PREGAME

• Texas Southern starts its final homestand of 2024-25 against Mississippi Valley State at 5 p.m. on Saturday inside the H&PE Arena.

• TSU will honor nine seniors prior to the game in **Grayson Carter**, **Mario Davis**, **Zaire Hayes**, **Kenny Hunter**, **Oumar Koureissi**, **Kavion McClain**, **Duane Posey**, **Jaylin Jackson-Posey** and **Jaylen Wysinger**

• TSU opened up the second half of SWAC play with a 1-1 mark but has dropped four of the past five and are now in a four-way tie for fourth place.

• Texas Southern fell in the finals of the 2024 SWAC Tournament last season and participated in the CIT as they fell to Tarleton State in the opening round.

• TSU returns two starters from last season and eight letterwinners as they lost seven lettermen. The Tigers added seven newcomers to its roster in the offseason as six were added via the transfer portal. The TSU men's basketball duo of **Grayson Carter** and **Kenny Hunter** were named to the 2024-25 Preseason All-SWAC Second Team. Hunter was also tabbed the league's Preseason Defensive Player of the Year.

• TSU has won 22 of the past 24 games over MVSU. Picked 12th in the SWAC Preseason poll, MVSU has only one SWAC win on the season and has surpassed the 60-point mark only once in the past 10

games. **Arthur Tate** leads the team with 10.2 points while **Alvin Stredic** leads the team in rebounding with five per contest. TSU has won 22 of the past 24 games over MVSU. MVSU's last win over TSU broke a 10-game winning streak by TSU on Jan. 9, 2023. Prior to the win, MVSU's last win over TSU was in 2017. MVSU hasn't won in Houston since Jan. 23, 2012.

• TSU head coach **Johnny Jones** is 12-1 lifetime against MVSU.

• TSU, which is led by seventh-year head coach **Johnny Jones**, has won three-of-the-past four SWAC Tournament Championships and enters the 2024-25 season looking to earn its eighth NCAA Tournament bid over the past 12 years.

• TSU made its fourth consecutive postseason under Jones and third straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2022-23. Jones went 24-14 in his inaugural year as head coach with three Power 5 conference wins. TSU fell in the finals of the 2019 SWAC Tournament and advanced to the semifinals of the CIT in 2019. In 2019-20, the Tigers made it back to the semifinals of the SWAC Tournament after a third-place regular season finish but saw the season end abruptly due to COVID-19. TSU won the SWAC Tournament and First Four contest in 2021 and was the first SWAC team to beat a ranked opponent from the SEC in 2021 at Florida. TSU claimed another Power 5 non-conference win against Arizona State in 2022.

• Jones is 100-86 all-time in the month of February and 32-16 at TSU.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

TSU 82, MISSISSIPPI VALLEY 53

1/13/25 • Itta Bena, Miss.

Texas Southern broke open a tight game with a 37-9 run midway through the second half to defeat Mississippi Valley State 82-53 Monday night on the road.

The first half was tight from start-to-finish with a total of six ties. Mississippi Valley State would lead by as much as four (11-7) early in the half. TSU countered with an 8-2 run to lead 15-13 but the Delta Devils fought back and only missed two field goals from that point as they closed out the first half with a 28-27 lead.

The contest remained close to open the second half as TSU would hold a narrow 40-38 lead after a MVSU three-pointer with 13:05 left. TSU would begin to create separation from that point with a 7-0 run led by four points from Josh Farmer en route to a 47-38 lead with 11:33 left. MVSU would end its drought with a basket but the Tigers would continue to pour it on as Kavion McClain and Kenny Hunter combined to score 19 points over the next eight minutes as TSU went on a 30-point swing to remove all doubt and seize any hopes of a MVSU comeback.

McClain led TSU 14 points followed by 13 from Hunter and 12 from Kehlin Farooq off the bench. Hunter grabbed nine rebounds while McClain dished out four assists and had five steals.

NEW FACES

Texas Southern went to the transfer portal to fill its holes in the offseason with the addition of seven experienced newcomers in **Jaylin Jackson-Posey** (New Mexico State), **Kavion McClain** (Abilene Christian), **Oumar "UNO" Koureissi** (Nicholls State), **Bryce Roberts** (UT Tyler) and **Duane Posey** (Northwestern State). **Josh Farmer** (UTSA) enrolled in the spring of 2024 but didn't suit up last season.

SOLID DEBUT

Newcomer **Kavion McClain** finished with 21 points off the bench at Xavier opening night (11/4). It marked the most points for a TSU newcomer in their TSU debut since a 23-point outing by **Jalyn Patterson** at Baylor in 2018. McClain followed it up with 22 versus Texas A&M-San Antonio and 13 at Georgia.

HAYES NAMED SWAC IMPACT PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior **Zaire Hayes** has continued his impressive play as he was recognized as the SWAC's Impact Player of the Week after the first week of SWAC play. The senior guard from Houston averaged 21.5 points per game while scoring a total of 43 points in the two outings.

Since joining the starting lineup on Nov. 17, Hayes has averaged 12 points per game with career-high 24 against Grambling State last Monday night.

McCLAIN NAMED SWAC IMPACT PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Newcomer **Kavion McClain** was named the SWAC's Impact Player of the Week on Nov. 10 after averaging 18.7 points through TSU's first three games.

POSEY NAMED SWAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Newcomer **Duane Posey** was named the SWAC's Player of the Week on Nov. 19 after leading TSU with a game-high 26 points and achieving a double-double with 12 rebounds as he was 14-of-15 from the line at Samford.

WELCOME BACK CARTER

TSU graduate post **Grayson Carter** returns after having a career year in 2023-24 as he finished third in scoring (7.1) and second in rebounding (4.5).

HISTORY WAS MADE (AGAIN & AGAIN)

In 2021-22, Texas Southern men's basketball made history once again as they became the first team in SWAC history to defeat a ranked opponent from the SEC after an impressive 69-54 win over No. 20 Florida on Dec. 6. While the win was monumental, TSU has been there before as this was its first win over a ranked team since a win at Oregon in 2018 and its second ranked win since 2014. In addition, the win also marked the first against an SEC opponent since 2018 (Texas A&M).

Once again, TSU assumed its role as a Power 5 slayer as they defeated Arizona State in November of 2022 for its second win over a Pac-12 team since 2018.

MEN'S BASKETBALL PICKED TO FINISH 2ND, HUNTER NAMED PRESEASON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The TSU men's basketball duo of Grayson Carter and Kenny Hunter were named to the 2024-25 Preseason All-SWAC Second Team. Hunter was also tabbed the league's Preseason Defensive Player of the Year.

