

What James Millikin envisioned when he founded the University in 1901 was unique: the university would embrace the "practical" side of learning along with the "literary and classical;" and, while affiliated with the Presbyterian Church, it would not be narrowly "sectarian" and would remain open to all.

The result is one of the nation's first small, comprehensive universities that, a century later, has four colleges and schools: College of Arts and Sciences, College of Fine Arts, School of Nursing and Tabor School of Business.

With an enrollment of nearly 2,400 students, Millikin is a devoted partner to the Decatur-area community. Its students learn through realworld projects and learn to

see connections with other academic disciplines to demonstrate the diversity of human experience, the interactions between technology and society.... They learn about themselves and others, developing a respect for differences and for the dignity of all.

The University subscribes to the philosophy of the NCAA Division III and offers no scholarships for athletes, but Millikin has enjoyed a broad and successful athletics program for many years. Teams and individuals in every sport have earned national recognition.

Sports for women include cross country, tennis, volleyball, basketball, soccer, swimming, softball, indoor and outdoor track & field and golf. Sports for men include cross country, football, soccer, basketball, swimming, wrestling, golf, indoor and outdoor track & field and baseball.



According to the coaches, the deciding game in the 2003 CCIW football race may again come down to the final Saturday when Augustana hosts Wheaton, as each picked up 45 points in the preseason voting. Wheaton had four first place votes while Augustana garnered three with Millikin picking up the final vote.

Millikin and Illinois Wesleyan each picked up 35 points to tie for third place. In 2002 the Big Blue was 4-3 in the league for a third place tie with North Central. North Central is tabbed for fifth place and Carthage is picked to finish sixth. Elmhurst and North Park round out the seventh and eighth spots.

head coach doug neibuhr

Doug Neibuhr begins his eighth season as head football coach at Millikin in 2003. A 1974 graduate of Millikin and former Big Blue assistant coach, Neibuhr brings a .704 career win percentage from 14 seasons into the 2003 campaign. He is 96-40-1 overall in his career and has compiled a 46-22 (.676) overall and 33-16 (.673) College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW) record in his

seven years at the helm of Millikin's program.



Neibuhr was named the 1998 CCIW Coach of the Year after leading the Big Blue to its first conference title since 1990 and its third-ever appearance in the NCAA Division III playoffs. His players have earned 36 first-team and 33 second-team all-conference selections at Millikin.



He compiled a 50-18-1 record in seven years at Wittenberg University (Springfield, Ohio), including a 35-5-1 mark in his last four seasons. In 1995, Neibuhr guided Wittenberg to its first undefeated season since 1979, a North Coast Athletic Conference Championship (NCAC) and a berth in the NCAA Division III playoffs. The Tigers also won a conference championship under Neibuhr in 1992.



Neibuhr has put together a .734 win percentage (69-25) in conference games during his

career and is one of only four head coaches in NCAA Division III history to take two different institutions to the national playoffs.

During his seven years at Wittenberg, Neibuhr's players earned All-America recognition 19 times, first team all-conference honors 50 times and Academic All-America recognition three times.

He was named the NCAC Coach of the Year twice (1992, 1995) and guided Wittenberg to a conference championship in 1992. He and his offensive line coach, Joe Fincham, were named 1995 Offensive Coordinators of the Year for NCAA Division III by *American Football Quarterly*.

Neibuhr completed his education at Millikin in three and a half years, graduating cum laude in December 1974. While playing quarterback and place kicker, he helped the Big Blue to a 23-6 record in his four years and the CCIW Championship in 1974. He is also a member of Millikin's Athletic Hall of Fame.

After serving as a graduate assistant coach at Illinois State University where he earned a master of science degree in 1976, Neibuhr served a year as assistant football, head baseball and head wrestling coach at Ripon (Wis.) College. He joined the Millikin staff in 1977, serving most of the next 12 years as offensive coordinator. He also coached the Big Blue men's golf team to six consecutive CCIW Championships and led the team to a third-place finish nationally in 1985.

Neibuhr and his wife, Jody, have three sons Brandt (18), Bryan (16) and Kirk (13).


Pat Allgeier Offensive Coordinator, O Line

Pat Allgeier begins his first season as offensive coordinator and his seventh season as offensive line coach in 2003, his eighth year on the staff. Allgeier is also Millikin's head men's golf coach.

A former All-North Coast Athletic

Conference offensive tackle, the Cincinnati native earned three letters for Wittenberg before graduating in 1993. He served as assistant offensive line coach at Wittenberg for two seasons.

Allgeier and his wife, Peg, live in Decatur with their one year-old twin daughters Amanda and Becca.



Nic Black Inside Linebackers

Nic Black begins his first season with the Big Blue in 2003 as the linebackers coach. A graduate of Wittenberg University and an All-North Coast Athletic Conference outside linebacker, Black joins the Millikin staff after serving as the

Defensive Coordinator and Special Teams coach for Springfield Shawnee High School in Springfield, Ohio.

Named the defensive line coach for the 2003 Miami Valley Football Coaches Association All-Star game, Black also served as the strength coordinator for Springfield Shawnee and Springfield Catholic Central High Schools from 2000 to 2002.



Ken Czajkowski Running Backs

Ken Czajkowski, in his seventh season as part of the Big Blue coaching staff, moves over to coach the running backs in 2003. He previously helped with the tight ends and offensive line.

A physical education teacher at Niantic-Harristown, Czajkowski student taught at Eureka Middle School in the winter of 1996. A 1996 graduate of Eureka College, Czajkowski played on the Red Devils football team from 1988-1991. He was an offensive line coach and recruiter at Eureka from 1992 to 1996, served as a baseball coach (1995-96) and administrative assistant for the basketball program (1995-96) at Eureka.



