HEAD COACH

MARC SMITH



Marc Smith, a native of Springfield (Ill.), returns to Millikin after five years as the head coach at Keystone College in La Plume, Penn. Prior to his years at Keystone, Smith served as an assistant coach for Millikin's Big Blue (1998 to 2002) and has also held assistant coaching positions at Mount Union College (Ohio), Martin Methodist College (Tenn.) and Ashland University (Ohio).

At Keystone, Smith's teams posted an 88-50 record while transitioning the program to NCAA Division III. His best record as a head coach came in 2003-04 when the team finished 24-4 with a North Eastern Athletic Conference (NEAC) conference and tournament championship. His 2004-05 squad followed up with back-to-back conference and tournament championships (22-7) but for the second year in a row was unable to advance into the NCAA Tournament due to the rules of its transition.

In addition to his coaching duties at Keystone, Smith also served as the Associate Athletic Director (2005-07) and an academic advisor and faculty member (2002-05). As the Associate Athletic Director, he was responsible for several different areas, including scheduling athletic events, fundraising, training and education programs for the athletic staff and



developing alumni and parent programs.

As a college player, Smith was the 1990 and 1991 Defensive Player of the Year at Black Hawk Community College. During his two years there, he was also a team captain (1990), Coaches Award recipient (1990), Most Valuable Player (1991), first-team all-conference (1991) and NJCAA all-region (1991). He capped his career with two years at



Lincoln Memorial where he was again named the team's Defensive Player of the Year (1992, 1993), a team captain (1992) and winner of the Frank B. Turner Award (1993).

Smith is believed to be the first African American full-time head men's basketball coach in Millikin history and one of a small number of African American head coaches in the history of the CCIW.

Smith earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Business Management from Lincoln Memorial University (Tenn.) in 1993 and completed his Masters of Education degree in Sport Science at Ashland University in 1996. He is a 1987 graduate of Springfield Lanphier High School.

Smith and his wife, Faith, live in Decatur with their children Marc, Jr. and Kaileigh.

GRISWOLD CENTER

Griswold Physical Education Center has been the home of Millikin University basketball since the 1970-71 season. The Big Blue men christened the new facility with a 108-77 victory over Grinnell on Dec. 1, 1970. The men also won the basketball program's 1,000th game at Griswold Center, a 67-54 victory over North Central on Jan. 11, 1995.

Three regulation-size basketball courts are located in the fieldhouse portion of the building, which is 114 by 192 feet. The original Tartan surface was replaced by a maple floor in 1989. Seating for 3,052 spectators is available in Griswold Center. In the summer of 2004, new bleachers were installed on the building's west side. In addition to traditional bleacher seating, fold-down style chairs are also part of the new bleacher design. And during the summer of 2005, new scoreboards were added thanks to a gift from Dyke ('68) and Sue Hawk ('69) Ridgley.

Griswold Center also houses a six-lane swimming pool, classrooms, offices, locker rooms and a training room. The building is named to recognize the gift of Mr. and Mrs. John C. Griswold. Mr. Griswold was a member of the class of 1923 and a former University trustee.



BIG BLUE ASSISTANT COACH



**Enzley Mitchell,
Assistant Coach**

Former professional player Enzley Mitchell joined the Big Blue as the new assistant men's basketball coach in September 2007. Mitchell has considerable basketball background including experience at NCAA Divisions I and III, NAIA and in the professional arena. At

Millikin, Mitchell will focus on developing the Big Blue's post game and recruiting new athletes.

Prior to joining the Millikin staff, Mitchell served as an assistant for IUPUI in Indianapolis in 2006-07 after being promoted from his position as the team's Director of Operations. He has also been an assistant coach at Wilberforce University (2005-06) and Earlham College (2004-05). In addition to his coaching duties at IUPUI, Mitchell also held a sales position with Comcast.

Mitchell began his professional playing and coaching career in Europe. As a player he played and toured on teams in Spain, France and the U.K. During the 1994-95 season Mitchell averaged 23 ppg, 11ppg and 5bpg playing for the Cardiff Clippers in

the English National League. In 2001 he participated in the World-basketball Summer Pro league in Aranda De Duero, Spain.

