### VOLLEYBALL BEGINS QUEST FOR FOURTH CONSECUTIVE REGIONAL TITLE VS. NEW FOE

The 10th-ranked Hope College volleyball team is ready to serve again in the NCAA Division III Tournament and eyes a program-best fourth regional crown in a row.

The Flying Dutch open against a new opponent in Southern Virginia University from the USA South Athletic Conference. Hope, the regular-season MIAA champion, received an at-large berth to the national tournament after finishing runner-up in the MIAA Tournament. The Flying Dutch are led by three AVCA all-region selections announced earlier this week: setter and Region 7 Player of the Year Lauren Lee, middle blocker Kamryn Burbridge and middle blocker Olivia Wyma.

This is the Flying Dutch's 21st NCAA Tournament appearance and their seventh consecutive. Hope has earned regional championships and reached the national quarterfinals five times: 2024, 2023, 2022, 2013 and 2009. The Flying Dutch's all-time postseason record is 36-19 in 20 appearances (.655). Hope claimed a national title in 2014, finished national runner-up in 2023, advanced to the national semifinals in 2009, and reached the national quarterfinals in 2022 and 2013. Ironically, Hope lost to eventual national champion Juniata College in each of the past three tournaments.

Hope has never faced an opponent from the USA South. The Flying Dutch went 13-5 against non-MIAA opponents this season.

### MIAA TOURNAMENT RUNNER-UP

After taking a back-and-forth opening set, the seventh-ranked Hope College volleyball team looked to continue its recent dominance in The Rivalry. No. 22 Calvin University had other ideas, rallying to win the MIAA Tournament championship match in four sets on Nov. 15 at DeVos Fieldhouse. The 23-25, 25-14, 25-18, 25-18 victory snapped the Flying Dutch's eight-match winning streak in the series

### MIAA SEMIFINAL TEST PASSED

Faced with another barrage of tough serves while trying to close out the same opponent that tested them last week, the Hope College volleyball team rose to the challenge earlier this time. The seventh-ranked Flying Dutch swept fourth-seeded Trine University in the MIAA Tournament semifinals on Nov. 14 at DeVos Fieldhouse, one week after being pushed to five sets by the Thunder.

### **OUTRIGHT MIAA TITLE SECURED**

An emphatic fifth-set comeback capped an emotional and record-tying night for the seventh-ranked Hope College volleyball team. The Flying Dutch denied Trine University's valiant comeback on Senior Day Nov. 7 at DeVos Fieldhouse, winning 25-18, 25-18, 23-25, 25-18, 15-6 to clinch the third consecutive outright MIAA regularseason championship. With an 8-0 league record, Hope claimed a threepeat of MIAA titles for the second time in program history, matching the run from 1996-98, when current head coach Becky Schmidt was a standout student-athlete for the Flying Dutch.

### WIN VS. ALMA SEALS TITLE SHARE

The ninth-ranked Hope College volleyball team clinched the No. 1 seed for the upcoming MIAA Tournament with a bit of dramatic flair. The Flying Dutch fought off three set points in the third set, rallying to finish off Alma College, 25-13, 25-14, 28-26, on Nov. 8 at DeVos Fieldhouse. Hope (20-5 overall) improved to 7-0 in MIAA play and secured at least a share of the program's 17th regular-season title.



### **ROAD SWEEP AT OLIVET**

The 11th-ranked Hope College volleyball team kept its conference momentum rolling on Oct.r 22 with a 3-0 sweep at The University of Olivet, winning 25-23, 25-14, 29-27, inside the Cutler Event Center. The victory lifted the Flying Dutch to 19-5 overall and 6-0 in the MIAA, maintaining their spot atop the conference standings. Senior Brooke Fox (Saunemin, Illinois / Pontiac Township) powered 12 kills on a crisp .303 hitting percentage.

