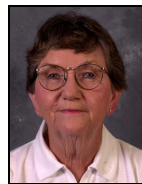

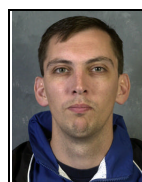

# head coach tim littrell

Tim Littrell, a 1977 graduate of Millikin University, enters his eighth season at the helm of the men's basketball program this season.

Littrell led the Big Blue to a 7-18 overall mark in the 2002-03 season when the team finished 2-12 in the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW). Under his leadership, the Big Blue have recorded a 77-98 record. Littrell's best season of his career came during the 1998-99 season when the Big Blue finished 17-8.



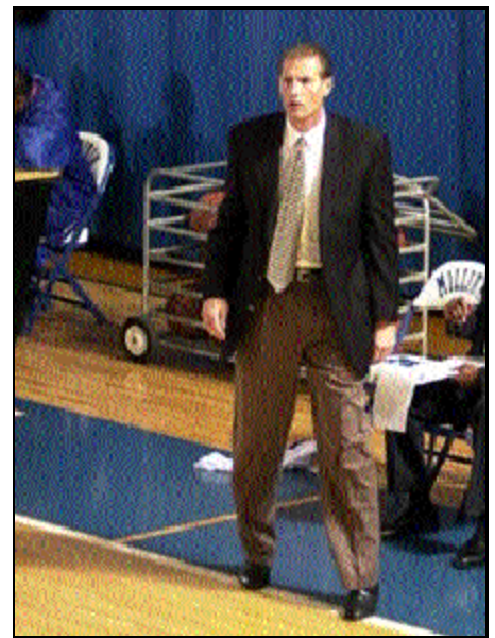
Prior to being named head coach, he served 18 years as an assistant coach for the Big Blue. He became a part-time assistant basketball coach at his alma mater in 1978 while teaching in the Mt. Zion school system. Littrell became a full-time staff member in 1981 and added the job of assistant football coach to his basketball duties.

A standout basketball player for the Big Blue, Littrell ranks 27th on Millikin's career scoring list with 1,071 points and 12th on the school's career rebounding list with 636. A two-year captain, he earned second-team All-CCIW and Big Blue Most Valuable Player honors his final two seasons and garnered college division All-State Special Mention as a senior. Littrell also lettered four times in baseball and once held Millikin season baseball records for most career games and most runs batted in.

Littrell earned a master's degree from Sangamon State in 1979. He is a member of Millikin's physical education faculty and was a 1988 inductee into the Millikin Athletic Hall of Fame. A Decatur native, Littrell is a graduate of Decatur's MacArthur High School where he was team captain and an All-Conference

selection in both basketball and baseball. He earned Honorable Mention All-State honors in basketball.

"This university and this community are very special to me. I have great respect for the Millikin tradition," says Littrell. "I knew



Ralph Allan, Don Williams, Jerry Gray and Joe Ramsey personally and I think it's very unusual for a coach to know his four immediate predecessors as he steps into this position. That gives me a special insight into the great basketball tradition here.

"I feel extremely fortunate to have the opportunity to coach at Millikin," says Littrell. "The position carries with it a great responsibility, and it's my job to carry on Millikin's great tradition."

Littrell is a member of the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association and National Association of Basketball Coaches. Littrell and his wife, Jenny, have two children: Ashley, 18, and Wes, 16.

# big blue assistant coaches



## **Jarrett Brown, Associate Head Coach**

Jarrett Brown returns to the Big Blue sidelines for his second season in 2003-04. A 1994 graduate of Eastern Illinois University, Brown came to Millikin from South Dakota State University where he served as a graduate assistant basketball coach.

Prior to his one year at South Dakota State, he served as boys head varsity basketball coach at Champaign's Centennial High School during 2000-01. He also served as boys head basketball coach at Unity High School in Tolono for two seasons (1998-99 and 1999-00) and at Chenoa High School for two seasons (1996-97, 1997-98).

As a high school coach, Brown recorded a 135-59 record in seven seasons (5 as head coach and 2 as an assistant), resulting in one state championship, two trips to the Elite Eight and two trips to the Sweet Sixteen. During his two seasons at Unity, Brown earned Illinois Basketball Coaches Association Region Coach of the Year honors. In addition to basketball, he also taught physical education and driver's education classes, served as head baseball coach and assistant football coach.