Dirk Doehring Wide Receivers

Dirk Doehring joins the Big Blue coaching staff for his first season in 2003. As the wide receivers coach, Doehring will be relying on the experience of his two varsity letters in a Big Blue uniform. A 2002 graduate, he majored in education.

Doehring was a co-captain and part of the record-setting 400-meter relay for Millikin's 2002 track team and taught at Argenta-Oreana High School last year when he was an assistant football and head boys track coach.



David Durish Defensive Linemen

David Durish is in his fourth season on the Big Blue staff as the team's defensive line coach. He is also Millikin's Assistant Athletic Director and Strength and Conditioning Coordinator.

A 1991 graduate of Indiana University of Pennsylvania, Durish served as the defensive line coach and special teams coordinator at Case Western Reserve University (Ohio) in 1999. Prior to coaching at Case Western Reserve, he served as the offensive line coach, recruiting coordinator and academic coordinator at Clarion University (Pa.) from 1997 to 1999. He also coached the offensive line and served as offensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator at Ohio Wesleyan University for one season.

Durish earned his master's of education in reading degree from Clarion in 1995 where he served as a graduate assistant offensive backfield coach in 1993 and coached the tight ends and wide receivers in 1994 and 1995.

Durish and his wife, Tracy, live in Decatur.



Jay Hood Asst. Head Coach, Defensive Coordinator, DBs

Jay Hood is in his sixth season with the Big Blue. In his fourth year as defensive coordinator, he is also the defensive backs coach and begins his second season as the assistant head coach. He

served as secondary coach in 1998.

Hood, a 1986 graduate of Ohio Wesleyan, was head coach at Mesa State College (Colo.) for four seasons before coming to Millikin. Prior to Mesa State, Hood was defensive coordinator at Fort Hays State University (Kan.) for four seasons and was defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach for one season each at Mesa State.

He earned his master's degree from Bowling Green University (Ohio) in 1987 where he served as a graduate assistant. Hood and his wife, Renee, live in Decatur.



Mike McLaughlin Outside Linebackers

Mike McLaughlin returns to coach the linebackers after assisting with the defensive line for the seven seasons. He also coached the linebackers in 1995.

McLaughlin joined the Millikin staff in 1988 after spending 16 years as a foot-

ball coach at Stephen Decatur and MacArthur High Schools in Decatur. The 1961 Northwest Missouri State graduate served as head football coach at Falls City, Neb., and Breckenridge, Mo., before coming to Decatur.

McLaughlin received his master's degree at Northwest Missouri State and teaches at MacArthur High School. He and his wife, Connie, have two daughters.

our 100th year...a look at 2003

Hungry for its fourth NCAA playoff berth and third under head coach Doug Neibuhr, the Big Blue's 2003 squad will rely on the return of 40 letter winners and 19 starters to improve on last season's 7-3 record. Looking for its sixth-straight winning season after finishing above .500 for 16 of the last 20 seasons, Millikin will need to regroup from the losses of 10 starters. But a pillar of football tradition stands behind the Big Blue, as the 16 seniors on the 2003 roster have helped the team to a 24-6 regular-season

record and a playoff berth in 2000. Neibuhr also welcomes back three players who have earned All-CCIW honors in their careers.

Among the most notable losses from last year's third-place CCIW team include Ryan Miller (WR), Nate Carden (DL), Brandon Witte (TE), Ryan Corley (RB), Lee Mateer (OL) and Chuck Walls (OL). All were starters and All-CCIW players in 2002. Replacing them is a tall order, but several players with considerable experience return for Neibuhr. who enters his 15th collegiate season and opens

his eighth on the Big Blue sidelines with a 46-22 (.676) record.

"I am very excited about our prospects for this fall. We return a number of significant contributors on both sides of the ball as well as all of our specialists," Neibuhr said.

The Big Blue wrapped up last season with a handful of nation-

al rankings including Top-25 marks in scoring and rushing offenses and Top-35 marks in total offense. Within the CCIW, Millikin led the league in PAT percentage and kickoff coverage while finishing second in pass defense.

OFFENSE-

After putting 381 points on the board, Millikin's strength was undoubtedly the offense in 2002 as the Big Blue steamrolled five opponents by scoring 30 or more points in those games. And Neibuhr doesn't expect his offense to slow down in 2003.

"Offensively we have a solid core of veterans returning who have a great understanding of what we'd like to accomplish. I expect us to have a strong, physical offense that exhibits big-play capability," Neibuhr said. "We do have the size and the speed conducive to success."

The Big Blue offense will have plenty of talent on hand this season with seven of 13 starters returning from a unit that averaged 38.1 points and 222.8 rushing yards a year ago.

"We expect to be solid at the quarterback position. Our starter returns for his senior season, but I expect him to be strongly challenged by a talented group of underclassmen," Neibuhr said.

QUARTERBACKS

Senior and three-year starter **DONNELL BROWN** returns at quarterback after Millikin's third-best single-season passing yardage and fifth-best season total offense yards in 2002. He also cleared the 3,000 yards passing mark last year to move into Millikin's Top-5. In his junior effort, Brown completed 108 of 203 passes (53.2 percent) for 1,627 yards and 16 touchdowns, but he should have some competition this fall. Sophomore **JUSTIN**

STESSMAN and junior **DAVID KOESTER** also return in 2003 after seeing time last year.

