- Saturday's contest will feature live audio on KTSU 90.9 FM and will be shown live on ESPN+
- TSU is looking for its third win of the 2023 season as they defeated Bethune-Cookman last week in Daytona Beach as it was its first SWAC win of 2023.
- TSU and Florida A&M will meet for the first time since the 2017 season opener for both teams. FAMU has not played in Houston since 1959 as they played TSU at old Jeppesen Stadium.
- FAMU enters the contest riding high as they're 4-0 in SWAC play with a two-game lead over its closest SWAC East foe. FAMU has won four straight and are coming off a bye weekend.
- The Rattlers lead the SWAC in total defense (274.2) and rank fourth in offense (378.0). They feature the top passer in quarterback Jeremy Moussa. FAMU head coach Wille Simmons is familiar with TSU and Shell Energy Stadium as he faced the Tigers three times while serving as head coach at Prairie View A&M from 2015-17 with two games played at the stadium.
- \bullet TSU has not played inside Shell Energy Stadium since its 2023 season opener against Prairie View A&M on Sept. 2.
- TSU had a pair of student-athletes earn SWAC Football Player of the Week honors as linebacker Jacob Williams earned defensive honors while LaDarius Owens earned specialist honors.
- TSU has played a pair of quarterbacks this season in **Andrew Body** and **Jace Wilson**. Wilson has taken over the top spot due to an injury to Body.
- Running back **LaDarius Owens** has surpassed the career 2,000-yard rushing mark with 2,148 yards. He needs 624 more yards to become TSU's all-time rushing leader which is currently held by **Thomas Sieh** with 2,934 yards. He's currently fifth all-time with 18 rushing touchdowns.
- The Tigers feature fifth-year head coach **Clarence McKinney**. A Houston native, McKinney attended high school across the street at Jack Yates High School and played collegiately at Montana State and the University of Mary. He also served as head coach at Yates before joining the staffs at Houston, Texas A&M and Arizona.
- Clarence McKinney is the 17th head coach in the history of Texas Southern Football. McKinney has a task ahead as the program has only had 28 winning seasons in 76 years of existence and hasn't recorded a winning season since 2000.
- McKinney won as a student at Yates High School and helped the University of Mary post three winning seasons as a student-athlete in college which made school history. As head coach at Yates, McKinney posted a mark of 30-8 over three years before moving on to the collegiate ranks as an assistant. As an assistant at Houston, Texas A&M and Arizona, McKinney has only experienced three losing seasons in his 11 years of collegiate coaching.

YEAR 5 OF THE McKINNEY ERA

Clarence McKinney is the 17th head coach in the history of Texas Southern Football. McKinney inherited a tough task as the 76 years of existence and hasn't recorded a winning season since 2000.

Under McKinney, the building process has been slow but steady as progress has been made across all facets of the program both on the field and inside the classroom. In 2021, Tiger fans finally saw the fruit of his labor as TSU won a pair of SWAC games, including the program's first win over Southern since 2011.

The 2022 season came down to the final minute as TSU inches short of its first wining season since 2000 and was in position to claim a spot in the SWAC Championship Game. During the season, TSU made history with its first shutout over Southern since 1971, a win at Alcorn State and its first win over Grambling State since 2013.

The Florida A&M Rattlers jumped out to a 29-0 advantage versus the Texas Southern Tigers in what was the season opener for both schools in the Jake Gaither Classic hosted at Bragg Stadium.

The Rattlers never looked back from there as they went on to claim a 29-7 victory over visiting TSU in front of a crowd of 15,401 spectators.

Florida A&M took a 7-0 lead at the 2:53 mark of the first quarter on a nine yard

Ryan Stanley touchdown run capping off a nine play 74 yard scoring drive in which they took 4:45 minutes off the game clock.

FAMU would add two more score in the first half with one coming on a six vard touchdown run by **Devin Bowers** (extra point missed), and the second on a 35-vard touchdown reception by Brandon Norwood at the 9:02 mark of the second quarter bringing the score to 20-0 heading into intermission.

