STORY LINES

- Alabama State split their season series with Southern last season, winning at the Dunn-Oliver Acadome before falling in Baton Rouge. The Hornets made the Top 10 on Sportscenter last season with the Kenny Strawbridge (Rockford, III.) buzzer heater at home
- The Hornets picked up a big road win behind a career day from Juan Reyna (San Antonio, Texas) with 25 points in an eight point win over Grambling State. The Hornets led by as many as 25 points midway through the second half.
- The official halfway point of the season began on Saturday and Alabama State finds itself three games back of Southern in
 the conference standings. If the season ended today, the Hornets would be a sixth seed and would likely face Florida A&M
 or Grambling State in the opening round of the conference tournament.
- Alabama State has just four games remaining on the season including a pair coming up next week and two more in the first week of March.
- The Hornets have started 15 different lineups this season, and have had their full squad for just one conference game to this point. They are currently tied for first in the nation in the number of starting lineups used this season.
- The Hornets were picked to finish eighth in the preseason poll on a vote from the league's head coaches and sports information directors with 125 total votes. They were just behind Alcorn State (128) in seventh and Florida A&M (138) in sixth. The top five included Texas Southern (237), Prairie View A&M (204), Jackson State (202), Grambling State (168), and Southern (167).
- Alabama State ended a 15-game road losing streak, and a six-game losing streak, with their win over Mississippi Valley State.
 The Hornets used four players in double figures with career-highs from Kenny Strawbridge and E.J. Clark, who combined for 41 points in the win.

OUICK HITS ...

- Alabama State head coach Mo Williams played his collegiate basketball at the University of Alabama. He was named The Sporting News Freshman of the Year, and led the Crimson Tide to their only number one ranking in school history.
- Assistant coach Trey Johnson played at a pair of Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) schools during his playing career, finishing 10th in the nation in scoring during his junior season at 23.5 points per game and was named First Team All-SWAC. After declaring for the 2006 NBA Draft, Johnson returned to school and was named the Preseason SWAC Player of the Year and Preseason All-American. During his senior season, he set a single season record for points in a single game, points per game average (27.1), free throws made, and free throws attempted. He finished his career as a member of the 1,000-point club with 1,698 career points placing in the top 10 in school history in just 2 seasons at JSU. Johnson also led Jackson State to 21 wins and the SWAC Tournament, earning Tournament MVP honors and was named the SWAC Player of the Year.
- Both Williams and Johnson played with two of the greats from the National Basketball Association (NBA) during their
 professional careers. Both played with Lebron James, while Johnson had the opportunity to play with Kobe Bryant during his
 time with the Los Angeles Lakers.
- Alabama State completed a five game road swing to open the season with all five games shown nationally. The first four were shown on the ESPN platform on either ESPN3, ESPN+, or the SEC Network, while the Iowa game was on the Big Ten Network.

ALABAMA STATE RETURNS FIVE WITH SIGNIFICANT PLAYING TIME ...

- The Hornets return six players who saw significant playing time in 2020-21 including second-leading scorer Kenny
 Strawbridge (Rockford, Ill.) who averaged 10.5 points and 7.2 rebounds per game, earning Second Team Preseason All-SWAC.
- They also return Kevion Stewart (Memphis, Tenn.) who averaged 8.2 points per game, while Jordan O'Neal (Mobile, Ala.) returns after averaging 5.8 points, 4.8 rebounds and a team-high 23 blocked shots. Meanwhile, E.J. Clark (Dallas, Texas) averaged 5.8 points per game and DJ Jackson (San Bernardino, Calif.) at 4.4 points per game.

SEVERAL NEWCOMERS DOT THE HORNETS ROSTER THIS YEAR...

