

WARHAWKS SECURE SEVENTH SERIES WIN IN GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE PLAY:

The Auburn University at Montgomery baseball team used a walk-off win in game one and a five-RBI effort from Ashton Thomas in game two of the doubleheader to sweep the University of West Florida on Senior Day at Q.V. Lowe Field. Senior pitcher Michael Myers, the Warhawk of the Week, secured the win in both games on the mound. The sweep marks the second consecutive weekend that AUM has swept the doubleheader to win the series. It also helped AUM clinch its eighth Gulf South Conference series victory in nine tries.

WARHAWKS GETTING RECOGNITION IN THE POLLS:

The Warhawks made the school's second ranked appearance in the latest American Baseball Coaches Association Poll (ABCA) in the NCAA Division II era, as they garnered a No. 21 ranking this week. This marks the fourth consecutive week AUM has been featured in the poll. AUM is also receiving votes in the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association national poll for the second straight week. The Warhawks, with seven wins over teams ranked or receiving votes this season, are again the fourth-ranked team in the NCBWA's South Region poll as well, which is also a top mark for the program.

MIDWEEK MORSELS:

The 21st-ranked Auburn University at Montgomery baseball team gave up seven runs in the first inning and a comeback attempt fell just short on Tuesday afternoon at Q.V. Lowe Field in the team's regular-season home finale. After getting down 8-0 after two innings, AUM scored five runs in the third, one in the fourth, and one in the seventh inning to make it a one-run game. Albany State, however, found some insurance with a late home run and held on for the midweek win. Jackson Ceman's fourth-inning solo home run was his third career home run and was his 200th career hit. Ceman ranks seventh in program history in that category. RH Frankland, Kasey Clark, and Ceman, also all reached base for the 19th straight game, the longest streak of the vear for the Warhawks.

SCOUTING THE FALCONS:

Connor Crowson leads the offensive charge for the Falcons with a .355 batting average and ranks first on the team in hits (60), home runs (8), walks (30), and total bases (91). Logan Harbin has added a .353/.560/.462 slash line with 10 doubles, seven home runs, and a team-best 39 RBIs. Montevallo is hitting .292 as a squad with 6.9 runs per game to go along with a 5.53 team ERA.

NEWS & NOTES:

BUSH SNAGS FIRST COLLEGIATE VICTORY:

Behind a two-run home run from Tyrese Rooks and a 3-for-5 effort from Brendan York, the AUM baseball team defeated Saint Leo University 13-3 in the finale of a three-game series to wrap up the opening weekend of the 2024 season. The win marked the first victory as a collegiate head coach for AUM skipper Franklin Bush. Bush was selected to lead the Warhawks after spending the past six seasons at the University of Montevallo, most recently as Associate Head Coach and Recruiting Coordinator.

WALK-OFF WARHAWKS:

AUM has already posted a pair of walk-off wins in the 2024 campaign. A Cooper Doughman RBI single combined with an Embry-Riddle throwing error helped the Warhawks to a 7-6 win in game two of the three-game series. AUM then delivered a 14-13 walk-off win over Georgia Southwestern. Tied at 13-13, Frankland worked a one-out walk and Nick Freeman pinch-ran for him to start the AUM ninth. Doughman followed with an infield single, and Freeman advanced to third on a GSW throwing error. JC Tunnell reached first on a bunt single to load the bases, and Hayden Grier beat out a fielder's choice ground ball to break up a double play and seal the Warhawk win.

ROOKS SETTING THE TABLE:

Junior outfielder Tyrese Rooks is off to a solid start in his first season donning the black and orange. Rooks, a Mobile, Ala. native, has posted a team-high 55 hits and is second with 41 runs scored. Rooks is getting on base 43 percent of the time for the Warhawks (.436) and has 18 multi-hit games. Rooks is hitting .348, good for second on the squad, with 10 doubles, a triple, three home runs, and 31 RBIs with 18 walks.

MULTI-HIT & MULTI-RBI WARHAWKS:

Making his presence felt early at the top of the AUM lineup, Tyrese Rooks has 18 multi-hit games thus far this year, including six three-hit games. Zach Dew has posted 16 multi-hit games, while Jackson Ceman has 14. Clark and Doughman each have 10. Jarren Wright has nine multi-hit efforts, while York and Frankland join him at nine. Clark leads the charge with 10 multi-RBI games, while Rooks and Dew have eight each. Frankland, Doughman, and Ceman are third on the team with seven multi-RBI contests.

LEAVING THE YARD:

10 different Warhawks have hit a home run this season.
Clark, Dew, Doughman, Frankland, Rooks, Wright, York, Purvis,
Grier, and Del Sol have all hit round-trippers, totaling 33 for
the team. Clark has a team-high eight homers, while Dew and
Doughman are tied for second with seven. 19 of the dingers
have driven in multiple runs for AUM, with the rest solo shots.

OURRENT STREAKS:

Kasey Clark has a team-best eight-game hitting streak, while Jackson Ceman owns the team's second-longest hitting streak at five games. RH Frankland, Ceman, and Clark have all reached base in 15 straight games, best on the team, while Cooper Doughman is riding a 10-game on-base streak. Jarren Wright has also found a way on base in four straight contests.

