# VOLLEYBALL SWEEPS WASHINGTON AND LEE, SETS UP REMATCH WITH NO. 1 JUNIATA

The second-ranked Hope College volleyball team powered its way into the NCAA Division III national semifinals with a season-best performance during a 3-0 quarterfinal victory against No. 11 Washington and Lee University on Wednesday.

The Flying Dutch (29-2) recorded team season-highs in three-set matches in both kills with 56 and assists with 53. Hope hit over .300 as a team for the second time during the NCAA Division III Tournament an 14th time this season. Outside hitter Addie VanderWeide put down a match-high 17 kills, the most by a Flying Dutch player in a three-set match. Junior Lauren Lee's 53 assists are the most by a Hope setter in a three-set match this season.

The Flying Dutch bring a 21-match winning streak into tonight's national semifinal against top-ranked Juniata College (Pennsylvania). It is the second Hope-Juniata match of the season and the third in a row in postseason play. They met in the 2023 title match and the 2022 national quarterfinals.

Juniata has won the past three meetings, including a 3-1 victory at Hope's DeVos Fieldhouse on Sept. 13.

The Flying Dutch then split their matches on Sept. 14, defeating Otterbein University in five sets before losing to eventual national quarterfinalist University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh in three sets. It was the last time Hope lost this season.

The business major has delivered on the court since transferring from the University of lowa, including this season with averages of 3.50 kills and 3.19 assists per set. VanderWeide is a full rotation standout.

As a junior, VanderWeide was selected as the AVCA Co-National Player of the

Lee (Plymouth, Michigan / Skyline) joined an elite Hope Volleyball club with her third All-America selection this season. The biology major equaled Lauren Hazekamp (2013-15) and Jenna Grasmeyer (2012-14) in accomplishing the feat.

One of the nation's top setters, Lee is averaging 11.39 assists this season for the Flying Dutch.

Lee made the All-America Second Team as a sophomore and the All-America First Team as a freshman.

Lockett (Mason, Ohio / William Mason) earned All-America honors for the second time in three season after missing the entire 2023 campaign due to injury.

The business major was an honorablemention recognition in 2022. This season, Lockett delivered 2.92 kills per set while maintaining a .290 hitting percentage.

DeWeerd (Kentwood, Michigan / South Christian) claimed All-America Honorable Mention distinction for the second consecutive season. Th4 social work major averaged 2.79 kills per set with a .368 hitting percentage as a senior.



### **ALL-REGION ACCOLADES**

Hope College seniors Addie VanderWeide, Alison DeWeerd and Annie Lockett joined junior Lauren Lee on the AVCA All-Region Teams for the 2024 season.

VanderWeide, an outside hitter, also was chosen as the AVCA Region 7 Player of the Year for the second consecutive season. VanderWeide and her teammates were among 14 first-team all-region selections. The business major claimed all-region distinction for the second team

DeWeerd earned all-region honors for the second time. Lockett received all-region accolades for the second time and the first time since 2022. Lee claimed all-region honors for the third time.

### **AVCA REGION, MIAA COACH OF THE YEAR**

A dominant Hope College volleyball team served up another honor for head coach Becky Schmidt.

The American Volleyball Coaches Association selected Schmidt as the Region 7 Coach of the Year after leading the Flying Dutch to a 25-2 overall record, an outright MIAA title and a return trip to the NCAA Division III Championships.

On Wednesday, Schmidt was named the MIAA Volleyball Coach of the Year.

In her 21st season as head coach, Schmidt guided the Flying Dutch to title repeats in both the MIAA regular season and league tournament. It marked the first time in program history Hope won back-to-back MIAA Tournament crowns.

### **HIGH ACHEIVERS**

Second-ranked Hope has been ranked in the top five of the American Volleyball Coaches Association NCAA Division III poll all season.

The Flying Dutch opened the season second in the preseason poll and were ranked fourth during the second and third polls.

On Oct. 1, Hope moved back into the No. 2 spot behind Juniata. The Flying Dutch has appeared in 196 AVCA polls and been No. 1 10 different times, including the 2014 national championship season.

#### **SETTING UP FOR SUCCESS**

Junior Lauren Lee (Plymouth, Michigan / Skyline) moved into second place all-time for career assists at Hope during the MIAA Tournament semifinal victory against Trine.

The biology major passed Lauren Hazekamp '15 with a 38-assist effort against the Thunder. Lee has 3,915 assists in 351 sets, surpassing third-place Hazekamp's 3,724 in 403 sets.