- Several newcomers highlight this year's roster including a handful of transfers starting with Trace Young (Owensboro, Ky.)
 who sat out last season. The junior averaged 9.8 points per game two seasons ago at John A. Logan College after averaging
 6.8 points at Wyoming as a freshman. He is joined by Michael Barber (Jackson, Miss.) who averaged 12.5 points and 7.1
 rebounds per game at SW Mississippi after playing a year at Howard.
- Christian McCray (Las Vegas, Nev.) will add a scoring punch after he transferred over last season from Cal State Fullerton,
 and is joined by Gerald Liddell (Cibolo, Texas) who transferred in from Texas averaging 4.4 points per game. The Hornets added
 two more transfers in Ashton McClelland (Houston, Texas) from Texas Southern and Isaiah Range (Cedar Hill, Texas) from

RARE FEAT - PAIR OF DOUBLE-DOUBLES IN SAME GAME ...

Alabama State had a rare feat happen on Saturday in their home opener against North Carolina Central when a pair of players
recorded a double-double in the same game. A pair of starters, Gerald Liddell and Jordan O'Neal recorded career nights in the
win with Liddell finishing with 22 points and 11 rebounds, while O'Neal went for 19 points and 14 rebounds.

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE ON THE BENCH FOR THE HORNETS ...

- Alabama State has several years of experience on the bench this season on the coaching staff with head coach Mo Williams, assistant coach Trey Johnson, and assistant coach Tyrone Levett all logging minutes in the professional ranks.
- Williams was drafted by Utah in 2003, and he would play his rookie season with the Jazz before spending the next four
 seasons with the Milwaukee Bucks. Williams played three seasons with the Cleveland Cavaliers (2008-11) where he teamed up
 with LeBron James and helped the Cavs post a league-best 66 wins in 2008-09. Williams was selected to the NBA All-Star
 Game in his first season with Cleveland.
- After stints with the Los Angeles Clippers (2011-12), Portland Trail Blazers (2013-14), Minnesota Timberwolves (2014-15) and Charlotte Hornets (2015), Williams returned to Cleveland for the 2015-16 campaign. In his final season in the NBA, Williams and the Cavaliers defeated the Golden State Warriors in seven games to win the 2016 NBA Finals.
- Johnson began his professional career in 2007 and went on to play over 10 years in numerous countries all over the world. He spent parts of three NBA seasons with the Cleveland Cavaliers, Toronto Raptors, Los Angeles Lakers, and New Orleans Hornets. Johnson was a member of the 2011 Lakers' playoff team as well. On his quest to become an NBA player, Trey also spent time in the NBA Development League, now known as the G-League, garnering NBA D-League All-Star honors twice (2008-09 and 2010-11). He earned Second Team D-League honors in 2008-09, and First Team honors in 2010-11 after leading the league in scoring at 25.5 points per game while also scoring a league-high 48 points in a single game.
- Johnson also starred internationally where he competed as a member of the Qatar National Team in the Asian Cup, hosted by Japan in 2012. He helped the country earn a bronze medal in the tournament, while also competing in the 2015 Asia Championship and the GCC Championship (Saudi Arabia).
- Following his career with Alabama State, Levett worked out for the Miami Heat and Detroit Pistons before getting his career started in Ireland with the Gleneagle Lakers. After short stints with the Kentucky Reach (WBL) and Southern Crescent Lightning (WBA), Levett played two years in Austria before playing for the Vermont Frost Heaves (ABA).
- He also played for AD Vagos (Portugal), Jamtland Basket (Sweden), Niigata Albirex BB (Japan) and LF Basket Norrbotten (Sweden) before landing in Canada. While in Canada, he become one of the league's all-time top scorers playing for the Longdon Lightning (2011), Halifax Rainmen (2011-13) and Saint John Mill Rates (2013-until retirement).
- Levett was a three-time all-star during his career and led Vermont to the ABA championship, while also being named All-WBA
 while playing for the Southern Crescent Lightning.

SPEAKING OF PROFESSIONAL BASKETBALL ...

- Former Hornets **Tobi Ewuosho** and **Fausto Pichardo** each inked professional deals during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Ewuosho signed his first professional contract to play overseas in Alabania after a stellar senior season, while Pichardo inked a deal to play in Latin America.

