The Alabama State University Department of Intercollegiate Athletics announced that five teams will be honored throughout the course of the 2021 season as the Hornets celebrate 120 years of football this fall.

Alabama State will honor five championship teams throughout

its history beginning with the Bethune-Cookman contest. The Hornets will honor division champions from 2001, 2003, and 2010, while also honoring the 2004 SWAC champiionshup team.



Alabama State will also honor the 30th anniversary of one of the greatest teams of all-time (from ESPN) in the 1991 HBCU National Championship team that finished 11-0-1 and won the Alamo Heritage Bowl.

OPENING DRIVES AT HOME FOR ALABAMA STATE THIS YEAR

Alabama State scored on their opening drive for the second consecutive home on a 10-play, 65-yard drive against Bethune-Cookman. They would score on their first three drives and four of their first five on the night.

RECEIVERS HAVE A NIGHT FOR ALABAMA STATE

Jeremiah Hixon led Alabama State with seven receptions for 100 yards and a touchdown on 10 targets. The total was just one catch short of a career-high that Hixon recorded against Tuskegee in 2018 (8-116). Eight different receivers caught a pass on the night, with four catching three or more passes in the game. Corker recorded four receptions for 48 yards, with Keron Jones and Tevin Sharpe each recorded three receptions in the win.

ALABAMA STATE PUTS UP GOOD NUMBERS AS A UNIT

Alabama State outgained Bethune-Cookman 378 (111 rushing/267 passing) to 159 (12 rushing/247 passing). The Hornets forced four turnovers including three fumbles, while also leading in time of possession (36:13 - 23:47). Alabama State also converted 10 of 18 third-down chances in the win.

RECORD NUMBER OF GRADUATES ACROSS THE COUNTRY THIS YEAR

The National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame today released a list of 3,284 student-athletes who have already earned their undergraduate degrees and will be playing college football this fall while pursuing second diplomas. This season marks the fourth year the NFF has compiled the list of graduated players.

Alabama State has the following who have received their degrees prior to the season starting: Austin Brundidge, Christian Clark, Ezra Gray, Joshua Long, Kimar Martin, Jacquez Payton, Cameron Rampersaud, Tevin Sharpe, Randall

Smith, and KJ Stokes.

BUSY YEAR ACADEMICALLY FOR GRAY

Alabama State senior running back **Ezra Gray** had a busy year academically for the Hornets as he was named a William V. Campbell Trophy finalist (Academic Heisman) and was named to the FCS Academic All-Star Team for the second consecutive year.

He was also the first student-athlete from Alabama State, in any sport, to be named a two-time CoSIDA Academic All-America.

Gray joined Alabama quarterback Mac Jones and Chisholm in the backfield announced by the organization and is the lone representative from the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) on the First Team and is one of five selections from the state of Alabama on the First Team.

He is one of 12 members on the First Team with a 4.00 GPA, and he becomes the first two-time CoSIDA Academic All-America® in school history.

The graduate student is a two-time FCS-ADA selection to the Academic All-Star Team, earning the distinction of being named the FCS-ADA co-Scholar Athlete of the Year in 2019-20, is a two-time CoSIDA Academic All-District selection, a finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy (considered the Academic Heisman), two-time Magic City Classic Scholar Athlete of the Year, and was a finalist for the Doris Robinson Scholar Athlete of the Year Award this past spring.

On the field, he is a five-time All-SWAC selection as either a running back or return specialist and earned First Team honors as a running back this past spring after leading the conference in rushing. He was named a First Team BOXTOROW All-American this past season, and for his career has rushed for 1,808 yards - a number that places him in the top-10 all-time at Alabama State. He has also scored nine rushing touchdowns, recorded 47 receptions for 265 yards and a touchdown, while also averaging 22.9 yards per kick return during his career.

THREE NAMED TO BLACK FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

The Black College Football Hall of Dame (BCFHOF) announced the 2021 Watch List for the Black College Player of the Year presented annually to the most outstanding football player from a Historically Black College & University.

Four finalists will be unveiled on November 30, 2021, with the winner of the Black College Football Player of the Year Award being announced during halftime of the Inaugural HBCU Legacy Bowl. The winner will receive the Deacon Jones Trophy during the game to be played February 19, 2022, in New Orleans on the NFL Network.