### **NOTEWORTHY**

Hope's regular-season winning percentage of .923 was ninth-best in NCAA Division III. Three teams in the nation did not lose: Juniata, MIT and Marietta.

Eleven times this season, a Hope hitter has recorded 16 or more kills. Annie Lockett delivered a season-high 22 kills during a five-set victory against Otterbein on Sept. 14 at DeVos Fieldhouse.

Lauren Lee has recorded 40 or more assists 11 times this season. Lee collected 61 assists against Otterbein on Sept. 14 at DeVos Fieldhouse.

Samantha Seib has delivered the Top 5 dig totals this season. Seib's highest total of 33 during a four-set win vs. Wis.-Whitewater Sept. 28 in Lexington, Kentucky.

A Hope blocker has posted five or more blocks three times this season. Sophomore Kamryn Burbridge holds the season high with six against Wisconsin-Oshkosh at Sept. 14 at DeVos Fieldhouse.

A Flying Dutch server have recorded four aces five different times this season. Three times, Samantha Seib accomplished the feat. Lauren Lee and Addie VanderWeide each have done it once.

### BACK-TO-BACK CHAMPS

Hope won back-to-back MIAA Tournament championships for the first time in program history last month. The Flying Dutch have claimed six tournament crowns: 20214, 2023, 2021 spring 2016, 2010 and 2000.

Hope ranks second among MIAA teams with league tournament crowns.



#### RECORD ALL-MIAA HONORS

Record-setting dominance propelled the MIAA-champion Hope College volleyball team to record-setting league honors. The second-ranked Flying Dutch finished with six All-MIAA recipients, including four on the first team, the most ever for the program. During the regular season, Hope went 8-0 in league play and won all 24 sets against MIAA competition for the first time in program history and the first time by an MIAA champion in five years. Senior outside hitter Addie VanderWeide led the accolades with a repeat selection as the MIAA's Most Valuable Player by hhe league's coaches.

VanderWeide (Grand Rapids, Michigan / Grand Rapids Christian HS) is joined on the All-MIAA First Team by three teammates: senior middle hitter Alison DeWeerd (Kentwood, Michigan / South Christian), junior setter Lauren Lee (Plymouth, Michigan / Saline) and senior outside hitter Annie Lockett (Mason, Ohio / William Mason). Hope also placed two on the All-MIAA Second Team: senior libero Samantha Seib (Elkhorn, Wisconsin / Catholic Central) and sophomore middle hitter Kamryn Burbridge (Grand Haven, Michigan / Grand Haven).

### TWO-TIME MIAA MVP

Addie VanderWeide joined current Flying Dutch head coach Becky Schmidt as Hope volleyball standouts chosen as MIAA MVP twice. Schmidt accomplished the feat in 1998 and 1997. It is the ninth time a Hope student-athlete has been selected as MIAA MVP in women's volleyball. Other recipients include Tracy Westra (2021), Andrea Helminiak (2009), Amy Brower (2001), DeeAnn Knoll (1987) and Linda Percy (1988). VanderWeide started all eight MIAA matches for the Flying Dutch. The business major totaled 96.5 points, 82 kills, 12 service aces and 77 digs with a hitting percentage of .311.

### **2023 CO-NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

Addie VanderWeide made history for the Hope College volleyball team. The American Volleyball Coaches Association selected VanderWeide as the 2023 AVCA Co-National Player of the Year along with Juniata College (Pa.) setter Olivia Foley. VanderWeide is the first from Hope to receive the AVCA's highest individual athletic honor. VanderWeide also was chosen as an AVCA First Team All-American. the AVCA Region 7 Player of the Year and the MIAA Volleyball Player of the Year. VanderWeide established a Hope single-season record with 535 kills in 35 matches.

### **ACADEMIC TEAM EXCELLENCE**

The 2023 Hope College volleyball team served up a successful year in the classroom, too. The Flying Dutch — the 2023 national runner-up in NCAA Division III — also claimed the American Volleyball Coaches Association Team Academic Award sponsored by INTENT during the 2023-24 school year. It markED the 16th consecutive season that Hope has received the AVCA accolade. The Flying Dutch, coached by Becky Schmidt, were among a record number of 1,400 collegiate and high school volleyball programs to earn the recognition. Hope also claimed the MIAA Team GPA Award.

