CREDENTIALS

Requests for working media credentials should be made to Wyatt Streett, Athletic Communications, Wofford College, 429 N. Church Street, Spartanburg, SC 29303. Requests should be made one week in advance. Requests are screened with care to insure a working press box. Children, spouses, pets and cheering are not allowed in the press box.

INTERVIEW

All interviews with members of the team during the season must be arranged through the Athletic Communications Office. Please call ahead and allow 24 hours to set up interviews with players. Arrangements will be made for telephone and in-person interviews at a time that is mutually agreeable to the reporter/broadcaster and the student-athlete. The best time to call Coach Edwards is in the morning. Any television crews wishing to tape an interview with Coach Edwards may do so daily before practice. Please call ahead to allow an office representative to help facilitate the interview.

PARKING

Parking for all members of the working media for Terrier home baseball games can be found in either the Student Life Lot (A) or the Verandah Lot.

INTERVIEWS

Student-athletes are available on the field immediately following the game. Coach Edwards will meet with the media following each game on the field. During a double-header, no student-athletes may be interviewed between games, with the exception of the starting pitcher of the first game. The Wofford locker room and training room in Richardson Hall are NOT open to the media.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Photo passes for newspaper photographers and photographers on assignment are available from the athletic media relations office. Credentials will not be issued for free-lance photographers. Photographers will not be allowed on the field during the game.

PRESSBOX SERVICES

Members of the media will be provided with flip cards, current statistics and pregame notes prior to the start of the game. Statistical summaries will include final box score. There is wireless access at King Field, along with ethernet ports. After the radio broadcast teams have completed their broadcasts, there are phone lines available as well. A photocopier and a fax machine are also available inside the Richardson Building.

DIRECTIONS TO KING FIELD

From the West/GSP Airport: Take I-85 north to exit 69 (Business 85 North). Exit at 5A, I-585 South/US 176. After 3 miles, turn right on Cleveland Street. Follow under railroad tracks and the baseball field can be reached by either going straight or turning left onto Memorial Drive.

From the North: Take I-26 east to exit 15 (US 176). Follow for 7 miles as road turns into I-585 South and then Pine Street. Turn right on Cleveland Street. Follow under railroad tracks and the baseball field can be reached by either going straight or turning left onto Memorial Drive.

From the East/Charlotte Airport: Take I-85 south to exit 77 (Business 85 South). Exit at 5A, I-585 South/US 176. After 3 miles, turn right on Cleveland Street. Follow under railroad tracks and the baseball field can be reached by either going straight or turning left onto Memorial Drive.

From the South: Take I-26 west to exit 21B (US 29 North). After 3.5 miles, turn left on St. John Street. Turn left at North Church Street. Turn right on Memorial Drive and follow until the baseball field is on your left.





The Village, beautiful, Charlestonian-style apartments designed to help transition students from college student to successful graduate.

Thanks to the generosity of alumnus and trustee Jerry Richardson '59, the Rosalind Sallenger Richardson Center for the Arts opened in May of 2017 and the Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium to house new basketball and volleyball arenas opened in September of 2017. The new Greek Village was completed in the spring of 2016.


Additionally, the Chandler Center for Environmental Studies and Jerome Johnson Richardson Hall, a 150-bed residence hall, opened in the fall of 2020. Renovations to the library into an academic commons were completed in the fall of 2019. Burwell Dining Hall and Mungo Campus Life Center renovations were finalized in 2021 and a new softball stadium, along with improvements to Snyder Field were finished in the summer of 2022.

Wofford's entire 175-acre campus is a national arboretum, named the Roger Milliken Arboretum at Wofford College in honor of the late longtime trustee and benefactor.









Wofford offers distinctive learning opportunities that set it apart from other liberal arts colleges. A few of those high-impact educational experiences include:

The Interim, a January term that encourages students and faculty to explore new interests both on and off campus. A sampling of on-campus programs include: Knitting, Science and Art of Craft brewing, Breakout Games, and Yoga. Travel/study projects take students to Australia, China, Ireland, Germany, Japan and other sites around the world. Students also complete internships both locally and around the globe.

The Bonner Scholar program, a service-learning scholarship program that places deserving students in volunteer positions throughout the community.

The Mungo Exchange is a place where students can build upon their liberal arts education by adding professional skills desired by employers and graduate schools. The Mungo Exchange includes the Career Center, whose events, programs and individual meetings are focused on our mission to prepare students for life after Wofford. The Office Entrepreneurship + Innovation serves as the hub and resource center for innovation on Wofford's campus, offering educational opportunities, resources, a community of support and professional connections to innovators and industry experts. International Programs, The Center for Community Based Learning and Undergraduate Research are also in the Mungo Exchange.

Environmental Studies provides a creative and supportive learning environment that helps students pursue their goals in the field of sustainability. It operates both on Wofford's campus and at the college's Goodall Environmental Studies Center at Glendale, S.C. The property where the center is located borders 19 acres of protected green space along Lawson's Fork Creek.

Neuroscience, a program that allows students to examine the nervous system and its regulation of behavior through an experimental approach, is offered

jointly by the Departments of Psychology and Biology.

Computational Science, a fast-growing interdisciplinary field that is at the intersection of the sciences, computer science and mathematics, involves learning to store, retrieve, process and visualize massive amounts of information in web-accessed databases.

The Creative Writing Concentration, a program led by outstanding published faculty authors that provides additional opportunities for students to hone their creative writing skills, earn coveted prizes and become published writers.

The Presidential International Scholar program offers an opportunity for an outstanding, intellectually gifted student to visit developing countries

researching a specific academic area of interest. The student then returns to campus to share his or her experiences.

Presidential Seminar, a weekly seminar for outstanding seniors hosted by Wofford President Nayef H. Samhat. Seminar participants explore interdisciplinary subjects of current significance. The college now has a similar program for juniors.

Liberty Fellowship is a two-year leadership experience for young citizens of South Carolina with exemplary promise for societal achievement. The Liberty Fellowship is offered in partnership with South Carolina businessman Hayne Hipp and the Aspen Institute.

A commitment in excess of \$1 million from a trustee and former Terrier baseball player made it possible for Wofford College to play its home games on campus again.

In May 2003, the Wofford Board of Trustees approved the \$1.8 million project, which bears the name of Russell C. King Field. The new field is located at the site of the former facility, Law Field, on campus. A past chairman, King served on the Wofford Board of Trustees for 25 years.

Russell C. King '56 made it possible for NCAA baseball to return to campus after an eight-year absence. Since beginning Division I play in 1996, Wofford had played its games off-campus at Duncan Park.

"Wofford has been envied and praised for the number of gathering spaces on our campus where students and faculty can interact," Wofford president Dr. Benjamin Dunlap said. "There could be no better springtime addition to that list than a handsome, centrally-located baseball facility — and that is what Russell C. King and other generous donors have made possible.

"As a sometime Yankee fan, it pains me that no one remembers King Kong Keller. But, as an ardent Terrier supporter, it gives me real satisfaction to know future generations will recognize the name of one of the best power hitters in Wofford's history. Russell King used to launch homers over the railroad tracks and, according to a legendary



account for which there are several purported eyewitnesses, one of his shots fell into a coal car and traveled all the way to Arizona — surely the longest home run on record!

