MEN'S BASKETBALL HOSTS SENIOR DAY SHOWDOWN VS. OLIVET

The Hope College men's basketball team will honor four senior student-athletes, then try to reclaim a share of the MIAA lead this afternoon at DeVos Fieldhouse against The University of Olivet.

The Flying Dutchmen are tied for second place in the MIAA standings with a 9-2 league record following Wednesday's 84-75 overtime loss at Trine University. Olivet edged Calvin University, 78-76, at home on Wednesday to move in sole possession of the MIAA lead — one game ahead of Hope and Trine. Trine plays at Calvin this afternoon.

The Flying Dutchmen lead the all-time series, 141-39, including a 67-65 victory at Olivet on Jan. 10.

Hope has won the last 12 games against the Comets, including games played at DeVos Fieldhouse and the Holland Civic Center. Olivet's last road victory in the series was 67-64 on Jan. 13, 2010, behind 22 points, 15 rebounds and five blocks from center Michael McCreary.

The Flying Dutchmen aim to bounce back from Wednesday's near-comeback. Hope rallied from 17 points down with four minutes remaining to force overtime on Brendan Cargill 3-pointer with three seconds remaining in regulation. Trine outscored Hope, 17-8, during the extra five-minute period, sinking all three 3-pointer attempts and all eight free throws.

LAST GAME

The Hope College men's basketball team nearly completed a comeback for the ages. Rallying from a 17-point deficit in the final four minutes of regulation, the Flying Dutchmen forced overtime at Trine University before falling, 84-75, on Wednesday. The Flying Dutchmen trailed 64-47 when senior forward Parker Hovey (Shelby, Michigan/Hart) started the comeback with a fast-break layup with 4:04 remaining. Six points from Hovey and five from sophomore forward Charles Howell (Cadillac, Michigan/Cadillac) fueled a run that pulled Hope within two points at 66-64 with 13 seconds left in regulation on a layup by freshman Brendan Cargill (Grand Rapids, Michigan/Forest Hills Central). After a Hope foul, Trine's Jayden Bradshaw split a pair of free throws with six seconds remaining. The Flying Dutchmen pushed the ball up the court, where Cargill buried a game-tying 3-pointer with three seconds left to force overtime. Trine (18-5, 9-2) outscored Hope 17-8 in the five-minute overtime, making all eight free throws and all three 3-point attempts.

LAST MEETING VS. OLIVET

The Hope College men's basketball team emerged triumphant from a second frantic finish in the opening four days of MIAA play, winning at Olivet University 67-65 on Saturday. Junior Parker Hovey (Shelby, Michigan/Hart) led the Orange and Blue with a career-high 33 points, shooting 60% from the field (12 of 20). Hovey also added seven rebounds and a career-high-tying six assists in 36 minutes. Hope, which trailed by as many as 10 points in the first half, took the lead for good at 65-63 on a layup by sophomore Orion Yant (Zeeland, Michigan/Zeeland West) with 42 seconds remaining. After Olivet split a pair of free throws with 15 seconds left, the Comets (4-9, 1-1 MIAA) fouled sophomore Brendan Cargill (Grand Rapids, Michigan/Forest Hills Central) four seconds later. Cargill made both free throws to extend the Flying Dutchmen's lead to 67-64. Hope (7-6 overall) then elected to foul, and Olivet again split at the line with seven seconds remaining to pull within two points. The Comets fouled quickly after the inbounds, sending Yant to the line. He missed his first attempt but made the second. Yant finished second on the team with eight points. Olivet rushed up the court, where a last-second shot by Porter Kretschman rolled off the rim as time expired. Nathan Richardson led four Comets in double figures with 13 points. Hope leads the all-time series by a 141-39 margin.



SCORING BURSTS

Two different Flying Dutchmen have totaled at least 25 points in a game this season: forward Parker Hovey and guard Brendan Cargill. Hovey netted 33 points vs. Olivet 29 points vs. Wisconsin-Platteville on Dec. 13 and vs. Muskingum. Hovey netted 25 points vs. Wisconsin-Whitewater on Dec. 19. Cargill poured in 30 vs. Albion on Jan. 29 at DeVos Fieldhouse and 29 at Anderson University (Indiana) on Jan. 3. Sophomore Orion Yant nearly joined the 25-point group, netting a career-high 24 points on Feb. 4 vs. Kalamazoo College at home.

IT'S FREE

The Flying Dutchmen use the free-throw line more than anyone on the MIAA, ranking first in free-throw attempts with 513 and made free throws with 372. Hope ranks fourth in free-throw percentage at .726. Marcus Wourman is ninth at .728. Parker Hovey is 10th at .710.

