STORY LINES

- Today's game begins a three-game homestand for Alabama State.
- Alabama State ended a 15-game road losing streak, and a six-game losing streak, with their win over Mississippi Valley State
 on Monday night. The Hornets used four players in double figures with career-highs from Kenny Strawbridge and E.J. Clark,
 who combined for 41 points in the win.
- Alabama State head coach Mo Williams missed the last four games due to the birth of his son with wife Antonia, and associate head coach Trey Johnson has taken over the helm going 1-2.
- Alabama State leads the all-time series with UAPB 31-19, including winning 14 of the 24 games played here in Pine Bluff. The
 Hornets look get back on the winning track after dropping their last game in H.O. Clemmons Arena (January 9, 2021).
- Alabama State freshman Juan Reyna leads the team with seven double figure games this season, and has connected on all 17 of his free throw attempts to open the 2021-22 season.
- The Hornets were picked to finish eighth in the preseason poll on a vote from the league's head coaches and sports information directors with 125 total votes. They were just behind Alcorn State (128) in seventh and Florida A&M (138) in sixth. The top five included Texas Southern (237), Prairie View A&M (204), Jackson State (202), Grambling State (168), and Southern (167).
- Alabama State has a strong Jackson connection with coaches Mo Williams and Trey Johnson. But it doesn't stop there
 as Director of Operations Dana Johnson is a Tiger alum, and two players have ties Michael Barber and Jayme Mitchell. It
 is the second season for Williams and Johnson leading the Alabama State program.
- Alabama State last made the NCAA Tournament in 2011, losing to UTSA in the opening round. They also made the tournament in 2001, 2004 and 2009.

OUICK HITS ...

- Alabama State head coach Mo Williams played his collegiate basketball at the University of Alabama. He was named The Sporting News Freshman of the Year, and led the Crimson Tide to their only number one ranking in school history.
- Assistant coach Trey Johnson played at a pair of Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) schools during his playing career, finishing 10th in the nation in scoring during his junior season at 23.5 points per game and was named First Team All-SWAC. After declaring for the 2006 NBA Draft, Johnson returned to school and was named the Preseason SWAC Player of the Year and Preseason All-American. During his senior season, he set a single season record for points in a single game, points per game average (27.1), free throws made, and free throws attempted. He finished his career as a member of the 1,000-point club with 1,698 career points - placing in the top 10 in school history in just 2 seasons at JSU. Johnson also led Jackson State to 21 wins and the SWAC Tournament, earning Tournament MVP honors and was named the SWAC Player of the Year.
- Both Williams and Johnson played with two of the greats from the National Basketball Association (NBA) during their professional careers. Both played with Lebron James, while Johnson had the opportunity to play with Kobe Bryant during his time with the Los Angeles Lakers.
- Alabama State completed a five game road swing to open the season with all five games shown nationally. The first four were shown on the ESPN platform on either ESPN3, ESPN+, or the SEC Network, while the Iowa game was on the Big Ten Network.

ALABAMA STATE RETURNS FIVE WITH SIGNIFICANT PLAYING TIME ...

- The Hornets return six players who saw significant playing time in 2020-21 including second-leading scorer **Kenny** Strawbridge (Rockford, III.) who averaged 10.5 points and 7.2 rebounds per game, earning Second Team Preseason All-SWAC.
- They also return Kevion Stewart (Memphis, Tenn.) who averaged 8.2 points per game, while Jordan O'Neal (Mobile, Ala.) returns after averaging 5.8 points, 4.8 rebounds and a team-high 23 blocked shots. Meanwhile, E.J. Clark (Dallas, Texas) averaged 5.8 points per game and **DJ Jackson** (San Bernardino, Calif.) at 4.4 points per game.

SEVERAL NEWCOMERS DOT THE HORNETS ROSTER THIS YEAR...

- Several newcomers highlight this year's roster including a handful of transfers starting with Trace Young (Owensboro, Ky.) who sat out last season. The junior averaged 9.8 points per game two seasons ago at John A. Logan College after averaging 6.8 points at Wyoming as a freshman. He is joined by Michael Barber (Jackson, Miss.) who averaged 12.5 points and 7.1 rebounds per game at SW Mississippi after playing a year at Howard.
- Christian McCray (Las Vegas, Nev.) will add a scoring punch after he transferred over last season from Cal State Fullerton, and is joined by Gerald Liddell (Cibolo, Texas) who transferred in from Texas averaging 4.4 points per game. The Hornets added two more transfers in Ashton McClelland (Houston, Texas) from Texas Southern and Isaiah Range (Cedar Hill, Texas) from

RARE FEAT - PAIR OF DOUBLE-DOUBLES IN SAME GAME ...

