THE SAMFORD GAME

Wofford is back on the road as they travel to Samford for the first of back-to-back SoCon road games ... The Terriers are 3-5 entering the game, following victories over Gardner-Webb (21-20), #14 Richmond (26-19) and VMI (31-16), along with losses to #13 William & Mary (28-21), #12 Mercer (22-3), Western Carolina (21-17), #19 Chattanooga (37-5) and #23 East Tennessee State (24-7) ... In the Southern Conference, the Terriers are 1-4 this season ... In a series that began in 1949, Wofford and Samford have met 21 times with the Bulldogs holding a 16-5 lead ... Samford has won nine straight games in the series, including a 31-10 win in Spartanburg last season ... Samford was 6-4 overall last season and 4-4 in the Southern Conference to finish tied for fifth ... So far this season they are 3-4 overall, with a 2-2 mark in the Southern Conference after wins over VMI and Mercer, along with losses to ETSU and The Citadel ... Their game at Furman was postponed due to Hurricane Helene.

TERRIER TOP NOTES

Here are the top notes of interest heading into the game at Samford ...

- Wofford has played five games against teams in the top 25, the most since 2017.
- Five Terriers have earned SoCon Player of the Week honors so far this year, the most since eight in 2017.
- Shawn Watson is entering his second full season as head coach of the Terriers.
- The Wofford defense is 39th in the nation and third in the SoCon, with the passing defense 16th overall and first in the SoCon.
- Wofford returns 16 starters overall, including seven on offense, seven on defense and two specialists.
- Nine players were named to the All-Southern Conference preseason team. Five players earned spots on the first team, the most in the league, including RB Ryan Ingram, TE Jordan Davis, DL Brandon Maina, LB David Powers and DB Maximus Pulley.

SAMFORD'S LAST GAME

The Citadel football team scored 28-straight second half points in a 28-11 win over Samford Saturday afternoon at Johnson Hagood Stadium.

With the loss, Samford fell to 3-4 overall and 2-2 in Southern Conference play. The Citadel improved to 4-5 overall and 2-4 on SoCon action.

For Samford in the loss, quarterback Quincy Crittendon completed 29-of-36 passes for 223 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions. Samuel Willoughby had five catches for 27 yards and a touchdown. Iaan Cousin caught three passes for a team-high 47 yards. Defensively, Noah Martin had 11 tackles, while C.J. Douglas had 10 stops.

For The Citadel, Garrison Johnson rushed for two touchdowns, while quarterback Jonathan Bennett and Johnny Crawford had a rushing touchdown each. Defensively, Dominick Poole and Evan Byrd had an interception each.

LAST MEETING

SAMFORD 31, WOFFORD 10 SATURDAY, OCTOBER 7, 2023

SPARTANBURG, S.C. — On Saturday afternoon, the Wofford College football team was defeated 31-10 by Samford University at Gibbs Stadium. The Bulldogs had a 7-0 lead after the first quarter and added 17 points in the second quarter for a 24-3 halftime lead. In the second half, both teams had touchdowns for the final margin.

Wofford is now 0-6 and 0-3 in the Southern Conference, while Samford is 3-3 overall and 3-2 in league play. The Terriers were led by J.T. Smith with seven carries for 67 yards and Ryan Ingram had 15 carries for 56 yards and a touchdown. Jay Stanton led the Bulldogs with 19 carries for 194 yards and two touchdowns, while Michael Hiers was 30-of-42 passing for 239 yards and a touchdown.

The Terriers had the ball to open the game and went three-and-out. Samford had one first down before having to punt on their first drive. With the ball back, Wofford had three first downs which included a 31-yard run by J.T. Smith. A 45-yard field goal attempt was blocked by the Bulldogs and they took over at the 29-yard line. After one first down, the Bulldogs punted. Wofford went three-and-out, with the Bulldogs beginning their drive at the 41-yard line. They rapidly moved down the field with three first downs and Jay Stanton found the endzone from one-yard out for a 7-0 lead at 3:30 in the first quarter.

Wofford went three-and-out and punted, which was followed by Samford gaining two first downs and adding a 24-yard field goal for a 10-0 advantage after one play in the second quarter. The Terriers then picked up three first downs and a 37-yard field goal by Bridger Jones made it a 10-3 scored with 11:22 left in the first half. With the ball back, Samford had six first downs on a twelve-play drive that covered 81 yards and was capped by a six-yard touchdown run for a 17-3 lead. Wofford went three-and-out again and the Bulldogs had three first downs before a nine-yard touchdown run pushed the lead to 24-3 with 3:12 left in the half. The Terriers had a first down run by Ryan Ingram before punting and Samford had three first downs before the half ended.

To open the second half, Samford had one first down and punted. Wofford's Pauly Seeley was intercepted by Xavier Nurse and the Bulldogs took over at the 47-yard line. Samford had one first down before punting back to the Terriers. Wofford had one first down before punting with the ball downed at the three-yard line. The Bulldogs covered 97 yards in 15 plays and scored on a run by Damonta Witherspoon for a 31-3 lead at 1:53 in the third quarter. Wofford had a pair of first downs before punting. Samford's quarterback was sacked by Eli Purcell on their next drive, forcing a three-and-out and punt.

