ABOUT AUGUSTANA COLLEGE: Known for its balance of liberal arts with focus in a major field, collaborative research opportunities, competitive athletic teams and award-winning student activities programs, Augustana College is a selective independent college of the liberal arts and sciences related to the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Augustana's athletic teams have won more championships than any other school in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. The Vikings own a total of 186 total team championships (144 men and 42 women) since the league began in 1946-47. Augustana is currently seventh in the nation in number of CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) Academic All-Americans produced in all sports with 161 as of March, 2016. During the 1990's the Vikings finished third, trailing only Nebraska and M.I.T.

Home to a Phi Beta Kappa academic honor society chapter since 1949, Augustana grants baccalaureate degrees in more than 60 areas of study. Along with a competitive athletic environment, student-athletes can join one or several of the school's 150 student organizations or take advantage of Augustana's wide variety of opportunities for international study. Augustana has a student-faculty ratio of 11:1, and nearly 90 percent of the faculty hold the Ph.D. or the terminal degree in their field.

HEAD COACH MEREDITH NEWMAN



Meredith Newman was named the head coach of the Augustana women's lacrosse program in August of 2014. She joined the Vikings after two seasons at Beloit College in Beloit, Wisconsin, where she served as the Buccaneers first-ever head coach. She is the second head coach in the history of Augustana's program.

In 2015, her first season in charge of the Vikings, she guided the team to a 19-2 record, the inaugural CCIW regular season and tournament championships and an appearance in the NCAA Division III Tournament, where Augustana reached the round of 16 before falling to eventual national champion SUNY Cortland. She was named the CCIW's first-ever Coach of the Year.

Newman's 2015 Vikings led the nation in scoring, assists and scoring margin and she coached one All-American, four All-Region players and 10 All-CCIW performers.

Newman was named Beloit's first women's lacrosse head coach in 2011. She led the Buccaneers to a 4-7 record in their inaugural season of 2013 and her squad improved to 10-7 overall and 6-4 in the Midwest Women's Lacrosse Conference this past spring. Her players also excelled in the classroom, compiling a 3.40 cumulative grade point average during her two seasons at Beloit.

A 2009 graduate of Sweet Briar College in Sweet Briar, Virginia, Newman served as an assistant coach at Kenyon College in Gambier, Ohio in 2010 and 2011. The program's offensive coordinator, she helped the Ladies put together a 23-9 overall record in two seasons, including a 14-3 mark and a North Coast Athletic Conference co-championship in 2010.

While at Sweet Briar, Newman was a four-year letter winner and two-time team captain for the Vixens. She was named to the Old Dominion Athletic Conference All-Academic team in 2009 and finished her career with 83 goals and 45 assists.

Newman also has coaching experience at the club level, leading Cool Stick and Vibe outfits, and served as an assistant coach at Merestead Sports Camps at both Sweet Briar and Bryn Mawr College in Bryn Mawr, Pennsylvania.

Vikings looking to continue dominant ways despite significant personnel losses from 2015

When the 2016 women's lacrosse season begins for Augustana there will be a different look for the Vikings. Gone are 10 players, six of them starters, who made up the first-ever recruiting class when the team began play in the 2012 season. That group helped fashion a sterling 70-10 overall record, win three conference titles, three conference tournament championships and advance to the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA Division III tournament three straight times.

Vikings' head coach Meredith Newman, entering her second year at the helm, acknowledges the loss of some key players but she looks forward to the opportunity for other players to step up.

"There is no question that we graduated some very good players who certainly got the Augustana women's lacrosse program started in the right direction," said Newman who posted a 19-2 record in her first year in charge of the Vikings. "But I am excited to see how some of our players who have been waiting in the wings respond to the challenge."

There is still plenty of talent remaining on the roster heading into the 2016 season as 18 letter winners return, including six starters. Six of the top eight goal scorers on the 2015 team return so there will be plenty of offensive firepower for Newman to build around.

A year ago Augustana 18.3 goals per game and led NCAA Division III in scoring offense, scoring margin (+11.76), assists (11.76) and finished third in draw controls (17.90). Junior Anne Hopkins (Mother McAuley HS, Chicago, Ill.) is the leading returnee in terms of scoring with 70 goals and 32 assists for 102 points. She was a first team all-conference selection in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin and was second team all-Great Lakes Region. She will be joined as a returning starter in the attack position by senior Emily Handrahan (Lake Zurich HS, Hawthorn Woods, Ill.). Handrahan scored 31 goals and had 49 assists last year for 77 total points. She was a first team all-conference selection as a junior.