MCCRAY SETTLES INTO ROLE OFF THE BENCH FOR HORNETS ...

- Christian McCray seems to have settled into a role off the bench for Alabama State through the first five games of the
- The junior transfer from Cal State Fullerton came off the bench against Iowa on the road in the last game to score 20 points in just over 16 minutes of action. Couple that with a eight-point performance against Vanderbilt and McCray is averaging 1.1 points per minute played.
- He is also the second-leading scorer on the team through the first give games of the season at 10.0 points per game.

HOME SWEET HOME ...

• Alabama State played a rare November home game that is not listed as an exhibition when they take the floor against North Carolina Central. That is not the only home game however this calendar year. The Hornets have already had an exhibition game this season against Mobile at home, and they will play Tuskegee (11/22), North Alabama (11/28) and Samford (12/8).

JACKSON CONNECTION ...

Alabama State has a strong Jackson connection with coaches Mo Williams and Trey Johnson. But it doesn't stop there
as Director of Operations Dana Johnson is a Tiger alum, and two players have ties - Michael Barber and Jayme Mitchell.

RANGE RECORDS FIRST DOUBLE-DOUBLE ...

- Isaiah Range recorded the first double-double of the season for the Hornets in the loss to Iowa State (11/16/21) on the road.
- He scored 15 points on 7-of-13 shooting from the floor, and grabbed 10 rebounds (eight of which were defensive rebounds) to lead Alabama State in both categories.

STRAWBRIDGE PLAYS BIG (LITERALLY) ON THE ROAD ...

- Kenny Strawbridge was forced into playing as a big on Saturday against Pepperdine (12/11/2021) and responded with his first double-double of the season.
- He finished game with 16 points (on 7-of-14 shooting from the floor) and grabbed 11 rebounds in the loss to the Wave.
- For the week, he averaged 15 points and nine rebounds per game (Samford and Pepperdine).

REYNA IMPRESSIVE THROUGH FIRST THREE GAMES TO START CAREER ...

- Juan Reyna continues to impress for Alabama State, becoming the first player this year to score in double figures in the first three games.
- He scored a career-high 16 against WKU (11/9/21), then added 10 against Vanderbilt (11/10/21) and another 10 against Missouri State (11/13/21) all on the road.

STRAWBRIDGE EARNS PRESEASON HONOR ...

- Alabama State redshirt sophomore Kenny Strawbridge (Rockford, III.) was named to the Second Team Preseason All-Conference team, announced by the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC).
- Strawbridge was second on the team in scoring last season at 10.5 points per game, scoring 189 total points in 18 games
 during the shortened season where the Hornets played conference-only games. He shot 35.9 (61-of-170) percent from the floor
 and 23.4 (11-of-47) percent from beyond the arc.
- The redshirt sophomore led the team from the free throw line, shooting 71.8 (56-of-78) percent from the free throw line.
 He was also second on the team in rebounding at 7.2 rebounds per game, grabbing 130 total including 32 offensive rebounds.
 Strawbridge also dished out 24 assists, recorded 14 steals and six blocked shots.
- He joins John Walker III (Texas Southern), Justin Hopkins (Texas Southern), MJ Randolph (Florida A&M), and Jayden Saddler (Southern) on the second team. The first team is made up of Preseason Player of the Year Jawaun Daniels (Prairie View A&M), Preseason Defensive Player of the Year Jayveous McKinnis (Jackson State), Cameron Christian (Grambling State), Garrett Hicks (Alabama A&M), and Jalen Johnson (Alabama A&M).

HORNETS PICKED EIGHTH IN THE PRESEASON SWAC POLL ...

- The Hornets were picked to finish eighth in the preseason poll on a vote from the league's head coaches and sports
 information directors with 125 total votes. They were just behind Alcorn State (128) in seventh and Florida A6M (138) in sixth.
- The top five included Texas Southern (237), Prairie View A&M (204), Jackson State (202), Grambling State (168), and Southern (167).

