## #19/19 WOFFORD (10-3) vs. #12/13 YOUNGSTOWN STATE (10-3)

### THE YOUNGSTOWN STATE GAME

And then there were eight ... On Saturday Wofford and Youngstown State will meet in the quarterfinals of the NCAA FCS Playoffs ... Both teams earned an at-large bid to the playoffs and are unseeded ... This is the second meeting ever between the two teams, the last in 1996 ... Wofford defeated Charleston Southern 15-14 in the first round in Spartanburg and then picked up a 17-3 win at #6 seed The Citadel on Saturday night ... Youngstown State defeated Samford 38-24 in the first round and then knocked off #3 seed Jacksonville State on the road 40-24 ... The winner of the game will advance to the semifinals to face the winner of the Richmond/Eastern Washington game on December 16 or 17 ... This marks the seventh season the Terriers have reached the NCAA FCS Playoffs and the first since 2012 ... Wofford is 10-3 on the season (6-2 in SoCon) after the win over Charleston Southern ... The Terriers enter the game with a six-game win streak, their longest since 2012 ... Youngstown State is 10-3 overall and went 6-2 in the Missouri Valley Football Conference ... The Terriers are fifth in the nation in rushing offense, 122nd in passing and 87th in total offense ... They are sixth in rushing defense, 23rd in passing defense and fifth in total defense ... The Penguins are 15th in rushing defense, 38th in passing defense and 12th in total defense, along with being 96th in passing offense, seventh in rushing offense and 23rd in total offense ... Wofford is ranked #19 in both the STATS FCS poll and the FCS Coaches poll ... The Penguins are #13 in the STATS FCS poll and #12 in the FCS Coaches poll.

# THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT ...

## YSU LAST GAME

Hunter Wells passed for 290 yards while Jody Webb ran for 140 and two touchdowns as the Youngstown State football team beat No. 3 Jacksonville State 40-24 in the second round of the FCS Playoffs on Saturday at Burgess-Snow Field at JSU Stadium.

The victory snapped Jacksonville State's (10-2) nine-game winning streak and 14-contest home victory run dating back to December 2014.

Wells hit Damoun Patterson on a 70-yard touchdown just over three minutes into the game to give the Penguins a 7-0 lead, and YSU never trailed. The game was tied at 7-7, and the Penguins held the upper hand for the final 51 minutes. Webb scored on a 37-yard run to put the Penguins up 14-7 at the 6:45 mark of the first quarter, and he had a 50-yard touchdown rush just 57 seconds into the third to give the Penguins a quick shot in the arm and push the lead back to 10 points at 27-17. JSU closed within 27-24 with 4:07 left in the third on a two-yard run by Josh Clemens, but the game turned quickly after that play.

On the ensuing kickoff, Jaylin Kelly had a short return, and JSU was penalized 15 yards for an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty. YSU took over at its 46-yard line and two plays later was back on top by 10 points. On the first play, Wells threw a 40-yard pass to Patterson down to the JSU eight. Ruiz went untouched eight yards for a touchdown with 3:44 left in the period and YSU now ahead 34-24. In the fourth, Zak Kennedy booted a 46-yard field goal with 8:04 left after the defense stopped JSU in YSU territory. That drive took a key 6:17 off the game clock. Kennedy added a 28-yard field goal with 5:02 left just after an interception by D.J. Thomas at the JSU 19-yard line.

## LAST MEETING

WOFFORD 0, YOUNGSTOWN STATE 28

THURSDAY, AUGUST 29, 1996

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio. - In the season opener, Wofford was defeated 28-0 by Youngstown State at Stambaugh Stadium on Thursday night. The Penguins took advantage of three Terrier fumbles and the defense kept Wofford off the scoreboard to secure the win.

The Terriers were led by Lomar Foster with eight carries for 54 yards, while quarterback Bryan Davis was 4-of-12 passing and had nine carries for 27 yards. On defense, Eric Danieli and Trevor Ellison each had 11 tackles for Wofford. The Penguins were led by Jake Andreadis with 10 carries for 48 yards and Adrian Brown had 46 yards on 12 carries with three touchdowns. Quarterback Demond Tidwell ran the ball ten times for two yards and was 8-of-15 passing with one interception.

Wofford began the game with a three-and-out. The Penguins answered with an eleven play drive that was capped by a one yard touchdown run by Adrian Brown for a 7-0 lead with 7:11 on the clock in the first quarter. Wofford again goes three-and-out and punts. With the ball back, the Penguins have one first down, but then fail to convert on a fourth-and-two. Wofford moves the ball into the redzone on a run by Tim Rayborn, but the Terriers fumble on the two yard line.

The Penguins go three-and-out and punt, but Wofford then misses a 41-yard field goal wide left and Youngstown State took over. The Terriers force a three-and-out, but the ensuing drive ends on another fumble. The Penguins take advantage of the turnover and take eight plays to score as Brian Cottom scores from a yard out. The PAT hits the goal post and the lead was 13-0 at the 3:25 mark of the second quarter. Wofford gains a pair of first downs, but comes up short on a fourth-and-nine and the Penguins took over. After two first downs passing, the Demond Tidwell was intercepted in the endzone by Tony Young to end the drive. Wofford runs one play before the half ends.

Youngstown State began the second half with a three-and-out. On the second play for the Terriers, Bryan Davis fumbled and it was recovered by the Penguins. With a short field, the Penguins drive was capped by a four-yard run by Adrian Brown. The two point conversion was good for a 21-0 lead at 10:37 in the third quarter. The teams then trade a pair of punts each before Wofford takes over with 13:58 on the clock in the fourth quarter. The Terriers then put together an 18-play drive, but it ends on a failed fourth-and-seven. The Penguins had plays of 52 yards and 21 yards to set-up a one-yard run by Adrian Brown for a 28-0 lead with 4:03 remaining. Wofford has one more drive, but it also ends on a fourth down play. The Penguins run out the final two minutes of the game.

Quarterback Brandon Goodson is 41-of-87 passing for 628 yards and he also has 347 rushing yards ... Lorenzo Long leads the team and the Southern Conference with 1,382 rushing yards on 274 carries and he has 16 touchdowns to lead the team with 96 points ... Tight end Chandler Gouger is the leading receiver with 13 catches for 205 yards and three touchdowns ... Freshman Datavious Wilson is the leading tackler with 92, along with 6.0 tackles for loss ... Tyler Vaughn leads the team with 16.5 tackles for loss and eight sacks ... Jaleel Green is second in the SoCon with five interceptions ... David Marvin is 16-of-21 on field goals and 39-40 on PATs with 87 total points.

## TERRIER TOP TEN

Here are the top ten notes of interest heading into Youngstown State game:

- The Terriers finished fourth in the nation in 2015 with 300.0 rushing yards per game and have 278.3 per game in 2016
- Mike Ayers has 197 wins at Wofford in his 29th season and 208 career wins in 32 seasons overall as a head coach
- Lorenzo Long enters the game with 3,437 career rushing yards to rank 5th in school history
- The offensive line is first in the country with only three total sacks and 0.23 sacks allowed
- In the fourth quarter, Wofford is outscoring opponents 121 to 45 (none in the last 3 games)
- The Terriers black shirts are sixth in the nation in rushing defense, third in scoring defense and fifth in total defense.
- A total of twelve players were named All-Southern Conference. Eight received first or second team honors from the media or coaches, while four were named All-Freshman.
- Nick Colvin earned CoSIDA Academic All-District honors this season
- The Wofford defense has allowed just one 100+ yard rusher in the last 37 games
- On defense, 12 players have sacks, 26 have a tackle for loss, eight have interceptions and six have fumble recoveries

## INJURY UPDATE

Players that missed The Citadel game included QB Evan Jacks (knee/season), QB Brad Butler (knee/season), LB Michael Roach (heart/season), LB John Patterson (neck/season), OL Nick Taylor (shoulder/season), QB David Howerton (bone marrow donation) and HB Lennox McAfee (fibula/season). Against The Citadel, OL Anton Wahrby and QB Brandon Goodson left the game due to injury.