Alabama State had three players named to the Watch List including senior running back **Ezra Gray**, sophomore defensive back **Irshaad Davis**, and senior defensive lineman **Christian Clark**

Gray led the team, and conference, in rushing during the spring season with 436 yards on 84 carries in five games. He averaged 5.2 yards per carry and scored three touchdowns, and he rushed for a career-high 195 yards against Jackson State and added another 100-yard game against Alabama A6M. The senior finished 15th nationally in all-purpose yards and 35th in the nation in rushing yards, while he also finished 19th in rushing yards per game on the season. He also earned the nod for return specialist on the Second Team after he returned 10 kicks and averaged 18.50 yards per return. He finished 48th in the nation in combined kick returns and also 48th in kickoff returns.

Davis led Alabama State in tackles with 41 on the season including 31 solo stops. He recorded a pair of tackles for loss and 0.5 sacks on the season, while he also finished with one interception, three pass breakups and a quarterback hurry from his safety position. Davis finished fourth in the conference in tackles and 20th in passes defended on the season, while he also finished 14th in the nation in solo tackles and 58th in total tackles.

Meanwhile, Clark finished with 15 tackles including nine solo stops. Clark recorded 2.5 tackles for loss and one pass breakup, while he also had one forced fumble and was part of a defense that held opponents to just over 800 yards rushing in five games from his nose guard position.

DAVIS NAMED TO THE PRESEASON STARTING LINEUP BY THE COLLEGE FOOTBALL AMERICA YEARBOOK

Alabama State sophomore defensive back Irshaad Davis was named to the 2021 Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Preseason Starting Lineup announced by the College Football America Yearbook publication.

Davis led the Hornets with 41 tackles on the season including 31 individual stops. He recorded a pair of tackles for loss and 0.5 sacks in the spring, while also recording an interception along with three pass breakups and a quarterback hurry from his safety spot. Davis finished in the top five in the

Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) in tackles and 20th in passes defended, while also being 14th in the country in solo tackles prior to the FCS playoffs.

The sophomore was one of three players selected from an HBCU including conference opponent Jordan Lewis (Southern) on the First Team defense and Dacquari Wilson (North Carolina A&T) on the First Team offense.

SIX NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN BY BOXTOROW

Alabama State led the way with six selections to the BOX-TOROW preseason HBCU college football All-American team, leading a contingent of 30 players selected prior to the start of the 2021 season.

Ezra Gray led the selections after earning First Team All-SWAC honors and leading the team, and the conference, in rushing during the spring season with 436 yards on 84 carries in five games. He averaged 5.2 yards per carry and scored three touchdowns, and he rushed for a career-high 195 yards against Jackson State and added another 100-yard game against Alabama A&M. The senior finished 15th nationally in all-purpose yards and 35th in the nation in rushing yards, while he also finished 19th in rushing yards per game on the season.

He was joined on the offense by tight end Terrance Ellis who started all five games at tight end and recorded a career-high 12 receptions for 77 yards, averaging 6.42 yards per reception. Redshirt freshman Travon Taylor also earned offensive honors after playing in all five games last season and helping the team rush for 905 yards and pass for 1,011.

The three were joined by three defensive players led by defensive linemen Christian Clark who finished with 15 tackles including nine solo stops. Clark recorded 2.5 tackles for loss and one pass breakup, while he also had one forced fumble and was part of a defense that held opponents to just over 800 yards rushing in five games from his nose guard position.

He was joined on the defensive side of the ball by a pair of defensive backs including Irshaad Davis who led Alabama State in tackles with 41 on the season including 31 solo stops. He recorded a pair of tackles for loss and 0.5 sacks on the season, while he also finished with one interception, three pass breakups and a quarterback hurry from his safety position. Davis finished fourth in the conference in tackles and 20th in passes defended on the season, while he also finished 14th in the nation in solo tackles and 58th in total tackles. Naytron Culpepper who finished the year with 15 tackles, including nine solo stops, joins Davis as a preseason pick in defensive backfield. He also finished the year with a pair of tackles for loss from his cornerback position and finished the year with four pass breakups. Culpepper also finished 19th in the conference in pass breakups this spring. The Hornets led the way with six selections, while UAPB had four. A host of schools including Alabama A&M, Tennessee State, Southern, Bowie State, and Jackson State each had

Even though a matchup has not been announced for 2025, Grant said that Southern has committed to play in the 2025 SWAC/MEAC Challenge.

