HORNETS RETURN HOME TO OPEN SWAC SCHEDULE

- HORNETS SET TO OPEN SWAC PLAY: Alabama State University welcomes Prairie View A&M to open SWAC play at ASU Stadium on Sat,, Sept. 24, 2022. The game will be broadcast on WSFA 12.2 (Bounce TV) with kick off slated for 5 p.m. (CST).
- ► INSIDE THE SERIES: This is the 38th meeting between Alabama State and Prairie View A&M with the Hornets holding a 27-9-1 lead in the series. Prairie View has dominated the series winning the last seven meetings dating back to a 48-42 win by the Hornets in 2013. The Panthers have outscored the Hornets 240-104 which is an average of 14.8-34.2 points per game over the last seven games and 134-43 in the last three games played at ASU Stadium.
- ◆ FORMER TEAMMATES COLLIDE: Alabama State Head Coach Eddie Robinson Jr. and Prairie View A&M Head Coach Bubba McDowell were teammates with the Houston Oilers (now Tennessee Titans) from 1992-1994. Robinson was a 1992 second-round draft pick of the Oilers, playing from 1992-1995. Houston drafted McDowell in 1987, where he would play until 1994 before concluding his career with the expansion Carolina Panthers.
- REMEMBERING AWYSUM HARRIS: The Hornets will wear an AH sticker on their helmets and the number 50 jersey and helmet will be displayed in his locker throughout the 2022 season in remembrance of sophomore linebacker (#50) Awysum Harris of Decatur, Ala. Additionally, the jersey will accompany the team and rest on the defensive bench during each game.
- ◆ HOME SWEET NEST: The Hornets are celebrating the 10th anniversary of ASU Stadium in 2022. Alabama State has won seven straight at home after a 21-13 win over Miles College on Sept. 3. ASU's last setback was a 14-7 loss to South Carolina State on April 3, 2021. The Hornets are 28-16 since ASU Stadium became home in 2012.
- PASSING THE WEALTH: Dematrius Davis and Myles Crawley have combined for 46 completions to 15 different receivers. Crawley has completed 56 percent of his passes (6th/SWAC) and has 400 passing yards (7th/SWAC). Isaiah Scott has a team-high eight catches for 169 yards (8th/SWAC). La'Vontae Shenault follows with 139 yards (10th/SWAC) and five receptions. Jacory Merritt-Croskey is the top target out of the backfield with five grabs for 57 yards. Crawley's 56.5 completion percentage is 6th in the SWAC and his 8.6 completions per game are 10th in the SWAC. Overall the Hornets' passing attack is 3rd in the SWAC in passing yards per game (229.7) while the quarterbacks 60.5 combined completion percentage ranks 3rd.
- #SWARMAS1 D: The Hornets are off to a solid start defensively. ASU ranks 2nd total defense (326.0/16th FSC), 3rd in scoring defense (23.7) and pass defense, (123.0), 5th in rush defense (155.3) and 6th in sacks (7). Linebacker Colton Adams is 12th in the SWAC with 18 tackles. The Hornets' 103.7 pass defense efficiency ranks 2nd in the SWAC (10th FCS). Alabama State has also been pretty good with a 34.2 third down conversion defense which ranks 4th in the SWAC (31st FCS).

- PRESEASON ALL-SWAC: The SWAC announced its 2022 Preseason All-Conference Football selections during SWAC Football Media Day in Birmingham, Ala. Safety Irshaad Davis and offensive lineman Robert Alston IV were First-Team Preseason All-SWAC selections. Davis posted a team-high 67 tackles (13th SWAC), 40 solo stops, on the way to garnering Second-Team All-SWAC honors in 2021. Davis tied for third in the SWAC with three interceptions and had six tackles for loss and two sacks.
- ◆ SWAC PRESEASON POLL: The league's 2022 predicted order of Finish announced Jackson State (116) as the top pick in the SWAC Eastern Division. Florida A&M (108), Alabama A&M (87), Alabama State (60), Bethune-Cookman (56), and Mississippi Valley State (35) make up the East Division rankings. Southern (111) was tabbed to finish first-place in the SWAC Western Division. Alcorn State (110), Prairie View A&M (82), Grambling State (77), Arkansas-Pine Bluff (42), and Texas Southern (40) round out the West Division rankings.