"Russell C. King Field is as significant an addition to our campus as Russell himself was to Wofford baseball in the 1950s."

King, who passed away August 14, 2011, was part of a three generation family at Wofford that also includes an athletic

background. His father, Russell Calvin King '29, played baseball and football for the Terriers as did one of his four uncles who attended Wofford. King's son, Russell C. King, Ill '81, is also a Wofford graduate.

King was a stalwart on Wofford's baseball teams from 1953-56, he was a .338 career hitter who led the '56 team to a 14-4 record while leading the squad in home runs and RBIs.

"I've been a long-time advocate of bringing baseball back to campus," King said.
"Back in my day, and in the future, a lot of students would come and watch at least part of the game. It was a good atmosphere and a place for students to gather.

"This will be a first-class facility and will have a significant impact on the beauty and activity for that corner of the Wofford campus. This is something I was prepared to do and wanted to do. It will help us attract some quality opponents and we'll be able to have some night games. As a former player, I'm excited about having a new field for our program."

Other components of the new facility include a major gift from Toccoa Switzer and her family for the construction of the seating area, which has 1,000 permanent seats located behind home plate. Grass banks behind each dugout bring total capacity to 2,500. A series of rocking chairs, overlooking the field, highlights the plaza area.

The Switzer family also has a long relationship with Wofford, spanning four generations. Toccoa Switzer is a former member of the Wofford Board of Trustees. Her late husband, James L. Switzer, Sr. '40, and his father, Dr. Paul K. Switzer '07 are Wofford graduates, as are her two sons, James L. Switzer, Jr. '80 and Dr. Paul K. Switzer, Ill '77. Toccoa's granddaughter, Lizzie Switzer '07, is also a graduate of Wofford.

"The Switzers made the first gift on the project," Dunlap said. "Without their generous support, Wofford baseball might have wandered in the alien corn a lot longer than it did. Long before 'Field of Dreams' made the thought a by-word, the Switzers were convinced that, if we built it, the springtime crowds would return to Wofford to enjoy an afternoon at the ballpark. Each season it is proven how right they were."

Over the past several seasons, various improvements have been made to the facility, including cutting out the base paths and adding railings in front of the dugouts. The most visible change was the addition in 2012 of an astroturf halo around the home plate area, which was expanded in 2018. The halo was made possible by family and friends in memory of Jason Derrick. Derrick was a pitcher for the Terriers from 1992-96 from Charleston, S.C. and passed away in 2008. In addition, the batting cages behind right field were renovated in 2016.

In the fall of 2020, first-year students moved into the new, 150-bed Jerome Johnson Richardson Hall, located just across Campus Drive from other first-year residences, Greene Hall and Marsh Hall. The residence hall houses a variety of student activities facilities on its main floor, and will provide beautiful living, fellowship and study areas for students. One wing of student rooms faces Russell C. King Field and Switzer Stadium. Another looks out over Snyder field. Both wings have rooms with views of the courtyard. The building stands on the site where Andrews Field House stood until 2019. Because of its proximity to athletics facilities, the first floor of the building houses baseball locker rooms and offices as well as locker rooms and a shared training facility for men's and women's golf. Richardson Hall is the first student housing built on Wofford's campus since 2011.

LOCKER ROOM

After using locker room facilities in Andrews Fieldhouse since 2009, the Terriers moved into the new facility in the fall of 2020. In addition to the locker room, office space for the coaches will also be in the building, along with a coaches locker room, officials locker room and laundry facilities. A spacious mud room with cleat and helmet racks, and storage room is also include for the team.

THE JOE E. TAYLOR CENTER

Wofford alumnus and former South Carolina Secretary of Commerce Joe Taylor donated \$1 million for the renovation of the Curry Building into the Joe E. Taylor Athletic Center. The Taylor Center features a 7,000 square foot weight room and offices for athletic department staff. The building, located next to Gibbs Stadium, was completed in June of 2009.

The weight room facility is equipped with a total of 24 racks with built-in pull-up bars and nearly 25,000 pounds of plates, dumbells and olympic weights. The 24 racks are divided, with twelve used with platforms and twelve used with benches. Additional equipment includes four pulldown machines, four low row machines, six glute/ham machines, two decline ab machines, and a leg press. Also included is a large area of Mondo track flooring, which is used with the step-up boxes, plyo boxes and hurdle sets in speed development.

The Taylor Center also provides offices for administration and several sports, including men's and women's tennis and cross country and track and field. A conference room and several work areas give the coaching staff much needed space. The first floor of the building contains the rifle range, which includes ten lanes with electronic scoring.


THE PHILOSOPHY

THE RICHARDSON BUILDING

The home of the Wofford College Athletic Department since 1996 is the Richardson Physical Activities Building. The facility includes offices for the administration, football, baseball and other sports on the second floor. Also included on the second floor is an aerobic dance room, team meeting room, racquetball courts and a student-athlete lounge. Locker rooms for football, men's and women's cross country/track and field, men's and women's soccer and a training room are located on the first floor.

Wofford alumnus Jerry Richardson made donations in 2008 and 2018 that were used for enhancing the Richardson Building. Numerous improvements were made in the facility to ensure that it is one of the most advanced athletic facilities in the nation.

The most recent renovations to the building include a 1,200 square foot addition to house a new state of the art hydrotherapy suite which includes a Hydroworx aquatic therapy pool with underwater treadmill. The existing training room was relocated to adjoin the new hydrotherapy suite, which results in a much-needed increased size for the new training room. Supporting the training area are three staff offices, exam room, and state-of-the-art x-ray room. The new team meeting room is equipped with the latest video technology and a media backdrop for post-game press conferences.

The existing football locker room was expanded and upgraded. The upgrades included new paint, carpet, ceilings, and lighting. The equipment room has been reconfigured, and a new high-density storage system was purchased to increase capacity and improve efficiency in the handling of equipment. In addition to the visible improvements a new supplemental mechanical unit to control moisture and improve indoor air quality was installed, along with new HVAC controls in the entire building.

With the campus fitness center relocated to the Benjamin Johnson Arena, renovations were also made to the second floor. A second team meeting room was created with sliding glass walls to provide flexibility for a variety of uses. A student-athlete lounge was built near the racquetball courts which includes two 70-inch monitors.

The building also includes the Harley Room, a large multipurpose area overlooking Gibbs Stadium. The area hosts a wide variety of campus events during the year and a new video wall was installed in 2022. On the patio, a sculpture of Jerry Richardson was dedicated on May 12, 2014 to honor him and recognize the 20th anniversary of the Carolina Panthers summer training camp being held on campus. The sculpture, created by noted California artist Todd Andrews, depicts Richardson seeming to be ready to walk over to Gibbs Stadium to watch the Terriers — for which he also played — take on the next worthy opponent.

BENJAMIN JOHNSON ARENA

When the campus community bid farewell to the Benjamin Johnson Arena as the home of Wofford basketball and volleyball in 2017, it created new possibilities for student recreation and wellness. The renovated Benjamin Johnson Arena student fitness center opened in January of 2018.

"The Benjamin Johnson Arena, which opened in 1981, holds a lot of history for Wofford College, and we're glad we are able to continue to use the facility as a larger, better fitness center for our students, faculty and staff," President Nayef Samhat says. "The addition of the new Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium provides us with this terrific opportunity to give our community a place in the Benjamin Johnson Arena to exercise both their bodies and their minds."