Alabama State had a rare feat happen on Saturday in their home opener against North Carolina Central when a pair of players
recorded a double-double in the same game. A pair of starters, Gerald Liddell and Jordan O'Neal recorded career nights in the
win with Liddell finishing with 22 points and 11 rebounds, while O'Neal went for 19 points and 14 rebounds.

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE ON THE BENCH FOR THE HORNETS ...

- Alabama State has several years of experience on the bench this season on the coaching staff with head coach Mo Williams, assistant coach Trey Johnson, and assistant coach Tyrone Levett all logging minutes in the professional ranks.
- Williams was drafted by Utah in 2003, and he would play his rookie season with the Jazz before spending the next four
 seasons with the Milwaukee Bucks. Williams played three seasons with the Cleveland Cavaliers (2008-11) where he teamed up
 with LeBron James and helped the Cavs post a league-best 66 wins in 2008-09. Williams was selected to the NBA All-Star
 Game in his first season with Cleveland.
- After stints with the Los Angeles Clippers (2011-12), Portland Trail Blazers (2013-14), Minnesota Timberwolves (2014-15) and Charlotte Hornets (2015), Williams returned to Cleveland for the 2015-16 campaign. In his final season in the NBA, Williams and the Cavaliers defeated the Golden State Warriors in seven games to win the 2016 NBA Finals.
- Johnson began his professional career in 2007 and went on to play over 10 years in numerous countries all over the world. He spent parts of three NBA seasons with the Cleveland Cavaliers, Toronto Raptors, Los Angeles Lakers, and New Orleans Hornets. Johnson was a member of the 2011 Lakers' playoff team as well. On his quest to become an NBA player, Trey also spent time in the NBA Development League, now known as the G-League, garnering NBA D-League All-Star honors twice (2008-09 and 2010-11). He earned Second Team D-League honors in 2008-09, and First Team honors in 2010-11 after leading the league in scoring at 25.5 points per game while also scoring a league-high 48 points in a single game.
- Johnson also starred internationally where he competed as a member of the Qatar National Team in the Asian Cup, hosted by
 Japan in 2012. He helped the country earn a bronze medal in the tournament, while also competing in the 2015 Asia
 Championship and the GCC Championship (Saudi Arabia).
- Following his career with Alabama State, Levett worked out for the Miami Heat and Detroit Pistons before getting his career started in Ireland with the Gleneagle Lakers. After short stints with the Kentucky Reach (WBL) and Southern Crescent Lightning (WBA), Levett played two years in Austria before playing for the Vermont Frost Heaves (ABA).
- He also played for AD Vagos (Portugal), Jamtland Basket (Sweden), Niigata Albirex BB (Japan) and LF Basket Norrbotten (Sweden) before landing in Canada. While in Canada, he become one of the league's all-time top scorers playing for the Longdon Lightning (2011), Halifax Rainmen (2011-13) and Saint John Mill Rates (2013-until retirement).
- Levett was a three-time all-star during his career and led Vermont to the ABA championship, while also being named All-WBA while playing for the Southern Crescent Lightning.

SPEAKING OF PROFESSIONAL BASKETBALL ...

- Former Hornets **Tobi Ewuosho** and **Fausto Pichardo** each inked professional deals during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Ewuosho signed his first professional contract to play overseas in Alabania after a stellar senior season, while Pichardo inked a deal to play in Latin America.

MCCRAY SETTLES INTO ROLE OFF THE BENCH FOR HORNETS ...

- Christian McCray seems to have settled into a role off the bench for Alabama State through the first five games of the season.
- The junior transfer from Cal State Fullerton came off the bench against Iowa on the road in the last game to score 20 points in just over 16 minutes of action. Couple that with a eight-point performance against Vanderbilt and McCray is averaging 1.1 points per minute played.
- He is also the second-leading scorer on the team through the first give games of the season at 10.0 points per game.

HOME SWEET HOME ...

• Alabama State played a rare November home game that is not listed as an exhibition when they take the floor against North Carolina Central. That is not the only home game however this calendar year. The Hornets have already had an exhibition game this season against Mobile at home, and they will play Tuskegee (11/22), North Alabama (11/28) and Samford (12/8).

