2008 CCIW PRESEASON POLL



The head football coaches in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) picked North Central to win the 2008 conference title in a preseason poll.

The Cardinals (9-3, 6-1 in 2007) won the poll with 48 points including six first place votes. North Central earned the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Division III Football Championship last season, advancing to the second round.

Wheaton (8-2, 5-2) was second in the voting with 44 points including two first place votes. Illinois Wesleyan (7-3, 6-1) was third with 33 points. Augustana (5-5, 3-4) was fourth with 28 points while Carthage (7-3, 4-3) finished fifth with 26 points. Elmhurst (6-4, 3-4), Millikin (2-8, 1-6) and North Park (1-9, 0-7) rounded out the poll with 22, 16 and seven points respectively.

Voting in the preseason poll is done by the head football coaches in the CCIW. Each coach votes for the seven other schools in the conference in order of predicted finish. Points are assigned in reverse order of voting (seven points for first, six for second, etc.). Coaches may not vote for their own team.

HEAD COACH

DOUG NEIBUHR

Doug Neibuhr begins his 13th season as head football coach at Millikin in 2008.

A 1974 graduate of Millikin and former Big Blue assistant coach, Neibuhr boasts a .634 career win percentage in 19 seasons. He is 118-68-1 overall in his career and has compiled a 68-50 (.576) overall and 46-38 (.548) College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW) record in his 12 years at the helm of Millikin's program.

Neibuhr was named the 1998 CCIW Coach of the Year after leading the Big Blue to its first conference title since 1990 and its third-ever appearance in the NCAA Division III playoffs. His players have earned 56 first-team and 53 second-team all-conference selections at Millikin.



He compiled a 50-18-1 record in seven years at Wittenberg University (Springfield, Ohio), including a 35-5-1 mark in his last four seasons. In 1995, Neibuhr guided Wittenberg to its first undefeated season since 1979, a North Coast Athletic Conference Championship (NCAC) and a berth in the NCAA Division III playoffs. The Tigers also won a conference championship under Neibuhr in 1992.



Neibuhr has put together a .647 win percentage (88-48) in conference games during his career and prior to the 2007 season was one of only four head coaches in NCAA Division III history to take two different institutions to the national playoffs.

During his seven years at Wittenberg, Neibuhr's players earned All-America recognition 19 times, first team all-conference honors 50 times and Academic All-America recognition three times.



He was named the NCAC Coach of the Year twice (1992, 1995), guiding Wittenberg to conference championships during both seasons. He and his offensive line coach, Joe Fincham, were named 1995 Offensive Coordinators of the Year for NCAA Division III by American Football Quarterly.

Neibuhr completed his education at Millikin in three and a half years, graduating cum laude in December 1974. While playing quarterback and place kicker, he helped the Big Blue to a 23-6 record in his four years and the CCIW Championship in 1974. He is also a member of Millikin's Athletic Hall of Fame and still holds the CCIW record for the most PATs in a season (38 in 1974).

After serving as a graduate assistant coach at Illinois State University, where he earned a master of science degree in 1976, Neibuhr served one year as assistant football, head baseball and head wrestling coach at Ripon (Wis.) College. He joined the Millikin staff in 1977, serving most of the next 12 years as offensive coordinator. He also coached the Big Blue men's golf team to six consecutive CCIW Championships and led the team to a third-place finish nationally in 1985.

Neibuhr and his wife, Jody, have three sons Brandt, Bryan and Kirk.

Patrick Allgeier
Assistant Head Coach, Running Game Coordinator, Offensive Line

Patrick Allgeier begins his 12th season as offensive line coach and his fifth as assistant head coach in 2008. This season Allgeier will coordinate Millikin's running game. In addition to his football duties, Allgeier also serves as

the Assistant Athletic Director for Events and Facilities.

A former All-North Coast Athletic Conference offensive tackle, the Cincinnati native earned three letters for Wittenberg before graduating in 1993. He served as assistant offensive line coach at Wittenberg for two seasons.

Allgeier and his wife, Peg, live in Decatur with their three daughters Amanda, Becca, and Allie.



Ken Czajkowski
Tight Ends/Assistant Offensive Line

Ken Czajkowski begins his 12th season as part of the Big Blue coaching staff in 2008. After coaching the defensive line in 2007, Czajkowski is going to the work with the tight ends and serve as assistant offensive line coach. In previous seasons, he has coached

the Big Blue running backs, tight ends and offensive line.

Czajkowski teaches physical education and coaches boys track at Sangamon Valley High School. A 1992 graduate of Eureka College, he played on the Red Devils football team from 1988-91. He was an offensive line coach at Eureka from 1992-96, served as a baseball coach (1995-96) and administrative assistant for the basketball program (1995-96) at Eureka.

Czajkowski and his wife, Tracey, live in Decatur with their daughter Katlyn and son Drew.



Patrick Etherton
Passing Game Coordinator, Wide Receivers Coach, Recruiting Coordinator, Head Junior Varsity Coach

A former Big Blue player and student assistant during his undergraduate days, Etherton returned to Millikin in 2004 following positions

at some of the top football colleges in the country. In

2008 he begins his fifth season coaching for the Big Blue. After spending his first four seasons on the defensive side of the ball, Etherton moves to the offense to coach the wide receivers and coordinate Millikin's passing game.