AUBREY GRACE NAMED TO THE PUNTER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

Alabama State freshman punter **Aubrey Grace** was named to the FCS Punter of the Year Watch List, announced by the Augusta Sports Council.

The award honors the nation's top collegiate punter in the FCS, and Grace becomes the second Hornet to be named to the Watch List - joining Anthony Craven in 2019. The 20 candidates on the list incorporate a broad spectrum of Football Championship Series (FCS) punters. The 2021 watch list was compiled based on the 2020 FCS Punter of the Year watch list, the 2020 All-Conference teams, the 2020 All-American Teams, and the 2021 preseason All-Conference teams.

Grace, a First All-SWAC preseason selection and a Spring 2021 BOXTOROW All-American, finished the year with 28 punts for 1,150 total yards. He averaged 41.7 yards per punt and booted a long of 57. He forced three fair catches and had seven land inside the 20, while he finished the year with nine punts of 50 yards or more. The freshman finished second in the conference in punting average and first in punts of 50 yards or more, and he finished 20th in the nation in punting.

He joins a list that includes Andrew Foster (Morehead State), Austin Dunlap (Southeastern Louisiana), Ben Niesner (Valparaiso), Brady Schutt (South Dakota), Chris Faddoul (Florida A&M), D.J. Amson (Northern Arizona), Daniel Whelan (UC Davis), Harry O'Kelly (James Madison), Joe Gurley (North Alabama), Jon Sot (Harvard), JT Bohlken (Illinois State), Kaleb Mosley (Tennessee State), Matthew Campbell (The Citadel), Matt McRobert (Sam Houston), Nathan Fondacaro (Villanova), Noah Gettman (Sacred Heart), Patrick Haughney (Holy Cross), Ryan Richter (Norfolk State), and Zach Haynes (Southeast Missouri).

The FCS Punter of the Year Award winner will be voted on by the FCS Punter of the Year Award/Ray Guy Award Committee and will be announced after regular season play commences (subject to change based on current on COVID-19 updates and decision making by the NCAA and other organizing bodies).

ALABAMA STATE TO HONOR FIVE TEAMS DURING THE 120-YEAR ANNIVERSARY OF THE PROGRAM

The Alabama State University Department of Intercollegiate Athletics announced that five teams will be honored throughout the course of the 2021 season as the Hornets celebrate 120 years of football this fall.

Alabama State and Miles will kick off the season on Saturday, September 4 in the Labor Day Classic at ASU Stadium, with the Hornets honoring the 2004 Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) championship team that finished 10-2 and defeated Southern 40-35 in the championship game. That year, Alabama State reeled off five consecutive conference wins to secure a berth in the championship game behind the late Tarvaris Jackson at quarterback.

The Hornets return home on September 25, facing Bethune-Cookman in the conference opener with kick set for 5 pm on Greek Unity Day. Alabama State will honor the 2001 SWAC Division champions that played in the championship game. That season, Alabama State finished 8-4 including winning eight consecutive games after dropping the first two of the season.

Alabama State and UAPB meet for homecoming at ASU Stadium on October 9, with kick set for 2 pm. The Hornets will celebrate the 30th anniversary of the 1991 SWAC and HBCU National Champions led by the late Houston Markham. The team finished 11-0-1 that season including a 36-13 victory over North Carolina A&T in the Alamo Heritage Bowl to cap off the unbeaten season.

The Hornets kick off November with Texas Southern on Military Appreciation Day (November 20) with kick set for 2 pm. They will honor the 2003 SWAC Division champions during the contest, a team that made the championship game before falling to Southern. The Hornets finished 8-5 that season including a streak of three consecutive wins to end the season capped off with victory in the Turkey Day Classic.

Alabama State will close out the regular season with the Turkey Day Classic against Tuskegee on November 25, honoring the 2010 SWAC Division champions. That season, Alabama State finished 7-5 including a steak of four consecutive wins.

ESPN FAMILY OF NETWORKS

The Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) has announced additions to the 2021 football television schedule, including a pair of home games featuring Alabama State.

