WOMEN'S BASKETBALL EYES SEASON SWEEP OF SAINT MARY'S

The nationally-ranked Hope College women's basketball teams aims for its first sweep of an MIAA opponent this afternoon when the Flying Dutch host Saint Mary's College at DeVos Fieldhouse. The Flying Dutch won the first meeting, 82-42, on Dec. 8 in Notre Dame, Ind.

The Orange and Blue overcame a slow start during their first game in two weeks, outscoring the Belles, 68-27, over the final three quarters. Center Leah Richards led the Flying Dutch with 15 points. Guard Chlose Brunsberg hit 4-of-5 shots from 3-point range as she added 12 points, while guard/forward Maddie Petroelje chipped in 11 points.

Hope leads the all-time series against Saint Mary's by a 71-6 margin. The Orange and Blue have won the past 35 meetings, including 15 consecutive regular-season seeps dating back to the 2008-09 season.

On Wednesday, the Flying Dutch posted an 84-65 victory at Adrian College, securing their sixth MIAA victory in seven tries this season with fourth-quarter dominance. After the Bulldogs pulled within one late in the third quarter, Hope opened the final 10-minute period on a 13-0 run and never looked back. Sophomore Maddie Petroelje led Hope's scoring effort with 17 points, hitting three triples and going a perfect 4-for-4 at the line.

DOMINANT DEFENSE

A dominant afternoon for the ninth-ranked Hope College women's basketball team on Jan. 10 delivered a 104-43, bounce-back win over The University of Olivet. The matchup was effectively decided within the opening minutes when the Flying Dutch set a new DeVos Fieldhouse record for fewest points allowed in a quarter with two, taking a 31-2 lead into the second quarter. The mark surpassed the previous record from 2020 during the NCAA Tournament when Hope allowed just three points against Grove City College. Offensively, it was the 41st time the Flying Dutch eclipsed 100 points in a game.

BIGGEST CROWD

A timely Terin delivered on both ends of the court at a critical juncture for the Hope College women's basketball team in the latest round of The Rivalry on Jan. 3 at DeVos Fieldhouse. Junior guard Terin Maynard's dogged defense and assertive offense helped the ninth-ranked Flying Dutch stave off a comeback-minded Calvin University midway through the third quarter on Saturday, earning a 67-56 victory in front of a season-high DeVos Fieldhouse crowd of 2,409. It was the largest NCAA Division III basketball crowd of the season, for either women's or men's basketball.

PROGRAM MILESTONE

After a slow start, the Hope College women's basketball team upped the tempo to defeat Alma College, 85-69, on Nov. 18 in the MIAA opener at DeVos Fieldhouse, marking the 1,000th victory in program history, a mark reached in 1,355 games. The Flying Dutch were the sixth program to accomplish the feat, joining the University of Scranton (Pennsylvania), Husson University (Maine), Elizabethtown College (Pennsylvania), St. John Fisher (N.Y.), and Southern Maine University.

MIAA ATHLETE OF THE WEEK

Sophomore guard Anna Richards was named MIAA Women's Basketball Athlete of the Week on Nov. 25 after helping lead the Flying Dutch to a 3-0 week featuring wins against Alma College (85-59), Carthage College (80-52) and No. 10 Illinois Wesleyan University (76-73). Richards, who earned MVP honors at the Michele Schoon Classic, averaged 15 points per game during the five-day stretch. Richards scored 17 points both Carthage College (Wisconsin) and Illinois Wesleyan.

BRIAN MOREHOUSE *HEAD COACH*

Brian Morehouse '91 has developed the Hope College women's basketball team into one of the nation's elite programs during his tenure, guiding the Flying Dutch to national championships in 2022 and 2006 and a national runner-up finish in 2010 as well as 18 MIAA championships through the 2023-24 season.

Through the 2024-25 season, Morehouse has guided the Flying Dutch to a 745-105 record (.879) over 29 seasons.

On January 13, 2024, Morehouse became the fastest collegiate basketball coach to 700 wins with a 79-77, double-overtime victory against Alma College at DeVos Fieldhouse in his 795th game. He broke the collegiate record set by Mark Campbell of Union University, Tenn. (811 games) and the NCAA record set by Kim Mulkey of Louisiana State (813 games).

In 2022, Morehouse guided the Flying Dutch to the third national title in team history and a 32-1 overall record. Hope extended a winning streak to 61 games over three seasons — tying for the third-longest in NCAA Division III history.