In addition to his Millikin coaching duties, Brown also teaches in the exercise science and sport program.



## **Bart Funneman**

Bart Funneman is a third-year assistant coach with Millikin. Funneman lettered four years for the Big Blue basketball team under former coach Joe Ramsey.

Funneman, who graduated from Millikin in 1979, has been teaching in the Central A&M school district for the past 22 years.

He was the assistant boys basketball coach for four years before becoming head coach, a position he held for 16 years and has assisted in football and is presently the Central A&M Middle School track coach.

Funneman recently received his master's degree in education from Eastern Illinois University. He is a graduate of Teutopolis High School. He started for the Wooden Shoes for three years and was named the team's MVP his junior and senior years. Funneman, who received All-State Special Mention his senior year, knows the importance of a great basketball tradition.

Funneman and his wife, Angie, live in Moweaqua and have two children, Tyler and Chelsey.

# 2003-04 cciw preseason poll



After finishing in a three way tie for first place a year ago, the Augustana Vikings are a clear-cut favorite in the 2003-04 College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin men's basketball race. The poll, which was conducted with the coaches in the league, showed Grey Giovanine's Vikings with a perfect score of seven first place votes for 49 points. Last year Augustana, Carthage and Illinois Wesleyan tied for the CCIW title as each team went 11-3 in league play. Illinois Wesleyan won the conference's automatic berth into the NCAA Division III tournament and won a pair of games to advance to the round of 16 before being eliminated.

Wheaton, which finished fourth last year with a mark of 9-5, was picked for second with 43 points and garnered the lone first place vote not going to Augustana.

Elmhurst, 6-8 in 2002-03, grabbed third place with 33 points while last year's other tri-champions: Carthage (31) and Illinois Wesleyan (29), were tabbed fourth and fifth. In sixth was North Central with 18 points while Millikin was seventh with 11 and North Park picked for eighth with 10.

The coaches in the league could not vote for their own teams.

# looking at 2003-04

After finishing the 2002-03 season with a 7-18 overall record and a 2-12 record in College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW), the 2003-04 Big Blue men's basketball team is looking to move up in the league standings after tying for seventh last year.

With four seniors and two juniors with considerable minutes returning, head coach Tim Littrell should put a talented group on the floor and have plenty of depth off the bench.

Littrell and the Big Blue lose only two players this season, but both were solid contributors. Graduate Tim Tolle (12.1 ppg, 5.7 rpg) was an all-around threat, despite missing a significant portion of the season with an injury. Also missing from the lineup will be Brett Williams (5.8 ppg, 5.1 rpg), who finished the season as a strong presence in the post.



But Littrell's returners bring a lot of experience to the floor. The Big Blue should get plenty of minutes and strong leadership from its four capable seniors - Kevin Causley (6.4 ppg, 5.2 rpg), Rob Klemm, Arian Rios (6.5 ppg, 3.6 rpg) and Phil Schneider (11.5 ppg, 5.0 rpg). Junior guards Chuck Williams (10.8 ppg, 2.9 rpg) and Jason Fisher (12.2 ppg, 2.3 rpg) also return.

Williams and Fisher have spent more time on the floor than most college juniors and with Rios also returning at guard, Littrell returns a very confident group of ball handlers and good perimeter shooting threats. The guards' experience against quality competition and composure under pressure will be a key component to the team's success, and the outside shooting threat will help open up the Big Blue's offense.

Schneider returns in the post after playing the majority of last season with a knee injury while Klemm returns after missing his junior season to study abroad.

"Phil will be a key contributor. His being healthy will allow him to do what he couldn't do last year and with Klemm's size, his body allows him to do some things that other athletes just can't do," Littrell said.