Senior Rebecca Pollard (Westfield HS, Carmel, Ind.), junior Maggie DelVecchio (Barrington HS, Barrington, Ill.) and freshmen Christina McCabe (Maine South HS, Park Ridge, Ill.) and Bailey Aasen (Park HS, Cottage Grove, Minn.) will battle for playing time in the attack position.

At the midfield seniors Kaylee Nolan (Carl Sandburg HS, Orland Park, Ill.) and Kendall Maduro (Neuqua Valley HS, Naperville, Ill.) and junior Olivia Mayer (Libertyville HS, Green Oaks, Ill.) form a solid nucleus. All three were start-

ers at some point in their respective careers. Nolan was first team all-conference and all-region a year ago and was also named the CCIW's "Defensive Player of the Year". Twice she won conference "Player of the Week" and she finished the year ranked fifth in NCAA Division III in draw controls with 7.57 per game (159 in 21 games). She owns a total of seven Augustana school records, including the career mark for draw controls with 339. Maduro, who was the "Newcomer of the Year" in the Midwest Women's Lacrosse Conference back in 2013, scored 31 goals with eight assists last year. She was also second team all-CCIW as a junior. Mayer, who is the starting point guard on the Augustana women's basketball team, tallied 27 goals with 14 assists last year.

Senior Shelby Cosman (Marian Catholic HS, Saint John, Ind.) and freshmen Carla Bennett (Marian Catholic HS, South Holland, Ill.) and Micheli Oliver (Berthoud HS, Berthoud, Colo.) make the midfield a very deep position. Cosman scored 23 goals and had four assists in 2015.

When it comes to defense seniors Cori Duncan (York HS, Elmhurst, Ill.), Kaitlin Hightower (Providence HS, Matthews, N.C.) and Nellie Bubb (Holy Family Catholic HS, Excelsior, Minn.) will lead the way. Duncan had 11 ground balls and eight caused turnovers while Hightower picked up seven ground balls and forced six turnovers. Bubb was credited with 16 ground balls and 11 caused turnovers. She also had 11 draw controls. Juniors Hanna Gobeille (Carl Sandburg HS, Orland Park, Ill.) and Jessie Czarnecki (Wheaton-Warrenville South HS, Wheaton, Ill.) and sophomore Megan Lipke (Arrowhead HS, Hartland, Wis.) will see playing time as well.

Senior Jenna Hofmann (Columbine HS, Littleton, Colo.) is the returning starter at goalkeeper where she posted an 18-2 record and had a 7.88 goals-against-average with 102 saves last year. She was second team all-conference in the CCIW. Sophomores Analia Fowler (York HS, Elmhurst, Ill.) and Maddie Russell (Noblesville HS, Noblesville, Ind.) will be in the mix as well.

"We know what it takes to win games," said Newman. "This group has had an awful lot of success and we have been able to perform when tested. We made the schedule tough on purpose and our challenge this year is to see if we are better than we were in 2015."

The Vikings will play five teams (Concordia-Wisconsin, Albion, Rhodes, Denison and Colorado College) in their non-conference schedule that were either conference champions or NCAA teams a year ago.

Newman announced that the captains for 2016 will be Duncan and Maduro.

Vikings begin the Meredith Newman era; finish 19-2; win the inaugural CCIW regular season and tournament championships; reach the NCAA Division III Tournament round of 16 for the third straight year

The 2015 season marked the beginning of the Meredith Newman era for Augustana women's lacrosse. Newman was hired in August of 2014 to replace Sara Tisdale, who left after three seasons to become head coach at Central Michigan University. The Vikings didn't miss a beat, as Newman guided the team to a 19-2 record, the inaugural CCIW regular season and tournament championships and an appearance in the NCAA Division III Tournament, where Augustana reached the round of 16 for the third consecutive year.

After going 16-1 in the regular season, including a perfect 6-0 in the first season of CCIW competition, the Vikings won both of their conference tournament games in dominating fashion at Thorson-Lucken Field. Augustana defeated Elmhurst 19-2 in the semifinals and Carthage 25-3 in the championship game.