### **ALBION SHOWDOWN**

The 12th-ranked Hope College volleyball team aced a big challenge on the road Friday night. The Flying Dutch tied a school record with 17 service aces during a first-place showdown at Albion College and earned a 25-19, 24-26, 25-14, 25-19 victory. Hope (18-5) seized sole possession of the MIAA lead after handing the Britons their first league loss. The Orange and Blue matched the 2013 record for a 25-point set with 17 aces, accomplished in three sets vs. Kalamazoo College. The Flying Dutch surpassed their previous four-set best of 10 aces vs. Trine University in 2008. Freshmen Amelia Gagnon (Belmont, Michigan / Grand Rapids West Catholic) and Kiera Morrison Illinois / Wheaton Academy) spearheaded the serving with five aces apiece.

### **PURPLE COMMUNITY VICTORY**

Many hands contributed to a victorious and meaningful on Oct. 14 for the 12th-ranked Hope College volleyball team. The Flying Dutch honored family and friends before the Purple Community Game, benefiting Van Andel Institute, at DeVos Fieldhouse, then defeated Kalamazoo College in three sets (25-14, 25-22, 25-17). Hope (17-5, 4-0 MIAA) received kills from 13 different contributors against Kalamazoo. Sophomore middle blocker Olivia Wyma (Hartland, Wisconsin / Arrowhead) led the attack with 10 kills. Senior outside hitter Brooke Fox (Saunemin, Illinois / Pontiac Township) chipped in seven kills and nine digs.

### **TOUGH LOSS TO EAU-CLAIRE**

The Flying Dutch started with an electric first-set performance against No. 12 Wisconsin-Eau Claire on Oct. 11 at DeVos Fieldhouse but lost 9-25, 25-20, 25-22, 25-12. Senior Lauren Lee (Plymouth, Michigan / Skyline) paced Hope with 34 assists, seven kills, and a .538 hitting percentage, while junior Kamryn Burbridge (Grand Haven, Michigan / Grand Haven) recorded nine kills and two aces. Sophomore Olivia Wyma (Hartland, Wisconsin / Arrowhead) added six kills and four total blocks,. Junior Kate Oates (Liberty Township, Onio / Cincinnati Christian) anchored the back row with 18 digs. As a team, Hope totaled 45 kills and hit .248, while Eau Claire had 47 kills at a .250 clip.

#### **SWEEPING COE**

The opening set against Coe set the tone for a 27-25, 25-13, 25-19 victory on Oct. 11, Hope's 12th in a row. Senior Brooke Fox (Saunemin, Illinois / Pontiact Townships) led Hope with 10 kills and three service aces while hitting .308 against Coe (12-7). Junior Kamryn Burbridge (Grand Haven, Michigan / Grand Haven followed with eight kills and two blocks, while senior Ella Contant (Elmhurst, Illinois / York Community) added seven kills and a .313 hitting percentage. Sophomore Olivia Wyma (Hartland, Wisconsin / Arrowhead) tallied six kills and a teamhigh four blocks. Senior Lauren Lee (Plymouth, Michigan / Skyline) directed the offense with 28 assists and added 10 digs for a double-double, while junior Kate Oates (Liberty Township, Ohio / Cincinnati Christian) anchored the back row with 14 digs. As a team, the Orange and Blue hit .248 with 11 aces.

### NCAA TOURNAMENT REMATCH

The 12th-ranked Hope College volleyball team aced the rematch of last year's NCAA Division III Tournament regional final. The Flying Dutch tied their season high with 14 service aces during a four-set victory against Millikin University (Illinois) on Friday night at DeVos Fieldhouse's DeVette-Van Wieren Court. The 25-23, 25-21, 27-29, 25-20 victory over Millikin (8-9) extended the Flying Dutch's winning streak to 11 matches and opened a three-win weekend. Senior Tess Herendeen (Fort Wayne, Indiana / Homestead), junior Kate Oates (Liberty Township, Ohio / Cincinnati Christian) and freshman Kiera Morrison (Bartlett, Illinois / Wheaton Academy) shared match-high honors with three service aces apiece.