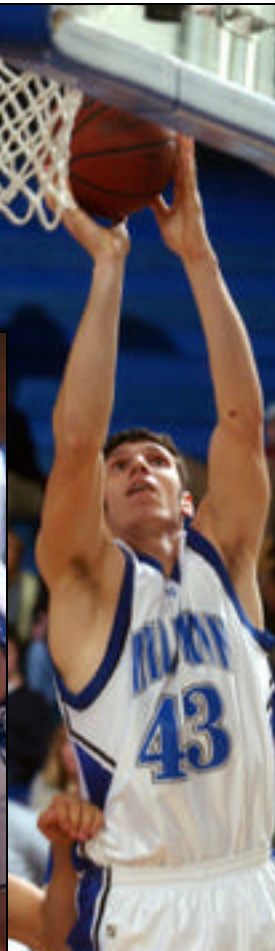
Several other players also return after seeing time a year ago including junior Adam Russell (1.2 ppg, 1.1 rpg) and sophomores Reid Jones (4.0 ppg, 1.6 rpg), Lance Brooks (5.0 ppg, 2.8 rpg) and David Winikates (1.1 ppg, 1.0 rpg).

A handful of freshmen could also filter into the mix in forwards Korte Long and Mike Gavic and guard Bryon Graven. Littrell describes Long and Gavic as "very physical, strong freshmen" and Graven "really understands the game-he's a quick learner and makes quick decisions under pressure."

Long joins the Big Blue after helping his high school team to a third-place finish in the Class A State Tournament, earning IBCA All-State third team honors and averaging 16.7 ppg. Gavic averaged a double-double (15.9 ppg, 11.1 rpg) as a senior and Graven earned All-State first team honors after averaging 20.4 ppg.

While he expects his offense to put plenty of points on the board, how the defense responds will be crucial to the outcome of the games. With plenty of talent back and a solid group of freshmen, the Big Blue just has to put all the pieces together. And playing against the top teams in one of the best basketball conferences in the country can only help strengthen Littrell's squad.

"The CCIW is one of the best leagues in the country for basketball in terms of NCAA appearances and tournament finishes. We know the level of competition and how tough the games are day in and day out," Littrell said. "One of the perks of being in this league is that you know every night you're playing one of the best Division III teams in the country."

# griswold physical education center

Griswold Physical Education Center has been the home of Millikin University basketball since the 1970-71 season. The Big Blue men christened the new facility with a 108-77 victory over Grinnell on Dec. 1, 1970. The men also won the basketball program's 1,000th game at Griswold Center, a 67-54 victory over North Central on Jan. 11, 1995.

Three regulation-size basketball courts are located in the fieldhouse portion of the building, which is 114 by 192 feet. The original Tartan surface was replaced by a maple floor in 1989. Seating for 4,080 spectators is available on motor-driven retractable bleachers.

Griswold Center also houses a six-lane swimming pool, classrooms, offices, dressing rooms and a training room. The building is named to recognize the gift of Mr. and Mrs. John C. Griswold. Mr. Griswold was a member of the class of 1923 and a former University trustee.



## coaches vs. cancer program

In 1993, the National Association of Basketball Coaches formed a partnership with the American Cancer Society to aid the funding of cancer research and increase awareness of cancer prevention among the fans of college basketball. In 1995, the Women's Basketball Coaches Association joined the team and this two seasons ago IKON Office Solutions became a national sponsor with a three-year, two-million dollar commitment.

Millikin head women's basketball coach Lori Kerans was diagnosed with breast cancer six years ago. She was contacted about getting involved in the program and said she had no indecision to take part.

"Both our men's and women's basketball teams will take part in the program," Kerans said. "We believe we're one of the first Division III institution in the nation to be participating with both men's and women's basketball in Coaches vs. Cancer throughout the entire season."

Millikin raised over \$10,000 during its first year in 1998-99 and over \$7,000 last season.

Kerans said there are three things the program focuses on: research, patient services and prevention programs.

"At Millikin, we are focusing most of our attention on the education aspect of cancer," Kerans said. "We want to make ourselves available to any setting: a church group, a

school, anywhere we can bring a message about cancer. We don't want to overwhelm people, but just say to them that cancer can be treated as any other opponent or challenge."

"Participating college coaches partner with the American Cancer Society, local business, organizations and individual to raise money for each made three-point field goal," Kerans said. "All proceeds benefit the local and state ACS chapters. More than 400 men's and women's college coaches are participating nationwide and to date have raised over \$16 million."

The Coaches vs. Cancer Challenge competition will be held on Jan. 17 at 4 p.m. in Griswold Center. Teams of five will attempt 3-point shots for one minute. Corporate teams can enter for \$500, student groups (youth, high school, college) can enter for \$100. Teams will receive T-shirts, recognition in Millikin basketball game programs, the opportunity to hang banners in Griswold Center during the Coaches vs. Cancer Challenge and post-competition coupons for Lock, Stock & Barrel.

