NETWORKS

- Today's game marks the 13th of 15 consecutive games away from home (with four on neutral sites in tournament play) to start the season for Alabama State, including a pair of conference games in January. The first time Alabama State will hit the floor at the Dunn-Oliver Acadome will be January $11\,$ against Mississippi Valley State.
- Alabama State head coach Lewis Jackson entered the season with 199 career wins, and picked up win 200 on the road in the Emerald Coast Classic against Chicago State (November 30). The win gives he and his wife (Freda Freeman-Jackson) over 500 wins combined at Alabama State
- Tobi Ewuosho was named the SWAC Player of the Week for his performance against Houston earlier this week. The senior scored a career-high 23 points against the Cougars, besting his previous mark of 18 against Grambling State last year.
- Ewuosho has scored in double figures in all but two games this season, and was named All-Tournment after scoring a combined 23 points in two games at the Emerald Coast Classic in Niceville.
- Ewuosho recorded a career-high 25 points in a loss to Austin Peay (12.22.19), besting his previous mark of 23 at Houston.
- Brandon Battle came off the bench for his best game in an Alabama State uniform against Chicago State (November 30). He finished the day with a career-high 14 points, grabbed three rebounds, blocked a career-high three shots and added a pair
- The Hornets have been shorthanded throughout the first 12 games this season, missing a pair of key contributors and another of pair of players playing while getting to 100 percent. Three players - Jeremy Hamilton, AJ Farrar and Tyrese Robinson remain questionable as the Hornets into the week.
- Today's game marks the second this season against a team ranked inside the top 10 on the road as the Hornets opened the year at then-8th ranked Gonzaga (number one this week).

5,570 CAREER POINTS SITTING ON BENCH IN COAT AND TIE

- Not only do the Hornets have a pair of Hall of Famers on the bench in coat and tie, but they also have three former student-athletes who scored over 1,000 career points in the Black and Gold.
- Steve Rogers, an assistant coach with the Hornets, is 25th all-time in NCAA Division I basketball history in total points since 1985.
- Rogers scored 2,534 points from 1998 until 1992 for

- Alabama State, since being passed by being passed by 16 players. When Roger finished his playing career, he was ninth on the list.
- Director of Player of Development, Tyrone Levett, is also on the list of former players who scored over 1,000 career points for the Hornets. He scored a total of 1,558 points for the Hornets, while playing for current head coach Lewis Jackson.
- Speaking of Jackson, he scored 1,478 points in just 56 games for Alabama State - two years of action for the Hornets.
- Between the three, they scored a total of 5,570 total points for the Hornets.

HORNETS SCHEDULE LOADED WITH TALENT FOR 2019-20 SEASON

- The Hornets will face eight teams in non-conference play with 20-plus wins last season, including three with 30plus on the season. The schedule also features trips to four teams who made it to the Sweet 16 or further last season in the NCAA Tournament, while also playing an in-state foe at a neutral site out of conference.
- Alabama State begins the season with one of two teams who climbed to the top of the polls last season in Gonzaga. The Hornets will travel to Spokane (Wash.) to face the Zags coming off an Elite 8 appearance and a 33-4 record in 2018-19 on November 5, before a road trip that has the Hornets at Missouri State on November 10 and Houston (33-4 last season) a Sweet 16 team from a season ago on November 12.
- Following the opening three games, Alabama State faces their second team who climbed to the top of the rankings last season in Tennessee. The Vols finished 31-6 last season and made it to the Sweet 16 and will face Alabama State in Knoxville on November 20. The Hornets close

In order to have time to arrange for player interviews, please provide 48 hours notice to the Athletic Strategic Communications Office. Player interviews may be conducted in the Dunn-Oliver Acadome or in the Athletic Strategic Communications Office. The Alabama State training rooms, locker rooms, weight room and meeting room areas are off-limits to the media. Your cooperation is appreciated.

For telephone interviews, the student-athlete will be provided with the number and will make the call at a mutually-agreed upon time. Phone numbers of student-athletes will NOT be made available to the media. For interviews with head men's basketball coach Lewis Jackson or head women's basketball coach Freda Freeman-Jackson, and/or Alabama State assistant coaches, please contact Travis Jarome in the Athletic Strategic Communications Office.

