Etherton has been on the Millikin football staff since 2004 and has coached on both sides of the football. He has 12 years of collegiate coaching experience. In addition to Millikin,

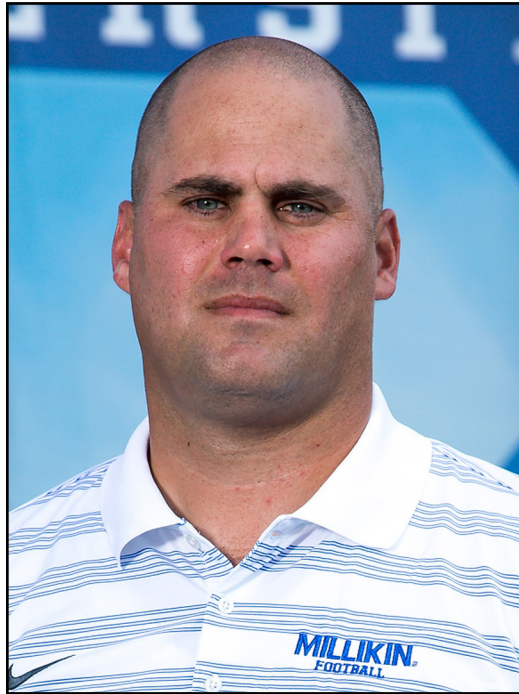
Etherton has been on the football staffs at Washington & Jefferson College, the University of Puget Sound and Allegheny College.

Recruiting Coordinator and Head JV Coach. From 2004-08, Etherton was Millikin's Co-Defensive Coordinator and Linebackers Coach in addition to running the JV program and heading up the recruiting efforts.

Etherton was Millikin's Head Men's Golf Coach from 2004 to 2011. Under Etherton, the Big Blue men's golf program has been successful including winning the 2011 CCIW Championship and a 14th place finish at the the NCAA Division III National Championships.

Etherton is a 2000 graduate of Millikin. He played defensive back during his playing days for the Big Blue and was a student assistant coach from 1998-2000. Etherton has a Masters of Educational Leadership from the University of Illinois Springfield. Etherton is married to 2002 Millikin graduate Airn English Etherton. Patrick Allgeier

Assistant Head Coach Offensive Line

Patrick Allgeier is in his 19th season at Millikin. Allgeier coaches the offensive line. In addition to his football duties, Allgeier also serves as the Assistant Athletic Director for

Events and Facilities.

A former All-North Coast Athletic Conference offensive tackle, the Cincinnati native earned three letters for Wittenberg before graduating in 1993. He served as assistant offensive line coach at Wittenberg for two seasons.

Tim Connell

Offensive Coordinator Quarterbacks

Tim Connell joined the Millikin staff as the Quarterbacks Coach for the 2011 season. In 2012 Connell was named the Offensive Coordinator.

In 2010, Connell was the Defensive Secondary Coach at Southwest Minnesota State University. Connell spent two seasons as Wide Receivers Coach at the University of Redlands and has twice served on the staff at Central College in Iowa.

As a player, Connell was a standout quarterback for Central College. In 2007, he was the Iowa Conference Most Valuable Player and named to the All-Conference First Team. Connell was D3football.com's All West Region Quarterback and received Honorable Mention All-American Honors from D3football.com. Connell holds a number of Central passing records including passing yards in a season (3,084), passing yards in a career (6,181), touchdown passes in a season (35). Connell is a NSCA-CSCS Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist.

Connell, his wife Kirby and son Noah, live in Decatur.



Dan Potempa

Defensive Coordinator

Former Big Blue star linebacker Dan Potempa has been Millikin's Defensive Coordinator since 2011.

The 2002 Millikin graduate earned CCIW All-Conference First Team honors

as a senior when he led the Big Blue in tackles with 83 including 51 solo stops.

Potempa joined the Big Blue staff in 2011 after spending four years at Carmel Catholic High School in Mundelein where he served as Defensive Coordinator and Linebackers coach in 2010. Carmel won the ESCC Championship and advanced to the IHSA 7A quarterfinals in 2010. Potempa's defense held opponents to only 11.5 points per game including only 8.5 points per game in conference play. His defense forced 27 turnovers in 12 games. Potempa also coached the Defensive Line during his time at Carmel Catholic. Potempa has two years of collegiate coaching experience at Lakeland College in Wisconsin where he coached linebackers and was the junior varsity defensive coordinator.

Potempa and his wife Maggie and daughter Georgia live in Decatur.



Patrick Colligan

Defensive Line

Patrick Colligan joined the Millikin staff in 2012 to coach the Big Blue Defensive Line.

Colligan came to Millikin after three seasons on the football staff at Westminster College in Pennsylvania where he

worked with the offensive line, tight ends and defensive backs and served as assistant recruiting coordinator. Colligan was also an assistant coach at South Park High School from 2005-06 helping the school to a state championship in 2005.

