Prior to 1993-94 NESCAC rules prevented Bowdoin from appearing in the NCAA Division III Men's Ice Hockey tournament. After that season, by a vote of the Presidents, team sports (except football) became eligible to participate in national championship tournaments. Bowdoin received its first NCAA bid in 1995-96