Texas Southern gave up a safety to start the second half on the kickoff which moved the score to 22-0 before a Vince Jefferies 12yard run put FAMU ahead 29-0 in the third

TSU would find the end zone at the 14:16 mark of the fourth quarter on a 30-yard touchdown pass from Jay Christophe to

Darvin Kidsy making the score 29-7 which would subsequently be the game's final.

Christophe went 12-of-39 for 140 yards and 1 touchdown while being sacked three times. He also led the Tigers rushing efforts carrying the ball 10 times for 29 yards.

Overall offensively the Tigers amassed 202 program has only had 28 winning seasons in yards (62 R, 140 P) while the Rattlers tallied 415 vards (198 R. 222 P). Florida A&M held possession of the ball for 38:55 minutes while TSU was is possession of the ball for 21:05 minutes.

ROAD WOES NO MORE

Texas Southern has had its struggles on the road over the past few seasons but has began to overcome them. Wins on the road at Alcorn State and Arkansas-Pine Bluff last year marked the first time TSU has won two true road contests inside an opposing SWAC stadium in a single season since 2017. TSU has one SWAC road win this season as they defeated Bethune-Cookman.

The last time TSU won a non-con-

ference road contest was on Sept. 13, 2014 against Central State (Ohio) in Nassau, Baha-

Simmons served as the offensive coordinator during their tenure there. Rollins played both quarterback and wide receiver at ASU.

SAME STADIUM, NEW NAME

TSU's football home, Shell Energy Stadium, was rebranded earlier this year as this marks the third time since the stadium's inception in 2012 that TSU will play in a facility with a different name. Since 2012, the stadium has been named BBVA Stadium and PNC Stadium. Last year, TSU recorded its first-ever sellout at the facility.

CHECK THE RECORDS

Quarterback Andrew Body

continues to rise up the TSU record book. The Corpus Christi, Texas surpassed the 4,000yard career passing mark last week as he has 4,102 yards. He currently ranks fourth all-time at TSU is on pace to end the year no lower than second or first with a huge year in the air. Former quarterback Sean Cook holds the alltime passing record at 6,297 yards.

On the ground, Body has 1,282 yards and ranks 17th all-time. In total offense, Body has 5,226 yards and ranks second alltime. The all-time record is 6,078 yards.

CHECK THE RECORDS AGAIN

Running back LaDarius Owens has surpassed the career 2,000-yard rushing mark with 2,148 yards. He needs 624 more yards to become TSU's all-time rushing leader which is currently held by Thomas Sieh with 2,934 yards. He's currently fifth all-time with 18 rushina touchdowns.

HISTORY MADE AGAIN

TSU head coach Clarence McKinnev's shutout over Southern last year marked the first time TSU has shut SU out since 1971 and also marked the first winning streak over SU since 1989 and 1990.

McKinney is also the first coach since Bill Thomas to defeat both Southern and Grambling State in the same season as that feat has not been accomplished since 1996.

WELCOME BACK FLORIDA

This marks the first year TSU will play both Florida A&M and Bethune-Cookman since joining the SWAC. This will be a memorable feat as BCU has not played TSU at least six times. TSU will have three games since 1982 when the teams played annually for several seasons while TSU will play FAMU one on AT&T Sports. for the first time since 2017. While both teams have a storied history against each other, this marks the first time since 1959 FAMU will venture to the city of Houston and play TSU.

TSU FOOTBALL TO DON MICHAEL STRAHAN SUITS

For the second straight year, the Texas Southern football team will look the part walking off the bus on Saturdays as they'll don a pair of suits from the Michael ketball court directly behind the current TSU Strahan collection.

Hebron Fangupo also joins the staff as the team's defensive analyst. He spent the previous year at Utah Tech and brings NFL experience as a player with multiple teams.