The Terriers converted a fourth-and-four with a pass to Rickie Shaw for a 22-yard gain. Alec Holt had a first down catch to move into the red zone. On fourth-and-goal from the five, a defensive holding call gave the Terriers a first down at the two. Ryan Ingram bounced outside and scored from two-yards out to make it a 31-10 game with 5:42 remaining. On Samford's next drive, Damien Curtis intercepted Michael Hiers and Wofford took over at the 32-yard line. The Terriers went three-and-out and punted, with Samford taking over with 3:43 left in the game. They were able to gain one first down and run out the clock.

ABOUT WOFFORD

Shawn Watson is entering his second full season as head coach of the Terriers. On offense, the offensive line features returning starters Quincy Hughes, Anthony Garcia and Briggs Kears. Luke Moise and Mason Howard will be at the other two spots. The pro spread offense usually sees three receivers, one tight end and one running back in most formations. Kyle Watkins has 33 catches for 463 yards, while Isaiah Scott has 20 catches for 240 yards. Jordan Davis starts at tight end and has 13 catches and three touchdowns. Ryan Ingram leads the team in rushing with 340 yards on 83 carries with a team-best four touchdowns. At quarterback, Amari Odom started the first four games, Pauly Seeley has started the next three contests and Bryce Corriston started against ETSU.

The defense remains a 3-4 base, with the defensive line led by returners Brandon Maina and Anthonie Lattany. They are joined by O'marion Brown. The linebacker position has three returners from last season. Jalen Marshall leads the team with 63 tackles, while John Boyles and David Powers also started last season. Nick Morgan steps in to start at the other outside linebacker position. In the secondary, Amir Annoor and Isaiah Wadsworth return at cornerback. At safety, transfer C.J. Coombes joins returner Maximus Pulley.

Bridger Jones is 4-of-5 on field goals, along with a 62.5 average on kickoffs. Devery Cagle is 4-of-5 on field goals. Sam Spence has 43 punts with a 41.0 average and has a 56.0 average on kickoffs. Tommy DiLiegro handles long snapping duties.

INJURY REPORT

Tight end Jacob Ritchie (knee), running back David Legette (Achilles), wide receiver Kyle Pinnix (knee), offensive lineman Ben Holmes (hip), defensive lineman Brandon Maina (knee), and offensive lineman Gavin Major (shoulder) will miss the remainder of the season due to injury.

COMPARED TO LAST YEAR

With eight games played, the Terriers have shown improvement over last year. The three wins have surpassed the mark from 2023 (2). The team has scored 131 points compared to 97 in the first eight games in 2023, while also giving up 177 points as opposed to 234 last season. Big plays are a part of the success, with 30 plays of 20 or more yards so far, compared to just 19 in the first seven games in 2023.

SOCON PLAYER OF THE WEEK

On September 2, Wofford linebacker Jalen Marshall was named the Southern Conference Defensive Player of the week. Marshall, a junior from Hiram, Georgia, led the Terriers with ten tackles in the win at Gardner-Webb on Thursday night.

SOCON PLAYERS OF THE WEEK PART 2

On September 9, the Southern Conference named Wofford quarterback Amari Odom the Offensive Player of the Week and defensive back Amir Annoor was named the Defensive Player of the Week. Annoor, a senior from Nashville, Tennessee, had two interceptions in the second half as the Terrier defense combined for four interceptions at Richmond. Odom, a second-year freshman from Inglewood, California, led the offense to a 26-19 road win at Richmond. He threw for 219 yards and two touchdowns on 16-of-28 attempts.

SOCON PLAYER OF THE WEEK PART 3

On September 16, Wofford defensive back C.J. Coombes was named the SoCon Defensive Player of the Week. Coombes, a second-year freshman from Bellefonte, Delaware, led the Terriers in tackles with 13 against #13 William & Mary. In the fourth quarter, he recovered a fumble.

SOCON PLAYER OF THE WEEK PART 4

On October 7, Wofford linebacker David Powers was named the SoCon Defensive Player of the Week. Powers, a senior from El Paso, Texas, led the Terriers in tackles with 11 on Saturday at Western Carolina. Early in the fourth quarter with the Catamounts driving, Powers intercepted a pass on the two-yard line to prevent a touchdown.

STATS PERFORM NATIONAL TEAM OF THE WEEK

After the win over Richmond, Wofford was named the Stats Perform FCS National Team of the Week for the first time in school history. The Terriers had back-to-back road wins over 2023 NCAA FCS Playoff qualifiers to begin the 2024 season.

JERRY RICE AWARD WATCH LIST

Defensive back C.J. Coombes is one of 30 players named to the in-season watch list of the Stats Perform 2024 Jerry Rice Award, which honors the FCS freshman player of the year in college football's Division I subdivision. Coombes, a second-year freshman from Bellefonte, Delaware, is second on the team in total tackles with 59. Among the SoCon leaders he is eighth in total tackles and he is ranked tenth in the nation in solo tackles.

WOFFORD'S LAST GAME

Wofford was defeated 24-7 by East Tennessee State University on Saturday afternoon at Gibbs Stadium. The Bucs had a 10-0 lead before the Terriers got on the board in the third quarter to cut the score to 10-7. The Bucs scored the next two touchdowns to secure the win.

Wofford is now 3-5 overall and 1-4 in the Southern Conference. East Tennessee State, ranked #23 in the nation, is 5-3 overall and 3-1 in league play. The Terriers were led by Bryce Corriston with 8-of-19 passing and a touchdown, while Ryan Ingram had 36 rushing yards. ETSU quarterback Jaylen King was 18-of-32 passing for 198 yards. He also ran for a pair of touchdowns.

