

WARHAWKS WIN FOURTH STRAIGHT GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE SERIES:

Kasey Clark and Zach Dew drove in five runs each, and the Auburn University at Montgomery baseball team dropped a season-high 16 runs in game one of its doubleheader against Shorter to secure a Gulf South Conference series win for the fourth consecutive week end. The game marked the fourth time this season AUM scored double-digit runs. AUM's two, three, and four hitters in the lineup combined to drive in 13 of the 20 runs on the day. In game one of the series, a 6-5 AUM win, Ashton Thomas smacked a two-run single to right with two outs in the top of the ninth inning to take a lead, and Grant Hickman notched his second save of the season.

CLARK SNARES WARHAWK OF THE WEEK HONORS:

First baseman Kasey Clark earned Warhawk of the Week honors after helping lead the team to its fourth consecutive weekend series victory in Gulf South Conference action. Clark hit .474 (9-for-19) in five games last week, as the Warhawks split a doubleheader against Spring Hill College and won their weekend series against Shorter University. The senior first baseman hit one home run, smacked two doubles, drove in nine runs, and scored nine runs. Clark added five walks and a stolen base. Clark slugged .737 for the week and reached base at a .583 clip. His week was highlighted by a 4-for-5 showing in game two against Shorter in which he helped AUM post its highest run total of the season (16). In the game, he walked once, scored two runs, had a bases-clearing single, and connected on a two-run single. Clark continued his hot stretch with a 3-for-5 effort, a walk, and two RBIs against Columbus State in the midweek.

MIDWEEK MORSELS:

Ryan Slaten logged another quality midweek start on the mound, but the Auburn University at Montgomery baseball team fell 5-4 in 10 innings to Columbus State University on Tuesday evening at Q.V. Lowe Field. Slaten logged 6.0 innings and allowed just one earned run. He gave up three total runs and scattered five hits with three strikeouts. Slaten did not issue a walk for the second time in his last three starts. He also logged five innings or more for the fifth straight outing and turned in his fourth consecutive start giving up two earned runs or less. Slaten has made six starts this year in the midweek and has yet to allow more than three earned runs in a game.

SCOUTING THE FLAMES:

Outfielder Brandon Daniels helps leads a Flames offense that leads the GSC at 9.0 runs per game (207 runs in 23 games). Daniels is hitting .398 with a team-high eight doubles, five home runs, and 38 RBIs. Daniels has also scored 29 runs and walked 18 times, while veteran Dylan Standifer has three doubles, five home runs, 19 RBIs, and a team-high 31 runs scored. On the mound, Lee owns the GSC's second-best staff ERA (4.25) and also leads the conference in strikeouts (195) and opponent's batting average (.258).

NEWS & NOTES:

BUSH SNAGS FIRST COLLEGIATE VICTORY:

Behind a two-run home run from Tyrese Rooks and a 3-for-5 effort from Brendan York, the AUM baseball team defeated Saint Leo University 13-3 in the finale of a three-game series to wrap up the opening weekend of the 2024 season. The win marked the first victory as a collegiate head coach for AUM skipper Franklin Bush. Bush was selected to lead the Warhawks after spending the past six seasons at the University of Montevallo, most recently as Associate Head Coach and Recruiting Coordinator.

WALK-OFF WARHAWKS:

AUM has already posted a pair of walk-off wins in the 2024 campaign. A Cooper Doughman RBI single combined with an Embry-Riddle throwing error helped the Warhawks to a 7-6 win in game two of the three-game series. AUM then delivered a 14-13 walk-off win over Georgia Southwestern. Tied at 13-13, Frankland worked a one-out walk and Nick Freeman pinch-ran for him to start the AUM ninth. Doughman followed with an infield single, and Freeman advanced to third on a GSW throwing error. JC Tunnell reached first on a bunt single to load the bases, and Hayden Grier beat out a fielder's choice ground ball to break up a double play and seal the Warhawk win.

ROOKS SETTING THE TABLE:

Junior outfielder Tyrese Rooks is off to a solid start in his first season donning the black and orange. Rooks, a Mobile, Ala. native, has posted a team-high 27 runs and a team-high 33 hits. Rooks is getting on base 45 percent of the time for the Warhawks (.452) and already has 12 multi-hit games.

MULTI-HIT & MULTI-RBI WARHAWKS:

Making his presence felt early at the top of the AUM lineup, Tyrese Rooks has 12 multi-hit games thus far this year, including four three-hit games. Brendan York has also posted eight multi-hit efforts, while Jackson Ceman is up to seven multi-hit games. JC Tunnell, Cooper Doughman, and Zach Dew have also posted six multi-hit games this season. Clark has five multi-hit ggmaes, including the team's only four-hit effort. Dew leads the charge with six multi-RBI games, while Doughman has added fivesuch games. Clark and Ceman each have four multi-RBI contests, while RH Frankland and Brendan York have three multi-RBI games each. Rooks has pitched in two multi-RBI games out of the leadoff spot.

EAVING THE YARD:

Seven different Warhawks have hit a home run this season. Clark, Dew, Doughman, Frankland, Rooks, Wright, and York have all hit round-trippers, totaling 16 for the team. Clark is up to a team-high five home runs, while Doughman has four and Dew has a trio. Eight of the dingers have been solo homers, while the rest have driven in multiple runs for the Warhawks.

OURRENT STREAKS:

Zach Dew leads the way for the Warhawks with a five-game hitting streak, while Clark, Wright, and York are all riding four-game hitting streaks. Jarren Wright has a team-best 15-game reached base streak, while Jackson Ceman has been on base in nine consecutive games. Clark and Rooks have also been on base in six straight games.

