HORNETS OPEN ROBINSON ERA AT THE MEAC-SWAC CHALLENGE

- » **HORNETS OPEN SEASON IN ATLANTA:** Alabama State opens the 2022 season against Howard University in the **MEAC-SWAC Challenge** at Center Parc Stadium in Atlanta. The game will be televised on ESPN with kickoff set for 6:05 p.m. (CT).
- » **MEAC-SWAC CHALLENGE:** Alabama State is making its first-ever appearance in the MEAC-SWAC Challenge. The MEAC holds an 11-4 record in the series, winning the last two meetings. The last win by a SWAC school was a 40-24 Prairie View A&M win over North Carolina Central in 2018.
- » **INSIDE THE SERIES:** This is the 2nd meeting on the gridiron between Alabama State and Howard University. The Hornets claimed a 27-12 win over Howard in 2004.
- » **HORNETS ON THE TUBE** The MEAC-SWAC Challenge against Howard University marks the first of five games that will air on the ESPN family of networks with the first three contests set to be televised. Following the season opener, Miles College pays a visit to ASU Stadium on Sept. 3 for the Labor Day Classic and that will be on ESPN+ at 5 p.m. Game three has Alabama State traveling out west to UCLA on Sept. 10 at 4 p.m. CST on the PAC-12 network. The Hornets welcome Jackson State on Oct. 8 at 2 p.m. on ESPN, while the ESPN network is to be announced for the Magic City Classic on Oct. 29, at 2:30 p.m. against Alabama A&M. Alabama State's annual Turkey Day Classic will air on ESPN+ when the Hornets play host to Arkansas-Pine Bluff at 2 p.m. Overall the SWAC will see 29 games on various ESPN networks, including the 2022 Cricket SWAC Football Championship on ESPN2 on Dec. 3.
- » **PRESEASON ALL-SWAC:** The SWAC announced its 2022 Preseason All-Conference Football selections during SWAC Football Media Day in Birmingham, Ala. Safety **Irshaad Davis** and offensive lineman **Robert Alston IV** were First-Team Preseason All-SWAC selections. Davis posted a team-high 67 tackles (13th SWAC), 40 solo stops, on the way to garnering Second-Team All-SWAC honors in 2021. Davis tied for third in the SWAC with three interceptions and had six tackles for loss and two sacks.
- » **NEW PLAY CALLER:** Harry Williams Jr. joined the staff in the spring as the offensive coordinator and will also tutor the quarterbacks. Williams comes over from Morehouse College where he served as the offensive coordinator for the Maroon Tigers.
- » **#SWARMAS1 DEFENSE:** Ryan Lewis was promoted to defensive coordinator from special teams coordinator in July and will remain coaching the inside linebackers. Lewis came to ASU from Bethune-Cookman where he served as the special teams Coordinator and linebackers coach. Lewis was the Associate Head Coach at Edward Waters College before B-C while also serving as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach.
- » **GRESHAM PROMOTED:** Billy Gresham was promoted to special teams coordinator after Ryan Lewis' promotion to defensive coordinator. Gresham is in his fifth year at Alabama State, and is in his second year coaching the outside linebackers.

SERIES NOTEBOOK: HOWARD UNIVERSITY

- **Alabama State** and **Howard University** meet for just the **2nd** time on the gridiron. **Delta State** defeated **Howard** 27-12, in the only meeting to date in 2004
- The **Bison** enter their third season under head coach **Larry Scott**, (South Florida, 2000) who is 3-10 in two seasons.
- Scott is a Sebring, Fla., native having spent a majority of his coaching career in the state of Florida He attended (1997-99) and coached (2006-12) at South Florida as well as Miami (2013-15) and most recently Florida (2018-2020). Prior to joining the Florida coaching staff, Scott was a member of the staff at the University of Tennessee (2016-17).
- Howard was picked fifth in the MEAC Preseason Poll behind South Carolina State, North Carolina Central, Delaware State, Howard and Morgan State.
- The Bison placed seven players on the 2022 Preseason All-MEAC First-Team, Senior receiver **Antoine Murray** and sophomore offensive lineman **Darius Fox** represent HU on the offensive side while defensive lineman **Darren Brokenburr** and defensive back **Kenny Gallop**. Running backs **Ian Wheeler** and **Jarett Hunter** and offensive lineman **Deshawn Ingram** were named to the Preseason All-MEAC Second-Team. Hunter and Wheeler are the one-two punch in the Bison backfield. Hunter rushed for 625 yards on 137 attempts and three touchdowns and Wheeler rushed 65 times for 443 yards and eight touchdowns. Wheeler amassed a team-high 629 receiving yards and was second with 33 catches. Gallop topped the team with 75 tackles (2nd MEAC), 45 solos, two tackles for loss and four pass breakups. Brokenburr lead HU with 3.5 sacks along with 23 stops and four TFLs.