Wofford had 178 total yards, with 103 receiving yards. East Tennessee State had 407 total yards, with 209 of those rushing yards. Wofford had nine first downs to 22 for the Bucs. Wofford was 2-of-12 on third down and 0-of-2 on fourth down. East Tennessee State was 8-of-17 on third down and 3-of-5 on fourth down. East Tennessee State was called for one penalty, while Wofford was called for six. East Tennessee State had a 34:06 to 25:54 time of possession advantage.

WOFFORD VS. ETSU GAME NOTES

This was the 32nd meeting between the two teams in a series that dates back to 1957. The series is now tied at 16-16 after ETSU has won three of the last four meetings ... The contest was the 79th Homecoming game at Wofford ... The Terriers are now 49-28-2 all-time in Homecoming games ... Eli Campbell had a pair of interceptions in the first half, giving him three for his career ... C.J. Coombes led the team with eight tackles. The defense had eight tackles for loss in the game, including two by Isaiah Mananga ... Isaiah Wadsworth blocked a field goal at the end of the first half, the first of his career. Wofford has blocked two field goals this season ... Game captains were Bryce Corriston and Maximus Pulley ... Attendance at Gibbs Stadium was 4,548.

2024 PRESEASON SOUTHERN CONFERENCE POLL

In the 2024 Southern Conference Preseason Poll, the conference's nine head coaches picked Wofford to finish eighth in the preseason poll with 19 total points. Wofford ended eighth in the 2023 final standings. A SoCon preseason media poll was not conducted.

2024 PRESEASON ALL-SOCON

The Terriers had nine players recognized by the league's coaches on the 2024 preseason all-conference first and second team. The nine selections were the most for the Terriers most since the 2019 season. Five players earned spots on the first team, the most in the league. Senior running back Ryan Ingram, who led the team in rushing and rushing touchdowns last season, was joined on the first team by senior tight end Jordan Davis. Senior defensive lineman Brandon Maina was an All-Southern Conference second team selection a year ago. Senior linebacker David Powers led the team in total tackles with 102 last season, while junior safety Maximus Pulley was second on the team in interceptions and first in recovered fumbles.

IN THE 2024 NATIONAL RANKINGS

In the 2024 NCAA rankings, David Powers is 46st at 0.28 interceptions per game ... Amir Annoor, Eli Campbell and Javis Mynatt are tied for 63rd with 0.25 interceptions per game ... Kyle Parsons is 35th in kick returns (22.5) ... Kyle Watkins is 77th in receiving yards per game (57.9) and 95th in receptions per game with 4.1 ... Jalen Marshall is 41st in total tackles (7.9), seventh in solo tackles (5.8), and 41st in tackles for loss (1.1) ... C.J. Coombes is tenth in solo tackles (5.3) and 77th in total tackles (7.4) ... Overall as a team, the Terriers are seventh in punt returns (14.75), fifth in interceptions (12), fifth in passing efficiency defense (106.20), and 38th in scoring defense (23.4).

ASSISTANT COACHING CHANGES

The Terriers had several coaching changes in the offseason. Joining the team on offense were tight ends coach Pete Collins and wide receivers coach Michealee Harris, while on defense John Beckley was named safeties coach.

THE 2023 SEASON

In the first full season under head coach Shawn Watson, the Terriers ended the 2023 season at 2-9 overall and 2-6 in the Southern Conference ... Wofford lost nine straight games to open the season ... They then earned an 11-8 win on the road at The Citadel and closed out the season with a 19-13 win over #2 Furman ... It was the first full season for head coach Shawn Watson ... Following the season, DL Brandon Maina and LB David Powers earned second team All-Southern Conference honors from the media ... QB Pauly Seely, LS Tommy DiLiegro and DB Eli Campbell earned spots on the SoCon All-Freshman team.

HOW THE 2024 OPPONENTS ARE DOING

The twelve opponents that Wofford faces this season were a combined 75-66 in 2023. Five advanced to the NCAA FCS Playoffs. This year five were ranked in the FCS preseason polls, including non-conference foes Richmond and William & Mary. So far in 2024, Gardner-Webb (2-6), Richmond (6-2), William & Mary (5-3), Mercer (7-1), Western Carolina (4-4), VMI (0-8), Chattanooga (5-3) and ETSU (5-3) are a combined 30-30. Among the FCS schools, Wofford has the 33rd toughest schedule.

LOTS OF RANKED OPPONENTS

So far this season, Wofford has played five games against teams that were ranked in the FCS Top 25 on game day. Richmond (14), William & Mary (13), Mercer (12), Chattanooga (19) and East Tennessee State (23) were all ranked. The last time Wofford faced five ranked opponents in a season was in 2017, which included a pair of playoff games. In 2007, Wofford faced seven total Top 25

teams, five of which were in the regular season.

A 12 GAME SEASON

Wofford has not played 12 games in the regular season since 2016. That season the Terriers were 9-3 in the regular season and then 10-4 overall after the FCS Playoffs. Prior to that, Wofford played 12 regular season games in 2002 (9-3).

TIES TO WATSON

With Watson taking over as head coach in December of 2022, he added several staff members from previous coaching stops. Running backs coach Seniorise Perry and wide receivers coach Michael Lee Harris were players at Louisville when Watson was offensive coordinator, while Jonathan Saxon was a graduate assistant on the defensive line on that staff. Quality control coach Roy Philon (Louisville) also played on teams coached by Watson.