In August, TSU added former graduate assistant Zerrick Rollins back to the staff as the new quarterbacks coach.

6 TIGERS EARN PRESEASON ALL-SWAC HONORS

Six Texas Southern football student-athletes earned 2023 Preseason All-SWAC Honors while the TSU football team was picked third in the annual preseason poll voted on by each school's respective Head Football Coach and Sports Information Direc-

The six preseason selections mark the most at TSU in more than a decade and marks the second straight season head coach Clarence McKinney has had four or . TSU was formally established in 1947 with more preseason selections. The third-place selection marked the highest preseason nod since 2011.

Wide receiver **Derek Morton** was . Texas Southern University (TSU) is one of named to the preseason first team while quarterback Andrew Body, running back Jacorey Howard, offensive lineman Mehdi Torrence, defensive end Michael Akins and kick returner Chaunzavia Lewis earned second team honors.

After posting less than 10 receptions in 2021, Morton emerged out of the shadows in 2022 and posted career highs in receptions (36) and yards (571) as he finished as TSU's top receiver. The San Antonio, Texas native had a 53-yard touchdown against Southern and averaged 57.1 yards per game.

Body returns for his junior season after passing for 1,799 yards last fall and 13 touchdowns while rushing for 576 yards. The Corpus Christi. Texas native is currently nearing the 4,000-yard career passing mark as he has 3,816 yards entering the year.

A senior running back from Houston, Howard scored a team-high six touchdowns on 425 rushing yards in 2022. Torrence had Good Morning America host and Pro Foot-

Defensively, Akins had a strong redshirt freshman season with 11 tackles for loss and 39 tackles while recording three sacks. As a result, the legislature provided for an interim and separate law school for Negroes.

GAME 1 Prairie View A&M TSU 9/2/23

The first overtime in the history of the Labor Day Classic ended in Prairie View A&M's favor as a field goal moved them past Texas Southern 37-34 inside Shell Energy Stadium on Saturday night.

TSU opened the contest on fire as they marched 54 yards in nine plays but missed a field goal on its opening attempt. On TSU's second drive, Jyrin Johnson caught three passes for 27 yards and moved TSU in the red zone but the Tigers had to settle for a 20-yard Curtis Falkenburg field goal as they led 3-0 with 7:20 in the first quarter,

Prairie View A&M answered on the ensuing drive with a 38-yard touchdown pass from Trazon Connley to Jahquan Bloomfield for a 7-3 lead after the PAT. TSU would fumble the kickoff minutes later and the Panthers made them pay as they scored another touchdown to lead 14-3 with 2:08 left.

TSU refused to go back down as the answered with a vengeance as AJ Bennett caught a nine yard touchdown to cap off an eight-play, 73-yard drive from Andrew Body to open the second quarter. PVAMU responded with a 23-yard field goal for a 17-10 margin. Both teams traded interceptions and TSU would capitalize on Javius Williams' pick as Body connected with Bennett for a 35-yard strike as Falkenburg tied the contest at 17-all with 5:18 left.

Williams opened the third quarter with a big momentum swing as his fumble recovery off a Michael Akins' strip set up a 16-yard Quay Davis touchdown from Body. The TSU defense forced a punt and TSU marched 55 yards as Falkenburg's 37-yard field goal moved the score to 27-17. Another PVAMU punt led to another explosive offensive play as LaDarius Owens burst through the seams and recorded a 77-yard touchdown run and a 34-17 lead towards the end of the third quarter. Prairie View A&M managed to respond as the quarter came to a close with an 11-yard touchdown run to cut the lead 34-24.

TSU threw an interception on its second drive of the quarter but the defense forced a turnover on downs to regain the ball. However, the Tigers had another interception and the Panthers responded with a field goal to draw within 34-27. Despite picking up two first downs on its next drive, TSU was forced to punt and the Panthers delivered a back-breaking drive which saw them score a touchdown with 49 seconds left which set up the first overtime in the history of the Labor Day Classic.