 Alabama State and Mo Williams will face three coaches with NBA experience this season including Penny Hardaway (Memphis), Jerry Stackhouse (Vanderbilt), and Reggie Theus (Bethune-Cookman).

YOUNG EARNS SWAC HONOR ...

- Alabama State junior forward Trace Young (Owensboro, Ky.) was named the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) Player
 of the Week after a pair of monster performances in conference action this week.
- Young averaged 25 points and eight rebounds per game over a pair of games against Bethune-Cookman and Florida A&M, leading Alabama State back from double-digit deficits in the second half of both games. The junior helped lead the Hornets to a 79-73 victory over Bethune-Cookman after scoring 21 points and grabbing eight rebounds, while also blocking a pair of shots. He finished the game shooting 50 (8-of-16) percent from the floor and 40 (2-of-5) percent from beyond the arc.
- He scored a career-high 29 points against Florida A&M in a 66-65 loss on Monday night, giving the Hornets the lead with 2:31 to play. The junior finished the night shooting 50 (8-of-16) percent from the floor and 90 (9-of-10) percent from the free throw line.
- For the week, Young shot 50 (16-of-32) perce

 Alabama State leads the Southwestern Athletic Conference in three different categories this season including free throw attempts, free throws made, and total rebounds.

O'NEAL RETURNED HOME LAST WEEKEND ...

- Alabama State sophomore forward Jordan O'Neal (Mobile, Ala.) returns home this weekend for the first time in his
 collegiate career.
- O'Neal started his high school career at B.C. Rain before transferring to Theodore, and comes home leading the team in blocked shots with 23.

REYNA PERFECT FROM THE LINE TO START THE YEAR ...

- Alabama State freshman Juan Reyna remains perfect from the to start his collegiate career through nine games in the regular season.
- The freshman connected on the first 17 of his free throw attempts before his streak was snapped with a pair of misses in a conference contest at home in first game back in 2022.

ALABAMA STATE IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY ...

- Alabama State ended non-conference play with back-to-back games against nationally-ranked teams in the state of Texas and in the Big 12.
- The Hornets faced two teams at the time were ranked and had another postponed (UCLA) due to COVID. They also faced an
 Iowa State team who is now ranked in the top 10, a team receiving votes (Iowa) and Memphis that was postponed.

REYNA GOES OFF ON THE ROAD AT GRAMBLING STATE ...

- The Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) announced the men's basketball weekly honors with Kenny Strawbridge?
 (Rockford, III.) earning Impact Player of the Week honors.
- Strawbridge averaged double figures over a pair of games for the Hornets. He scored 14 points on 4-of-9 shooting from the floor in a 74-64 loss to Samford, while also grabbing seven rebounds. He followed that up with 16 points on 7-of-14 shooting from the floor, while grabbing 11 rebounds to record his first double-double of the season. For the week, Strawbridge averaged 15.0 points and 9.0 rebounds per game.
- Meanwhile, Caleb Hunter of Mississippi Valley State was named the Player of the Week after averaging 18.5 points, 3.5
 assists and 3.0 rebounds per game in a pair of non-conference games.

LIDDELL EARNS SWAC HONOR (DECEMBER 29) ...

- Alabama State junior forward Gerald Liddell (Cibolo, Texas) was named the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) Impact
 Player of the Week after his performance against No. 16/17 Texas.
- Liddell, in his first year at Alabama State after transferring from the Longhorns' program, led the Hornets in the game with a team-high 16 points. He also added a pair of rebounds, one blocked shot and one steal against his former team.
- The junior currently leads the team in scoring at 11.7 points per game as the Hornets head into conference play. He is shootiing 45.0 (50-of-111) percent from the floor and 42.3 (11-of-26) percent from beyond the arc. He has scored in double figures in six games this season and is also averaging 4.8 rebounds per game.
- The award is the second for the Hornets' program in three weeks after Kenny Strawbridge (Rockford, III.) earned the award on December 15.