Practice Coverage

In general, Alabama State practices, held at the Dunn-Oliver Acadome or Lockhart Gymnasium, are closed to the local media.

Credential Requests

All requests for media, radio, television, photography and scouting for the 2017-18 Alabama State Basketball season, or for any individual game, should be made IN WRITING, on company letterhead or via e-mail, (company name in address), to Travis Jarome. Press Row Services

A media workroom is located on the concourse level of Dunn-Oliver Acadome. Game notes, rosters, programs and other information will be available in this room prior to games. Half-time and post-game statistics will be delivered to press row as soon as possible. Complete post-game box scores will be available approximately 20 minutes after the game.

Visiting Radio/Television Broadcasts

Visiting radio stations will have phone lines (including one data line) available at courtside opposite the team benches. Space will be allocated along press row for television broadcasts. Visiting SIDs will designate their official radio stations and Alabama State will supply phone lines on a reciprocal basis for that station. Entities which wish to broadcast Alabama State home contests should send their request, in writing, to Travis Jarome.

- out the month of November with a road trip to VCU (25-8) a tournament team from last season and the Emerald Coast Classic (November 29-30) in Niceville (Fla.) where they will face Chattanooga in the opening game.
- The month of December starts with a road game at South Dakota (13-17 a season ago) on December 9, before facing another tournament team from a season ago in Kansas State (25-9) on December 11. They continue their road swing out west with a contest against a familiar foe in Boise State (13-20), before heading to Florida for the St. Pete Classic December 21 and 22.
- During the Florida swing, Alabama State will face a pair
 of familiar foes beginning with in-state foe UAB December
 21. The Hornets and Blazers tip off at 4 pm in the first
 game of the tournament, before Alabama State faces
 Austin Peay on December 22. The final non-conference
 contest has Alabama State facing Oregon on the road
 December 29, with the Ducks favored to win the Pac-12
 after a 25-13 record last season and a Sweet 16
 appearance.
- The Hornets open conference play on January 4 against Jackson State on the road, playing nine contests in Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) play on the road. They will play their first home game on January 11 against Mississippi Valley State at the Dunn-Oliver Acadome

ROSS NAMED PRESEASON SECOND TEAM ALL-SWAC EARLIER THIS FALL

- Alabama State junior Jacoby Ross earned preseason honors on a vote of the league's head coaches and sports information directors earlier this summer.
- Ross, who was named Second Team Preseason All-SWAC, played in 31 games with 26 starts as a sophomore, and finished second on the team in scoring last season averaging 12.6 points per game.
- He also dished out 2.3 assists per game, while averaging 31.6 minutes per game. He finished the season shooting 34.0 (126-of-371) percent from the floor, and 33.3 (68-of-204) percent from beyond the arc. Ross also shot a team-high 83.5 (71-of-85) percent from the free throw line.
- The junior grabbed a total of 83 rebounds, averaging 2.7 rebounds per game and recorded 27 steals last season. He also scored in double figures 19 times, including 20-plus points five different times.

HORNETS PICKED TO FINISH FOURTH IN THE SWAC IN PRESEASON POLL

- The Hornets were picked fourth in the preseason poll with 140 votes, just behind Grambling State in third with 146 points.
- Texas Southern was picked second (156) and defending champion Prairie View A&M was picked to repeat with 161 total votes.

FATHER AND SON DUO STILL ON BENCH AND IN UNIFORM FOR THE HORNETS

- Although one Rogers' sibling graduated two years ago, one remains in uniform this season. Redshirt junior Austin Rogers has two years of eligibility remaining for the Hornets.
- He joins his father, Steve on the roster this year for the Hornets as he remains on the bench as an assistant coach.

DROPPING DIMES

- Kevin Holston picked up where he left off the 2018-19 season against (7/8) Gonzaga in the season opener.
 The DC-native dished out seven assists in the opener against the nationally-ranked Zags.
- He ended the 2018-19 season with six assists against Texas Southern in the conference tourney.