## MICHAEL ROACH UPDATE

A junior from Kenosha, Wisconsin, Michael Roach started the Tennessee Tech game at outside linebacker. He collapsed in the team bench area during the third quarter of the contest. He was attended to by the athletic training staff, team physicians and EMS. He was transported to Cookeville Regional Medical Center where he was alert and responsive. He stayed at CRMC on Thursday and Friday nights. On Saturday, he was released from Cookeville Regional Medical Center and returned to campus. He was diagnosed with hypertrophic cardiomyopathy and had a procedure to place an implantable cardioverter defibrillator on Friday. He will miss the remainder of the season.

## JOHN PATTERSON INJURY

Linebacker John Patterson suffered a fracture of the C6 vertebra during the first half of the football game on Saturday, October 22 against The Citadel. The next day, he had surgery to fuse several vertebrae. A junior from Lilburn, Georgia, Patterson started all seven games this season at linebacker. He has 19 tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss, including a sack. Last season he started all eleven games at linebacker and finished second on the team in tackles with 78, along with 4.5 tackles for loss. He will miss the remainder of the season.

## DAVID HOWERTON SAVES A LIFE

David Howerton has missed the last five games of the season after donating bone marrow. The football team partnered with the "Get in the Game, Save a Life" initiative, which is part of Be The Match, operated by the National Marrow Donor Program, to hold an event on campus in April of

2016 to have individuals register their bone marrow. Howerton received a phone call in August that he was a possible match for a patient. He underwent further testing, and doctors discovered that he was a match. On Monday, October 31, he anonymously donated bone marrow to his match and was back to campus on Tuesday. Howerton, a senior from Asheville, North Carolina, has played in 16 career games for the Terriers, primarily on special teams. He saw action at quarterback against Johnson C. Smith earlier this season.

## NEXT MAN UP AT QUARTERBACK

Heading into August, the Terriers had returning quarterbacks in senior Evan Jacks, senior Brad Butler, junior Brandon Goodson and senior David Howerton, in addition to true freshman Joseph Newman. Jacks (5), Butler (3) and Goodson (3) all started multiple games in 2015. During the first fall scrimmage, Jacks suffered a torn ACL. Butler started the first four games until a torn ACL during the ETSU game on September 24. Goodson moved into the starting role for the next nine games, but left The Citadel game due to a sprained ankle. With Howerton out for several weeks after donating bone marrow, Newman took over and led the Terriers to a win in Charleston. Nick Colvin, a senior running back, would be next on the list to play quarterback, a position he played in high school.

## WOFFORD'S LAST GAME

On Saturday night, Wofford won 17-3 at The Citadel to advance in the 2016 NCAA FCS Playoffs at Johnson Hagood Stadium. The Citadel, the sixth seed, scored first with a field goal, but the Terriers scored 17 unanswered points in the second half to earn the victory. The Terriers were led by Lorenzo Long with 92 rushing yards, while Joe Newman had 45 rushing yards and a touchdown. On defense, Lincoln Stewart had a career-high 16 tackles, while Datavious Wilson added a career-high 14. Devin Watson sealed the victory with a 64-yard interception returned for a touchdown with 30 seconds left in the game. The Bulldogs were led by Tyler Renew with 76 rushing yards, while Dominique Allen was 11-of-22 passing. Wofford had 256 total yards, with 223 rushing. The Citadel had 355 total yards, 235 of which were rushing. Wofford had 10 first downs to 19 for The Citadel. Wofford was 3-of-12 on third downs and 2-of-2 on fourth downs. The Citadel was 6-of-18 on third down. Wofford was called for four penalties, while The Citadel was whistled nine times. The Citadel had a 35:48 to 24:12 time of possession advantage.

## WOFFORD VS. THE CITADEL GAME NOTES

The game marked the seventh season that the Terriers have played in the NCAA FCS postseason. They are now 7-6 all-time in the NCAA FCS Playoffs. This is the first time Wofford has won two postseason games since 2003 ... This was the first time Wofford and The Citadel have faced each other in the postseason ... The Terrier defense has not allowed a 100-yard rusher in a game this season. They allowed a season-high 236 rushing yards to The Citadel ... The #19 Terriers have ten wins on the season, topping the total from last year (5-6). The eight regular season wins were the most since the 2011 season and the ten total wins the most since 2010 ... Lorenzo Long had 90 rushing yards. He now has 3,435 career rushing yards to rank 5th in school history ... The 36 yard touchdown run by Joseph Newman was the longest of his career and his first career touchdown ... The interception by Lincoln Stewart was his first of the season and second of his career ... The interception by Devin Watson was his third of the season, all in the postseason ... Brandon Goodson had two interceptions on the season, but threw two in the second quarter to give him four ... Game captains were Will Gay, Anton Wahrby, Boston Bryant and Miles Brown.

The VMI game marked the final regular season home contest for 28 Wofford seniors. ## WOFFORD IN THE NCAA PLAYOFFS

The 2016 season marks the seventh appearance in the NCAA FCS Playoffs for the Terriers. In 2003, Wofford defeated North Carolina A&T 31-10 in the first round at Gibbs Stadium. In the second round, Wofford won 34-17 over Western Kentucky at Gibbs Stadium. Against Delaware in the semifinals, the Terriers were defeated 24-9. In the 2007 season, Wofford had a win at Montana and loss to Richmond. The Terriers were sent on the road in 2008 to face #1 James Madison and were defeated 38-35. In 2010, the Terriers won at Jacksonville State before falling at home to Georgia Southern in the quarterfinals. In 2011, Wofford was defeated at UNI. A home win in 2012 against New Hampshire and was followed by a loss at North Dakota State. Wofford is 7-6 overall in the playoffs after wins in 2016 over Charleston Southern and The Citadel.

## TERRIERS ON TURF

Wofford played on artificial turf three times in 2012 with a 1-2 record. In the 2013 season, Wofford played four games on turf and were 1-3. In 2014, the Terriers were 1-4 with a win at Samford. In 2015, Wofford played only two games on artificial turf - a loss at Idaho and a win at Mercer to go 1-1. The Terriers played on artificial turf five times this season at Tennessee Tech, at Samford, at Western Carolina, at Furman and at Chattanooga and were 4-1. The playoff game at Youngstown State will be on artificial turf.

## 2016 ALL-SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

Wofford had eight players earn first or second team honors from the coaches or media and four players were named to the All-Freshman Team. The eight Terriers honored are the most since the 2012 season when nine players were recognized. The four named All-Freshman are the most in school history, topping the three in 2010 and 2014. Earning first team honors from the Southern Conference Coaches were RB Lorenzo Long, OL Anton Warby, DL Miles Brown, DL Tyler Vaughn, and PK David Marvin. Second team honors went to OL Roo Daniels, DB Jaleel Green and P David Marvin. DB George Gbesse, DL Mikel Horton, LB Datavious Wilson and LB Jireh Wilson earned All-Freshman Team honors. In the media voting, first team honors went to RB Lorenzo Long, OL Anton Wahrby, DL Tyler Vaughn, DB Jaleel Green and David Marvin as punter and kicker. Second team recognition went to OL Roo Daniels, OL Dequan Miller and DL Miles Brown.