The 6-10 Carter is TSU's top-returning scorer as he averaged 7.1 points and 4.2 rebounds this past season. The Dallas native was third on the team in blocked shots (16) and shot 46 percent from the field. He had 10 games with double-digit points including a high of 19 against North Carolina A&T State and Mississippi Valley State while also posting a double-double versus Samford.

Hunter led TSU with 38 blocks last year and led the team in rebounds with 4.5 per contest while shooting 52 percent from

the field. Hunter had eight games with two-plus blocks including four apiece versus Mississippi Valley State and Grambling State. He had 15 games with five or more rebounds including 12 at Southern.

As a team, TSU was picked second in the preseason poll as the Tigers advanced to the finals of the SWAC Tournament.

BET YOU DIDN'T KNOW

- The entire nation had a opportunity to find out about Texas Southern University in 2019 as the university hosted the third Democratic presidential primary debate on Sept. 12, 2019 inside the H&PE Arena. Former President **Joe Biden** and Former Vice President **Kamala Harris** both participated in the event.

- TSU was formally established in 1947 with a mission to establish a credible college for African-American students.

- Texas Southern University (TSU) is one of the nation's largest historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs). TSU provides a first class educational experience, offering over 120 baccalaureate, masters and doctoral degree programs in nine schools and colleges. The University has assets exceeding \$250 million and currently has over 10,800 students enrolled.

- The Thurgood Marshall School of Law, was created as a consequence of a 1946 lawsuit brought by **Heman M. Sweatt**. Under the Texas Constitution, which required separate but equal treatment, Mr. Sweatt was refused admission to the University of Texas School of Law because he was black. As a result, the legislature provided for an interim and separate law school for Negroes.

- **Good Morning America** host and NFL Hall of Famer **Michael Strahan** played at TSU from 1989-92. He was recently inducted into the TSU Athletics Hall of Fame in October of 2024 and will be the school's first College Football Hall of Famer in December of 2025.

- Grammy award winner music superstar **Megan Thee Stallion** graduated from TSU in December 2021.

GAME 1

Xavier 78, TSU 60

11/4/24 • Cincinnati, Ohio

Xavier went on an 11-0 run midway through the second half to break open a tight contest as TSU dropped its season opener 78-69 Monday night.

Tied at 10 in the first half, the trio of Kolby Granger, Oumar Koureissi and Kavion McClain sparked an 8-0 run as TSU opened an 18-10 lead. Xavier cut it to 18-14 but TSU kept the pressure on its BIG EAST foe as they upped the margin back to eight (24-16) at the 9:01 mark. The Muskateers cut the lead to 24-21 but TSU continued to take their best punch as Granger's three-point play and Alex Anderson's trey moved the lead back to 30-21.

Xavier did its best to try and chip away but the Tigers held their ground en route to a 38-34 halftime lead.

Xavier would take the lead early in the second half as they upped it to 45-40 nearly three minutes in. Down 49-48, Kolby Granger's three-pointer moved TSU back ahead 51-49 but Xavier tied it at 51. McClain's trey moved TSU back on top 54-51 as there were two more ties from that point.

Xavier would hit three consecutive baskets while TSU would miss its next three during a 2:19 span as the Muskateers moved ahead 65-55. TSU would get within eight on several occasions down the stretch but couldn't overcome the deficit as Xavier won for the second time in series history.

McClain finished with 21 points off the bench while Granger followed with 15. Kenny Hunter led TSU with six boards. Grayson Carter chipped in with 10 points.

TSU is back in action at home on Wednesday against Texas A&M-San Antonio at 6 p.m.

GAME 2

TSU 100, TEXAS A&M-SA 66

11/6/24 • Houston, Texas

A strong defensive effort midway through the first half sparked a big first half run as TSU claimed a 100-66 win over Texas A&M-San Antonio Wednesday night at the Fertitta Center.

Playing their second game in three

days, the Tigers started out a little slow and the Jaguars took full advantage as they were red hot from beyond the three-point line with in the first 8:19. TAMUSA was 9-of-15 from the field and 6-of-10 from beyond the arc as they claimed an early 26-21 lead.

The Tiger defense finally woke up over the final minutes as they outscored TAMUSA 27-11 over the final 9:15. Kavion McClain led the Tigers with seven points during that span as the TSU defense finally stifled the Jaguars as they finished the final 9:15 minutes of the half 3-of-8 on three-point attempts and 4-of-14 overall. Nine Tigers would score during that span en route to a 48-37 halftime lead.

It was even to begin the second half as TSU led 56-47 at the 14:24 mark. However, the Tigers went on a 17-5 run over the next 5:09 as McClain led the Tigers with six points. Once again, the team flashed its depth with six players scoring en route to a 100-plus night for the first time this year.

McClain led the way with 22 points, eight assists and three steals while Kenny Hunter scored 15 points with seven rebounds.

GAME 3

GEORGIA 94, TSU 62

11/10/24 • Athens, Ga.

Kenny Hunter scored 16 points as TSU dropped the first game of the Peach State Classic by a 94-62 margin to Georgia on Sunday.

The contest was close early on as TSU was down 20-17 after Hunter's jumper. Another Hunter basket would draw TSU within 25-20 at the 9:41 mark but the game would switch tones from that point as UGA outscored the Tigers 23-9 to end the half ahead 45-29. During the run, TSU would only connect on two shots while UGA was 7-of-18.

TSU would draw within 14 points on several occasions early on in the second half but UGA pushed it to 20-plus points several minutes later as that would be the closest TSU would get.

Hunter led TSU with 16 followed by 13 from Kavion McClain.

GAME 4

GEORGIA TECH 81, TSU 62

11/12/24 • Atlanta, Ga.

A big first half run by Georgia Tech turned the tide of the contest as TSU fell 81-62 Tuesday night.

Grayson Carter's trey gave TSU an early 3-2 lead but TSU wouldn't return to the board for another three minutes as Carter's second three-pointer and bucket moved them ahead 8-6. The Yellowjackets would outscore TSU 8-3 to claim a 17-11 lead at the 12:48 mark but four points from Duane Posey sparked brief surge as TSU trailed 20-17.

However, TSU would miss its next five shots as Georgia Tech began to heat up as they outscored them 10-2 to lead 30-19. Posey's jumper cut the deficit to 30-21 with 6:30 left but TSU closed out the half 1-of-9 from the field as the Yellowjackets closed the half ahead 49-25.

The Tigers couldn't overcome their first half hole as the Yellowjackets led comfortably throughout the second half.

Posey led TSU with 15 points and six rebounds while Kenny Hunter grabbed nine rebounds.

GAME 5

SAMFORD 97, TSU 82

11/17/24 • Homewood, Ala.

Duane Posey and Kenny Hunter both had double-doubles but a game-changing run midway through the first half was the difference as Samford defeated TSU 97-82 on Sunday.