Colligan is a graduate of California University of Pennsylvania and earned his master's degree at Westminster.

Outside Linebackers

Jack Baucus became an assistant football coach at Millikin in August 2014 coaching the Big Blue outside linebackers.

Ben Brandstatter

Defensive Backs\Special Teams

Ben Brandstatter joined the Millikin football staff in August of 2014 serving as an assistant coach. Brandstatter will coach the Big Blue defensive backs and work with the Special Teams unit.

Brandstatter played collegiately at DePauw University where he played strong safety and on special teams. Brandstatter was the Tiger's leading tackler in his senior season.

Brandstatter comes to Millikin after spending two years teaching and coaching football in the St. Louis Public School system.

He is a 2012 graduate from DePauw University earning a bachelor's degree in History. Brandstatter is currently pursuing a master's degree in Secondary Education at the University of Missouri-St. Louis.

FOOTBALL

Looking at 2014

Entering his fourth season, Head Millikin Football Coach Patrick Etherton believes the Big Blue have the talent and experience to produce success on the field and move up in the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW) standings. Millikin suffered through an injury filled season in 2013. While last season produced unwanted results on the scoreboard, it provided valuable playing time for a number of young players on both sides of the football. Etherton and the Big Blue staff added a very talented recruiting class in hopes of producing a winning combination on the field.

Millikin returns 25 letter winners including four starters on offense and eight starters on defense.

OFFENSE

The Millikin offense got a record setting rushing performance last year, but with the loss of four offensive linemen and an All-Conference running back the Big Blue will be looking for a more diversified approach on offense this season.

Junior Nick Pippin is back at quarterback. Last season Pippin passed for 1,556 yards with eight touchdowns and rushed for 236 yards and one score. Etherton believes last year provided Pippin with valuable experience and taught him what it takes to be a successful college quarterback.

Etherton is confident in the targets Pippin has to deliver the ball to at wide receiver and tight end. Millikin has depth at wide receiver led by Brady Cufaude and Sean Maloney. The Big Blue staff is expecting big things from both players who are looking to rebound from injuries last season. Cufaude had 316 yards and three touchdowns in seven games last season. An early injury forced Maloney to the sidelines last season, but he hopes to build on the promise he showed in his freshman season. Junior Taylor Sanders is back after leading the Big Blue in receiving last year with 433 yards on 38 catches. Sophomores CJ Baker and Avantae Meriwether are also expected to see time at receiver this season. Millikin receiving will get some added depth from the Millikin basketball team as Chase Robbins joins the football program after a stellar high school football career.

The tight end position could play a major factor in the Millikin offense this season, as former quarterbacks junior Kyle Leadlove and sophomore Tucker Schwengel bring their athleticism and size to the position. Freshman Austin Gardner will give the Big Blue some size and skill at tight end as well.

Without one dominate running back, Millikin

will give opponents a bevy of speedy rushers in 2014. Coach Etherton is pleased with the depth of talent he has in the backfield and is confident the group will provide the rushing yards needed to keep the Big Blue offense moving the football. The group is led by senior Justin Brooks who has rushed 529 yards in his career. Sophomore Jacoby Sims and freshman Isaiah Townsend are expected to get some carries as Millikin uses a variety of looks on offense.

Most of the rebuilding work done this pre-season has been on the offensive line where the Big Blue returns only one starter. Junior Anthony Berkman anchors the line after starting all 20 games in the last two seasons.



Berkman will move from tackle to guard this season. The rest of the starting line spots will be filled by players that have experience, but will be in their first season as starters. Senior Mitchell McElroy moves to the center spot. Sophomores, Glenn Morgan, Austin Brummett and Sean Nicholson, round out the rest of the line. Sophomores Killian Markworth and Kybric Lamb along with freshman Jordan Hughes, Mike Mendez and Eric Ivery provide Millikin with capable backups along the offensive line.

DEFENSE

Millikin returns a wealth of experience on defense and several freshmen have brought much needed size and speed to the unit.

After earning All-Conference Second Team honors on defense last year, Jowonis Edwards returns to the Millikin defensive backfield. Last season, Edwards had 52 tackles and team high six interceptions. He earned Millikin's Most Valuable Defensive Player Award and Most Valuable Freshmen-Defense Award. Mike Blakely moves to the defense from wide receiver bringing great speed and athletic ability. While the defensive backfield will be young, they feature a number of playmakers. Freshman Demetreeus Loper will join Blakely at cornerback. Sophomores Mykal Neal and Danny Beresky return at safety. Neal led Millikin with 64 tackles last

season along with three interceptions and three pass break-ups. Beresky had 25 tackles in 2013 before having his season cut short by injury. Sophomore Chase Fontinel and freshmen Jalen Easler, Steve Isbell and Amon Mason impressed the coaches in the preseason and should all see playing time as the season moves along.