TSU failed to move the ball to open overtime and missed a 42-yard field goal. The Tigers came up big on defense with a pair of tackles for loss but the Panthers sealed the contest with a 35-yard game-winning field goal.

TSU racked up 486 yards of offense as Body finished 18-of-38 for 286 yards. Owens rushed for 104 yards on eight carries while Quay Davis caught seven passes for 120 yards. Jacob Williams led the defense with nine tackles, three sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss.

GAME 2 Toledo 71 TSU 3 9/9/23

Toledo scored on its first eight possessions as they handed TSU a road loss on Saturday inside Glass Bowl Stadium.

The reigning Mid-American Conference champions, the Football Bowl Subdivision Rockets forced a punt on TSU's opening drive and converted on two third downs on its opening drive before scoring on a Peny Boone 1-yard touchdown run followed by a two-point conversion.

TSU quarterback Jace Wilson, who was making his first start of the season, settled down on the second drive and picked up his initial first down of the game on a 3rd-and-8 scramble. However, the drive stalled at the TSU 32 as TSU was forced to punt. Three plays into its second drive of the contest, the Rockets converted a 3rd-and-6 and used the momentum to score its second touchdown of the contest three plays later.

Down 15-0, TSU had two quick first downs which moved them to the Rocket 40. How-ever, a TSU holding penalty negated a potential first down followed by an untimely sack. TSU was forced to punt on the drive which was ultimately blocked as Toledo started its next drive at the TSU 37. Toledo only needed one play on the offensive end to answer as they moved ahead 22-0 following the PAT.

A TSU interception at the close of the first quarter led to another Rocket scoring drive and a 29-0 deficit at the start of the second quarter. TSU wouldn't back down despite the deficit as Wilson and Jacorey Howard moved TSU to the Toledo 12. However, a holding call moved the Tigers back and two incomplete passes led to a 34-yard Curtis Falkenburg field goal.

Despite the score, the Rockets kept the gas on as they scored 21 points to close out the half ahead 50-3.

The Rockets added three additional touchdowns in the second half for the final score

TSU finished with 238 yards of total offense as Wilson passed for 92 yards on 8-of-20 passing. Howard led TSU with 43 yards rushing on 11 carries followed by Jyrin Johnson's four receptions. Defensively, Jacob Williams led the Tigers with 13 tackles.

GAME 3 Rice TSU 9/16/23

For the second straight weekend, TSU couldn't overcome a slow start as Rice claimed a non-conference win inside Rice Stadium on Saturday night.

The Tigers fumbled on the opening play and Rice needed only four plays to score as they led 7-0 after a 1-yard touchdown run and the PAT. TSU punted on its next drive and Rice scored in three plays as a 35-yard touchdown strike led to a 14-0 margin after the PAT. TSU punted once again on the ensuing drive and Rice scored on its first play from scrimmage to up the margin to 21-0 following the PAT. The Tigers were forced to punt again and Rice used a 44-yard strike on its fourth play from scrimmage to set up its fourth touchdown and a 28-0 lead with 5:55 left in the first quarter.

Early in the second quarter, TSU fumbled on its own 30 and Rice would capitalize once again via the run as they scored on a 3-yard rush for a 35-7 lead after the PAT. Midway through the second quarter, the Tigers would find the endzone as starter Jace Wilson led a five-play drive which culminated with a 15-yard touchdown pass to Jyrin Johnson.

Unfortunately, that would be the lone score of the contest as Rice added a late touchdown in the first half followed by two touchdown runs in the third and fourth quarters.

TSU finished with 185 yards of total offense as 104 came via the air and 81 was on the ground. Wilson passed for 104 yards on 9-of-19 attempts while LaDarius Owens rushed for 48 yards. Defensively, Elinus Noel, Calvin Henderson and Ja'Corey Benjamin led TSU with seven tackles apiece.