TSU turned a 5-0 deficit to open the game into a 6-5 lead as Duane Posey scored four of the next six points to reverse course. Three-point shooting would become a factor from that point as the Bulldogs nailed consecutive treys to lead 11-10 but TSU hung tough as Posey's dunk kept them within range at 16-14. A Bulldog trey and pair of free throws upped their lead to 21-14 with 10:55 left but Kolby Granger's trey and two free throws from Posey sparked a 5-0 run as TSU trailed 21-10 with 9:53 left.

Samford connected on four consecutive three-pointers over the next four minutes to open up a 35-23 lead. TSU would cut it

to 10 at 37-27 but the Bulldogs closed out the half on a 10-5 run to claim a 51-32 halftime lead.

The closest TSU would draw within the second half was 14 points early on but an 11-4 run upped Samford's lead to 20 as they held a tight grip on the lead until the end.

Duane Posey led TSU with a game-high 26 points and achieved a double-double with 12 rebounds as he was 14-of-15 from the line. Kenny Hunter also had a double-double with 14 points and 10 boards while Zaire Hayes and Granger added 12 and 11 points, respectively.

GAME 6

NEW MEXICO 99, TSU 68

11/24/24 • ALBUQUERQUE, N.M.

A pair of runs in both halves was the difference as TSU dropped a 99-68 decision at New Mexico on Sunday.

New Mexico led 16-10 early in the first half but Kavion McClain's six consecutive points tied it at 16-all. The Lobos would regain the lead and led by as much as six (28-22) with 4:43 left but Zytariious Mortle's five points sparked a 7-1 surge which gave TSU a 31-29 lead with 2:27 left. However, the Tigers would miss their final six shots at the end of the half while the Lobos finished 3-of-5 to claim a 38-31 halftime lead.

The Lobos opened the second half on a 12-2 run for a 50-33 lead four minutes in. TSU would cut it to 14 on several occasions within the next few minutes but the Lobos put the game out of reach with another run midway through the half.

McClain led TSU with 15 points and six assists followed by 12 from Jaylen Wysinger and 10 from Zaire Hayes. Oumar Koureissi grabbed a team-best seven boards followed by five from Kenny Hunter.

GAME 7

TSU 80, TEXAS A&M-KINGSVILLE 72

11/27/24 • Houston, Texas

Texas Southern led from start-to-finish as they toughed out an 80-72 win over Texas A&M-Kingsville on Wednesday afternoon.

The Tigers came out smoking as they opened up the game on a 15-2 run as they were a perfect 5-for-5 from the field including a trio of three-pointers. The roles would reverse quickly as TAMUK countered with a 10-2 run as they went 4-of-4 to draw within 17-12. The Tigers bounced back with a 7-2 surge to push its lead back to double digits (24-14) following Kavion McClain's jumper and led by as much as 11 (34-23) with 5:06 left. However, TAMUK's Allen Singleton put the team on his back as the half came to a close as he scored 10 of the Javelina's next 12 points while Kolby Granger scored the final five points for TSU. Singleton's buzzer-beating three-pointer the length of the court as time expired cut TSU's lead to 39-35.

The second half saw the Javelinas scratch and claw but the Tigers found ways to hold them off at the right time. They would cut TSU's lead to four on two occasions within the first four minutes as the latter saw TSU's Grayson Carter score four straight to up TSU's lead to 53-43 with 14:21 left. A three-point play by Kehlin Farooq with 11:47 left moved the margin to 58-46 but once again TAMU went on a 15-4 run aided by a trio of three-pointers to move within 62-61 at the 7:19 mark.

With the margin for error slim, Farooq answered with a bank shot as the shot clock expired to move the lead back to 64-61. The TSU defense would pick up the intensity from that point and another contributor would rise as Alex Anderson scored eight points over the next 5:39 to spark a 16-7 surge and move TSU back ahead by 13 with 1:47 left to wrap up the contest.

Four players scored in double figures led by McClain's 14 points and six assists. Carter scored 12 points followed by 12 from Anderson and Kenny Hunter.

GAME 8

TEXAS STATE 72, TSU 59

12/1/24 • Houston, Texas

A pair of double-digit second half runs by Texas State was the difference as TSU fell 72-59 on Sunday evening inside the H&PE Arena.

The first half was tight as there were a total of five ties. With TSU trailing 17-16 with 9:08 left, the Tigers turned to their defense to spark a 10-2 run as they forced four Bobcat turnovers while five Tigers would score to lead 26-19 with 4:18 remaining. Texas State managed to seize momentum as the half would end after posting a 9-2 run while TSU missed six of its final seven shots as both teams entered the half tied at 28-all.

Kenny Hunter scored four points to open the second half as the TSU defense held Texas State to 1-of-5 shooting as the Tigers claimed a 33-30 lead two minutes in. However, Texas State began to heat up as they went on a 17-4 surge fueled by 70 percent shooting (7-of-10) while TSU turned the ball over four times en route to trailing 47-37.

Kavion McClain put the Tigers on his back as he scored eight consecutive points over the next 2:24 to cut the margin to 49-45 with 9:29 left. McClain's spurt was the closest TSU would get from that point as the Bobcats attacked the basket over the next 4:45 and went on a 14-1 run for a 63-46 lead to lead by 17 and take full control of the contest. TSU would regroup after the big run and nearly matching the Bobcats' production over the final 3:21 but the damage from the final run was too much to overcome.

McCain led TSU with 12 points and four rebounds while Hunter and Zaire Hayes both added 10 points. Hunter and Kolby Granger tied for the rebound lead with six each.

GAME 9

SAM HOUSTON 89, TSU 71

12/7/24 • Huntsville, Texas

Texas Southern dropped an 87-71 road decision at Sam Houston State Saturday evening.

Down 15-13 early on, Kolby Granger's three-pointer moved TSU ahead 16-15 but the Bearkats would regain the lead as they led 19-16 with 8:11 left. The Tigers would roar back from that point as Zaire Hayes' three-point play tied the contest at 19-all. Kavion McClain's trey moved TSU on top 22-19 as the lead grew to 26-21 after Oumar Koureissi's layup.

SHSU would regain a 27-26 lead after a 6-0 surge but TSU fought back again as McClain's five points sparked an 8-0 run and a 34-27 lead with 1:32 left. SHSU would get within 34-32 with 38 seconds left but McClain's layup with eight seconds left gave TSU a 36-32 halftime lead.