The lower level of the arena (once basketball and volleyball courts and bleachers) houses a new multi-sport playing surface with three courts. A walking track surrounds the perimeter of the courts. The locker rooms were completely renovated. The concourse areas have become the new student fitness center with the installation of a variety of equipment and machines.

The east concourse has weight equipment, including free weights, benches and machines. The other concourse has cardio equipment, including treadmills, stationary bikes and elliptical machines. The concourses also have open locker storage and new audio-visual equipment.


In addition to the fitness activities, Benjamin Johnson Arena is home of a comprehensive intramural, recreation, and club sports programs that encompass team sports, individual sports, fitness classes, club sports, as well as various other programs. Highlights include intramural basketball and softball, equestrian club, men's club lacrosse, club ultimate frisbee and an outdoors club.

The arena is named after Benjamin O. Johnson '30 who was a Spartanburg textile executive associated with Spartan Mills. Mr. Johnson was also a trustee of Wofford College as well as a benefactor. Wofford moved into the Benjamin Johnson Arena in 1981 after playing in adjacent Andrews Field House for 50 years. The \$4.5 million arena is part of the Campus Life Building, which was designed to serve as the center of athletic, social and cultural activity on campus.

The first men's basketball contest was held on January 22, 1981, as The Citadel scored a 65-64 win over Wofford. The Terriers first win in the arena was on January 26, 1981. The men had an overall record of 334-131 in 37 seasons in the facility.

The Wofford women's basketball team fielded its first varsity team in the 1980-81 season, moving into Benjamin Johnson Arena in 1981 after playing in Andrews Fieldhouse for the first half of the season. The first women's basketball game was held on January 22, 1981, with Wofford defeating Sacred Heart 74-25.

WOFFORD TRADITIONS

THE EARLY YEARS

The first baseball team at Wofford took the field in 1889 under the direction of Professor Marshall, however there is evidence of a team representing the College playing Furman in 1885. In 1896, the Wofford team took on South Carolina and won 18-6. Wofford pitcher Gus Chrietzburg struck out 19 batters against Wake Forest that season as well. In 1899, the team was undefeated with wins over Clemson, South Carolina, Furman, Citadel, Erskine and College of Charleston.

MARK LINE

One of the winningest coaches in Wofford baseball history is Mark Line. He served as head coach from 1985 to 1994, posting a career record of 204-157 for a .564 winning percentage. He was named NAIA District VI Coach of the Year in 1987. In 1990, the Terriers won 30 games for the first time in school history. He has served as the Deputy Athletic Director at Wofford before serving at the first head coach of the Wofford Softball program during its inception until the hiring of Chelsea Butler. Line currently is an assistant coach for the Terrier softball team as it begins its first season of action.

FIVE DAYS IN MAY

In 2007, the Terriers pulled off one of the most amazing runs in conference tournament history as they entered as the ninth seed. A 5-3 play-in game victory against Furman led to a 19-6 shellacking of the top seed, the College of Charleston, on Wednesday. Thursday's 12-5 win over UNC Greensboro put Wofford in the winner's bracket. The result, a 6-2 win over The Citadel and a rematch in the championship game. Pitching on two days rest, Austin Redwine limited The Citadel to one run and four hits over nearly seven innings of work to give Wofford the 4-2 victory and the 2007 Championship. In 2024, the Terriers replicated Five Days in May with an improbable run of seven games in five days. The No. 5 seed Terriers bested No. 8 The Citadel 8-3 in a single-elimination play-in game to advance to the double-elimination portion of the event. Wofford won back-to-back contests over Western Carolina and UNCG on Thursday and Friday, respectively. However, No. 2 seed Samford won on Saturday, forcing the Terriers into the losers' bracket. Later that night, Wofford defeated ETSU in a 13-10 slugfest to force a rematch with the Bulldogs. On Sunday, the Terriers won the first contest 10-9 to force the winner-take-all affair, and Wofford triumphed 15-9 in that match-up to secure the 2024 SoCon Championship.

NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Terriers made their first appearance in the NCAA Baseball Tournament during the 2007 season. Sent to the Columbia Regional, Wofford faced South Carolina in the first game and North Carolina State in the second game. Wofford made its second appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 2024 and subsequently made program history. The Terriers were selected as the No. 3 seed in the Chapel Hill Regional. In the opening contest, Wofford faced the defending national champion LSU and pushed the Tigers to their limit despite a 4-3 walk-off loss. The next day, Wofford bested LIU 5-2 for its first NCAA Tournament victory in program history. This set up a rematch against LSU the following afternoon, which the Tigers won.

BACK-TO-BACK

On May 21, 2021, the Terriers defeated Mercer twice in a doubleheader at home to secure the Southern Conference regular season championship, the first in program history. The title came by way of a 36-21 overall record with a program-best 21-9 SoCon clip. Wofford raised the bar the following season, securing the 2022 SoCon regular season title with a 16-4-1 league record and a 42-16-1 overall record, the program's first-ever 40-win season. The 2022 season also saw Wofford enter the top 25 rankings for the first time in program history, marking a historic campaign in the second leg of back-to-back championships.

BRANDON WARING

Brandon Waring had one of the best single-season performances of any Terriers in 2007. He set a school record with 27 home runs, which was second in the nation. In the Southern Conference Tournament, he earned MVP honors. An All-Southern Conference first team selection, he was also a first team All-American by the ABCA, *Baseball America* and *Collegiate Baseball*. Waring was a semifinalist for the Brooks Wallace Award. He was selected in the MLB Draft by the Reds and has spent the last three seasons in the Baltimore 0's organization. He signed as a free agent with the Minnesota Twins for the 2014 season.

TERRIERS

Wofford's nickname dates back to the early 1910's when Professor E.H. Shuler recalled seeing a terrier named Jack at Wofford baseball games. A cartoon showing a Jack-like dog doing gymnastics appeared in a Wofford Journal about the same time. By 1914, the nickname Terrier was firmly established for the college's athletic teams. Wofford has had a number of real life mascots including Spike in the mid-50s and Jocko in the early 1960s. Most Wofford Terriers have been Boston Terriers



which have a smooth black coat with white markings on the face, neck, chest, legs and feet. They usually pack a muscular 20 pounds on a foot-high frame.

BEN WOFFORD

Born on October 19, 1780, Benjamin Wofford rode a Methodist circuit as a lay exhorter in 1806 and 1807 in western Kentucky, but soon returned to South Carolina in that year to marry Anna Todd. With the death of her father in 1809, he inherited control of the Todd family farm in the southern part of Spartanburg County. Ordained in 1814, he served as an itinerant for only three years. A year after the death of Anna Todd Wofford in 1835, he married Maria Barron. His business interests and their diminished enthusiasm for rural life led them to move to the village, at the corner of present-day Magnolia and St. John Streets. There he continued to invest conservatively and live simply until his death on December 2, 1850.

Wofford's will provided \$100,000 for the establishment of a college for literary, classical, and scientific education in Spartanburg, to be under the control and management of the state's Methodist Conference. Within four years of Benjamin Wofford's death, the trustees he named took the money he bequeathed, secured a charter, bought land, built a college and five houses for professors, hired a faculty, and opened its doors.

