THE FACTS

- Alabama State was picked to win the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) championship with eight first-place votes.
- The Lady Hornets won the regular season and tournament championship last season - their third in five years - and are looking to become the third team to repeat, and the first since their accomplished the feat in 2016 and 2017.
- McKenna Wiscombe was named Preseason Second Team All-SWAC. Wiscombe tied for the team lead in scoring, and was second in the conference, with 17 total points. She finished the season with seven goals, including four game-winners.
- Alabama State must replace all-conference performers GK Madison Roop (SWAC Goalkeeper of of the Year), D Ashley Thomas (SWAC Defender of the Year), D Mercedes Padilla (2018 SWAC Defender of the Year), F Teaggan Ilela (two-time All-SWAC), and D McKenna Lupori (SWAC All-Tournament) among others.

THE SERIES

- Number of times that Jacksonville State and Alabama State have met in the series dating back to 2006.
- Series record with Jacksonville State dating back to 2006, with Alabama State dropping a 3-2 match in the last meeting (9/8/2019).

LADY HORNETS RELEASE 2021 SCHEDULE

Three months after finishing up an unprecedented spring season, the Alabama State University Department of Intercollegiate Athletics released the 2021 fall soccer schedule featuring seven home matches and a pair of matches against in-state competition.

Alabama State claimed, both, the regular season, and Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) championships last season along with the automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The title was the third in five seasons for the Lady Hornets and head coach Jodie Smith, and they look to become the first team to repeat as conference champions since the last time they accomplished the feat back in 2016 and 2017.

The Lady Hornets (9-3-1, 6-0-1 SWAC in the spring) will hit the home pitch nine times including an exhibtion match against Troy to get the 2021 campaign started.

WISCOMBE NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SWAC

Alabama State senior forward **McKenna Wiscombe** was named Second Team Preseason All-SWAC on a vote by the league's head coaches and sports information directors.

Wiscombe, a second team selection at the end of the spring season, finished the year with 17 total points which was tied for the team lead and second in the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC). She finished the year with a team-high seven goals, including four game-winning goals, and three assists.

The senior was named to the 2021 spring SWAC All-Tournament Team and was named the Tournament MVP after scoring four goals, including a pair against Jackson State in the semifinals to push the Lady Hornets into the championship game, and added a pair of assists.

LADY HORNETS PICKED TO WIN SWAC FOR SECOND CONSECUTIVE SEASON

Alabama State was picked to repeat as the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) champion in the preseason poll on a vote of the league's head coaches and sports information directors.

The Lady Hornets tallied a league-leading eight first place votes and 148 total points, ahead of Grambling State with a pair of first place votes and 138 total votes. Alabama A&M (118) and Jackson State

(114) round out the top four selections.

Prairie View A&M (106) was picked to finish fifth, followed by Southern (89), Texas Southern (76), Alcorn State (55), UAPB (50), and Mississippi Valley State (45).

Alabama State claimed the regular season championship last season and have won three of the last five postseason tournaments. They are looking to become the first repeat champion since they pulled off the feat in 2016-17.

LOTS OF FACES TO REPLACE / LOTS OF NEWCOMERS INVADE MONTGOMERY

Alabama State must replace sseveral all-conference performers GK Madison Roop (SWAC Goalkeeper of the Year), D Ashley Thomas (SWAC Defender of the Year), D Mercedes Padilla (2018 SWAC Defender of the Year), F Teaggan Ilela (two-time All-SWAC), and D McKenna Lupori (SWAC All-Tournament) among others.

Alabama State begins the year with 11 newcomers, including both goalkeepers.

FIRSTS ON THE ROAD AGAINST WINTHROP IN 2021 SEASON OPENER

Madison Chambers (Hobart, Tasmania, Australia) recorded her first career assist in the match, while Zelia Griffith (Livonia, Mich.) also picked up her first career assist on the second goal of the match.

Not to mention **Camila Jimenez** (Weston, Fla.) who scored her first career goal in the match to tie things up and force overtime.

BEORTEGUI CONTINUES STREAK INTO SEASON OPENER FOR SPRING 2021

Isabella Beortegui (Santa Ana, Calif.) added to her total of the year, although her first two goals do not count toward the season statistics. She scored a pair of goals in the exhibition contest against Troy.

