A CONCISE HISTORY OF **TEXAS SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY**

Texas Southern University, a special purpose institution for urban programming, has a history that dates to 1927. The University's earliest antecedents were characterized by a progression of institutional constructs; extension classes, a junior college, a four-year private institution, and, ultimately, a state-supported institution. The University's status as an institution of higher learning came during the era of segregation when the State of Texas denied Heman Marion Sweatt, an African American, entrance into the University of Texas Law School. Consequently, on March 3, 1947, the Texas State Senate of the 50th Legislature passed Senate Bill 140 providing for the establishment of the institution, including a law school, to be located

in Houston. This bill was complemented use Bill 788, which called for the purchase of a 53-acre site to house the campus. Thus, was born Texas State University for Negroes; its name changed in June 1, 1951, to Texas Southern University.

Designated as an institution of the "first class," when the University opened its doors in September 1947, it had 2,300 students, two schools, one division and one college – the Law School, the Pharmacy School, the Vocational Division, and the College of Arts and Sciences. Responding to the changing times, in 1973, the 63rd Legislature designated Texas Southern University as a "special purpose" institution for urban programming. As a result, four more academic units were added – the College of Education, the School of

Public Affairs, and the School of Communications. This designation described what Texas Southern University was doing from its inception – embracing diversity.

Today, Texas Southern University offers bachelor's, master's and doctoral degree programs in the following academic colleges and schools: the College of Liberal Arts and Behavioral Sciences; the College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences; the College of Science, Engineering and Technology; the College of Education; the Barbara Jordan-Mickey Leland School of Public Affairs; the School of Communication; the Thurgood Marshall School of Law; the Jesse .H. Jones School of Business; the Graduate School; and the College of Transdisciplinary Studies.



ABOUT THE CITY OF HOUSTON

Houston, the fourth largest city in the United States, has a population of more than 4 million. Its residents, representing a variety of cultures, contribute to Houston's strong international orientation in the arts, entertainment, commerce, and education. From multicultural extravaganzas such as the Houston International Festival and the Houston International Film Festival in the spring to the Italian, Caribbean, Greek, Hispanic, Mediterranean and Egyptian festivals in the fall, international students will find numerous diversions that remind them of home. The city also offers a broad variety of ethnic cuisines, such as Chinese, Ethiopian, Bangladeshi, Greek, Indonesian, Indian, South American, Japanese, Persian, Mexican and Thai. Between festivals and dining at a favorite ethnic restaurant, the international student can also enjoy the traditional performing arts. Houston is home to permanent companies such as The Houston Grand Opera, The Houston Symphony, The Houston Ballet, and The Alley Theater and The Ensemble Theater.

Houston, of course, is also home to the Johnson Space Center, which includes the control center for all manned U.S. space flights, and the Texas Medical Center, the largest medical center in the world. As major international business center, Houston ranks third nationally in the number of foreign trade offices and is the base of operations for the international energy industry. In addition, more than 50 foreign governments maintain consular offices in the city, making Houston's consular corps the largest in the South and Southwest.

Arrival in Houston

You can reach TSU from any part of the Greater Houston area in less than 20 minutes. Three major freeways exit near the campus, and Metro has several bus stops in front of the University.

Houston has two airports, Houston Bush Intercontinental and Houston Hobby. Houston Bush Intercontinental Airport is located 25 miles north of the city. The airport bus service, located near the baggage claim area, runs every 30 minutes from 7:15-12:45 a.m. The bus goes to downtown Houston. From there, students can take a taxi to the university or to a hotel near the university.

Alternatively, students can travel by taxi from the airport directly to the university. Taxi fare is more expensive than the airport bus fare. Houston's Hobby Airport is much closer to the university. Taxi service is located in the airport's ground transportation area.

Texas Southern University is a small version of the City of Houston, with its many cultures and great vitality. Students of all ages and ethnic backgrounds mix in a comfortable atmosphere. TSU's location in Houston, its diversity and its vitality make it an exciting place to study and learn.

TEXAS SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY
PRESIDENT **JAMES W. CRAWFORD III**



James W. Crawford III, Vice Admiral, JAGC, U.S. Navy (Retired) is the 14th President of Texas Southern University.