## SOCON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

The Southern Conference named safety Jaleel Green the Defensive Player of the Week on September 5. Green helped Wofford preserve a 21-7 victory at Tennessee Tech. With the Terriers holding a 14-point lead, Green intercepted Michael Birdsong at the Wofford 5-yard line with 4:48 left in the game, allowing the Terriers' offense to run out the clock and preserve the win. Green added five tackles in the win. A native of Jacksonville, Florida, this is the first player of the week of his career.

## SOCON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK II

The Southern Conference named linebacker Terrance Morris earned the Defensive Player of the Week award on November 21. Morris anchored Wofford's defense in a 17-0 shutout win over VMI Saturday. Midway through the fourth quarter with the Terriers holding a 10-0 lead, Morris picked off an Al Cobb pass and returned it 29 yards to the VMI 13-yard line. This is the first Player of the Week honor of his career.

## SOCON SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

The Southern Conference named David Marvin as the Special Teams Player of the Week on October 10. In a 31-19 win at Western Carolina, Marvin set a new school record with a career-long 57-yard field goal in the first quarter. The kick tied the league record for longest field goal in conference history and was the longest since 2000. He was 4-of-4 on PATs and punted three times for an average of 57.0 yards per punt. Marvin kicked off six times and recorded four touchbacks against the Catamounts.

## SOCON SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK II

The Southern Conference named David Marvin as the Special Teams Player of the Week on October 24. Against The Citadel, Marvin hit two-of-three field goals attempts, including a long of 41 yards. He kicked off four times, forcing two touchbacks and averaging 57.8 yards. He also punted five times with an average of 49.6 yards. He booted two punts over 50 yards, forced two fair catches and placed three kicks inside the Bulldogs' 20-yard line.

## SOCON SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK III

The Southern Conference named Wofford's David Howerton as the Special Teams Player of the Week on October 31. With the Terriers holding a 14-7 early in the third quarter, reserve quarterback David Howerton blocked a Tyler Zielenske punt and recovered it in the end zone for a Wofford touchdown to give the Terriers a 21-7 advantage. It was the first career touchdown for the senior from Asheville, North Carolina, who has contributed on special teams the last two seasons.

## NATIONAL AND SOCON SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

David Marvin was tabbed as the SoCon Special Teams Player of the Week for games played on November 5. In addition, Marvin was named as the STATS FCS National Special Teams Player of the Week. Marvin booted a 54-yard field goal in the second quarter and then kicked a 57-yard field goal on the final play of the second quarter to give the Terriers a 20-13 halftime lead. His 57-yard effort tied the league record for longest made field goal. The senior averaged 43.8 yards on four punts and placed two inside the Furman 20-yard line. He averaged 59.5 yards on six kickoffs and forced two touchbacks.

### SOCON SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK IV

The Southern Conference named Wofford's Lennox McAfee the Special Teams Player of the Week on November 14. McAfee provided a burst to the Wofford special teams in the Terriers' 36-28 win at Chattanooga. After the Mocs opened the scoring to take a 7-0 lead, McAfee returned the ensuing kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown. McAfee's return tied the school record set by Nick Colvin at Idaho last season. In the second quarter after the Wofford defense forced a safety, McAfee took the free kick back 60 yards and set the Terriers up at the UTC 12-yard line.

### SOCON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE MONTH

The Southern Conference announced that Jaleel Green was named the Defensive Player of the Month for football in November. Green recorded three interceptions in four games during November as the Terriers went 4-0 during the month. Green was a part of Wofford's defense that gave up just 17.3 points per game in the month. He added 19 tackles, including 14 solo stops, and was credited with four tackles for loss. Green blocked a 38-yard field goal attempt in a win at Furman on Nov. 5 and led the Terriers with seven tackles in a victory over Charleston Southern in the first round of the FCS Playoffs on Nov. 26.

### PRESEASON SOUTHERN CONFERENCE POLL

In the 2016 Southern Conference Preseason Poll, the conference's nine head coaches picked Chattanooga as the choice to win the league championship, while Wofford was picked to finish sixth. The Southern Conference Sports Media Association also selected Chattanooga first, with Wofford in sixth place. East Tennessee State joins the league for the 2016 season.

### PRESEASON ALL-SOCON

The Terriers had four players recognized by the league's coaches on the 2016 Preseason All-SoCon team, with two on the first team and two on the second team. Leading the Terriers on the first team were offensive lineman Anton Wahrby and defensive lineman Miles Brown. Wahrby, a senior from Karlskrona, Sweden, started all eleven games in 2015 at right tackle. Brown, a sophomore from Washington, D.C., started all eleven games as a true freshman last season. Second team honorees include running back Lorenzo Long and offensive lineman Dequan Miller.

### A FEW TURNOVERS

One common denominator over the past three seasons has been turnovers. After being +7 in turnovers during the 2012 SoCon Championship season, the Terriers have been in the negative. In 2013, Wofford was -5 (24 turnovers, 19 take-aways) and in 2014 the team was -1 (12 turnovers and 11 take-aways). Last season, Wofford was -2 in the turnover column with 19 turnovers (15 fumbles lost and 4 interceptions) to 17 take-aways. So far in 2016, Wofford only has 13 turnovers (nine fumbles and four interceptions) and has 23 take-aways (17 interceptions, six fumble recoveries)

to be +10 (+0.77 pg) on the season.

### LONG FOR 3,000 CAREER RUSHING YARDS

Lorenzo Long had 969 yards last season to bring his total to 2,055, becoming only the 16th player in school history to reach the 2,000 yard mark. He has added 1,382 yards this season for a total of 3,437 which is fifth in school history. He reached the 3,000 mark in the third quarter at Furman (11/5). In addition, he is currently 6th in career carries and third in career rushing touchdowns with 37. Long is also seventh in the nation in yards among active FCS players. ## HEAD COACH MIKE AYERS • 29TH SEASON

Wofford head coach Mike Ayers (Georgetown, Ky. '74), the winningest coach in school history, is in his 29th season at the Terrier helm with a record of 197-135-1. Ayers has spent 31 years as a collegiate head coach and has a record of 208-156-2 that includes a three-year stint as the head coach at East Tennessee State from 1985-87. Ayers earned Southern Conference Coach of the Year honors from the league coaches in 2000, 2003 and 2007 and by the media in 2000, '02, '03 and '10. Ayers was the 2003 recipient of the Eddie Robinson Award as Division I-AA's National Coach of the Year and also earned the 2002 Division I-AA National Coach of the Year award from the *College Sporting News* in addition to being the runner-up for the Robinson Award. Ayers is the longest tenured coach in the Southern Conference at 29 years, with Russ Huesman at Chattanooga next at seven seasons.

### WINNINGEST ACTIVE FCS COACHES

Head coach Mike Ayers has 208 wins (197 Wofford, 11 ETSU) which ranks tied for fourth in the FCS among active coaches after the second round of the 2016 playoffs.

### REACHING 1,000 CAREER RUSHING YARDS

Will Gay reached the 1,000 mark against Tennessee Tech in 2015 and was at 1,078 yards when an injury cut his season short. He began 2016 with a 116 yard game and now has 1,554 career yards.