The 2021 slate, which includes a record number of league games slated to be available on ESPN's linear and digital platforms, no features five additional games that have been slated to be carried live on ESPN+.

Alabama State will be featured on ESPN+ twice in five days as the platform has picked up the Texas Southern game on November 20 and the Turkey Day Classic against Tuskegee on November 25. Both games will kick at 2 pm.

Those games join games already airing for the Hornets on the ESPN Family of Networks including on the road against Auburn (September 11) on the SEC Network. The Hornets can also be seen on ESPN+ at home against Bethune-Cookman (September 25), on the road against Jackson State (October 16) on ESPN+, and the Magic City Classic in Birmingham against Alabama A&M (October 30) on ESPN3 and tape-delayed on ESPNU.

The two additional games give Alabama State six games on the ESPN Family of Networks this fall.

Alabama State opens the 2021 season next weekend at ASU Stadium against Miles, with kick set for 5 pm.

ALABAMA STATE HAS EIGHT SELECTIONS FOR PRESEASON ALL-SWAC

The Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) released the 2021 Preseason All-Conference teams at Media Days, and Alabama State is well-represented with eight slots on the two teams.

Ezra Gray was named First Team running back after he led the team, and conference, in rushing this season with 436 yards on 84 carries in five games. He averaged 5.2 yards per carry and scored three touchdowns, and he rushed for a career-high 195 yards against Jackson State and added another 100-yard game against Alabama A&M. The senior finished 15th nationally in all-purpose yards and 35th in the nation in rushing yards, while he also finished 19th in rushing yards per game on the season. He also earned the nod for return specialist on the Second Team after he returned 10 kicks and averaged 18.50 yards per return. He finished 48th in the nation in combined kick returns and also 48th in kickoff returns.

Gray was joined on the first team on the defensive side by three players including **Irshaad Davis** who led Alabama State in tackles with 41 on the season including 31 solo stops. He recorded a pair of tackles for loss and 0.5 sacks on the season, while he also finished with one interception, three pass breakups and a quarterback hurry from his safety position. Davis finished fourth in the conference in tackles and 20th in passes defended on the season, while he also finished 14th in the nation in solo tackles and 58th in total tackles.

He was joined by a pair of defensive linemen including **Christian Clark** who finished with 15 tackles including nine solo stops. Clark recorded 2.5 tackles for loss and one pass breakup, while he also had one forced fumble and part of a defense that held opponents to just over 800 yards rushing in five games from his nose guard position. **Andrew Ogletree** also earned a spot on the first team after he finished with 15 tackles this spring, including nine solo stops. He finished with five tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks, while he also recorded five quarterback hurries. Ogletree finished 15th in the conference in tackles for loss, while he also finished 79th in the nation in sacks and 86th in tackles for loss.

Freshman **Aubrey Grace** earned a First Team selection as the punter after he finished the year with 28 punts for 1,150 total yards and averaged 41.7 yards per punt and booted a long of

57. He forced three fair catches and had seven land inside the 20, while he also finished the year with nine punts of 50 yards or more. The freshman finished second in the conference in punting average and first in punts of 50 yards or more, and he finished 20th in the nation in punting.

A pair of players joined Gray on the Second Team including defensive back **Naytron Culpepper** who finished the year with 15 tackles, including nine solo stops. He also finished the year with a pair of tackles for loss from his cornerback position and finished the year with four pass breakups. Culpepper also finished 19th in the conference in pass breakups this spring. Rounding out the preseason selections for Alabama State was tight end **Terrance Ellis** who started all five games at tight end and recorded a career-high 12 receptions for 77 yards, averaging 6.42 yards per reception.

HORNETS PICKED FOURTH IN THE DIVISION IN PRESEASON POLL

Alabama State was picked to finish fourth in the SWAC East Division behind Alabama A&M (122), Florida A&M (109), and Jackson State (80) after picking up 78 total votes in the preseason poll on a vote by the league's head coaches and sports information directors.

DAVIS NAMED SECOND TEAM AFCA ALL-AMERICAN IN SPRING 2021

Alabama State sophomore defensive back Irshaad Davis was named to the 2021 Spring AFCA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Coaches' All-America Second Team announced by the American Football Coaches Association.