NCAA COMPLIANCE

The importance of following all NCAA rules and regulations is imperative to maintaining the integrity of Wofford College and intercollegiate athletics. What is a Representative of Athletics Interests (Booster/Donor)?

All alumni, friends, and employees of the College are categorized as 'representatives of athletics interest.' The NCAA stipulates that once an individual has been identified as a 'representative' or "booster/donor" he/she retains this status forever even if the individual is no longer associated with the athletics program. Furthermore the NCAA states that it is possible for a person to be a representative of more than one institution at the same time. A representative of athletics interest may not:

- Contact a prospect's coach, principal or counselor in an effort to evaluate a prospect
- Visit the prospect's institution to pick up film or transcripts
- Contact a prospect, his/her parents, legal guardians or spouse on or off campus
- Contact a prospect by telephone or letter
- Make special arrangements to entertain a recruit
- Provide extra benefits to a prospect, student-athlete or the parents, family and/ or guardians of the prospects or student-athletes

2025 BASEBALL OUTLOOK

This will be the second season under the direction of head coach J.J. Edwards after leading the program to the 2024 SoCon Championship and an NCAA Tournament appearance in his first season at the helm. Leading the team will be seven seniors: David Wiley, Michael Sills, Dylan Rhadans, Grant Comstock, Braden Hofmeyer, Tyler Hare, and Adam Haber. Overall, 24 players return to the team from last season when the Terriers tallied a 42-20 overall record, their third-straight 40-win campaign. The Wofford roster is full, featuring 27 newcomers joining the squad. This includes 20 freshmen with seven incoming transfers.

PITCHING

The pitching staff includes 26 total arms, 21 of which are right-handers with five southpaws. Four hurlers are seniors, led by Braden Hofmeyer who posted a 2.83 ERA and 4-2 record over 28.2 innings before being shut down with an injury. Dylan Rhadans is a senior left-hander, and his fellow senior right-handers are Michael Sills and Grant Comstock. Sills appeared in four games while Comstock did not see any action. Rhadans posted a 1-0 record with 27 punchouts over 11 games, four starts, before missing the back portion of the season with injury.

The staff boasts seven juniors, highlighted by returners Champ Davis and Branton Little. Davis recorded a 3-1 record with a save and 15 punchouts in 22.1 innings. Little posted a 2-0 record with 29 strikeouts over 44.2 innings of action. John Gray and Jackson Coen also return to the team, and they are joined by transfers Charlie Horne, Carter Rasmussen, and Sheldon Egger. Gray had a breakout season with a 1-0 record in his limited 12.0 innings of action.

Five sophomores are a part of the staff, including 2024 SoCon All-Freshman Team member Kenny Michaels. The southpaw notched a pair of saves with a 3-2 record and 4.78 ERA in his rookie season. Davis Rivers, Mason Compton, Alec Bouchard, and Noah McMahon also return as sophomores. Bouchard led the team last season with five saves out of the bullpen.

The freshmen joining the pitching staff are Miller Alston, Austin Laughlin, Wes Estes, Cullen Condon, Jamie Whittier, Cameron Larson, Mason Weaver, Bryce Harder, Layton Bilderback, and Brady Snow.

Among returners, Hofmeyer started the most games last season with eight. Little and Compton each started four. Michaels is the returning leader in both innings pitched (49.0) and strikeouts (58).

CATCHERS

The Terriers have four catchers on the roster. They are evenly split with two juniors and two freshmen.

Lucas Manning highlights the backstops as the only returner. The junior hit .343 last season with 20 RBI in 50 games of action. He swiped 13 bases and is the leading stealer among returning players.

Raul Feliz joins Manning as a junior. Feliz is a transfer from Indian River State where he hit .276 as a sophomore in 48 games.

Wofford welcomes two freshmen catchers, Lucas Grantham and Zach Porter.

With Manning the only returner behind the dish, he is poised to step into the primary starting role.

INFIELD

The infield is led by senior Tyler Hare, who started all

62 games at first base in 2024. The left-handed slugger clubbed a team-high 16 home runs with 63 RBI while hitting .315.

Hunter Herndon is one of two junior infielders, a transfer from Sewanee. He can also play the outfield. Herndon was an All-SAA First-Team player at Sewanee. James Layman returns after appearing in 11 games.

There are three sophomore infielders. Ryan Wynn had a breakout freshman campaign with a .263 average over 19 games. Harrison Campi returns alongside Wynn. They are joined by incoming transfer from Central Michigan, Drew Loikits. He hit .347 overall in his 31 games of action, including 23 starts.

The infield features five freshmen: Joey Chitla, Tanner Hardin, Thomas Woodridge, Jack Painter, Cade Collins.

With Hare as the only returning starter from last season's infield, the remaining three slots are up for grabs. **OUTFIELD**

Seniors David Wiley and Adam Haber lead the outfield. Wiley hit .286 over 58 games with 54 starts, swatting seven round-trippers with 37 RBI. Haber played in 37 games with 25 starts, hitting .278 with 20 RBI.

The outfield contains three juniors, two returners and a transfer. Andrew Mannelly highlights the juniors after hitting .301 with seven homers and 50 RBI. He was named to the All-Tournament Team for the Chapel Hill Regional. Logan Tribble also returns afte playing in nine contests. Niko Brini rounds out the juniors as a transfer in from UConn. He played in 13 games a freshman but didn't see action as a sophomore.

Tyler Bak and Ethan Belk are the two sophomores. Bak was a SoCon All-Freshman Team selection after hitting .286 with 19 RBI and 10 steals. Belk hit .333 over his 11 games played.

A trio of freshmen join the outfield in Kaz Uehara, Ben Timblin, and Carson Cherry. Uehara is the son of former MLB and NPB pitcher Koji Uehara. The Terrier outfield sees the most stability of all the position groups from last season. Wiley was the primary right fielder with left field featuring a rotation of Bak, Mannelly, and Haber. With centerfielder Marshall Toole departing after his MLB Draft selection, that slot is open for the taking.

POSITION PLAYERS RETURNING

J.J. Edwards joined the coaching staff in the fall of 2011 as the volunteer assistant and was promoted to assistant coach in the summer of 2012. He was named the head coach of the program on July 13, 2023. Now in his 14th season on the staff overall, he enters his second campaign as the head coach of the Terriers. In the summer of 2016 he added the responsibilities of recruiting coordinator and in the summer of 2021 was promoted to associate head coach.

In Edwards' first season as head coach in 2024, the Terriers reached new heights with a 42-20 overall record and 12-8 SoCon clip. The 42 wins tied the program's record and marked a third-straight 40-win campaign. Wofford battled out of the losers' bracket of the Southern Conference Tournament to defeat Samford twice on Championship Sunday, securing the program's second-ever SoCon Tournament title. Edwards became the winningest first-year coach in program history and the first rookie skipper in the program's history to take his squad to a SoCon Championship and the NCAA Tournament. Wofford was selected as the No. 3 seed to the Chapel Hill Regional. Despite losing the opening match-up to LSU, the Wofford defeated Long Island 5-2 in game two to secure the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament victory. The Terrier offense was one of the best in the country en route to Wofford's success. With 33 triples, Wofford led the nation and set a new program record. Wofford also ranked second nationally in batting average (.334), runs (617), runs per game (10.0) and sacrifice flies (41) while sitting third in on-base percentage (.438), fourth in sacrifice bunts (55) and fifth in hits (716). The Terriers were well represented in the All-SoCon balloting as Dixon Black, Marshall Toole and Zac Cowan all earned first-team honors. Daniel Jackson was named SoCon Freshman of the Year, and he secured a spot on the second team alongside Mike Eggert. Tyler Bak, Kenny Michaels and Camden Wicker were all tabbed to the SoCon All-Freshman Team with Jackson.