RANGE RECORDS FIRST DOUBLE-DOUBLE ...

- Isaiah Range recorded the first double-double of the season for the Hornets in the loss to Iowa State (11/16/21) on the road.
- He scored 15 points on 7-of-13 shooting from the floor, and grabbed 10 rebounds (eight of which were defensive rebounds) to lead Alabama State in both categories.

STRAWBRIDGE PLAYS BIG (LITERALLY) ON THE ROAD ...

- Kenny Strawbridge was forced into playing as a big on Saturday against Pepperdine (12/11/2021) and responded with his first double-double of the season.
- He finished game with 16 points (on 7-of-14 shooting from the floor) and grabbed 11 rebounds in the loss to the Wave.
- For the week, he averaged 15 points and nine rebounds per game (Samford and Pepperdine).

REYNA IMPRESSIVE THROUGH FIRST THREE GAMES TO START CAREER ...

- Juan Reyna continues to impress for Alabama State, becoming the first player this year to score in double figures in the first three games.
- He scored a career-high 16 against WKU (11/9/21), then added 10 against Vanderbilt (11/10/21) and another 10 against Missouri State (11/13/21) all on the road.

COLLEGE COACHES WITH AN NBA TITLE ...

- Opening the 2021-22 season there are only six head coaches who have won an NBA title and are leading their own college program this season.
- That list includes Juwan Howard (Michigan), Mo Williams (Alabama State), Lindsey Hunter (Mississippi Valley State), Darrell Walker (Little Rock), Mark Madsen (Utah Valley), and Speedy Claxton (Hofstra).

STRAWBRIDGE EARNS PRESEASON HONOR ...

- Alabama State redshirt sophomore Kenny Strawbridge (Rockford, III.) was named to the Second Team Preseason All-Conference team, announced by the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC).
- Strawbridge was second on the team in scoring last season at 10.5 points per game, scoring 189 total points in 18 games during the shortened season where the Hornets played conference-only games. He shot 35.9 (61-of-170) percent from the floor and 23.4 (11-of-47) percent from beyond the arc.
- The redshirt sophomore led the team from the free throw line, shooting 71.8 (56-of-78) percent from the free throw line. He was also second on the team in rebounding at 7.2 rebounds per game, grabbing 130 total including 32 offensive rebounds. Strawbridge also dished out 24 assists, recorded 14 steals and six blocked shots.
- He joins John Walker III (Texas Southern), Justin Hopkins (Texas Southern), MJ Randolph (Florida A&M), and Jayden Saddler (Southern) on the second team. The first team is made up of Preseason Player of the Year Jawaun Daniels (Prairie View A&M), Preseason Defensive Player of the Year Jayveous McKinnis (Jackson State), Cameron Christian (Grambling State), Garrett Hicks (Alabama A&M), and Jalen Johnson (Alabama A&M).

HORNETS PICKED EIGHTH IN THE PRESEASON SWAC POLL ...

- The Hornets were picked to finish eighth in the preseason poll on a vote from the league's head coaches and sports information directors with 125 total votes. They were just behind Alcorn State (128) in seventh and Florida A&M (138) in sixth.
- The top five included Texas Southern (237), Prairie View A&M (204), Jackson State (202), Grambling State (168), and Southern (167).

STRAWBRIDGE EARNS SWAC HONOR (DECEMBER 15) ...

- The Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) announced the men's basketball weekly honors with Kenny Strawbridge?
 (Rockford, III.) earning Impact Player of the Week honors.
- Strawbridge averaged double figures over a pair of games for the Hornets. He scored 14 points on 4-of-9 shooting from the floor in a 74-64 loss to Samford, while also grabbing seven rebounds. He followed that up with 16 points on 7-of-14 shooting from the floor, while grabbing 11 rebounds to record his first double-double of the season. For the week, Strawbridge averaged 15.0 points and 9.0 rebounds per game.
- Meanwhile, Caleb Hunter of Mississippi Valley State was named the Player of the Week after averaging 18.5 points, 3.5
 assists and 3.0 rebounds per game in a pair of non-conference games.

LIDDELL EARNS SWAC HONOR (DECEMBER 29) ...