ON THE REBOUND

Three Flying Dutchmen have reached double-digits in rebounds in a single game this season, including Hovey four times with 12 vs. Franklin University (Indiana) on Nov. 8 and Adrian on Jan. 14, and 10 against both Wisconsin-Whitewater on Dec. 19 and Elmhurst University (Illinois) on Nov. 12. Yant pulled down a career-high 10 rebounds at Adrian on Jan. 31 and vs. WashU on Jan. 2. Cargill collected a career-best 10 rebounds against Wheaton College (Illinois) on Nov. 15.

STEAL NERVES

Hope gets after it defensively in the backcourt, swiping a league-best 9.36 steals per game — one more than any other MIAA opponent. Two Flying Dutchmen rank in the Top 10 individually: Parker Hovey (second at 1.9) and Marcus Wourman (seventh at 1.5). The single-game high for steals is six, shared by Parker Hovey (vs. North Central and Olivet), and sophomore Orion Yant (vs. Wisconsin-Whitewater).

MIAA ATHLETE OF THE WEEK

Parker Hovey and Orion Yant have claimed the Flying Dutchmen's fourth MIAA Men's Basketball Athlete of the Week accolades this season. The MIAA honored Hovey on Jan. 12, Dec. 15 and Dec. 8. Yant received the accolades on Feb. 17.

ROLLING OUT THE ORANGE CARPET

International social media sensations Josh and Jase — Josh Clarke and Jason Riley from Nottingham, England — attended a Jan. 14 game at DeVos Fieldhouse. The duo toured the United States, beginning in West Michigan and documenting their adventures on TikTok, Instagram, Facebook and YouTube. It marked their first collegiate basketball game as fans. Josh & Jase sat courtside in the Hope student section, participated in the Big E's-sponsored halftime shootout and met with fans. Their content can be found on TikTok, Instagram and Facebook.

DEFUSING THE THUNDER

On a charged Wednesday night inside DeVos Fieldhouse, the Hope College men's basketball team delivered a wire-tight, cinematic finish in front of 1,074 fans, outlasting Trine University 82-80 in a thrilling MIAA opener. The finish delivered non-stop, back-and-forth action. Trine overcame a 14-point deficit with 7 minutes, 47 seconds remaining to pull within two twice late. Logan McKenzie sank the first but missed the second. Cade Brenner grabbed the loose ball, but without a timeout, Trine scrambled for a game-winning shot. Sophomore Charles Howell (Cadillac, Michigan / Cadillac HS) ripped the ball away for a clean steal, then found an open Brendan Cargill (Grand Rapids, Michigan / Forest Hills Central), who was immediately fouled and split his two free-throw attempts to secure the win.

COMING UP CLUTCH

The Flying Dutchmen tipped off the first of MIAA play with two thrillers against two of the top four teams in the MIAA Mens' Basketball Coaches Preseason Poll: an 82-80 victory at home against Trine University on Jan. 7 and a 67-65 victory at The University of Olivet. It marked the first time since the 2008-09 season the Flying Dutchmen played in back-to-back games decided by two of fewer points.

NON-CONFERENCE TESTS

Hope had played the toughest schedule among MIAA teams heading into league play, ranking 38th out of 400-plus teams in NCAA Division III. The Flying Dutchmen's non-league opponents combined for 76-51 record (.595).

ANOTHER THRILLER

The Hope College men's basketball team closed out its weekend swing through the state of Ohio with another nail-biting win Dec. 6, edging Ohio Wesleyan University, 60-59, in Delaware, Ohio. The Flying



Dutchmen trailed, 59-56, with a little more than a minute remaining. Junior forward Parker Hovey (Shelby, Michigan / Hart) scored on a layup with 43 seconds left to pull Hope within one. Hope then forced an OWU miss and grabbed the loose ball. Following a miss, Hovey grabbed another offensive rebound and was fouled with 11 seconds remaining. After the Flying Dutchmen timeout, senior guard Marcus Wourman (Lansing, Michigan / East Lansing) found a cutting Hovey in the paint on the inbounds pass, where he was fouled. Hovey, who entered the game shooting 61.1% from the free-throw line, made both foul shots to put Hope ahead. The Battling Bishops (3-5) then missed a shot in the paint on their final possession. Wourman grabbed the rebound to secure the victory.