# cciw history

The College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW) celebrates its 58th year this season. Millikin is one of the four charter members with uninterrupted membership.

In National Collegiate Athletic Association Division III competition, CCIW schools have won 33 NCAA titles in 27 years. The schools have won seven titles in men's basketball, one in women's basketball, 11 in men's cross country, four in football, four in men's swimming, one in men's soccer, two in men's outdoor track & field, one in men's indoor track & field and two in volleyball.

The original nine-member league was formed at a meeting in Jacksonville, Ill. on April 26, 1946, and began competition during the 1946-47 school year as the College Conference of Illinois. The name was changed in May 1967 to recognize the two Wisconsin schools, Carroll and Carthage. Charter members were Millikin, Augustana, Carthage (then located in Illinois), Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, North Central and Wheaton.

Carthage left in 1952 and returned in 1961, while Illinois College departed in 1953 and Lake Forest left in 1967. Wheaton left in 1959 and returned in 1967, and Elmhurst dropped out in 1960 only to return in 1967. Carroll joined in 1955 and left in 1992 and North Park became a member in 1962.

Originally staging competition only for men, women's sports were added to the CCIW slate in 1986.

## Griswold Physical Education Center

Griswold Center is perfect for the intercollegiate athlete or intramural player. The Center provides a gymnasium to seat 4,000, a running track and three regulation-size basketball courts. Millikin hosts several high school tournaments and games including the annual IHSA Class A Girls and Boys Supersectionals.

The men's and women's basketball, women's volleyball and men's wrestling teams also compete in Griswold Center's gym and its six-lane McIntosh Pool is home to the Big Blue men's and women's swim teams. The building also houses classrooms, staff offices, athletic training facilities and locker rooms.



Just north of Griswold Center, Millikin's track & field teams take advantage of 1997 renovations that included an eight-lane, all-weather track. The USATF Youth Athletic Championships were held on the track in both 2000 and 2001 and Millikin also hosted the NCAA Division III Outdoor Track & Field Championships in 2001.

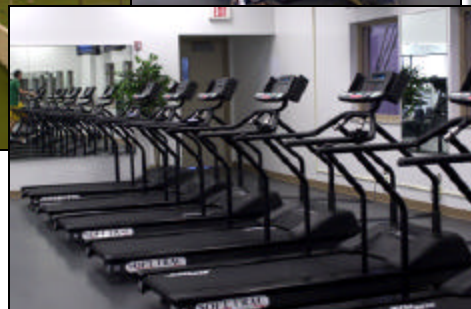
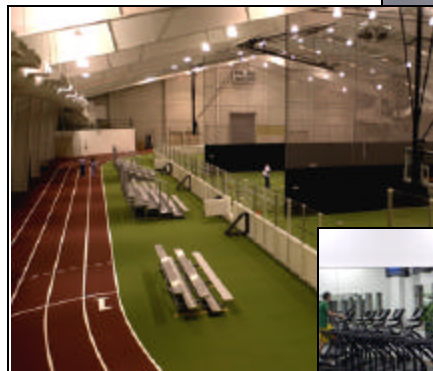
Several Big Blue teams make use of off-campus facilities. The men's and women's tennis teams play and practice at the

Fairview Park Tennis Complex, located just across the street from campus. The men's and women's golf teams frequent the city's three golf courses while the Big Blue baseball program calls Sunnyside Park home. The softball team plays its home games at Borg-Warner Sports Complex while the cross country teams do most of their training at Fairview Park on the paved, grass and dirt trails that trace the historic Interurban Railway. The trails lead through Kiwanis Park to the Macon County Conservation District Bikeway to the Rock Springs Environmental Center. The men's and women's soccer teams play their home schedule at Stephen Decatur Middle School and also make use of Fairview Park's spacious areas for practices.

## Decatur Indoor Sports Center (DISC) at Millikin

Newly constructed in January 2000 in conjunction with the Decatur Park District, the DISC is a 87,000 square foot, on-campus athletic facility.

The DISC's new weight rooms are the perfect place for the serious athlete or amateur to work up a sweat. Upstairs facilities include machine weights and cardiovascular equipment while the lower-level room provides an expanse of free-weights and dumbbells.