### FIRST CAREER STARTS

In the season opener at Tennessee Tech, LB Datavious Wilson, CB George Gbese, CB Devin Watson, DL Chris Boudreaux, and WR Jason Hill made first career starts. At Ole Miss, WR Cole Cleary made his first career start and WR Dorian Lindsey started against ETSU. LB Tyreik Lyles and DL Mikel Horton started against JCSU, LB Lincoln Stewart started against Mercer and CB Dimitri Redwood started at Furman. A total of eleven players have made first career starts in 2016. In 2015, Wofford had 13 players make their first starts during the season. In the 2014 season, a total of 21 players overall made first career starts.

### VETERAN CAREER STARTS

The most veteran player on the team this year is senior offensive lineman Anton Wahrby with 42 career starts. He is followed by offensive lineman Dequan Miller (34), safety Jaleel Green (34), running back Will Gay (34), fullback Lorenzo Long (32), and center Bradley Way (22).

### TRUE FRESHMEN ON THE FIELD

Seven true freshmen played in the 2016 season opener at Tennessee Tech. LB Datavious Wilson started at linebacker. Other true freshmen on the field included RB Ostin McPherson, RB Blake Morgan, LB Jireh Wilson, DL Mikel Horton, CB Dimitri Redwood, and WR Dorian Lindsey. Additional true freshmen playing this season are S Mason Alstatt, QB Joe Newman and DL Robbie Armstrong. Fifteen true freshman played during the 2015 season, a number already matched in 2016.

### IN THE SMOKEHOUSE

A number of freshman were redshirted in 2016, or in the words of Coach Ayers, spending some time in the smokehouse. These include OL Ronnie Brooks, LB Brandon Brown, OL Josh Burger, RB Jamison Chapman, OL Blake Jersaty, DB Darron Paschal, RB Andy Riazzi, and DB Ulysses Strawter.

### COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Nick Colvin was named to the 2016 CoSIDA Academic All-District Football Team, selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America, which recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances athletically and in the classroom. He has played in all eight games this season and has 16 carries for 50 yards, along with four catches for 49 yards. He is a biology major with a 3.78 grade point average and plans on attending dental school following graduation. It was the 17th straight season at least one Wofford football student-athlete has been named Academic All-District.

### 2016 RECRUITING CLASS

Wofford welcomed a total of 18 student-athletes in the 2016 recruiting class. The class includes nine

### ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Wofford's football program has ranked among the top 10 percent of FCS teams in the Academic Performance Review (APR) in eight of the last ten seasons to earn public recognition.

In 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015, Wofford had the highest APR in the SoCon. The Terriers lead the SoCon with 146 Academic All-Southern Conference selections since the program started in 2003.

Among all NCAA Division I (FBS and FCS) football teams, Wofford's APR score of 986 is 18th in the nation. The Terriers are ahead of schools such as Richmond (985), Stanford (983), Princeton (983), Navy (982), Boston College (981), Harvard (979), Virginia (974), and Wake Forest (968).

Wofford has had at least one player named CoSIDA/Capital One First Team All-District in each of the last 17 seasons. This season Nick Colvin was named Academic All-District. In addition, safety James Zotto was named an Academic All-American in 2014.

The student-athletes are from eight different states, including five from South Carolina, three from Georgia, two from Ohio, two from Kentucky, and one each from Alabama, Florida, Tennessee, and Washington, D.C. On defense, the nine players include five defensive backs, three linebackers, and one lineman. On offense, the nine players include four running backs, three offensive linemen, one wide receiver and one quarterback.

### DEEP THOUGHTS...

Of the 57 scoring drive this season, 20 were for 10 or more plays, while 22 covered 70 yards or more ... Wofford has posted three shutouts this season, the most since the team also posted three in the 1989 season ... Lorenzo Long leads the team with 80 rushes for a first down or a touchdown, with 24 of those coming on third down ... Will Gay has 76 carries and picked up 26 first downs, with nine of those on third down ... Lorenzo Long leads the team with 11 plays of 20 or more yards ... 22 different players have plays of 20 or more yards ... Of the 65 receptions, 40 have been for a touchdown or first down ... The Terriers have an average start of the 33.9 yard line, while opponents have a 28.3 yard line average start ... The Terriers are outscoring opponents in all four quarters; however in the second half Wofford has a 196 to 94 advantage in scoring.

S Michael Sarafianos filled in at kicker as a freshman when David Marvin missed several games due to injury ... LS Ross Hammond's father is serving as South Carolina Secretary of State ... DL Miles Brown went to high school at Sidwell Friends, where he was classmates with President Obama's daughters ... K David Marvin is serving as the Co-President of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) this year ... QB Brandon Goodson spent the summer as an intern at the Aspen Institute in Colorado ... Over 80 players spent time this season on campus and in addition to taking classes, took part in a variety of internships and jobs. Jobs included working at a local moving company, Waffle House, and on the campus grounds crew ... ### WOFFORD 100 YARD RUSHERS

Wofford began 2016 with a 100-yard game from Will Gay against Tennessee Tech and added 100-yard games from Lorenzo Long against JCSU, ETSU, Samford, Western Carolina, The Citadel, Mercer, Chattanooga and VMI. Brandon Goodson had his first 100-yard game at Furman. Wofford has a 100-yard rusher in ten of the 13 games.

### OPPONENT 100 YARD RUSHERS

The Wofford rushing defense ended the 2014 season ranked ninth in the nation in rushing defense, allowing only 1,182 total yards on 392 carries for an average of 107.5 yards per game. A big part of that defense was not allowing an opponent to have a 100+ yard rusher. The Terriers went 17 games without allowing a 100+ rusher (last 2 games in 2013, 11 games in 2014, first four games in 2015) before allowing Tee Mitchell to go for 110 yards at Mercer on October 3. The previous 100+ rusher was Jacob Huesman of Chattanooga on November 9, 2013 with 116 yards on 18 carries. Wofford has since gone 19 games straight without a 100-yard rusher.

### UNDER 100 YARDS RUSHING

Wofford also held opponents to under 100 total rushing yards three times last year - Gardner-Webb (91), Western Carolina (89) and VMI (46). In nine of the twelve games this season, the Terriers have held opponents to under 100 rushing yards. Wofford started 2016 by holding Tennessee Tech to 41 rushing yards and then Ole Miss ran for 174 yards. JCSU gained only 18 total yards and ETSU was at -7 for the game, while Samford ran for only 30 yards and Western Carolina had 46. The nation's top rushing team, The Citadel, was held to 190 rushing yards (down from the 381 average) and did not allow a 100-yard rusher. Mercer was held to 48 rushing yards, Furman ran for 65, Chattanooga had 88 and VMI had 62. Charleston Southern had 195 rushing yards and The Citadel had 235 in the playoffs, the most by an opponent this season.

### MAKING THE LONG KICKS

David Marvin kicked a 51-yard field goal in his first career game at Georgia Tech in 2014 and set a school record (and tied the SoCon mark) with a 57-yard field goal at Western Carolina on October 8, which he tied at Furman on November 5. His 16 made field goals this year are the most in a single season at Wofford, while the 21 attempts are also first. He has recorded seven of the ten longest

While David Marvin has been making field goals, he and Brian Sanders have also combined to put together the nation's top ranked punting unit with a net punting average of 42.06 yards. Marvin has punted 41 times with a 46.0 average and a long of 67 yards, while Sanders has 10 punts for a 44.3 average and a long of 55 yards. Overall of the 51 punts, 17 have landed inside the 20 and 15 have gone for over 50 yards.

