad Barraclough, Tomas Bernedo, Micah Linscott, Eddie Williamson) have been produced during Chastonay's tenure.

The 2019 campaign, the last in D2, marked the most successful in program history for Bellarmine, which did not lose a match until the Sweet 16 of the NCAA II Tournament. The Knights went 16-1-5 overall and 10-0-4 in the GLVC. Both win

totals set new program records. Along with an undefeated regular season, Bellarmine captured the GLVC Tournament title following a 3-2 victory over McKendree and secured its first-ever NCAA II Tournament berth. The Knights built a 30-game unbeaten streak bridging the 2018 and 2019 seasons and finished the year with a No. 13 national ranking. Bernedo, Linscott and Williamson earned All-America accolades from the D2CCA, and Bernedo became the program's first GLVC Offensive Player of the Year.

Bellarmine finished 12-5-2 in 2018. At the time, the Knights tied both the most overall wins and the most conference victories (nine) in program history. Bellarmine finished second in the league and earned the No. 2 seed in the GLVC Tournament, where the Knights advanced to the finals. Skulstad became the program's first GLVC Defensive Player of the Year honoree.

In 2017, Chastonay's Knights tied a then-program record with nine GLVC wins. Bellarmine's 11 overall victories were one shy of the program record at the time. The biggest highlight of the season came when Bellarmine defeated second-ranked and Final Four-bound Rockhurst, 2-1. Williamson was named GLVC co-Freshman of the Year.

From 2009-12, the Knights posted double-digit wins in every season. Bellarmine had one of its best seasons ever in 2012 as Chastonay's Knights went 10-5-3 overall and 9-3-3 in the GLVC. In 2010, Bellarmine finished 10-5-2 and the Knights achieved a No. 18 national ranking. That season came on the heels of an 11-win campaign in 2009 and, two years before that, the Knights tied a then-program record with 12 wins. Hopkins became the program's first All-American in 2009 after garnering second-team honors from Daktronics. Hopkins and Barraclough both reaped All-America recognition in 2010.

Chastonay, who was voted GLVC Coach of the Year in 2005, also led Bellarmine's women's program as the head coach (1998-09) for 12 seasons, guiding the program to its first-ever appearance in the NCAA II Tournament in 2009.

Prior to coming to Bellarmine, Chastonay was a successful high school coach in Louisville at Eastern High School. He spent four seasons at the lead of the Eagles soccer team, where he compiled a 71-19-2 record including winning the 1996 Kentucky state championship and finishing the season ranked nationally in the top 25. For his accomplishments that season, he was named the KHSAA Soccer Coach of the Year.







## THE LEGEND CONTINUES

The 2023 campaign marks Tim Chastonay's 26th as the head coach at Bellarmine. He is the longest-tenured coach in BU athletics. His 225 career wins are three times more than the next Knights men's soccer coach (George Taurman, 80) on the list. Chastonay also holds program coaching records for most single-season wins (16 in 2019), most single-season conference wins (10 in 2019) and unbeaten streak (30, bridging 2018 and 2019). Chastonay pulled double duty as the women's head coach for 12 seasons (1998-09). He's also their all-time wins leader with 119 — 40 more than the next coach — and guided the program to its first-ever appearance in the NCAA II Tournament in 2009.

## OVER THE HUMP

Although Bellarmine came close its first two seasons in Division I, the Knights secured their first winning record in the D1 era in 2022 after going 6-4-8 (.556). They were 7-8-2 (.471) in 2021 and 4-4 (even .500) in 2020. Bellarmine earned the North Division's one-seed in the ASUN Tournament in its inaugural D1 season. The Knights have made an appearance in the conference semifinals in each of their three seasons in the league, advancing last year after winning a PK shootout, 3-0, over Stetson following a 2-2 deadlock in regulation in the quarterfinals.