As the head coach of the Swansea Basketball Club, a professional team in Swansea, Wales, Mitchell led the team to a 20-5 record and a semi-final appearance in the Premier League during the 1995-96 season. The team won just one game in 1994-95.

As a college athlete and four-year letter winner at Spring Arbor University (Mich.), Mitchell was a two-time All-WHAC first-team selection and the league's Defensive Player of the Year in 1993-94. He still holds the Spring Arbor record for career blocked shots (227) after leading the team in that category for three seasons. He is also No. 11 in Spring Arbor career rebounding (618) and scored nearly 1,000 points in his career. As a senior Mitchell helped lead the cougars to a 21-13 record averaging 18 points and 10 rebounds per game.

Mitchell earned his bachelor's degree in Business Administration from Spring Arbor in 1994. He received a master's degree Recreation and Sport Management from Indiana State University in 2005.

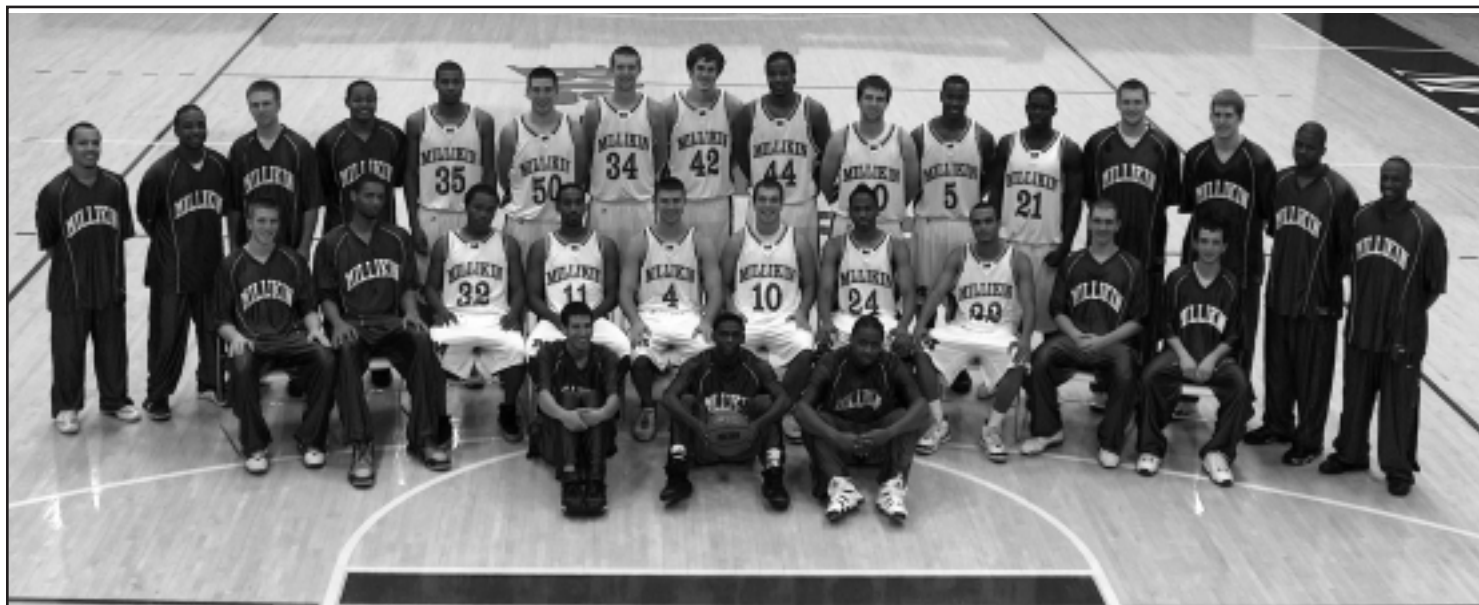

LOOKING AT 2007-08

A new era of Big Blue basketball begins at Millikin University in 2007-08 as Marc Smith takes the helm of the program. A former Big Blue assistant coach, Smith returns to the Big Blue after a successful five-year stint at Keystone College (Pa.).