Grayson Carter's layup with 19:48 left in the second half gave the Tigers a 38-32 lead but Sam Houston went on a 13-0 run to lead 45-38 at the 16:56 mark. Duane Posey's basket ended the TSU drought as they would cut the deficit to 53-46 with 13:28 left but Sam Houston would outscore TSU 21-14 over the next six minutes to claim a 15-point (74-59) lead. A Granger three-pointer cut TSU's deficit to eight at the 6:28 mark but that would be the closest they would get as the Bearkats claimed the win.

McClain led TSU with 19 points and five assists followed by 14 from Granger, 13 from Koureissi and 10 by Alex Anderson. Zaire Hayes, Kenny Hunter and Granger all had four rebounds.

GAME 10

NEVADA 105, TSU 73

12/14/24 • Reno, Nev.

A 26-4 run towards the close of the first half set the tone for Nevada to claim a 105-73 win over TSU men's basketball on Saturday night.

Nevada jumped out to an early 16-4 lead behind the strength of four three-pointers. TSU's Zaire Hayes would end the drought with a three-pointer as the Tigers began to

settle down and cut it to single digits on two occasions. With 12:39 left, Nevada moved its lead back to 12 but the Tigers went on an 11-4 run sparked by four Tigers scoring as they trailed 24-20 at the 10:33 mark.

The Wolfpack attempted to create further separation over the next three minutes but TSU's play on both ends kept them close as they trailed 29-25 after Jaylen Wysinger's dunk off his own steal. However, Nevada's Kobe Sanders was a one-man wrecking crew as the half came to a close as his 11 points sparked a 26-4 Wolfpack run en route to a 55-31 halftime lead.

TSU would draw as close as 19 early in the second half after Kavion McClain's three-pointer but that would be the closest they would get as the Wolfpack maintained a 20-point margin from that point.

Hayes led TSU with 16 points while McClain added 13. Kenny Hunter had seven rebounds with eight points.

GAME 11

BOISE STATE 82, TSU 51

12/17/24 • Boise, Id.

It was a tale of two halves as Boise State's second half start set the tone for an 82-51 win over TSU men's basketball on Tuesday night.

TSU led 5-4 early on after a Kavion McClain three-pointer but struggled to find the scoreboard from that point as they were scoreless for nearly three minutes as McClain hit another trey to cut the deficit to 13-8. Boise State upped its lead to 18-10 but TSU kept it close as every time the Broncos attempted to break away, the Tigers found ways to escape from its double-digit deficit.

Down 29-18 with 3:57 left, TSU had its big break as Jaylin Jackson-Posey's three-pointer sparked a 7-0 run as Jaylen Wysinger and McClain had a pair of points to get within 29-25 at the 2:58 mark. However, Boise State had a late run of its own with a 7-2 run for a 36-27 halftime lead.

Boise State opened the second half with a 7-0 run to increase its lead to 43-27 but five quick points from McCain narrowed the gap to 43-32 with 17:47 left. Unfortunately, TSU went cold from the field and committed several turnovers at the wrong time as Boise

State countered with a 17-2 surge over the next seven minutes to take firm control of the contest.

McCain led TSU with 15 points while Kenny Hunter had six rebounds and two blocks.

GAME 12

ABILENE CHRISTIAN 69, TSU 65

12/21/24 • Abilene, Texas

Texas Southern men's basketball fell just short in the closing seconds despite playing shorthanded in a 69-65 loss at Abilene Christian on Saturday.

The Tigers entered Saturday's game minus several starters and contributors which took a toll on the team's depth. The Tigers would start out slow as five early turnovers and only two field goals within the first five minutes saw them fall behind 19-5. Josh Farmer would end the drought with a basket but the Wildcats would maintain a double digit lead until the 6:51 mark.

After the slow start, TSU would get its bearings and came roaring back with a 15-5 run to tie it at 34-all as Kavion McClain, who played at ACU last season, led the charge with eight points. However, ACU would answer with an 8-1 run for a 42-35 lead at the break.

TSU was within one possession on several occasions to open the second half but ACU had a 7-0 run which spanned three minutes to lead 55-45 at the 9:48 mark. Once again, TSU refused to back down as they turned the tide and pulled ahead 58-57 with 4:50 left courtesy of a 13-2 surge.

ACU reclaimed the lead on a layup in the paint and a moving pick violation was called on TSU followed by a foul on Zaire Hayes as he was attempting to secure a loose ball after an ACU missed three-pointer. ACU would move ahead 61-58 on another layup in the paint.

Hayes would drain a jumper off an inbounds play at the 3:27 mark to draw TSU within 61-60 but TSU post Kenny Hunter was whistled for his fifth and final foul on the ensuing possession despite his best effort to stay straight up in the paint. ACU would hit one-of-two free throws for a 62-60 lead but once again TSU was whistled for an untimely turn-

over as they were penalized for a 10-second call.

Despite the setback, McClain would come up with a steal and Kolby Granger would draw a foul on a putback attempt. He would hit 1-of-2 free throws to tie it at 62-all with 2:35 left. TSU would force an ACU miss on its next attempt but was whistled for an offensive foul with 2:05 left.

The Wildcats would get a seal in the paint and score for a 64-61 lead. McClain answered with two free throws to draw TSU within 64-63. After a pair of missed baskets by both teams, McClain found Hayes on a runout with 47.2 seconds left as TSU regained a 65-64 lead. With the shot clock winding down and 23.9 seconds left, ACU's Leonardo Bettiol once again received the ball deep in the paint and scored to move them ahead.

TSU had a chance to move ahead but missed the go-ahead attempt and was forced to foul to save clock. ACU would connect on the first end of the 1-and-1 but came up with an offensive rebound on the second attempt which led to a pair of free throws and a two-possession lead.

McClain led TSU with 19 points while grabbing seven rebounds. Hayes followed with 17 while Kenny Hunter added 10 with six rebounds and two blocks. Kolby Granger grabbed 10 rebounds with eight points.

GAME 13

TSU 103, CBS HOUSTON 68 12/28/24 • Houston, Texas

Texas Southern opened the second half on a 24-2 run and never looked back as five players scored in double figures en route to a 103-68 win over CBS Houston on Saturday.

The Tigers scored the first 10 points of the contest for an early 10-0 lead to take control as Kenny Hunter set the tone in the paint with four points. CBS would counter with an 8-1 run to trail 11-8 but fellow post Grayson Carter would match Hunter's play in the paint from that point as he scored seven points to spark a 19-4 surge as the lead grew to 30-18 with 9:28 left. However, CBS would turn the tables and was hot from the field as they closed out the half on a 21-10 run to trail

40-33.

Two early baskets by CBS drew them to within five early in the second half but Zaire Hayes put the team on his back over the next five minutes. Hayes scored eight points followed by six from Kavion McClain as TSU forced four turnovers and held CBS to only one shot en route to a 24-2 run over the next 5:13 to claim a 66-39 margin. With the lead firm in hand, the Tigers closed out non-conference play in style as they surpassed the 100-point mark for the second time this season.