He was appointed by the TSU Board of Regents in May 2024. Crawford is a decorated veteran, strategic planner and decisionmaker, academic leader, collaborator, and problem solver governed by three guiding principles: faith, family, and service.

He was appointed by President Obama as the 43rd Judge Advocate General of the United States Navy. He served as the principal military legal counsel to the Secretary of the Navy and Chief of Naval Operations, and the Department of Defense Representative for Ocean Policy Affairs (REPOPA). He also led over 2,300 attorneys, enlisted paralegals, and civilian employees of the worldwide Navy JAG Corps community.

A 1979 student-athlete graduate of Belmont Abbey College, he was commissioned through the JAG Corps Student Program in 1983, following graduation from the University of North Carolina School of Law at Chapel Hill. He later earned a Master of Laws degree (Ocean and Coastal Law) from the University of Miami School of Law and a Master of Arts in National Security and Strategic Studies from the Naval War College. In 2008, he was named an MIT Seminar XXI Fellow.

Crawford previously served as a consultant on International Humanitarian Law for Palantir Technologies for developing artificial intelligence solutions to improve protections for civilians and civilian infrastructure during armed conflict. From 2020 to 2023, he served as the first male president of Felician University, a 2,100-student Roman Catholic university in Lodi and Rutherford, New Jersey.

Crawford and his wife, Elizabeth, have twin teenage sons, Nicholas and Alexander.

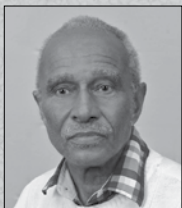

Clyde E. Duncan, Sr. was named head coach of the men's and women's track and field team at his Alma Mater in 1995. As a world-respected athlete and coach, Duncan brings a wealth of experience, knowledge and enthusiasm to the Flying Tiger program.

From 1995-2013, Duncan served as head coach of both the men's and women's track & field team before coaching the men exclusively from 2013-2024. In May of 2024, he was appointed to lead both programs once again.

On the men's side, the program continues to make history. After making SWAC history during the 2023-24 campaign, the Tigers picked up where they left off in 2024-25 with their second consecutive men's cross country championship and followed it up in February 2025 with the program's second straight indoor championship.

During the 2023-24 season, TSU men's track & field made SWAC history as the first team since 2011 to complete the rare trifecta which consists of winning cross country, indoor and outdoor track & field championships in the same calendar year.

In 2015, the men's track & field team captured the 2015 Southwestern Athletic Conference Indoor Title marking the program's first Championship since 1994. Texas Southern swept the league's track and field titles during the 2016 campaign as they claimed both the Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field Championships.

In 2019, TSU won its first men's cross country title since 1993 while the men's cross country team was named a 2019 NCAA Division I Men's All-Academic team by the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA).



Since 2021, the program has remained amongst the upper echelon of the SWAC as TSU has finished no less than fourth place in the indoor championships and third during the outdoor championships. Individually, Duncan has had several student-athletes compete at the NCAA Championship and NCAA Preliminary Rounds over the past decade highlighted by Tremedia Brice's 200-meter NCAA Indoor Championship in 2005.

During the mid to late eighties, Duncan served as the head men and women's track and field coach at Arizona State. Prior to his appointment, he spent three seasons at the University of Washington as the head women's track and field coach and was in charge

of sprints for the men's squad.

Duncan spent five years with the University of Houston (1977-1982). He was responsible for sprinters, relay teams, hurdlers and recruiting. He also recruited University of Houston Hall of Famer and Olympian Carl Lewis to the Cougar program in 1980.

Duncan has also held head coaching positions at Grambling State University and at Wiley College earlier in his career. He began his coaching career at Texas Southern in 1969 under former TSU standout head coach Dave Bethany.

As a Collegiate athlete, Duncan and the Flying Tigers held three world records under legendary track and field coach Stan Wright. Duncan and his teammates posted the 4x100 relay world record on two separate occasions. The Flying Tigers indoor mile relay squad set the 1966 world mark in this event. Also, the 1965 sprint medley relay broke the world record and Duncan earned the title of the "World fastest Human" during his freshman year. Additionally, he was the National Athletic Intercollegiate Association's 60-yard dash champion.