WIDE RECEIVERS

The quarterbacks will be throwing it out to a few new faces this season. Senior **MICHAEL**

MARKER returns after finishing second on the team a year ago with 20 catches for 426 yards and five touchdowns. Junior ERIC PABON is back after 11 catches for 196 yards and senior tight end ARTHUR ANDERSON caught five passes for 80 yards. Contributions are also expected from sophomore NATHAN CHANDLER who spent most of last season on the return teams, and sophomore JOSH ALLOTEY.

"With the return of four of our top six wide receivers we expect to put a talented group on the field," Neibuhr said. "We expect to have excellent speed at this position and have a group of men who have playmaking capability."

RUNNING BACKS

Power, speed and depth return in the ground game as well with juniors JAY GRAZIANO, MIKE KENDERS and JEMELLE SHEPHERD. Shepherd finished second in rushing yardage a season ago with 343 yards while Graziano finished with 145 yards and a touchdown. The Big Blue's short-yardage specialist, Kenders led Millikin with 13 touchdowns while averaging 2.5 yards per carry and finished the season nationally ranked in scoring. But a handful of other players should also be fighting for time on the field once practice begins.

The tight end spot will see a new starter emerge after the graduation of Brandon Witte. Neibuhr returns two letter winners with solid experience in Anderson and junior **TYLER LUX**. Anderson leads the way after five catches for 80 yards last season.

"There will be great competition at the running back positions," Neibuhr said. "We have some talented people who will be in the mix and it will be very interesting to see who steps up and performs at a consistently high level."

OFFENSIVE LINE

With all of the offense weapons the Big Blue has available, Millikin's offensive line looks to be ready to block the defensive charge. Juniors JON HART, NATHAN GRAY and ERIC HOF-

MANN, and sophomore **TONY LIPKA** all return to the line after considerable time in 2002.

"We are youthful but experienced in our offensive line and expect this area to be solid. Although none are seniors, we do return four men who started last season. Our expectations are very high for this group," Neibuhr said.

DEFENSE-

The Big Blue's stalwart defense remains virtually intact after last season with the two-deep returning entirely at almost every position

"While we return eight starters on defense, including all of our linebackers and defensive backs, the development of the defensive line will be paramount to our success," Neibuhr said. "Although we return just one starter on the defensive line, we do have a number of underclassmen who received significant playing time last season. Their development will be key to our defensive success. I expect us to run very well and play with the enthusiasm, poise and confidence that you would expect from a veteran unit."

LINEBACKERS

The linebackers should have plenty of experience and tenacity this season with the returns of seniors JASON HARVEY and MATT PHILLIPS, juniors BRANDON BORDNER and AL KATOR and sophomores ERIC KRAMER and DORTANIAN BLOUNT.

"We return our entire two-deep at the four linebacker positions and expect this to be a strength of our team," Neibuhr said.

The linebackers finished the season with all of the top tackling marks. Phillips led the team with 74 and 4 TFLs while Kramer had 62 tackles, 3 TFLS and 2 sacks. A second-team All-CCIW player, Harvey finished with 59 tackles, 4 TFLs, 2 interceptions and a forced fumble and Bordner finished with 48 tackles, 6 TFL and 4 sacks.

SECONDARY

The strength of the secondary should also enable the Big Blue to keep opponents on their toes as three of last year's four starters return in seniors **LEE CLAYTON** and **DEREK STEPHENS** and junior **KEVIN MEEHAN**. Junior **JASON LYNCH** will also suit up again in 2002 after considerable time last season.

Clayton was a first-team All-CCIW pick while Stephens finished 2002 tied for fourth with 48 tackles and also picked up two interceptions. Meehan and Kator recorded 44 and 40 tackles, respectively.

"We also return all starters and backups in the defensive secondary and are excited about the talent level and experience that we have there," Neibuhr said.

DEFENSIVE LINE

The biggest area for growth this season will be on the defensive line, which boasts lone returner and senior **JEFF BECK**. Beck tallied 36 tackles a year ago with 5 TFLs and 2 sacks. After earning starter-quality minutes in 2002, juniors **ROMELLE LIP-SCOMB**, **KYLE HEMENOVER** and **TIM STAFFELDT** also return on the defensive line.

SPECIAL TEAMS -

High expectations have also been set for the special teams unit. With record-holder **ANDY BEALS** returning for his senior season, Neibuhr also returns senior punter **TRAVIS MEYER** and returners Chandler and sophomore **SEANTAÉ HOLLAND**.

Beals, who holds career marks for PATs and kicking points, needs just 65 points this season to tie the career scoring mark and is two field goals shy of tying that career mark. He also wrapped up the 2003 season with a Hewlett Packard Third-Team All-America honor and a spot in the national rankings for field goals per game.

Meyer, who also saw considerable time with the defensive unit, was the team's top punter with an average of 36.5 yards per try. On the return team, Chandler and Holland were the top players a year ago. Chandler averaged 7.9 yards per return for 173 yards while Holland's 103 yards equaled a 7.4 per return average.

"I would be disappointed if our special teams are not outstanding," Neibuhr said. Returning our kicker, punter, long snapper, holder and well as all of our return specialists will make this an area of strength."

PROGRAM HISTORY -

Millikin's football program is steeped in tradition, winning 11 CCIW Championships. The most recent one came in the 2000 season. The Big Blue football team finished with a 7-3 record overall in the 2002 season and has compiled the best regular-season record of all CCIW schools over the last five years (39-9). Millikin's last five seasons are also its best regular-season marks since the 1920s. In seven seasons, Neibuhr has compiled a 46-22 record at Millikin (.676) and is tied for fourth in career wins. After the 2002 season, Neibhur was 21st in win percentage and 34th in career victories of active Division III coaches and is one of only four coaches to take two different teams to the NCAA playoffs. Millikin falls into 18th place in win-loss percentage and 17th in wins in the NCAA after 2002.

frank m. lindsay field



Named in memory of long-time Decatur business leader and media owner, and recognizing the support given to Millikin by his family, Frank M. Lindsay Field was dedicated on Oct. 17, 1987.