Everyone scored for the Tigers as Duane Posey scored 16 points while McClain and Carter followed with 15 points. Hayes added 13 while Hunter scored 10. Posey also grabbed nine rebounds while Hunter had seven.

GAME 14

SOUTHERN 67, TSU 58

1/4/25 • Houston, Texas

TSU men's basketball rode a roller coaster of emotions in its season opener as they fell 67-58 to Southern on Saturday inside the H&PE Arena.

TSU came out strong as they opened the first half 5-of-9 as four players would score en route to a 15-7 lead within the first seven minutes. Defensively, TSU held SU to only two field goals while forcing three turnovers.

After strong start, the bottom would fall out for the Tigers as Southern reversed course and went on a 19-0 run to claim a 26-15 lead as TSU went nine minutes without a basket during a 0-for-13 drought. By the time the dust settled, TSU was down 26-15 until two Kavion McClain free throws drew them to within 26-17 with 1:23 left. TSU would out-score SU 6-4 to close out the half down 29-21.

The Jaguars opened the second half with another big run as they had a 19-4 surge during the first 6:01. However, the Tigers finally fought themselves out of their early funk with a 19-2 run which energized the crowd and cut the deficit to 50-46 after Zaire Hayes' free throw. During the run, TSU rode the hot hand of Jaylin Jackson-Posey with nine points followed by six from Hayes. TSU also set the tone defensively as they forced five

SU turnovers during the run.

Down 50-46, TSU had a chance to draw closer but missed two short attempts at the basket. SU would answer with a trey to move ahead 53-46 followed by two free throws to lead 55-46. TSU would get it down to seven points on several occasions from that point but couldn't get over the hump as SU closed out the game with the win.

Hayes led TSU with 19 followed by 11 from Duane Posey. Kenny Hunter grabbed seven rebounds and blocked two shots.

TSU 71, GRAMBLING STATE 66

1/6/25 • Houston, Texas

TSU overcame a four-point deficit in overtime with defense and clutch free throw shooting to defeat Grambling State 71-66 Monday night inside the H&PE Arena.

Based on the past history between both teams, the contest would be close and it was to begin with as TSU would claim an early 11-7 lead as Kenny Hunter led the way for the Tigers with four early points but GSU's Ernest Ross would set the tone for a rare battle of post players with five points.

After the early lead, Grambling State would begin to settle into a groove as the Tigers would go on a 15-5 run over the next 5:25 as Mikale Stevenson capped the run off with a layup off a TSU turnover for a 22-16 lead. TSU's Grayson Carter would end the drought with a three-pointer that bounced in and the Tigers would settle down as Zaire Hayes scored five points to jumpstart a 10-4 surge to knot the contest at 26-all with 4:10 left.

Grambling State would move back ahead by four for the next minute but TSU's defense rose to the occasion as Jaylin Jackson-Posey blocked a shot which turned into a Josh Farmer dunk as TSU trailed 30-28 with 1:22 left. Hayes' jumper with 35 seconds left tied it up at 30-all and TSU would move ahead 32-30 at the end of the half after a missed GSU jumper courtesy of Kavion McClain's jumper with a second left.

The second half would see TSU claw its way through with several opportunities to move ahead by a large margin but GSU found ways

to keep it close when the momentum was beginning to swing TSU's way. TSU would find itself up by seven on three occasions within the final 8:25 with the last at the 2:06 mark after Hayes' jumper.

Once again, the history books would come into play from that point as the turnover bug haunted TSU. The Tigers committed two crucial turnovers at the 1:11 and 56 second mark which led to GSU chipping away at the lead from the free throw line. With TSU ahead 57-55 in the final 30 seconds, the Tigers had a chance for a two-possession lead but missed the jumper. Grambling State was fouled with 13 seconds left on a drive attempt and connected on the game-tying free throws at 57-all. TSU had a shot to win it but turned the ball over with two seconds left as GSU's game-tying desperation shot fell short.

GSU's Mikale Stevenson opened the overtime period with a bucket but Jaylin Jackson-Posey answered calmly with a three-pointer to move ahead 63-62. The contest would turn physical from that point as GSU would move ahead 64-60 with 2:06 left after a free throw. However, TSU would counter as Zaire Hayes hit a big three-pointer to cut the deficit to 64-63 at the 1:50 mark.

Grambling State was fouled on the ensuing attempt but an injury forced them to change free throw shooters. They would miss both attempts with 1:36 left and the game came down to the free throw line as Hayes hit 1-of-2 to tie it at 64. Hayes was fouled again after a GSU miss and hit two more free throws for a 66-64 lead and came up big defensively with a steal but the ensuing free throw were missed. Grambling State would miss a three-point attempt at the 23 second mark and TSU would ice the game from the line with five points in the final 17 seconds.

Hayes continued his superb play with 24 points while McClain added 11 with five assists. Jackson-Posey grabbed nine rebounds with five assists while Kenny Hunter blocked five shots, grabbed six rebounds with five steals.

Texas Southern broke open a tight game with a 37-9 run midway through the second half to defeat Mississippi Valley State 82-53 Monday night on the road.

The first half was tight from start-to-finish with a total of six ties. Mississippi Valley State would lead by as much as four (11-7) early in the half. TSU countered with an 8-2 run to lead 15-13 but the Delta Devils fought back and only missed two field goals from that point as they closed out the first half with a 28-27 lead.

The contest remained close to open the second half as TSU would hold a narrow 40-38 lead after a MVSU three-pointer with 13:05 left. TSU would begin to create separation from that point with a 7-0 run led by four points from Josh Farmer en route to a 47-38 lead with 11:33 left. MVSU would end its drought with a basket but the Tigers would continue to pour it on as Kavion McClain and Kenny Hunter combined to score 19 points over the next eight minutes as TSU went on a 30-point swing to remove all doubt and seize any hopes of a MVSU comeback.

McClain led TSU 14 points followed by 13 from Hunter and 12 from Kehlin Farooq off the bench. Hunter grabbed nine rebounds while McClain dished out four assists and had five steals.

GAME 17

TSU 66, ALCORN STATE 57 1/18/25 • Houston, Texas

Texas Southern men's basketball upped its winning streak to three games after holding off a furious Alcorn State comeback Saturday evening inside the H&PE Arena.

Both teams were neck-to-neck to open the game as it was setting up to become the typical Alcorn State-TSU battle down to the wire. However, the Tigers set the tone defensively and took ownership of the game on the defensive end which fueled their offense from that point as they outscored ASU 19-4 over the next eight minutes as five Tigers scored. TSU also held ASU scoreless during a seven-minute stretch during the run.