BIG MEN STEP UP AGAINST TALLER ZAGS

- Although there was foul trouble early on for the post players of Alabama State, they all responded.
- Brandon Battle, Mike Stone and Tyrese Robinson all 6-7 or taller - got into foul trouble early, with Stone fouling out in the second half.
- However, they responded by combining for 21 points against the taller lineup of Gonzaga.

ROSS HITS FROM DEEP AGAINST GONZAGA

- Jacoby Ross produced one of his better shooting nights of his career in the season opener.
- After having a quiet first half of the first half, Ross caught fire and connected on 4-of-6 from beyond the arc on the night.
- Ironically all of his three-pointers came from the left wing.

CLOSE IN THE SECOND HALF

- After trailing by just one, Alabama State gave up a 13-0 run to the Zags in the first half and trailed by 12 at the break.
- After a pair of three-pointers from Jacoby Ross, the Hornets found themselves down just nine to the nationally-ranked Zags before Gonzaga was able to pull away.

EWUOSHO EARNS SWAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK IN NOVEMBER FOR HIS PERFORMANCE AT HOUSTON

- Tobi Ewuosho scored a new career high 23 points in the Hornets non-conference outing at Houston to earn Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) Player of the Week honors back on November 21.
- He finished the night shooting 54.5 (6-of-11) from the field while also recording a pair of steals and an assist versus the Cougars.

BIG WEEKEND FOR EWUOSHO IN FLORIDA AGAINST UAB AND AUSTIN PEAY

- Ewuosho had another big weekend for the Hornets as they dropped a pair of games at the St. Pete Shootout against UAB and Austin Peav.
- The senior dropped 25 points against Austin Peay to set a new career-high in the final game of the tournament. He connected on nine field goals and hit on all four of his three-point opportunities.
- Over the weekend, he averaged 21 points per game in the two contests.

WAITING ON THE WINGS

- While Ewosho is leading the team in scoring, the Hornets are awaiting the wings to start shooting the basketball at higher percentages as they enter conference play next month.
- The senior is shooting 50.4 (59-of-117) from the floor and is also hitting 45.8 (11-of-24) percent from beyond the arc.
- Meanwhile the wing players Leon Daniels (32.0), Jacoby Ross (22.9), Kevion Stewart (23.4) and Jeremy Hamilton (22.2) have all struggled from outside in the first 12 games of the season.

MARKS SURPASSING SEASON MARKS JUST 12 GAMES IN

- Ewuosho has already connected on 11 three-pointers this season, eclipsing his season best in three years for the Hornets.
- · His previous season-high was nine.

MISSING IN ACTION

- Several Hornets have missed action this season just 12 games into the season.
- Over the last two games, the Hornets had three players in street clothes on the bench including post players Tyrese Robinson and AJ Farrar, with Robinson playing in only three games this season.
- Jeremy Hamilton has missed the last two games as well for the Hornets.
- Meanwhile, Decardo Day missed the first 10 games of the season before making his debut in the St. Pete Shootout against UAB.

ANOTHER RANKED TEAM ON THE SCHEDULE FOR THE HORNETS THIS WEEKEND

 Alabama State will play yet another ranked team this weekend when they hit the floor in Eugene. The Hornets will not only be facing a ranked team, but facing their second team ranked in the top 10 after facing Gongaza earlier this season.

SECOND TRIP OUT WEST THIS SEASON FOR THE HORNETS, SECOND IN DECEMBER

- This weekend marks the second trip out West for the Hornets this season, and in the month of December.
- They traveled out West to face Boise State after a pair of games in the midwest against South Dakota State and Kansas State.

NO STRANGER TO EUGENE FOR THE HORNETS

- Alabama State is no stranger to Eugene as they made the trip out West two years ago to face the Ducks.
- In that contest, the Hornets fell 114-56 to close out the month of November.
- From that time, only three players remain who made the trip Ross, Ewuosho and Austin Rogers.