2024 INCOMING CLASS

The Terriers welcomes an incoming class of 39 players in the fall of 2024, which included four transfers. There are 22 newcomers on defense, 15 on offense and two specialists.

TRUE FRESHMEN ON THE FIELD

With the NCAA redshirt rules, players can see action in up to four games and keep the redshirt. Wofford is playing a number of true freshmen this year, including WR Ivory Aikens, OL Luke Moise, LB Caleb Oliver, WR Isaiah Scott and DL Marion Smokes.

THE 2024 RETURNERS

Wofford returns 16 starters for the 2024 season. On offense, wide receivers Kyle Pinnix and Rickie Shaw, running back Ryan Ingram, and quarterback Pauly Seeley return along with offensive linemen Quincy Hughes, Briggs Kears and Anthony Garcia. On defense, the seven returners are defensive lineman Brandon Maina, linebackers Jalen Marshall, David Powers, and Matthew Clayton, and defensive backs Maximus Pulley, DJ Curtis and Amir Annoor. On special teams, kicker Bridger Jones and long snapper Tommy DiLiegro will return. An additional 13 players who started at least one game also return.

THE STORM FRONT

The Terriers have played two games this season that were impacted by Hurricane Helene, which hit the Carolinas on September 27. The Mercer (9/28) game was played as scheduled, despite much of campus and Spartanburg without power. The Western Carolina game (10/5) was played without fans due to the ongoing recovery effort. In 2023, Wofford and VMI played on September 23 in heavy rain from Tropical Storm Ophelia.

INTERCEPTION INCREASE

Wofford had only five interceptions in the 2022 season and then had nine interceptions in 2023. So far in 2024, the Terriers have twelve interceptions by eight different players. The twelve interceptions are fifth in the nation.

TAKING THE BALL AWAY

So far in 2024, the Terriers have come up with 18 turnovers - six fumble recoveries and 12 interceptions. Last season, Wofford had 16 take-aways and in 2022 the number was 14. The 12 interceptions are already three more than in 2024 (9). The team is +0.38 on the season in turnover margin which is 35th in the nation. In 2023 Wofford had a +0.09 turnover margin which was 57th in the nation.

WATKINS WITH THE BIG PLAY

After missing the final six games of the 2023 season due to injury, senior wide receiver Kyle Watkins is back in a big way in 2024. In his previous three seasons, he had 27 catches for 239 yards. So far in 2024 he has 33 catches for 463 yards and a touchdown. Eight of his receptions have been for 20 or more yards.

ODOM AT QB

Amari Odom, in his second season at Wofford, started the season finale against Furman in 2023 after missing most of the season due to a medical issue. He entered the 2024 season as a second-year freshman and earned the starting quarterback job during fall camp. He won three of his first four games as a starter, which was last achieved by Joe Newman in the 2018 season (wins over The Citadel, VMI and Gardner-Webb, loss at Wyoming).

RYAN CAN RUN

Senior running back Ryan Ingram became the 72nd player in school history to reach 1,000 career rushing yards after a 159 yard performance against Western Carolina in 2023. He currently is at 1,685 yards on 351 carries. Only 16 Terriers have been able to reach the 2,000 rushing yard milestone.

THE "OLD" GUYS

Staying for a fifth year at Wofford - a traditional residential liberal arts institution - is not something that is as common as at other schools. Since Wofford does not have a graduate program (VMI is the only other SoCon school not to have one), planning must go into spreading courses out so there is at least one class left for the fall semester. This year, there are nine fifth-year players on the team - LB John Boyles, QB Bryce Corriston, OL Anthony Garcia, RB Ryan Ingram, OL Briggs Kearse, DL Anthonie Lattany, RB David Legette, LB David Powers and DB Isaiah Wadsworth.

A LIMITED TRANSFER WINDOW

Due to the academic requirements at Wofford, transfers are not a common occurrence. Since a limited number of credits can transfer, only freshmen and sophomores can usually join the team. There are fifteen transfers on the roster in 2024: TE Carlos Anaya, DB CJ Coombes, QB Samuel Cornett, TE Jordan Davis, OL Mason Howard, OL Anthony Garcia, DL Trenton Kintigh, DL Anthonie Lattany, LB Jalen Marshall, LB David Powers, DB Maximus Pulley, LB Benny Radicia, DB Jahaad Scales, WR DJ Tyler and OL Andrew Vaught.

NEW NUMBERS

Several players switched numbers for the 2024 season, including LB Tyson Wilkerson (8), DB J'Vion Luster (24), DB Darius Malcolm (27), TE Franklin Smith (35), DL Seth Foster (52), OL Julio del Jesus (72), WR Jack Purdy (80), WR Grayson Gregg (86) and DL Marcus Dees (99).

FIRST CAREER STARTS

After 32 players had first career starts in the fall of 2021, Wofford had 18 players earn first career starts in 2022. At the season opener against Pittsburgh in 2023, four players made their first career starts and by the end of the season eleven players recorded first career starts.