TSU would only allow one more field goal from that point as they closed out the half with a bang en route to a 34-12 score.

Alcorn State opened the second half on an 11-0 run to cut the lead to 34-23 with 17:07 left. They would get as close as 10 (35-25) a minute later but TSU took control as Jaylen Wysinger scored five points to spark a 14-5 run as TSU led comfortably (49-30) at the 11:02 mark.

The Braves wouldn't go away as they countered with a 16-6 run to trail 55-46 with 5:21 left. TSU's Duane Posey would excite the crowd with a huge dunk to lead 57-46 but once again ASU kept chiseling away at the lead. With 38 seconds left, ASU recorded a jumper to draw within 61-57 but was forced to foul on the defensive end to save clock. Jaylin Jackson-Posey would hit 1-of-2 free throws but Posey came up huge with an offensive rebound which led to an ASU foul as TSU would hit all four of its free throws to seal the game.

Zaire Hayes led TSU with 16 points followed by 11 from Wysinger and 10 by Posey. Posey added three blocks while Kenny Hunter had six boards and two blocks.

TSU won its fourth-straight contest with clutch plays down the stretch as they defeated Jackson State 81-73 on Monday inside the H&PE Arena.

TSU 82, ALABAMA A&M 73

It wasn't the prettiest of wins, but TSU will take it as they outlasted Alabama A&M 82-78 in overtime on Saturday inside the AAMU Events Center.

With the win, TSU head coach Johnny Jones is 13-0 lifetime against Alabama A&M. TSU continues its domination in the series against Alabama A&M as the Tigers have won 22 straight and 33 of the past 34 matchups. Despite the historical data, AAMU played TSU close last season in the semifinals of the SWAC Tournament and Saturday's contest ended up being the same.

TSU wasted no time in setting the tone as they opened the contest a perfect 5-of-5 from the field within the first 4:17. AAMU would heat up with a 6-0 run to trail 11-9 but Kenny Hunter would put the team on his back as TSU was a perfect 4-for-4 over the next 3:26 as his six points upped the margin to 19-13 with 10:24 left. TSU would lead by as much as 11 (27-16) in the first half but AAMU would chip away to trail 30-24 at the half.

A 7-2 run by TSU to open the second half upped the lead back to double digits at 37-25. Both teams would match production over the next seven minutes as TSU used the free throw line to its advantage as they led 53-41 after a Kolby Granger jumper with 6:48 left. The next four minutes weren't too kind for the Tigers as they failed to get a field goal off while committing five turnovers as AAMU outscored them 13-3 to get within 56-54 with 2:47 left.

Despite the setback, Kavion McClain took over with five quick points within 28 seconds to move the lead back to 61-54 with 2:19 left. However, AAMU refused to go away as they outscored TSU 9-2 over the next 1:50 to knot it at 63-all with five seconds left as they were whistled for free throw attempts with five seconds left. AAMU's Darius Ford missed the potential go-ahead free throw with five seconds left but a jump ball situation off a Kehlin Farooq rebound gave them a chance to win once again with two seconds left. AAMU had two shots to win it in that span but fell short as TSU went into OT for the second time this year in SWAC play.

a 47-41 lead after Kavion McClain's three-pointer at the 13:43 mark. JSU would answer with a three-pointer on the ensuing possession but Jaylin Jackson-Posey's two free throws pushed the lead back to five. The rare four-point play by Jayme Mitchell, Jr. from Jackson State cut the TSU lead to 49-48 and after a pair of missed TSU free throws, Tamarion Hoover nailed a trey to give JSU a 51-49 margin with 11:57 left.

Kavion McClain's trey moved TSU back on top 52-51 as the Tigers upped their margin to as much as five (58-53) with 8:34 left after Jaylen Wysinger's trey. However, JSU would reclaim a 59-58 lead with 6:26 left after a pair of Hoover free throws.

The lead would change hands on six occasions over the next three minutes as a three-pointer from Mitchell, Jr. moved JSU on top 66-65 with 3:37 left. Duane Posey, who's making a name for himself with his intensity in the paint, responded with a big basket in the paint to move TSU ahead 67-66. JSU would miss a three-pointer on the ensuing basket and Kenny Hunter hit a big jumper from the free throw line with 2:36 left for a 69-66 margin. However, TSU was whistled for a technical on the play and JSU flipped the three-point deficit to one (69-68).

JSU committed a costly turnover on its next possession as the ball was thrown too low to the post and rolled out of bounds. TSU responded with a big three-pointer from McClain for a 72-68 lead and JSU missed a long three-point attempt on its next possession. Duane Posey was fouled with 1:12 left and hit two free throws for a 74-68 lead.

JSU's Shannon Grant hit one-of-two free throws after being fouled and they were forced to prolong the game by sending TSU to the free throw line. Despite the pressure mounting, TSU remained calm, cool and collected as McClain and Kehlin Farooq was a combined 7-for-7 from the stripe to seal the win.

McClain scored a game-high 20 points while Posey added 15 followed by 10 from Wysinger. Jackson-Posey and Kolby Granger had seven rebounds apiece.

Since 2007, TSU is 25-14 against JSU and has won 17 of the past 21 dating back to 2015. TSU has won 11 of the past 14 against JSU. Since 2012, TSU is 20-8 against JSU.

TSU opened with two quick baskets from Hunter and Jaylin Jackson-Posey in overtime to take a 68-63 lead. AAMU would trim it to three and eventually one at 69-68 with 1:39 left but Jackson-Posey answered the AAMU trey with his second trey of the period for a 72-68 margin with 1:12 left. AAMU missed its next basket and McClain hit two free throws to lead by six. The Bulldogs would miss another three-pointer and TSU threw the dagger down as Kehlin Farooq dunked home a bucket for a 76-68 lead. TSU would close out the game with McClain shooting 6-of-6 from the free throw line to seal the win.

McClain scored 20 points and dished out seven assists for TSU followed by 19 from Hunter and 10 by Jaylen Wysinger. Duane Posey had another strong day in the paint with 11 rebounds.

TSU 80, ALABAMA STATE 69

1/27/25 • Montgomery, Ala.

Jaylen Wysinger had a career-night with 23 points as TSU used a late run in the final four minutes to claim an 80-69 road win at Alabama State Monday night.

The Hornets jumped out to a 15-8 lead early in the first half but Kavion McClain and Wysinger scored the next five points to slow the momentum down as TSU trailed 15-13. TSU turned to the three-point ball to jump start its offense as Wysinger nailed two straight triples followed by one from McClain for a 9-2 run and a 22-15 Tiger lead. The momentum would move back to the Hornets over the next few minutes as they answered with a 14-2 run to claim a 29-24 lead at the 3:26 mark. TSU would use the free throw line to its advantage to close out the half as they trailed 33-30.

