WOMEN'S BASKETBALL FACES ALBION FOR THE SECOND TIME IN NINE DAYS IN POSTSEASON

After a redemptive week, the Hope College women's basketball team turn the page as postseason play tips off. Fittingly, the Flying Dutch will start at the site of their last postseason defeat.

Ninth-ranked Hope is in Angola, Indiana, tonight for an MIAA Tournament semifinal showdown against Albion College. The winner will face either top-seeded Trine University or fourth-seeded Calvin University in the title game on Saturday, Feb. 27, at 7:30 p.m..

The Flying Dutch lost to Calvin in the 2025 semifinals at Trine, ending their season.

Hope heads into the postseason this week on the heels of back-to-back dominating victories at home at DeVos Fieldhouse: 80-44 against Albion on Feb. 18 and 89-58 against Trine on Feb. 21. The Flying Dutch avenged two of their three regular-season losses: 60-54 in overtime on Jan. 28 at Albion and 67-61 in regulation on Jan. 7 at Trine.

The Orange and Blue lead the all-time series with Albion, 83-32, including a 9-1 mark in MIAA Tournament games since the format tipped off in 1993. Hope has beaten the Britons nine times in a row since Albion won the first meeting during the first round of the inaugural MIAA Tournament.

LAST MEETING

Hope showcased its balance offensively during an 80-44 victory vs. Albion on Feb. 18 placing four players in double figures during a performance that avenged a 60-54 overtime loss on Jan. 28 at Albion. Senior Sydney Vis led all scorers with 18 points on 75% shooting (8-of-12). Sophomore Anna Richards scored added 15 points and three assists, while sophomore Leah Richards and sophomore Maddie Petroelje each contributed 12 points. Against Albion, Hope built a 17-8 edge after one quarter., then shot nearly 59 percent during the second frame and outscored Albion 25-12 for a 42-20 halftime advantage.

SCORER EYES MILESTONE

Forward Sydney Vis enters tonight's game with 979 career points in 102 games. By the end of the season, Vis could become the 17th women's basketball standout to achieve 1,000 career points at Hope.

BRIAN MOREHOUSE *HEAD COACH*

Brian Morehouse '91 has developed the Hope College women's basketball team into one of the nation's elite programs during his tenure, guiding the Flying Dutch to national championships in 2022 and 2006 and a national runner-up finish in 2010 as well as 18 MIAA championships through the 2023-24 season. Through the 2024-25 season, Morehouse has guided the Flying Dutch to a 745-105 record (.879) over 29 seasons.

On January 13, 2024, Morehouse became the fastest collegiate basketball coach to 700 wins with a 79-77, double-overtime victory against Alma College at DeVos Fieldhouse in his 795th game. He broke the collegiate record set by Mark Campbell of Union University, Tenn. (811 games) and the NCAA record set by Kim Mulkey of Louisiana State (813 games).

In 2022, Morehouse guided the Flying Dutch to the third national title in team history and a 32-1 overall record. Hope extended a winning streak to 61 games over three seasons — tying for the third-longest in NCAA Division III history.

In 2021, Morehouse led Hope to a 16-0 record in a season shortened by the COVID-19 pandemic. The Flying Dutch's 45-game winning streak set a school record and ranked as the eighth-longest in NCAA Division III history.

In 2020, Morehouse guided Hope to being the only undefeated team in Division III women's basketball with the No. 1 ranking. The Flying Dutch were one of 16 teams in title contention before the NCAA Tournament was canceled because of the COVID-19 pandemic. It also marked the 22nd consecutive time the Flying Dutch had earned at least 20 wins during his tenure.

During the 2020 season, Morehouse reached the 600-win mark in his 690th game — faster than, at the time, any basketball coach in NCAA history at any level, women's or men's.

Morehouse has been chosen as the Division III National Coach of the Year three times by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (2021, 2020, 2006). He was also named Division III Coach of the Year by D3hoops.com (2019-20).

Morehouse was selected as the 2024 MIAA Women's Basketball Coach of the Year by his peers after leading the Flying Dutch to a fourth consecutive regular season title and seventh consecutive MIAA Tournament title game appearance.

Morehouse has been named the Michigan Collegiate women's basketball coach of the year by the Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan four times in his career (2001-02, 2007-08, 2011-12, 2015-16). Morehouse is ranked among Division III's elite active coaches by winning percentage.

In 2024, Morehouse was selected as serve as an on-court coach for the USA Women's Under 17 Team Trials in Colorado Springs, Colorado.

Morehouse's basketball roots run deep. His father, Dean, was the boy's basketball coach at Fremont (Mich.) High School. He joined son Brian as an assistant coach in 2000-01. Brian and Dean were honored as "Hometown Heroes" during the 2006 National Baby Food Festival in Fremont.

Morehouse currently represents MIAA coaches on the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Conference Captains Committee and serves as a member of the WBCA board. He also serves as a member of the board of the Hand Up Fund, and is involved with Special Olympics and Holland Area Hospice.