Davis, a First Team All-SWAC and BOXTOROW All-America selection, led Alabama State in tackles with 41 on the season including 31 solo stops. He recorded a pair of tackles for loss and 0.5 sacks on the season, while he also recorded one interception, three pass breakups, and a quarterback hurry from his safety position. Davis finished fourth in the conference in tackles and 20th in passes defended on the season, while he also was 14th in the nation in solo tackles and 58th in total tackles prior to the FCS playoffs.

The sophomore was one of four players selected from an HBCU including Jordan Lewis (Southern) and Decobie Durant (South Carolina State) on the First Team defense. Davis was joined on the Second Team by Alabama A&M receiver Abdul-Fatai Ibrahim.

The AFCA has selected an All-America team since 1945 and currently selects teams in all five of its divisions, and the teams are the only All-America teams chosen by the coaches. This year's team is made up of 24 seniors, 16 juniors, eight sophomores, and two graduate students.

NETTLES NAMED FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR IN THE SWAC

Ryan Nettles was selected as the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) Freshman of the Year, and six others were chosen all-conference on a vote of the league's head coaches sports information directors announced by the conference office Thursday morning.

Nettles, who was recently named a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award which is presented to the national freshman of the year in college football's Division I subdivision, was named the SWAC Newcomer of the Week four times and the SWAC Offensive Player of the Week once. He also finished the season with 917 yards through the air on 85-for-144 passing and eight touchdowns, with a 59.0 completion percentage and was one of the top five quarterbacks in every statistical category. Nettles is also listed 26th overall in the nation in passing touchdowns and 39th in passing yards, while also finishing

in the top 50 in passing efficiency, passing yards per game, points responsible for, points responsible for per game.

NETTLES NAMED FINALIST FOR THE JERRY RICE AWARD (TOP FRESHMAN)

Ryan Nettles was named as one of 16 finalists for the Jerry Rice Award, which is presented to the national freshman of the year in college football's Division I subdivision, announced by Stats Perform FCS on Monday.

Nettles finished the spring 2021 season completing 85 of his 144 attempts (59.0 percent) for 917 yards and eight touchdowns. He also rushed the ball for 110 yards and one touchdown in five games, with his most notable game coming against Mississippi Valley State where he finished with 361 yards of total offense and four total touchdowns. Nettles was named the SWAC Newcomer of the Week four times this spring and the Offensive Player of the Week one time.

The Rice Award is named for the legendary Hall of Fame wide receiver and is celebrating its 10th anniversary season. Los Angeles Rams wide receiver Cooper Kupp is the most prominent winner of the award, and the most recent recipient in 2019, former North Dakota State quarterback Trey Lance, is projected to be one of the early selections in the NFL Draft on April 29.

GRACE BOOMS ONE 67 YARDS

Freshman punter **Aubrey Grace** boomed a new career long punt of 67 yards late in the third quarter, breaking a mark of 57 yards he set against Southern during the spring season.

The 62 points allowed by Alabama State is the most allowed since a 62-13 loss to #8 (FCS) Kennesaw State, and the 63 allowed to #7 (FBS) Auburn in back-to-back games back in 2018.



OFFENSE

CHANGE IN HORNETS' STARTING LINEUP AGAINST AUBURN

Alabama State made a change to its starting lineup prior to kick against Auburn on the offensive line. The Hornets went with Travon Taylor (LT), Josh Anjorin (LG), Charlie Maxwell (C), Taurrian Stafford (RG), and Jimmie Jenkins (RT).

NETTLES MISSED MOST OF THREE SEASONS BEFORE GETTING UNDER CENTER LAST SEASON

Alabama State quarterback Ryan Nettles missed the better part of three years of football before getting under center last season. He was injured during his senior year of high school, then sat out his first year at Alabama State to rehab before COVID-19 hit.

He was finally able to get on the field and did not disappoint. He was selected as the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) Freshman of the Year, and six others were chosen all-conference on a vote of the league's head coaches sports information directors announced by the conference office.

Nettles, who was named a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award which is presented to the national freshman of the year in college football's Division I subdivision, was named the SWAC Newcomer of the Week four times and the SWAC Offensive Player of the Week once. He also finished the season with 917 yards through the air on 85-for-144 passing and eight touchdowns, with a 59.0 completion percentage and was one of the top five quarterbacks in every statistical category. Nettles is also listed 26th overall in the nation in passing touchdowns and 39th in passing yards, while also finishing in the top 50 in passing efficiency, passing yards per game, points responsible for, points responsible for per game.