Head coach Johnny Jones and staff made the necessary adjustments at halftime as there were three lead changes within the first five minutes. Kenny Hunter would move the lead back to TSU following a jumper as they led 40-39 with 14:56 left. Hunter score again for a 42-39 lead as TSU and ASU battled back-and-forth like heavyweight boxers over the next few minutes except the fact that TSU kept the lead in their corner.

TSU 79, PRAIRIE VIEW A&M 63 **2/1/25 • Houston, Texas**

Texas Southern won its seventh straight contest as Kavion McClain led a 27-9 second half run en route to a 79-63 win over Prairie View A&M on Saturday inside the H&PE Arena.

Prairie View A&M would lead 7-6 to begin the game but Kenny Hunter's basket off a Josh Farmer rebound quickly gave the Tigers an 8-7 lead. From there, both teams would go back-and-forth with the Tigers finding ways to stay in front despite some early shooting success by the Panthers.

Tied at 17-all with 8:30 left, TSU would attempt to create some separation over the next 5:48 as four Tigers would score during that span en route to a 27-21 margin with three minutes remaining. On the flip side, PVAMU used the three-ball to its advantage as Braelon Bush scored all seven of its points. But in typical PVAMU-TSU fashion, the Panthers fought back towards the close of the half as they held TSU without a field goal attempt over the final 1:59 as Tanahj Pettway's buzzer beater layup closed the gap to 28-27 at the half.

After a spirited halftime ceremony which saw the TSU soccer team honored for its regular season championship along with the Ocean of Soul Marching Band's performance, the Tigers managed to keep the energy generated on the court to open the second half.

A Farmer dunk at the 19:26 mark gave TSU a 32-27 lead but PVAMU eventually closed the gap and tied it at 35-all with 16:48 left. The Panthers missed an opportunity to move ahead and the spotlight would turn to a one Kavion McClain over the next eight minutes.

McClain was fouled with 16:21 left and hit two free throws for a 37-35 lead. PVAMU would knot it again at 37-all after a Pettway tip-in but McClain answered with a trey for a 40-37 margin. McClain's try jump-started a series where TSU would score on eight consecutive possessions as the lead jumped to 51-42. McClain continued to heat up from that point as he scored eight of the next 10 points during a two-minute span as TSU opened it up and led 59-36.

By the time the dust settled and the crowd was feeling comfortable, TSU led 64-46 and was never seriously challenged from that point as they won their third straight over PVAMU and third consecutive game over them by double digits.

McClain led the way with 23 points, five rebounds, four steals and four assists. Zaire Hayes returned to the lineup with 14 points while Josh Farmer and Duane Posey added 10 each. Kolby Granger grabbed eight rebounds while Farmer and Kehlin Farooq had six boards.

UAPB 69, TSU 68 **2/4/25 • Pine Bluff, Ark.**

TSU's seven-game winning stream was halted in the final minutes at Arkansas-Pine Bluff by a 69-68 margin on Tuesday.

Playing a makeup date due to a weather-related postponement in January, UAPB took advantage of its rare schedule change as they jumped out to a 20-12 lead early on before TSU finally responded with a 9-0 run to lead 21-20 with seven minutes left in the first half. UAPB would answer with a

trey on its next possession and held on to the lead en route to a 33-27 halftime lead.

The deficit grew to nine (36-27) early on but TSU responded with a 15-3 run as Jaylin Jackson-Posey scored five points to lead the charge as TSU led 42-39. TSU maintained its lead and led by as much as six (63-57) with 7:15 left but would only score one point over the next 2:31 as UAPB went on an 8-1 run to regain a 65-64 lead with 4:02 left. With 2:22 left, TSU regained a 66-65 lead but UAPB countered with a basket to move ahead 67-66. TSU picked up a big steal late but nearly turned it over until they forced a jump ball to regain possession, TSU had a shot to win it twice but missed both attempts as time expired.

The Tigers (10-12, 7-2) were led in scoring by Kavion McClain, who finished with 19 points. Kenny Hunter added 15 points, 15 rebounds and two steals for Texas Southern. Zaire Hayes also had 11 points and six rebounds.

Florida A&M scored a basket with 3.2 seconds left to break a late tie and secure a win over TSU on Saturday night.

FAMU broke open a 15-all tie with a 17-6 run or a 32-21 lead at the 4:36 mark. However, TSU would fight back towards halftime with a 7-0 run to trail 32-28. FAMU would open the second half with an 8-3 run to lead 40-31. Kehlin Farooq would spark a 10-5 TSU surge to draw within 43-41 with 10:41 left but FAMU would maintain its lead over the next few minutes via the free throw line as they shot 6-of-6 to lead 49-44 with 7:55 left. An 8-0 run by TSU moved them ahead 52-49 but FAMU answered with a trey to tie it at 52-all with 5:51 left.

From there it was back-and-forth with multiple lead changes but FAMU's success from the free throw line (7-of-8) was the big difference as they found ways to get to the line when it appeared its offensive pos-

For the third straight night, TSU fell in the closing seconds as Bethune-Cookman claimed an 80-77 win inside the H&PE Arena.

With TSU ahead 12-7 early on, Bethune-Cookman would turn the tide with a 15-3 run as they only missed two shots during the five-minute run en route to a 22-15 lead.

The Tigers responded with a 17-5 run over the next five minutes as they shot 70 percent (7-of-10) from the field as Kehlin Farooq led the way with six points. TSU doubled up Grambling State over the final 8:49 to break its three-game losing streak as they won 67-60 Saturday evening.

With TSU trailing 12-10 early in the second half, Grambling State went on a 12-2 run over the next 3:51 to extend its lead to 24-12. Grambling State would lead by double digits up until right below the four-minute mark but TSU outscored GSU 10-6 over the final 3:50 as Oumar Koureissi led the way with six points while Kavion McClain picked up a steal in the closing seconds and found Bryce Roberts for the score at the buzzer for 37-30 halftime deficit.

TSU continued to fight to open the second half as Duane Posey and Jaylin Jackson-Posey scored seven of the first nine points to spark a 9-4 run as TSU trailed 41-39. TSU would finally move ahead on Jack-

son-Posey's three-pointer at the 13:58 mark but the momentum was short as GSU went on a 7-0 run to lead 52-46 with 11:34 left. The three-point line would become TSU's friend over the next 3:08 as TSU made three treys to spark a 13-1 run as they reclaimed a 59-53 lead after Grayson Carter's trey.

Despite only recording one field goal over the final 6:34, TSU did its part on the defensive end and held GSU to only two field goals during that span while shooting 6-of-7 from the free throw line to record its first series sweep over Grambling State since 2022.