Gifts from the Lindsay family and from an endowment fund created in 1961 by former members of the defunct Kappa Delta Chi fraternity financed the project. Donations from the classes of 1979 and 1980 assisted in the purchase of a new scoreboard, while a new sound system, an improved drainage system and an underground irrigation system were also added.

Frank M. Lindsay Field seats 4,000, including seating for 2,300 spectators on the west side. Lindsay Field also includes a concession stand and restrooms under the southwest corner of the grandstand.

The newest addition to Lindsay Field is a state-of-the-art press box built on the west side of the field. Construction of the new press box concluded in Spring 2001

and was funded entirely with the gift of \$800,00 from the late F. Merrill and the late Margery "Sis" Lindsay.

The lower level features expanded working spaces for print and electronic media. It has up-to-date features including telephone and Internet connections in all boxes. Game-day clock workers, coaches and the Sports Information staff join the media in the lower level. A large guest area is located on the second level, and videographers can find a clear view of the field from the top of the second level.

The press box is handicap-accessible by elevator from both levels, is air-conditioned and heated with restrooms facilities on each floor. In the summer of 2001, the press box was used when Millikin hosted the NCAA Division III Track & Field Championships and the USATF Youth Championships.

Millikin awarded an honorary degree to Frank Lindsay in 1954 and to his son, F.

Merrill Lindsay in 1981, making them one of the only two father-son combinations so recognized by the University.

F. Merrill Lindsay and his wife, Sis, donated a gift of \$1 million to Millikin in 1997 for the new running track around the football field. The gift provided the impetus for the track project.





the abc's of millikin football

- A is for Academic All-Americans. Millikin football has had 10 first-team selections.
- **B** is for "Big Blue," attributed to professor Carl Head who used it in posters during the 1916 season.
- **C** is for College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin. Millikin has won or shared 11 CCIW titles.
- **D** is for Decatur Indoor Sports Complex at Millikin (DISC), a state-of-the-art recreational facility.
- **E** is for Eugene Wallace, Millikin's career leader in touchdowns in a season (21) and game (7).
- **F** is for Frank M. Lindsay. Millikin's field is named in memory of the long-time Decatur business leader.
- **G** is for Sid Gepford, who was Millikin's first professional football player.
- **H** is for Bob Henry. He holds five school record, including career rushing attempts (677).
- I is for interceptions. The Big Blue recorded nine interceptions last season.
- **J** is for Ryan Jorstad, the first football Academic All-American in school history (1960).
- **K** is for Marc Knowles. He holds the record with 254 receiving yards in one game.
- L is for Bob Lockart. He holds eight school records, including career pass completions.
- **M** is for Musso. George Musso, a 1933 graduate, was inducted into the NFL Hall of Fame in 1982.
- **N** is for new records. The Big Blue set two individual records in 2002.
- **O** is for offense. The Big Blue averaged 38.1 points per game last season.
- **P** is for Sam Powers. He led Millikin in scoring in the first three seasons (1903-05).
- **Q** is for Query. Jeff Query is the only Millikin player ever selected in the NFL draft.
- **R** is for receivers. Ten of the 15 players who caught a pass in 2002 return this year.
- **S** is for Shilling Hall, one of the several campus buildings dedicated by President Theodore Roosevelt in 1903.
- **T** is for three. Three of 2003's returning players finished the 2002 season nationally ranked in Division III Donnell Brown (pass efficiency), Mike Kenders (scoring) and Andy Beals (field goals).
- **U** is for undefeated. Millikin has had five undefeated and untied seasons in its history.
- **V** is for victories. Millikin has recorded 489 victories in 97 years of football.
- **W** is for winning streaks. The Big Blue's school record for consecutive wins is 26 (1918-21).
- **X** is for extra points. 2003 senior Andy Beals broke head coach Doug Neibhur's career record for extra points, setting a new mark with 121.
- **Y** is for youth. A total of 66 freshmen are on the preseason roster.
- **Z** is for Ed Zachry (1939-41), Hugo Zahn (1948-49), Brian Zimmerman (1990-91), Rob Zanoni (1993-94) and Frank Zurek (2001-present), the only letter winners whose last names begin with the letter Z.



Season Highlights (Returning Players in Bold)