GAME 4 Grambling State 35 TSU 23 9/23/23

Grambling State scored a late touchdown in the fourth quarter to pull away from Texas Southern 35-23 on Saturday afternoon inside Eddie G. Robinson Stadium.

Grambling State used its running game to score early as they punched it in from a yard out on its second drive of the contest for a 7-0 lead following the PAT. TSU finally got things going offensively to open the second quarter as Jace Wilson completed 3-of-4 passes with the latter a 41-yard strike to AJ Bennett for a 7-7 tie after Curtis Falkenburg's PAT.

Both defenses rose to the occasion throughout the quarter as they combined for five punts. However, Grambling State would strike late with only seven seconds left with a late touchdown pass for a 14-7 halftime lead.

TSU opened the third quarter with a bang with big plays in the rushing and passing attack but had to settle for a 41-yard Curtis Falkenburg field goal as the drive stalled on the 24. Down 14-10, TSU's momentum was short-lived as GSU countered with a seven-play, 75-yard drive which culminated in an 11-yard touchdown run and a 21-10 lead following the PAT.

Two drives later, TSU finally returned to the endzone as Wilson connected with Eyan Means for a deep bomb as Means scored on a 34-yard touchdown reception. Falkenburg's PAT was good as TSU was down 21-17 late in the third quarter.

Early in the fourth quarter, TSU was forced to punt at its on 1 and GSU had short field position due to a big return and TSU personal foul. GSU needed only one play to up the lead to 28-17. On TSU's ensuing drive, the Tigers marched down the field and kept it close as Jacorey Howard had several big runs to move the team down the field. Wilson delivered the heavyweight blow as he connected with Jyrin Johnson for a 25-yard touchdown and a 28-23 margin as the two-point conversion fell inches short.

With the game on the line and 6:45 remaining, TSU had Grambling State pinned on its own 13 entering third down. Unfortunately, Grambling State quarterback Myles Crawley found one-on-one coverage and converted a 37-yard pass which gave them momentum en route to a 1-yard run six plays later

With the opportunity to get back into the contest down only score gone, TSU couldn't recover as GSU closed out the win.

TSU finished with 271 total offensive yards as LaDarius Owens rushed for 76 yards on 20 attempts while Wilson passed for 153 yards on 14-of-24 passing. Isaiah Bogerty led the way defensively with 10 stops.

GAME 5 TSU 52 Lincoln 7 9/30/23

Texas Southern dominated from start to finish as they celebrated homecoming in style en route to a 52-7 win over Lincoln University inside Durley Stadium.

TSU rode the legs of LaDarius Owens on its first drive as he led TSU on an eight-play, 66-yard drive which saw him score on a 13yard run. Ahead 7-0, TSU forced a Lincoln punt on its opening drive and quarterback Jace Wilson opened the second drive with two huge passing plays of 30 yards each to Trenton Leary and Owens. The TSU running game took over from that point and Owens and Jacorev Howard drove the team down the field as Howard scored from four yards out and a 14-0 lead following Curtis Falkenbura's PAT.

After the two quick scores, the TSU offense cooled off until late in the second guarter as the Howard and Owens duo took every snap and returned TSU back to the endzone following Howard's 36-yard run. Falkenburg's PAT was good as TSU upped the lead to 21-0.

Lincoln would find the scoreboard late in the quarter on a 10-yard run as they entered the half down 21-7 to TSU.

TSU opened the second half with a quick three-and-out and the offense took full advantage as Wilson had a strong drive which featured a mix of the run and pass. Wilson moved TSU up three scores after a 25-vard touchdown run with 9:08 left.

The TSU defense continued to play at a high level while the offense kept responding as Howard and Jonathan Lewis both scored as the lead grew to 42-7 at the close of the quarter. Freshman Jordan Davis added his first career touchdown pass in the fourth quarter along with Christian Avelar's field goal for the final tally.