SERIES NOTEBOOK: PRAIRIE VIEW A&M

- ► Alabama State and Prairie View A&M meet for the 38th time on the gridiron with the Hornets holding a 27-9-1 record in the series.
- ► The Panthers have won the last seven meetings, including three straight at ASU Stadium and have outscored ASU 240-104 over the last seven meetings and 124-43 in the last three games played in Montgomery, Ala.
- ▶ The Panthers dropped a 31-14 decision to Incarnate Word on Saturday to fall to 1-2 overall. UIW scored 20 first half points and 11 third quarter points before yielding a fourth quarter score. Minus starter **Trazon Connelly**, PV quarterbacks combined to complete 4-of-16 passes for 69 yards while rushing attack amassed 211 yards and pair of touchdowns. Antoine Ahmad rushed 15 times for 95 yards and two touchdowns for the Panters. Offensively, UIW piled up 491 yards offensive that inlouded 283 passing and 208 rushing. Dejuan Lewis led the Panther defense with 11 tackles, five solo stops on the day.
- ▶ **Bubba McDowell**, is off to a 2-1 start in his first season at the helm of Prairie View A&M and is 1-0 in the in the SWAC. The former NFL defensive standout is in his 11th season as a part of the Prairie View A&M coaching staff to include four seasons as an assistant head coach. He also coached the Panther cornerbacks the last three seasons.

NEWS. NOTES. & SIDEBAR STATS

- ➡ BEHIND ENEMY LINES: The Hornets are 6th in the SWAC and 35th in FCS with 2.33 sacks per game while the 7.3 tackles for loss are 5th in the SWAC (23rd FCS). Steffon Young-Rolle ranks 2nd in the SWAC with 3.0 sacks while ranking 3rd with 1.0 sacks per contest (19th FCS). Brandon Gaddy is T3rd in the SWAC with 3.0 solo tackles and 4.0 TFLs. Adrian Maddox is T4th with 3.5 tackles for loss and is 3rd with 3.0 solo TFLs. Gaddy's 2.0 solo sacks are T3rd and his .67 sacks per game are T6th in the conference.
- PASS DEFENSE: The Hornets' 103.76 pass defense efficiency is 2nd in the SWAC (10th FGS) while the 56.3 completion percentage against is the 3rd lowest in the SWAC ASU is yielding 170 yards per game passing, standing 3rd in the SWAC (17th FGS) Naytron Culpepper and Keenan Isaac ranks 3rd in the SWAC in passes broken up with three apiece.
- THE TURNOVER BATTLE: Alabama State's -2.33 turnover margin is 11th in the SWAC while its four turnovers gained are 9th. Adrian Maddox's two interceptions are 2nd in the conference while Rodney Echols Jr. and Maddox are T1st with one fumble recovered (10th FGS).
- SPECIAL TEAMS: Returner Robert McMinn is averaging 8.3 yards per punt return, ranking 4th in the conference while his 94 combined kick return yards rank 6th. McMinn also ranks 11th in the SWAC with 17.8 yards per kickoff return. Aubrey Grace is 4th in the SWAC, averaging 39.6 yards a punt while his four punts inside the opponent's 20 are tied for 2nd in the SWAC in punts.
- BOXTOROW RANKINGS: Alabama State moved to sixth in the BOXTOROW Coaches Poll but fell to ninth in the media version of the poll. Jackson State tops both polls while Alcorn State is fourth and Prairie View A&M seventh in the Coaches Poll. Florida A&M (6th) and Alabama State are the only other SWAC Schools in the Media Poll
- HBCU TOP 50 NFL: Keenan Issac and Irshaad Davis garnered a lot of preseason attention after recently being named to Jordan Reid's ESPN Top 50 HBCU NFL Prospects. Isaac is ranked 18th while Davis is listed at 32nd on the list.
- BOXTOROW AA: Irshaad Davis was named to the BOXTOROW Preseason HBCU All-American list. The SWAC dominated the list with 15 selections out of the 28 players named to the team.
- ◆ EAST-WEST SHRINE BOWL 1000 LIST: The East-West Shrine Bowl announced its list of all-star game-eligible players from the SWAC, MEAC, Big South, and CIAA, who were determined eligible for the 1000 List for the 2023 East-West Shrine Bowl, and the 2023 NFL Draft. Alabama State's Naytron Culpepper and cornerback Keenan Issac are among 16 SWAC players with the potential to receive an invitation to play in the 2023 East-West Shine Game on Feb. 2 in Las Vegas, Nev.
- ◆ FGS PUNTER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST: Punter Aubrey Grace was named to the Augusta Sports Council's preseason watch list for the 2022 FGS Punter of the Year Award, which honors the nation's top collegiate FGS punter. Grace earned BOXTOROW All-American and All-SWAC Second-Team honors in 2021. The Pike Road High product was among the nation's best in punting with a 41.1-yard average, averaging a season-best 48 yards per punt against Mississippi Valley State. Additionally, Grace forced three fair catches and pinned seven punts inside the 20 and nine of over 50 yards. The 22 candidates on the list incorporate a broad spectrum of Football Championship Series (FGS) punters.
- HBCU POWER RANKINGS: Alabama State moved from 15th to 10th in the NCAA HBCU Power Rankings. The Hornets finished