- Alabama State junior forward Gerald Liddell (Cibolo, Texas) was named the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) Impact
 Player of the Week after his performance against No. 16/17 Texas.
- Liddell, in his first year at Alabama State after transferring from the Longhorns' program, led the Hornets in the game with a team-high 16 points. He also added a pair of rebounds, one blocked shot and one steal against his former team.
- The junior currently leads the team in scoring at 11.7 points per game as the Hornets head into conference play. He is shootiing 45.0 (50-of-111) percent from the floor and 42.3 (11-of-26) percent from beyond the arc. He has scored in double figures in six games this season and is also averaging 4.8 rebounds per game.
- The award is the second for the Hornets' program in three weeks after Kenny Strawbridge (Rockford, III.) earned the award on December 15.

- Alabama State had a pair of games on the road against nationally recognized teams postponed in mid-December due to COVID-19 protocols inside their opponents' program.

- Alabama State and Bethune-Cookman will meet on the hardwood at the inaugural Bridge Builders Classic at the Mitchell Center in Mobile (Ala.) on January 29.
- The event will feature three high school games beginning at 10 am, followed by a pair of collegiate games including Jackson State and Grambling at 5 pm. The Hornets and Bethune-Cookman will close the night out with tip set for 7 pm.
- The Bridge Builders Classic was created to enhance exposure for Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) and
 to highlight the roles that HBCUs play in educating aspiring professionals and developing future leaders. The Bridge Builders
 Classic will serve as the "ultimate HBCU basketball experience" in the city of Mobile.

WILLIAMS OUT OF ACTION LAST TWO GAMES ...

- Head coach Mo Williams missed the last two games against Texas and Texas Tech on the road awaiting the birth of his seventh son.
- In his absence, associate head coach Trey Johnson has served in the lead role.

- Alabama State opens conference play on the road for the first time under Williams after opening last season at home against Jackson State on ESPNU.
- The Hornets split the season series with Mississippi Valley State last season, with both teams winning on their opponents'
 home floor.

- Alabama State leads the series on the road against Mississippi Valley State since the 1994 season, winning 16 of the 30 contests against the Delta Devils.

GAME 2 WKU 79, Alabama State 74 November 9, 2021




The Hornets had a pair of chances to tie the game in the final three minutes but couldn't convert and turned the ball over three times which allowed Iowa State to pull away down the stretch.


The two finished just eight rebounds shy of the entire North Carolina Central team.


GAME 9 North Alabama 81, Alabama State 69 November 28, 2021



I Kenny Strawbridge (Rockford, III.) and Gerald Liddell (Cibolo, Texas) scored in double figures for Alabama State who jumped out to an early lead, but it wasn't enough as Pepperdine used a second half run to pull away from the Hornets for a 79-62 victory at Firestone Fieldhouse Sunday afternoon.

Strawbridge led Alabama State with a double-double, scoring 16 points (7-of-14) shooting and grabbing 11 rebounds, while Liddell added 14 points and recorded a pair of steals. Isaiah Range (Cedar Hill, Texas) added nine points and seven rebounds for Alabama State (1-9) who finished the night shooting 36.9 (24-of-65) percent from the floor. They were held to just 25 (4-of-16) percent from beyond the arc and 58.8 (10-of-17) percent from the free throw line.

The Hornets jumped on top of Pepperdine early in the first half, going on an 11-0 run that tied the game up and then pushed Alabama State ahead 16-8 with 12:03 to play in the half. They would push the lead to as many as 10 at 22-12 with nine minutes left on a pair of free throws from Strawbridge. However, Pepperdine went on a 19-4 run over a span of six minutes to take a 31-26 lead with 2:44 to play in the half.

Alabama State was able to get back to within one at 33-32 on a put back from Range before the Wave hit a three and held on for a two-point lead at the break.

Pepperdine (4-8) used a 22-6 run in the second to pull away for the final margin after shooting 52.7 (29-of-55) percent from the floor and 41.7 (10-of-24) percent from beyond the arc. They also shot 73.3 (11-of-15) percent from the free throw line.

Houston Mallatte led Pepperdine with a game-high 24 points.



GAME 13 16/17 Texas 68, Alabama State 48 December 22, 2021


AUSTIN, Texas | Alabama State went ahead early on the road against No. 16/17 Texas at the Frank C. Erwin Center, before the Longhorns were able to pull away in the second half for a 68-48 victory on Wednesday afternoon.

Gerald Liddell (Cibolo, Texas) led Alabama State (1-10) with 16 points on 5-of-12 shooting from the floor, in a game that was picked up on Sunday following the postponement of games for both Texas and the Hornets. Alabama State also played without head coach Mo Williams who was out for the game awaiting the birth of his child.