TSU rolled off 568 total yards as 376 came via the ground. Owens rushed for 139 yards on 13 carries and a touchdown while Howard gained 94 yards with three touchdowns. Wilson passed for 130 yards on 14of-23 passing while Canary Simmons had six stops followed by 2.5 sacks from Jacob Williams

GAME 6 TSU 34 Bethune-Cookman 31 10/14/22

Texas Southern made the plays when it counted as they earned a big 34-31 win over Bethune-Cookman on Saturday afternoon at Daytona Stadium.

Playing at BCU's Homecoming, TSU struck first as Curtis Falkenburg's field goal sailed through the uprights with 7:02 left in the first quarter. With no time remaining in the quarter, LaDarius Owens broke through the Wildcat defense like a missile and ran it in from 42 yards out as TSU upped the lead to 10-0 after Falkenburg's PAT.

The TSU defense stymied BCU on the opening drive of the second quarter but a costly leaping penalty on a fourth down punt revived BCU's drive as they took advantage and scored a touchdown run as they trailed 10-7 after the PAT.

Despite the setback, TSU would regain the edge on the ensuing drive as Jace Wilson picked up a big first down via a 17-yard run on 3rd-and-9 followed by a 23-yard pass to Trent Leary. After two JaCorey Howard runs to inch closer to the goal line, Owens would run it in from one yard as TSU upped the margin to 17-7.

BCU was deep into TSU territory on its next drive but Jacob Williams came up with a play that would have huge ramifications later on as he stripped the ball from the runner and returned it 95 yards for a touchdown and a 24-7 lead. BCU would return the kickoff 61 yards to the TSU 32 but had to settle for a field goal as the score was now 24-10.

The Tigers went hurry up at the close of the half and was successful as Wilson found Jyrin Johnson for a 29-yard reception followed by a 13-yard Wilson run which set up a 41-yard Falkenburg field goal with no time remaining and a 27-10 halffime lead.

BCU would have a long drive to open the second half as they scored on a two-yard rushing touchdown on fourth down to trail 27-17 after the PAT. TSU punted on its first drive and the Wildcats inched closer to the Tigers with another long drive to open the remaining and a 27-10 halffime lead.

ing the fourth quarter.

TSU's field goal attempt was blocked to open the fourth quarter but the TSU defense responded on the next drive as Michael Akins forced a sack which led to a Wildcat punt. The Tigers also punted but pinned the Wildcats deep in their own territory.

Three plays into its next drive, BCU com-mitted a costly mistake as TSU's Xavier Player picked off the Wildcats at their own 4. Owens delivered the first knockout blow with a seven-yard touchdown run as TSU moved back ahead 34-24 following the PAT with 7:27 left.

Once again, the Wildcats put together another long drive and scored a touchdown to draw within 34-31 with 36 seconds left. The onside kick was unsuccessful but BCU still had a timeout as TSU was faced with a 3rd-and-6 with 24 seconds left.

Owens delivered the ultimate knockout blow as he broke free for a 51-yard run and TSU went into victory formation to hold on to the win.

TSU finished with 388 total offensive yards (199 R, 189 P) as Owens rushed for 163 yards on 19 attempts along with three touchdowns. Wilson passed for 189 yards while Leary caught six passes for 82 yards. Jacob Williams led TSU with 13 tackles, 25 tackles for loss, two pass breakups, a forced fumble and fumble return for a score. Isaiah Bogerty followed with 12 stops, a tackle for loss and a half-sack. Elinus Noel added 10 tackles and two sacks from the defensive line spot.

TEXAS SOUTHERN FOOTBALL

CLARENCE McKINNEY HEAD COACH



Clarence McKinney was named Head Football Coach at Texas Southern University on Dec. 3, 2018 and begins his fifth season.