JOHNNY JONES HEAD COACH



Johnny Jones begins his seventh season as Texas Southern's head men's basketball coach.

Jones quickly made his mark on the TSU program as he led the Tigers on a history-making season in 2018-19 which included wins over three teams from Power 5 Conferences.

He quickly set the tone with a win over Baylor in his TSU debut as it marked the first-ever loss by Baylor to a team from the Southwestern Athletic Conference. Several weeks later, Jones once again made headlines as the Tigers knocked off No. 18 Oregon on the road. The loss was only the fourth non-conference defeat for Oregon since the Ducks opened Matthew Knight Arena in 2011. The Tigers capped off non-conference play with a solid win over Texas A&M of the SEC as the Tigers recorded their first-ever win over Texas A&M since the series began.

The Tigers completed the 2018-19 regular season with a 14-4 SWAC mark and the No. 2 seed in postseason play. The Tigers advanced to the finals of the 2019 SWAC Tournament for the third consecutive season and was selected to participate in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament. TSU turned its play up another level in postseason play as they embarked on its longest postseason run since winning the 1977 NAIA Tournament with a 3-1 record and an appearance in the semifinal round.

Under Jones, senior forward Jeremy Combs had a breakout year as he was named Honorable Mention All-American by the Associated Press and was the SWAC's Player and Newcomer of the Year. The 6-7 standout also earned the league's player of the week award five times.

Despite the loss of an All-American in Combs, TSU once again remained in the upper echelon of the SWAC as the Tigers finished in third place and continued their dominance inside the H&PE Arena with a 10-1 record. TSU won its 10th consecutive first round opener in the SWAC Tournament which ultimately would be its last contest due to COVID-19. Senior guard

Tyrik Armstrong received NABC All-District 22 First Team and All-SWAC First Team honors while sophomore forward Yahuza Rasas earned both NABC and All-SWAC Second Team honors. For the second straight season, TSU had a player move on to the professional ranks as forward Eden Ewing was signed by Michelin Etha Engomis Nicosia of the OPAP Basketball League.

In 2020-21, Jones set another milestone as he returned TSU to the NCAA Tournament for the ninth time in university history and fourth time as a head coach following an impressive SWAC Tournament run. The Tigers also made history with its second NCAA Tournament win in school history following a 60-52 win over Mount St. Mary's.

TSU overcame a myriad of obstacles during the regular season and continued to persevere as the team picked up a Mountain West non-conference win over Wyoming. TSU entered the 2021 postseason as one of the hottest teams nationally by winning 14-of-15 heading into the NCAA Tournament. TSU also featured Jones' second SWAC's Newcomer of the Year and SWAC Tournament MVP in Michael Weathers in addition to an All-SWAC Tournament team member in Karl Nicholas.

Jones ushered the Tigers into the 2021-22 season full of expectations and they lived up to them. TSU made history once again as they became the first team in SWAC history to defeat a ranked opponent from the SEC after an impressive 69-54 win over No. 20 Florida on Dec. 6. While the win was monumental, TSU has been there before as this was its first win over a ranked team since a win at Oregon in 2018 and its second ranked win since 2014. In addition, the win also marked the first against an SEC opponent since 2018 (Texas A&M). Statistically, the Tigers dominated the boards as the top rebounding team in the SWAC while also leading the league in blocks. Once the dust settled, TSU finished where prognosticators expected as they captured its 10th SWAC Tournament Championship and NCAA Tournament berth after an impressive SWAC Tournament run which featured two dominant wins. Jones also had his second SWAC Tournament MVP in newcomer PJ Henry along with all-tourney team member John Walker III.

The Tigers once again made the SWAC proud as they earned its third overall and second straight NCAA Tournament win after defeating Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and earning the right to play eventual national champion Kansas in Fort Worth, Texas.

In 2022-23, TSU made SWAC history as it became the first eighth seed to win a SWAC Tournament as they knocked off the first, second and fifth seeds. TSU earned the right to participate in its fourth straight NCAA First Four as it ran TSU's postseason streak to nine seasons. Future NBA G-Leaguer Joirdon Karl Nicholas was named to the 2022-23 All-SWAC Second Team as he finished his career with nine double-doubles in addition to surpassing the 1,000-point career mark this season.

During the 2023-24 campaign, Jones once again made history as he achieved his 400th career win after TSU's season-finale win over Prairie View A&M while also earning his 100th career win at TSU several weeks earlier. The Tigers continued their postseason excellence as they advanced to the SWAC Tournament finals for the 19th time in program history as it marked the seventh consecutive season TSU has advanced

to the finals of the SWAC Tournament. TSU also extended its post-SWAC Tournament postseason appearance streak to seven years as they participated in the CIT for the second time in university history.

Once again, Jones' team featured a 1,000-point career scorer in All-SWAC guard PJ Henry while guard Jonathan Cisse closed out his career with several career scoring highs throughout the season.

Prior to arriving at TSU, Jones served as the Nevada Wolf Pack's associate head coach for one season. Jones came to Nevada after five seasons as the head coach at LSU.

Jones helped the Wolf Pack win a second consecutive Mountain West outright regular season title going 15-3 in conference play and 29-8 overall. The 29 wins tied the school record. The Pack made a second consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and reached the Sweet 16 for the second time in school history.

Prior to Nevada, Jones spent five years as head coach at his alma mater, LSU. He won 90 games in his five years as the head coach at LSU, the most of any head coach at LSU in their first five years. He was the fourth-winningest coach in LSU history. The DeRidder, La. native led the LSU Tigers to two postseason appearances, an NIT and NCAA tournament bid, and coached the 2016 No. 1 overall pick in the NBA draft Ben Simmons.

While at LSU, Coach Jones also recruited future NBA players Tim Quarterman, Johnny O'Bryant, Jordan Mickey and Jarrell Martin. Among those he helped recruit to LSU in his assistant days were NBA superstar and Naismith Hall of Famer, Shaquille O'Neal. He also was involved in the recruiting of two-time All-American Chris Jackson (now Mahmoud Abdul-Rauf) and national high school player of the year (and an assistant coach under Jones), Randy Livingston.

Jones was also a head coach at North Texas for 11 seasons from 2001-12. He led the Mean Green to two NCAA tournaments berths and five top-three conference finishes. Overall, Jones has 34 years of Division I coaching experience, including 18 seasons as a head coach.

During the 1999-2000 season Jones was the interim head coach at Memphis and led the Tigers to a 15-16 record.

Jones played his college ball at LSU. He was a part of the 1981 Final Four team and joined head coach Dale Brown's staff after his playing time, helping lead the Tigers to another Final Four in 1986. Jones and his wife Kelli have two children, John, a TSU graduate and current assistant, and Jillian.
