Head Coach Lori Kerans



Lori Kerans begins her 26th season at the helm of the Big Blue women's basketball program in 2011-12. Kerans has led the Big Blue to 13 20-win seasons, and in 2004-05, she guided Millikin to its 14th NCAA appearance and its first-ever NCAA Championship.

In 2004-05, the Big Blue earned Kerans her 11th career NCAA playoff berth and 11th College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin crown en route to the program's first-ever national title. She has been named CCIW Coach of the Year seven times, including 1996-97, 1997-98 and 2004-05 when she led Millikin to a school record 25 victories each season (surpassed in 2004-05 with 29 wins). She has been honored by the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association as its Women's Division III Coach of the Year 10 times, including 2004-05 and was named the Molten/Division III News Coach of the Year in both 1997-98 and 2004-05. After her team's NCAA title run in 2004-05, she was also named the WBCA's Region 7 Coach of the Year. In her career to date she has coached seven of the CCIW's "Most Outstanding Players," 18 All-CCIW first teamers and three Final Four All-Tournament players (including the 2004-05 All-Final Four Most Outstanding Player).



Millikin's all-time winningest coach, Kerans owns a 481-176 mark. In her 25 years she has had 23 winning seasons and owns a .733 winning percentage. Through the 2010-11 season, her winning percentage ranked her 17th nationally among active Division III coaches and 14th in career wins. In the all-time Division III coaching categories, she is 23rd in win percentage and 17th in wins. She owns a 251-67 record in games at Griswold Center. Between 1997 and 2001 her teams have put together a school-record 46-game home winning streak.

Kerans, who is thought to be the first woman to both play in and coach at the NCAA Tournament, owns

a 17-11 record in NCAA games. Her teams had twice advanced to the Elite Eight before the national championship.

Millikin's women's team became the first team in CCIW men's or women's basketball history to win five straight championships with its 1997-98 title. The Big Blue won at least 20 games a year during the eight-year span from 1993-94 to 2000-01, something no other women's team has accomplished in CCIW history.

A 1985 graduate of Millikin, Kerans was a four-year basketball letter winner and a three-year softball letter winner. As a senior during the NCAA basketball tournament, Kerans was named the Central Regional's Most Valuable Player and was a Final Four All-Tournament Team selection. The Big Blue finished third at the NCAA Division III Basketball Championships in 1985 when Kerans was named Millikin's Most Valuable Player. In softball, Kerans was a second-team Academic All-American in 1985 and team MVP in 1984. In 1985, she received the University's M Award, given annually to the senior woman who has contributed the most to the athletics program.

Kerans earned a master's degree at Illinois State University after graduating from Millikin. She is a 1991 inductee into the Millikin Athletic Hall of Fame and was inducted into the Decatur Athletic Hall of Fame in June 1998. Kerans also serves as Millikin's Senior Women's Administrator.

After the 84-85 basketball season when the team placed third nationally, Kerans earned ASWF All-America, ASWF All-Region, NCAA Final Four All-Tournament, NCAA Central Regional MVP and Millikin MVP honors. She also finished her career seventh on Millikin's all-time scoring list and held the record with 21 consecutive free throws.

Kerans earned three letters in softball and played on the school's inaugural team in 1983. Athlete-time captain, she won MVP honors as a senior when she set records for walks in a game and walks in a season. The single-game mark still stands.

Assistant Coaches



Joanna Conner

Former Big Blue standout Joanna Conner joined the Millikin staff as a Women's Basketball Assistant Coach and Assistant Sports Information Director in July 2011.

After spending the 2006-07 season on the Big Blue staff, Conner spent three years at Manchester College where she

was the Spartans top women's basketball assistant coach and Co-Head Strength and Conditioning coach. Conner was an assistant coach at St. Francis University in Joliet, Ill. for the 2010-11 season.

As a player for Millikin, Conner was an All-CCIW performer and was named to the D3hoops.com All-American Third Team after her junior season when she helped the Big Blue win the national championship. During Millikin's tournament run, Conner was named to the NCAA Sectional All-Tournament Team and the Final Four's Most Valuable Player. Conner is Millikin's number four all-time rebounder with 796 career boards and the Big Blue's number 14 all-time scoring finishing her career with 1,132 points.