Under the tutelage of Edwards, the Terrier offense has ranked in the top three of the SoCon in batting average every season since 2018. Wofford has ranked in the top five nationally in stolen bases in nine of the last 11 seasons and has not ranked below ninth in the country in that span. Each of the last three SoCon Players of the Year have come from Wofford, with Colin Davis (2021), Lawson Hill (2022) and Ryan Galanie (2023) earning the honors.

The 2023 campaign saw Wofford continue to succeed with a 40-19 record, just the program's second 40-win season. Wofford was 12-9 in SoCon action to place third in the league and ultimately advanced to the SoCon Championship for a second-straight season. First baseman Ryan Galanie was named SoCon Player of the Year and highlighted a duo of All-SoCon First-Teamers that also included Lucas Mahlstedt. The second team featured four Terriers: Coulson Buchanan, Matthew Marchal, Cameron Gill and Dixon Black. Wofford led the league in walks (294), hits (617), on-base percentage (.422), runs (499), sacrifice bunts (86) and triples (18). The sac bunts led the nation and set a new single-season program record. Wofford's .314 batting average was second in the league and 13th nationally, and the Terriers swiped 153 bases to sit second in the SoCon and fifth in the nation. On top of sacrifices, Woffford set single-season program records for runs, hit by pitch (86) and fielding percentage (.978).

The Terriers reached new heights in the 2022 season with a 42-16-1 overall record, the most wins in program history and the team's first 40-win season. The Terriers were 16-4-1 in league play to claim a second-straight Southern Conference Regular

Season Championship. Five Terriers earned First-Team All-Southern Conference recognition, including Matthew Marchal, Lawson Hill, John Dempsey, Ryan Galanie and Brennen Dorighi. Hill was tabbed Player of the Year by the media. Dalton Rhadans and Josh Vitus were selected to the second team, and the All-Freshman Team featured Carter Bailey, Coulson Buchanan and Marshall Toole. Wofford made it to the championship series of the SoCon Torunament for the third time in program history but fell short to UNCG. The squad's .314 batting average led the conference, as did its 145 stolen bases.

The 2021 season saw Wofford win the first regular season Southern Conference Championship in school history. The team was 36-21 overall and 21-9 in league play, which were the most conference wins in school history. Outfielder Colin Davis was named SoCon Player of the Year and Elliot Carney was named SoCon Pitcher of the Year. They were joined by Dalton Rhadans, Jack Renwick, Lawson Hill and Nolen Hester receiving All-SoCon honors. Renwick and Trey Yunger were named to the All-Freshman Team. The Terriers had a .291 batting average that ranked second in the league, while four players had averages over .300. Among the NCAA leaders, Wofford was second in stolen bases, 20th in doubles and 14th in on base percentage.

In 2020, the team was 14-3 overall. The team was hitting .316 and had a .422 on base percentage, both of which were ranked first in the Southern Conference. Wofford was also leading the league in hits, runs, RBIs, walks and stolen bases before the season was cut short.

During the 2019 season, Wofford won 36 games, tied for the second-most in school history. The 14-9 record in the Southern Conference to finish second overall, the highest in school history. In the Southern Conference Tournament, Wofford reached the championship series for the second time in school history before falling to Mercer. Seven Terriers earned All-Southern Conference honors, highlighted by Hayes Heinecke being named Freshman of the Year. Heinecke, Brett Rodriguez, John Dempsey, Hudson Byorick, Colin Davis and Mike Brown were named All-SoCon, with Heinecke, Dempsey and Matty Brown earning All-Freshman Team recognition. Heinecke and Dempsey added Collegiate Baseball Freshman All-America honors. The team's .306 batting average was the best in the SoCon and the highest for a Wofford team since 1991. School records were also set for runs, doubles and walks.

In the 2018 season the team posted a 36-23 overall record, the second-most wins in school history. In Southern Conference play, the Terriers were 15-9 to finish third overall and set a new school record for league wins. Outfielder McClain Bradley earned second team All-Southern Conference honors, while outfielder Colin Davis and catcher Lawson Hill were named to the All-Freshman Team. Davis was also recognized as a Collegiate Baseball Freshman All-American. The team batting average

of .287 ranked third in the league, along with leading the conference in doubles and stolen bases.

The team won 28 games overall in 2017. The 13-11 mark in Southern Conference play marked just the second winning record in league play in school history. Four position players earned All-Southern Conference honors - first baseman Brett Hash, catcher Carson Waln, outfielder McClain Bradley and designated hitter Cody Miller - while infielder Brett Rodriguez was named to the All-Freshman Team. The Terriers led the league in stolen bases and were fourth in runs scored and home runs, while posting a team batting average of .294 on the season.

During the 2016 season, Wofford won 30 games, marking the third straight year with 30 or more wins. The team was 12-12 in the Southern Conference, just the second .500 or better mark in league play for the Terriers. Shortstop Derek Hirsch earned second team All-Southern Conference honors and led the team in hitting with a .368 batting average. Among conference leaders, Wofford was first in stolen bases, second in fielding percentage, sixth in on base percentage, sixth in RBIs, second in triples and fifth in walks received. The team set a new school record for fielding percentage (.972).

In 2015, the Terriers set a school record for wins with a 39-22 overall record. The

13-10 mark in the Southern Conference resulted in a third place finish, the highest in school history. Wofford had seven starters hitting above .300 on the season, with a team batting average of .302 which ranked second in the SoCon and 15th in the nation. First baseman Conor Clancey, outfielder James Plaisted, and designated hitter Matt Ramsay were named All-Southern Conference. Ramsay was second in the league in batting average at .359, while Clancey had 66 RBIs to lead the conference. The Terriers had 184 extra base hits on the year, leading the SoCon in doubles with 125 and triples with 20. Nationally, the team was first in stolen bases with 138, second in stolen bases per game, 18th in doubles, 24th in hits, 25th in scoring, 31st in slugging percentage, and 13th in on-base percentage.

During the 2014 season, the team had a school-record with 32 wins. The overall record of 32-28 was the first winning record since 1992 for Wofford. The team led the nation in stolen bases with 153 and stolen bases per game with 2.55. Wofford also set new school records in walks received and fielding percentage.

In the 2013 season, his work with the offense resulted in the Terriers leading the nation with 163 stolen bases. The team was also first in the SoCon in sacrifice bunts. During his first season on the staff he worked primarily with the outfielders and coached first base. The team won 22 games for the second straight year and was 9-21 in the SoCon for the third straight season.

He was a four-year letterwinner and three-year starter at Sacred Heart. Playing primarily in the infield, he was team captain in 2010 and 2011. In 2011, the team won the Northeastern Conference Championship. Edwards earned first team Northeastern Conference and first team New England honors in 2011 as he led the team with a .372 batting average and 80 hits. He had a .340 career batting average and was also named to the Northeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll in 2010 and 2011.