- Team ranked as high as 18th nationally in October 2002.
- In CCIW games last season, Millikin ranked fourth or better overall in scoring offense, scoring defense, pass offense, pass defense, punting, rushing offense, rushing defense, total offense, total defense, passing efficiency and pass efficiency defense.
- Nationally, the Big Blue tied for 12th in scoring offense (38.1), 25th in rushing offense (222.8), and tied for 34th in total offense (409.1).
- Place kicker **Andy Beals** broke several records, including the career PAT (121) and career kick scoring (199) marks as a junior when he was named to the Hewlett-Packard All-America third team. Beals was also a first team academic All-District selection in 2002, and ranked nationally in field goals per game (1.0).
- Defensive lineman **Jeff Beck** received Second Team Academic All-District honors during his junior season. In 2002, Beck recorded 36 tackles with five for loss and two sacks.
- John Bell was the teams leading rusher, despite a season-ending injury in Week Eight. He rushed for 572 yards on 101 carries and six touchdowns while averaging 70.4 ypg and 5.6 ypc.
- Quarterback **Donnell Brown** completed 53 percent of his passes, throwing for 1,627 yards and 16 touchdowns. He moved into third in season-best performances and fifth in career passing after his junior season. Brown also ended the 2002 season ranked nationally in pass efficiency (141.6) and moved into fourth on Millikin's season list for total offense (1,788).
- Nate Carden, a defensive lineman, was named the teams Most Valuable Player. He was named CCIW Player of the Week twice last season and was a first-team All-CCIW pick. He recorded 38 tackles, nine for a loss of 37 yards, and led the team with six sacks.
- Lee Clayton, an All-Conference first-team selection, recorded 35 tackles, one interception and was second on the team with six pass breakups and one blocked kick.
- Ryan Corley, a second-team All-CCIW selection at fullback, ran for 240 yards on 40 carries with two touchdowns. He also received for another 117 yards and two touchdowns in 2002.
- Jason Harvey, a second-team All-Conference selection, was third in tackles (59) with four for a loss. He also recorded one sack and two interceptions with one returned for a touchdown.
- Mike Kenders was the team's leading scorer, rushing for 13 touchdowns and receiving for another. He averaged 10.7 ypg and 2.5 ypc on 43 carries and finished the season ranked nationally in scoring (8.4).
- Eric Kramer was second on the team in tackles with 62 and earned CCIW Player of the Week during the season for his 12 tackles with one for loss and one sack effort against Carthage.
- All-Conference selections Lee Mateer and Chuck Walls blocked for an offense that put up 38.1 points a game. Mateer was also named to National Weekly Football Gazette's Division III All-North Region Team.



- Ryan Miller earned a spot in the career receiving records, moving up to sixth with 1,374 yards. He caught 27 passes for 587 yards last season and was also a first-team All-Conference selection.
- Matt Phillips led the team in tackles with 74, including four for a loss of eight yards.
- Brandon Witte, a second-team All-CCIW selection, had five receptions for 35 yards and one touchdown. He protected for an offense that averaged 516.1 yards a game and represented Millikin on the CCIW's Fall Academic All-Conference team.

2002 in review

Millikin 54, Franklin 21 (Sept. 14, 2002)

Millikin scored 22 points in the opening quarter including points on its first four offensive drives. John Bell scored on a 26-yard run and Donnell Brown threw two TD passes including a 5-yard strike to senior Ryan Corley and a 12-yarder to Mike Gardiner. Also adding to the first-quarter scoring, Andy Beals drilled a 36-yard field goal. The Big Blue added to its lead in the second with a 32-yard field goal by Beals while a 3-yard run by Corley gave Millikin a 32-0 half-time lead.

Franklin got on the board less than three minutes into second half, driving 79 yards for its first points of the game. The Big Blue opened its third quarter scoring with a 63-yard drive and Brown's third TD pass of the day, connecting with Ryan Miller from 18-yards out. Taking to the air in the second half, the Grizzlies scored three touchdowns, including two in the third quarter.

Millikin's offense livened up again late in the third quarter when Brown connected with Miller on a 93-yard score to put the Big Blue up 47-13 heading into the final quarter. The 93-yard touchdown catch was a career best for both Miller and Brown. Millikin scored its final points of the day on Mike Kenders' 3-yard run with 6:49 remaining.

The Big Blue piled up 570 total yards on the afternoon. The rushing attack gained 316 yards on 55 carries with eight different players recording positive rushing yards. Bell led the ground attack compiling 124 yards on 19 carries. Brown threw for 258 yards and four touchdowns, completing 50 percent (12-24) of his passes. On the receiving end, Miller led the team with 163 yards on five receptions. Defensively, Nate Carden had two sacks moving the Grizzlies back 15 total yards while also forcing a fumble and deflecting a pass. Jason Lynch and Al Kator led the Big Blue with eight tackles apiece. Craig Mack recorded five tackles and returned an interception 38 yards while 2001's interception leader Jason Harvey picked off his first pass of the year.

Millikin piled up 570 yards on 79 plays (312 on the ground) compared to the Grizzlies' 352 yards on 67 plays (45 of them pass plays).

Millikin 54, Aurora 13 (Sept. 21, 2002)

Millikin's Big Blue didn't waste any time with the Aurora Spartans, pushing for 28 points in the first half before taking a commanding 44-6 halftime lead. A 10-point second half helped Millikin to a 54-13 victory.

The Big Blue scored touchdowns on each of its first quarter possessions. Jason Harvey returned an interception 47-yards for a touchdown to open the scoring in the second quarter. It was Harvey's second pick in as many games.

Across the board, Millikin dominated the game. With 17 first downs, the Big Blue piled up 223 yards on the ground and 142 yards in the air to out-gain the Spartans 365 yards to 236. Defensively, the Big Blue was sharp, picking off two passes and forcing the Spartans to fumble the ball seven times.

The scoring started as Millikin got on the board less than two minutes into the game on a 67-yard pass from Donnell Brown to Ryan Miller. Mike Kenders ended the first half with three touchdowns (two 1-yard runs and a 6-yard reception). Harvey got things going in second quarter with his interception returned for a touchdown before Aurora got on the board. With 5:38 left in the second quarter, Aurora's capitalized on a 25-yard scoring pass.

But before Aurora's celebration ended, the Big Blue capitalized again as Matt Phillips recovered a blocked PAT attempt and ran it back for two points. Kenders added another 1-yard run to close out the first half with Millikin holding a 44-6 lead.

Andy Beals scored the only points of the third quarter on a 26-yard field goal and the Big Blue got its final points of the game from Romelle Lipscomb, who carried a 28-yard Aurora fumble back for a touchdown with 12:18 left in the game. Aurora closed out the game's scoring on a 16-yard pass.

