head coach tim littrell

Tim Littrell, a 1977 graduate of Millikin University, enters his 10th season at the helm of the men's basketball program in 2005-06.

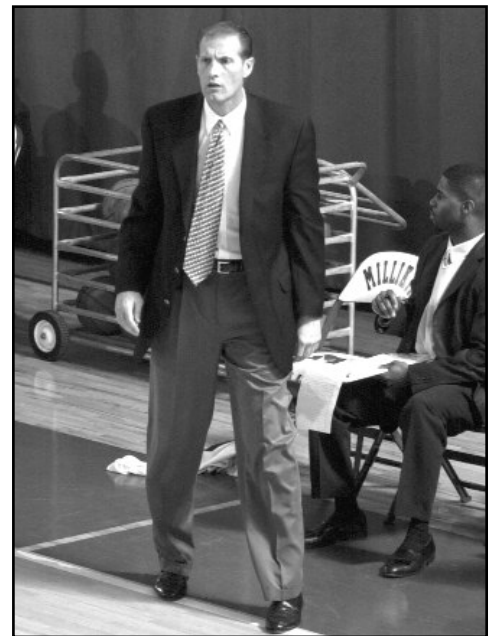
Littrell led the Big Blue to a 12-13 overall mark in the 2004-05 season when the team finished 4-10 in the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW). Under his leadership, the Big Blue has recorded a 103-122 record. Littrell's best season of his career came during the 1998-99 season when the Big Blue finished 17-8.

Prior to being named head coach, Littrell served 18 years as an assistant coach for the Big Blue. He became a part-time assistant basketball coach at his alma mater in 1978 while teaching in the Mt. Zion school system. Littrell became a full-time staff member in 1981 and added the job of assistant football coach to his basketball duties.

A standout basketball player for the Big Blue, Littrell ranks 29th on Millikin's career scoring list with 1,071 points and 12th on the school's career rebounding list with 636. A two-year captain, he earned second-team All-CCIW and Big Blue Most Valuable Player honors his final two seasons and garnered college division All-State Special Mention as a senior. Littrell also lettered four times in baseball and once held Millikin season baseball records for most career games and most runs batted in.

Littrell earned a master's degree from Sangamon State in 1979. He is a member of Millikin's physical education faculty and was a 1988 inductee into the

Millikin Athletic Hall of Fame. A Decatur native, Littrell is a graduate of Decatur's MacArthur High School where he was team captain and an All-Conference selection in both basketball and baseball. He earned Honorable Mention All-State honors in basketball.



"This university and this community are very special to me. I have great respect for the Millikin tradition," says Littrell. "I knew Ralph Allan, Don Williams, Jerry Gray and Joe Ramsey personally and I think it's very unusual for a coach to know his four immediate predecessors as he steps into this position. That gives me a special insight into the great basketball tradition here.

"I feel extremely fortunate to have the opportunity to coach at Millikin," says Littrell. "The position carries with it a great responsibility, and it's my job to carry on Millikin's great tradition."

Littrell is a member of the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association and National Association of Basketball Coaches. Littrell and his wife, Jenny, have two children: Ashley and Wes.

Todd Creal returns for his second season with the Big Blue in 2005-06. A 1998 graduate of Illinois College, Creal came to Millikin from Illinois College where he served as the assistant coach for the Blueboys basketball team. Prior to his return to Illinois College, Creal

spent two years as an assistant at Augustana College (Ill.) and was a part of the staff in 2002-03 when the team went 20-5 and won a conference title. In addition to his basketball coaching duties at Augustana, Creal was also the head coach of the men's and women's tennis programs.

After his graduation from Illinois College in 1998, Creal spent three seasons on the Illinois College sidelines as an assistant coach and was the head coach of both the men's and women's soccer programs. He later went on to earn his masters degree from Western Illinois University in December 2001. He enjoyed an outstanding playing career on the basketball court for the Blueboys and served as the team captain in 1996-97. He has also been active in West Central Illinois Special Olympics.

