WOMEN'S SOCCER KICKS OFF MIAA PLAY VS. TRINE

The second-seeded Hope College women's soccer team opens MIAA Tournament play with a semifinal match against third-seeded Trine University at Van Andel Soccer Stadium. The two teams are meeting in the semifinals for the fourth consecutive season. The last two meetings were decided by one goal, with the Flying Dutch winning 1-0 in 2024 and 2-1 in 2023. Trine topped Hope 3-0 in 2022 in Angola.

The Flying Dutch are 22-13-3 in MIAA Tournament matches, including an 11-8 record in the semifinals. Today's winner advances to face either tops-seeded Calvin University or fourth-seeded Kalamazoo College in the finals on Saturday, Nov. 8, at the site of the highest remaining seed.

The Flying Dutch won the first meeting with Trine this season, 3-0, on October 11 in Angola, Indiana. Senior Lina Rea (Macomb, Michigan / Utica) scored twice for the Flying Dutch, and senior Ainsley Harris (Zeeland, Michigan / Holland Christian) added one goal. Junior goalkeeper Clara Feenstra (Hudsonville, Michigan / Hudsonville) recorded a four-save shutout.

Hope leads the all-time series, 35-1-2.

With 12 wins so far this season, Hope has reached double-digits wins for the fifth consecutive victory. Topping Trine would put the Flying Dutch at the 13-win mark for the first time since the 2019 season.

ALL-MIAA FIRST TEAM

The Flying Dutch claimed five first-team honorees: defenders Olivia Dieppa and Adelyn Raad, goalkeeper Clara Feenstra, and forwards Ainsley Harris and Lina Rea.

Dieppa proved to be a dynamic two-way player, contributing across the field for the Flying Dutch. The senior shared the team lead with eight goals during the regular season.

Raad (Hudsonville, Michigan / Hudsonville) quickly became a force as a freshman, helping to anchor Hope's defense while handling corner kicks.

Harris (Zeeland, Michigan / Holland Christian) received her third All-MIAA First Team honor after scoring a career-high six goals this season, including four against MIAA opponents, and collecting two assists.

Feenstra (Hudsonville, Michigan / Hudsonville) earned her second All-MIAA honor after ranking second in the MIAA with a 0.724 goals-against average and a .792 save percentage in league matches.

Rea (Macomb, Michigan / Utica) earned her first All-MIAA selection after a career-best season that included eight goals and two assists.

MIAA SPORTSWOMAN OF THE YEAR

Hope College women's soccer standout Olivis Dieppa has been selected as the MIAA Senior Sportswoman of the Year, honoring her remarkable combination of athletic excellence, academic achievement, and community service. The senior defender is the Flying Dutch's first recipient of the honor. Off the field, Dieppa maintains a 3.96 GPA as an Exercise Science major and earned early acceptance into Grand Valley State University's Physical Therapy program.

Her commitment to service includes volunteering with Mary Free Bed Rehabilitation Hospital, going on a mission trip to Kenya to provide water filters, and serving as the student-athlete mental health representative within Hope's athletic department. In addition to her research and teaching assistant roles, Dieppa has been a three-time MIAA Academic Honor Roll honoree and a leader in student panels.



ALL-MIAA SECOND TEAM

The Flying Dutch also placed three standouts on the All-MIAA Second Team in midfielders Lauren Ellinger and Grace Fowler, and defender Mia Hesley.

Ellinger (Fishers, Indiana / Hamilton Southeastern) recorded career highs with three goals and three assists, including two goals and two assists in MIAA play.

Fowler (Cumming, Georgia / Pinecrest Academy) earned her first All-MIAA honor and contributing one goal and two assists this season.

Hesley (Portage, Michigan / Portage Central) received her second All-MIAA recognition. The sophomore helped the Flying Dutch post six shutouts, including four against MIAA opponents.

TRIPLE THREATS

The Flying Dutch are one of two MIAA teams with three goal scorers ranking in the Top 10 for conference matches. Senior defender Olivia Dieppa tied for second with five goals in eight MIAA games. Senior forwards Ainsley Harris and Lina Rea tied for fifth with four goals apiece.

Hope put six in the Top 10 in assists: Adelyn Raad first with eight, freshman Joanna Namel (South Lyon, Michigan / Saint Catherine of Siena Academy) tied for fifth with three, and Lauren Ellinger, Ainsley Harris, Lina Rea and junior forward Halle Barnard (Rockford, Michigan / Rockford) tied for seventh with two apiece.

ASSISTS ARE TOTALLY RAAD

Adelyn Raad needs one assist to tie the school record for single-season assists of 13. The freshman is currently tied for second place among Flying Dutch standouts with Lindsey (O'Dell) Engelsman, Hope's current associate athletic director.

COACHING STAFF



HOLL VAN NOORD
Head Coach

Holly Van Noord was appointed as the seventh Hope College women's soccer head coach on June 7, 2024, after spending the previous three seasons as an assistant coach for the Flying Dutch.

In her first season, Van Noord guided Hope to a 12-4-2 overall record and a 6-1-1 mark in MIAA play. Van Noord coached six All-MIAA selections and 2024 MIAA Newcomer of the Year, defender Mia Hesley.

Prior to Hope, Van Noord served as a physical and health education teacher for Hudsonville Public Schools. Van Noord also was the Hudsonville High School girls soccer coach for six seasons and led the Eagles to an 83-22-16 overall record (.752). Hudsonville finished state runner-up in Division 1 in 2023.



ELLIOT SLENK
Associate Head Coach

Elliot Slenk has been a member of the Hope College Women's Soccer coaching staff since the 2012 season. He became associate head coach prior to the 2019 season. Along with coaching at Hope, Slenk currently serves as the head coach of the Holland Christian varsity girls soccer team.

Prior to coming to Hope, Slenk spent four years as the assistant coach for the Holland Christian boys varsity team helping them to a district and regional championship along with a state semifinal finish in 2008. Slenk has led the Holland Christian girls program since 2012. He coached them to district championships and regional final runner-up finishes in both 2012 and 2015. In 2017, the Maroons won both the District and Regional Championships on their way to a state semifinal finish.



MEGAN BIGELOW
Assistant Coach

Megan Bigelow '21 joined her alma mater's women's soccer coaching staff as an assistant before the 2025 season. Bigelow played soccer for the Flying Dutch for four seasons, earning All-MIAA First Team honors in 2019. She made the MIAA Academic Honor Roll all four years before graduating. She majored in business and economics.