Millikin's Head Men's Golf Coach, he has also added the title of Head Junior Varsity Coach in 2006 and has served as the football team's Recruiting Coordinator since 2005. Prior to coming to Millikin, his most recent coaching position was as Division III Washington & Jefferson's Special Teams Coordinator, defensive backs coach and Strength and Conditioning Coordinator. He has also served as the Offensive Coordinator at Division III University of Puget Sound, was the defensive backs coach at Division III Allegheny College and was a student assistant for the offensive line and linebackers at Millikin from 1998-00. He wore a Big Blue uniform as a defensive back for Millikin from 1996-98.

Etherton recently completed his Masters in Educational Leadership from the University of Illinois Springfield.



Chris Krich
Defensive Coordinator, Defensive Backs, Coordinator of Academic Support, Video Coordinator

Chris Krich will serve as Millikin's defensive coordinator in 2008 after serving as the co-defensive coordinator for two seasons. A defensive backs and wide receivers coach at Millikin from 1998-00, Krich returned to the Big Blue in 2006. In addition to his Defensive Coordinator duties, Krich also coaches the defensive backs and serves as the football program's Coordinator of Academic Support.

Between stints with the Big Blue, Krich served as the Assistant Head Coach at Lakeland College (Wis.) for the 2003-05 seasons following a position as a Defensive Graduate Assistant at Fort Hays State (Kas.) in 2002. As the Assistant Head Coach at Lakeland, he served in various capacities including Defensive Coordinator, Special Teams Coordinator and Recruiting Coordinator. In just three seasons at Lakeland, Krich coached three All-American defensive players and 24 All-Conference defensive players.

A four-year letter winner at Mesa State College (Colo.) as a free safety, Krich earned All-Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference honors as a senior in 1997. He received his bachelor's degree from Mesa State in Human Performance & Wellness and earned a master's degree from Fort Hays State in Health, Physical Education and Recreation.

Krich and his wife, Allison, live in Decatur.



Anthony Kerr
Linebacker Coach, Special Teams Coordinator, Strength & Conditioning Coordinator

Anthony Kerr joins the Big Blue staff for the 2008 season to coach the special teams and linebackers. Kerr will also serve as the team's Strength and Conditioning Coordinator.

Kerr comes to Millikin after coaching and teaching at Dana College. At Dana, he coached the linebackers, defensive backs and special teams. Kerr started his coaching career at Mesa State College coaching linebackers and special teams. During his playing days, Kerr played outside linebacker and safety at Mesa State leading his team in tackles and earning All Conference honors during his junior and senior seasons.

Kerr earned his bachelor's degree in Mass Communications from Mesa State and a master's degree in Sports Management from Nova Southeastern University in Florida.

His parents Robert and Tammy Kerr reside in Nebraska.



Don Typer
Outside Linebackers Coach

Don Typer joins the Big Blue staff in 2008 to work with the outside linebackers. Typer has coached football at Sullivan High School for 15 years including the three as the varsity head coach.

Typer teaches P.E. at Sullivan Elementary and coaches JV basketball and middle school track. He has a degree in Physical Education from Eastern Illinois University.

Defensive Line

A long-time high school coach, Dennis Gatchel is back on the Big Blue sidelines for the fifth season in 2008 after a 6-year stint as the head coach at Meridian High School.

In 2008, Gatchel will coach the defensive line. He has coached the wide receivers (2004), running backs (2005), outside linebackers (2006) and cornerbacks (2007). Gatchel previously served the Millikin team from 1990-94. He was the head coach at Macon and Breese Central High Schools. Gatchel was the *Decatur Herald & Review* Area Coach of the Year in 1986 (Macon) and 1999 (Meridian), coaching both teams to 2nd place IHSA State finishes.

Gatchel and his wife, Mary Kay, live in Decatur and their daughter, Cara, is a graduate of Millikin.



Mike Poe

Running Backs

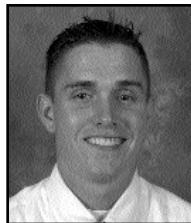
Veteran assistant coach Mike Poe returned to the sidelines for the Big Blue in 2006 after coaching local high school teams for three

seasons.

Poe will coach the running backs for the 12th season in 2008 after previously coaching the group from 1993-02. He has also coached the wide receivers, kickers, offensive and defensive line during his tenure with the Big Blue.

Before joining Millikin's staff in 1983, Poe coached high school football for several years, winning a league title in 1980 at Niantic-Harristown. The 1974 Millikin graduate served Millikin for 25 years as the Big Blue's head wrestling coach and began his career on the football staff at Cape Central H.S. in Cape Girardeau (Mo.). He is also a member of Millikin's Athletic Hall of Fame.

Poe is currently teaching at Springfield Southeast High School. He and his wife, Candy, have three children.

Kicking Coach

Andy Beals returned to the Big Blue in 2007 to coach the kickers and punters. One of the most successful kickers in Millikin history, Beals rewrote the Big Blue and CCIW record books during his career and still holds Millikin marks for career points (277), career kicking points (277), season kicking points (80), consecutive points after touchdowns (31), career field goals (38) and season field goals (13). His CCIW records for career kicking points (188), career field goals (31), season kicking points (59) and single-game kicking points (17) also still stand.