In addition to his coaching duties at Millikin, Creal teaches in Millikin's Exercise Science and & Sport program.



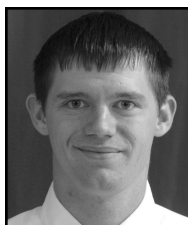
Zach Binkley, Student Assistant

looking at 2005-06

With four-year starters and 1,000-point career scorers Jason Fisher and Chuck Williams, and starter Adam Russell lost to graduation, Millikin University's men's basketball team will certainly feature a new backcourt look in 2005-06. But the front court returns nearly in tact and head coach Tim Littrell and the Big Blue have high expectations for a young group with plenty of depth and talent.

Millikin welcomes back two starters in senior Lance Brooks and junior Korte Long, as well as all of last season's reserves. Senior Reid Jones is expected to move into a starting guard spot and returning guard/forward Mike Gavic and forwards Tyler Nohren, Matt Nohren and Doug Goldstein will all play significant roles in what Littrell hopes will be a balanced offensive attack.

"Our biggest concern this season will be replacing 47 percent of the points we got out of our three graduating players last year. Those are a lot of points to replace at once, but with our depth, we'll play more people at the guard position this year," Littrell said. "No single person will average 16, 17, 18 points a game, but we're hoping we'll approach those kinds of numbers with several players sharing in the scoring."

This year's version of the Big Blue is looking to improve on last season's 12-13 record, despite the loss of the team's top two scorers.

Brooks averaged 5.1 points and 2.6 rebounds in the 24 games he played as a junior. Long, who missed the last six games of the season with an injury, returns after leading Millikin in rebounding. He averaged 20.2 minutes in his 19 games, scoring 8.1 points and grabbing 5.5 rebounds per contest while shooting .541 from the field. Gavic was consistent for the Big Blue all year, seeing time in each of the 25 games with 5.4 points and 3.9 rebounds per game. While he spent most of 2004-05 as a forward, Gavic is expected to share time at both the guard and forward spots this season.

Also back in the front court are sophomore twins Tyler and Matt Nohren and senior Doug Goldstein. Tyler Nohren played in 17 games with one start and averaged 10.7 minutes on the floor per game to go with his 3.3 rebounds and 3.8 points with a .684 field goal percentage. Matt averaged 6.5 minutes per game as a freshman, appearing in 13 games. Goldstein played in nine games as a junior for the Big Blue.

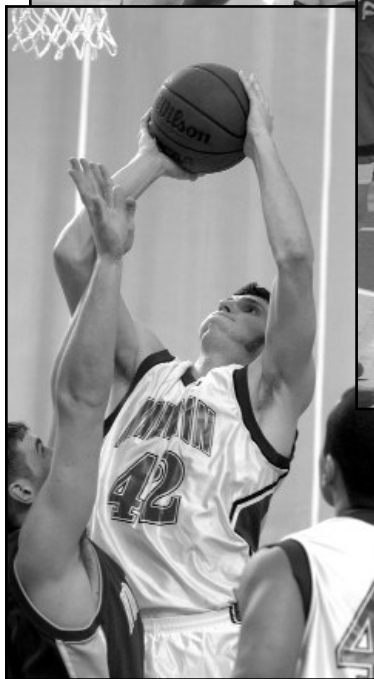
In the back court, Jones returns with the most guard time of the returners. In 2004-05, he started five of the 25 games he played with 3.3 points per game and 19 assists and is expected to lead a young group of guards.

Looking to join Jones will be juniors Robbie Kaiser and Bryon Graven. Graven played in all 25 games a season ago with one start and averaged 16.2 minutes per game and 4.6 ppg. Kaiser played in 22 contests. Sophomore Keanon Harrington, who saw limited action a year ago, could also see more time this season.

Littrell's recruiting class is solid top to bottom, led by freshmen guards Drew Gensler, John Harmsen, Mitch Ade and guard/forward Ray Kissing. All could see some time this year.

"I think more than anything, this freshman class is a great shooting group and collectively probably shoots the ball better than any team we've had in the last decade," Littrell said of his 12 incoming freshmen players. "In the long run, our depth will have to include some freshmen for us to be as deep as we want to be."

