



MEN'S BASKETBALL AIMS FOR 4-0 MIAA START WITH VICTORY AT HOME AGAINST ALMA

The Hope College men's basketball team looks to continue a perfect start to MIAA play this afternoon at DeVos Fieldhouse when the Flying Dutchmen host Alma College. The Orange and Blue enter tied atop the MIAA standings, sharing 3-0 league records with Calvin University.

On Wednesday, the Flying Dutchmen defeated Adrian College, 86-76, at home behind a near-triple double from forward Parker Hovey, the reigning MIAA Men's Basketball Athlete of the Week. Hovey totaled 17 points, 12 rebounds and a DeVos Fieldhouse record-tying nine blocked shots. Hovey matched Nate VanArendonk's 2012 blocked shot performance against Adrian.

Hovey also sank 13 of Hope's season-high 32 made free throws. Guard Marcus Wourman also chipped in 17 points.

The Orange and Blue leads the all-time series against Alma, 164-51. Hope has won the past nine meetings against the Scots, dating back to the 2020-21 season. The Flying Dutchmen have swept the past eight regular-season series, including victories last season of 95-46 at home and 77-54 on the road.

The 164 wins is the most by the Flying Dutchmen against an MIAA opponent, nine more than the next team, Kalamazoo College, and 11 more than third-place Adrian College.

CELEBRITY SIGHTING

International social media sensations Josh and Jase — Josh Clarke and Jason Riley from Nottingham, England — attended the game as the college's guests. The duo is touring the United States, beginning this week in West Michigan and documenting their adventures on TikTok, Instagram, Facebook and YouTube. It marked their first collegiate basketball game as fans. Josh & Jase sat courtside in the Hope student section, participated in the Big E-sponsored halftime shootout and met with fans. Their content can be found on TikTok, Instagram and Facebook.

CLOSE CALLS

The Flying Dutchmen tipped off the first of MIAA play with two thrillers against two of the top four teams in the MIAA Mens' Basketball Coaches Preseason Poll: an 82-80 victory at home against Trine University on Jan. 7 and a 67-65 victory at The University of Olivet. It marked the first time since the 2008-09 season the Flying Dutchmen played in back-to-back games decided by two of fewer points.

FREE STUFF

The Flying Dutchmen use the free-throw line more than anyone on the MIAA, ranking first in free-throw attempts with 366 and made free throws with 268. Hope ranks second in free-throw percentage at .732. Junior Parker Hovey are the Orange and Blue's top free-throw shooters, ranking eighth (.718) and ninth (.712), respectively.

STEAL CITY

Hope gets after it defensively in the backcourt, swiping a league-best 9.73 steals per game. Three Flying Dutchmen rank in the Top 10 individually: Hovey (first at 2.5), freshman guard Brendan Cargill (fifth at 1.6), and Wourman (tied for sixth at 1.5). The single-game high for steals is six, shared by sophomore center Hovey twice (vs. North Central and Olivet), and sophomore Orion Yant (vs. Wisconsin-Whitewater).

SCORING MACHINES

Two different Flying Dutchmen have totaled at least 25 points in a game this season: Hovey and Cargill. Hovey netted 33 points vs. Olivet 29 points against Wisconsin-Platteville on Dec. 13 and against Muskingum. Hovey also netted 25 points against Wisconsin-Whitewater on Dec. 19. Cargill poured in 29 points against Anderson University (Indiana) on Jan. 3.



ON THE REBOUND

Three Flying Dutchmen have reached double-digits in rebounds in a single game this season, including Hovey four times with 12 vs. Franklin University (Indiana) on Nov. 8 and Adrian on Jan. 14, and 10 against both Wisconsin-Whitewater on Dec. 19 and Elmhurst University (Illinois) on Nov. 12. Yant pulled down a career-high 10 rebounds vs. WashU and Jan. 2. Cargill collected a career-best 10 rebounds against Wheaton College (Illinois) on Nov. 15.

MIAA ATHLETE OF THE WEEK

Parker Hovey has claimed all three of the Flying Dutchmen's MIAA Men's Basketball Athlete of the Week accolades this season. Prior to this week, the junior earned the honor on Dec. 8 and Dec. 15. They were his first league weekly recognition. The MIAA honored Hovey on Jan. 12, Dec. 15 and Dec. 8.