Duncan was inducted into the National Federation of State High School Association's Hall of Fame in



July 2007. He won nine state boys' track championships in the early 1960s while attending North High School in Des Moines, Ia.

He swept the 100, 220 and 440-yard dashes from 1962 to 1964. Amazingly in 2007, he still owns the state's top time (9.3) in the 100-yard dash. He was the 14th Iowan inducted into the National Hall of Fame, which was founded in 1982 to honor students, coaches and officials involved in high school extracurricular activities. Duncan was also inducted into the Drake Relays Hall of Fame and in 2010, he was inducted into the SWAC Hall of Fame.

In January of 2023, Duncan was inducted into the Texas Track & Field Coaches Association's 2023 Hall of

Fame Class. He was one of seven members inducted into the prestigious group.

The Des Moines, Ia. native received a bachelor's degree from Texas Southern in 1969 and a master's degree in 1972. He is married to Juanita, and they have six children, Gina, Nina, Clyde, Jr., Billy, Shawn and Brandon.

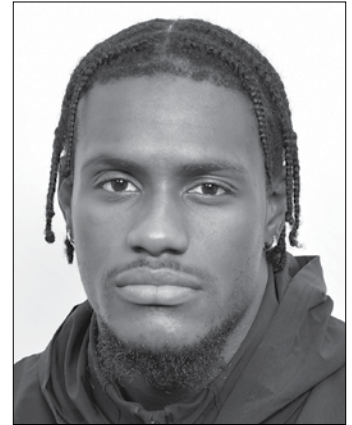

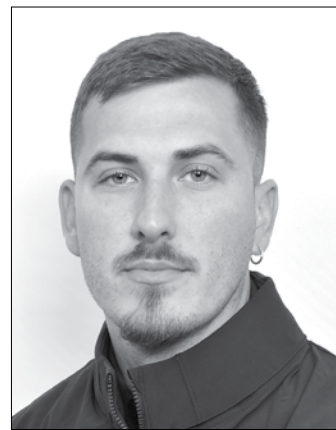

Clyde E. Duncan, Jr., Ph.D. is widely recognized as one of the “official voices” of Track and Field, as well as other sporting events and speaking engagements. Duncan, Jr. is known by his signature phrase, which has given him recognition as the “CLAP CLAP MAN!” Duncan, Jr. provides insight and excitement to competitions and functions around the world. Duncan, Jr. has served as the Public Address (P.A.) Announcer for the Texas Southern University (TSU) Relays since 1998, the NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships, Big-12 Conference Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field Championships, Ivy League Heptagonal Indoor Track and Field Championships at Columbia University, Cornell University, Dartmouth College and Harvard University, SWAC Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field Championships, Conference-USA Cross Country/Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field Championships, Southland Conference Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field Championships, Badger Windy City Invite - Chicago, Illinois, New Balance Nationals Outdoor (NBNO) Championships - Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, American Southwest Conference Outdoor Track and Field Championships, Texas Relays, AAU Indoor National Track and Field Championships, Southwest Preparatory Conference Track and Field Championships, the University of Houston, Prairie View A&M University, Rice University, Stephen F. Austin State University, Texas A&M University, Texas



State University, Sam Houston State University, University of the Incarnate Word, the Awty International School, the John Cooper School, Lancaster High School, TAPPS District and Regional Track and Field Championships, UIL High School Regional Track and Field Championships and several High School and Youth track and field competitions. He has served as the Master of Ceremonies for the Lay Witnesses for Christ International Christian Athlete of the Year Awards, the University of Houston Track and Field Awards Banquet, the Texas Southern University All-Sports Banquet as well as other events.

For over 26 years, Dr. Duncan, Jr. have serves as a professor and more recently the Internship Coordinator at Texas Southern University in the School of Communication. Duncan spent ten

years with the Texas Southern University running programs starting as a volunteer in 1997. From 1998 to 2006, Duncan, Jr. served as the Head Coach for the Men's and Women's Cross-Country Teams. As the Assistant Track and Field Coach, he primarily worked with the field event and distance personnel. Duncan led several “Flying Tigers” to the SWAC Cross Country/ Indoor and Outdoor individual championships, with five top nine finishes at the NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field Championships during his tenure.