The Big Blue kicks off its season on Nov. 18 when it hosts MacMurray.



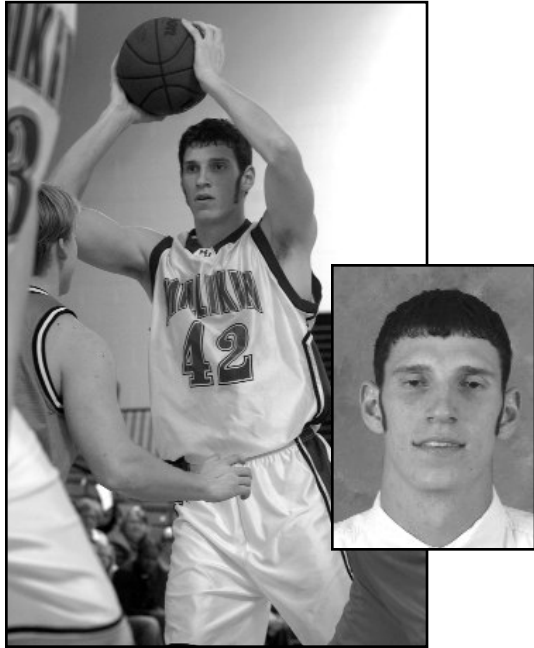

griswold physical education center



Griswold Physical Education Center has been the home of Millikin University basketball since the 1970-71 season. The Big Blue men christened the new facility with a 108-77 victory over Grinnell on Dec. 1, 1970. The men also won the basketball program's 1,000th game at Griswold Center, a 67-54 victory over North Central on Jan. 11, 1995.

Three regulation-size basketball courts are located in the fieldhouse portion of the building, which is 114 by 192 feet. The original Tartan surface was replaced by a maple floor in 1989. Seating for 3,052 spectators is available in Griswold Center. In the summer of 2004, new bleachers were installed on the building's west side. In addition to traditional bleacher seating, fold-down style chairs are also part of the new bleacher design. And during the summer of 2005, new scoreboards were added thanks to a gift from Dyke ('68) and Sue Hawk ('69) Ridgley.

Griswold Center also houses a six-lane swimming pool, classrooms, offices, locker rooms and a training room. The building is named to recognize the gift of Mr. and Mrs. John C. Griswold. Mr. Griswold was a member of the class of 1923 and a former University trustee.

cciw history

The College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW) celebrates its 60th year this season. Millikin is one of the four charter members with uninterrupted membership.

In National Collegiate Athletic Association Division III competition, CCIW schools have won 31 NCAA titles in 59 years. The schools have won seven titles in men's basketball, two in women's basketball, 11 in men's cross country, four in football, four in men's swimming, one each in men's and women's soccer, two in men's outdoor track & field, one in men's indoor track & field and two in volleyball.

The original nine-member league was formed at a meeting in Jacksonville, Ill. on April 26, 1946, and began competition during the 1946-47 school year as the College Conference of Illinois. The name was changed in May 1967 to recognize the two Wisconsin schools, Carroll and Carthage. Charter members were Millikin, Augustana, Carthage (then located in Illinois), Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, North Central and Wheaton.

Carthage left in 1952 and returned in 1961, while Illinois College departed in 1953 and Lake Forest left in 1967. Wheaton left in 1959 and returned in 1967, and Elmhurst dropped out in 1960 only to return in 1967. Carroll joined in 1955 and left in 1992 and North Park became a member in 1962.

Originally staging competition only for men, women's sports were added to the CCIW slate in 1986.

Griswold Physical Education Center

Griswold Center is perfect for the intercollegiate athlete or intramural player. The Center provides a gymnasium to seat 3,052, a running track and three regulation-size basketball courts. Millikin hosts several high school tournaments and games including the annual IHSA Class A Girls and Boys Supersectionals. Recent renovations include new bleachers on the west side, a fresh coat of paint, a new gym floor design and new scoreboards.