ALL-TOURNAMENT HONOR

Forward Parker Hovey delivered one bright spot for the Flying Dutchmen during the Glenn Van Wieren Classic on Jan. 2-3 at DeVos Fieldhouse, being named as one of six all-tournament selections. Hovey averaged 25.5 points, 6.5 rebounds, 1.5 blocks, 1.5 assists and 1.0 steals vs. fourth-ranked WashU and Muskingum, who had a combined three losses between them at the time. Hovey totaled 22 points and six rebounds against WashU and scored 29 points and seven rebounds against Muskingum.

NON-CONFERENCE TESTS

Hope had played the toughest schedule among MIAA teams heading into league play, ranking 38th out of 400-plus teams in NCAA Division III. The Flying Dutchmen's non-league opponents combined for 76-51 record (.595).

COACHING MILESTONE

Greg Mitchell '89 became the third Flying Dutchmen basketball coach to reach 200 career wins earlier this season, joining Glenn Van Wieren (660) and Russ DeVette (318) after a 98-83 victory at Anderson in the season opener. "Any kind of big win, I find myself reflecting," head coach Greg Mitchell said after the game. "I'm blessed to be in the position I'm in with the players I've coached and our coaching staff I've worked with." Heading into the Alma game, Mitchell's overall record at Hope is 207-102 (.670), including a 108-41 mark in MIAA play (.725).

GREG MITCHELL *HEAD COACH*

Greg Mitchell is the 11th head coach in the Flying Dutchmen's storied history. He joined the college in July 2014 and also holds the rank of assistant professor of kinesiology.

In 10-plus seasons, Mitchell has led the Flying Dutchmen to a 207-102 record, four MIAA regular-season championships, four MIAA Tournament titles, and six NCAA Division III Championships tournament appearances.

Mitchell has deep ties to Hope Basketball. The 1989 Hope graduate played four seasons of basketball for the Flying Dutchmen, winning two MIAA championships (1986-87 and 1987-88) and making three NCAA Division III Tournament appearances (1987-89) during that time.

As a junior, Mitchell and the Flying Dutchmen made their deepest run in the national tournament, reaching the 1988 Great Lakes Regional final before falling in double overtime to eventual national champion Ohio Wesleyan University, 110-107.

Mitchell helped the Flying Dutchmen post a 74-27 overall record and a 40-8 mark in MIAA play during his four seasons as a player. He still holds the Flying Dutchmen record for career 3-point shooting at 46.4 percent (116-of-250). He averaged a career-high 10.3 points per game his senior season in 1988-89.

Before returning to his alma mater, Mitchell spent 25 years coaching varsity boys basketball at Laingsburg High School near Lansing, Michigan, while teaching for Laingsburg and Okemos schools. Mitchell compiled a 362-201 career record at Laingsburg, including a state runner-up finish during the 2012-13 season. At Laingsburg, Mitchell coached Laingsburg to three Michigan High School Athletic Association regional championships, six district championships, and six conference championships.

Mitchell was named Coach of the Year seven times: twice in Class C by the Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan (2013 and 1997), once in Class C by the Associated Press Sports Editors of Michigan (2012), once in Class C by the Detroit News (2013) and three times by the Lansing State Journal (2013, 2012 and 1997).

Mitchell earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Hope. He also received a master's degree in athletic administration from Michigan State University.

Mitchell and his wife, Dina Zurchauer ('88), have four children: daughters Aleah, Quincie and Jalynn, and son Bryson.

KEN GEORGE

Assistant Coach

Ken George became a full-time assistant coach for Hope College Men's Basketball on April 12, 2024. George had served as a part-time assistant for the Flying Dutchmen since the 2020-21 season. Prior to joining Hope, George coached boys basketball at the high school level for three decades. He won 341 games over 24 seasons at Forest Hills Central in Ada, Michigan, and led the Rangers to nine conference championships, four Michigan High School Athletic Association district titles and three MHSAA regional championships. George is a 1986 Farmington Hills Harrison High School and 1990 Albion College graduate. He played point guard for the Britons. He and his wife, Meggan, have two sons, Jordan, a 2020 Hope graduate, and Tyler, a 2022 graduate.

Coach Ryan Klingler brings a wealth of experience and passion to his role as a varsity assistant with the Hope College men's basketball team. With 15 years of varsity high school coaching under his belt, including head coaching stints at Fennville HS and Grandville HS, Coach Klingler has a proven track record of developing talented student-athletes and competitive programs. Currently teaching at Grandville High School and residing in Holland, Klingler has a deep-rooted connection to Hope College, graduating in 2001. When not coaching or serving the community, Klingler enjoys spending time with his family, including his two children, Drew (19) and Gina (18). He also actively helps manage a local restaurant, Baja Grill, with his two younger brothers, Ross and Gary.