With the CCIW not receiving an automatic bid, the Vikings were an at-large selection to the NCAA Division III Tournament field. After a first-round bye, they defeated Concordia (Wis.) 19-13 in a second round game at Thorson-Lucken. That earned them a trip to Cortland, New York to face SUNY Cortland. The Red Dragons ousted Augustana 21-2 in a "Sweet 16" contest and went on to capture the national championship. It was the second straight year that the Vikings were eliminated by the eventual champion.

Individual honors were many in 2015. Senior attacker Hilary Kargl (Sacred Heart Academy, Louisville, Ky.) was named a third team All-American by the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association. Augustana had four IWLCIA All-Great Lakes Region selections—Kargl, senior defender Bridget Conniff (Benet Academy, Downers Grove, Ill.) and junior midfielder Kaylee Nolan on the first team and sophomore attacker Anne Hopkins (Mother McAuley HS, Chicago, Ill.) on the second team. All four were also named to the All-CCIW first team, along with senior defender Nattali Shelton (Wheaton-Warrenville South HS, Wheaton, Ill.) and junior attacker Emily Handrahan (Lake Zurich HS, Hawthorn Woods, Ill.). Senior defender Gina Filippo (Libertyville HS, Green Oaks, Ill.), senior attacker Kelly Stelzer (Wheaton-Warrenville South HS, Wheaton, Ill.), junior goalie Jenna Hofmann (Columbine HHS, Littleton, Colo.) and junior midfielder Kendall Maduro (Neuqua Valley HS, Naperville, Ill.) were second team All-CCIW selections. Nolan was honored as the conference's Defensive Player of the Year and Newman was the league's Coach of the Year.

With an average of 18.29 goals per game this season, Augustana led the nation in scoring. The Vikings also led Division III in scoring margin (11.76) and assists per game (11.76) and ranked seventh in scoring defense (6.52), fourth in winning percentage (.905) and third in draw controls (17.9 per game).

Individually, Kargl led the team in goals (76), assists (64) and points (140) this year. Her school-record point total led the nation and she ranked sixth in assists. She finished her career with 270 goals and 184 assists for 454 points, the third-most in NCAA Division III history. She ranks 11th all-time in Division III assists and 21st in goals.

Hopkins finished with 70 goals and 32 assists and ranked 10th in the nation with 102 points. Handrahan was second on the team and 10th nationally with 49 assists. Nolan was the team leader in draw controls (a school-record 159), ground balls (50) and caused turnovers (36). Her average of 7.57 draw controls per game ranked fifth in the nation.

This year's team included 10 seniors who were original members of the Augustana varsity program. Newman's senior captains were Conniff, Stelzer and attacker Kate Zisser (Kirkwood HS, St. Louis, Mo.). The rest of the senior class consisted of Kargl, Shelton, Filippo, defender-midfielder Emily Pavlik (Lyons HS, La Grange, Ill.), defender-midfielder Alex Palmisano (Wheaton-Warrenville South HS, Wheaton, Ill.), defender Anna Kylo (St. Croix Lutheran HS, Bloomington, Minn.) and defender Barbara Vega

(Marian Catholic, Flossmoor, Ill.). That group helped the program compile a record of 70-10 (.875), capture three undefeated conference titles and make three NCAA Division III Tournament appearances in its first four-years of intercollegiate competition.

THE COLLEGE CONFERENCE OF ILLINOIS & WISCONSIN

Now in its 70th year, the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation." The league was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946 in Jacksonville, Illinois. Competition opened in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois.

Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967 the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin to recognize Carthage, which had moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin from Carthage, Illinois in 1962, and Carroll, which entered the league in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced some changes since the league's inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton left following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and then for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in 1961 and North Park entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll withdrew.

Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence. The league sanctioned women's sports for the first time in the 1986-87 school year and Augustana participated in the first ever women's competition. That was on September 14, 1986 when the Vikings met North Central in a volleyball match that was held at Elmhurst College.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin sanctions 23 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's lacrosse, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling.

Augustana owns more CCIW team championships than any other school in the league with 186 total. Of those 186, the men have won 144 and 42 belong to the women.

Women's lacrosse became an official varsity sport at Augustana during the 2011-12 school year. In their inaugural season, the Vikings led NCAA Division III in scoring offense, scoring margin, and caused turnovers.

During the 2015 season, Augustana will compete in the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin. In addition to the Vikings, current members of the CCIW include Carroll, Carthage, Dubuque, Elmhurst, Illinois Wesleyan, and North Central