LAST TIME OUT vs. OREGON (11.18.17)

- Kenny Wooten led six Ducks in double figures as Oregon defeated Alabama State 114-56 at Pete Matthews Arena in non-conference action.
- Wooten led all scorers with 19 points and grabbed 13 rebounds for Oregon (3-0), while Victor Bailey, Jr. added 18 points and three steals. Elijah Brown chipped in 15 points and six assists, while Payton Pritchard added 13 points and seven assists. Troy Brown and Abu Kigab each added 13.
- Reginald Gee was the only player figures for Alabama State (0-4), finishing the night with 15 points. Jacoby Ross added eight points and six assists off the bench for the Hornets, who finished the night 34.5 (20-of-58) percent from the floor and 36.8 (7-of-19) percent from beyond the arc.
- The Hornets also shot 69.2 (9-of-13) percent from the free throw line, while forcing 15 turnovers.
- Meanwhile, Oregon finished 62.5 (40-of-64) percent from the floor and 62.5 (15-of-24) percent from beyond the arc. They also shot 76 (19-of-25) percent from the free throw line, while winning the rebounding battle 46-20.

HEAD COACH, LEWIS JACKSON



Lewis Jackson, one of the all-time greats in school history, will be returning for his 15th year as head basketball coach at Alabama State University.

Jackson was a legend as a player at ASU. The Wetumpka, Ala., native became his alma mater's head coach in June 2005, catapulting the former player and assistant coach to the top of the program he helped build into a Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) powerhouse.

Jackson had served as an assistant

as ASU since the 2000-01 season and has been an integral part of the program's success. ASU has won two SWAC Tournament Championships (2009, 2011) and earned NCAA Tournament berths with those championships. He also led the Hornets to regular season conference titles in 2008 and again a year later in 2009. Last season he led the Hornets to a program first appearance in the CollegeInsider's Tournament.

The 2014-15 season saw the Hornets near the top of the SWAC the entire season finishing the season with a 19-10 overall record and a second-place conference finish with a 14-4 record.

Following the season Jamel Waters and Maurice Strong were named All-SWAC while Steve Rogers was named the SWAC Freshman of the Year.

Jackson led the team to a turnaround during the 2013-14 season, finishing the year with a 19-13 record, including a tie for second place in the SWAC with a 12-6 record. Jamel Waters and Bobby Brown were named to the All-SWAC team following the season.

The Hornets season saw them advance to the semifinals of the conference tournament and earning a first-ever invitation to the College-Insider.com Tournament (CIT) where they faced Sam Houston State in the opening round.

The 2012-13 turned out to be one of the most challenging seasons' since Jackson took over the program. The team consisted of 10 new players and the scheduled included the likes of Middle Tennessee, Florida, Central Florida and Detroit, all 20-win programs and post-season tournament participants.

ASU rebounded once Southwestern Athletic Conference play started and finished the season tied for fifth at 8-10. Of the 10 losses, seven were by 10 points or less.

In 2011-12 Jackson led ASU to a 12-19 overall season, playing what may have been the toughest schedule in the history of the program. Of the team's 19 losses, 10 of those were by seven points or less and that included four losses by three points or less.

Jackson led the Hornets during a four-year run from the 2007-08 season through the 2010-11 season which saw ASU win two SWAC Regular Season championships, two SWAC Tournament titles, make appearances in two NCAA Tournaments and an NIT appearance.

The 2010-11 year was two seasons in one as ASU season struggled the first half of the season and then picked up steam in the second winning 11 of their final 12 regular season games which culminated in a SWAC Tournament Championship and another trip to the NCAA Tournament.

The 2009-10 season marked the third consecutive year that ASU finished with a winning record. The Hornets made it to the semi-final

round of the SWAC tournament. The team included a pair of First Team All-SWAC players - Menji Mundadi and Tremayne Moorer.

In 2008-09, Jackson guided the Hornets to a 22-10 mark and a 16-2 conference record en route to a second consecutive SWAC regular season crown. In addition, ASU captured the SWAC Tournament title earning the conference's automatic NCAA Tournament berth.

In 2007-08, Jackson led Alabama State to the SWAC regular season championship with a 15-3 record, finishing the season 20-11 overall with an appearance in the NIT. The Hornets never lost back-to-back SWAC games that season and outscored their league opponents by more than 11 points per game.

Jackson began learning his up-tempo, full-court style as a graduate assistant at ASU under the late James Oliver Sr. Over the next five years, he served as a basketball instructor. In 1998, he coached The Challenge—an Amateur Athletic Union team that featured some of the top high school talent in the country, including stars Alvin Pettway and Tyrone Levett.

