GREYHOUND NOTES

ON TAP

To open 2022 after three back-to-back game cancellations the Greyhounds will travel to McKendree and host Southern Indiana.

VS. McKendree

The Bearcats and Hounds last faced off in Jan of 2021 when McKendree took the win 63-76, Sadie Hill came off the bench scored 21 points.

Ulndy leads the series 9-4.

Vs. USI

The Hounds fell to the Screaming Eagles 62-79 in their last match up, where Elana Wells posted 16 points to lead the Hounds in her second start of the season.

USI leads the series 26-20.

ALL UP HILL

Sadie Hill has scored in double digits during every game this season, with two instances where she was one rebound away from a double-double. She has scored over 20 points three times.

Hill notched her first career double-double in the Hounds home loss to UIS on Dec. 4 where she posted 23 points and 12 rebounds. She currently leads the Hounds with 16.5 PPG and 6.4 RPG.

LOOKING WELLS

Freshman, Elana Wells, has found her place in the Greyhounds starting lineup after appearing in her first game against Lake Erie in the Hounds first win of the season on Nov. 24. Wells coming off the bench posted 10 points an followed suit by scoring double digits in the next two games. Wells made her first start at the conference win over Lewis, where she scored 10 points and had six rebounds.

POLL POSITION

The Hounds were picked to finish third in the East Division this season according to the GLVC Coaches Preseason Poll. The Greyhounds earned 10 points to slot behind Lewis at No. 2 in the voting, while Southern Indiana earned 15 points and three of five first-places votes as the official favorite in the East. Both Truman (Central) amd Drury (West) earned the maximum 16 points to top their respective divisions.

The GLVC regular season will feature three divisions and a 20-game schedule, where every team plays every divisional opponent twice – home and away; two random non-divisional opponents twice – home and away; and every other non-divisional opponent once. The top eight teams with the most points derived from the familiar GLVC Point Rating System at the end of the regular season will earn a berth to the GLVC Basketball Championship Tournament March 3-6 at the Vadalabene Center in Edwardsville, Ill., on the campus of Southern Illinois University Edwardsville.

A LOOK BACK

Led by all-conference performers Taylor Drury and Mickey Sasson, the Greyhounds finished 11-11 last season. The Hounds snagged the No. 8 seed in the GLVC Tournament but fell 70-66 to the top-seeded Drury Panthers in the quarterfinals.

Drury earned All-GLVC First Team honors after a a stellar campaign, while Sasson garnered a second-team nod. The pair finished 1-2 on the team in both scoring and rebounding, with Drury averaging 16.7 points and 6.6 rebounds and Sasson going for 11.8 and 6.9.

The majority of last year's roster will also return. They'll be joined by freshmen Liv Becker and Elana Wells, along with Davenport transfer Madison Jones, who last season ranked fifth in the GLIAC at 16 points per game.

30 UNDER 30

The Women's Basketball Coaches Association the WBCA Thirty Under 30 honorees from the 2020-21 season, presented by Morgan Stanley Global Sports & Entertainment. Ulndy assistant coach Evan Dodd has been listed as one of this year's honorees, Dodd finishing up his third year after the 2020-21 season concluded at the University of Indianapolis.

Dodd helped lead the Greyhounds to an 11-10 record this season and coaching staff led the Hounds to their second-straight GLVC Tournament Championship appearance. Senior Taylor Drury , who topped the team at 16.7 points per contest, was named to the All-GLVC First Team while Mickey Sasson was voted to on the All-GLVC Second Team.

The WBCA Thirty Under 30 program was created to recognize 30 up-and-coming women's basketball coaches age 30 and under at all levels of the game. Each honoree has exemplified their involvement in community service, mentorship and impact on others, professional manner, and attitude and professional association involvement.

Former Division I standout Kristin (Drabyn) Wodrich enters her sixth season as the Ulndy head coach in 2021-22.

