## **VOLLEYBAL RETURNS HOME THIS WEEKEND,** HOSTS TWO NATIONALLY-RANKED FOES

The 18th-ranked Hope College volleyball team will have home-court advantage for the first time in nearly a month this weekend.

The Flying Dutch host No. 14 Marietta College (Ohio) on Friday and No. 7 Illinois Wesleyan University on Saturday at DeVos Fieldhouse. They are the Orange and Blue's first home matches since a three-set victory against Concordia University (Wisconsin) on August 30.

Hope is riding a five-match winning streak heading into the weekend. The current run started with a three-set victory at No. 22 Carnegie Mellon University

on Sept. 18 in Pittsburgh and continues with four victories in two days at the Gallaudet University Kim Worthington Classic last weekend in Washington, D.C.

The Flying Dutch are 2-0 all-time against Marietta, sweeping the Pioneers in regular-season matches during the 2013 and 1987 seasons.

Hope is 8-3 against Illinois Wesleyan, including three consecutive victories on the Titans' court during the 2023, 2021 and 2019 seasons.

## GAME NOTES

### **MIAA HONORS**

Hope College setter Lauren Lee was selected as the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association Women's Volleyball Specialist of the Week on Monday for the first time this season and the ninth time in her career.

The senior from Plymouth, Michigan (Skyline) led the 18th-ranked Flying Dutch to a 5-0 record last week during matches in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and Washington, D.C. Lee averaged 10.69 assists, 2.38 digs and 1.0 kills per set over matches at No. 22 Camegie Mellon University and a four-team tournament at Gallaudet University.

### **PERFECT WEEKEND**

The 18th-ranked Hope College volleyball team capped off a dominant weekend in Washington, D.C. with two more wins on Saturday. The Flying Dutch pushed their win streak to five matches by opening the day with a gritty 3-1 victory over Franklin and Marshall University (Pennsylvania), 19-25, 25-15, 28-26, 25-23), and closing it by sweeping Whittier College (California) in three sets sets, 25-19, 28-26, 25-23, at Gallaudet University's Worthington Classic.

Senior setter Lauren Lee (Plymouth, Michigan / Skyline) was named Tournament MVP. Sophomore middle blocker Olivia Wyma (Hartland, Wisconsin / Arrowhead) also made the all-tournamen team.

### **GOOD START IN D.C.**

The 18th-ranked Hope College volleyball team flexed its balance and serving power during a 3–0 sweep over the University of California-Santa Cruz on Friday afternoon (25–9, 25–20, 25–21) and a second sweep against host Gallaudet University (25-16, 25-17, 25-21) in the evening at the Worthington Classic in Washington, D.C.

Senior Kate Luurtsema (Alto, Michigan / South Christian) led vs. UC-Santa Cruz with seven kills. Junior Kamryn Burbridge (Grand Haven, Michigan / Grand Haven) had a team-high kilsl vs. Gallaudet.



## **FUN IN PITTSBURGH**

The 18th-ranked Hope College volleyball team stayed in control from start to finish Thursday night, sweeping No. 22-ranked Carnegie Mellon University in straight sets (25-16, 25-17, 26-24) at the Highmark Center for Health, Wellness and Athletics in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. The Flying Dutch improved to 5-4 on the season.

Hope finished with 41 kills as a team at a .246 hitting percentage. Defensively, the Flying Dutch held Carnegie Mellon (9-3) to .173. hitting Senior Brooke Fox (Saunemin, Illinois / Pontiac Township HS) led the offense with nine kills.

## **TOP-5 SHOWDOWNS**

The eighth-ranked Hope College volleyball team dropped a pair of matches to Top-5 ranked opponents on Saturday in Oshkosh, Wisconsin. The Flying Dutch lost to No. 5 University of La Verne (California) in four sets (25-20, 12-25, 25-27, 27-25), then No. 3 University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh in three (25-12, 25-21, 25-20). Two Hope teammates were named to the all-tournament team: senior setter Lauren Lee (Plymouth, Michigan / Skyline) and sophomore middle blocker Olivia Wyma (Hartland, Wisconsin / Arrowhead).

## **GOING THE DISTANCE VS. CHICAGO**

The Hope College volleyball team showed its trademark grit on Friday afternoon but fell just short in a five-set battle against the University of Chicago at the Kolf Sports Center in Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

The Maroons claimed the match 25-21, 25-22, 14-25, 22-25, 15-8 to hand the eighth-ranked Flying Dutch their second loss of the season. # MIAA CONFERENCE

#### **BOUNCE BACK IN OHIO**

The third-ranked Hope College volleyball team swept host Ohio Wesleyan in the morning, then outlasted Wittenberg University in a five-set thriller to bounce back from a five-set loss at Denison University (Ohio) on Friday to improve their record to 4-1 overall.

In the opener, Hope's attack clicked early and never slowed in a 25-19, 25-21, 25-17 victory over Ohio Wesleyan. The Flying Dutch hit .240 as a team, paced by sophomore Olivia Wyma (Hartland, Wisconsin / Arrowhead HS), who recorded 11 kills on a .563 hitting percentage.

The afternoon matchup against Wittenberg turned into a test of resilience for the Flying Dutch, who won 25-21, 28-26, 28-30, 11-25, 15-7. Junior Kamryn Burbridge (Grand Haven, Michigan / Grand Haven) led the charge with 16 kills and three blocks, while Wyma continued her hot hitting with 14 kills at a .462 clip.