## PRESEASON PLAUDITS

Matthew Brozovich was voted 2023 ASUN Preseason Goalkeeper of the Year along with to the Preseason All-ASUN Team. He's back for a fifth season in goal. Last season, the native of St. Louis was a second-team All-ASUN selection after ranking second in the league in goals-against average (1.04, ninth in BU record book) and save percentage (.754, 10th in BU record book) and third in shutouts (five, 7th in BU record book) among conference goalkeepers with at least 10 starts at the conclusion of the regular season. A two-time ASUN Defensive Player of the Week, Brozovich has appeared in 25 games with 22 starts in his career and recorded a 0.94 GAA and .770 save percentage.

## DEFENSIVE DOMINANCE

Last season, Bellarmine's defense ranked second in the ASUN in fewest goals allowed (17) and goals-against average (0.92) while tying for second in shutouts (seven). The Knights had a string of five straight shutouts and a stretch of seven of nine games with clean sheets. In 18 matches, Bellarmine conceded more than one goal only five times. In addition to Brozovich, starting defenders Brock Pope and Jackson Kirn are back. Last year, Pope, a team captain, was named to the ASUN All-Tournament Team for the second straight season after scoring a goal in both the quarterfinals and semifinals. He was a unanimous selection to the 2023 Preseason All-ASUN Team. Kirn ranked second on the team last season with 1,566 minutes and earned a ASUN Defensive Player of the Week accolade.

## BALLAS IS BACK

Juan Ballas has returned to Bellarmine after playing last season at Oregon State. The fifth-year senior forward played his first three seasons with the Knights and is a two-time ASUN All-Conference selection, earning second-team plaudits as a sophomore and junior. In 47 career games at Bellarmine, Ballas amassed 14 goals and four assists. He scored three goals in eight matches in the Covid-shortened spring of 2021 and followed with four goals in the fall of 2021. That D1-era production came after he netted seven goals as a freshman in the Knights' final year in D2.

## CHAMPIONSHIP PEDIGREES

Brozovich, Ballas, Kirn, senior midfielder and captain Rahim Shalash, and senior midfielder Omar Sanyang are the final remaining members on Bellarmine that played on the historic 2019 squad. That season, BU's final in D2, the Knights captured their first-ever GLVC Tournament title and followed by advancing to the Sweet 16. They finished 16-1-5, including 10-0-4 in the GLVC, and built a 30-game unbeaten streak bridging the 2018 and 2019 campaigns.

## RUNS IN THE FAMILY

Midfielder Jack Fischer led Bellarmine last season in assists with five. That was one year after another Fischer led the team in assists with the same total — Greg, Jack's older brother, tallied five helpers in 2021 in his final season with the Knights.

## SCHOLARLY BUNCH

Bellarmine excelled in the classroom in the 2022-23 school year, as a program-record 37 players earned ASUN Honor Roll accolades. In fact, it was the fourth straight year the Knights set a new program record for conference academic achievement. BU had 31 ASUN Honor Roll recipients in 2021-22 and 29 in 2020-21 following 20 Academic All-GLVC laurels in 2019-20, all highwater marks at the time. Shalash and the since-graduated Haziq Zed were named to the 11-member ASUN All-Academic Team, while Shalash, Zed, Kirn, Fischer, Pope and since-graduated Nolan McGrath were recognized on the College Sports Communicators' Academic All-District Team.

## WELL-ROUNDED INDIVIDUAL

In addition to the aforementioned academic accolades, Shalash was chosen as Bellarmine's selection for the ASUN Fall Winners for Life team for 2022. Off the pitch, Shalash carried a 3.93 GPA as a Biology/Pre-Med major. He served as the SAAC President while also serving on BU's Athletics Advisory board and conducting Biochemistry research in the summer.

## PRESEASON PREDICTIONS

In the ASUN preseason coaches' poll, Bellarmine was picked to finish fifth in the eight-team league. Defending ASUN Tournament and regular-season champion Lipscomb was predicted to repeat behind seven first-place votes and 63 total points. FGCU (53) was next followed by Central Arkansas (47), Stetson (39), Bellarmine (30), North Florida (29), Jacksonville (14) and Queens (13).