After earning her first head coaching position in the spring of 2016, Wodrich guided the Greyhounds to a seven-win improvement in 2016-17. Ulndy compiled a 17-14 mark overall, culminating in an appearance in the GLVC Tournament semifinals. The record marked a sharp turnaround from the previous two seasons that saw the Hounds endure their first consecutive losing seasons since 1999.

The Greyhounds posted a .500 season, going 11-11 in the shortened conference-only season due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. The Greyhounds posted a .450 FG% and averaged 69.0 points per game.

Defense was the Greyhounds' calling card in Wodrich's debut season. Ulndy surrendered just 60.2 points per game, the third-lowest total in the GLVC and 58th-best in all of Division II. The Greyhounds held opponents to 60 points or fewer in 17 of the their 31 games on the year.

Wodrich and the Greyhounds had one of their best seasons yet in 2019-20, earning a 19-10 overall record and the sixth seed in the GLVC Tournament. The record marked the highest win total during Wodrich's tenure, including their 12-8 record within the confernece.

One of the Greyhounds' biggest wins of the year came on Jan. 26, 2017 when Ulndy shot 66 percent from the floor in an 80-65 win over No. 11-ranked Bellarmine, snapping a 17-game losing streak against nationally-ranked opponents. It was the first of two wins over a nationally-ranked conference rival, as the Greyhounds dominated No. 21 Southern Indiana in a 66-48 win in the guarterfinals of the GLVC Tournament.

A native of nearby Avon, Ind, Wodrich took over after spending the previous thre e years as an assistant coach at crosstown IUPUI. Wodrich served as the recruiting coordinator under head coach Austin Parkinson, as well as the academic liaison, head of guard player development and the manager of opponent scouting responsibilities. With Wodrich on staff, the Jaguars recorded a 59-37 record, setting a single-season program mark with 23 wins in 2013-14. Following a 15-16 season in 2014-15, the Jags finished 21-11 in 2015-16, which included a trip to the Women's National Invitational Tournament (WNIT) that saw IUPUI garner its second-ever tournament win.

"I would like to thank Dr. Willey and the hiring committee for giving me this tremendous opportunity at the University of Indianapolis," Wodrich said at the time of her hiring. "Ulndy is a special place and I cannot express my excitement enough to be a part of the Greyhound family. I have a passion for teaching the game of basketball, and I bring high energy with everything I do. I want the players to feel that every day. It is truly an honor to be the head coach at a university in my home state that has established itself on a national level athletically and academically."

"It takes a special person to meet the needs of our student-athletes, coaches and administrative staff, but this search ended with a unanimous vote of support for Kristin." said Dr. Sue Willey, Vice President for Intercollegiate Athletics. "Her enthusiasm and deep sense of dedication and determination for this position stood out among her other excellent qualities. Kristin will be a great fit for our department and university. We are thrilled that she will be leading our women's basketball team back to the success that is expected of all of our Ulndy programs."

Prior to returning home to Central Indiana, Wodrich served as the head assistant coach at her alma mater, the University of Maryland Baltimore County (UMBC), from 2011-13. While assisting head coach Phil Stern, Wodrich had a number of duties at UMBC, inlcuding serving as the program's recruiting coordinator, head of player development, lead opponent scout, academic liaison and head of alumni relations.

Before joining the UMBC staff, she assisted 12-time Patriot League Champion head coach Bill Gibbons at the College of Holy Cross in 2010-11 where she helped out with scouting, recruiting, practice planning, guard development and video coordination.

Wodrich broke into the coaching community in July 2008 when she was named a graduate assistant at Texas Tech University, where she assisted with the day-to-day operations, video responsibilities and the organization of summer camps. She graduated from Texas Tech with her Master's degree in sport management in 2010.

As a player at UMBC, Wodrich was a four-year letter winner for the Retrievers from 2004-2008 and helped guide the team to the 2007 America East championship and a spot in the NCAA Division I Tournament. She was named to the America East All-Conference Third Team as a senior in 2008 after averaging 11.4 points per game. She graduated in 2008 with a bachelor's degree in interdisciplinary studies with a focus in broadcast communications and exercise physiology.