A four-year football letter winner, Beals was a three-time first-team All-CCIW selection, was named an Academic All-District selection three times and earned first-team Academic All-America honors as a senior. He earned three All-America kicking honors in his career, two as a senior and one during his junior year. Beals also earned three letters as a record-holder for the Big Blue baseball team.

Beals earned a degree in Business from Millikin in 2003 and completed a Masters of Business Administration from Millikin in 2007.



Chris Katzmark

Assistant Wide Receivers Coach

Chris Katzmark joins the Big Blue coaching staff in 2008 to assist with the wide receivers. Katzmark completed his playing career last year for Millikin catching 33 passes for 613 yards and one touchdown. As a junior, Katzmark had three touchdowns and 217 yards receiving.

After graduating from Millikin in December 2007, Katzmark played arena football for the Bloomington Extreme and this summer Katzmark played for Finland's Kouvola Indians.

A LOOK AT 2008

The 2008 Millikin football team features a group of talented and experienced returning players and a strong class of newcomers that should allow the Big Blue to be a factor in the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW) title race this season.

The Big Blue know that it won't be easy playing in one of the country's toughest football conferences, but the team is ready to put in the work to return them to among the conference's top teams.

The Big Blue returns six starters on offense and seven starters on defense. The returning players include a number of players that saw significant playing time down the stretch in 2007. Millikin returns three All-CCIW performers including team captains linebacker Sam Jordan and wide receiver Matt Kormelink. Jordan and Kormelink were both First Team All Conference selections in 2007.

OFFENSE -

The key to the Millikin offense is a strong group of talented wide receivers. Kormelink returns after setting a Millikin record for catches in 2007 with 67 receptions for 947 yards and five touchdowns. During his career, Kormelink has shown the ability to make the "big" play and he will be looked to for more important catches in 2008. Junior Chris Hampton is another threat for the Big Blue after gaining 380 receiving yards in 2007. Speedy sophomore wide receiver/kick returner Kody Smith could also be a factor. Senior Obie Goodner returns at the tight end position for the Big Blue.

The success of the passing game will rely on Millikin's ability to get consistent contributions from the quarterback position. The Big Blue will be looking to returners Andy Dicken and Drew Fendrich along with newcomer Gavin Johnston to step forward to take control of the Millikin offense. Dicken made three starts in 2007 throwing for 880 yards and five touchdowns. Fendrich made two starts with over 300 yards passing.

A main ingredient in the success of the Millikin offense will be

the development of the offensive line, a group that is young, but experienced. Senior Tom Heuer is the lone player who started every game last season, but several players made their way into the starting line-up at different points last season. Center Josh

Hinkelman saw significant action last year when starter Sean Staffeldt missed time with an injury. Another returner to the offensive line is Khris Dunard who was a starter at the beginning of last season, but had his season cut short due to injury. Fred Pohlman who saw time last season at tight end moves to offensive tackle. Pohlman is 6-7 and 300 pounds and should provide added punch to the line.

A talented group of running backs will take the field for the Big Blue in 2008. Junior Emmanuel Minter, who gained over 300 yards last year, is back along with sophomore Dion Wilson who earned his way into the starting line-up late last season. Millikin's incoming class features several excellent running backs that have the potential to make contributions this season.

DEFENSE -

Traditionally the Big Blue are known for having one of the conference's top defenses each year and the 2008 unit is expected to

continue that tradition returning seven starters and several young players who gained valuable experience in 2007.

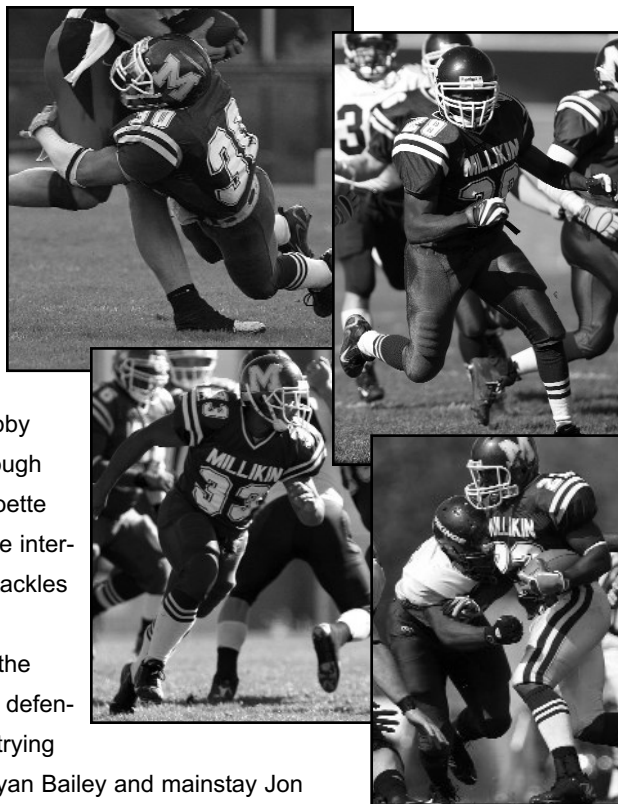
The defensive unit will be lead by an experienced group of linebackers and defensive backs. 2007 First Team All-CCIW selection Sam Jordan returns to play one of the inside linebacker spots. He was the Big Blue's top tackler last season with 88 tackles including 10 for losses. Another key returner is senior Will Earlywine who has spent the previous two seasons as a starter for the Big Blue. Earlywine had 62 tackles in 2007. The Big Blue also expects to get contributions from Josh Ingold and Gavin Asbury at the linebacker position.



