NO. 2 HOPE OUTLASTS NO. 19 CHICAGO IN FIVE-SET THRILLER, EXTENDS WIN STREAK TO 10

The second-ranked Flying Dutch saddled up for a showdown vs. No. 19 University of Chicago on Thursday's Country Music Night at DeVos Fieldhouse, and it turned into a five-set thriller with 23 lead changes.

Hope emerged victorious, 25-14, 20-25, 25-23, 22-25, 15-9, and improved to 18-2 on the season. The Flying Dutch pushed their winning streak to 10 matches after playing past three sets for the first time this month: a span of eight matches.

Senior Alison DeWeerd (Kentwood, Michigan / South Christian) and senior Addie VanderWeide (Grand

Rapids Christian) shared team-high honors with 16 skills apiee. Senior Annie Lockett (Mason, Ohio / William Mason) chipped in 12 kills. Setter Lauren Lee (Plymouth, Michigan / Skyline) recorded a matchbest 45 assists.

Hope improved its record against nationally-ranked opponents this season to 7-2/

The Flying Dutch also raised their record at DeVos Fieldhouse to 7-2. Hope has three more regularseason home games scheduled: today, Oct. 23 vs.The University of Olivet and Oct. 25 vs. Calvin University.

NATIONAL RANKINGS

Second-ranked Hope has been ranked in the top five of the American Volleyball Coaches Association NCAA Division III poll all season.

The Flying Dutch opened the season second in the preseason poll and were ranked fourth during the second and third polls. Three weeks ago, Hope moved ack into the No. 2 spot behind Juniata College (Pa.). The Flying Dutch has appeared in 192 AVCA polls and been No. 1 10 different times, including the 2014 national championship season.

MIAA PRESEASON FAVORITE

Hope was chosen as the unanimous favorite in the 2024 MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll. The defending league champion Flying Dutch received all eight possible first-place votes. Hope topped the nine-team preseason poll with eight points. Coaches could not vote for their team. Calvin finished second with one first-place vote and 16 points. Albion placed third with 22, points and was followed by Adrian (29 points), Trine (35), Olivet (49), Alma (50), Kalamazoo (56) and Saint Mary's (59).



TOP NATIONAL HONOR

Addie VanderWeide made history for the Hope College volleyball team. The American Volleyball Coaches Association selected VanderWeide as the 2023 AVCA Co-National Player of the Year along with Juniata College (Pa.) setter Olivia Foley. VanderWeide is the first from Hope to receive the AVCA's highest individual athletic honor. VanderWeide also was chosen as an AVCA First Team All-American. the AVCA Region 7 Player of the Year and the MIAA Volleyball Player of the Year. VanderWeide established a Hope single-season record with 535 kills in 35 matches.

ACADEMIC TEAM EXCELLENCE

The 2023 Hope College volleyball team served up a successful year in the classroom, too. The Flying Dutch—the 2023 national runner-up in NCAA Division III—also claimed the American Volleyball Coaches Association Team Academic Award sponsored by INTENT during the 2023-24 school year. It markED the 16th consecutive season that Hope has received the AVCA accolade. The Flying Dutch, coached by Becky Schmidt, were among a record number of 1,400 collegiate and high school volleyball programs to earn the recognition. Hope also claimed the MIAA Team GPA Award.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Addie VanderWeide and Olivia Fiebing were selected to the 2023 Academic All-America® volleyball teams as chosen by College Sports Communicators. VanderWeide, an outside hitter, was one of nine first-team selections in NCAA Division III. Fiebing, a libero, was one of 10 third-team honorees. They were the third set of Hope volleyball teammates to be named to Academic All-America® teams in the same season, joining: Tracy Westra and McKenna Otto (2021 fall) and Lauren Hazekamp and Jayne Kessel (2015). Other members of the Flying Dutch to be chosen for Academic All-America® Volleyball teams: Otto (2021 spring), Adair Cutler (2020), Jenna Grasmeyer (2014) and Kim Grotenhuis (2000).