#### A LITTLE MORE PASSING

In 2012, Wofford ran 854 total plays. Of those plays, 766 were rushing and 88 were pass attempts (89.7% rush offense). In the 2013 season, the Terriers ran 784 plays, 647 of which were runs and 137 pass attempts. The rush offense was down to 82.5%, or conversely the passing offense was

up seven percent. In 2014, of the 688 total plays, 575 were runs and 113 were passes for a 83.6% rush offense. During the 2015 season, Wofford had 106 passes and 633 rushes for a 85.6% rushing offense. This season the Terriers have 724 rushing attempts and 120 passes for a 85.8% run offense.

#### LESS PASSING, MORE WINS

Since the start of the 2010 season, the Terriers have been most successful when they throw the ball ten times or less in a game. With ten or fewer attempts, Wofford is 37-17 overall. With eleven or more passes per game, Wofford is 16-14 overall.

#### THE RED ZONE

The Wofford red zone offense is 38-of-47 overall with 30 touchdowns and eight field goals for a 81% success rate which is 56th in the nation. The red zone defense has been even more impressive, ranking first in the Southern Conference and ninth in the nation at 71%. The Terriers opponents are 27-of-38 in the red zone with 24 touchdowns and 3 field goals.

#### FOURTH DOWN? GO FOR IT!

On fourth and short in plus territory, expect the Terriers to go for it instead of punting. Wofford is 20-of-32 on fourth downs, while opponents are 9-of-18 so far. The Terriers are 24th in the nation in fourth down percentage with a 62.5% success rate and are tied for third in fourth down attempts. Defensively, opponents are only at 50% on the season to ranked 55th in the nation.

#### COACHING STABILITY AT THE TOP

With Mike Ayers entering 29th season on the sidelines at Wofford, some of his assistants have also put in a number of years. Offensive coordinator Wade Lang leads the way at 29 years on staff. Offensive line coach Eric Nash has 14 years of experience at Wofford. Overall, the assistant coaches have 78 years of combined service at Wofford. In addition, six of the ten assistant coaches are Wofford graduates.

#### COACHING CHANGES

During the 2015 offseason, the Terriers welcomed four new coaches to the staff. Greg Gasparato (Wofford '09) works with the inside linebackers, Dane Romero (Wofford '09) is the running backs coach, B.J. Connolly (Williams '84) works with the tight ends, while Brian Mance (Clemson '05) is the cornerbacks coach. Leading up to the 2016 season, there has only been one change to the staff, as Shiel Wood (Wofford '06) returned as safeties coach and recruiting coordinator.

#### WINNING SEASONS

With a 9-4 mark in 2012, Wofford had a winning record for the third straight season and the tenth time in the last eleven years in 2012. The Terriers were 5-6 in 2013, one game under the .500 mark, but rebounded with a 6-5 record in 2014. Wofford was 5-6 in 2015, but are 9-3 in 2016 to secure a winning record. Over the past twenty-nine seasons under Coach Ayers, Wofford has recorded 20 winning seasons.

#### POLL POSITIONS

The Terriers opened the 2013 season ranked #5 by the coaches and #8 by The Sports Network (now STATS), but dropped out on November 18. To begin 2014, they were receiving votes in both polls but failed to garner votes in the final poll. Wofford opened 2015 failing to receive votes in either major poll. In the 2016 preseason polls, Wofford received votes in both polls. Following the win over Chattanooga, Wofford returned to the top 25 on November 14, sitting at #19 in the FCS Coaches poll and #20 in the STATS FCS poll.

#### TERRIERS AGAINST FBS TEAMS

The 2016 season marked the 19th time in the last 18 seasons the Terriers have played against a member of the FBS (NCAA Division I-A). Overall, Wofford is 1-18 in those games. In 2011, Wofford had a lead at Clemson in the third quarter. At South Carolina in 2012, the game was tied at 7-7 at the start of the fourth quarter. Wofford was down five points to Georgia Tech in 2014 with ten minutes to go in the game. In 2016, Wofford lost to Ole Miss, while South Carolina (2017) and Wyoming (2018) are also on future schedules.

#### DEFENSE BY COMMITTEE

The Terrier defense is a true team with contributions from numerous players. Overall, 22 players have recorded ten or more tackles. 26 players have at least a share of a tackle for loss, while 12 have recorded sacks. Eight players have interceptions, six have fumble recoveries and five have forced fumbles.

## GOING OVERTIME

The overtime game against The Citadel was only the eighth overtime game in school history. The Terriers lost the first two overtime games, then won the next two against Western Carolina and Georgia Southern. In 2012, a 24-17 double overtime loss at Samford was followed by a win over Chattanooga. After the win over Mercer in 2015 and a loss to The Citadel in 2016, Wofford is now 4-4 all-time in overtime games.

## TERRIERS AT HOME

Wofford has won 63 of its last 81 games played in Gibbs Stadium, including going 5-0 in 2014 ... Since Gibbs Stadium opened on Oct. 5, 1996, Wofford has posted a record of 84-32 (.741) ... Under Mike Ayers, Wofford is 92-45 (.671) in home games ... The Terriers have won 49 of 74 home SoCon games at Gibbs Stadium.

## THE 2016 TERRIERS GROUND ATTACK

Wofford finished last season ranked fourth in the nation in rushing at 300.2 yards per game. So far this season, Wofford is at 278.3 rushing yards per game to rank fifth in the nation.

## THE 2016 TERRIERS DEFENSE

Last season Wofford was third in the Southern Conference in total defense (first rushing defense, seventh passing defense) and allowing 380.5 yards per game. So far this season, the defense is first in the SoCon in total defense, first in rushing defense and fifth in passing defense and are allowing only 277.5 yards per game which is fifth in the nation.

## RUSHING

Wofford has finished among the top seven schools in the nation in rushing in each of the past 18 years. The Terriers' wingbone offense puts a premium on ball control and keeping the opponent's offense on the boundary. Eight times the Terriers have been second in the nation in rushing yards per game, while in 2010 and 2011 they finished first.

## WOFFORD VS. NON-CONFERENCE OPPONENTS

Since 2000, Wofford is 22-3 in non-conference regular season FCS games ... Wofford's loss to Coastal Carolina in 2006 snapped a streak of 10 straight regular season non-conference wins against FCS opponents ... The Terriers had not lost a non-conference regular season game to a FCS opponent since dropping the 2000 season opener to Lehigh 34-14 ... The loss to Gardner-Webb in 2013 ended a nine-game streak and Wofford lost again to Gardner-Webb in 2014.

## PREVENTING THE SACK

The offensive line is a veteran group this season, with two seniors, a junior and a pair of sophomores in the starting five. Last year they gave up only eight sacks all season which ranked third in the nation (0.73 per game). So far in 2016 they allowed just one sack each against Johnson C. Smith, ETSU and Samford.

## DROPPING THE QB

While the offensive line prevents sacks, the defensive line made them with 30 in the 2016 season for a loss of 196 yards to rank third in the SoCon and 42nd in the nation. In addition, the Terriers have 86 tackles for a loss of 326 yards which is third in the conference and 35th in the nation. Last season Wofford had 18 sacks (+10) and 49 tackles for loss (+35).

## BRENTON BERSIN

Wide receiver Brenton Bersin signed as an undrafted free agent with the Carolina Panthers in April of 2012. He spent the 2013 season on the Panthers practice squad. He re-signed with the Panthers again in 2014 and made the 53-man roster and had his first NFL catch against Detroit on September 14. He caught his first touchdown on October 19 at Green Bay and made his first start on October 26 against Seattle. Bersin's 1-yard touchdown reception at Green Bay was the first touchdown catch by a player from Wofford since Jerry Richardson had a touchdown as a member of the Baltimore Colts at Dallas (10/30/60). In 2015, Bersin had a career-high four catches against Tampa Bay (10/4). He remained on the roster for the remainder of the season as the Panthers won the NFC Championship and played in Super Bowl 50.