A LOOK AT 2008

The key to the success of the defense will be in a talented, experienced and deep secondary. Seniors Stefen Edwards and Devi Greer return as the Big Blue's cornerbacks. In 2007, Edwards had 65 tackles, four interceptions and eight pass deflections to earn him CCIW Second Team honors. Greer had three interceptions and 40 tackles last year. Millikin has a number of experienced players returning at the safety position including Kevin Israelson, Tim Hoette, Jordan Bowman and Bobby Galichio. The group is equally tough against the run and the pass. Hoette had 83 tackles last year and three interceptions while Israelson had 42 tackles and two interceptions.

If there are any questions on the defensive unit, it will be in on the defensive line where the Big Blue are trying to replace All-CCIW performer Ryan Bailey and mainstay Jon Booker. Several talented players that saw significant playing time last season are ready to step forward and answer the questions about the defensive front. Returning to the defensive front for 2008 are 2007 starter Jake Polich and Ben McNeely and Greg Hendrian, two players that got noticed for their performance



late last season. Polich had 20 tackles last season while McNeely contributed 25. Hector Galvan moves up to the defensive line after racking up 39 tackles as a linebacker last year for the Big Blue. Senior Drew Poulos is also making the move to the defensive line from tight end. Poulos' size, 6-1 and 260 pounds, and athletic ability should make him a force on the defensive front.

SPECIAL TEAMS -

On special teams, the Big Blue will be looking to replace kicker/punter Aaron McLean. Replacing the three time all CCIW punter won't be easy, but the Big Blue expect spirited competition from a talented group of newcomers looking to take over the kicking duties.

The strength of the Millikin special teams will be in the return teams. Cody Smith and Chris Hampton will once again perform those duties for the Big Blue in 2008. Both players bring speed, excitement and the threat of breaking the long run to the return

game.

FRANK M. LINDSAY FIELD



Named in memory of long-time Decatur business leader and media owner, and recognizing the support given to Millikin by his family, Frank M. Lindsay Field was dedicated on Oct. 17, 1987.

Gifts from the Lindsay family and from an endowment fund created in 1961 by former members of the defunct Kappa Delta Chi fraternity financed the project. Donations from the classes of 1979 and 1980 assisted in the purchase of a new scoreboard, while a new sound system, an improved drainage system and an underground irrigation system were also added.

Frank M. Lindsay Field seats 4,000, including seating for 2,300 spectators on the west side. Lindsay Field also includes a concession stand and restrooms under the southwest corner of the grandstand.

The newest addition to Lindsay Field is a state-of-the-art press box built on the west side of the field. Construction of the new press box concluded in Spring 2001 and was funded entirely with the gift of \$800,000 from the late F.

Merrill and the late Margery "Sis" Lindsay.

The lower level features expanded working spaces for print and electronic media. It has up-to-date features including telephone and Internet connections in all boxes. Game-day clock workers, coaches and the Sports Information staff join the media in the lower level. A large guest area is located on the second level, and videographers can find a clear view of the field from the top of the second level.

The press box is handicap-accessible by elevator from both levels, is air-conditioned and heated with restroom facilities on each floor. In the summer of 2001, the press box was used when Millikin hosted the NCAA Division III Track & Field Championships and the USATF Youth Championships.

Millikin also hosted the NCAA Division III Outdoor Championships and the USATF Masters Meet in 2003.

Millikin awarded an honorary degree to Frank Lindsay in 1954 and to his son, F. Merrill Lindsay in 1981, making them one of the only two father-son combinations so recognized by the University.

F. Merrill Lindsay and his wife, Sis, donated a gift of \$1 million to Millikin in 1997 for the new running track around the football field. The gift provided the impetus for the track project.

Frank M. Lindsay Field served as the site of the Millikin football program's 500th win. The Big Blue won the program's 500th contest on Nov. 13, 2004, a 45-24 victory over Illinois Wesleyan University.

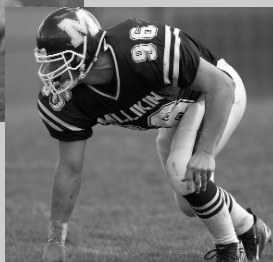

- B** is for "Big Blue," attributed to professor Carl Head who used it in posters during the 1916 season.
- C** is for College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin. Millikin has won or shared 11 CCIW titles.
- D** is for Decatur Indoor Sports Complex at Millikin (DISC), a state-of-the-art recreational facility.
- E** is for Eugene Wallace, Millikin's leader in touchdowns in a season (21) and game (7).
- F** is for Frank M. Lindsay. Millikin's field is named in memory of the long-time Decatur business leader.
- G** is for Sid Gepford, who was Millikin's first professional football player.
- H** is for Home. Since Frank M. Lindsay Field was dedicated in 1970, the Big Blue is 119-56 (.680) at home.