In 2021, Morehouse led Hope to a 16-0 record in a season shortened by the COVID-19 pandemic. The Flying Dutch's 45-game winning streak set a school record and ranked as the eighth-longest in NCAA Division III history.

In 2020, Morehouse guided Hope to being the only undefeated team in Division III women's basketball with the No. 1 ranking. The Flying Dutch were one of 16 teams in title contention before the NCAA Tournament was canceled because of the COVID-19 pandemic. It also marked the 22nd consecutive time the Flying Dutch had earned at least 20 wins during his tenure.

During the 2020 season, Morehouse reached the 600-win mark in his 690th game — faster than, at the time, any basketball coach in NCAA history at any level, women's or men's.

Morehouse has been chosen as the Division III National Coach of the Year three times by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (2021, 2020, 2006). He was also named Division III Coach of the Year by D3hoops.com (2019-20).

Morehouse was selected as the 2024 MIAA Women's Basketball Coach of the Year by his peers after leading the Flying Dutch to a fourth consecutive regular season title and seventh consecutive MIAA Tournament title game appearance.

Morehouse has been named the Michigan Collegiate women's basketball coach of the year by the Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan four times in his career (2001-02, 2007-08, 2011-12, 2015-16). Morehouse is ranked among Division III's elite active coaches by winning percentage.

In 2024, Morehouse was selected as serve as an on-court coach for the USA Women's Under 17 Team Trials in Colorado Springs, Colorado.

Morehouse's basketball roots run deep. His father, Dean, was the boy's basketball coach at Fremont (Mich.) High School. He joined son Brian as an assistant coach in 2000-01. Brian and Dean were honored as "Hometown Heroes" during the 2006 National Baby Food Festival in Fremont.

Morehouse currently represents MIAA coaches on the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Conference Captains Committee and serves as a member of the WBCA board. He also serves as a member of the board of the Hand Up Fund, and is involved with Special Olympics and Holland Area Hospice.

COURTNEY KUST

Associate Head Coach

Courtney Kust '13 became Hope College's associate head women's basketball coach prior to the 2023-24 season. Kust had served as an assistant coach for the Flying Dutch the previous nine seasons and as the college's Assistant Athletic Director of Events since July 1, 2019. Head coach Brian Morehouse said he is excited about Kust's promotion to associate head coach. During the 2021-22 season, Kust helped the Flying Dutch claim the third NCAA Division III national championship in program history. Hope's record during Kust's coaching tenure is 231-23, a winning percentage of .909. In 2018, Kust was named a member of the Women's Basketball Coaches' Association "Thirty Under 30 Class," a distinction that recognizes 30 up-and-coming women's basketball coaches aged 30 and under at all levels of the game. A native of Cincinnati, Ohio, Kust played basketball for the Flying Dutch from the 2009-10 to the 2012-13 season. She was a member of the 2010 national runner-up team and a captain her senior year. She earned All-Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association First Team honors during her junior and senior seasons.



COLLY CARLSON

Assistant Coach

Colly Carlson '92 has been on the Hope College women's basketball coaching staff since the 2005-06 season. Before that, Carlson coached high school basketball for 13 years. He teaches at Hamilton High School and is in his 22nd year of teaching social studies there. Carlson and his wife, Kristie (Gauntt) Carlson, are both graduates of Hope College in 1992. They live in Hamilton with their four children — triplets Sydney, Samantha and Spencer, and son Reece.



AUSTIN RANDEL

Assistant Coach

Austin Randel joined Hope College Women's Basketball as a junior varsity coach and assistant varsity coach prior to the 2021-22 season.

Randel brings six seasons of women's basketball collegiate coaching experience to the Flying Dutch, including four seasons over two stints at NAIA Aquinas College and two seasons at Calvin University. He was named interim head coach at Calvin during the 2018-19 season.

Randel played collegiately at NCAA Division II North Greenville University in Greenville, S.C., for two seasons, then played Ferris State University for two seasons. He reached the 1,000-point mark for his college career. He also played two seasons semi-professionally for the Grand Rapids Cyclones.

Randel also currently works as a Head Coach for Michigan Basketball Academies Women's 2023 and 2026 national teams as well as their Women's Basketball Player Development Director.

VOLLEYBALL SWEEPS WASHINGTON AND LEE, SETS UP REMATCH WITH NO. 1 JUNIATA

The second-ranked Hope College volleyball team powered its way into the NCAA Division III national semifinals with a season-best performance during a 3-0 quarterfinal victory against No. 11 Washington and Lee University on Wednesday.