NEWS, NOTES, & SIDEBAR STATS

➔ **EAST-WEST SHRINE BOWL 1000 LIST:** The East-West Shrine Bowl announced its list of all-star game-eligible players from the SWAC, MEAC, Big South, and CIAA, who were determined eligible for the 1000 List for the 2023 East-West Shrine Bowl, and the 2023 NFL Draft. Alabama State's **Naytron Culpepper** and cornerback **Keenan Issac** are among 16 SWAC players with the potential to receive an invitation to play in the 2023 East-West Shrine Bowl on Feb. 2 in Las Vegas, Nev. Culpepper was a Second-Team All-SWAC selection and a **BOXTOROW** All-American in 2021. The Miami, Fla., native started five games at defensive back, registering 15 tackles, including a season-high seven tackles against Mississippi Valley and five tackles against Jackson State. Isaac saw action in just two games after offseason surgery, finishing with five tackles, all against Mississippi Valley State in his return. In 2019, Isaac started 11 games at cornerback, finishing as the team's third leading tackler with 55, including 44 solos. The Midfield, Ala., native recorded four tackles for loss, totaling 19 yards, and had eight pass breakups and one quarterback hurry. Isaac registered a season-high nine tackles twice, against Tuskegee and Texas Southern.

➔ **FCS PUNTER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST:** Punter **Aubrey Grace** was named to the Augusta Sports Council's preseason watch list for the 2022 FCS Punter of the Year Award, which honors the nation's top collegiate FCS punter. Grace earned **BOXTOROW** All-American and All-SWAC Second-Team honors in 2021. The Pike Road High product was among the nation's best in punting with a 41.1-yard average, averaging a season-best 48 yards per punt against Mississippi Valley State. Additionally, Grace forced three fair catches and pinned seven punts inside the 20 and nine of over 50 yards. The 22 candidates on the list incorporate a broad spectrum of Football Championship Series (FCS) punters. \

➔ **SWAC PRESEASON POLL:** The league's 2022 predicted order of Finish announced Jackson State (116) as the top pick in the SWAC Eastern Division. Florida A&M (108), Alabama A&M (87), **Alabama State (60)**, Bethune-Cookman (56), and Mississippi Valley State (35) make up the East Division rankings. Southern (111) was tabbed to finish first-place in the SWAC Western Division. Alcorn State (110), Prairie View A&M (82), Grambling State (77), Arkansas-Pine Bluff (42), and Texas Southern (40) round out the West Division rankings.

➔ **REMEMBERING AWYSUM HARRIS:** The Hornets will wear an **AH** sticker on their helmets throughout the 2022 season in remembrance of sophomore linebacker (#50) **Awysum Harris** of Decatur, Ala. Harris passed away from natural causes in July.

➔ **HBCU POWER RANKINGS:** **Alabama State** is ranked **15th** in the NCAA HBCU Preseason Power Rankings. The Hornets finished 16th in the final 2021 HBCU Power Rankings. Howard went 3-8 in 2021 is nipping at ASU's heels at No. 16 after the Bison were 19th in 2021. Jackson State tops the poll followed by Florida A&M (2nd) and Alabama A&M (4th). Alcorn State (6th), Southern (7th), and Prairie View A&M (10th) round out the SWAC representatives in the top 10. Other SWAC Schools in the poll are: Grambling State (13th), Bethune-Cookman (17th), Mississippi Valley State (18th), Texas Southern (19th) and Arkansas-Pine Bluff (20th).

➔ **SWAC GO:** The Allen Media Group (AMG) free-streaming digital platform, HBCU GO -- the leading media provider for the nation's 107 Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) -- proudly announced nationwide clearance for their 2022-23 sports season as part of the new carriage deal with CBS owned-and-operated duopoly stations. Alabama State at Bethune-Cookman University on November 5th is one of 11 SWAC football games on **HBCUGO.TV**.

➔ **BOXTOROW RANKINGS:** **Alabama State** received votes in the **BOXTOROW** Preseason HBCU Media Poll. Jackson State edged South Carolina State for the top spot with Florida A&M in third. Alabama A&M, Prairie View A&M Alcorn State and Southern University make up the 6-9 spots.

➔ **THE GRAND DADDY OF THEM ALL:** Alabama State travels to Pasadena, California, to take on PAC 12 member UCLA on Saturday, Sept. 10. The Bruins play their home games in Rose Bowl Stadium and the game will be broadcast on the PAC 12 Network at 4 p.m. (CT).

➔ **NEW TURF TO DEFEND:** Hornet fans and alumni will experience a fresh new look with the installation of new FieldTurf at ASU Stadium. The **FieldTurf Vertex CORE** is the latest in turf technology and was installed before summer football camp by FieldTurf Inc. Eddie Robinson, Jr. was named the 30th head coach in Alabama State University on November 26, 2021, returning to his alma mater.

A native of Louisiana, Robinson was born and raised in New Orleans. He attended Brother Martin High School, graduating in 1988. He furthered his education attending Alabama State University on an academic scholarship. He earned a Bachelor's degree in chemistry in 1994.

He lettered in football all four years and earned All-SWAC honors and SWAC Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1990 and 1991, Sheridan Broadcasting Network All-America honors in 1990 and 1991, as well as Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1991 as a linebacker for the Hornets. Robinson also achieved academic All Conference honors and was recognized as The Toyota Leadership Award recipient in 1990. In 1998, he became the youngest individual to be inducted into the SWAC Hall of Fame at 28 years old, and in 2012 he was recognized as a MEAC/SWAC Challenge Legend.