Eric Kramer and Nick Shaub led the defense with six tackles apiece. Kramer also forced a fumble. Harvey and Craig Mack each hauled in their second interceptions of the year after picking off passes last week at Franklin (Ind.) College.

While the defense was solid, the Big Blue offense put up big numbers for the second week in a row. Brown completed 9 of 15 passes for 142 yards and two touchdowns. Jemelle Shepherd led the ground attack, compiling 68 yards on 16 carries.

Millikin 65, Anderson 7 (Sept. 28, 2002)

Defensive lineman Nate Carden was named CCIW Player of the Week for the second time this season after piling up seven tackles in the game (6 solo) and one sack for a loss of 10 yards. The defense, which held the Ravens to 240 yards on the day and just 11 on the ground, was led Derek Stephens with nine tackles. Eric Kramer added six tackles in the win.

The offense did its part, scoring more than 50 points for the third straight week as the Big Blue racked up 594 yards of total offense. John Bell led the ground attack for Millikin with 127 yards on 17 carries and two touchdowns. Lee McCoy added 114 yards on seven carries for two touchdowns, including a 71-yard score late in the fourth quarter.

With 10 points in the game, Andy Beals set the Millikin career kicking points record. Beals' 158 over the last three seasons bettered the 153 mark set by Charlie Sammis from 1976-78.

Millikin 21, Carthage 12 (Oct. 5, 2002)

With the 21-12 win over Carthage, the Big Blue moved up in the polls, from 21 to 18 in the AFCA poll and from 39 to 38 in the Hansen poll.

The Big Blue scored all its points in the first half, the first on a 1-yard touchdown run by Mike Kenders. Kenders leads the team in scoring on the season with eight touchdowns. John Bell ran in another score from 23 yards out and Donnell Brown scored on a 13-yard run to give the Big Blue a 21-0 lead in the second quarter.

The Millikin defense surrendered two touchdowns, the last with 47 seconds left in the game. The defense held Division III rushing leader Randal Baker to 142 yards on the day, just over 62 yards below his season average. Linebacker Eric Kramer led the defense in tackles with 12 (seven solo, five assisted) and was named CCIW defensive player of the week for his efforts. Jason Harvey and Lee Clayton were second on the team with nine tackles apiece.

Wheaton 39, Millikin 20 (Oct. 12, 2002)

On a day when it struggled on both sides of the ball, the Millikin football team lost its first game of the year on Homecoming, 39-20 to Wheaton College. The Big Blue jumped out to an early 17-0 lead, but could not hold the Thunder offense in the game. For the second straight week Millikin failed to score in the second half while giving up 13 points.

Donnell Brown connected with Michael Marker for a 66-yard touchdown pass on the second play to give Millikin the early 7-0 lead. Mike Kenders punched the ball in on Millikin's next drive to go up 14-0. Andy Beals hit a 32-yard field goal attempt to make it 17-0 early in the first quarter.

From there Wheaton scored 26 straight points to take a 26-17 lead. Beals hit another field goal from 28-yards just before the half to cut the lead to six 26-20.

Millikin had 321 yards of total offense on the day while giving up 540 to Wheaton. Brown was 14-of-26 for 157 yards and one touchdown. Lee McCoy led all rushers with 52 yards. Marker finished the day as the leading receiver with 80 yards on three catches and one touchdown.

On the defensive side, Jason Harvey recorded 10 tackles and one sack in the game. Matt Phillips and Eric Kramer each had nine apiece in the loss.

Millikin 37, Elmhurst 14 (Oct. 19, 2002)

Behind the three rushing touchdowns scored by Mike Kenders, the Millikin football team took care of Elmhurst, 37-14.

The Big Blue took the lead early in the game on a 10-yard touchdown pass from Donnell Brown to Ryan Corley. Kenders scored two of his three touchdowns in the first half, one on a run from two yards out and the second on a 3-yard run just before the half. Millikin tacked on a safety to take a 23-0 lead at the half.

Elmhurst opened the second half with 56-yard touchdown run to cut the lead to 23-8. But the Big Blue responded by grinding five minutes off the clock and topped off a 14-play, 56-yard drive with a 2-yard touchdown run by Kenders to take a 30-8 lead going into the fourth quarter.

The Bluejays put one more score on the board midway through the fourth quarter, but it was not enough as running back John Bell scored from 25 yards out with 19 seconds remaining in the game to seal the win.

Bell led the team with 118 yards on the ground on 20 carries. Jemelle Shepherd tallied 54 yards in the game as well. The Big Blue recorded 317 rushing yards as a team on 64 carries.

In the air, Brown was 7-of-19 for 137 yards and one touchdown. Ryan Miller led the receivers with two catches for 41 yards.

Jason Harvey finished the game with eight tackles and caused one fumble to lead the defense. Tim Blankenship had three tackles and two sacks in the win.

Augustana 41, Millikin 14 (Oct. 26, 2002)

Despite jumping out to a quick 7-0 lead, the Millikin football team dropped its game against CCIW foe Augustana, 41-14.

Ryan Corley got the Big Blue on the board with a 48-yard run mid-way through the first quarter. Augustana fired back with two scores of its own to take a 14-7 lead. John Bell scored on a 5-yard run to tie the game at 14-14 in the second quarter. The Vikings put it in the end zone one last time before the half to take a 21-14 lead into the locker room.