- 16th in the final 2021 HBCU Power Rankings. Jackson State tops the poll followed by South Carolina State (2), Tennessee State (3), North Carolina Central (4), and Southern (5). Alcorn State (6), Florida A&M (7), North Carolina A&T (8) and Alabama State (10) round out the top 10.



Eddie Robinson, Jr. was named the 30th head coach in Alabama State University on November 26, 2021, returning to his alma mater.

A native of Louisiana, Robinson was born and raised in New Orleans, He attended Brother Martin High School, graduating in 1988. He furthered his education attending Alabama State University on an academic scholarship. He earned a Bachelor's degree in chemistry in 1994.

He lettered in football all four years and earned All-SWAC honors and SWAC Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1990 and 1991, Sheridan Broadcasting Network All-America honors in 1990 and 1991, as well as Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1991 as a linebacker for the Hornets. Robinson also achieved academic All Conference honors and was recognized as The Toyota Leadership Award recipient in 1990. In 1998, he became the youngest individual to be inducted into the SWAC Hall of Fame at 28 years old, and in 2012 he was recognized as a MEAC/SWAC Challenge Legend.

Robinson was the Houston Oilers' second round pick in the 1992 NFL draft, the 50th player selected.

He was a stalwart in the community during his 11-year NFL career, playing with the Houston Oilers (1992-1995), Jacksonville Jaguars (1996-1997), Tennessee Titans (1998-2001) and Buffalo Bills (2002): appearing in Super Bowl XXXIV with the Titans in 2000. He finished his career with 850 tackles, 23 sacks and six interceptions. Robinson received the Titans Unsung Hero award for the Tennessee Titans during his career. He was the ultimate professional and obtained the knick name "Steady Eddie" for his methodical preparation and on field knowledge of the game, receiving accolades from his coaching staff and teammates for his leadership skills and attention to detail.

Robinson retired from the NFL following the 2002 season and entered the business world, and is currently the owner/manager of Magnolia River LLC Real Estate Investment Company.

He was a college football analyst for Fox Sports South, ESPNU, ESPN3 and Comcast Sports South from 2005 until 2014. In addition he was a co-host on a regionally televised weekly sports show INSIDE SWAC from 2006 to 2009, and continues to broadcast collegiate football games on the radio and appears on sports podcast as a featured guest.

Robinson possesses more than 30 plus years of experience at various levels of Football. He is a stellar ASU Alumnus and a man of vision who has a proven record of success. He assisted ASU in establishing its Football Hall of Fame and has been a consistent supporter of ASU athletic programs financially and by supporting athletic administrations and coaches.

He has worked to support the mission of HBCU's academically and athletically.


He has hosted Youth Football camps at Alabama State University, Texas Southern University and in his Houston Third Ward community. Robinson regularly speaks to high school students and young athletes promoting life skills and planning for success. He is an NFL Ambassador for USA Football helping to promote the game of football to parents and young football players. He mentored and coached an inner-city baseball league in the Sunnyside neighborhood of Houston, and incorporated a program to help young African-American baseball players achieve youth and high school success in baseball with a goal of playing baseball in college and professionally. Two of his players have signed college scholarships to play college baseball with others expected to follow this path and all have plans to attend college. He volunteers his time with the Houston school districts' Real Men Read program, reading to elementary school kids, and sharing his keys to success.



The first game in the New ASU Stadium was the 89th Turkey Day Classic on November 22, 2012 in which the Hornets hosted the Tuskegee Golden Tigers. The game was a sell-out and was televised nationally on ESPNU.

The stadium's current capacity sits at 26,500 but the project was designed to allow for future expansion that can expand the capacity to 55,000.

The stadium also holds a restaurant and retail space which welcome visitors to the stadium and area 365 days a year.