2007 IN REVIEW



Neibuhr, Big Blue Get Big Win Saturday, September 01, 2007

Millikin's quick start showed promise and gave the Big Blue an early 17-7 lead. But down the stretch it was a missed field goal attempt by Illinois College that secured the Big Blue its first win of the 2007 season, 23-21. The win also pushed Millikin head coach Doug Neibuhr to 67 wins on the Big Blue sidelines, moving him in No. 2 on Millikin's all-time coaching list.

Thirty eight seconds remained on the game clock with Illinois College looking at 4th and 15 yards. The Blueboys lined up for a 44-yard field goal attempt, but it sailed wide left and Millikin ran out the clock for the win.

With multiple options at quarterback, Millikin gave both Andy Dicken and Justin Levingston multiple series' of action. Dicken earned the start and completed 12-of-23 passes for 139 yards with two interceptions. Levingston completed 3-of-5 passes for 17 yards. Matt Kormelink was the Big Blue's leading receiver, pulling down five catches for 50 yards.

Defensively, Millikin sacked the Blueboys four times for 27 yards (one each by Hector Galvan, Jon Booker, Ryan Bailey and Steve Noe).

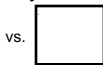


Katzmark's Career Day Not Enough Saturday, September 08, 2007

Dismal weather wasn't all the Big Blue had to battle when it traveled to No. 14 Ohio Northern University. Turnovers plagued the Big Blue in the 42-0 loss, overshadowing a career day by senior wide receiver Chris Katzmark. Katzmark caught six passes for a career-high 157 yards in the loss.

Millikin didn't help its own cause, fumbling five times and losing three (two in red zone). The Big Blue also threw an interception. The Polar Bears capitalized on those opportunities scoring off three Millikin turnovers and off of a series after a successful onside kick.

Andy Dicken earned the start at quarterback, completing 7-of-15 passes for 62 yards with an interception. Justin Levingston completed 10-of-16 for 181 yards. On the ground, Levingston's 18 yards on nine carries led the way.



Kormelink Moves Up In Record Books Saturday, September 15, 2007

Millikin University's Big Blue knew it would have its hands full with two ranked opponents in two weeks. The Big Blue welcomed the No. 23 Wabash College Little Giants to Frank M. Lindsay Field and again came away with a tough loss, 28-6. Neither team did much on the ground, but the passing games provided plenty of offense. Millikin threw for 423 yards (32-for-53) and the Little Giants passed for 245 yards (23-of-34). On the ground, Wabash was credited with 43 yards to four for Millikin.

Despite two losses, it was the second week in a row that a Millikin receiver had a career day. This week it was Kormelink, who caught 13 passes for 206 yards and a touchdown to move into No. 3 on Millikin's single-game receiving list. Kormelink is also listed in a tie for No. 7 with a 177-yard game in 2006. At quarterback, Millikin starter Justin Levingston was 17-of-29 for 256 yards and a touchdown while throwing two interceptions. Andy Dicken was 15-of-24 for 167 yards. Ryan Bailey led the individual defensive unit with nine tackles including two sacks for 19 yards and three TFLs for 20 yards. Kormelink led the game's receivers, but Wabash's Brock Graham was next with 125 yards and touchdown on 12 catches.



No. 7 Wheaton Stops Big Blue, 29-7 Saturday, September 29, 2007

On the road at Wheaton, the Big Blue faced its third ranked opponent in as

many games and was looking to get back in the win column. But No. 7 Wheaton held strong and posted a 29-7 win over the Big Blue. Millikin (1-3, 0-1) gave up just five points (a field goal and a safety) until late in the first half when Thunder took a 12-0 lead into halftime. Millikin scored its only touchdown of the game with 12:51 on the third-quarter clock when Justin Levingston hooked up with Chris Katzmark from 37 yards out.

On the offensive side of the ball, Justin Levingston got the start for the second-straight week at quarterback and played the entire game. He finished 24-of-46 for 203 yards and a touchdown with one interception. He also led the rushing attack with 54 yards on 13 carries. Chris Katzmark was Levingston's favorite target, pulling down 11 catches for 119 yards and a TD. Will Earlywine led the defense with 13 tackles, including 2.5 for losses of 7 yards.



Kormelink Reaches 1,000 Career Receiving Yards Saturday, October 06, 2007

Millikin's Big Blue got back on track in its Homecoming game against North Park. Both teams entered the game with matching 1-3 records and 0-1 in the CCIW, but Millikin's offense opened it up and finished with a 34-7 win.

Millikin (2-3, 1-1) got outstanding play from players in every facet of the game. On offense, junior wide receiver Matt Kormelink joined elite company, pulling in six catches for 122 yards and becoming the 12th player in Big Blue history to record 1,000 career receiving yards. The yards came thanks to another solid game from quarterback Justin Levingston who completed 8-of-15 passes for 212 yards with no interceptions. Defensively, Tim Hoette was all over the field. He led the Big Blue with 11 tackles, picked up TFL, a forced fumble and took away a Vikings pass in the end zone on North Park's final drive of the game to let Millikin run out the clock. On Special Teams, freshman Kody Smith had a breakout game that included a 62-yard punt return for touchdown in the second quarter. It was Smith's first score of his career. Jeremy Stephen led Millikin's rushing attack with 55 yards on 11 carries and Minter added 53 yards on 10 carries. Junior transfer Chris Hampton also had a solid day for Millikin, catching two passes for 90 yards. In addition to Levingston's 212 yards passing, Andy Dicken completed his only pass attempt for 45 yards.