As strong as his coaching resume has been, Jackson's credentials as a player are equally as impressive. While playing for Wetumpka High, Jackson led his team to back-to-back state championships and was twice chosen as Most Valuable Player of the state tournament.

Jackson then selected ASU to continue his basketball career, becoming one of the best players in school history. After breaking into the starting lineup four games into his freshman season, he went on to score 2,203 points-ranking fourth on ASU's all-time scoring list.

After his senior season in 1984, Jackson was named SWAC Player of the Year, Black College Basketball Player of the Year and a Black College All-American. He was drafted by the Golden State Warriors in the third round and received an invitation to try out for the United States Olympic basketball team. He would ultimately play professionally in Australia, Canada and the Philippines before retiring in 1990.

In 1999, Jackson was inducted into the SWAC Hall of Fame. A year later, he was selected for inclusion in the Alabama State University Hall of Fame. His number, 33, is retired by ASU and hangs in the Dunn-Oliver Acadome. Wetumpka High School retired both numbers Jackson donned. 34 and 35.

Jackson is married to ASU's head women's basketball coach, Freda Freeman-Jackson. They have two children: Antron and Bianca.

Jacoby Ross paced three players in double figures for Alabama State, but it wasn't enough for the Hornets as they fell 95-64 to No. 7/8 Gonzaga in the season opener Tuesday night in front of 6,000 at the McCarthey Athletic Center.

Ross led Alabama State (0-1) with 16 points, finishing the night 6-of-7 from the floor and 4-of-5 from beyond the arc. He was joined in double figures by Brandon Battle with 10 points, and Tobi Ewuosho added 10 points and five rebounds off the bench for the Hornets.

However, Gonzaga (0-1) countered with five players in double figures led by Corey Kispert with a game-high 28 points on 10-of-13 shooting from the floor, and 5-of-6 shooting from beyond the arc. He also added three assists and a pair of steals in the Zags win. He was joined in double figures by Filip Petrusev with 15 points and six rebounds, while Admon Gilder added 12.

Ryan Woolridge and Drew Timme each added 11 for Gonzaga.

Alabama State ended the night shooting 49.0 (24-of-49) percent from the floor and 56.3 (9-of-16) percent from beyond the arc. They also shot just 58.3 (7-of-12) percent from the free throw line, while grabbing 25 rebounds. Meanwhile, the Bulldogs shot 57.6 (34-of-56) percent from the floor and 50.0 (10-of-20) percent from beyond the arc. They also shot 63.0 (17-of-27) percent from the free throw line.

Alabama State fell behind late in the first half and could not get any closer than six points in the second half, falling to Missouri State 59-50 at JQH Arena Sunday afternoon.

Kevin Holston was the lone player in double figures for Alabama State (0-1) as he finished with 11 points, going 4-for-7 from the floor. Meanwhile Tobi Ewuosho and Kevion Stewart each finished with nine points in the loss, while Brandon Battle added eight points and six rebounds.

The Hornets shot just 32.1 (17-of-53) percent from the floor and 25.0 (5-for-20) percent from beyond the arc, while they also shot 73.3 (11-of-15) percent from the free throw line. They forced Missouri State (1-1) into 20 turnovers and outscored the Bears 23-8 off the bench.

The two teams traded the lead for most of the first half, including when Alabama State used a three-pointer from Stewart with 7:26 to play in the half to tie the game at 14-14. The Hornets took the lead pushed it to 17-14 when Battle converted a three-point play with 6:05 to play in the half. However, Missouri State used a 15-5 run to close out the first half to take a 29-22 lead.

After the Bears were able to push the lead to 11 early in the second half, Alabama State answered to cut it to six at 34-28 with 14:30 to play on a three-point play by Ewuosho. However, that was as close as the Hornets could get in the second half, as each time they got to within six the Bears had an answer.


Ewuosho poured in a career-high 23 points, the only play in double figures for Alabama State (0-1) on the night. The senior bested his career-high of 18 points he set against Grambling State last season and did so with 10 of his 23 from the free throw line – finishing the night 10-of-13 from the stripe. He also finished the finished the night 6-of-11 from the floor and grabbed six rebounds.