- Alabama State redshirt sophomore Kenny Strawbridge (Rockford, III.) was named the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) Player of the Week.
- Strawbridge earned the honor following a 27-point performance on the road against Mississippi Valley State for a shorthanded Alabama State team. He set a new career high by connecting on 68.8 (11-of-16) percent of his shots from the floor in helping end a 15-game road losing streak for the Hornets. He also finished the game shooting 66.7 (4-of-6) percent from beyond the arc, while grabbing four rebounds and recording three steals.
- For the week, the redshirt sophomore averaged 15.0 points and 3.0 rebounds (which including a non-conference game on the road at No. 25 Texas Tech), while shooting 52.2 (12-of-23) percent from the floor.

 to highlight the roles that HBCUs play in educating aspiring professionals and developing future leaders. The Bridge Builders
 Classic will serve as the "ultimate HBCU basketball experience" in the city of Mobile.

- Head coach Mo Williams missed four games this season beginning with the trip to Texas in December due to the birth of his


The Hornets had four players in double figures led by Trace Young (Owensboro, Ky.) and Jordan O'Neal (Mobile, Ala.) with 12 points each in the win. Young finished with a team-high seven rebounds and four steals in his first game in a Hornet uniform, while O'Neal finished with six rebounds and a pair of blocked shots.

Meanwhile, Isaiah Range (Cedar Hill, Texas) and Michael Barber (Jackson, Miss.) each added 10 points for Alabama State, with Barber collecting seven rebounds. Range added five rebounds and three assists in the win.

Alabama State shot 55.2 (16-of-29) percent from the floor in the second half to pull away from the Rams who had drawn to within 12 at the break. They ended the night shooting 50.9 (28-of-55) percent from the floor and 25.0 (4-of-16) percent from beyond the arc, while hitting 75.0 (12-of-16) percent from the free throw line.

The Hornets won every statistical category apart from second chance points (14-13), outrebounding Mobile 45-30 and added a 19-2 advantage on fast break points. The largest lead of the night for Alabama State was 27 with 9:11 remaining in the game, while went on a 12-0 scoring run midway through the first half to widen the margin.

Mobile was led by Sage McKenna with 14 points on the night.



GAME 2 WKU 79, Alabama State 74 November 9, 2021


BOWLING GREEN, Ky. | Trace Young (Owensboro, Ky.) narrowly missed a double-double at E.A. Diddle Arena on Tuesday night, but it wasn't enough to overcome a late Western Kentucky run as the Hilltoppers were able to escape with a 79-74 victory.

Young finished with a game-high 23 points on 56.3 (9-of16) percent shooting from the floor and grabbed nine rebounds in his debut for Alabama State, pacing three players in double figures for the Hornets. Juan Reyna (San Antonio, Texas) added 16 points in his collegiate debut, while Isaiah Range (Cedar Hill, Texas) added 14 points off the bench for the Hornets.

Alabama State (0-1) jumped ahead early and after WKU (1-0) tied the game at 5-all with 16:23 to play in the first half, they led until late in the second half. The Hilltoppers were able to take their first lead of the game with 4:02 remaining on one of their 17 free throws (out of 30 attempts) gave them a 64-63 lead. They were able to push the lead to seven (70-63) with 90 seconds to play before Alabama State trimmed it to four a pair of times.

The Hornets trimmed the lead to 75-72 with 21 seconds remaining on a pair of free throws by Reyna, one of nine (out of 11 attempts) by the Hornets. After WKU was able to extend the lead to 77-72, Alabama State answered with another two free throws by Reyna to get the deficit to 77-74 with nine seconds remaining before the Hilltoppers were able to put it away at the line.

Alabama State finished the night shooting 48.3 (28-of-58) percent from the floor and 40.9 (9-of-22) percent from beyond the arc, while WKU connected on 43.8 (28-of-64) percent from the floor and 31.6 (6-of-19) percent from beyond the arc.