FOUR NEWCOMERS GET THE NOD IN THE STARTING LINEUP AGAINST TROY IN EXHIBITION AND IN SEASON OPENER AGAINST WINTHROP

Alabama State started four newcomers in the exhibition contest against Troy and then again against Winthrop including MF Katherine Nedved (Chandler, Ariz.), MF Camila Jimenez (Weston, Fla.), D Madison Tyler (Maricopa, Ariz.), GK Sheila Sanchez (Castellon, Spain).

THE REMAINDER OF THE STARTERS IN SEASON OPENER ALL HAVE EXPERIENCE FROM THE SPRING SEASON

The Lady Hornets also started F Kassandra Schoen (St. Michael's, Minn.), F McKenna Wiscombe (Orem, Utah), F Isabella Beortegui (Santa Ana, Calif.), MF Grace Norbury (Melbourne, Australia), D Kristen Thomas (Watkinsville, Ga.), D Kayleigh O'Neal (San Diego, Calif.), and D Paige Patton (Kent, Wash.).

THE FACE OF ALABAMA STATE WOMEN'S SOCCER

Jodie Smith enters his 16th season on the sidelines in the fall of 2021 and has positioned the Lady Hornets soccer program as one of the top teams in the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC).

Smith's success on the field at ASU is evident as he had produced 48 All-Conference players, five SWAC Offensive Players of the Year, two SWAC Freshmen of the Year, a pair of SWAC Goalkeepers of the Year and a pair SWAC Defensive Player of the Year. In addition, he has produced 16 SWAC All-Tournament team selections and three SWAC All-Tournament MVP winners.

Equally as impressive is the success of his players off the field in the classroom. Among the players under his tutelage were 2014 College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Senior CLASS Award National Finalist Kylee Hathaway and 2013 CoSIDA/GTE Academic All-District Selection and National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Scholar All-Region India Pleasant.

Over the course of eight seasons, Alabama State has placed 45 players on the SWAC All-Academic Teams and earned the United Soccer Coaches Team Academic Award in seven of those seasons. This past year, they posted 18 in just one season on the SWAC All-Academic Team.

This past season, Smith led Alabama State through an unprecedented COVID-19 spring season in which the team won their third conference title in five years with an undefeated run through the conference regular season and tournament. The Lady Hornets pitched three shutouts during conference play on their way to the NCAA Tournament against nationally-ranked Penn State. In the fall of 2019, the Lady Hornets qualified for the SWAC Tournament, before being ousted in the opening round. During the 2018 season, Alabama State had their string of back-to-back championships snapped by Grambling State in a 1-0 match in the championship. That loss was the eighth match on the season decided by just one goal.

The Lady Hornets won their second consecutive conference championship when they won the final two games of the tournament on penalty kicks, including a scoreless draw (4-3 PKs) against Grambling State in the championship match. They were able to finish the season with 11 wins, including a seven-match unbeaten streak down the stretch to claim the championship. They advanced to the NCAA Tournament where they fell to South Carolina in the opening round.

In the 2016 season, Smith led Alabama State to a historic season as the Lady Hornets went 11-10-1 overall and 7-2-1 in SWAC play. ASU defeated Jackson State and Texas Southern in the SWAC Tournament before edging Arkansas-Pine Bluff to win the school's first-ever SWAC Tournament title. With the SWAC championship, Alabama State earned the automatic qualifier for the NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Tournament as the Lady Hornets fell in the opening round to top-ranked South Carolina, 7-0.

During the 2015 season, Smith guided the Lady Hornets to the SWAC Championship match for the second time in three seasons and won his 50th career match at ASU with a 3-0 SWAC semifinal victory against Prairie View A&M on Nov. 6, 2015 in Huntsville, Ala.. The team earned two selections on the All-SWAC teams as sisters Ariela Lewis (First Team) and Aaliyah Lewis (Second Team) were each given the recognition. The two players were among the top point getters in the conference, combining for 23 goals and 16 assists. Prior to this time period, the Lady Hornets had not had a winning season in program history.

In the 2014 season, Smith guided the team to another double-digit win total, the first time in program history it has posted back-to-back seasons of double-digit wins. For a second straight season, the team was able to string together an unbeaten streak of at least seven games to mark the program's second-longest winning streak. The run propelled them into the SWAC Tournament Semifinals. Once again, the team was led offensively by Aaliyah Lewis, who followed up her stellar freshman season.

Kempainen played four years at Minnesota, and was an integral part of rebuilding the program from 2004 to 2007. She earned a Bachelor of Communciation degree from Minnesota in 2008.