DJ Heath and Kevin Holston each dished out three assists, while Ewosho added a pair of steals for the Hornets in the loss.

Alabama State shot 34.7 (17-of-49) percent from the floor and 33.3 (7-of-21) percent from beyond the arc. They also shot 65.2 (15-of-23) percent from the free throw line and turned the ball over just 13 times in the loss and forced Houston into 13 of their own.

Meanwhile, Marcus Sasser led four Houston (1-0) players in double figures with 14 off the bench as he connected on four three-pointers for the Cougars. Quentin Grimes added 13 for the Cougars and grabbed five rebounds; while DeJon Jarreau added 11 points and four assists.

Fabian White, Jr. added 10 points and six rebounds for Houston, who ended the night with 45 total rebounds.


Ewuosho led Alabama State (0-4) with 17 points, connecting on 4-of-9 shooting from the floor that included a pair of three-pointers. He also connected on 7-of-8 from the free throw line, while grabbing five rebounds in the

Tobi Ewuosho led three players in double figures for Alabama State as the Hornets jumped on top of No. 19/21 VCU early Monday, before the Rams were able to pull away for a 78-62 victory at the Stuart C. Siegel Center.

Ewuosho scored nine of his team-high 17 points in the first nine minutes of the game to help Alabama State (0-5) grab a 21-20 lead with 8:34 remaining in the opening half. The Hornets took a five-point lead early in the contest at 12-7 on a Leon Daniels three-pointer with 16:12 to play in the half, before VCU (6-0) stormed back to take a 20-16 lead with 11:13 to play in the half.

The Hornets went on a 5-0 run to grab the one-point lead with under nine minutes to play in the half, before VCU outscored the visitors 26-7 over the final 8:34 to take a 46-28 lead. Alabama State had a chance in the second half to pull within single digits before another Rams' run put the game away.

Ewuosho finished the night 6-of-9 from the floor and hit all four of his free throws. He also grabbed six rebounds, dished out a pair of assists and blocked a pair of shots. Meanwhile, Kevion Stewart added a career-high 14 points, including a pair of three-pointers; while Daniels added 11 points and seven rebounds in the loss.

Alabama State shot 38.2 (21-of-55) percent from the floor and 36.4 (8-of-22) percent from beyond the arc, while also hitting 70.6 (12-of-17) percent from the free throw line. The Hornets also dished out 12 assists.

An early first half run by Chattanooga proved to be too much for Alabama State to overcome as the Hornets fell 74-56 in the opening game of the Emerald Coast Classic for both teams Friday afternoon.

After an Austin Rogers' three-pointer tied the game at 5-all with 16:33 remaining in the opening half, Chattanooga (4-3) used a 13-0 run to pull away over the next three minutes to take an 18-5 lead with 13:21 remaining in the half. The Mocs were able to put another run together near the end of the first half to take a 48-22 lead, before Alabama State was able to respond in the second half with a run of their own.

The Hornets trimmed the deficit to 19 at one point in the half after trailing by as many as 30. using pressure defense and fast break baskets. Kansas State missed just eight shots in the first half and pulled away early from Alabama State as the Hornets fell 86-41 at Bramlage Coliseum Wednesday night.

Alabama State (1-8) had no answer for Kansas State (6-3) in the first half as the Wildcats shot 71.4 (20-of-28) percent from the floor and 66.7 (10-of-15) percent from beyond the arc. pulling away for a 52-16 halftime lead. However, the Hornets were able to answer in the second half as they were outscored by just nine (34-25) in the final 20 minutes and held Kansas State to just 28.6 (2-of-7) percent from beyond the arc.

Tobi Ewuosho and Kevin Holston each scored nine points to lead Alabama State, with Ewuosho added nine rebounds and Holston four assists in the loss. The Hornets finished the night shooting 27.3 (15-of-56) percent from the floor and 28.6 (6-of-21) percent from beyond the arc, while also shooting 50.0 (5-of-10) percent from the free throw line.