## **FIRST LOSS**

The Hope College volleyball team opened strong but fell in a five-set battle at Denison University (Ohio) on Sept. 5. The Flying Dutch (2-1) took sets one and three, but the Big Red answered each time and pulled away late for a 13-25, 25-19, 15-25, 25-19, 15-11 victory inside Livingston Gymnasium. Senior Brooke Fox (Saunemin, Illinois / Pontiac Township HS) led Hope with 12 kills.

## 2-0 START

The third-ranked Hope College volleyball team turned back a second opponent in as many days on Aug. 30.

Hope powered Concordia University (Wis.) in straight sets, 25-20, 25-17, 25-19, at DeVos Fieldhouse. Middle hitter senior Kate Luurtsema (Alto, Michigan / South Christian) led the charge with 10 kills on the afternoon, while senior setter Lauren Lee (Plymouth, Michigan / Skyline) orchestrated the attack with 30 assists. Lee also put down seven kills in the win.



## **SUCCESSFUL HOME OPENER**

The third-ranked Hope College volleyball team delivered a statement win in its home opener on Aug. 29. With several new faces in the lineup, the Flying Dutch erupted early and often for a 25-15, 25-15, 25-17 victory against Ohio Northern University at DeVos Fieldhouse.

Senior Brooke Fox (Saunemin, Illinois / Pontiac Township HS) led Hope with 13 kills.

## **MIAA PRESEASON FAVORITES**

The Hope College volleyball team is favored to continue its reign as Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association champion.

Winners of the past two league titles, the Flying Dutch finished first in the 2025 MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll.

Hope collected six of eight possible first-place votes and totaled 10 points. Coaches could not vote for their teams. Calvin University placed second with 13 points and three first-place votes.

Rounding out the poll were Albion College (22), Trine University (30), Adrian College (35), Alma College (40), Saint Mary's College (51), the University of Olivet (56) and Kalamazoo College (62).

## **DECORATED RETURNERS**

Lauren Lee, a 5'7" senior setter from Plymouth, Michigan (Skyline HS), returns as a three-time AVCA All-American, earning first-team honors last season.

# **BECKY SCHMIDT** HEAD COACH

Becky Schmidt '99 has made her mark on Hope College volleyball as a student-athlete and as a head coach. In 21 seasons, Schmidt has quided the Flying Dutch to a 538-132 record heading into the NCAA Division III Tournament. Her collegiate coaching record, which includes three seasons (38-33) at the University of Redlands, Calif., is 576-165 that ranks her among the nation's elite.

In 2024, Schmidt guided the Flying Dutch to a second consecutive sweep of MIAA regular-season and tournament titles and chosen as the AVCA Region 5 and MIAA Volleyball Coach of the Year.

In 2023, Schmidt led Hope to a national runner-up finish and was voted as the AVCA Region 7 Coach of the Year and the inaugural MIAA Volleyball Coach of the Year.

In 2014, Schmidt guided the Flying Dutch to their first national championship with a 6-0 run during the NCAA Division III Tournament. Hope matched a school record for wins in a single season with a 34-2 record. Fifteen times, Schmidt has guided the Flying Dutch to the NCAA Division III Tournament. Four times, Hope has won the NCAA regional final and advanced to the national quarterfinals.

Schmidt has led Hope to seven outright MIAA regular-season championships (2024, 2023, 2021 fall, 2010, 2009, 2008 and 2005) and two MIAA title shares (2014 and 2013). Five times, Schmidt guided led the Flying Dutch to MIAA Tournament titles: 2024, 2023, 2021 spring, 2016, and 2010. The 2021 spring title occurred during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Four times, Schmidt led the Flying Dutch to unbeaten records in MIAA play (8-0 in 2024 and 2023 and 16-0 in 2005 and 2009. The 2024 team won all 24 sets during eight MIAA matches. The 2009 team had a 34-4 mark, a school record for victories, and advanced to the national semifinals. The 2013 team reached the national quarterfinals and ended with a 32-3 record.

In November 2008, she was elected the NCAA Division III representative to the Board of Directors of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA).

Schmidt had an article published in the June-July, 2008 issue of "Coaching Volleyball", the publication of the American Volleyball Coaches Association. The article, "Cultivating Competition: Five Scrimmages to Kindle Your Athletes' Competitive Fire," flows from coach Schmidt's twin interests: volleyball and sports psychology.

A 1999 Hope graduate, Schmidt played middle blocker and ranked among the NCAA leaders in several statistical categories. She was voted the most valuable player in the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) as both a junior and senior. As a senior, she became the first Hope volleyball player to receive NCAA Division III All-American honors. She was also awarded an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship.

A kinesiology major, she received departmental recognitions for her academic work. Her senior year she was presented the John Schouten Award as the college's outstanding female student-athlete. After graduating from Hope she was a graduate assistant volleyball coach at Miami University of Ohio while completing her master's degree in Sport Behavior and Performance. Prior to returning to her alma mater, she was head coach at the University of Redlands, Calif., compiling a 38-33 record in three seasons at the NCAA Division III institution. Schmidt has also coached volleyball club teams in Michigan, Ohio, and California. In California, she has coached the Redlands Dragons 18s team and helped establish a volleyball development program for 12-year-olds. In 2002 she coached a USA Athlete's International volleyball team to a gold medal in Australia.

Associate Head Coach

Carrie Lehocky '07 rejoined the Hope College volleyball staff prior to the 2018 season and became associate head coach in 2022. She also serves as an assistant professor of kinesiology at Hope.

During her Hope volleyball playing career, she was a