Prior to joining the Terriers he was an assistant coach for the Oneonta Outlaws of the NYCBL during the summer of 2011. He played in the NYCBL for three seasons with the Elmira Pioneers, earning first team honors in 2009.

A native of Endwell, New York, Edwards received his bachelor's degree in history from Sacred Heart in 2010 and added a masters in the art of teaching in 2011. He is also a certified teacher. A standout in baseball and basketball, he was inducted in the Maine-Endwell High School Athletic Hall of Fame in 2018. Edwards and his wife. Melissa, have two daughters, James Marie and Wells Lily, and reside in Spartanburg.

Pat Brown joined the Wofford staff as pitching coach in July of 2023 and was elevated to associate head coach while retaining pitching coach duties in the summer of 2024. He enters his second season with the Terriers in 2025. He completed his third season as the pitching coach at St. Joseph's in the spring of 2023 prior to his arrival in Spartanburg. In each of his three seasons the Hawks reached the Atlantic 10 postseason, culminating in the program's first-ever A-10 regular season title in 2023.

"Pat has a proven track record of success and development with a pitching staff," said Edwards. "He is going to be a great addition to our staff and program. We happy to welcome him and his wife Katy to our Wofford Baseball family."

Brown's first season with the Terriers in 2024 was historic, as Wofford posted a 42-20 overall record with a 12-8 league clip. The 42 wins mark a third-straight 40-win campaign for the Terriers while tying the program's single-season record. Wofford won the SoCon Tournament after battling out of the losers' bracket to defeat Samford twice and reach the NCAA Tournament. The Terriers were tabbed as the No. 3 seed in the Chapel Hill regional and secured their first-ever NCAA Tournament victory by downing Long Island 5-2. Brown's pitching staff was instrumental to the team's success, posting the most strikeouts in the SoCon with 497 and the second-best ERA with a 5.79 mark. The Terriers owned the best strikeout-to-walk ratio in the league at 2.47, which was 25th best in the nation. Leading the charge was Zac Cowan, who earned First-Team All-SoCon honors and was named Most Outstanding Player of the SoCon Tournament. He owned a 3.35 ERA, second in the SoCon, while striking out the most batters with 124. His 10 wins were also second. Senior Mike Eggert earned his first All-Southern Conference nod with a second-team selection by the media. Brown also helped develop freshmen Kenny Michaels and Camden Wicker, both of whom earned SoCon All-Freshman Team recognition.

A number of Hawks saw their careers rise to a new level under Brown's tutelage. In 2021, Hayden Seig went on to sign a free agent contract with the Los Angeles Angels organization. The following season, Matt McShane earned Collegiate Baseball Newspaper Freshman All-America honors and a place on the Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team. Domenic Picone was named to the All-Conference Second Team in 2023, becoming just

the fifth SJU starting pitcher to earn All-Conference honors since the Hawks joined the league 40 years earlier.

Brown joined the Hawks from Carson-Newman University, where he had been coaching since the summer of 2019. Prior to his stint in Tennessee, Brown spent two seasons at Arcadia University in Glenside, Pennsylvania, where he helped guide the Knights to a MAC Commonwealth title and an NCAA Tournament bid in 2017. Mike Boulanger and Joel Bartoni each earned First Team All-Conference honors in 2017 and 2018, respectively, with Bartoni nabbing a pair of All-Region nods as well.

Brown began his coaching career at Bloomsburg University after graduating from SUNY Oswego in 2015. The Liverpool, New York, native made 38 appearances out of the bullpen for the Lakers, notching four career saves and posting a 3.67 strikeout-to-walk ratio in 72.1 innings. He was a member of SUNY Oswego's NCAA Regional team as a senior.

Brown comes to Spartanburg with his wife, Katy.



Hudson Byorick joined the staff in the fall of 2022 as the director of player development and was elevated to an assistant coach the following season, working primarily with the hitters. Byorick enters his third season on staff in 2025 after adding the duties of recruiting coordinator in the summer of 2024. A 2020 graduate of Wofford, Byorick returned to Spartanburg after a playing

career with the Terriers.

In 2024, Byorick headed one of the nation's best offenses en route to Wofford posting a 42-20 record with a 12-8 league clip to secure the SoCon Tournament championship. It was Wofford's third-straight 40-win season, and the 42 wins tied the program record. The SoCon Tournament title was Wofford's second, and the Terriers were selected as the No. 3 seed in the Chapel Hill Regional. Wofford bested Long Island 5-2 in game two to grab the program's first NCAA Tournament victory. Byorick's offense ranked near the top of the country in many categories, notably topping the nation with a program-record 33 triples. Wofford also ranked second nationally in batting average (.334), runs (617), runs per game (10.0) and sacrifice flies (41) while sitting third in on-base percentage (.438), fourth in sacrifice bunts (55) and fifth in hits (716). Three Terriers ranked in the top 10 of the SoCon in batting average. Marshall Toole's 43 steals and 10 triples both set new program records. He was named First-Team All-SoCon alongside Dixon Black and Zac Cowan. Daniel Jackson earned SoCon Freshman of the Year honors, and he was joined on the all-freshman team by Tyler Back, Kenny Michaels and Camden Wicker.

Byorick's first season on the staff in 2023 saw Wofford post a 40-19 record with a 12-9 SoCon clip. It was Wofford's second-ever 40-win campaign. The Terriers returned to the SoCon Championship for the second-straight season. Ryan Galanie was named SoCon Player of the Year and was joined on the All-So-Con First Team by pitcher Lucas Mahlstedt. The second team included Coulson Buchanan, Matthew Marchal, Cameron Gill and Dixon Black. Three Terriers featured on the SoCon All-Freshman Team: Zac Cowan, Branton Little and Charlie Weber. Wofford's .314 batting average was second in the conference and 13th in the nation, and the Terriers topped the conference in ERA with a 5.23 clip. With 2.38 walks allowed per nine innings, Wofford led the entirety of Division I baseball. The Terriers also topped the nation with 86 sacrifice bunts, a program record. With a fielding percentage of .978, Wofford led the SoCon and set a new single-season program record.

In two seasons as a player from 2019-20, Byorick made 77 starts in the outfield and played in 78 games overall. He owned a career .336 average with 93 hits, 53 RBI and 63 runs scored along with 11 stolen bases. Byorick then played a fifth season as a graduate transfer at West Virginia.



The Rebels were 25-29 overall in 2023 as he assisted with daily practices and operations. He also assisted the director of analytics with advance scouting of opponents. He received a masters of sports analytics from Ole Miss in 2023 with a concentration in sports business.

"Frederic is a young man who has put in his time and has shown he is willing to work hard to make any program he touches better," said Edwards. "He did a great job at Ole Miss and we are excited to see what he can do for our program."

A native of Pascagoula, Mississippi, he was a catcher at East Mississippi Community College during the 2019 and 2020 seasons, earning MACCC All-Academic first team honors. He was also a NJCAA first team Academic All-American. He earned his bachelor degree in biochemistry from Mississippi State in 2022, where he was a Presidential Scholar.