Meanwhile. Xavier Sneed led all scorers as he poured in 20 to lead Kansas State on 8-of-10 shooting from the floor, Antonio Gordon and DaJuan Gordon each added 13 points, while Cartier Diarra dished out 10 assists for Kansas State who finished the night shooting 62.5 (35-of-56) percent from the floor. They also shot 54.5 (12-of-22) percent from beyond the arc and 66.7 (4-of-6) percent from the free throw line.

December 14, 2019 Boise, Idaho | ExtraMile Arena


Boise State used a pair of first half runs in which they held Alabama State to just one basket to pull away from the Hornets for a 100-57 victory at ExtraMile Arena Saturday night.

Leon Daniels led a pair of Hornets in double figures with 12 points on 5-of-7 shooting from the floor after being limited to just six minutes in the first half due to foul trouble. He was joined in double figures by Tobi Ewuosho who finished with 10 points and six rebounds, while DJ Heath scored six of his eight down the stretch for Alabama State in the loss.

The Hornets shot 35.9 (23-of-64) percent from the floor and just 17.9 (5-of-28) percent from beyond the arc, while also hitting on 85.7 (6-of-7) percent from the free throw line.

Meanwhile, Derrick Alston paced five Boise State (6-4) players in double figures with 31 points as he finished 11-of-12 from the floor and 6-of-7 from beyond the arc. He also added four rebounds and four assists for the Broncos. Justinian Jessup added 19 points with five three-pointers, while RJ Williams finished with a double-double (12 points and 16 rehounds).

Alex Hobbs added 11 and Max Rice 10 off the bench for Boise State who finished the night shooting 59.0 (36-of-61) percent from the floor. They also shot 51.7 (15-of-29) percent from beyond the arc and 76.5 (13-of-17) percent from the free throw line.

Trailing by as many as 12, Alabama State fought back in the second half with two chances to take the lead, but their second half rally fell short in a 71-63 loss to UAB at the Basketball Destination St. Pete Classic Saturday night.

Alabama State (1-10) trailed by as many as 12 in the first half before a furious rally early in the second half due to full court pressure and 60 percent shooting, tied the game at 40-all with 14:27 to play. However, a missed shot turned into a 7-1 run by the Blazers to give UAB a 47-41 lead with 12:08 remaining in the game.

The Hornets to draw within a point again at 53-52 with 8:31 to play in the half on a layup by Austin Rogers, but UAB answered with another run to push the lead to 10 with just over six minutes to play. However, Alabama State did not go away as they pulled to within five with just under two minutes to play but couldn't convert on a free throw and layup. Those two misses allowed UAB to put the game away.

Tobi Ewuosho led Alabama State with 17 points and six rebounds, while also dishing out three assists and recording a pair of steals. Four other players combined 33 points for Alabama State who finished the night shooting 40.7 (24-of-49) percent from the floor and 29.2 (7-of-24) percent from beyond the arc.

Despite their best offensive output of the season, Alabama State could not overcome the Austin Peay tandem of Terry Taylor and Jordyn Adams Sunday afternoon as they fell to the Governors 80-69 in the final game of the Basketball Destination St. Pete Shootout.

Taylor and Adams combined for 60 of Austin Peay's 80 points on the afternoon, with each scoring 30 in the win. Taylor finished the day 12-of-16 from the floor and 5-of-8 from the free throw line, while also grabbing seven rebounds; while Adams finished 9-of-14 from the floor and a perfect 10-of-10 from the free throw line.

Tobi Ewuosho poured in a career-high 25 points for Alabama State (1-11) as he finished 9-of-12 from the floor and a perfect 4-of-4 from beyond the arc. He also hit on 3-of-4 of his free throws for the Hornets, while Brandon Battle finished with nine points for Alabama State.

The Hornets and Austin Peay traded baskets for much of the first half and into the second half, before the Governors were able to use a 12-2 run to pull away from Alabama State. The Hornets held the lead for much of the first half, and finished the day shooting 45.3 (24-of-53) percent from the floor and 50.0 (9-of-18) percent from beyond the arc.

They also shot 75.0 (12-of-16) percent from the free throw line and forced 16 Austin Pay turnovers. Meanwhile, Austin Peay finished the day shooting 58.3 (28-of-48) percent from the floor.