Millikin's defense combined for four sacks (33 yards), 14 tackles for losses (59 yards), two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries (18 yards), three interceptions (20 yards), five pass deflections and one QB hurry. In addition to Hoette's day, Sam Jordan added 10 tackles with two for losses of six yards and Ryan Bailey had seven tackles.

Turnovers Costly For Big Blue Saturday, October 13, 2007

The Millikin football team had taken care of the ball the last few weeks after a rough start to the season, but the turnovers were back during the Big Blue's game at Illinois Wesleyan as Millikin fell 24-7. The Big Blue threw five interceptions and lost two fumbles in the game. The two teams were nearly even statistically with the Titans finishing with 276 total yards to Millikin's 256. There was only a five-yard difference in passing yards (196 for Millikin and 191 for IWU) and the Titans ran for 85 yards compared to Millikin's 60.

Individually, Justin Levingston's 36 yards on the ground led the Big Blue, and he completed 9-of-24 passes for 123 yards with four interceptions and a touchdown. Andy Dicken was 6-of-16 for 73 yards with an interception. On the receiving end, Kormelink hauled in seven catches for 150 yards and a TD. Punter Aaron McLean took the field eight times, averaging 44.0 yards per punt. Defensively, Sam



Jordan led Millikin with 13 tackles including three for losses of seven yards. Tim Hoette and Ryan Bailey had 11 tackles each. Hoette added an interception and Bailey was credited with a sack and 5.5 tackles for losses of 15 yards. Greer, who intercepted two Titans passes, returned them a total of 25 yards.

Kormelink Continues Streak Saturday, October 20, 2007

The Big Blue football team was on the road at North Central and the Cardinals got their homecoming victory, 46-21. Millikin struggled offensively in the first half, trailing 23-0, and a resurgent second-half offense couldn't make up enough ground for the win.

Andy Dicken threw for 132 yards and two touchdowns on 8-of-20 passing with one interception. Justin Levingston was 6-for-17 for 79 yards. Matt Kormelink caught eight passes for 140 yards with two scores and moved into No. 6 in Millikin career receiving history (1,393). It was his third-straight game of 100+ receiving yards. Millikin couldn't get much going on the ground, as Emmanuel Minter picked up 16 of the team's 39 rushing yards. Defensively for Millikin, Sam Jordan had 12 tackles and Ryan Bailey added 10 with 0.5 sacks and 1.5 tackles for loss. Jon Booker, Jordan Bowman and Bobby Galichio were each credited with forced fumbles and Ben McNeely returned one of the fumbles 35 yards. Jake Polich recovered the other loose ball for the Big Blue.

2007 IN REVIEW



Fourth Quarter Breakdown Dooms Big Blue Saturday, October 27, 2007

Just when Millikin's football team looked in control with a 21-10 lead over the visiting Carthage Red Men, the momentum shifted with the beginning of the fourth quarter. It ended with Carthage piling up 28 fourth-quarter points en route to a 38-28 win.

Defensively, Millikin (2-6, 1-4) picked off five Red Men passes, three in the first half. Stefen Edwards grabbed two, and Bobby Galichio, Will Earlywine and Tim Hoette each added interceptions. Offensively, Dion Wilson led all players with 90 rushing yards on 13 carries with a 21-yard first-quarter touchdown. Chris Katzmark finished with four catches for 108 yards. Andy Dicken earned the start at quarterback and completed 11-of-36 passes for 159 yards and two TDs with one interception. Justin Levingston was 0-for-1 with an interception and Fendrich was 5-for-11 down the stretch for 101 yards and a touchdown.

Katzmark, McLean Set Records In Loss Saturday, November 03, 2007

Despite another tough loss 25-21 to Elmhurst, two Big Blue seniors – punter Aaron McLean and wide receiver Chris Katzmark – set new records and moved into all-time lists.

Millikin (2-7, 1-4) had a chance on its final drive of the game, getting the ball with 2:29 remaining on its own 44-yard line. With five seconds left after a Millikin timeout, Drew Fendrich missed Matt Kormelink high in the end zone. Dion Wilson gained 72 yards on 14 carries with a TD in his first start. On the receiving end, Kormelink finished with 78 yards on eight catches. Millikin gave freshman quarterback Drew Fendrich the first start of his career. Fendrich completed 15-of-34 passes for 133 yards with one interception. Defensively, Millikin intercepted three Bluejays passes and returned them for a total of 138 yards. Kevin Israelson ran back a pick 47 yards, Stefen Edwards had a 20-yard return and Devi Greer's 71-yard return was nearly taken back for a touchdown. On the day, Tim Hoette and Sam Jordan were each credited with 12 tackles.

In the Big Blue record books, Katzmark became just the 13th receiver



in Millikin history to amass 1,000 receiving yards. His one catch for 24 yards in a fourth-quarter drive that led to a touchdown pushed him over the mark for 1,002 career yards. Kormelink also joined the 1,000 yard receivers club this season.