Senior Andy Roth returns to the Millikin line-backing unit after missing most of last season. Roth had 72 tackles in 2012. Junior Jake Gates is back after recording 36 tackles in seven games last year. Freshmen Devin Orrell and Nikia Averitte bring size and power to the unit while still possessing the speed to track down the opposition. Sophomore Matt Madrigal freshmen Nick Retherford, Alex Duncan and Alex Tatar provide depth at linebacker.

Millikin returns three experienced players on the defensive line. Senior Wesley Beach, junior Adam Rosner and sophomore Travis Goveia provide the Big Blue defense a solid front. Beach has been a two-year starter with 27 tackles including 4.5 tackles for loss last year. Rosner is another two-year starter with 47 tackles last season including 9.5 tackles for a loss. Goveia had 45 tackles and a team high 11 tackles for a loss and one interception as a freshman. A solid group of freshmen back up the unit led by second year player Isaiah Blumenshine. Matthew Briddick and James Jones should see early action for the Big Blue.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Senior Grant Shreve will handle the Millikin punting duties again in 2014 after leading the CCIW in punting last year averaging 40 yards per punt. Shreve will handle the holding duties as well. Chayce Volpert will handle the kicking duties after hitting 26-28 extra points and two field goals in 2013. Freshman Tyrin White has earned the long snapper role.

Blakely will be the Big Blue punt and kick-off returner. In 2013, he had 847 kickoff return yards in 2013 averaging 18.8 yards per return.

Frank M. Lindsay Field



Named in memory of long-time Decatur business leader and media owner, and recognizing the support given to Millikin by his family, Frank M. Lindsay Field was dedicated on Oct. 17, 1987.

Gifts from the Lindsay family and from an endowment fund created in 1961 by former members of the defunct Kappa Delta Chi fraternity financed the project. Donations from the classes of 1979 and 1980 assisted in the purchase of a scoreboard, while a new sound system, an improved drainage system and an underground irrigation system were also added.

Frank M. Lindsay Field seats 4,000, including seating for spectators on the west side. Lindsay Field also includes a concession stand and restrooms under the southwest corner of the grandstand.

Thanks for the generous contributions to Millikin's Transform MU Campaign major improvements were made to the facility in time for the 2014 season. Renovations included new artificial turf surface, lights, a new track surface and a new video scoreboard. The Millikin soccer teams will join the Big Blue football and track and field teams in calling Lindsay Field home. In 2014, the Millikin soccer programs will play their first home games ever at night. For football it will be the first time a home game is played under lights since 1928.

A press box is located on the west side of the field. Construction of the new press box concluded in Spring 2001 and was funded entirely with the gift of \$800,000 from the late F. Merrill and the late Margery "Sis" Lindsay.

The lower level features expanded working spaces for print and electronic media. It features include telephone and Internet connections in all boxes. Game-day clock workers, coaches and the Sports Information staff join the media in the lower level. A large guest area is located on the second level, and videographers can find a clear view of the field from the top of the second level.

The press box is handicap-accessible by elevator from both levels, is air-conditioned and heated with restroom facilities on each floor. In the summer of 2001, the press box was used when Millikin hosted the NCAA Division III Track & Field Championships and the USATF Youth Championships. Millikin also hosted the NCAA Division III Outdoor Championships and the USATF Masters Meet in 2003.

Millikin awarded an honorary degree to Frank Lindsay in 1954 and to his son, F. Merrill Lindsay in 1981, making them one of the only two father-son combinations so recognized by the University.

F. Merrill Lindsay and his wife, Sis, donated a gift of \$1 million to Millikin in 1997 for the new running track around the football field. The gift provided the impetus for the track project.

Frank M. Lindsay Field served as the site of the Millikin football program's 500th win. The Big Blue won the program's 500th contest on Nov. 13, 2004, a 45-24 victory over Illinois Wesleyan University.

CCIW History

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enters 2014-15 as its 69th season of competition, 29th for women's sports.

During the 2013-14 academic year, the CCIW honored over 1,400 academic all-conference recipients, 14 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, 33 CoSIDA Academic All-District recipients and 87 all-Americans.

CCIW schools have accounted for 46 national championships in NCAA Division III competition, including 15 in men's cross country, six in men's basketball, six in men's outdoor track and field, four in football and men's indoor track and field, three in women's soccer, two in women's outdoor track & field, women's basketball and men's soccer and one apiece in baseball and women's indoor track and field.

The conference was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946, in Jackson, Ill., and opened competition in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois. In 1967, the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin, to recognize Carthage, which moved to Kenosha, Wis., in 1962 and Carroll, which entered the conference in 1955.

The CCIW sponsors 23 sports, including baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's lacrosse, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling.
