GOLF

WENDELL F. FORBES: Wendy, known for his coaching success in hockey and baseball at Middlebury, begins his eighth season coaching fall golf. A 1951 Middlebury graduate, he was an outstanding athlete in hockey, football and baseball. He played baseball in the St. Louis Cardinal system for three years before entering coaching at Northfield (Vt.) High School. He served as baseball coach, freshman hockey coach and as assistant in football at Norwich University for seven years before returning in 1962 to Middlebury. Forbes was named College-Division-Coach-of-the-Year in 1975 by the American Hockey Coaches Association. He led last year's skaters to a 15-7-3 record and to the ECAC semi-finals. A golfer for 19 years, he is former club champion at Middlebury and Northfield courses, has played in several state amateur tournaments, and has served as pro at Vermont courses.



PROSPECTS

Made up predominately of sophomores and juniors, the Panther golf squad will be young, but will have a fair amount of experience. Although only one player won't be returning, his loss is a major one since it is the leading player and captain, Jim Whitton.

Despite that loss, the Panthers do have a top notch competitor returning in sophomore Jeff Cummings, who tied for fourth with Whitton in the NESCAC Tournament last spring. Others expected to return to compete for a starting slot are Jim Lindberg, Steve Riley, John Power, Rick Moorhead, John McGee, Frank Burke, Dave Hanken, Geoff Fitzgerald, Jack Bousa and Bart Gummere.

Displaying some good individual performances towards the end of the spring season, Panther linksmen gave notice they have the potential for improvement of last spring's 2-4-1 mark.