While competing, Duncan, Jr. was a member of the Arizona State University and the University of Houston Track and Field Teams. In 1989

and 1990, he earned All-American honors in the Long Jump and as a member of UH Cougar 4x100 relay team. He received two Bachelor's Degrees and two Master Degrees from Texas Southern University in both Speech Communication and Sociology and has a Ph.D. in African-American Ministry.

Rev. Duncan, Jr. is a licensed and ordained minister and is married to the former Nikki Edwards, Ed.D. (Co-announcer). They have three daughters, Dr. Dominique (All-American/Graduate of Texas A&M University & Texas Southern University, now competing internationally), Alia (Texas State Champion in Track and Field - TSU Relays D.J./Graduate of Texas Southern University) and Kayla (Scholar - TSU Relays D.J.).

MEN'S TRACK & FIELD REPEATS AS SWAC INDOOR CHAMPIONS

Texas Southern men's track & field won its second consecutive SWAC Indoor Championship with a thrilling finish at the Birmingham Crossplex.

Between last year's trifecta of winning men's cross country, indoor/outdoor titles, and the 2024 men's cross country championship, TSU has now won five consecutive titles under head coach emeritus Clyde Duncan, Sr. Duncan, Sr. also won his fifth straight SWAC Coach of the Year honor.



MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY WINS 2ND CONSECUTIVE SWAC CHAMPIONSHIP AFTER DOMINANT PERFORMANCE

For the second straight year, the TSU men's cross country team used a team effort to capture its second consecutive SWAC Men's Cross Country Championship at Apalachee Regional Park.

Facing stiff competition from rival Prairie View A&M and Alabama A&M early on, the Tigers took full control of the 8K race around the four-minute mark (1.3K mile mark).

Manuel Garza and Brandon Adolphus were named to the 2024 All-SWAC Second Team for their efforts while Director of Track & Field Clyde Duncan, Sr. was named SWAC Men's Cross Country Coach of the Year.

WOMEN'S TRACK PLACES 4TH, BROWN NAMED TOP TRACK PERFORMER



Sophomore Alyvia Brown earned top honors as the TSU women's track & field placed fourth at the 2025 SWAC Indoor Championships. Brown, who was named the SWAC's Track Performer of the Year, set the tone from the opening race as she won the 3,000 on Saturday with a personal-best time of 10:10.49. In the field events, Destinee Payne placed fifth in the long jump with a length of 18-10.5 feet.

On Sunday, Brown won the 5,000 as she dominated the field with a time of 18:15.64 while also finishing second in the mile run after a tight race with a personal-best mark of 4:57.53.