2024 FIRST CAREER STARTS

In the 2024 season opener at Gardner-Webb, six players made first career starts: OL Luke Moise, TE Carlos Anaya, DL O'marion Brown, LB Benny Radicia WR Cam Smith, and S C.J. Coombes. At Richmond, OL Mason Howard, WR Isaiah Scott and WR Jack Purdy made first career starts. Marcus Dees started his first career game against VMI and Marion Smokes started against ETSU, giving the team eleven players to make first career starts in 2024.

VETERAN CAREER GAMES PLAYED/STARTS

The most veteran player on the team this year is defensive lineman Anthonie Lattany with 41

THE TERRIER

Wofford's nickname dates back to the early 1900's when Professor E.H. Shuler recalled seeing a terrier named Jack at Wofford baseball games. Jack made an appearance in the 1909 baseball team photo. A cartoon showing a Jack-like dog doing gymnastics appeared in a Wofford Journal in 1910. By 1914 when football resumed after an 11-year absence at Wofford, the nickname Terrier was firmly established for the college's athletic teams. Wofford has had a number of real life mascots including Spike in the mid-50s and Jocko in the early 1960s. Most Wofford Terriers have been Boston Terriers which have a smooth black coat with white markings on the face, neck, chest, legs and feet. They usually pack a muscular 20 pounds on a foot-high frame. A sculpture of a Terrier was unveiled on March 25, 2008 outside of the Student Life Building as a gift to Wofford College from the Class of 1956. Among NCAA Division I schools, Wofford is joined by Boston University with a terrier as a mascot.

STABILITY AT QUARTERBACK?

In the 2018 and 2019 seasons in which Wofford won back-to-back SoCon Championships, Joe Newman started 25 consecutive games. After Jimmy Weirick started all five games in the 2020-21 spring season, in the fall of 2021 the Terriers used four different starting quarterbacks - Peyton Derrick (7), Jimmy Weirick (1), Bryce Corriston (2), Kyle Pinnix (1). It was the first time Wofford had four quarterbacks start in the same season since moving to NCAA Division I in 1995. The stability at the position returned in 2022, with Weirick starting all eleven games in 2022. In 2023, the instability was back as Bryce Corriston won the quarterback position in fall camp and started the first three games and returned for the Western Carolina and The Citadel games. Freshman Pauly Seeley started the five games Corriston missed time due to injury, while Amari Odom started the season finale against Furman to give the Terriers three starting quarterbacks on the season. Odom has started the first four games of 2024 before missing the Western Carolina game due to injury and Pauly Seeley started the next three games. Bryce Corriston then started against ETSU.

2024 CAREER FIRSTS

Players with career firsts so far in 2024 include first receptions at Gardner-Webb by Ivory Aikens and Isaiah Scott, while Sam Spence had his first punt ... At Richmond, Jack Purdy had his first reception and on defense Benny Radicia had his first interception and Caleb Oliver had his first sack ... Against William & Mary, Jack Purdy had his first career touchdown reception and Carlos Anaya had his first reception ... Jalen Marshall and Jarvis Mynatt had first career interceptions against Mercer, while Devery Cagle had his first career field goal against the Bears ... At Western Carolina, Isaiah Scott had his first receiving touchdown and C.J. Coombes had his first career interception ... Against VMI, Marion Smokes had his first career sack and O'marion Brown had his first career fumble recovery.

2024 DRIVING NOTES...

Wofford has an average drive start of the 29.9 yard line, while opponents are starting from the 35.9 yard line ... On the opening drives of a game, Wofford has five punts, two field goals, and a safety. To begin the second half, Wofford has five punts, a field goal and two lost fumbles ... Of the 23 scoring drives, ten went for more than 70 yards, three lasted for more than five minutes and three lasted 10 or more plays.

2024 DEEP THOUGHTS...

By quarter, Wofford is leading in the first quarter (+5) ... The team is being outscored in the second (+8), third (+44) and fourth (+9) quarters ... Opponents average 4.9 yards per play on 550 plays, while the Terriers average 4.7 yards per play on 497 plays ... Ryan Ingram has had 21 of his 85 carries go for a first down or touchdown ... Kyle Watkins has 33 receptions, with 21 for either a first down or touchdown ... Watkins leads the team with 11 big plays of 20+ yards.

DEFENSE BY COMMITTEE

The Terrier defense is a true team effort with contributions from numerous players in the 2024 season. Overall, nine players have 20 or more tackles. Seventeen players had at least a share of a tackle for loss, while nine recorded sacks. So far this season, five different players have led the team in tackles in the eight games.

STOPPING THE PASS

The Wofford defense is anchored by one of the best secondaries in the FCS. So far this season, the teams is fifth in the nation in passing efficiency defense at 106.2. They have allowed only three passing touchdowns.

THIRD DOWN WOES

On third down, Wofford has only converted 31 of 114 attempts this season for a 27.2% success rate, which is the tenth-lowest percent in the nation. The Terriers are 0-4 on 3rd-and-one, but 9-of-15 on third-and-three. Over half (72) of the attempts have been 3rd-and-long (6+ yards).

FOURTH DOWN? GO FOR IT!

On fourth and short in plus territory, the Terriers could punt, go for it, or maybe even run a fake. Wofford is 8-of-20 on fourth downs this season, with the 20 attempts ranked 16th in the nation. The 40.0% success rate is 93rd in the nation. Defensively, opponents are only at 44% (4-of-9) on the season to be ranked 39th in the nation.

