## WOMEN'S BASKETBALL GEARS UP FOR FIRST NCAA TOURNAMENT AT HOME SINCE 2023

The nationally-ranked Hope College women's basketball team returns to DeVos Fieldhouse to host NCAA Division III Tournament for the first time in three seasons. The Flying Dutch (No. 6 WBCA/No. 7 D3hoops) last competed in the postseason on their court in 2023, defeating St. Norbert College, 82-61, in the first round before falling to Wartburg College, 81-67, in the second round.

In 2024, Hope went on the road for all three postseason games, winning twice at DePauw University before losing to host Wisconsin-Whitewater in the Sweet Sixteen. The Flying Dutch missed the NCAA Tournament last season.

Hope faces a new opponent in the first round in Penn State-Behrend, champions of the Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference. The Flying Dutch last faced an AMCC team in 2022, downing Laroche University, 86-54, in a first-round contest at DeVos Fieldhouse en route to a national title.

The Flying Dutch bring in a season-best, eight-game winning streak that started on Jan. 31 with an 88-46 victory against visiting Adrian College. Hope defeated Albion College and Trine University in succession for the second consecutive week to claim the MIAA Tournament title and the league's automatic berth to the national tournament.

Hope is a three-time national champion, winning it all in 1990, 2006 and 2022 and becoming one of four Division III teams with at least three national championships. The Flying Dutch also were national runner-up in 2010.

## LAST GAME

The Flying Dutch topped Trine, 76-62, in the MIAA Tournament final on the Thunder's home court on Saturday. Hope scored the game's first nine points during the opening 3 minutes, 39 seconds and never trailed. Hope led, 20-12, after the first quarter. Trine rallied after that but never pulled closer than three points. The Orange and Blue shot 50% from the field (29-58) and put three in double figures. Sophomore guard and All-MIAA First Team selection Anna Richards scored a career-high 24 points of 64.7% field-goal shooting (11-17). Junior guard Terin Maynard posted a double-double with a season-high 15 points and a career-best 10 assists. She finished one assist shy of tying the MIAA Tournament record. Sophomore forward and All-MIAA Second Team honoree Leah Richards chipped in 12 points. The Flying Dutch downed Trine for the second time in a week after losing the Jan. 7 meeting at Trine.

## SCORER ACHIEVES MILESTONE

Senior forward Sydney Vis scored nine points at Trine last week and became the 17th member of the Flying Dutch to reach the 1,000-career point milestone. Vis has totaled 1,006 points over 105 games so far for the Orange and Blue.

# BRIAN MOREHOUSE *HEAD COACH*

Brian Morehouse '91 has developed the Hope College women's basketball team into one of the nation's elite programs during his tenure, guiding the Flying Dutch to national championships in 2022 and 2006 and a national runner-up finish in 2010 as well as 18 MIAA championships through the 2023-24 season. Through the 2024-25 season, Morehouse has guided the Flying Dutch to a 745-105 record (.879) over 29 seasons.

On January 13, 2024, Morehouse became the fastest collegiate basketball coach to 700 wins with a 79-77, double-overtime victory against Alma College at DeVos Fieldhouse in his 795th game. He broke the collegiate record set by Mark Campbell of Union University, Tenn. (811 games) and the NCAA record set by Kim Mulkey of Louisiana State (813 games).

In 2022, Morehouse guided the Flying Dutch to the third national title in team history and a 32-1 overall record. Hope extended a winning streak to 61 games over three seasons — tying for the third-longest in NCAA Division III history.

In 2021, Morehouse led Hope to a 16-0 record in a season shortened by the COVID-19 pandemic. The Flying Dutch's 45-game winning streak set a school record and ranked as the eighth-longest in NCAA Division III history.

In 2020, Morehouse guided Hope to being the only undefeated team in Division III women's basketball with the No. 1 ranking. The Flying Dutch were one of 16 teams in title contention before the NCAA Tournament was canceled because of the COVID-19 pandemic. It also marked the 22nd consecutive time the Flying Dutch had earned at least 20 wins during his tenure.

During the 2020 season, Morehouse reached the 600-win mark in his 690th game — faster than, at the time, any basketball coach in NCAA history at any level, women's or men's.

Morehouse has been chosen as the Division III National Coach of the Year three times by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (2021, 2020, 2006). He was also named Division III Coach of the Year by D3hoops.com (2019-20).

Morehouse was selected as the 2024 MIAA Women's Basketball Coach of the Year by his peers after leading the Flying Dutch to a fourth consecutive regular season title and seventh consecutive MIAA Tournament title game appearance.

Morehouse has been named the Michigan Collegiate women's basketball coach of the year by the Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan four times in his career (2001-02, 2007-08, 2011-12, 2015-16). Morehouse is ranked among Division III's elite active coaches by winning percentage.

In 2024, Morehouse was selected to serve as an on-court coach for the USA Women's Under 17 Team Trials in Colorado Springs, Colorado.

Morehouse's basketball roots run deep. His father, Dean, was the boy's basketball coach at Fremont (Mich.) High School. He joined son Brian as an assistant coach in 2000-01. Brian and Dean were honored as "Hometown Heroes" during the 2006 National Baby Food Festival in Fremont.

Morehouse currently represents MIAA coaches on the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Conference Captains Committee and serves as a member of the WBCA board. He also serves as a member of the board of the Hand Up Fund, and is involved with Special Olympics and Holland Area Hospice.