Dick Marshall

Dick Marshall is in his 17th year as Millikin's assistant coach. He came to Millikin after a 33-year career as head coach at Cumberland (1 year) and Mt. Zion High Schools (32 seasons).

Marshall began his coaching career at Cumberland before being named coach at

Mt. Zion, where he compiled a 301-128 (.702) record in 16 seasons. His teams won eight Apollo Conference titles, seven regional championships and three sectional titles. Marshall was named Macon County Coach of the Year six times. Marshall is a member of the Illinois Basketball Coaches Hall of Fame.

He is a graduate of Paxton High School and earned his bachelor's degree from Eastern Illinois University. Marshall and his wife, Gloria, have two daughters, Kim and Shelly, and four grandchildren: Andrew, Josh, Blake and Courtney.



Bob Kerans

Bob Kerans is the shooting coach for the Big Blue Women's Basketball program and recruiter for Central and Southern Illinois. He is a life long educator having served as a coach, teacher, director of guidance, and principal of Newton High School in Newton, Illinois.

Coach Bob started the girls basketball program at Newton High School in 1977, where he coached Lori Kerans from 1977-81. He also served as Newton's Mayor as well as the Director of Economic Development for Jasper County after retiring from education.

In addition to basketball, his hobbies include training bird dogs, taxidermy, and fishing. Coach Bob graduated from Brocton High School in 1957 and Eastern Illinois University with a Masters Degree in Education in 1962. He is married to Lolly, has two children; Lori Kerans and Lisa Hollis, and is an especially proud grandpa of Hannah and Zachary Hollis.

Looking at 2011-12

Millikin Head Women's Basketball Coach Lori Kerans has high hopes for 2011-12 as she welcomes back a veteran team that returns 14 letter winners including four starters and eight players that saw significant action on last year's team that finished 17-9.

The returning group is led by seniors Julia Robert, Beth Wellbaum and Crystal Zeigler. All three players started all 26 games last year and are entering their third season as starters for the Big



Blue. Robert averaged 13.3 points and 6.2 rebounds last season to earn All-Conference Third Team Honors. Wellbaum will again run the Millikin offense after dishing out 115 assists last season. Zeigler returns as the go to player in the paint after averaging eight points and seven rebounds last season.

Senior Cecily Aldridge is expected to reclaim her starting spot after missing much of last season with an injury. Aldridge averaged eight points a game in 12 games she played in last season.

Other experienced players that coach Kerans is counting on included Olya Cholewick, Nikki Tipsword and Heather Pruemer. Cholewick played in all 26 games last season including making 20 starts in replace of Aldridge. Cholewick averaged five points per game last season and is a force on the defensive end of the court earning the Big Blue's Defensive Player of the Year award last season. Kerans has high expectations for Tipsword this season as one of the Big Blue's main offensive weapons. Tipsword has the skills to make knock down the three pointer as well as make moves and score in the paint. Tipsword averaged seven points and three rebounds per game last year and Kerans

is looking for her to step up offensively this season. Pruemer will be a key contributor off the bench in 2011-12 after joining the Big Blue midway through last season. Pruemer has the ability to be an impact player in the post after averaging nine points per game last season.

The Millikin offense should also benefit from the return of Kaitlin Brassil's outside shooting touch after she missed all of last season due to injury. Brassil hit 59 three pointers during her sophomore season.

Kerans also have a deep and talented bench with veterans Bria Williams, Emily Joines, Brittany Czaplicki, Brittney Gallivan, Erin Downey and Alex Reynolds all battling for playing time.

The Big Blue have six freshman in the mix for playing time as they start the season including Rachel Kindred, Shelby Schmale, Moli Cople, Paige Roytek, Holly Haskins and Hannah Golden.

The Big Blue start the season on the road at Wisconsin-Platteville. Millikin has a tough non-conference schedule that Kerans hopes prepared the Big Blue to do battle in the rugged College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin. Kerans enters the season needing 19 wins to reach 500 career wins. The Big Blue have the talent to make reaching that milestone a possibility this season.

Millikin Earns NCAA Championship Millikin 70, Randolph-Macon 50

The Millikin University Big Blue brought home the school's first-ever NCAA team championship in 2004-05 with a Division III women's basketball title when it defeated Randolph-Macon 70-50 in Norfolk, Va.