GRAY ONE OF THE BEST

Ezra Gray was named First Team running back after he led the team, and conference, in rushing this season with 436 yards on 84 carries in five games. He averaged 5.2 yards per carry and scored three touchdowns, and he rushed for a career-high 195 yards against Jackson State and added another 100-yard game against Alabama A&M. The senior finished 15th nationally in all-purpose yards and 35th in the

nation in rushing yards, while he also finished 19th in rushing yards per game on the season.

YOUNGEST OFFENSIVE LINE IN THE CONFERENCE RETURNS

The youngest offensive line in the conference last season returns led by BOXTOROW All-American **Travon Taylor**, **Josh Anjorin**, **Robert Alston**, **Charlie Maxwell**, and **Taurrian Stafford**. They are joined by several newcomers this season highlighted by Montgomery-native **Keeundra Salter** among others.

HIXON RETURNS THIS FALL AND MAKES A SPLASH IN RETURN

Jeremiah Hixon, who changed his hometown from Spanish Fort (Ala.) to his true hometown of Monroeville (Ala.) over the summer, made a splash in the return to fall football on Saturday. He was targeted 11 times and came up eight receptions in a win over Miles in overtime. The redshirt-sophomore finished with 92 yards receiving.

And if that wasn't enough, the hometown of Monroeville should bring back some memories. It is the same hometown as former Hornets and current NFL offensive lineman for the Houston Texans **Tytus Howard** (highest draft pick in school history).

NETTLES HAS TARGETED 13 DIFFERENT RECEIVERS THIS SEASON

Alabama State quarterback **Ryan Nettles** has targeted 13 different receivers this season, with 11 making catches. He has connected with **Jeremiah Hixon** 19 different times and **Keron Jones** another 10.

QUARTERBACK ROOM IS CROWDED AND LED BY NETTLES

The quarterback room is crowded yet again with redshirt freshman **Ryan Nettles** returning after a stellar first year under center in which he was named a Jerry Rice finalist (Top Freshman). The SWAC Newcomer of the Year passed 917 yards and eight touchdowns in his first season, and he will be backed up by **Myles Crawley** and **Joe Owens, Jr.** this season. Crawley played in a pair of games last season in the wildcat formation and scored on a rushing touchdown.

HORNETS HAVE PAIR OF KICKS BLOCKED AGAINST AUBURN IN THE ROAD

Alabama State had a punt blocked in the opening quarter that set up a touchdown in the opening minute of the second quarter, and later had a field goal blocked and returned for a touchdown to extend the lead to 20-0 with just over six minutes remaining. It is the first time in the modern era that Alabama State has had two different kicks blocked, and is the third attempt blocked in a contest involving Alabama State - blocked an extra point attempt against Miles.

GRACE. ONE OF THE BEST IN THE NATION

Freshman **Aubrey Grace** has solidified himself as one of the best in the nation when it comes to punting the football. The freshman was most recently was named to the FCS Punter of the Year Watch List. Grace, a First All-SWAC preseason selection and a Spring 2021 BOXTOROW All-American, finished the year with 28 punts for 1,150 total yards. He averaged 41.7 yards per punt and booted a long of 57. He forced three fair catches and had seven land inside the 20, while he finished the year with nine punts of 50 yards or more. The freshman finished second in the conference in punting average and first in punts of 50 yards or more, and he finished 20th in the nation in punting.

He joins a list that includes Andrew Foster (Morehead State), Austin Dunlap (Southeastern Louisiana), Ben Niesner (Valparaiso), Brady Schutt (South Dakota), Chris Faddoul (Florida A&M), D.J. Amson (Northern Arizona), Daniel Whelan (UC Davis), Harry O'Kelly (James Madison), Joe Gurley (North Alabama), Jon Sot (Harvard), JT Bohlken (Illinois State), Kaleb Mosley (Tennessee State), Matthew Campbell (The Citadel), Matt McRobert (Sam Houston), Nathan Fondacaro (Villanova), Noah Gettman (Sacred Heart), Patrick Haughney (Holy Cross), Ryan Richter (Norfolk State), and Zach Haynes (Southeast Missouri).