### **SERVING A VICTORY VS. ADRIAN**

Junior Kamryn Burbridge delivered a career-best four aces for the 12th-ranked Hope College volleyball team during a three-set victory at Adrian College on Oct. 8. Burbridge (Grand Haven, Michigan / Grand Haven) also shared match-high honors with eight kills and contributed two blocks. With a 25-18, 25-13, 25-14 win, the Flying Dutch extended their winning streak to 10 matches while improving to 14-4 overall and 3-0 in MIAA play. Burbridge hit at a .400 clip to share top kill honors with senior outside hitter Brooke Fox (Saunemin, Illinois / Pontiac Township). Sophomore middle blocker Olivia Wyma (Hartland, Wisconsin / Arrowhead) added seven kills and a team-high four blocks.

The eighth-ranked Hope College volleyball team dropped a pair of matches to Top-5 ranked opponents on Saturday in Oshkosh, Wisconsin.The Flying Dutch lost to No. 5 University of La Verne (California) in four sets (25-20, 12-25, 25-27, 27-25), then No. 3 University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh in three (25-12, 25-21, 25-20).

Two Hope teammates were named to the all-tournament team: senior setter Lauren Lee (Plymouth, Michigan / Skyline) and sophomore middle blocker Olivia Wyma (Hartland, Wisconsin / Arrowhead).

### **GOING THE DISTANCE VS. CHICAGO**

The Hope College volleyball team showed its trademark grit on Friday afternoon but fell just short in a five-set battle against the University of Chicago at the Kolf Sports Center in Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

The Maroons claimed the match 25-21, 25-22, 14-25, 22-25, 15-8 to hand the eighth-ranked Flying Dutch their second loss of the season. Chicago (4-3) topped the teams outside the American Volleyball Coaches Association NCAA Division III Top 25 who received votes. Senior Brooke Fox (Saunemin, Illinois / Pontiac Township HS) led Hope's attack with a matchhigh 18 kills and added two service aces.

### **BOUNCE BACK IN OHIO**

third-ranked Hope College volleyball team swept host Ohio Wesleyan in the morning, then outlasted Wittenberg University in a five-set thriller on Sept. 6. In the opener, Hope's attack clicked early and never slowed in a 25-19, 25-21, 25-17 victory over Ohio Wesleyan. #### MIAA ACADEMIC ELITE SELECTION

Eva Hurting '25 was among three Hope College standouts from its women's lacrosse and volleyball teams are among the first-ever 88 recipients of the MIAA's honor created to recognize exceptional academic achievement among student-athletes across the conference. Established by the MIAA Faculty Athletic Representatives, the Academic Elite Award will be presented annually to the male and female student-athlete in each sport with the highest cumulative grade-point average. Honorees must have at least two years of varsity participation and hold junior or senior academic standing. Each of these three Hope student-athletes achieved a cumulative 4.0 GPA.

A public accounting and business major, Hartung graduated last spring with a public accounting and business degree. Eva was named to the MIAA Academic Honor Roll for three consecutive years and received the 2024 NCAA Elite 90 Award, also recognizing her high academic results.

### 2024 AVCA ASSISTANT COACH OF THE YEAR

The American Volleyball Coaches Association recognized Hope College associate head coach Carrie Lehocky's contributions to the national quarterfinal-bound Flying Dutch and selected her as the 2024 AVCA Assistant Coach of the Year in NCAA Division III. Lehocky was Hope's first recipient and the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association's second since the program started in 2019.

Lehocky has served as associate head coach at her alma mater since 2022. She is the Flying Dutch's defensive coordinator, calls serves and manages team wellness.

## **BECKY SCHMIDT** HEAD COACH

Becky Schmidt '99 has made her mark on Hope College volleyball as a student-athlete and as a head coach. In 22 seasons, Schmidt has quided the Flying Dutch to a 538-134 record heading into the NCAA Division III Tournament. Her collegiate coaching record, which includes three seasons (38-33) at the University of Redlands, Calif., is 576-165 that ranks her among the nation's elite.