There will be more to the new-look Big Blue than just a head coach though. Former professional player Enzley Mitchell joins the staff in an assistant role and together the two will work to put Millikin back on the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW) map.

The new coaching duo inherits a young group of players that include just one senior and six returning letter winners. But Smith and Mitchell don't necessarily see that as a cause for concern – for Millikin it means there is plenty of raw talent to work with. And already Smith is excited by the work ethic of his team and the number of players who want to be a part of the program. Smith is also excited by the number of players he has that can play multiple positions. In his mind the potential is great – “We're going to get better, but the question is with whom?”

Numbers are on Smith's side and he's confident that his players' continued development will ultimately lead to a deep bench this season. That's not to say that the Big Blue doesn't return any experienced players.

The bulk of Smith's returners come in sophomore post-players Joscar Demby, Robert Rexroade and Zach Ott. Because of the playing time they received last season, expectations for the trio will be high. In order for the group to improve, Smith said they will have to overcome last season's inconsistent scoring and make their presence known in the paint.

Demby's solid 6-7 frame is well suited for the CCIW, and he showed glimpses of his capabilities during his freshman season when he earned 16 starts. Demby averaged 6.9 ppg while shooting .504 from the field with individual game highs of 15 points, seven rebounds and three blocks.

Ott's contributions a year ago included 7.9 ppg and 2.4 rpg and Smith sees bigger numbers for his sophomore season. Ott shot .500 from the field and nearly .450 from 3-point range a year ago as well as proving himself as one of the Big Blue's most consistent free throw shooters.

Rexroade also saw considerable playing time as a freshman and with a full year of CCIW competition under his belt, his game will continue to mature and evolve. Rexroade is looking to improve on a 6.0 ppg scoring average and 2.8 rpg from his first year.

In addition to scoring in the paint, another of Smith's priorities will be to mobilize a 3-point scoring attack and for that he will rely on senior Keanon Harrington, junior John Harmsen and sophomore Charles Warren.

Harrington returns after playing in 24 games a year ago when he averaged 3.8 ppg and 3.1 rpg. The most experienced of the returners, Harrington will rely on his 54 career appearances to lead the young Big Blue in his final season. In his career, Harrington is averaging 3.9 ppg and 2.9 rpg while shooting .386 from the field.

Harmsen has played off the bench for the Big Blue in his first two seasons. In 2006-07, he logged time in nine games while shooting better than .400 from both the field and behind the 3-point line. The junior varsity's Most Valuable Player in his sophomore season, Harmsen could have a break-out year and a big part of Millikin's offense in 2007-08.

Warren's minutes improved as his freshman season went on and Smith sees the potential he can bring to the team in his sophomore year. A 3-point threat, Warren also frustrated opponents on defense. As a freshman, he averaged 4.3 ppg and 1.8 rpg with 14 steals while shooting .417 from the field.

Smith also has a group of newcomers who will add plenty of valuable depth. Several have shown the ability that they could contribute early, including junior transfer Tunde Ogunleye, freshman Darrell Adams and sophomore Bob Burton.

Burton played primarily on the Big Blue's junior varsity squad as a freshman, with time in five varsity games, but was impressive at the JV level. He's been strong in the preseason as well and could be in line for some early playing time.

Ogunleye may have the biggest advantage of the newcomers. After transferring from Keystone College, Ogunleye is already familiar with Smith's system after two years in his program with the Giants. At 6-7, Adams adds another big body in the post and provides additional depth in the paint. Another freshman who has been impressing coaches in the preseason is 5-10 guard Boston Flemming.

One thing Smith says his newcomers have in common is “a passion for basketball and a desire to work to improve their skills.” If their preseason was any indication, Smith should be able to count on them to have a major impact on the program.

For Big Blue fans, Smith promises enthusiasm, a competitive, defensive-minded approach and a fast-paced game on both ends of the floor. Millikin kicks off its 2007-08 season on Nov. 19 at Blackburn College.