Faced with a major rebuilding job in his first season at TSU, McKinney quickly went to work in building a foundation for future success. On the field, the TSU offense finished fourth overall in the SWAC in total offense with 416.6 yards per game and nearly 3,000 total yards as it marked one of the top offensive finishes in university history and the highest offensive output since 2010. The offense boasted a 1,000-yard receiver in Donnie Corley in addition to one of the top kickers in the SWAC in freshman Richard Garcia III as both earned All-SWAC honors. The Tigers also showed SWAC opponents what to expect in the future as several of their games came down to the wire despite fielding a youthful roster with true freshmen in key roles.

McKinney also displayed his leadership in the spring of 2021 after leading the Tigers in their historic spring season. Senior defensive lineman Michael Badejo earned second team All-SWAC honors while also navigating the team through the challenges of COVID-19. In addition, defensive linebacker Tim Walton made history as a draft pick of the United States Football League (USFL).

McKinney's rebuilding efforts began to bear fruit in the fall of 2021 as TSU began to turn the corner with its play on the field. The Tiger offense finished second in the SWAC as the unit averaged 29 points per game while also averaging 429 yards per contest. The Tigers also ranked second in rush offense (188.1), third in passing (241.2) and first downs (20.1) and fourth in red zone offense (83.7 percent). On special teams, the Tigers finished second in PATs (38-of-39), third in punt returns (11.8) and kickoffs (39.1) as the team won a pair of SWAC contests.

TSU also defeated Southern University for the first time since 2011 and had several games decided in the closing minutes which displayed a full team effort for nearly 60 minutes. Four Tigers were rewarded for their efforts on the gridiron with a spot on the 2021 All-SWAC Foot-

ball Team as it marked the most Tigers to earn all-conference postseason honors since 2010. Individually, freshman quarterback Andrew Body exploded on the scene in 2021 as one of the top players in the SWAC after ranking top 10 in both passing and rushing in addition to second in total offense. Senior wide receiver Ke'Lenn Davis finished third in the SWAC in receiving yards. Kick returner LaDarius Owens finished fifth in kick return average and second in all-purpose yardage. The TSU offensive line also made a complete turnaround from his first season as the unit finished third in the SWAC in sacks allowed. Defensively, linebacker Tarik Cooper finished 14th in the SWAC in tackles while cornerback Isaiah Hamilton finished 14th with nine pass deflections and seventh in fumble recoveries.

In 2022, the hard work McKinney has put in continued to blossom as the Tigers were in the hunt for a SWAC West crown up until the final full weekend of the season. TSU finished one game short of earning its first winning season while posting its best SWAC record (4-4) since 2000 as the team posted its most wins (5) since 2014. McKinney is only the third coach in TSU history to record wins over both Southern University and Grambling State while also the first coach to defeat Southern University in consecutive seasons since 1977-78. In addition, three Tigers (Derrick Tucker, Tarik Cooper, Drake Centers) earned a spot in the second annual HBCU Legacy Bowl while Tucker was selected in the sixth round of the 2023 USFL College Draft which marked the third Tiger drafted under McKinney. Along with Tucker's success, offensive lineman Drake Centers also earned an opportunity to play professionally as he joined the Ottawa Redblacks of the Canadian Football League.

TSU was one of the most improved teams in the league in 2022 as they fielded the fourth-best scoring offense and was sixth in scoring defense. TSU was also top four in rush offense (177.7 ypg), kickoff returns (20.9), punt returns (10.5), sacks against (23), red zone defense (67.6%), opponent penalties (77.5), penalties (65.7) and opponent third down conversions (67.6%). Three Tigers (Drake Centers, Isaiah Hamilton and Chaunzavia Lewis) earned All-SWAC honors as Centers was TSU's first two-time All-SWAC lineman in 50 years while Hamilton led the SWAC with five interceptions and also led the league with two returned for a touchdown. Wide receiver Derek Morton exploded on the scene with a 36-catch season after only eight in 2021. Quarterback Andrew Body finished fourth in total offense while Chaunzavia Lewis led the SWAC in punt returns and was third in kick return yardage. Defensively, linebacker Jacob Williams went from a single digit freshman season to a 53-tackle season as a sophomore and a team leader.