PRESIDENT

Nayef H. Samhat, the 11th president of Wofford College, is a native of Detroit, Michigan. He holds a B.A. in international affairs from The George Washington University's School of International and Public Affairs, a master's degree in international affairs from Columbia University and a Ph.D. in political science from Northwestern University.

The Wofford College Board of Trustees elected Samhat as president of the college on Tuesday, May 14, 2013. He began his duties at Wofford on July 1, 2013.



after serving as provost and professor of political science and international studies at Kenyon College in Gambier, Ohio. Prior to his time at Kenyon, he was the Frank B. and Virginia B. Hower Associate Professor of Government and International Studies and an associate dean at Centre College in Danville, Kentucky.

Since taking office at Wofford, Samhat has led the college through two strategic visioning processes, including the latest to address justice, equity, diversity and inclusion on campus. A record \$470 million comprehensive fund-raising campaign, including endowment growth of over \$250 million (the total is now more than \$400 million), concluded in 2021. He has overseen the renovation or construction of 11 campus facilities, the re-evaluation of the general education curriculum, an increased engagement with the Spartanburg community, including new initiatives in Spartanburg's northside neighborhood, SACSCOC reaccreditation, and new marketing and branding initiatives as well as many other plans, programs and grants designed to build community, boost sustainability, champion the liberal arts and enhance the educational experience for students.

He serves on the executive committee of the Annapolis Group of Liberal Arts Colleges. Past national service includes the boards of the Council of Independent Colleges national board of directors, the National Association of Independent Colleges and Universities (NAICU) and the NCAA Division I board of directors and board of governors, which also included service on the NCAA Division I Presidential Forum and as a mentor for the NCAA Pathway Program. He also was chairman of the Southern Conference Council of Presidents in 2015-16.

His academic interests include international relations theory, international

political economy and the politics of the Middle East, especially international relations in the Middle East. He has contributed articles, papers, reviews and essays on these and other topics. Samhat is also a staunch advocate of the liberal arts educational experience and has been a national presenter, panelist and commentator on the subject.

Samhat is married to Prema Samhat. They have three daughters, Alia, Jehan and Leila, Dr. Samhat threw out the first pitch at the 2016 season and three grandsons.

SCOTT KULL

ROBERT D. ATKINS '65 DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Scott Kull was named Wofford College director of athletics, effective April 1, 2024. Kull previously served as the deputy athletics director for external affairs and executive director of the athletics foundation at University of North Carolina Charlotte. He has held similar positions at the University of Utah, University



of South Florida, Florida State and Texas Christian University. His career has also taken him to the University of Florida and Georgia Tech.

A proven fundraiser, Kull has over 30 years of experience in intercollegiate athletics, including work in strategic planning, student-athlete wellbeing, athletics marketing and media relations, departmental leadership, financial affairs, compliance and risk management, corporate sponsorship, licensing, ticket sales, emerging technologies and facilities and event management. In 2019, he was recognized by the Sports Business Journal as a "power player."

Before Charlotte, Kull was at the University of Utah, where he served as Deputy Athletics Director for External Affairs since 2018. While with the Utes, he achieved the largest gift in athletics history, oversaw a development team that achieved record giving and attracted \$51 million in gifts for a football stadium renovation. That team also secured \$4 million in gifts towards a gymnastics practice facility. In addition, Kull contributed to NIL education and revenue initiatives for the department.

He also oversaw marketing, television, media relations, licensing, multi-media rights and digital and creative media. He created a digital and creative department and handled revenue contracts including stadium pouring rights, official footwear and apparel, merchandise, website, multimedia and PAC-12 television. He led efforts to secure \$53 million in future athletics revenue and oversaw a staff that achieved a 300% increase in fundraising from 2016 to 2017. Their efforts were instrumental in USF reaching its goal of \$1 billion in the Unstoppable Campaign.

Likewise, he oversaw external relations, including revenue contracts for concessions, pouring rights, AAC television, website, licensing, apparel and merchandise. He served on search committees to hire head coaches in football, men's basketball, baseball, women's golf and men's tennis.

As the Senior Associate Athletics Director for External Operations at TCU from 2005-2016, he served as a member of the Executive Leadership Team for Strategic Planning & Management. He was a member of the development team that raised \$260 million for Capital Projects over eight years, including \$164 million for football stadium renovations and \$72 million for basketball arena renovations.

Among his duties in external operations, he oversaw a 12-year, \$40 million agreement with IMG for sponsorship and media rights. He was also instrumental in procuring video boards and LED displays for several athletic facilities. He partnered with coaching staffs to effectively administer men's basketball, swimming and diving, golf, track and field and cross country.

He was General Manager and Associate AD with Host Communications at Florida State University from 1999 to 2005 and served as Director of Marketing for the Seminoles from 1997-99. He got his start at Florida, where he was a graduate assistant in the athletics ticket office from 1992-93. He also served as a Marketing Assistant at Georgia Tech (1993-94) and as an Assistant Director of Marketing at Ohio State from 1994-97.

A 1990 graduate of Otterbein College, where he played football and threw the javelin. Kull received his Master of Arts in Sport Management from Ohio State University in 1992.

Raised in Old Town, Maine and Claremont, N.H., Kull enjoys travel, cycling and has competed in the Ironman Triathlon. His community involvement includes the United Way, the Live Thankfully program and Habitat for Humanity.

SPORTS MEDICINE

Spartanburg Regional Healthcare System's Sports Medicine Institute is the official sports medicine provider of Wofford College athletics. By partnering with the Sports Medicine Institute, Wofford student-athletes have access to all the services and specialties of a teaching hospital as well as a Level 1 trauma center at Spartanburg Medical Center. This includes specialty physicians, diagnostic testing such as MRI and CT, pharmacy services, drug testing and nutritional counseling.

With the opening of Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium in the fall of 2017 and the renovations of the Richardson Building in the summer of 2018, the Wofford College Athletic Training staff has two new on-campus facilities.

The athletic training area in Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium is used for men's and women's lacrosse, and men's and women's golf. This location will also be the



primary area for physical therapy with a Biodex machine and treadmill. The area includes two offices, an exam room, and a wet area with two Grimm CRYOtherm hot/ cold soaking tubs.

In the Richardson Building, the athletic training room is primarily for football, men's and women's soccer, baseball, softball, men's and women's tennis, and men's and women's cross country and track and field. A 1,200 square foot addition houses a new state of the art hydrotherapy suite which includes two Grimm CRYOtherm hot/ cold soaking tubs and a Hydroworx aquatic therapy pool with underwater treadmill, resistance jet technology, and an underwater camera for detailed observations and feedback to the trainers and athletes. The existing training room was relocated to adjoin the new hydrotherapy suite, which results in a much-needed increased size for the new training room. Supporting the training area are three staff offices, exam room, x-ray room, and storage room.

WILL **CHRISTMAN**

DIRECTOR OF SPORTS MEDICINE

Will Christman is in his 16th season at Wofford and was named Director of Sports Medicine in 2016. He joined the Terriers in 2008 after working for two years at Furman University. He oversees the athletic training room and assists with the football team. The football team has won five Southern Conference titles during his tenure.

The Southern Conference has been on the forefront of innovation and originality in developing creative solutions to address issues facing intercollegiate athletics. From establishing the first postseason college basketball tournament (1921), to tackling the issue of freshman eligibility (1922), to developing women's championships (1984), to becoming the first conference to install the 3-point goal in basketball (1980), the Southern Conference has been a pioneer.