From that point on Augustana rang up 20 unanswered points, holding the Big Blue to just 35 yards of total offense in the second half. Bell led the team with 63 yards rushing on 12 carries and the one touchdown. He was also the team's leading receiver with 22 yards on four catches. Quarterback Donnell Brown finished the day 9-of-19 passing with two interceptions.

Defensively, Kevin Meehan led the team with 21 tackles on the day. Matt Phillips added 18 and Jason Harvey had 10.

2002 in review

Millikin 72, North Park 0 (Nov. 2, 2002)

The Millikin football team followed up its loss to Augustana with a 72-0 blanking of CCIW opponent North Park.

The Big Blue saw some changes in the starting lineup in its eighth game. Justin Stessman got the start at the quarterback position, going 4-of-5 for 106 yards and two touchdowns. He also ran five times for 57 yards and a touchdown.

With John Bell sidelined with a foot injury, the running duties were split among three sophomores. Lee McCoy led the trio on the day with 100 yards on 10 touches, scoring once on a 33-yard touchdown in the first quarter. Jay Graziano added 59 yards and a touchdown while Jemelle Shepherd had 29 yards on three carries.

Millikin used all seven of its quarterbacks in the contest, 12 running backs and three kickers. The Big Blue tallied 552 yards of total offense in the contest, while the defense gave up just 114. Eric Kramer led the team with eight tackles on the day. Brandon Bordner and James Whitelock added seven apiece and Matt Phillips had five.

Kicker Andy Beals surpassed head coach Doug Neibuhr's career record of 111 points after touchdown on his second kick of the day. Beals finished the game with 116 career points after touchdown.

North Central 24, Millikin 17 (Nov. 9, 2002)

Seventeen unanswered points and a turnover-free second half weren't enough to beat North Central. Five Big Blue first-half turnovers proved too costly as the Cardinals put points on the board on three of those five opportunities.

Justin Stessman got his second start at quarterback but was replaced by Donnell Brown midway through the second quarter. Neither found a way to get the offense going in the first half though, and heading into the locker rooms at the break Millikin had only 173 yards in addition to its five turnovers (3 fumbles and an interception each by Brown and Stessman).

After North Central scored on its first possession of the second half to take a 24-0 lead, Millikin got itself on the board on a 47-yard pass from Brown to Michael Marker. Andy Beals shortened the Cardinals lead to 24-10 on a career-best 50-yard field goal before Brown completed a 2-yard pass to Brandon Witte for a TD with 7:24 left in the game to bring the score to 24-17.

Millikin got one last chance when North Central attempted a 27-yard field goal that could have put the game out of reach. But the Cardinals missed and the Big Blue had the ball back with 1:37 remaining. Starting on its own 27-yard line, Millikin failed in its last drive of the game, using 12 plays but netting only 47 yards.

Individually, Brown led the rushing attack with nine carries for 57 yards. Jay Graziano also had 54 yards on 11 carries. On the receiving end, Mike Gardiner caught six passes for 98 yards and Marker had three receptions for 58 yards and one TD. In the passing department, Brown completed 23 of 42 passes with one interception for 265 yards with two TDs.

Overall, Millikin bettered North Central's total yardage 398 to 261 and accounted for 23 of the game's 34 first downs. North Central's rushing game stopped Millikin, 221 yards to 133 for the Big Blue while Millikin relied on its

passing game for 265 yards (40 for North Central). Penalties were also a factor in the game as the Big Blue gave up 87 yards on nine penalties.

Millikin 27, Illinois Wesleyan 23 (Nov. 16, 2002)

With a 20-0 halftime lead, Millikin was looking for an easy win over Illinois Wesleyan in the season finale for both teams. But things changed quickly. When the Big Blue fumbled the opening kickoff of the second half and the Titans put a 24-yard field goal on the scoreboard, the game began to take a twist. In the end, Millikin pulled off a dramatic finish, coming from behind to knock off Illinois Wesleyan, 27-23.

The Big Blue dominated the first half of the game, taking a 20-0 lead on two field goals from Andy Beals, a 1-yard run by Mike Kenders and a 21-yard TD reception from Donnell Brown to Ryan Miller. After two quarters of play, the Big Blue had an impressive 205 yards to Illinois Wesleyan's 46 and spent most of the first half in Illinois Wesleyan territory.

But penalties and turnovers kept Wesleyan in the game in the second half. After the initial fumble on the kickoff, Millikin fumbled three times in the second half. Already giving the Titans 143 yards on six first-half penalties, the Big Blue finished the game with 213 penalty yards and IWU took advantage going on a 23-0 run and taking a 23-20 lead on John Spellman's second touchdown of the day.

With 4:23 left in the game, Millikin started on its own 8-yard line after the return and went on a drive of its own. Needing to get within field goal range to tie it up, the Big Blue marched the ball downfield and scored on a 29-yard pass from Brown to Michael Marker. Beals' extra point made it a 4-point Millikin lead, with 2:05 left to play.

Starting at their own 32-yard line, the Titans took a clipping call and set itself back another 15 yards. With first-and-10 from its own 17, IWU found a receiver at the Titans 49 and completed two straight passes up to the Millikin 34 before Derek Stephens hauled down an interception at the Millikin 12.

With the ball on its own 22-yard line, Millikin ran down the clock before it had to punt the ball away. With time for one more play, IWU had the ball on its own 44-yard line, but the quarterback was dropped for a loss as the clock expired.

Jemelle Shepherd was the game's leading rusher with 89 yards on 16 carries and Lee McCoy recorded 40 yards on 7 carries. At quarterback, Brown completed 12 of 20 passes for 190 yards and two TDs with one interception. On the receiving end, Miller had four catches for 88 yards and one touchdown. Michael Marker had the team's only other TD reception, and finished with three catches for 72 yards.