To highlight the title, Millikin had three players named to the All-Tournament team in senior Audrey Minott, freshman Lindsay Ippel and junior Joanna Conner. Joining them were Randolph-Macon's Megan Silva and Southern Maine's Megan Myles. Conner was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

The NCAA Championship was the first for any team in Millikin history, and the first women's basketball team to win the championship since the CCIW began crowning a conference champion in 1987.

Millikin wrapped up the season with a 16-game win streak and head coach Lori Kerans concluded the 2004-05 campaign with a career record of 382-120. The trip to the NCAA Final Four was the second for Kerans, who was the senior guard on Millikin's 3rd place team in 1984-85.

Both Millikin and Randolph-Macon advanced to the finals with upset victories in their semifinal games. Each team was also making its program's first Championship Game appearance. Millikin's previous best Final Four finish was a 3rd place finish in 1985, while Randolph-Macon reached the Sweet Sixteen in 1996. Southern Maine (31-3) topped Scranton (29-3) in the third place game, 55-53.

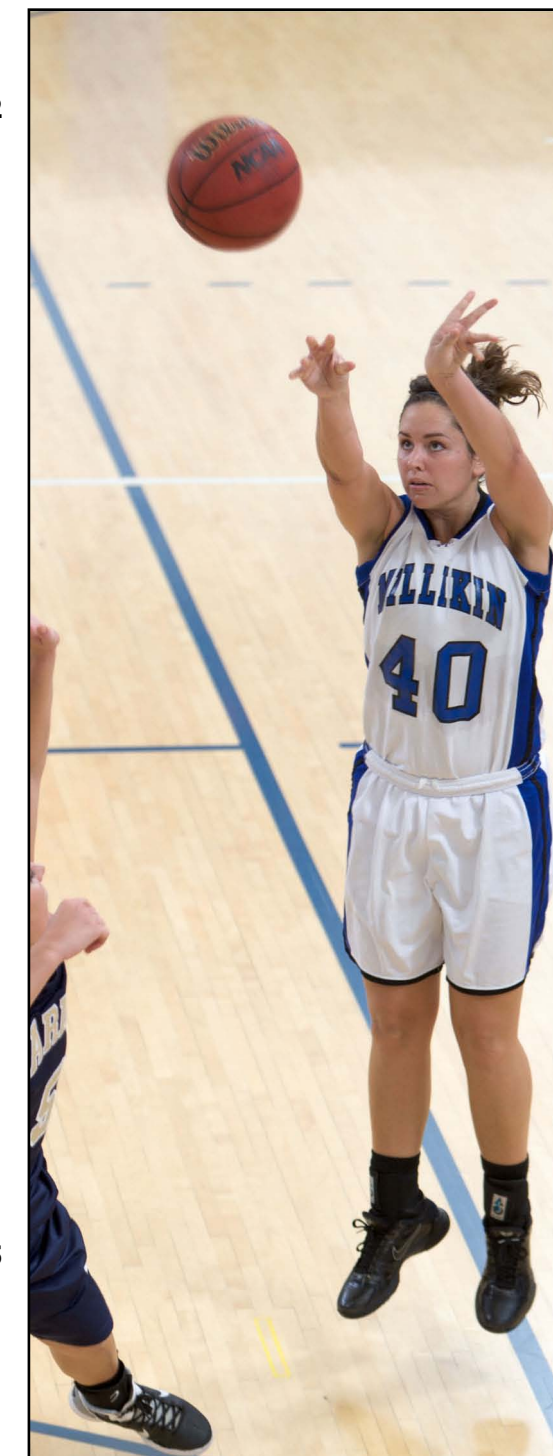

CCIW History

Entering its 66th season in 2011-12, the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation."

In NCAA Division III competition, CCIW schools have accounted for 42 national championships, including 13 in men's cross country, six in men's basketball, six in men's outdoor track and field, four in football, three in women's soccer and men's indoor track and field, women's outdoor track & field, two in men's soccer and one apiece in women's basketball, baseball and women's indoor track and field.

The conference was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946, in Jacksonville, Ill., and opened competition in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois. In 1967, the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin, to recognize Carthage, which moved to Kenosha, Wis., in 1962 and Carroll, which entered the conference in 1955. Carthage left the conference in 1952, but returned in 1961.

The CCIW sponsors 21 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling.