## MR. RICHARDSON

Jerry Richardson came to Wofford in the mid-1950s as an unheralded pass receiver from Fayetteville, N.C. By the time he left to begin his pro career with the Baltimore Colts, the passing combination of Charlie Bradshaw to Jerry Richardson had received nationwide fame. Richardson was an Associated Press Little All-America selection in 1957 and '58. He still holds Wofford's single-game record with 241 receiving yards vs. Newberry in 1956 and is the record holder for touchdown receptions in a season (9 in 1958) and in a career (21). Drafted by the defending world champion Colts, Richardson played two seasons in the NFL, earning Colt Rookie of the Year honors in 1959 and finishing third in the balloting for top NFL rookie. As a senior at Wofford, he scored 72 points on nine touchdowns, 12 extra points and two field goals. Richardson calls his greatest honor being elected team captain in 1958. In 1983, he was chosen to Wofford's All-Time Football team as a receiver. He is currently the owner of the Carolina Panthers. Last year, Wofford announced the construction of two new facilities on campus donated by Richardson. Due to be completed in Spring 2017, the Rosalind S. Richardson Center for the Arts will become home to academic programs in theatre arts, visual arts and art history. Expected to open in Fall 2017, the Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium will be a 123,000-square-foot facility that will include a 3,400-seat basketball arena and a 500-seat volleyball competition venue.



## CAROLINA PANTHER TRAINING CAMP

The Carolina Panthers have held summer training camp at Wofford since their inaugural season in 1995 and it will be held on campus until at least 2019. The camp provides Wofford tremendous national exposure and visibility. Media members that visit Wofford during the camp include ESPN, Fox Sports, NFL Network, USA Today and Sports Illustrated. This year's camp drew a record crowd, finishing with a total of nearly 135,400 visitors as camp ended on Tuesday, Aug. 16. That's nearly a 75 percent increase from 2015's record 77,625 visitors.



## RECENT SUCCESS

Wofford has finished among the top four teams in the Southern Conference race in twelve of the last thirteen years, winning four SoCon Championships. In the last thirteen years, the Terriers have won 62 of 98 SoCon games played. Over that time, Wofford is the winningest program in the Southern Conference with a .628 win percentage.

Will Gay picked up a first down on a 19-yard run, but a 42-yard field goal by David Marvin was wide right with seven seconds left in the first quarter. With the ball back, Wofford had first down runs by Blake Morgan and Lorenzo Long. Nick Colvin picked up a first down and then Brad Butler capped the drive with a 10-yard run. The point after was good and the score was tied at 7-7 with 7:37 left in the second quarter.

After a first down by the Golden Eagles, Lincoln Stewart had a sack for a loss of eleven yards. A TTU punt gave Wofford the ball back. Will Gay picked up a first down, but the Terriers had to punt. The Golden Eagles began a drive with two minutes left in the first half and gained two first downs before punting. Wofford had the ball back with 28 seconds remaining and Will Gay ran for a 34-yard first down. A 62-yard field goal try by David Marvin was wide right to end the first half.

**WOFFORD 13, #18 OLE MISS 38**  
**SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 10, 2016**

OXFORD, Miss. — On Saturday afternoon, Wofford was defeated 38-13 by #18 Ole Miss at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium. The Rebels scored on their first five possessions of the game and held the Terriers to a field goal in the first half. Wofford scored twice in the fourth quarter, a touchdown and field goal, for the final margin. Wofford was led by Brad Butler with 59 rushing yards, including a touchdown, and 4-of-7 passing. For Ole Miss, Chad Kelly was 20-of-27 passing for 219 yards and three touchdowns.

The Rebels had the ball first and kicked a 40-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead just 1:57 into the contest. Wofford went three-and-out and punted on their opening drive. SPARTANBURG, S.C. —Wofford defeated Johnson C. Smith 59-0 on Saturday afternoon at Gibbs Stadium. The Terriers started slow and had a 17-0 lead at the half before scoring 42 points in the second half, which included three defensive touchdowns. Wofford was led by Lorenzo Long with 127 rushing yards and three touchdowns, while Brad Butler was 10-of-12 passing for 124 yards and a touchdown. ## GAME FOUR ETSU 0, WOFFORD 31 SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 24, 2016

SPARTANBURG, S.C. – Wofford opened Southern Conference play with a 31-0 win over East Tennessee State on Saturday afternoon at Gibbs Stadium. The Terriers scored touchdowns on their first two drives of the game and the defense held the Bucs to only 76 yards of total offense and recorded nine tackles for loss in the contest for the win.

Wofford moves to 3-1 on the season and 1-0 in the Southern Conference, while ETSU is 2-1 and 1-1 in the league. Wofford was led by Lorenzo Long with 156 yards on 19 carries with two touchdowns. Andre Stoddard added two touchdowns, while the offense had 350 rushing yards. The Bucs were led by Austin Herink with 80 yards on 14-of-22 passing.

The Terriers had the ball first and after four first downs Andre Stoddard capped the drive with a five-yard touchdown run. Wofford had a long touchdown run by Brandon Goodson called back by penalty and the Terriers had to punt. On third down for the Bucs, John Patterson sacked Austin Herink and forced a punt. Wofford then went three-and-out and punted, with ETSU taking over at the ten-yard line with 7:28 left in the first half. They were able to gain one first down before punting. BIRMINGHAM, Ala. – Wofford could not overcome penalties in a 28-26 loss at Samford on Saturday afternoon at Seibert Stadium. The Terriers committed a season high ten penalties, while the Bulldog offense scored four passing touchdowns.

### MERCER 21, WOFFORD 31 SATURDAY, OCTOBER 29, 2016

SPARTANBURG, S.C. - On Saturday afternoon, Wofford earned a 31-21 victory over Mercer at Gibbs Stadium. The Terriers took a 24-7 lead in the third quarter after a blocked punt recovery for touchdown by David Howerton and a field goal by David Marvin, but the Bears battled back in the fourth quarter to make it a close contest.

Wofford moves to 5-3 on the season and 3-2 in the Southern Conference, Mercer is 4-4 and 2-3 in the league. The Terriers were led by Lorenzo Long with 108 rushing yards and two touchdowns. The Bears were led by John Russ, who was 30-of-45 passing for 271 yards and three touchdowns.

The Terriers had the ball first and gained one first down before punting. Mercer took over at the two-yard line and gained one first down before a sack on third down forced a punt. The Terriers were stopped on fourth-and-one, giving Mercer the ball at the 46-yard line. After two first downs, John Russ was intercepted by Jaleel Green. The Terriers were unable to move the ball and punted.

The Bears had a first down, but a sack by Terrance Morris and a penalty forced a punt. The snap was dropped and Wofford took over just across midfield. After a couple first downs, Lorenzo Long scored from one yard out to give Wofford a 7-0 lead with 7:36 left in the second quarter. A 40-yard field goal attempt by Mercer was wide right and Wofford took over with 3:38 left in the half. A 60-yard completion by Brandon Goodson to Chandler Gouger moved the ball inside the five-yard line. Lorenzo Long went in from three yards and Wofford had a 14-0 lead with 1:23 on the clock. Mercer moved down the field and scored on a five-yard pass to Chandler Curtis with 12 seconds left remaining in the half.

Both teams went three-and-out and punted to open the second half. Mercer added a three-and-out, but the punt was blocked by David Howerton and he recovered the ball in the end zone for a touchdown. Wofford had a 21-7 lead with 11:19 left in the third quarter. On the next possession by the Bears, they had one first down before punting. With the ball back, David Marvin added a 33-yard field goal for a 24-7 lead at the 4:36 mark of the third quarter.