Defensively, Matt Phillips and Lee Clayton led the team with 4.5 tackles. Phillips recorded one for loss while Clayton recorded an interception and broke up one pass. Overall, the Big Blue broke up eight passes and combined for six sacks for losses of 36 yards.





George Musso

Musso, a 1982 Hall of Fame inductee, played 12 seasons with the Bears (1933-44) and earned All-Pro honors at tackle and guard—the first player to be recognized at two positions. He served as Chicago's captain when the Bears were known as the "Monsters of the Midway."

Wagner, who played halfback and cornerback, was inducted into the CFL Hall of Fame in 1980 following a nine-year career (1946-54) with the Montreal Alouettes. He led the CFL in scoring his first four seasons, scored a league-record 79 career touchdowns and was a five-time all-league selection.

The most recent NFL signee was Eric Smith, a 1997 graduate. Smith, a two-time CCIW selection at tight end, signed a two-year free agent contract with the San Diego Chargers in May 1998.

Two more recent players, Mike Kohl and Joe Hyland, played in Europe during the spring and summer of 1998. Kohl

played quarterback for the Karlskoga Wolves in Sweden. Hyland played linebacker for Hamburg's (Germany) Blue Devils.

David Peabody, a 1994 graduate, also spent one year playing in Europe with the Noris Rams of Nurnberg, Germany. Peabody helped lead his team to a playoff berth and earned first-team All-Germany honors.

The first Millikin professional was Sid Gepford, who played with the Decatur

Staleys (which became the Chicago Bears in 1922) in 1919. A year later, Roy Adkins, Leo Johnson, F. "Jake" Lanum, Kile MacWherter and Randolph Young joined the Bears, while halfback George Corbett played for Chicago from 1932-38. Joe Carp played from 1926-29 and in 1933 with Frankfort, Pottsville, Boston and Philadelphia.

Jim Perryman, a 1983 graduate, played with the NFL's Buffalo Bills and Indianapolis Colts, and with the USFL's Pittsburgh Maulers.

Aric Anderson, a 1987 graduate, played with the Green Bay Packers during the players' strike and also played in the Arena Football League.

In 1989, wide receiver Jeff Query become the first Millikin player selected in the NFL draft. The Packers chose him in the fifth round.

Curt Reed, a 1989 graduate, played with the Albany Firebirds of the Arena Football League and 2000 graduate Bob Meyer played two seasons with the Arena League's Peoria Pirates.

The College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW) celebrates its 58th year this season. Millikin is one of the four charter members with uninterrupted membership.

In National Collegiate Athletic Association Division III competition, CCIW schools have won 33 NCAA titles in 27 years. The schools have won seven titles in men's basketball, one in women's basketball, 11 in men's cross country, four in football, four in men's swimming, one in men's soccer, two in men's outdoor track & field, one in men's indoor track & field and two in volleyball.

The original nine-member league was formed at a meeting in Jacksonville, III. on April 26, 1946, and began competition during the 1946-47 school year as the College Conference of Illinois. The name was changed in May 1967 to recognize the two Wisconsin schools, Carroll and Carthage. Charter members were Millikin, Augustana, Carthage (then located in Illinois), Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, North Central and Wheaton.

Carthage left in 1952 and returned in 1961, while Illinois College departed in 1953 and Lake Forest left in 1967. Wheaton left in 1959 and returned in 1967, and Elmhurst dropped out in 1960 only to return in 1967.

Carroll joined in 1955 and left in 1992 and North Park became a member in 1962.

Originally staging competition only for men, women's sports were added to the CCIW slate in 1986.





Griswold Center is perfect for the intercollegiate athlete or intramural player. The Center provides a gymnasium to seat 4,000, a running track and three regulation-size basketball courts. Millikin host several high school tournaments and games including the annual IHSA Class A Girls and Boys Supersectionals.

The men's and women's basketbal women's volleyball and men's wrestling teams also compete in Griswold Center's gym and its sixlane McIntosh Pool is home to the Big Blue men's and women's swim teams. The building also houses classrooms, staff offices, athletic training facilities and locker rooms.

Just north of Griswold Center, Millikin's track & field teams take

advantage of 1997 renovations that included an eight-lane, all-weather track. The USATF Youth Athletic Championships were held on the track in both 2000 and 2001 and Millikin also hosted the NCAA Division III Outdoor Track & Field Championships in 2001.

Several Big Blue teams make use of offcampus facilities. The men's and women's tennis teams play and practice at the

Fairview Park Tennis Complex, located just across the street from campus. The

men's and women's golf teams frequent the city's three golf courses while the Big Blue baseball program calls Sunnyside Park home. The softball team plays its home games at Borg-Warner Sports Complex while the cross country teams do most of their training at Fairview Park on the paved, grass and dirt trails that trace the historic


Interurban Railway. The trails lead through Kiwanis Park to the Macon County Conservation District Bikeway to the Rock Springs Environmental Center. The men's and women's soccer teams play their home schedule at Stephen Decatur Middle School and also make use of Fairview Park's spacious areas for practices.

Decatur Indoor Sports Center (DISC) at Millikin

Newly constructed in January 2000 in conjunction with the Decatur Park District, the DISC is a 87,000 square foot, on-campus athletic facility.

The DISC's new weight rooms are the perfect place for the serious athlete or amateur to work up a sweat. Upstairs facilities include

machine weights and cardiovascular equipment while the lower-level room provides an expanse of freeweights and dumbbells. The DISC also features a 200-meter indoor running track. For more information on the DISC, call 217,429,3472.