BREAKING A STREAK

Alabama State connected on their first field goal since the fall of 2019 after Cosmin Diaconu connected on a 37-yarder in the fourth quarter.

BARNES ONE OF THE BEST LONG SNAPPERS IN THE COUNTRY

Senior Luke Barnes is one of the best long snappers in the country, both on the field and in the classroom. The recent graduate of Alabama State has a 4.0 grade point average and has been nominated for the academic award from the National Football Foundation. He has also proven himself on the field by being named All-Conference, and most recently was named an All-America long snapper.

LOCAL TALENTS HANDLE THE KICKING DUTIES FOR THE HORNETS

Three different student-athletes handle kicking duties for Alabama State, and all three are from the River Region. Senior **Hunter Hanson** (Montgomery, Ala.) handles the extra point attempts and field goals, while **Cosmin Diaconu** (Prattville, Ala.) handles field goals and kickoffs. Meanwhile, **Aubrey Grace** (Pike Road, Ala.) handles punting, but can also placekick.

HANSON LOOKS TO ADD TO HIS CAREER POINT TOTAL THIS FALL

Hunter Hanson, the most experienced of the kicking crew, looks to add to his scoring total this fall after 17 points (all PATs) in the spring. Hanson scored a career-best 52 points during his freshman season with 12 field goals and 16 extra points. He followed that up with 41 points his sophomore season on eight field goals and 17 extra points. During his career, Hanson has scored 156 points throughout his career (28 field goals / 72 extra points). He is currently on pace to reach 200 if he continues his normal scoring pace.

TWITTER SENSATION

Luke Barnes is a twitter sensation as he seems to find ways to perfect his snapping. Whether it is snapping through stairs on the field, or over the wall, Barnes has a knack for the unbelieveable.

HORNETS CONVERT ONSIDE KICK AGAINST AUBURN

Cosmin Diaconu kicked the first onside kick of the year for Alabama State, recovered by Tevin Sharpe to open up the second had at the Auburn 43-yard line.

DEFENSE RISES UP

Brandon Gaddy led Alabama State in tackles with six. He also added a sack, a forced fumble, and a fumble recovery. Meanwhile, Irshaad Davis added a fumble recovery and an interception, while also recording five tackles. Jacquez Payton recorded four pass breakups, while Jeffrey Scott had a scoop and score called back for the defense.

HORNETS SHINE IN 2021 DEBUT

Alabama State held Miles to just 205 yards of total offense in a 14-13 overtime win in the Labor Day Classic last weekend. As a unit, they had a shut going against the Golden Bears out until 3:44 remaining in the contest. The Hornets held Miles to just 170 yards rushing and 35 yards passing (3-for-9) in the win.

PAYTON HAS PICK SIX CALLED BACK

Jacquez Payton, a transfer from Jacksonville State, brought the crowd to its feet early in the game when he intercepted a pass and took it back for a touchdown. However, it was called back to an encroachment penalty, but that is the reason he was brought to Alabama State.

ADAMS LEAVES GAME EARLY WITH INJURY

Alabama State redshirt freshman linebacker **Colton Adams** (better known as Bubba) left the game against Miles early after making three tackles. There is no update on Adams for the week, but he is not listed on the depth chart.

SHEDDING THE POUNDS

Alabama State defensive lineman **Christian Clark**, already on the of the best in the conference and in FCS, has dropped weight since last fall and into the spring season. The senior was hovering around the mid-390s last year and before the game against Miles, weighed in at 343. That 50-plus pounds dropped by the senior in less than a year.

SPEAKING OF CLARK

The senior recorded 10 tackles in the win over Miles on Saturday, with nine of those coming as assisted tackles. The total was just one off of his career-high set against Kennesaw State back in 2019.

DAVIS AND CLARK SHARE A COMMON BOND THESE DAY

Sophomore defensive back **Irshaad Davis** and senior defensive lineman **Christian Clark** share a common bond, and not playing on the same field on Saturdays. The two have older players who play in the National Football League (NFL), and have won the last two Super Bowls.