Mercer had a first down, plus a penalty, and then added a 38-yard reception to move inside the 10. A touchdown catch by Marquise Irvin cut the lead to 24-14 at the 3:42 mark of the third quarter. Wofford got the ball back and moved down the field with passes to R.J. Taylor and Will Gay, and a first down run by Lorenzo Long. On fourth-and-one from the six, the keeper by Brandon Goodson was a couple inches short. Mercer took over, but failed to convert on a fourth-and-one and Wofford took over at the 32-yard line.

After several penalties by the Terriers, a roughing the passer call gave Wofford a first down. A pass to R.J. Taylor picked up a first down and on fourth-and-one from the nine, Lorenzo Long gained just enough for the first down. Chase Nelson scored from one-yard out to give the Terriers a 31-14 lead with 6:39 remaining in the game. Mercer scored on a 10-yard pass to Marquise Irvin to cut the lead to 31-21 in four plays and 36 seconds. The Bears attempted an on-side kick, but it was recovered by the Terriers. Working with a short field, Wofford had three first downs but were stopped on fourth-and-long. Mercer took over on downs with 1:36 left in the game at the 18-yard line. John Russ was intercepted by Dylan Young and he returned it to the three-yard line. Wofford took a knee twice to end the game.

### WOFFORD 34, FURMAN 27 SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 5, 2016

GREENVILLE, S.C. - Wofford scored a touchdown with less than a minute remaining to defeat Furman 34-27 on Saturday at Paladin Stadium. The Terriers had the lead at the half, but the Paladins scored 14 unanswered in the third quarter to take the lead. Touchdowns by Brandon Goodson and Lorenzo Long in the fourth quarter gave Wofford the win.

Wofford moves to 6-3 on the season and 4-2 in the Southern Conference. Furman is 2-7 overall and 2-5 in the league. The Terriers were led by Brandon Goodson with 121 rushing yards and two touchdowns, along with a 3-of-4 passing day for 66 yards and a touchdown. David Marvin made field goals from 54 and 57 yards in the game. Furman was led by Reese Hannon with 305 passing yards as he was 27-of-40 on the day with one interception.

The Paladins and Terriers both went three and out and punted on their opening possessions. Antonio Wilcox scored from there to give Furman a 6-0 lead after the extra point was missed with 9:38 on the clock. On the first play of the next drive by Wofford, a Lorenzo Long fumble was recovered by Carl Rider and Furman took over at the 15-yard line. A sack by Tyler Vaughn forced a 38-yard field goal attempt. The attempt was blocked by Jaleel Green and Wofford took over at the 21-yard line.

The Terriers went three-and-out. A fumble by Antonio Wilcox was forced by Chris Boudreaux and recovered by JoJo Tillery. On third down, Brandon Goodson went 64-yards down the far sideline for a touchdown. Wofford had a 7-6 lead at 2:50 in the first quarter. The Paladins went three-and-out and punted. With the ball back, David Marvin hit a 54-yard field goal for a 10-6 lead at the 10:30 mark of the second quarter.

A three-and-out by the Paladins gave Wofford the ball at the 41-yard line, but a fumble by Chris Martin was recovered by Bryan Okeh and the Paladins took over at the 50. Duncan Fletcher caught a 10-yard pass for a touchdown as Furman had a 13-10 lead with 1:25 left in the half. A little trickery in the backfield led to Brandon Goodson finding a wide open Chandler Gouger for a 14-yard touchdown. Wofford had a 17-13 lead with 23 seconds left in the half. Furman fumbled and the ball was recovered by Boston Bryant. With three seconds left, David Marvin attempted a 57 yard field goal that just cleared the crossbar for a 20-13 lead at the break.

The Terriers opened the second half with the ball and gained one first down before punting. Furman had a 14-yard touchdown pass to Thomas Gordon as they tied the game at 20 with 6:10 left in the third quarter. Wofford went three-and-out, but the snap was fumbled and Furman recovered at the five yard line. On the next play, Antonio Wilcox gave the Paladins a 27-20 lead with 3:56 left in the third.

A 33-yard touchdown run by Brandon Goodson tied the game at 27 with 14:17 on the clock in the fourth quarter. Jaleel Green picked off Reese Hannon in the end zone and returned it to the 36-yard line. The Terriers went three-and-out and punted back to the Paladins. Furman was forced three-and-out. With the ball back, a 33-yard pass reception by Will Gay moved the ball to the 7. Lorenzo Long went seven yards up the middle for a touchdown and Wofford led 34-27 with 49 seconds left. The Paladins had one first down, but time ran out as Dominique Lemon recovered a fumble on the final play of the game.

## GAME TEN WOFFORD 36, #7 CHATTANOOGA 28 SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 12, 2016

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. — Wofford kept playoff hopes alive with a 36-28 win over Chattanooga on Saturday afternoon at Finley Stadium. The Terriers kicked a field goal with just over two minutes remaining to give them an eight point advantage and the defense held to preserve the win.

Wofford moves to 7-3 on the season and 5-2 in the Southern Conference. Chattanooga, is 8-2 overall and 6-2 in league play. The Terriers were led by Lorenzo Long with 123 rushing yards and a touchdown and Lennox McAfee had 160 kick return yards, including a touchdown. The Mocs had 57 rushing yards from Derrick Craine and Alejandro Bennifield was 19-of-32 passing with two interceptions.

The Mocs had the ball first and took a 7-0 lead after a five-yard touchdown reception by Richarde Bagley at the 10:33 mark of the first quarter. On the ensuing kickoff, Lennox McAfee went 100 yards down the near sideline to tie the game at 7-7 with 10:21 on the clock in the first. The Mocs went three-and-out. The Wofford offense gained a pair of first downs before taking the lead with a 51-yard field goal by David Marvin for a 10-7 game. On the next drive by the Mocs, they regained the lead with a 20-yard pass to Derrick Craine for a 14-10 score with 1:06 left in the first quarter. With the ball back, Chandler Gouger caught a 16-yard pass from Brandon Goodson in the end zone to give the Terriers a 17-14 lead at the 12:25 mark of the second quarter. The teams traded punts. On the first play for the Mocs, a deep pass by Alejandro Bennifield was intercepted by Jaleel Green. Wofford had to punt after a pair of first downs and the Mocs started at their own one yard line. On the second play, Datavious Wilson and Terrance Morris stopped Derrick Craine in the backfield for a safety and Wofford took a 19-14 lead with 3:18 on the clock.

The Mocs had an eight yard touchdown pass to Richarde Bagley to cut the Wofford lead to 26-21 with ten seconds remaining.

To start the second half, both teams punted. The Terriers then had one first down before punting. Jireh Wilson picked off Alejandro Bennifield in the backfield and returned it ten yards to the five yard line. Lorenzo Long scored from the one to give Wofford a 33-21 lead at the 7:16 mark of the third quarter. Chattanooga gained one first down before punting back to the Terriers. Wofford had a fourth-and-one, but were inches short and the Mocs took over at the 31 yard line. A 30-yard pass and a one-yard pass to Xavier Borishade on fourth down cut the Wofford lead to 33-28 with 14:55 on the clock in the fourth quarter.