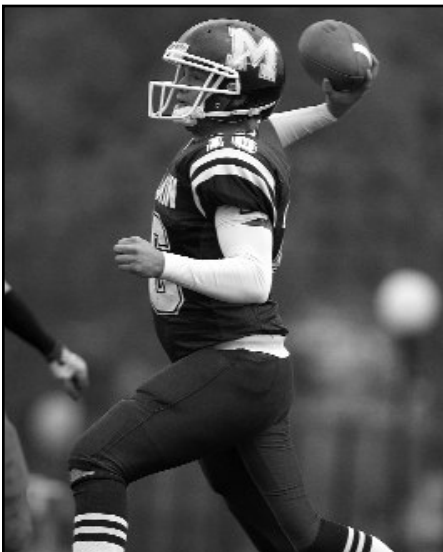
McLean finished the day with 241 punting yards to create a new Big Blue single-season record with 2,531 punting yards. He already held Millikin career record for punting yards (now 8,262) and punts in a career (now 210). Against Elmhurst, McLean punted the ball away six times for an average of 40.2 yards, was credited with a long punt of 47 yards and had two balls land inside the 20 yard line.

BIG BLUE AMONG THE PROS

Twenty-six former Millikin University players have enjoyed professional football careers in the NFL, CFL, European and Arena football leagues. Eight of them played in the Chicago Bears organization, including six on the 1920 Staley team that was the forerunner of the present Bears franchise. Enjoying the most distinguished professional careers of the former Big Blue were Pro Football Hall of Famer George Musso and Canadian Football League Hall of Famer Virgil Wagner.

Musso, a 1982 Hall of Fame inductee, played 12 seasons with the Bears (1933-44) and earned All-Pro honors at tackle and guard—the first player to be recognized at two positions. He served as Chicago's captain when the Bears were known as the "Monsters of the Midway."

Wagner, who played halfback and cornerback, was inducted into the CFL Hall of Fame in 1980 following a nine-year career (1946-54) with the Montreal Alouettes. He led the CFL in scoring his first four seasons, scored a league-record 79 career touchdowns and was a five-time all-league selection.

The most recent NFL signee is Michael Marker, a wide receiver who graduated in 2003. Marker, signed with the Green Bay Packers in December 2004. Eric Smith, a 1997 graduate and two-time CCIW selection at tight end, signed a two-year free agent contract with the San Diego Chargers in May 1998.

Recent players Chris Katzmark, Ryan Bailey, Donnell Brown, Mike Kohl and Joe Hyland are playing or have played in European leagues. Katzmark (WR, 2007 graduate) and Bailey (DL, 2008 graduate), signed contracts with Finland's Kouvola Indians in 2008. Prior to his departure overseas, Katzmark also played with the arena team Bloomington Extreme. Brown, a quarterback and 2003 graduate, has played in Germany with the

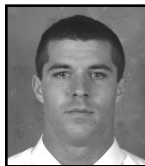
Dresden Monarchs in the German Football League since 2003. Kohl and Hyland, played during the spring and summer of 1998. Kohl played quarterback for the Karlskoga Wolves in Sweden

while Hyland played linebacker for Hamburg's (Germany) Blue Devils. David Peabody, a 1994 graduate, also spent one year playing in Europe with the Noris Rams of Nurnberg, Germany. Peabody helped lead his team to a playoff berth and earned first-team All-Germany honors.

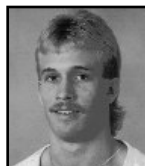
The first Millikin professional was Sid Gepford, who played with the Decatur Staleys (which became the Chicago Bears in 1922) in 1919. A year later, Roy Adkins, Leo Johnson, F. "Jake" Lanum, Kile MacWherter and Randolph Young joined the Bears, while halfback George Corbett played for Chicago from 1932-38. Joe Carp played from 1926-29 and in 1933 with Frankfort, Pottsville, Boston and Philadelphia. Jim Perryman, a 1983 graduate, played with the NFL's Buffalo Bills and Indianapolis Colts, and with the USFL's Pittsburgh Maulers.

In 1989, wide receiver Jeff Query became the first Millikin player selected in the NFL draft. The Packers chose him in the fifth round. Deverick Lampley, a 1985 graduate, spent some time with the Dallas Cowboys. Aric Anderson, a 1987 graduate, played with the Green Bay Packers during the players' strike and also played in the Arena Football League and in 1988 Alphonso Lott signed with the Dallas Cowboys as a free agent.

2002 graduate and CCIW Defensive Player of the Year Michael Lindsey joined the Arena Football League's Peoria Rough Riders (formerly Peoria Pirates) in February 2005. Bob Meyer, a 2000 graduate, also played in Peoria when the team was still the Pirates. Curt Reed, a 1989 graduate, played with the Albany Firebirds of the Arena Football League.



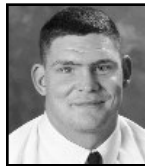

CCIW HISTORY



The College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW) celebrates its 63rd year in 2008-09. Millikin is one of the four charter members with uninterrupted membership.

In National Collegiate Athletic Association Division III competition, CCIW schools have won 34 titles in 62 years of league competition. The schools have won seven titles in men's basketball, two in women's basketball, 11 in men's cross country, four in football, four in men's swimming, one in men's soccer, three in women's soccer, two in men's outdoor track & field, one in men's indoor track & field, one in women's indoor track and two in volleyball.

