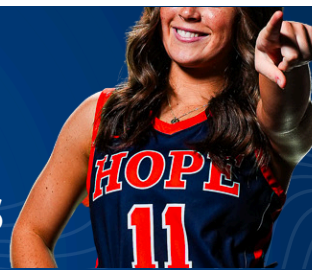

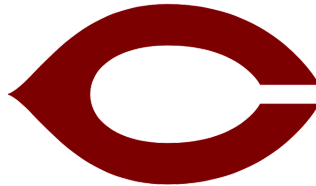

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL FACES RARE MATCHUP VS. UCHICAGO IN NCAA SECTIONAL OPENER

The Hope College women's basketball team will play the University of Chicago for the first time in 12 years and just the sixth time overall on Friday in the NCAA Division III sectional semifinal in Oshkosh, Wis. The Flying Dutch are 4-1 all-time against Chicago and winners of the past four meetings, including a 76-68 victory at DeVos Fieldhouse on Dec. 13, 2014. Chicago won the first meeting, 73-59, on Dec. 30, 1994 at Chicago.

The Hope-Chicago winner advances to the national quarterfinal on Saturday, March, 14, to face either host Wisconsin-Oshkosh or Washington University in St. Louis, who tip off after the Hope-Chicago game.

This is the second time Hope and Illinois Wesleyan have met in the NCAA Division III Championships. On March 7, 2020, the unbeaten Flying Dutch rallied from nine points down with less than five minutes remaining to win, 72-69, and advance to the Sweet 16. The national tournament was canceled less than a week later because of the COVID pandemic.

Today's winner advances to next week's sectional at a site to be determined to play either the University of Chicago or the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater on Friday, March 13. Hope is seeking its 13th Sweet Sixteen appearance and first since 2024. The Flying Dutch are 12-6 in second-round games.

NCAA 1ST AND 2ND ROUND

Trailing by six points with two minutes remaining, the nationally-ranked Flying Dutch scored the last six points of regulation, then produced big shots and key defensive stops in the five-minute extra period to defeat Illinois Wesleyan University, 90-85, in an NCAA Division III tournament second-round game on Saturday at DeVos Fieldhouse. Hope — No. 6 WBCA/No. 7 D3hoops — beat Illinois Wesleyan 76-73 in overtime on Nov. 22 in the Michele Schoon Classic at DeVos Fieldhouse. The rematch mirrored the two teams' memorable 2020 NCAA second-round game the Flying Dutch hosted, where the Flying Dutch rallied from nine points down with five minutes remaining to win, 72-69. In Friday's opener, a relentless pace carried Hope to a landmark win, 103-65 over Penn State University Behrend, and the program's first-ever 100-point performance in an NCAA Tournament game.

SCORER ACHIEVES MILESTONE

Senior forward Sydney Vis scored nine points at Trine last week and became the 17th member of the Flying Dutch to reach the 1,000-career point milestone. Vis has totaled 1,006 points over 105 games so far for the Orange and Blue.

The forward become the second Hope student-athlete to finish a game at DeVos Fieldhouse without a miss on at least 10 attempts. Guard Angelique Gaddy went 12 of 12 against Kalamazoo College on Jan. 15, 2013.

PROGRAM MILESTONE

After a slow start, the Hope College women's basketball team upped the tempo to defeat Alma College, 85-69, on Nov. 18 in the MIAA opener at DeVos Fieldhouse, marking the 1,000th victory in program history, a mark reached in 1,355 games. Hope was the sixth program to accomplish the feat.

BRIAN MOREHOUSE *HEAD COACH*

Brian Morehouse '91 has developed the Hope College women's basketball team into one of the nation's elite programs during his tenure, guiding the Flying Dutch to national championships in 2022 and 2006 and a national runner-up finish in 2010 as well as 18 MIAA championships. Morehouse has guided the Flying Dutch to a 756-108 record (.877) over 30 seasons.

On January 13, 2024, Morehouse became the fastest collegiate basketball coach to 700 wins with a 79-77, double-overtime victory against Alma College at DeVos Fieldhouse in his 795th game. He broke the collegiate record set by Mark Campbell of Union University, Tenn. (811 games) and the NCAA record set by Kim Mulkey of Louisiana State (813 games).

In 2022, Morehouse guided the Flying Dutch to the third national title in team history and a 32-1 overall record. Hope extended a winning streak to 61 games over three seasons — tying for the third-longest in NCAA Division III history.

In 2021, Morehouse led Hope to a 16-0 record in a season shortened by the COVID-19 pandemic. The Flying Dutch's 45-game winning streak set a school record and ranked as the eighth-longest in NCAA Division III history.

In 2020, Morehouse guided Hope to being the only undefeated team in Division III women's basketball with the No. 1 ranking. The Flying Dutch were one of 16 teams in title contention before the NCAA Tournament was canceled because of the COVID-19 pandemic. It also marked the 22nd consecutive time the Flying Dutch had earned at least 20 wins during his tenure.

During the 2020 season, Morehouse reached the 600-win mark in his 690th game — faster than, at the time, any basketball coach in NCAA history at any level, women's or men's.

Morehouse has been chosen as the Division III National Coach of the Year three times by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (2021, 2020, 2006). He was also named Division III Coach of the Year by D3hoops.com (2019-20).

Morehouse was selected as the 2024 MIAA Women's Basketball Coach of the Year by his peers after leading the Flying Dutch to a fourth consecutive regular season title and seventh consecutive MIAA Tournament title game appearance.

Morehouse has been named the Michigan Collegiate women's basketball coach of the year by the Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan four times in his career (2001-02, 2007-08, 2011-12, 2015-16). Morehouse is ranked among Division III's elite active coaches by winning percentage.

In 2024, Morehouse was selected to serve as an on-court coach for the USA Women's Under 17 Team Trials in Colorado Springs, Colorado.

Morehouse's basketball roots run deep. His father, Dean, was the boy's basketball coach at Fremont (Mich.) High School. He joined son Brian as an assistant coach in 2000-01. Brian and Dean were honored as "Hometown Heroes" during the 2006 National Baby Food Festival in Fremont.

Morehouse currently represents MIAA coaches on the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Conference Captains Committee and serves as a member of the WBCA board. He also serves as a member of the board of the Hand Up Fund, and is involved with Special Olympics and Holland Area Hospice.

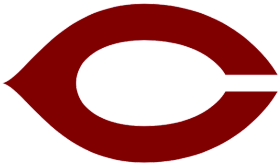