The Terriers picked up two first downs and were faced with a fourth-and-three, which was a yard short and the Mocs took over at the 36 yard line. They had one first down before punting and Wofford began at the 11 yard line. A 24-yard field goal by David Marvin gave the Terriers a 36-28 lead with 2:08 left in the fourth quarter. SPARTANBURG, S.C. — The Wofford College football team finished the regular season with a 17-0 win over VMI on Saturday afternoon at Gibbs Stadium. The Terriers had a 3-0 lead at halftime and scored a pair of touchdowns in the final six minutes of the game to earn the victory and put the team in position for a possible FCS Playoff berth.

Wofford moves to 8-3 on the season and 6-2 in the Southern Conference. VMI ends the season at 3-8 overall and 1-7 in the league. Lorenzo Long led the Terriers with 111 yards and a touchdown on 18 carries. The Keydets were led by Al Cobb who was 18-of-31 passing for 184 yards.

The Keydets had the ball first and went three-and-out and punted. Wofford was able to gain three first downs, but had to settle for a 30-yard field goal by David Marvin at 7:34 in the first quarter. On the next drive by VMI, they picked up a first down before punting. With the ball back, the Terriers had four first downs and drove to the one-yard line, but were stopped on fourth down.

SPARTANBURG, S.C. — One point was the difference as the Wofford College football team earned a 15-14 win over Charleston Southern at Gibbs Stadium on Saturday afternoon. Devin Watson had two interceptions for the Terriers in the second half, including one with a minute remaining in the game to secure the win. The Terriers advance in the NCAA FCS Playoffs to face The Citadel next Saturday in Charleston.

Wofford advances with a 9-3 record on the season and #10 Charleston Southern finishes at 7-4 on the season. The Terriers were led by Lorenzo Long with 96 rushing yards and two touchdowns. The Wofford defense came up with 10 tackles for loss and three sacks. The Bucs were led by Darius Hammond with 94 rushing yards, while Shane Bucenell was 9-of-18 passing.

The Terriers had the ball first and went three-and-out and punted. The Bucs were able to gain one first down before punting back to Wofford. After gaining a first down, the Terriers were forced to punt. Charleston Southern moved down the field with four first downs and scored on a seven-yard touchdown pass from Shane Bucenell to Jared Scotland for a 7-0 lead at 1:41 in the first quarter.

On the next drive by Wofford, they gained one first down added a first down on a late hit on the quarterback. On a fourth-and-one, Andre Stoddard picked up a first down. Lorenzo Long added a first down and then on a 24-yard apparent touchdown run, instant replay rule Long down at the six-inch line. Two plays later, Long scored but the point after was wide left. Wofford trailed 7-6 at the 9:09 mark of the second quarter.

The Bucs went three-and-out and punted after a tackle for loss by Devin Watson on third down. Wofford also went three-and-out and punted back to the Bucs. After a three-and-out by Charleston Southern punted and it was blocked by Terrance Morris and recovered at the 2-yard line by Bryce Motes. On fourth-and-inches, instant replay ruled Lorenzo Long did not cross the line and CSU took over on downs. On third down, Tyler Vaughn tackled Shane Bucenell in the end zone for a safety and an 8-7 lead with just over two minutes left in the half. After the free kick, Wofford went three-and-out and punted. Charleston Southern ran out the clock to end the first half.

To begin the second half, Charleston Southern used a 51-yard run by Darius Hammond to set up first-and-goal. Shane Bucenell scored from two yards out to give CSU a 14-8 lead with 12:15 on the clock in the third quarter. Both teams then went three-and-out and punted twice. Wofford took over with 5:08 on the clock in the third quarter and had a 30-yard pass completion to Dorian Lindsey to move across midfield. Lorenzo Long capped the drive with a 32-yard touchdown run up the middle for a 15-14 lead with 2:32 left in the third quarter.

With the ball back, the Bucs gained three first downs before Devin Watson intercepted Shane Bucenell at the 28-yard line. Wofford was able to gain one first down before punting. The Bucs answered with a first down, but also had to punt. The Terriers could only gain two yards and had to punt on their next drive. CSU had a first down, but then the Wofford defense stepped up with a tackle for loss by Jaleel Green, sack by Dylan Young and a pass break-up by George Gbesee to force a punt.

Wofford was unable to pick up a first down and punted with 3:03 left in the fourth quarter. On third down, Devin Watson picked off Shane Bucenell and returned it 47-yards to the 24-yard line with 1:09 on the clock. The Terriers took a knee twice to seal the win.

CHARLESTON, S.C. – On Saturday night, Wofford won 17-3 at The Citadel to advance in the 2016 NCAA FCS Playoffs at Johnson Hagood Stadium. The Citadel scored first with a field goal, but the Terriers scored 17 unanswered points in the second half to earn the victory.

Wofford advances with a 10-3 record on the season and sixth-ranked The Citadel ends the season at 10-2 overall. The Terriers were led by Lorenzo Long with 92 rushing yards, while Joe Newman had 45 rushing yards and a touchdown. Devin Watson sealed the win with a 64-yard interception return for a touchdown with 30 seconds left. The Bulldogs were led by Tyler Renew with 76 rushing yards, while Dominique Allen was 11-of-22 passing.

The Bulldogs had the ball first and gained six first downs to move inside the five yard line, but they had to settle for a 24-yard field goal to take a 3-0 lead at 7:25 in the opening quarter. Wofford went three-and-out and punted on their opening possession. The Citadel had a 26-yard pass to move across midfield, but on fourth-and-five turned the ball over on downs and Wofford took over at the 30.

A deep pass by Brandon Goodson was intercepted by Dee Delaney, who returned it 20 yards. On the next play, Lincoln Stewart intercepted Dominique Allen and returned it 21 yards. Brandon Goodson was intercepted on the next play from scrimmage by Dee Delaney, who ran it back 48 yards. The Citadel was unable to gain a first down and then a 44-yard field goal attempt was wide left. After two first downs, the Terriers had to punt.

With the ball back, the Bulldogs had two first downs before punting. Wofford took over at the four and was unable to move the ball and punted. The Bulldogs had two first downs, but back-to-back holding calls made it first and 30. A 27-yard run by Dominique Allen moved the ball to the seven yard line with 16 seconds left in the first half. A 25-yard field goal was wide left with four seconds on the clock. Wofford took a knee to end the half.

To open the second half, Wofford and The Citadel both went three-and-out and punted. On the next drive by Wofford, Brandon Goodson left the game due to an injury and Joe Newman entered the game. Blake Morgan went 44 yards down the sideline for a first down and David Marvin tied the game with a 47-yard field goal with 8:09 on the clock. The Citadel went three-and-out and punted back to the Terriers, but Wofford also went three-and-out. The Citadel punted on fourth down, but a roughing the punter call resulted in a first down. They were unable to gain another first down and punted.

Wofford had a first down pass from Joe Newman to Blake Morgan for a 26-yard gain. After a first down run by Lorenzo Long, the Terriers faced a fourth-and-one. Lorenzo Long picked up two yards for the first down. Joe Newman then went 36-yards on the keeper for a 10-3 lead with 10:28 left in the fourth quarter. The Citadel had a first down, and then converted a fourth-and-one. After another first down, a personal foul on the Terriers gave the Bulldogs first down inside the ten. A 35-yard field goal attempt with 4:23 left hit the right upright and was no good.

Wofford answered with a 43-yard run by Lorenzo Long, but the drive stalled and a 46-yard field goal by David Marvin was no good and The Citadel took over with 2:12 left in the fourth quarter. The Bulldogs gained a pair of first downs, but then Devin Watson picked off Dominique Allen and returned it 64 yards for a touchdown. The PAT was good and the Terriers led 17-3 with 30 seconds remaining. The Bulldogs ran out of time and Wofford earned the win.