RUSHING LEGACY

Wofford had finished among the top ten schools in the nation in rushing in 22 straight years until the fall of 2022 when they were 13th overall. The Terriers' wingbone offense put a premium on ball control and keeping the opponent's offense on the boundary. Eight times the Terriers have been second in the nation in rushing yards per game, while in 2010 and 2011 they finished first.

200+ PASSING YARDS

There have only been 35 games in Wofford history with 200 or more passing yards, and only four game with 300 or more passing yards (2022 at Kennesaw, vs. ETSU, at Furman, 1969 vs. Catawba, 309). Since the year 2000, here are the 13 games with 200 or more passing yards:

GOING OVERTIME

The Terriers lost the first two overtime games played, then won the next two. In 2012, a 24-17 double overtime loss at Samford was followed by a win over Chattanooga. There was a win over Mercer in 2015 and losses to The Citadel and Youngstown State (double overtime) in 2016. The Terriers had overtime wins against Western Carolina and Chattanooga in 2017, along with against Chattanooga in 2019. Wofford was defeated 45-44 in overtime in 2021 at The Citadel and is now 7-6 all-time in overtime games.

WOFFORD VS. NON-CONFERENCE FCS OPPONENTS

Since 2000, Wofford is 29-10 in non-conference regular season FCS games ... Wofford's loss to Coastal Carolina in 2006 snapped a streak of 10 straight regular season non-conference wins against FCS opponents ... The Terriers had not lost a non-conference regular season game to a FCS opponent since dropping the 2000 season opener to Lehigh 34-14 ... The loss to Gardner-Webb in 2013 ended a nine-game streak ... Wofford lost again to Gardner-Webb in 2014, along with a loss to SC State in 2019, losses to Kennesaw State in 2021 and 2022, plus a loss to Elon in 2022 ... Wofford added a loss at William & Mary and to Presbyterian in 2023 ... Wofford won in 2024 against Gardner-Webb and Richmond, but lost to William & Mary.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Wofford's football program has ranked among the top 10 percent of FCS teams in the Academic Performance Review (APR) consistently to earn public recognition. In 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019, Wofford had the highest APR in the SoCon. The APR public recognition program was halted in 2020 due to COVID. The Terriers lead the SoCon with 176 Academic All-Southern Conference selections since the program started in 2003.

Wofford has had at least one player named CoSIDA/CSC All-District in 21 of the last 22 seasons. In addition, safety James Zotto was named an Academic All-American in 2014.

TERRIERS AGAINST FBS TEAMS

The 2024 season marks the 23rd time in the last 24 fall seasons the Terriers play against a member of the FBS (NCAA Division I-A). Overall, Wofford is 1-25 in those games. In 2011, Wofford had a lead at Clemson in the third quarter. At South Carolina in 2012, the game was tied at 7-7 at the start of the fourth quarter. Wofford was down five points to Georgia Tech in 2014 with ten minutes to go in the game. In 2017, Wofford trailed South Carolina 14-10 in the third quarter. Wyoming scored with 17 seconds left in the game in 2018. Wofford was scheduled to play South Carolina in 2020 but the game was canceled. Virginia Tech was on the slate in 2022 (and in 2025) before the game at Pitt in 2023. South Carolina returns to the schedule in 2024 and 2028, while Clemson is scheduled again in 2027.

TERRIERS AT HOME

Wofford has won 84 of its last 120 games played in Gibbs Stadium, including going 5-0 in 2014 and 2018 ... Since Gibbs Stadium opened on Oct. 5, 1996, Wofford has posted a record of 105-49 (.681) ... The Terriers have won 64 of 103 home SoCon games at Gibbs Stadium.

MR. RICHARDSON

Jerry Richardson came to Wofford in the mid-1950s as an unheralded pass receiver from Fayetteville, N.C. By the time he left to begin his pro career with the Baltimore Colts, the passing combination of Charlie Bradshaw to Jerry Richardson had received nationwide fame. Richardson was an Associated Press Little All-America selection in 1957 and '58. He still holds Wofford's single-game record with 241 receiving yards vs. Newberry in 1956 and is the record holder for touchdown receptions in a season (9 in 1958) and in a career (21). As a senior at Wofford, he scored 72 points on nine touchdowns, 12 extra points and two field goals. Drafted by the defending world champion Colts, Richardson played two seasons in the NFL, earning Colt Rookie of the Year honors in 1959 and finishing third in the balloting for top NFL rookie. He was the founder of the Carolina Panthers. In 2015, Wofford announced the construction of two new facilities on campus donated by Richardson. The Rosalind S. Richardson Center for the Arts opened in the spring of 2017 and is the home to academic programs in theatre arts, visual arts and art history. The Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium is a 123,000-square-foot facility opened in September of 2017 and includes a 3,400-seat basketball arena and a 400-seat volleyball competition venue. Jerome Johnson Richardson Hall, a residence hall for approximately 150 students with athletic facilities for baseball, softball and golf, opened in the fall of 2020. On February 24, 2021, Wofford announced a \$150 million gift to the endowment from Richardson, putting his contributions to his alma mater at over \$262 million since his graduation. He passed away on March 1, 2023.

SOCON SUCCESS

Wofford has finished among the top four teams in the Southern Conference race in 15 of the last 20 years, winning seven SoCon Championships. In the last 20 years, the Terriers have won 89 of 156 SoCon games played. Over that time, Wofford is the tied for the second-winningest program in the Southern Conference with a .570 win percentage.