### **ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS**

Addie VanderWeide and Olivia Fiebing were selected to the 2023 Academic All-America® volleyball teams as chosen by College Sports Communicators. VanderWeide, an outside hitter, was one of nine first-team selections in NCAA Division III. Fiebing, a libero, was one of 10 third-team honorees. They were the third set of Hope volleyball teammates to be named to Academic All-America® teams in the same season, joining: Tracy Westra and McKenna Otto (2021 fall) and Lauren Hazekamp and Jayne Kessel (2015). Other members of the Flying Dutch to be chosen for Academic All-America® Volleyball teams: Otto (2021 spring), Adair Cutler (2020), Jenna Grasmeyer (2014) and Kim Grotenhuis (2000).

# **BECKY SCHMIDT** HEAD COACH

Becky Schmidt '99 has made her mark on Hope College volleyball as a student-athlete and as a head coach. In 21 seasons, Schmidt has guided the Flying Dutch to a 538-132 record heading into the NCAA Division III Tournament. Her collegiate coaching record, which includes three seasons (38-33) at the University of Redlands, Calif., is 576-165 that ranks her among the nation's elite.

In 2024, Schmidt guided the Flying Dutch to a second consecutive sweep of MIAA regular-season and tournament titles and chosen as the AVCA Region 5 and MIAA Volleyball Coach of the Year.

In 2023, Schmidt led Hope to a national runner-up finish and was voted as the AVCA Region 7 Coach of the Year and the inaugural MIAA Volleyball Coach of the Year.

In 2014, Schmidt guided the Flying Dutch to their first national championship with a 6-0 run during the NCAA Division III Tournament. Hope matched a school record for wins in a single season with a 34-2 record. Fifteen times, Schmidt has guided the Flying Dutch to the NCAA Division III Tournament. Four times, Hope has won the NCAA regional final and advanced to the national quarterfinals.

Schmidt has led Hope to seven outright MIAA regular-season championships (2024, 2023, 2021 fall, 2010, 2009, 2008 and 2005) and two MIAA title shares (2014 and 2013). Five times, Schmidt guided led the Flying Dutch to MIAA Tournament titles: 2024, 2023, 2021 spring, 2016, and 2010. The 2021 spring title occurred during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Four times, Schmidt led the Flying Dutch to unbeaten records in MIAA play (8-0 in 2024 and 2023 and 16-0 in 2005 and 2009. The 2024 team won all 24 sets during eight MIAA matches. The 2009 team had a 34-4 mark, a school record for victories, and advanced to the national semifinals. The 2013 team reached the national quarterfinals and ended with a 32-3 record.

In November 2008, she was elected the NCAA Division III representative to the Board of Directors of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA).

Schmidt had an article published in the June-July, 2008 issue of "Coaching Volleyball", the publication of the American Volleyball Coaches Association. The article, "Cultivating Competition: Five Scrimmages to Kindle Your Athletes' Competitive Fire," flows from coach Schmidt's twin interests: volleyball and sports psychology.

A 1999 Hope graduate, Schmidt played middle blocker and ranked among the NCAA leaders in several statistical categories. She was voted the most valuable player in the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) as both a junior and senior. As a senior, she became the first Hope volleyball player to receive NCAA Division III All-American honors. She was also awarded an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship.

A kinesiology major, she received departmental recognitions for her academic work. Her senior year she was presented the John Schouten Award as the college's outstanding female student-athlete. After graduating from Hope she was a graduate assistant volleyball coach at Miami University of Ohio while completing her master's degree in Sport Behavior and Performance. Prior to returning to her alma mater, she was head coach at the University of Redlands, Calif., compiling a 38-33 record in three seasons at the NCAA Division III institution. Schmidt has also coached volleyball club teams in Michigan, Ohio, and California. In California, she has coached the Redlands Dragons 18s team and helped establish a volleyball development program for 12-year-olds. In 2002 she coached a USA Athlete's International volleyball team to a gold medal in Australia.

Carrie Lehocky '07 rejoined the Hope College volleyball staff prior to the 2018 season and became associate head coach in 2022. She also serves as an assistant professor of kinesiology at Hope.

During her Hope volleyball playing career, she was a

defensive specialist who was on the coaching staff for the 2009 national semifinalist team.

Lehocky coached for seven years with the Impact Dynamic Volleyball club, six years at Byron Center High School and one year apiece at Grand Haven and West Ottawa high schools. She also coached two years of freshmen girls basketball at Byron Center.

Lehocky was a middle school physical wellness instructor for West Ottawa Public Schools. She graduated from Hope College with a B.A. in Physical Education and a