In 2024, Schmidt guided the Flying Dutch to a second consecutive sweep of MIAA regular-season and tournament titles and chosen as the AVCA Region 5 and MIAA Volleyball Coach of the Year.

In 2023, Schmidt led Hope to a national runner-up finish and was voted as the AVCA Region 7 Coach of the Year and the inaugural MIAA Volleyball Coach of the Year.

In 2014, Schmidt guided the Flying Dutch to their first national championship with a 6-0 run during the NCAA Division III Tournament. Hope matched a school record for wins in a single season with a 34-2 record.

Fifteen times, Schmidt has guided the Flying Dutch to the NCAA Division III Tournament. Four times, Hope has won the NCAA regional final and advanced to the national quarterfinals. Schmidt has led Hope to seven outright MIAA regular-season championships (2024, 2023, 2021 fall, 2010, 2009, 2008 and 2005) and two MIAA title shares (2014 and 2013). Five times, Schmidt guided led the Flying Dutch to MIAA Tournament titles: 2024, 2023, 2021 spring, 2016, and 2010. The 2021 spring title occurred during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Four times, Schmidt led the Flying Dutch to unbeaten records in MIAA play (8-0 in 2024 and 2023 and 16-0 in 2005 and 2009. The 2024 team won all 24 sets during eight MIAA matches. The 2009 team had a 34-4 mark, a school record for victories, and advanced to the national semifinals. The 2013 team reached the national quarterfinals and ended with a 32-3 record.

In November 2008, she was elected the NCAA Division III representative to the Board of Directors of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA).

Schmidt had an article published in the June-July, 2008 issue of "Coaching Volleyball", the publication of the American Volleyball Coaches Association. The article, "Cultivating Competition: Five Scrimmages to Kindle Your Athletes' Competitive Fire," flows from coach Schmidt's twin interests: volleyball and sports psychology.

A 1999 Hope graduate, Schmidt played middle blocker and ranked among the NCAA leaders in several statistical categories. She was voted the most valuable player in the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) as both a junior and senior. As a senior, she became the first Hope volleyball player to receive NCAA Division III All-American honors. She was also awarded an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship.

A kinesiology major, she received departmental recognitions for her academic work. Her senior year she was presented the John Schouten Award as the college's outstanding female student-athlete. After graduating from Hope she was a graduate assistant volleyball coach at Miami University of Ohio while completing her master's degree in Sport Behavior and Performance. Prior to returning to her alma mater, she was head coach at the University of Redlands, Calif., compiling a 38-33 record in three seasons at the NCAA Division III institution. Schmidt has also coached volleyball club teams in Michigan, Ohio, and California. In California, she has coached the Redlands Dragons 18s team and helped establish a volleyball development program for 12-year-olds. In 2002 she coached a USA Athlete's International volleyball team to a gold medal in Australia.

Carrie Lehocky '07 rejoined the Hope College volleyball staff prior to the 2018 season and became associate head coach in 2022. She also serves as an assistant professor of kinesiology at Hope.

Lehocky coached for seven years with the Impact Dynamic Volleyball club, six years at Byron Center High School and one year apiece at Grand Haven and West Ottawa high schools. She also coached two years of freshmen girls basketball at Byron Center.

Lehocky was a middle school physical wellness instructor for West Ottawa Public Schools. She graduated from Hope College with a B.A. in Physical Education and a Health Education minor.

Taylor Babec joined the Hope College volleyball coaching staff an assistant coach prior to the 2024 season.

Babec was a four-year letterwinner at Illinois Wesleyan University as a middle hitter. Babec finished her career ranked 14th in program history with an average of 0.70 blocks per set. Babec graduated from Illinois Wesleyan in May 2024 with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology.