BUZZER BEATER

With 4.3 seconds left in the Nov. 115 home opener, Parker Hovey rebounded a missed free throw and kicked the ball quickly to Marcus Wourman. The Lansing, Michigan, native performed a little magic, dribbling quickly up the court and burying a 3 from the left wing that hit nothing but the bottom of the net as time expired to give the Hope College men's basketball team a thrilling 76-75 victory over Wheaton College (Illinois) on Saturday at DeVos Fieldhouse. Wourman finished with 22 points in 31 minutes for the Flying Dutchmen, who dramatically evened their record at 2-2. The East Lansing High School graduate also contributed two assists and two rebounds while not committing a turnover.

COACHING MILESTONE

Greg Mitchell '89 became the third Flying Dutchmen basketball coach to reach 200 career wins earlier this season, joining Glenn Van Wieren (660) and Russ DeVette (318).after a 98-83 victory at Anderson in the season opener. "Any kind of big win, I find myself reflecting," head coach Greg Mitchell said after the game. "I'm blessed to be in the position I'm in with the players I've coached and our coaching staff I've worked with." Heading into the Alma game, Mitchell's overall record at Hope is 207-102 (.670), including a 108-41 mark in MIAA play (.725).

WHAT'S NEXT

The Flying Dutchmen play their next two games on the road: Saturday, Feb. 7, at 3 p.m. at Alma College and Wednesday, Feb. 11, at 7:30 p.m. at Trine University. Hope returns home on Saturday, Feb. 14, at 3 p.m. vs. The University of Olivet for Senior Day.

GREG MITCHELL *HEAD COACH*

Greg Mitchell is the 11th head coach in the Flying Dutchmen’s storied history. He joined the college in July 2014 and also holds the rank of assistant professor of kinesiology.

In 10-plus seasons, Mitchell has led the Flying Dutchmen to a 210-103 record, four MIAA regular-season championships, four MIAA Tournament titles, and six NCAA Division III Championships tournament appearances.

Mitchell has deep ties to Hope Basketball. The 1989 Hope graduate played four seasons of basketball for the Flying Dutchmen, winning two MIAA championships (1986-87 and 1987-88) and making three NCAA Division III Tournament appearances (1987-89) during that time.

As a junior, Mitchell and the Flying Dutchmen made their deepest run in the national tournament, reaching the 1988 Great Lakes Regional final before falling in double overtime to eventual national champion Ohio Wesleyan University, 110-107.

Mitchell helped the Flying Dutchmen post a 74-27 overall record and a 40-8 mark in MIAA play during his four seasons as a player. He still holds the Flying Dutchmen record for career 3-point shooting at 46.4 percent (116-of-250). He averaged a career-high 10.3 points per game his senior season in 1988-89.

Before returning to his alma mater, Mitchell spent 25 years coaching varsity boys basketball at Laingsburg High School near Lansing, Michigan, while teaching for Laingsburg and Okemos schools. Mitchell compiled a 362-201 career record at Laingsburg, including a state runner-up finish during the 2012-13 season. At Laingsburg, Mitchell coached Laingsburg to three Michigan High School Athletic Association regional championships, six district championships, and six conference championships.

Mitchell was named Coach of the Year seven times: twice in Class C By the Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan (2013 and 1997), once in Class C by the Associated Press Sports Editors of Michigan (2012), once in Class C by the Detroit News (2013) and three times by the Lansing State Journal (2013, 2012 and 1997).

Mitchell earned a bachelor’s degree in physical education from Hope. He also received a master’s degree in athletic administration from Michigan State University.

Mitchell and his wife, Dina Zurchauer (’88), have four children: daughters Aleah, Quincie and Jalynn, and son Bryson.

Ken George became a full-time assistant coach for Hope College Men's Basketball on April 12, 2024. George had served as a part-time assistant for the Flying Dutchmen since the 2020-21 season. Prior to joining Hope, George coached boys basketball at the high school level for three decades. He won 341 games over 24 seasons at Forest Hills Central in Ada, Michigan, and led the Rangers to nine conference championships, four Michigan High School Athletic Association district titles and three MHSAA regional championships. George is a 1986 Farmington Hills Harrison High School and 1990 Albion College graduate. He played point guard for the Britons. He and his wife, Meggan, have two sons, Jordan, a 2020 Hope graduate, and Tyler, a 2022 graduate.

Coach Ryan Klingler brings a wealth of experience and passion to his role as a varsity assistant with the Hope College men's basketball team. With 15 years of varsity high school coaching under his belt, including head coaching stints at Fennville HS and Grandville HS, Coach Klingler has a proven track record of developing talented student-athletes and competitive programs. Currently teaching at Grandville High School and residing in Holland, Klingler has a deep-rooted connection to Hope College, graduating in 2001.