SEC STATISTICAL RANKS:

Rooks ranks ninth in the GSC in hits (51), and is tied for 10th in runs scored (40). He is second in the league in at-bats (148). Jackson Ceman is eighth in on base percentage (.510) and Kasey Clark ranks in a tie for sixth in runs scored (43). Zach Dew is currently tied for fourth in doubles (13), while Ceman is tied for third with 14 HBPs. Kasey Clark (tied for fifth) and Jackson Ceman (tied for sixth) also appear in the league's top 10 in walks. Defensively. Clark ranks fifth in the league in putouts (265). On the hill, Ryan Slaten is ranked eighth in the GSC in ERA among qualified pitchers (3.65). Clay Slagle's five wins rank in a tie for fourth, and he is fifth in the league in batters struck out looking (16), Luke Turner (15) and Slaten (14) are also Top 10 in that category. Lucas Baggett and Grant Hickman's three saves each rank in the Top 10, while Turner owns the top mark in the league with just six walks allowed. Slagle is third having only walked seven hitters.

TEAM LEADERS:

Offensively, Jackson Ceman leads AUM's qualified hitters at a .357 batting average. Rooks leads the team in hits (51), Clark leads the squad in runs scored (43), Dew paces the team in doubles (13), and Clark and Doughman are tied for the top mark on the team with seven home runs. Clark's 37 RBIs and 31 walks lead the way, and Ceman has 14 HBPs. Doughman is slugging .563 and has a 1.030 OPS, while Ceman leads the team with a .510 on-base percentage. Luke Turner has logged a team-high 50.1 innings, while Slagle has five wins. Turner also has 49 strikeouts against just six walks on the season. Slaten and Turner also each have a complete game, while Baggett and Hickman have three saves each.

THREE NAMED TO GSC NEWCOMER WATCHLIST:

Tyrese Rooks, Ryan Slaten, and Brendan York were each named to the Gulf South Conference's Newcomer Watchlist ahead of the 2024 season. Rooks starred in the outfield at Bishop State Community College. he was an All-Conference selection in 2022 and posted a .362 batting average in 2023 with 13 doubles, one home run, and 21 runs batted in.

Slaten, a 6-foot-5 pitcher, played two seasons at Central Alabama Community College. He posted a 10-4 career record with five complete games in 20 starts. He logged 110 career innings and struck out 110 with a career 3.85 ERA. York appeared in 102 games across three seasons at Chattahoochee Valley Community College. York hit .289 in 44 games in 2023 at shortstop, and also hit .300 across 19 games in his debut collegiate season in 2021.

OULF SOUTH CONFERENCE PRESEASON POLL:

A season removed from going 19-31 with an 11-19 record in conference play to finish 10th, AUM was picked to finish 11th in this year's preseason coaches poll. The University of West Florida was picked to finish in the poll position, while Valdosta State University was picked to finish second.

Lee University (third), the University of Montevallo (fourth), and the University of Alabama in Huntsville (fifth) rounded out the top five preseason poll vote-getters.

FRANKLIN BUSH OUICK BIO:

Director of Athletics Erik Maas announced the hiring of Franklin Bush as the head baseball coach at Auburn University at Montgomery on Wednesday, June 28th, 2023. Bush becomes just the third head coach in the baseball program's 37-year history, building on the foundation laid by Q.V. Lowe, who won more than 1,000 games from 1987 to 2014, and Marty Lovrich, who coached the Warhawks to 235 wins from 2015 to 2023.

"We are excited to welcome Franklin Bush as the new head coach of the Warhawk baseball program," said Maas. "AUM Baseball has great tradition and Franklin fits what we were looking for as someone who can develop a championship-level program on and off the field, while honoring that tradition. We are happy to bring Franklin and his family back home to Montgomery to lead this storied program," Maas exclaimed.

Bush comes to the capital city after spending the past six seasons at fellow GSC institution the University of Montevallo, most recently as Associate Head Coach and Recruiting Coordinator. The 2022 Alabama Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year, Bush helped lead Montevallo to second and third place finishes in the GSC the past two years (with a 75-31 overall record in that span), including an NCAA South Region tournament in 2023.

Bush was heavily involved in all aspects of the program for the Falcons, including on-field coaching, academic management, community involvement initiatives, and facility maintenance. Under his tutelage, the program produced two GSC Players of the Year, an NCBWA Player of the Year, six All-American selections, seven First Team All-GSC selections, five second team All-GSC selections, two College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-Americans, five CSC Academic All-District Honorees, three GSC All-Academic Team selections, and 50 Honor Roll recipients.

"Montgomery is where it all started for me," said Bush. "To come back home and serve as the head baseball coach [for Auburn University at Montgomery] is an absolute dream for me and my family. We are grateful to Chancellor Carl Stockton, Erik Maas, and the search committee for this opportunity. We look forward to working each and every day to build on the success of this baseball program and athletics department."

The baseball program found success both on and off the field, particularly in the classroom, as the program maintained a 3.0 cumulative GPA in each semester of his tenure at Montevallo. Bush served on a coaching staff that led the Falcons to a pair of NCAA South Region tournaments (2018 & 2023) and a pair of nationally ranked recruiting classes. The Falcons' 2019 recruiting class was ranked fourth nationally, and the squad's 2023 recruiting class was ranked 18th nationally. The program also produced a 19th-round pick in the MLB Draft in 2019, the second-highest draft pick in program history.

He also has held three different summer ball coaching positions in his career. Bush began as an assistant coach for the Wellsville Nitros in the New York Collegiate Baseball League in 2016 before taking the head coach position for the Newark Pilots of the Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League in 2017. Bush then served as head coach of the Madisonville Miners of the Ohio Valley League in Madisonville, Kentucky.

Bush holds a master's degree in Adult Education from Auburn University and a bachelor's degree in Sports Management from Blackburn College in Carlinville, Illinois.