The men's and women's basketball, women's volleyball and men's wrestling teams also compete in Griswold Center's gym and its six-lane McIntosh Pool is home to the Big Blue men's and women's swim teams. The building also houses classrooms, staff offices, athletic training facilities and locker rooms.

Just north of Griswold Center, Millikin's track & field teams take advantage of 1997 renovations that included an eight-lane, all-weather track. The USATF Youth Athletic Championships were held on the track in both 2000 and 2001 and Millikin also hosted the NCAA Division III Outdoor Track & Field Championships in 2001.

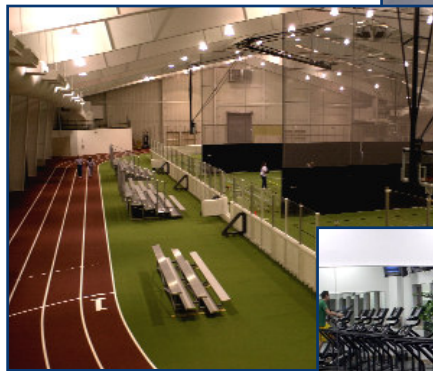


Several Big Blue teams make use of off-campus facilities. The men's and women's tennis teams play and practice at the Fairview Park Tennis Complex, located just across the street from campus. The men's and women's golf teams frequent the city's three golf courses while the Big Blue baseball program calls Sunnyside Park home. The softball team plays its home games at Borg-Warner Sports Complex while the cross country teams do most of their training at Fairview Park on the paved, grass and dirt trails that trace the historic Interurban Railway. The trails lead through Kiwanis Park to the Macon County Conservation District Bikeway to the Rock Springs Environmental Center.

Decatur Indoor Sports Center (DISC) at Millikin

Constructed in January 2000 in conjunction with the Decatur Park District, the DISC is a 87,000 square foot, on-campus athletic facility.

The DISC's new weight rooms are the perfect place for the serious athlete or amateur to work up a sweat. Upstairs facilities include machine weights, cardiovascular equipment and indoor golf facilities while the lower-level room provides an expanse of free-weights and dumbbells. 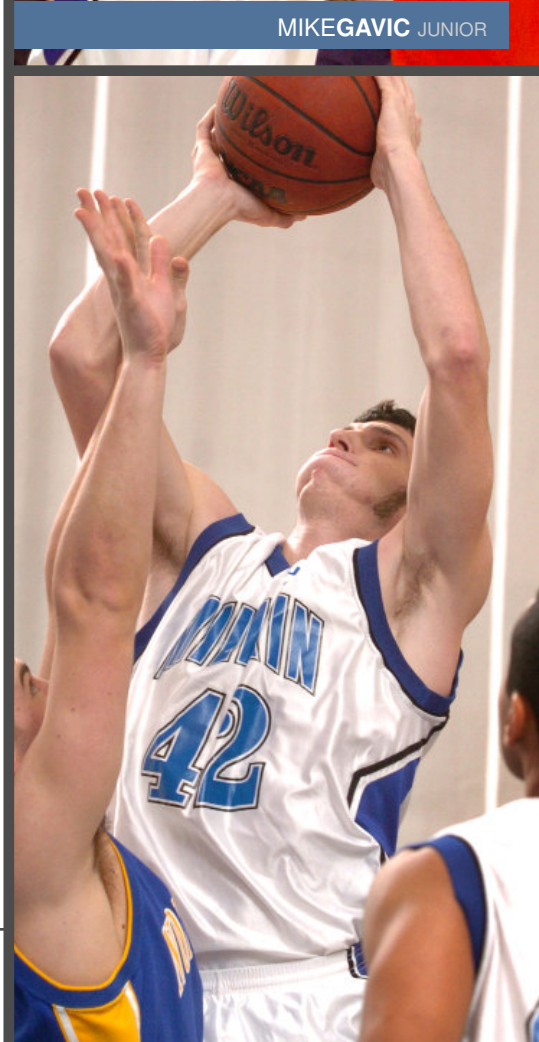