Juan Reyna (San Antonio, Texas) added 10 points in the loss, connecting on four of his nine shot opportunities for Alabama State who finished the day shooting 36.7 (18-of-49) percent from the floor and 33.3 (5-of-15) percent from beyond the arc. They also shot 63.6 (7-of-11) percent from the free throw line.

Meanwhile, Dylan Disu led Texas with 14 points off the bench, pacing four players in double figures including Marcus Carr with 13. Andrew Jones added 12 and Timmy Allen 10 for the Longhorns who finished the game shooting 42.1 (24-of-57) percent from the floor and just 29.2 (7-of-24) percent from beyond the arc. They also shot 92.9 (13-of-14) percent from the free throw line.

The Hornets got on the board first on a Liddell jumper just 20 seconds into the game in a homecoming of sorts for the junior who started his career at Texas. They continued to build on the lead, taking an early 8-2 and building that lead to 18-9 with 10:36 to play in the half. The Hornets held the lead behind seven straight points from Trace Young (Owensboro, Ky.) over a span of four minutes.



GAME 14 25/25 Texas Tech 75, Alabama State 53 December 28, 2021


LUBBOCK, Texas | Alabama State closed out their non-conference portion of the schedule, falling to No. 25 Texas Tech 75-53 at the United Supermarkets Arena Wednesday afternoon.

Gerald Liddell (Cibolo, Texas) led Alabama State with 15 points on 6-of-11 shooting from the floor, while grabbing five rebounds and three steals. Meanwhile, Trace Young (Owensboro, Ky.) added 14 points and six rebounds for the Hornets who finished the day shooting 35.3 (18-of-51) percent from the floor, while shooting 29.6 (8-of-27) percent from beyond the arc.

Meanwhile, Texas Tech (10-2) was paced by Davion Warren with 15 points. Kevin McCullar and Adonis Arms each added 11 for the Red Raiders who finished the day shooting 50.9 (29-of-57) percent from the floor and 33.3 (9-of-27) percent from beyond the arc.

The two teams struggled for nearly three minutes to open the game, combining for one shot before Liddell scored the game's first basket on a jumper from the elbow with 17:40 to play in the opening half. They would grow the lead to 5-2 on a Young three-pointer with 16:59 to play in opening half and held a 12-10 lead with just over 12 minutes to play in the half.

Texas Tech (10-2) went on a run at the point, a 7-0 run over two minutes to take a 17-12 lead before Kenny Strawbridge (Rockford, III.) put a halt to that run with a three-pointer with 9:52 to play in the half to trim the lead to 17-15. Following that basket, the Red Raiders went on an 12-0 run later in the half to build their lead with the run ending on a DJ Jackson (San Bernardino, Calif.) three-pointer from the right wing before the Hornets went into the locker room trailing 42-27.



GAME 15 Alabama State 84, MVSU 75 January 3, 2022

ITTA BENA, Miss. | Kenny Strawbridge (Rockford, III.) paced four players in double figures as a shorthanded Alabama State squad picked up a conference-opening 84-75 victory over Mississippi Valley State at the R.W. Harrison HPER Complex on Monday night.

Strawbridge paced Alabama State (2-11, 1-0 SWAC) with a career-high 27 points on 11-of-16 shooting from the floor, including four three-pointers in the victory. He also picked up four rebounds and three steals to help end a six-game losing streak for the Hornets. The road win was first away from home for Alabama State since defeating Mississippi Valley State (January 12, 2021), ending a 15-game streak away from home.

The redshirt sophomore was joined in double figures by Isaiah Range (Cedar Hill, Texas) with a season-high 16 points and eight rebounds. He finished the night shooting 7-of-11 from the floor in 38 minutes, while recording a pair of assists. E.J. Clark (Dallas, Texas) finished with a career-high 14 points and seven assists. He and Range combined to play 70 minutes, dishing out a combined nine assists compared to zero turnovers.

DJ Jackson (San Bernardino, Calif.) added a career-high 10 points, three assists and three steals, while Michael Barber (Jackson, Miss.) finished the game with a career-high 11 rebounds.

Alabama State finished the night shooting 53.7 (29-of-54) percent from floor and 53.8 (7-of-13) percent from beyond the arc, while connecting on 67.9 (19-of-28) percent from the free throw line. They connected on eight of ten from the line in the final three minutes to seal the victory after Mississippi Valley State chipped a 17-point lead for the Hornets down to two with just over six minutes remaining.