Assistant Coach

Tom Davelaar has been as an assistant coach with Hope College Men's Basketball since the 1981-82 season. Davelaar began his tenure at Hope as a volunteer after serving as the boys basketball coach at Zeeland. His role has progressed each and every year at Hope with his primary responsibility being that of opponent scouting and preparation. A 1972 graduate of Hope College, Davelaar taught social studies and history for 39 years with the Zeeland Public Schools. He retired in 2011. He still is active in the Zeeland Public Schools, providing the "golden chords" as the public address announcer for football and track. Davelaar has three children -- Hope grads, Joe '00, Kate '00, and Sarah, an '04 JMU '04 grad -- and four grandchildren. Davelaar is married to Anne Bakker.

The second-ranked Hope College volleyball team powered its way into the NCAA Division III national semifinals with a season-best performance during a 3-0 quarterfinal victory against No. 11 Washington and Lee University on Wednesday.

The Flying Dutch (29-2) recorded team season-highs in three-set matches in both kills with 56 and assists with 53. Hope hit over .300 as a team for the second time during the NCAA Division III Tournament an 14th time this season. NEW OPPONENT

The Flying Dutch are trying to win a national title in the state of Virginia for the second time. In 2014, Hope defeated Emory University (Georgia) in the title match in five sets at Christopher Newport University in Newport News.

Four from Hope College received All-America recognition from the AVCA:

- OH Addie VanderWeide, first team;
- S Lauren Lee, first team;
- OH Annie Lockett, third team;
- MB Alison DeWeerd, honorable mention.

VanderWeide (Grand Rapids, Michigan / Grand Rapids Christian) repeated as an All-America First Team honoree this season.

The business major has delivered on the court since transferring from the University of Iowa, including this season with averages of 3.50 kills and 3.19 assists per set. VanderWeide is a full rotation standout.

As a junior, VanderWeide was selected as the AVCA Co-National Player of the Year

Lee (Plymouth, Michigan / Skyline) joined an elite Hope Volleyball club with her third All-America selection this season. The biology major equaled Lauren Hazekamp (2013-15) and Jenna Grasmeyer (2012-14) in accomplishing the feat.

One of the nation's top setters, Lee is averaging 11.39 assists this season for the Flying Dutch.

Lee made the All-America Second Team as a sophomore and the All-America First Team as a freshman.

Lockett (Mason, Ohio / William Mason) earned All-America honors for the second time in three seasons after missing the entire 2023 campaign due to injury.

The business major was an honorable-mention recognition in 2022. This season, Lockett delivered 2.92 kills per set while maintaining a .290 hitting percentage.

DeWeerd (Kentwood, Michigan / South Christian) claimed All-America Honorable Mention distinction for the second consecutive season. The social work major averaged 2.79 kills per set with a .368 hitting percentage as a senior.

**ALL-REGION ACCOLADES**

Hope College seniors Addie VanderWeide, Alison DeWeerd and Annie Lockett joined junior Lauren Lee on the AVCA All-Region Teams for the 2024 season.

VanderWeide, an outside hitter, also was chosen as the AVCA Region 7 Player of the Year for the second consecutive season. VanderWeide and her teammates were among 14 first-team all-region selections. The business major claimed all-region distinction for the second team

DeWeerd earned all-region honors for the second time. Lockett received all-region accolades for the second time and the first time since 2022. Lee claimed all-region honors for the third time.

AVCA REGION, MIAA COACH OF THE YEAR

A dominant Hope College volleyball team served up another honor for head coach Becky Schmidt.

The American Volleyball Coaches Association selected Schmidt as the Region 7 Coach of the Year after leading the Flying Dutch to a 25-2 overall record, an outright MIAA title and a return trip to the NCAA Division III Championships.

On Wednesday, Schmidt was named the MIAA Volleyball Coach of the Year.

In her 21st season as head coach, Schmidt guided the Flying Dutch to title repeats in both the MIAA regular season and league tournament. It marked the first time in program history Hope won back-to-back MIAA Tournament crowns.

HIGH ACHIEVERS

Second-ranked Hope has been ranked in the top five of the American Volleyball Coaches Association NCAA Division III poll all season.

The Flying Dutch opened the season second in the preseason poll and were ranked fourth during the second and third polls.

On Oct. 1, Hope moved back into the No. 2 spot behind Juniata. The Flying Dutch has appeared in 196 AVCA polls and been No. 1 10 different times, including the 2014 national championship season.