SEC STATISTICAL RANKS:

Rooks ranked fourth in the conference in runs scored (27) and leads the conference in at-bats (95). Clark is eighth in the league in runs scored with 25 and leads the conference in walks with 22. Clark also ranks fourth in at-bats with 91. Dew is eighth in doubles (7) and sixth in at-bats (89), while Jackson Ceman ranks eighth with nine HBPs. Defensively, Kasey Clark ranks second in the league in putouts (175). On the hill, Ryan Slaten is ranked fifth in ERA among qualified pitchers with a 3.38. Clay Slagle ranks second in the GSC in batters struck out looking with 13, while Slaten is eighth in that category (10). Slaten is ninth in innings pitched (32.0) and ninth in opponent batting average (.252). Turner ranks third in the league with only four walks given up, while Slaten ranks 10th with only 12 earned runs allowed. Lucas Baggett's three saves rank fourth in the league, while his four wins rank eighth. Grant Hickman's two saves rank him ninth in the league.

TEAM LEADERS:

Offensively, Jackson Ceman owns a .358 batting average, the top mark on the team. Rooks leads the team with 33 hits and 27 runs. Zach Dew is up to seven doubles and has the lone triple and Kasey Clark paces the group with five home runs. Dew and Clark are tied for the team lead in RBIs with 22, while Clark has walked 22 times, best on the team. Ceman has been hit by a pitch nine times and has the best on-base percentage (.494). Rooks and Tunnell each have four stolen bases to lead Lucas Baggett leads the team with four wins and three saves. Ryan Slaten has logged 32.0 innings on the mound, and Slagle has a team-high 30 strikeouts. Trey Bacon (3.1 innings) and Clay Weatherly (2.2 innings) have not allowed an earned run.

THREE NAMED TO GSC NEWCOMER WATCHLIST:

Tyrese Rooks, Ryan Slaten, and Brendan York were each named to the Gulf South Conference's Newcomer Watchlist ahead of the 2024 season. Rooks starred in the outfield at Bishop State Community College. he was an All-Conference selection in 2022 and posted a .362 batting average in 2023 with 13 doubles, one home run, and 21 runs batted in.

Slaten, a 6-foot-5 pitcher, played two seasons at Central Alabama Community College. He posted a 10-4 career record with five complete games in 20 starts. He logged 110 career innings and struck out 110 with a career 3.85 ERA. York appeared in 102 games across three seasons at Chattahoochee Valley Community College. York hit .289 in 44 games in 2023 at shortstop, and also hit .300 across 19 games in his debut collegiate season in 2021.

OULF SOUTH CONFERENCE PRESEASON POLL:

A season removed from going 19-31 with an 11-19 record in conference play to finish 10th, AUM was picked to finish 11th in this year's preseason coaches poll. The University of West Florida was picked to finish in the poll position, while Valdosta State University was picked to finish second.

Lee University (third), the University of Montevallo (fourth), and the University of Alabama in Huntsville (fifth) rounded out the top five preseason poll vote-getters.

FRANKLIN BUSH OUICK BIO:

Director of Athletics Erik Maas announced the hiring of Franklin Bush as the head baseball coach at Auburn University at Montgomery on Wednesday, June 28th, 2023. Bush becomes just the third head coach in the baseball program's 37-year history, building on the foundation laid by Q.V. Lowe, who won more than 1,000 games from 1987 to 2014, and Marty Lovrich, who coached the Warhawks to 235 wins from 2015 to 2023.

"We are excited to welcome Franklin Bush as the new head coach of the Warhawk baseball program," said Maas. "AUM Baseball has great tradition and Franklin fits what we were looking for as someone who can develop a championship-level program on and off the field, while honoring that tradition. We are happy to bring Franklin and his family back home to Montgomery to lead this storied program," Maas exclaimed.

Bush comes to the capital city after spending the past six seasons at fellow GSC institution the University of Montevallo, most recently as Associate Head Coach and Recruiting Coordinator. The 2022 Alabama Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year, Bush helped lead Montevallo to second and third place finishes in the GSC the past two years (with a 75-31 overall record in that span), including an NCAA South Region tournament in 2023.

Bush was heavily involved in all aspects of the program for the Falcons, including on-field coaching, academic management, community involvement initiatives, and facility maintenance. Under his tutelage, the program produced two GSC Players of the Year, an NCBWA Player of the Year, six All-American selections, seven First Team All-GSC selections, five second team All-GSC selections, two College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-Americans, five CSC Academic All-District Honorees, three GSC All-Academic Team selections, and 50 Honor Roll recipients.

"Montgomery is where it all started for me," said Bush. "To come back home and serve as the head baseball coach [for Auburn University at Montgomery] is an absolute dream for me and my family. We are grateful to Chancellor Carl Stockton, Erik Maas, and the search committee for this opportunity. We look forward to working each and every day to build on the success of this baseball program and athletics department."

The baseball program found success both on and off the field, particularly in the classroom, as the program maintained a 3.0 cumulative GPA in each semester of his tenure at Montevallo. Bush served on a coaching staff that led the Falcons to a pair of NCAA South Region tournaments (2018 & 2023) and a pair of nationally ranked recruiting classes. The Falcons' 2019 recruiting class was ranked fourth nationally, and the squad's 2023 recruiting class was ranked 18th nationally. The program also produced a 19th-round pick in the MLB Draft in 2019, the second-highest draft pick in program history.

He also has held three different summer ball coaching positions in his career. Bush began as an assistant coach for the Wellsville Nitros in the New York Collegiate Baseball League in 2016 before taking the head coach position for the Newark Pilots of the Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League in 2017.