The Flying Dutch (29-2) recorded team season-highs in three-set matches in both kills with 56 and assists with 53. Hope hit over .300 as a team for the second time during the NCAA Division III Tournament an 14th time this season. Outside hitter Addie VanderWeide put down a match-high 17 kills, the most by a Flying Dutch player in a three-set match. Junior Lauren Lee's 53 assists are the most by a Hope setter in a three-set match this season.

The Flying Dutch bring a 21-match winning streak into tonight's national semifinal against top-ranked Juniata College (Pennsylvania). It is the second Hope-Juniata match of the season and the third in a row in postseason play. They met in the 2023 title match and the 2022 national quarterfinals.

Juniata has won the past three meetings, including a 3-1 victory at Hope's DeVos Fieldhouse on Sept. 13.

The Flying Dutch then split their matches on Sept. 14, defeating Otterbein University in five sets before losing to eventual national quarterfinalist University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh in three sets. It was the last time Hope lost this season.

snap a three-game losing streak to Juniata that includes the 2023 national title match and the 2022 national quarterfinals. Juniata leads the all-time series, 5-1. Hope's lone win came in 2014 during the regional semifinals of the Flying Dutch's national championship run.

NEW OPPONENT

The Flying Dutch are trying to win a national title in the state of Virginia for the second time. In 2014, Hope defeated Emory University (Georgia) in the title match in five sets at Christopher Newport University in Newport News.

ALL-AMERICANS

Four from Hope College received All-America recognition from the AVCA:

- OH Addie VanderWeide, first team;
- S Lauren Lee, first team;
- OH Annie Lockett, third team;
- MB Alison DeWeerd, honorable mention.

VanderWeide (Grand Rapids, Michigan / Grand Rapids Christian) repeated as an All-America First Team honoree this season.

The business major has delivered on the court since transferring from the University of Iowa, including this season with averages of 3.50 kills and 3.19 assists per set. VanderWeide is a full rotation standout.

As a junior, VanderWeide was selected as the AVCA Co-National Player of the Year

Lee (Plymouth, Michigan / Skyline) joined an elite Hope Volleyball club with her third All-America selection this season. The biology major equaled Lauren Hazekamp (2013-15) and Jenna Grasmeyer (2012-14) in accomplishing the feat.

One of the nation's top setters, Lee is averaging 11.39 assists this season for the Flying Dutch.

Lee made the All-America Second Team as a sophomore and the All-America First Team as a freshman.

Lockett (Mason, Ohio / William Mason) earned All-America honors for the second time in three season after missing the entire 2023 campaign due to injury.

The business major was an honorable-mention recognition in 2022. This season, Lockett delivered 2.92 kills per set while maintaining a .290 hitting percentage.

DeWeerd (Kentwood, Michigan / South Christian) claimed All-America Honorable Mention distinction for the second consecutive season. Th4 social work major averaged 2.79 kills per set with a .368 hitting percentage as a senior.



ALL-REGION ACCOLADES

Hope College seniors Addie VanderWeide, Alison DeWeerd and Annie Lockett joined junior Lauren Lee on the AVCA All-Region Teams for the 2024 season.

VanderWeide, an outside hitter, also was chosen as the AVCA Region 7 Player of the Year for the second consecutive season. VanderWeide and her teammates were among 14 first-team all-region selections. The business major claimed all-region distinction for the second time

DeWeerd earned all-region honors for the second time. Lockett received all-region accolades for the second time and the first time since 2022. Lee claimed all-region honors for the third time.

AVCA REGION, MIAA COACH OF THE YEAR

A dominant Hope College volleyball team served up another honor for head coach Becky Schmidt.

The American Volleyball Coaches Association selected Schmidt as the Region 7 Coach of the Year after leading the Flying Dutch to a 25-2 overall record, an outright MIAA title and a return trip to the NCAA Division III Championships.

On Wednesday, Schmidt was named the MIAA Volleyball Coach of the Year.

In her 21st season as head coach, Schmidt guided the Flying Dutch to title repeats in both the MIAA regular season and league tournament. It marked the first time in program history Hope won back-to-back MIAA Tournament crowns.

HIGH ACHIEVERS

Second-ranked Hope has been ranked in the top five of the American Volleyball Coaches Association NCAA Division III poll all season.

The Flying Dutch opened the season second in the preseason poll and were ranked fourth during the second and third polls.

On Oct. 1, Hope moved back into the No. 2 spot behind Juniata. The Flying Dutch has appeared in 196 AVCA polls and been No. 1 10 different times, including the 2014 national championship season.