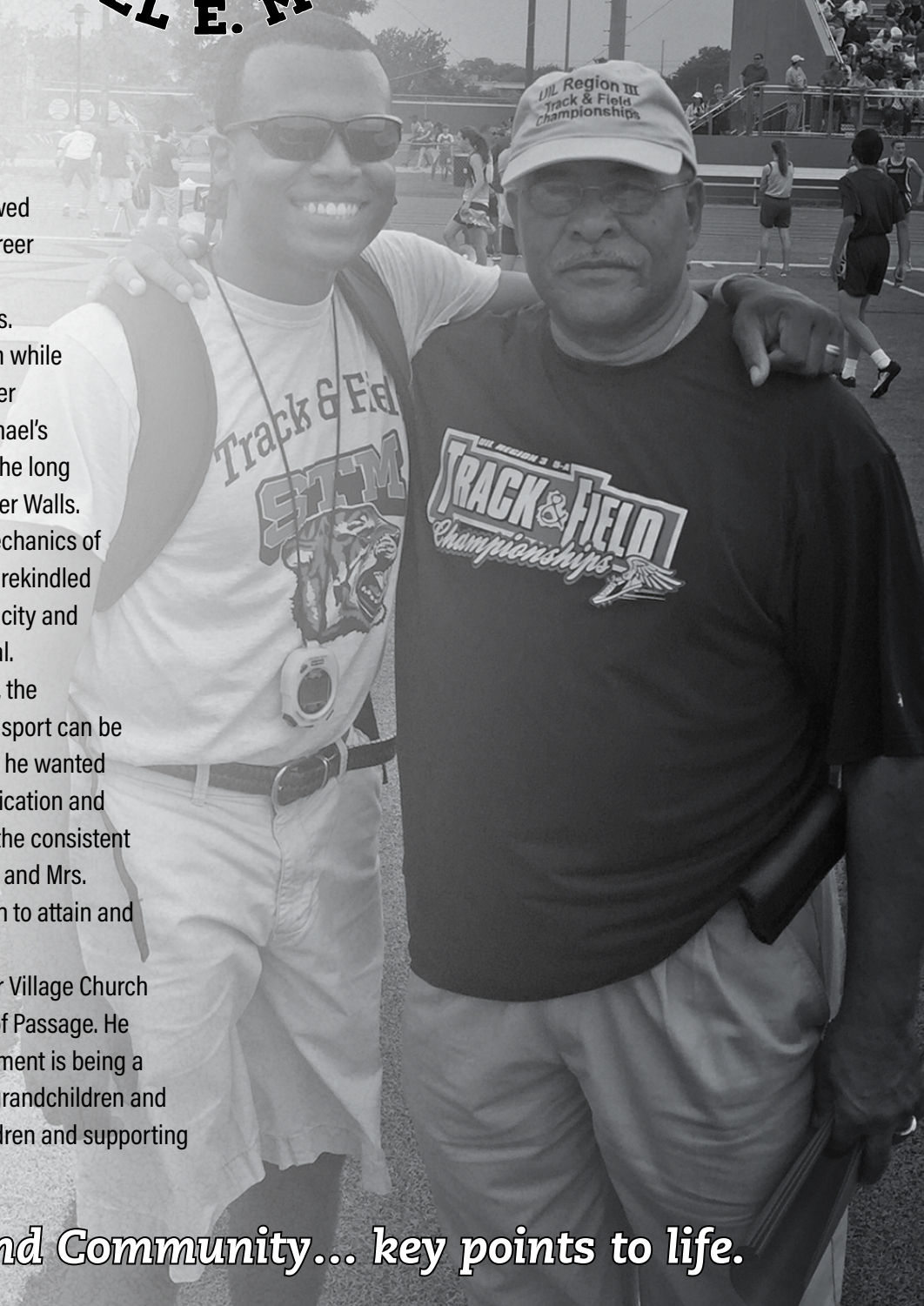
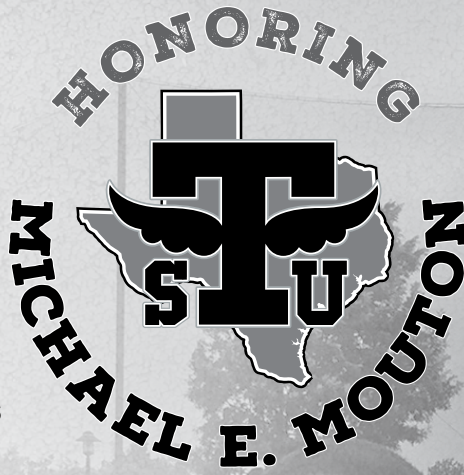
A native Houstonian whose upbringing in scenic San Francisco wrought not only an exceptional student but an astounding athlete that lettered in wrestling, football as well as track and field.

Honoree Clifford McBride is an example of one who lives by Philippians 2:3 - 5, "Be humble and give more to honor others than yourself". McBride was raised in Independence Heights, better known as Studewood, and attended James Burrus Elementary, Booker T. Washington Jr. High School and Sr. High School.

In his younger years, McBride loved all sports and participated in most. Upon reaching tenth grade, Coach James Green encouraged him to try hurdles. He worked tirelessly for a year before entering a contest. In eleventh, he earned third place in the 120 yard hurdles which gave him the spark that he needed to continue. The following summer, he excelled during his competition in the AAU Junior Olympics by winning the 120 yard hurdles. His twelfth grade year yielded greater successes. He earned first place in all competitive hurdle races for the season in 1968. He advanced to the District meet and placed second.

During the school year 1967-68, integration of athletic competitions began in Houston Independent School District. Booker T. Washington and Worthing High Schools were selected to participate in the integrated Texas Relays at the University of Texas. During the teams' drive to Austin both teams was notified that Dr. Martin Luther King had been shot but we, the team, had to stay focused. More importantly, we had to win by leaps and bounds or fear the possibility of losing. In the

120 yard hurdles, the race was close. While I actually came in first, yet close, representing Washington HS, first place was awarded to the "all white team". However, there were two additional races, the 440 and 880 relays. Our teams won both races by leaps and bounds. We continued our competitions at the state level. Historically, this was a first for Black schools in Texas.