In Super Bowl LIV against the San Francisco 49ers, Frank Clark recorded a sack on Jimmy Garoppolo on a fourth down late in the fourth quarter during the 31-20 win. The next season, Clark and the Chiefs lost to Carlton Davis and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in Super Bowl LV.

MISSING IN ACTION

Three key defensive players were out of action on Saturday against Miles on Saturday, with all three starting games in the spring. Junior defensive back **Naytron Culpepper**, sophomore linebacker **Devonte Webster**, and junior defensive back **Daniel Troutman** (season-ending injury in spring).

SEEING DOUBLE

Alabama State has a pair of twins on the defensive side of the football in **Devonte Webster** (linebacker) and **Bryce Webster** (defensive back).

SOMETHING ABOUT A GUY NAMED BUBBA IN ALABAMA ON THE FOOTBALL FIELD

Those were the words uttered about **Colton Adams**, better known by one name - Bubba, at SWAC Media Days during the summer. The redshirt freshmen has been injured the better part of his first two years, but has still made an impact. He will do so in his third different number this season. Adams will don the number 1, alongside receiver **Jeremiah Hixon**. Last season, in just two games, Adams finished as the team's fourth-leading tackler in the spring with 18. He recorded a season-high 11 against Southern in the season opener.

ONE OF THE BEST IN THE LEAGUE ON DEFENSE

Alabama State finished the year holding teams to 24.2 points per game, which was good for a top-five finish in the SWAC. They also held teams to 140.8 yards rushing per game.

HEAD COACH DONALD HILL-ELEY

Donald Hill-Eley is in his seventh season at Alabama State University, and his fifth in the lead role after he was named the Head Football Coach of the program on December 7 following a stint as the Interim Head Coach.

Eley was named to the Interim role on October 6, 2017 after an 0-5 start to the season, and guided the Hornets to five wins in their final six games including a victory in the Magic City Classic over Alabama A&M and a pair of wins on opponents' homecoming weekends. He also guided the Hornets to four road wins to close the season, all in conference play.

Through four seasons as the head coach at Alabama State, Eley has posted a 17-17 record, including a 3-3 record during the COVID-19 pandemic in the spring of 2021. During his time at Alabama State, Eley has seen growth inside the program with several all-conference selections and the first-ever first round pick in the NFL Draft, Tytus Howard - the 23rd overall pick of the Houston Texans.

He came to Alabama State after a oneyear stint as wide receivers coach at Norfolk State, and was responsible tight ends and special teams.

After Eley took over the Hornets, the team finished atop the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) in both scoring defense and total defense. The Hornets allowed 18.0 points per game and allowed opposing teams 303.5 yards per game of total offense. The defense held opponents to just 155.64 yards through the air.

The long-time Mid-Eastern Athletic

Conference (MEAC) coach spent 13 seasons at Morgan State (2001-13). After his first season as offensive coordinator, Eley spent the final 12 as head coach and was named 2002 MEAC Coach of the year. His 59 wins rank third all-time in Bears' history. He spent four seasons at Hampton (1997-2000) as offensive coordinator and pro liaison, helping the Pirates win an HBCU National Championship, two MEAC titles, and the 1999 Heritage Bowl. Eley spent four seasons in professional football in the Canadian Football League, first with the Baltimore Stallions (1994-95) as receivers coach before two seasons with the Toronto Argonauts as a guest coach (1996-97). Hill was on the staff of three straight Grey Cup championship teams (1995-97) during his time in the CFL.

After graduating from Virginia Union, he entered the coaching ranks at his alma mater in 1991 before becoming a graduate assistant at Hampton in 1992, where he received his master's in counseling in 1995. He is presently completing his Ph.D. at Morgan State.

STADIUM INFORMATION

ASU Stadium on the campus of Alabama State University in Montgomery, Alabama is a 26,500-seat stadium that replaces the Cramton Bowl as the host venue for the Alabama State Hornets football team. The first game in the New ASU Stadium was the 89th Turkey Day Classic on November 22, 2012 in which the Hornets hosted the Tuskegee Golden Tigers. The game was a sell-out and was televised nationally on ESPNU.

The stadium's current capacity sits at 26,500 but the project was designed to allow for future expansion that can expand the capacity to 55,000.

The stadium also holds a restaurant and retail space which welcome visitors to the stadium and area 365 days a year.
