MEN'S SOCCER KICKS OFF MIAA PLAY VS. CALVIN

The Hope College men's soccer team begins its quest for a second consecutive MIAA title this evening at home against Calvin University at Van Andel Soccer Stadium. The Flying Dutchmen shared last season's crown with Trine University.

The Orange and Blue finished second in this season's MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll, receiving two firstplace votes and finishing with 12 points in the eightteam poll. Coaches could not vote for their own teams. Calvin topped the poll with six first-place votes and nine points. Trine placed third with 19 points and was followed by Albion College (28), Adrian College (29), Kalamazoo College (35), Alma College (45) and the University of Olivet (47).

Hope aims to build on a strong performance at nationally-ranked University of Notre Dame on Sept. 30. The Flying Dutchmen scored tying goals from junior Michael Dietz and sopjomore Jackson Mindling before the Fighting Irish delivered the game-winner in the 83rd minute for a 3-2 victory.

The Flying Dutchmen are seeking their first victory since a 3-1 decision on Oct. 15, 2013, at Van Andel Soccer Stadium. Calvin leads the series, 67-34-14, and is 16-0-4 in the past 20 meetings. Hope defeated four opponents this season: Ohio Wesleyan, 3-0, in the season opener, Franklin College, 10-0, Benedictine University, 4-0, and Andewrson University, 3-1.

GAME NOTES

LAST MEETING

The Flying Dutchmen dropped their last meeting to Calvin, 2-1, during the MIAA Tournament semifinals on Nov. 5, at Van Andel Soccer Stadium.

Seth Walters drew Hope even in the 29th minute after converting a penalty kick following the Knights' successful PK 4 ½ minutes earlier. Calvin's Colin Nieuwenhuis delivered the game-winner in the 79th minute.

Hope went on to receive an at-large berth to the NCAA Division III Tournament and advanced to the second round for the first time in 11 years before falling at seventh-ranked University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire, 2-1 in double overtime.

SETH THE STRIKER

Forward Seth Walters is the Flying Dutchmen's leading goal scorer vs. the Knights, striking in both of last season's games at Calvin: a 2-1 loss during the MIAA Tournament semifinals and a 1-1 regular-season tie on Oct. 9, at Calvin. Walters is the only Hope player on the roster with a goal against the Knights.

During his career, Walters has scored 38 times over 38 games. The engineering major has 14 goals the last two seasons, including three this season, since returning from a injury that sidelined him for the 2023 season.

GOING TO JACKSON

Sophomore Jackson Mindling has quickly emerged as a scoring force in two seasons for the Flying Dutchmen, totaling 19 goals in 30 career careers.

The Grand Rapids native played high school soccer close at Calvin at Grand Rapids Christian High School. Mindling netted 12 goals as a freshman en route to earning All-MIAA recognition.

This season, Mindling has seven goals, including game-winners against Ohio Wesleyan University on Aug. 29 at Van Andel Soccer Stadium and Sept. 13 at Benedictine University (Illinois).

Mindling ranks second among MIAA goalscorers with seven this season, trailing only Calvin's Matt Torrell, who heads into the MIAA opener with eight.



HOME AT VAN ANDEL

The Flying Dutchmen have won 72.2% of their games at Van Andel Soccer Stadium, posting a 110-38-14 since the facility opened for the 2009 season.

Hope is 63-23-5 against MIAA opponents at Van Andel (.649). Calvin owns nine of those victories, the most among opponents.

NEXT MATCH

The Flying Dutchmen's next match is Saturday, Oct. 11, at 3 p.m. at The University of Olivet. Hope leads the all-time series, 84-14-1, including a 1-0 victory last season.

The last three matches against the Comets have been decided by one goal, with Orange and Blue winning twice during the regular season and Olivet during the 2023 MIAA Tournament.

NEXT HOME MATCH

Hope returns to Van Andel Soccer Stadium on Wednesday, Oct. 15, at 7 p.m. against Kalamazoo College.

It is the Flying Dutchmen's Purple Community Game benefiting Van Andel Institute.

Proceeds from this fall's Purple College men's soccer, women's soccer on October 8 and volleyball games on October 14 help provide internships for Hope students at Van Andel Institute, a world-renowned leader in disease research and medical education.

David Blahnik was named Hope College men's soccer head coach on May 3, 2022. In two seasons, Blahnik has guided the Flying Dutchmen to an 18-9-9 overall record and a 9-4-1 mark against MIAA opponents.

Blahnik guided Olivet Nazarene to a .707 winning percentage over six seasons from 2012 through 2017. Blahnik served as an assistant men's soccer coach at Hope in 2019, helping the Flying Dutchmen return to the NCAA Division III Tournament and finishing with a 14-6-1 overall record. Blahnik holds a bachelor's degree in sport management and a Master of Business Administration degree from Olivet Nazarene.