GAME 3 Vanderbilt 91, Alabama State 72 November 10, 2021

NASHVILLE, Tenn. | Despite shooting 50 percent from the floor Wednesday night, Alabama State couldn't withstand a pair of runs by Vanderbilt falling to the Commodores 91-72 on Wednesday night.

Alabama State (0-2), playing their second road game in as many days, outshot the Commodores from the floor despite taking eight less shots on the night. The Hornets hit 50 (26-of-52) percent from the floor and 31.6 (6-of-19) percent from beyond the arc.

They also connected on 82.4 (14-of-17) percent from the free throw line, but it was the turnovers and a big first half run that put room between the two teams. Isaiah Range (Cedar Hill, Texas) added nine off the bench, while Jayme Mitchell (Jackson, Miss.) and Christian McCray (Las Vegas, Nev.) added eight each.

Jordan Wright led Vanderbilt with 16 points, while Jamaine Mann recorded a double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds. Scotty Pippen, Jr. added 15 and Stute 13 in the win. Vanderbilt finished the night shooting 45.3 (29-of-64) percent from the floor and 28.6 (8-of-28) percent from beyond the arc.

Missouri State 78, Alabama State 60 November 13, 2021

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. | Gerald Liddell (Cibolo. Texas) led four players in double figures for Alabama State as the Hornets dropped their third consecutive road game to open the season, falling to Missouri State 78-60 at JQH Arena on Saturday night.

Liddell finished the night 14 points on 6-of-13 shooting from the floor and picked up three steals, while Kenny Strawbridge (Rockford, III.) finished with 12 points on 5-of-10 shooting from the floor with a pair of blocked shots. Jordan O'Neal (Mobile, Ala.) chipped in with 11 points and a pair of blocked shots.

Juan Reyna (San Antonio, Texas) scored in double figures for the third consecutive game, adding 10 points with a pair of three-pointers for the Hornets who finished the night shooting 38.7 (24-of-62) percent from the floor. They also shot 21.1 (4-of-19) percent from beyond the arc and 66.7 (8-fo-12) percent from the free throw line.


The Hornets had a pair of chances to tie the game in the final three minutes but couldn't convert and turned the ball over three times which allowed Iowa State to pull away down the stretch.


GAME 9 North Alabama 81, Alabama State 69 November 28, 2021

Texas Southern (7-10, 5-3 SWAC) jumped out to an 8-0 lead before the Hornets could get on the board following the first media timeout with a McCray jumper with 14:56 to play in the opening half. Alabama State (4-15, 3-4 SWAC) continued to battle before tying the game at 21-all with 4:57 to play in the half.

Texas Southern was able to push the lead back to three at 24-21 before Alabama State went on a 5-0 run to take their first lead of the game. A jumper by Jordan O'Neal (Mobile, Ala.) pulled the Hornets to within one at 24-23 with 4:12 to play in the half, before Range gave them the lead at 25-24 with 3:34 to play in the half. Texas Southern was able to close the half on 5-1 run to take a 29-26 halftime lead.

The second half started out much the same way as Texas Southern raced out to a 10-point lead with 14:06 to play in the game before Alabama State was able to pull back to within five at 46-41 with 11:28 to play. The teams traded baskets over the next six minutes before Alabama State used a Range jumper with 5:25 to play (57-53). From that point, Texas Southern was able to put the game away with free throws.



GAME 22 Alabama State 79, B-CU 73 January 29, 2022

MOBILE, Ala. | Alabama State trailed by double digits with just under seven minutes to play in the game, before erasing the deficit for a 79-73 victory over Bethune-Cookman in Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) in the Bridge Builders Classic.

Alabama State trailed 65-55 with 6:54 to play in the game before a Kevion Stewart (Memphis, Tenn.) three-pointer with 4:56 to play gave the Hornets a 66-65 lead. They continued the 13-0 run on a Trace Young (Owensboro, Ky.) dunk with 4:12 to play before holding off a rally from Bethune-Cookman down the stretch.