Affiliated with the United Methodist Church, the college is committed to provide superior liberal arts education that prepares its students for extraordinary and positive contributions to society. Shawn Watson was named head coach on December 1, 2022. A veteran with nearly 40 years of coaching experience, Watson came to Wofford in January 2022 as assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. On October 6, he was named interim head coach of the Terriers.

Prior to Wofford, he spent the 2021 season as the assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at the University of Northern Iowa. Along with his work with the Panthers, he has served as offensive coordinator at Texas (2014-15), Louisville (2012-13), Nebraska (2007-10), Colorado (2000-05) and Pittsburgh (2017-18). Additionally, he was the head coach at his alma mater, Southern Illinois, from 1994-96.

In his first full season as head coach in 2023, the Terriers were 2-9 overall and 2-6 in the Southern Conference. Wofford won the last two games of the season as they earned an 11-3 win at The Citadel and then downed Southern Conference Champion Furman 19-13 at Gibbs Stadium as the Paladins were ranked #2 in the nation. Following the season, DL Brandon Maina and LB David Powers earned All-Southern Conference honors.

During his first season at Wofford in 2022, he helped lead the transition from the option to the pro spread as offensive coordinator. He was named interim head coach on October 6 and led the team to a 3-3 record. His first win with the Terriers was on October 16 against The Citadel. He followed that with wins over East Tennessee State and VMI. Quarterback Jimmy Weirick set school single season records for completions (187), attempts (323) and passing yards (2,479). Weirick holds four of the top marks for passing yards in a game, including the record of 428 at Furman. Wide receiver Landon Parker set the school record for receiving yards in a season with 804.

Watson played safety at Southern Illinois (1979-80) and began his coaching career as a Salukis graduate assistant in 1982, making stops at Illinois and Miami (Ohio) before

landing the head job at his alma mater in 1994. In his three seasons as head coach, the team was 11-22 overall and produced 20 all-conference players.

He earned a bachelor's degree in health education from SIU in 1982. Watson and his wife, Anita, have three children: Amber (Marcus Capone), Aaron (Victoria) and Adam (April) and three grandchildren, Caden, Maggie and Wyatt.

BOILING SPRINGS, N.C. — In the season opener on Thursday night, the Wofford scored ten unanswered points in the fourth quarter to rally for a 21-20 win over Gardner-Webb at Spangler Stadium.

The Terriers were led by Amari Odom who was 22-of-35 for 260 yards and a touchdown, while Kyle Watkins had seven catches for 109 yards.

The Runnin' Bulldogs had the ball to open the game and they had a 44-yard field goal to take a 3-0 lead with 12:17 on the clock in the first quarter. Wofford went three-and-out on its first possession and punted. The Terrier defense forced a three-and-out, and Wofford took over at the 18-yard line.

With the ball back, the Runnin' Bulldogs had five first downs before scoring on a 22-yard pass completion for a 10-8 lead at 12:44 in the second quarter. Wofford had a 35-yard run by Ivory Aikens to move across midfield and a fourth-and-five was converted with a pass to Cam Smith.

To open the second half, the Runnin' Bulldogs recovered a Wofford fumble at the 32-yard line. On their first play of the drive, a 32-yard run by Edward Saydee gave Gardner-Webb a 20-11 lead at the 13:36 mark.

Gardner-Webb had a 31-yard field goal attempt blocked by Brandon Maina and recovered by Maximus Pulley with a 28-yard return across midfield. After a first down run by Ryan Ingram, Wofford took a 21-20 lead with a 45-yard field goal by Bridger Jones with 5:50 remaining.

After the punt, Amari Odom found Jordan Davis for a first down. With fourth-and-inches and 1:41 remaining, a quarterback sneak by Amari Odom got the first down after a replay. Wofford ran out the clock for the win.

After trading possessions, Wofford had the ball back with 28 seconds to work with but had three passes into the endzone fall incomplete to end the game at Gibbs Stadium.

Wofford opens the season at 2-1, while the #13 ranked William & Mary improves to 2-1. The Terriers were led by Amari Odom who was 15-of-32 passing for 230 yards. Wofford took a 17-14 lead on the first drive of the third quarter, but the Catamounts scored a touchdown late in the third quarter for a 21-17 advantage.

Wofford is now 2-3 overall and 0-2 in the Southern Conference. Western Carolina is 2-3 overall and opens SoCon play at 1-0. CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. — On Saturday afternoon, Wofford College football team was defeated 37-5 by Chattanooga at Finley Stadium. The Mocs had a 10-5 lead at the half and then scored 27 unanswered points in the second half as the Terriers turned the ball over four times.

Wofford is now 3-4 overall and 1-3 in the Southern Conference. Chattanooga, ranked #19 in the nation, is 4-3 on the season and 3-1 in league play. The Terriers were led by Kyle Parsons with 52 rushing yards, while quarterback Pauly Seeley was 16-of-29 for 129 yards. Chattanooga quarterback Chase Artopoulos was 13-of-19 passing for 145 yards and he rushed for a pair of touchdowns.

The Mocs had the ball first and on the second play from scrimmage Anthonie Lattany forced a fumble and recovered it at the 22-yard line. Wofford was able to get on the board with a 37-yard field goal by Devery Cagle at the 12:17 mark of the first half. With the ball back, the Mocs had four rushing first downs before tying the game at 3-3 with a 31-yard field goal with 6:25 on the clock. Wofford went three-and-out on their next possession. Chattanooga had five first downs to move inside the 10-yard line. They capped the drive with a two-yard touchdown reception to take a 10-3 lead with 12:43 on the clock in the second quarter.