BECKY SCHMIDT HEAD COACH

Becky Schmidt '99 has made her mark on Hope College volleyball as a student-athlete and as a head coach. In 20 seasons, Schmidt has guided the Flying Dutch to a 512-130. Her collegiate coaching record, which includes three seasons (38-33) at the University of Redlands, Calif., is 550-163 and that ranks her among the nation's elite. During the 2023 season, Schmidt led Hope to a national runner-up finish and was voted by her peers as the 2023 AVCA Region 7 Coach of the Year and the MIAA Women's Volleyball Coach of the Year.

In 2014, Schmidt guided the Flying Dutch to their first national championship with a 6-0 run during the NCAA Division III Tournament. Hope matched a school record for wins in a single season with a 34-2 record. Fourteen times, Schmidt has guided the Flying Dutch to the NCAA Division III Tournament. Four times, Hope has won the NCAA regional final and advanced to the national quarterfinals.

Schmidt has led Hope to six outright MIAA regular-season championships (2023, 2021 fall, 2010, 2009, 2008 and 2005) and two MIAA title shares (2014 and 2013). Four times, Schmidt guided led the Flying Dutch to MIAA Tournament titles: 2023, 2021 spring, 2016, and 2010. The 2021 spring title occurred during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Twice, Schmidt led the Flying Dutch to 16-0 records in MIAA play (2005 and 2009). The 2009 team had a 34-4 mark, a school record for victories, and advanced to the national semifinals. The 2013 team reached the national quarterfinals and ended with a 32-3 record.

Schmidt coached her 100th Hope victory on Sept. 6, 2008, when the Flying Dutch defeated Olivet. Her Hope record at that time was 100-52. She coached her 200th Hope victory on October 15, 2011, when the Flying Dutch defeated St. Benedict. Her Hope record at that time was 200-60. She won her 300th Hope game on Nov. 21, 2014, against Clarkson, N.Y., in the NCAA Division III quarterfinals. Her record at the time was 300-73. She coached her 400th Hope victory on Sept. 8, 2019, against Kenyon, Ohio. Her Hope record at that time was 400-108. Schmidt coached her 500th Hope victory on Nov. 1, 2023, at Olivet.

In November 2008, she was elected the NCAA Division III representative to the Board of Directors of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA).

Schmidt had an article published in the June-July, 2008 issue of "Coaching Volleyball", the publication of the American Volleyball Coaches Association. The article, "Cultivating Competition: Five Scrimmages to Kindle Your Athletes' Competitive Fire," flows from coach Schmidt's twin interests: volleyball and sports psychology. A 1999 Hope graduate, Schmidt played middle blocker and ranked among the NCAA leaders in several statistical categories. She was voted the most valuable player in the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) as both a junior and senior. As a senior, she became the first Hope volleyball player to receive NCAA Division III All-American honors. She was also awarded an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship.

A kinesiology major, she received departmental recognitions for her academic work. Her senior year she was presented the John Schouten Award as the college's outstanding female student-athlete.

After graduating from Hope she was a graduate assistant volleyball coach at Miami University of Ohio while completing her master's degree in Sport Behavior and Performance. Prior to returning to her alma mater, she was head coach at the University of Redlands, Calif., compiling a 38-33 record in three seasons at the NCAA Division III institution.

She has also coached volleyball club teams in Michigan, Ohio, and California. In California, she has coached the Redlands Dragons 18s team and helped establish a volleyball development program for 12-year-olds. In 2002 she coached a USA Athlete's International volleyball team to a gold medal in the "Down Under Games" in Australia. Schmidt is a 1994 graduate of Holland High School. While at Hope she was involved in the Holland community, volunteering with the Boys and Girls Club and Habitat for Humanity. She has continued her involvement with Habitat for Humanity in California. She also served as an assistant women's lacrosse team coach at Redlands. Becky is married to David Fleece. The couple has a son. David has been the announcer at Hope volleyball matches for several years.



CARRIE LEHOCKY

Associate Head Coach

Carrie Lehocky '07 rejoined the Hope College volleyball staff prior to the 2018 season and became associate head coach in 2022. She also serves as

She also coached two years of freshmen girls basketball at Byron Center.