The original nine-member league was formed at a meeting in Jacksonville, Ill. on April 26, 1946, and began competition during the 1946-47 school year as the College Conference of Illinois. The name was changed in May 1967 to recognize the two Wisconsin schools, Carroll and Carthage. Charter members were Millikin, Augustana, Carthage (then located in Illinois), Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, North Central and Wheaton.

Carthage left in 1952 and returned in 1961, while Illinois College departed in 1953 and Lake Forest left in 1967. Wheaton left in 1959 and returned in 1967, and Elmhurst dropped out in 1960 only to return in 1967. Carroll joined in 1955 and left in

1992 and North Park became a member in 1962.

Originally staging competition only for men, women's sports were added to the CCIW slate in 1986.

BIG BLUE ATHLETICS FACILITIES

Griswold Physical Education Center

Griswold Center and its surrounding facilities are perfect for the intercollegiate athlete or intramural player. Griswold Center houses a 3,052-seat gymnasium and three regulation-size courts. Millikin hosts several high school tournaments and games each year including the annual IHSA Class A Girls Super-Sectionals.

The men's and women's basketball, women's volleyball and men's wrestling teams also compete in Griswold Center's gym and its six-lane McIntosh Pool is home to the Big Blue men's and women's swim teams. The building also houses classrooms, staff offices, athletic training facilities and locker rooms. Recent renovations to the gym include new bleachers on the west side, a fresh coat of paint, a new gym floor design and new scoreboards.



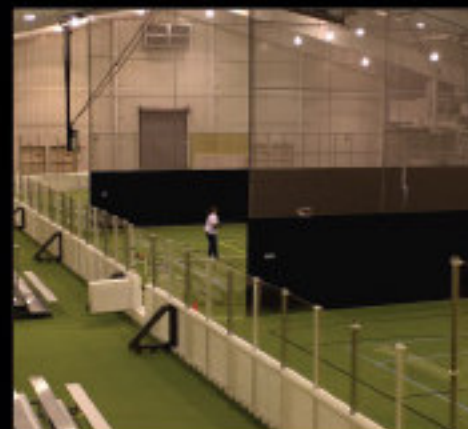
Frank M. Lindsay Field

Just north of Griswold Center, Millikin's track & field teams take advantage of 1997 renovations to the Frank M. Lindsay Track & Field complex that included an eight-lane, all-weather track. The USATF Youth Athletic Championships were held on the track in both 2000 and 2001 and Millikin also hosted the NCAA Division III Outdoor Track & Field Championships in 2001 and 2004. In addition to the track & field teams, the football team calls Lindsay Field home as well. One of two natural grass surfaces remaining in the CCIW, the Lindsay Field complex has also undergone recent renovations including the addition of a state-of-the-art press box, new scoreboards and a new sound system.



Soccer Facility

To the south, behind the DISC (see below), is the home of the Big Blue soccer teams. Play began at the complex in 2003 and the fields have seen continued improvements. Recent renovations included covered dugouts, landscaping, an irrigation system and a practice field.



Off-Campus Practice and Competition Sites

Several Big Blue teams make use of off-campus facilities. The women's tennis team plays and practices at the Fairview Park Tennis Complex, located just across the street from campus. The men's and women's golf teams frequent the city's four public golf courses while the Big Blue baseball program calls Sunnyside Park home. The softball team plays its home games at Borg-Warner Sports Complex. While the cross country teams host home meets at the Scovill Golf Course, most of their training is done at Fairview Park on the paved, grass and dirt trails that trace the historic Interurban Railway. The trails lead through Kiwanis Park to the Macon County Conservation District Bikeway to the Rock Springs Environmental Center.

Decatur Indoor Sports Center (DISC) at Millikin

Constructed in January 2000 in conjunction with the Decatur Park District, the DISC is a 87,000 square foot, on-campus athletic facility.

The DISC's new weight rooms are the perfect place for the serious athlete or amateur to work up a sweat. Upstairs facilities include machine weights and cardiovascular equipment while the lower-level room provides an expanse of free-weights and dumbbells. The DISC also features a 200-meter indoor running track and indoor soccer and basketball facilities as well as a climbing wall. For more information on the DISC, call 217.429.3472.

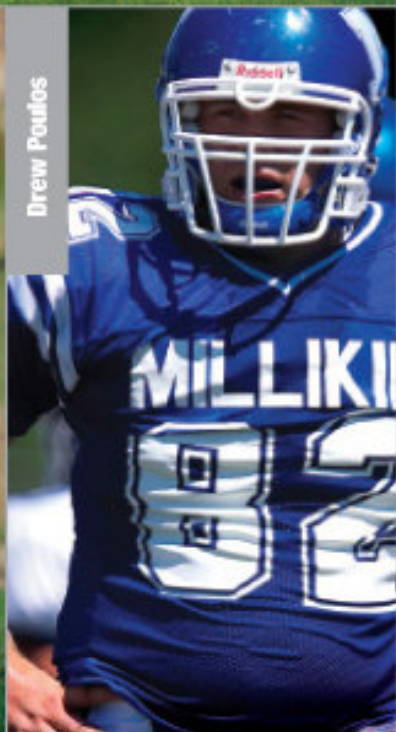