Wofford had one first down before Sam Spence had a punt that was downed at the one-yard line. On first down, Marion Smokes and Javario Tinch stopped the runner from getting out of the endzone for a safety. The Chattanooga lead was 10-5 with 8:39 left in the first half. Wofford went three-and-out on their next drive. After Chattanooga had one first down, they punted. The Terriers and Mocs then traded three-and-outs, with Wofford taking over with 1:47 remaining in the half. Running the two-minute offense, the Terriers had two first downs before punting. The Mocs ran one play before the half ended.

To begin the second half, Wofford went three-and-out and punted. The Mocs had a first down and then had a 45-yard completion to move into the redzone. After a rushing first down, a one-yard touchdown run by Chase Artopoulos pushed the Chattanooga advantage to 17-5 with 10:32 on the clock. On the first play of the next drive by the Terriers, Pauly Seeley was intercepted by Kobe Joseph and the Mocs took over at the 16-yard line. Artopoulos ran the ball in for a 13-yard touchdown to give the Mocs a 24-5 lead with 9:42 remaining in the third quarter.

After Wofford had two first downs, they faced fourth-and-long. Lined up to punt, the Terriers ran a fake with Jon Schaffer completing a 19-yard pass to Kyle Parsons for the first down. On the next play, Wofford threw a pass to the endzone that was intercepted by the Mocs and returned to the 35-yard line. A quick 30-yard completion moved the ball across midfield but the drive stalled. The Mocs added a 48-yard field goal for a 27-5 lead with 2:27 left in the third quarter.

With the ball back, the Terriers had two first downs before facing fourth-and-two. Bryce Corriston ran for the first down, but another interception by the Mocs gave them the ball at the 41-yard line. After two first downs, Chattanooga added a 44-yard field goal for a 30-5 lead with 7:11 left in the game. Wofford had a first down and again faced a fourth down. The Mocs intercepted their fourth pass of the day, with Reuben Lowery returning it 61 yards for a touchdown and a 37-5 lead with 5:22 remaining. On the following drive, Wofford had a first down and faced fourth-and-three. A pass was incomplete and the Mocs took over with 1:57 left in the game. They ran three plays to end the game.

SPARTANBURG, S.C. — The Wofford College football team was defeated 24-7 by East Tennessee State University on Saturday afternoon at Gibbs Stadium. The Bucs had a 10-0 lead before the Terriers got on the board in the third quarter to cut the score to 10-7. The Bucs scored the next two touchdowns to secure the win.

Wofford is now 3-5 overall and 1-4 in the Southern Conference. East Tennessee State, ranked #23 in the nation, is 5-3 overall and 3-1 in league play. The Terriers were led by Bryce Corriston with 8-of-19 passing and a touchdown, while Ryan Ingram had 36 rushing yards. ETSU quarterback Jaylen King was 18-of-32 passing for 198 yards. He also ran for a pair of touchdowns.

The Bucs had the ball first and had one first down before having an incomplete pass on a fake punt attempt. Wofford went three-and-out and punted, with the ball downed at the two-yard line. The Bucs then had three first downs, which included a fourth down conversion, before attempting a 47-yard field goal that was wide right. The Terriers had one first down before punting back to the Bucs with 2:40 left in the first quarter. ETSU had a first down, which was followed by a nine-yard tackle for loss by Isaiah Mananga. On third-and-long, Eli Campbell intercepted a deep pass and Wofford took over at the 30-yard line. After a three-and-out by the Terriers, the Bucs also went three-and-out.

After another three-and-out by Wofford, the Bucs took over near midfield. Eli Campbell came up with his second interception of the day and returned it to the 28-yard line. The Terriers attempted a 38-yard field goal that was wide left and the Bucs regained possession. Two passing first downs moved the ball across midfield and then they converted a fourth-and-three with a run to move inside the redzone. The Bucs kicked a 28-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead with 1:59 left in the first half. Wofford went three-and-out and punted. After three quick first downs, ETSU had a 39-yard field goal attempt that was blocked by Isaiah Wadsworth to end the half.

To begin the second half, Wofford had one first down before a miscue on the punt resulted in the Bucs picking up a fumble and returning it 15 yards for a touchdown. ETSU had a 10-0 lead at 10:43 in the third quarter. With the ball back, Wofford had a pair of first downs and then Bryce Corriston found Jordan Davis open for a 29-yard touchdown reception. The Bucs had a 10-7 lead with 7:09 on the clock in the third quarter. On the next drive by ETSU, they had a first down and then converted a fourth-and-one. A 22-yard touchdown run by Jaylen King pushed the lead to 17-7 at the 3:38 mark of the quarter. Wofford went three-and-out and punted.

The Bucs had a pair of first downs before Jaylen King ran 32 yards for a touchdown and a 24-7 lead at the 13:08 mark of the fourth quarter. The Terriers had one first down before punting. The Bucs had two first downs before having an incomplete pass on fourth-and-nine with 5:13 left in the game. Wofford had a 32-yard first down reception by Kyle Watkins and Kyle Parsons ran for a first down. A catch by Jack Purdy resulted in another first down, but then on fourth-and-long a pass was incomplete and Wofford turned it over on downs.