CCIW HISTORY

The College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW) celebrates its 62nd year in 2007-08. Millikin is one of the four charter members with uninterrupted membership.

In National Collegiate Athletic Association Division III competition, CCIW schools have won 32 titles in 61 years of league competition. The schools have won seven titles in men's basketball, two in women's basketball, 11 in men's cross country, four in football, four in men's swimming, one in men's soccer, two in women's soccer, two in men's outdoor track & field, one in men's indoor track & field and two in volleyball.

The original nine-member league was formed at a meeting in Jacksonville, Ill. on April 26, 1946, and began competition during the 1946-47 school year as the College Conference of Illinois. The name was changed in May 1967 to recognize the two Wisconsin schools, Carroll and Carthage. Charter members were Millikin, Augustana, Carthage (then located in Illinois), Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, North Central and Wheaton.

Carthage left in 1952 and returned in 1961, while Illinois College departed in 1953 and Lake Forest left in 1967. Wheaton

left in 1959 and returned in 1967, and Elmhurst dropped out in 1960 only to return in 1967. Carroll joined in 1955 and left in 1992 and North Park became a member in 1962.

Originally staging competition only for men, women's sports were added to the CCIW slate in 1986.

BIG BLUE ATHLETIC FACILITIES

Griswold Physical Education Center

Griswold Center and its surrounding facilities are perfect for the intercollegiate athlete or intramural player. Griswold Center houses a 3,052-seat gymnasium and three regulation-size courts. Millikin hosts several high school tournaments and games each year including the annual IHSA Class A Girls Super-Sectionals.

The men's and women's basketball, women's volleyball and men's wrestling teams also compete in Griswold Center's gym and its six-lane McIntosh Pool is home to the Big Blue men's and women's swim teams. The building also houses classrooms, Exercise Science Dept. offices, athletic training facilities and locker rooms. Recent renovations to the gym include new bleachers on the west side, a fresh coat of paint, a new gym floor design and new scoreboards.

Frank M. Lindsay Field

Just north of Griswold Center, Millikin's track & field teams take advantage of 1997 renovations to the Frank M. Lindsay Track & Field complex that included an eight-lane, all-weather track. The USATF Youth Athletic Championships were held on the track in both 2000 and 2001 and Millikin also hosted the NCAA Division III Outdoor Track & Field Championships in 2001 and 2004. In addition to the track & field teams, the football team calls Lindsay Field home as well. One of two natural grass surfaces remaining in the CCW, the Lindsay Field complex has also undergone recent renovations including the addition of a state-of-the-art press box, new scoreboards and a new sound system.

Soccer Facility

To the south, behind the DISC (see below), is the home of the Big Blue soccer teams. Play began at the complex in 2003 and the fields have seen continued improvements. In Summer 2006, the soccer facility underwent renovations that included covered dugouts, landscaping, an irrigation system and a practice field that will be ready in Fall '07.

Off-Campus Practice and Competition Sites

Several Big Blue teams make use of off-campus facilities. The women's tennis team plays and practices at the Fairview Park Tennis Complex, located just across the street from campus. The men's and women's golf teams frequent the city's four public golf courses while the Big Blue baseball program calls Sunnyside Park home. The softball team plays its home games at Rotary Park. While the cross country teams host home meets at the Hickory Point Golf Course, most of their training is done at Fairview Park on the paved, grass and dirt trails that trace the historic Interurban Railway. The trails lead through Kiwanis Park to the Macon County Conservation District Bikeway to the Rock Springs Environmental Center.

Decatur Indoor Sports Center (DISC) at Millikin

Constructed in January 2000 in conjunction with the Decatur Park District, the DISC is a 87,000 square foot, on-campus athletic facility.

The DISC's new weight rooms are the perfect place for the serious athlete or amateur to work up a sweat. Upstairs facilities include machine weights and cardiovascular equipment while the lower-level room provides an expanse of free-weights and dumbbells. The DISC also features a 200-meter indoor running track and indoor soccer and basketball facilities as well as a climbing wall. For more information on the DISC, call 217.429.3472.