The Southern Conference is the nation's fifth-oldest NCAA Division I collegiate athletic association. Only the Big Ten (1896), the Missouri Valley (1907), the Pac-12 (1915) and the Southwestern Athletic (1920) conferences are older in terms of origination.

Academic excellence has been a major part of the Southern Conference's tradition. Hundreds of Southern Conference student-athletes have been recognized on CoSIDA Academic All-America and all-district teams. A total of 20 Rhodes Scholarship winners have been selected from conference institutions, most recently in 2012-13, when former Wofford volleyball player Rachel Woodlee earned the prestigious award.

Championships.

The Southern Conference offices are located in the historic Beaumont Mill in Spartanburg, South Carolina. A textile mill that was in operation from 1880 until 1999, Beaumont Mill was renovated in 2004 and today offers the league first-class meeting areas and offices as well as a spacious library for storage of the conference's historical documents.

MEMBERSHIP HISTORY

On Feb. 25, 1921, representatives from 14 of the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association's (SIAA) 30 members met at Atlanta's Piedmont Hotel to establish the Southern Intercollegiate Conference. On hand at the inaugural meeting were officials from Alabama, Alabama Polytechnic Institute (Auburn), Clemson, Georgia, Georgia School of Technology (Georgia Tech), Kentucky, Maryland, Mississippi A&M (Mississippi State), North Carolina, North Carolina State, Tennessee, Virginia, Virginia Polytechnic Institute (Virginia Tech) and Washington & Lee.

Dr. S.V. Sanford of Georgia was chosen as acting chairman and N.W. Dougherty of Tennessee was named secretary. The

decision to form a new athletic conference was motivated by the desire to have a workable number of conference games for each league member. With 30 schools in the SIAA by the early 1920s, it was impossible to play every school at least once during the regular season and many schools went several years between playing some conference members. In addition, in 1920, the SIAA voted down proposed rules that an athlete must be in a college a year before playing on its teams and refused to abolish a rule permitting athletes to play summer baseball for money.

Play began in the fall of 1921, and a year later, six more schools joined the fledgling league, including Tulane (which had attended the inaugural meeting but had elected not to join), Florida, Louisiana (LSU), Mississippi, South Carolina and Vanderbilt. VMI joined in 1923 and Duke was added in 1929.

By the 1930s, membership in the Southern Conference had reached 23 schools. C.P. "Sally" Miles of Virginia Tech, president of the Southern Conference, called the annual league meeting to order on Dec. 9, 1932, at the Farragut Hotel in Knoxville, Tennessee. There, it announced that 13 institutions west and south of the Appalachian Mountains were reorganizing as the Southeastern Conference. Members of the new league included Alabama, Alabama Polytechnic Institute, Florida, Georgia, Georgia School of Technology, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, Mississippi A&M, University of the South, Tennessee, Tulane and

According to the minutes of the meeting, Georgia's Dr. Sanford stated that the division was made along geographical lines. Florida's Dr. J.J. Tigert, acting as spokesman for the withdrawing group, regretted the move but believed it was necessary as the Southern Conference had grown too large. The resignations were accepted and the withdrawing schools formed the new league, which began play in 1933.

The Southern Conference continued with membership of 10 institutions, including Clemson, Duke, Maryland, North Carolina, North Carolina State, South Carolina, Virginia, VMI, Virginia Tech and Washington & Lee.







The second major shift occurred some 20 years later. By 1952, the Southern Conference included 17 colleges and universities. Another split occurred when seven schools — Clemson, Duke, Maryland, North Carolina, North Carolina State, South Carolina and Wake Forest — departed to form the Atlantic Coast Conference, which began play in 1953. The revamped Southern Conference included members The Citadel, Davidson, Furman, George Washington, Richmond, VMI, Virginia Tech, Washington & Lee, West Virginia and William & Mary.

A third major shift occurred in 2012-13, when five members announced their departures and three schools were added. College of Charleston announced its decision to leave for the Colonial Athletic Association following the 2012-13 season, while Appalachian State (Sun Belt), Davidson (Atlantic 10), Elon (Colonial) and Georgia Southern (Sun Belt) announced they would depart following the 2013-14 campaign. At the Southern Conference's 2013 spring meetings in Hilton Head Island, South Carolina, the league officially extended invitations to former members ETSU and VMI, as well as Mercer, to join the league for the 2014-15 academic year.

Today, the league continues to thrive with a membership that includes 10 institutions and a footprint that spans six states: Alabama, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee and Virginia. Current league members are The Citadel, ETSU, Furman, Mercer, UNCG, Samford, Chattanooga, VMI, Western Carolina and Wofford.

CHAMPIONSHIPS

Men's basketball was the first sport in which the conference held a championship. The league tournament is the nation's oldest, with the inaugural championship held in 1921 at Atlanta's City Auditorium and won by Kentucky. The tournament began Feb. 25, the same day that members of the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association met to discuss forming the new league that would become the Southern Conference. The following year, North Carolina won the first tournament after the formation of the league.

Commissioner Germann spearheaded the Southern Conference's expansion to include women's athletics during the 1983-84 season. That year, league women's championships were held in volleyball, basketball and tennis.

The Southern Conference declares champions in 11 men's

sports — football, soccer, cross country, basketball, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, wrestling, baseball, lacrosse, tennis and golf — and 10 women's sports — soccer, volleyball, cross country, basketball, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, tennis, golf, and softball. Rifle is a mixed sport.



Women's Soccer



At the end of the last academic year, there were approximately 2,000 four-year colleges in the United States. Only 290 of them have the right to induct their graduates into Phi Beta Kappa, the nation's most prestigious liberal arts honor society. There are six private Phi Beta Kappa colleges and universities in the Carolinas: Wofford, Davidson, Duke, Elon, Furman and Wake Forest.

Founded at the College of William and Mary in December 1776, Phi Beta Kappa was the first of the Greek letter fraternities and adopted such rituals as the badge, the secret oath, and the special handclasp from the various secret societies of the day.

Phi Beta Kappa, however, was also devoted to the principles of "friendship, morality, and literature (or learning)," and these characteristics gradually attained the greatest emphasis. John Quincy Adams, Edward Everett and Joseph Story, members of the Harvard chapter, are credited with making the fraternity a public literary and honor society for undergraduates in the 1830's. Women were first admitted to Phi Beta Kappa in 1875 at the University of Vermont.

Wofford received its chapter at the 1940 triennial meeting, bringing to fruition more than ten years of work by three Phi Beta Kappa members who were then serving on the faculty: President Henry Nelson Snyder, Dr. David Duncan Wallace, class of 1894, and Dr. John West Harris '16, a brash and brilliant young English professor not afraid to campaign vigorously in the conviction that his alma mater deserved membership. (Dr. Harris later founded the National Beta Club, which still has its headquarters in Spartanburg).

Phi Beta Kappa today sponsors numerous programs to encourage scholarship and learning, including the Phi Beta Kappa Book Awards and the visiting scholar, academic fellowship and leadership programs.

For these reasons, Phi Beta Kappa Day at Wofford has institutional significance, as well as being especially memorable for the new members, each of whom will receive the traditional Phi Beta Kappa watch key or pin.