After high school, McBride's journey took a pivotal turn when he walked on at Prairie View University. Despite initially being considered unnecessary to the team, he earned his place among eight returning All-Americans and an Olympian, Fred Newhouse. With the motivation to prove himself, McBride rose to prominence. A life-changing opportunity came when a teammate's injury opened the door for him to compete in the SWAC meet in 1969. He seized the moment, earning national recognition in the 440 yard relays, a testament to his resilience and versatility. Additionally, he was awarded All-Conference and All-American Track and Field.

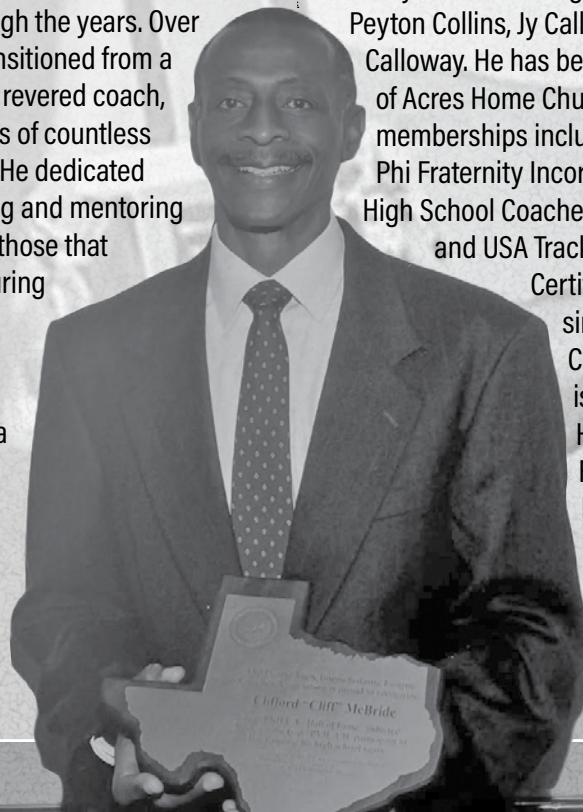
Once graduated from Prairie View University, McBride was invited by Coach Russell Austin to participate in the Masters Division of Track and Field and Senior Olympics. His accomplishments continued through the years. Over decades, he transitioned from a star athlete to a revered coach, shaping the lives of countless young athletes. He dedicated his life to training and mentoring kids, especially those that mirrored him during his youth. His efforts instilled discipline, technique, and a love for sports, leaving an indelible mark on the Houston community and beyond. In 2013,

McBride was inducted into the Prairie View Interscholastic League of Coaches Association Hall of Honor and Hall of Fame. During the 2024 season, McBride's successes of molding the lives of young adults yielded him acknowledgment and recognition for his support and skill in Track and Field. Clifford McBride was inducted into the Masters Hall of Honor as a Founding Member.

McBride has supported Texas Southern University's Track and Field Relays over twenty years. He has served as a USA Track & Field Official. Additionally, he has worked as an umpire, windgauge operator, polevault, and marshall.

Cliff is the proud father of Jai McBride Calloway and son in law Lorenzo Calloway. He has three grandchildren, Peyton Collins, Jy Calloway, and Zeau Calloway. He has been a life member of Acres Home Church of God. Other memberships include: Omega Psi Phi Fraternity Incorporated, Texas High School Coaches Association, and USA Track and Field Certified Official since 1997.

Clifford McBride is currently the Head Track & Field Coach, Head Basketball Coach, and Head Football Coach at The Post Oak School.

A dedicated family man, Mr. Hunt has been married for 22 years to Rhonda Hunt. Together, they have two daughters: Raevyn Rogers, an Olympic medalist, and Reghan Hunt, an honor roll student at UTSA.

His enduring passion for the TSU Relays is driven by his belief in the power of athletics to shape lives, build character, and foster community. Through his leadership and dedication, he continues to contribute to the event's legacy, ensuring it remains a premier competition that inspires future generations of athletes.