Robinson was the Houston Oilers' second round pick in the 1992 NFL draft, the 50th player selected.

He was a stalwart in the community during his 11-year NFL career, playing with the Houston Oilers (1992–1995), Jacksonville Jaguars (1996–1997), Tennessee Titans (1998–2001) and Buffalo Bills (2002); appearing in Super Bowl XXXIV with the Titans in 2000. He finished his career with 850, 23 sacks and six interceptions. Robinson received the Titans Unsung Hero award for the Tennessee Titans during his career. He was the ultimate professional and obtained the nick name "Steady Eddie" for his methodical preparation and on field knowledge of the game, receiving accolades from his coaching staff and teammates for his leadership skills and attention to detail.

Robinson retired from the NFL following the 2002 season and entered the business world, and is currently the owner/manager of Magnolia River LLC Real Estate Investment Company.

He was a college football analyst for Fox Sports South, ESPNU, ESPN3 and Comcast Sports South from 2005 until 2014. In addition he was a co-host on a regionally televised weekly sports show INSIDE SWAC from 2006 to 2009, and continues to broadcast collegiate football games on the radio and appears on sports podcast as a featured guest.

Robinson possesses more than 30 plus years of experience at various levels of Football. He is a stellar ASU Alumnus and a man of vision who has a proven record of success. He assisted ASU in establishing its Football Hall of Fame and has been a consistent supporter of ASU athletic programs financially and by supporting athletic administrations and coaches.

He has worked to support the mission of HBCU's academically and athletically.

He has hosted Youth Football camps at Alabama State University, Texas Southern University and in his Houston Third Ward community. Robinson regularly speaks to high school students and young athletes promoting life skills and planning for success. He is an NFL Ambassador for USA Football helping to promote the game of football to parents and young football players. He mentored and coached an inner-city baseball league in the Sunnyside neighborhood of Houston, and incorporated a program to help young African-American baseball players achieve youth and high school success in baseball with a goal of playing baseball in college and professionally. Two of his players have signed college scholarships to play college baseball with others expected to follow this path and all have plans to attend college. He volunteers his time with the Houston school districts' Real Men Read program, reading to elementary school kids, and sharing his keys to success.

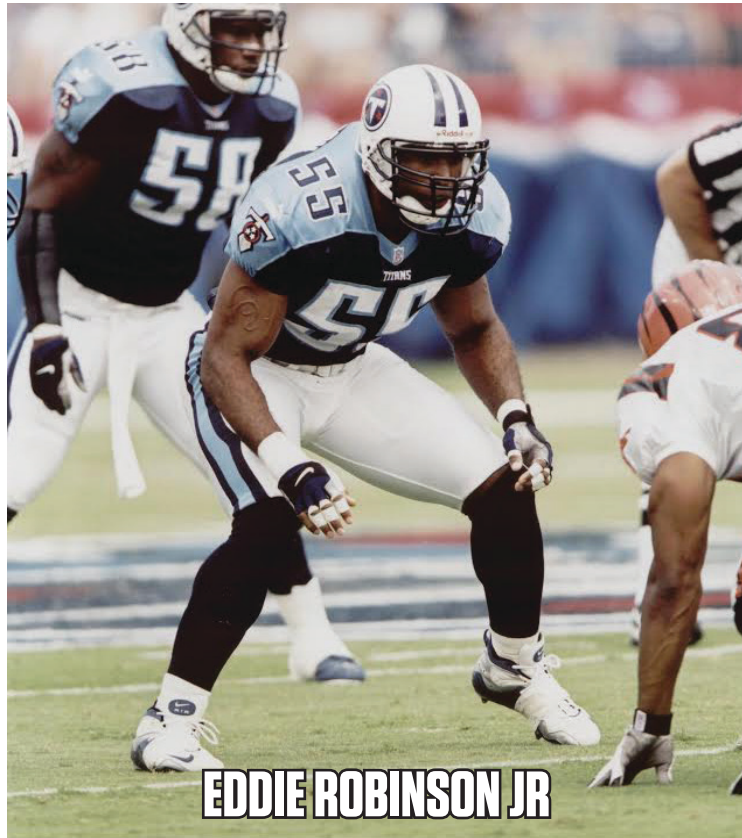

STADIUM INFORMATION

ASU Stadium on the campus of Alabama State University in Montgomery, Alabama, is a 26,500-seat stadium that replaced the Cramton Bowl in 2012 as the host venue for the Alabama State Hornets football team. The first game in the New ASU Stadium was the 89th Turkey Day Classic on November 22, 2012 in which the Hornets hosted the Tuskegee Golden Tigers. The game was a sell-out and was televised nationally on ESPNU.

The stadium's current capacity sits at 26,500 but the project was designed to allow for future expansion that can expand the capacity to 55,000.

The stadium also holds a restaurant and retail space which welcome visitors to the stadium and area 365 days a year.