Young finished the night with 21 points and eight rebounds while hitting on 50 (8-of-16) percent of his shots from the floor including a pair of three-pointers. Kenny Strawbridge (Rockford, III.) finished 2ith 11 points and a pair of assists, while E.J. Clark (Dallas, Texas) finished with 10 points and four assists for Alabama State (5-15. 4-4 SWAC).

Alabama State finished the night shooting 48.3 (29-of-60) percent from the floor and 40.0 (6-of-15) percent from beyond the arc. They also connected on 75 (15-of-20) percent from the free throw line.

Meanwhile, Joe French led Bethune-Cookman (5-15, 3-5 SWAC) with 27 points and Marcus Garrett 24.

GAME 23 Florida A&M 66, Alabama State 65 January 31, 2022


MONTGOMERY, Ala. | Trace Young (Owensboro, Ky.) had a career-night against Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) leading Florida A6M, but the Hornets couldn't hold the lead in the waning seconds after battling back from a double-digit effort falling 66-65 at the Dunn-Oliver Acadome on Monday night.

Young finished with a career-high 29 points and grabbed eight rebounds for the Hornets, including knocking down a three-pointer with just 2:31 to play in the contest to give Alabama State their first lead at 65-64. The two teams each missed opportunities before Florida A&M turned a missed shot with just under 40 seconds left into a pair of free throws by Bryce Moragne with just 21 seconds to play to give the Rattlers a one-point lead.

Alabama State (5·15, 4·5 SWAC) had a chance to win the game in the final seconds but a shot fell short at the buzzer giving Florida A&M the win.

The Hornets battled back from a double-digit deficit for the second time in as many games, trailing by as many as 14 twice in the game including early in the second half before the rally.

Young was the lone player in double figures for Alabama State as he finished the night shooting 8-of-16 from the floor including four three-pointers. He also connected on 9-of-10 from the charity stripe in the loss for Alabama State who finished the night shooting 35.6 (21-of-59) percent from the floor and 33.3 (7-of-21) percent from beyond the arc. They also shot 69.6 (16-of-23) percent from the free throw line.



GAME 24 Alabama State 80, Grambling State 72 February 5, 2022

GRAMBLING, La. | Juan Reyna (San Antonio, Texas) had a career day and Alabama State held a double-digit lead for most of their road Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) game against Grambling State, pulling away for an 80-72 victory on Saturday.

Reyna, who missed just one shot on the night, finished with a career-high 25 points on 7-of-8 shooting from the floor (4-of-5 from beyond the arc) and was perfect from the free throw line (7-of-7) for the Hornets who led for all but 42 seconds on the day. The freshman was one of three players in double figures including E.J. Clark (Dallas, Texas) with 13 points (with seven rebounds) and Kenny Strawbridge (Rockford, III.) 11.

The game was tied at 0-all until Gerald Liddell (Cibolo, Texas) hit a three-pointer with 19:18 to play in the game to break the tie and give Alabama State the lead that it would not relinquish. They started the game on an 11-2 run over the first five minutes and pushed the lead to 18 on a three-pointer from Reyna with 4:24 to play in the half. The Hornets withstood a 10-0 Grambling State (9-13, 7-3 SWAC) run to close the first half to take a 39-31 lead into the locker room.

The two teams struggled to start the second half before Isaiah Range hit a layup with 18:59 to play in the contest to give Alabama State a 41-31 lead. The Hornets outscored Grambling State 20-10 over the next eight minutes to push the lead to 61-41, before back-to-back tip-ins by Clark and Jordan O'Neal (Mobile, Ala.) pushed the lead to 25 at 66-41.

Alabama State (6-16, 5-5 SWAC) finished the night shooting 46.4 (26-of-56) percent from the floor and 56.3 (9-of-16) from beyond the arc. They also shot 73.1 (19-of-26) percent from the free throw line, while assisting on 13 of the team's 26 baskets and grabbing 40 rebounds.