Off the field, McKinney and his coaching staff has worked tirelessly in spreading the TSU football brand in the Houston area and state of Texas. On the recruiting front, McKinney has begun to restock the roster with quality high school talent from across the state which will pay dividends in the future while also having four student-athletes during his watch earn an opportunity to play professional football. In the classroom, McKinney has also handled business as 60-plus student-athletes have graduated under his watch after two seasons while the team continues to place many of its student-athletes on the SWAC Commissioner's Honor Roll on a yearly basis.

A member of Kevin Sumlin's first coaching staff at Houston, McKinney arrived to Texas Southern after spending the 2018 season as Associate Head Coach/Running Backs at the University of Arizona.

Prior to his stint with the Arizona Wildcats McKinney spent six seasons on Sumlin's staff at Texas A&M serving as Running Backs coach

(2012-17) as well as Offensive Coordinator (2013). While at Texas A&M in 2016 the Aggies produced one of the greatest rushing seasons in the last 20 years at Texas A&M. Trayveon Williams surpassed the 1,000-yard mark with 1,057 yards, while Keith Ford chipped in 669 yards as the Aggies' rushing attack averaged 5.7 yards per carry and produced 211.8 yards per game.

In 2015, the Aggies' running back corps produced its first 1,000-yard rusher of the McKinney era when Tra Carson rushed for 1,165 yards, which included seven 100-yard rushing games. Using a balanced rotation of running backs in 2014, the Aggies' trio of runners averaged over five yards per carry while combining for 1,520 rushing yards and 15 rushing touchdowns.

As previously noted in addition to his running back coach duties, McKinney served as the Aggies' offensive coordinator and play-caller for the 2013 Cotton Bowl and the 2013 regular season. Under his direction, the Aggies led the SEC in passing, scoring and total offense, while setting school records for passing yards, touchdowns and completion percentage.

Under McKinney's direction in 2012, the Aggies' top three running backs combined for more than 1,600 yards while averaging 5.5 yards per carry. Combined with quarterback Johnny Manziel, A&M's rushing attack was the best in the SEC and was the school's most productive ground game in more than 20 seasons.

Prior to coming to Texas A&M, McKinney served as Houston's recruiting coordinator, in addition to overseeing the Cougar running backs. His four-year stay at Houston was highly successful as the Cougars compiled a 36-17 record and played in three bowl games. UH posted double-digit wins twice during his stay, including 2011's school-record 13 victories and bowl triumph over Penn State.

UH's 2011 campaign enjoyed the strong play of running back Charles Sims, who gained 7.5 yards per carry on his way to 821 yards while grabbing 51 passes for 575 yards. In 2010, McKinney tutored Bryce Beall to first-team All-C-USA honors. Beall and Michael Hayes combined for 1,499 yards and 20 touchdowns.

In 2009, Sims earned a spot on the C-USA All-Freshman Team after averaging 4.92 receptions per game, ranking third among FBS receiving running backs. During his first year at Houston in 2008, McKinney guided Beall to C-USA Freshman of the Year honors after becoming the first freshman in UH history to rush for more than 1,000 yards. Beall also was named the MVP of the 2008 Armed Forces Bowl after rushing for 135 yards and one touchdown in a 34-28 win over Air Force.

Prior to joining Sumlin's staff at UH, McKinney served as head football coach at Jack Yates High School, compiling a winning record of 30-8 in three seasons. While at Yates he received several accolades, including being named a 2006 Gordon Wood 4A Coach of the Year Finalist and a 2007 Texans Coach of the Year Finalist.

McKinney also served as an assistant football coach at North Shore High School (2003-05) and Booker T. Washington High School (1997-2003) where he was named the 2003 Houston Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Under his leadership as head and assistant coach, McKinney helped many young men to receive scholarships to NCAA Division I schools and pursue their dreams of playing in the NFL.
