/// KICKOFF COVERAGE ///

- Tuskegee (6-2, 5-1 SIAC) will face off against Alabama State (6-4, 5-3 SWAC) on Thursday, November 23, at 2 p.m., in the Turkey Day Classic for the final game of the 2023 season at ASU Stadium.
- Fans can watch live on ESPN+, with Butch Alsandor (play-by-play) and Jorge Vargas (analyst), as well as listen live on the Black College Sports Network with Frank Lee (play-by-play) and Ken Woodard and Kindric Hooks (analysts).
- The Golden Tigers have dominated the series with Alabama State historically, leading 62-38-3. The series has been back-and-forth of late, as the programs have split the last ten meetings, while Tuskegee holds a 14-11 edge in the last 25 meetings against the Hornets. The first game played between the two teams was in 1901, with Tuskegee winning, 37-0. Alabama State took the last matchup, earning a Turkey Day Classic win in 2021 with a 43-9 result in Montgomery.
- Tuskegee and Alabama State will be meeting for the 104th time for the second-most played series in school history, trailing only Morehouse (113), while being ahead of Clark Atlanta (83), Miles (66) and Morris Brown (54) to round out the five longest in TU history.
- As announced by the conference on Tuesday, November 14, a duo of Tuskegee student-athletes were named First-Team All-SIAC, and four more were named as Second-Team All-SIAC honorees.
- Sophomore defenders **Mikael King** and **Malik Moore** both earned first team All-SIAC honors, while sophomore OL **Damion Clark**, senior P **Ryan Duff**, sophomore WR **Antonio Meeks**, and junior S **Christian Ramsey** all earned second team honors.

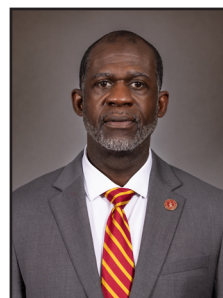

Aaron James enters his second season with the program and first at the helm after being named the 18th head coach of Tuskegee University.

In his first season returning to his alma mater as the offensive coordinator, James helped the Golden Tigers to a turnaround season in 2022 with an 8-3 record, including 7-0 in the SIAC and reaching the SIAC Championship game. Under his watch, Tuskegee gained 3,676 total yards of offense and 39 touchdowns, led by a pair of running backs who ran for over 1,500 total rushing yards combined, while Bryson Williams led the way through the air as the team passed for 1,921 yards and 16 touchdowns.

He also coached three All-SIAC performers in 2022, in First Team running back Taurean Taylor, Second Team center Nathan Harrison, and Second Team receiver Antonio Meeks.

A 2022 participant in the NFL Coaching Academy, James returns to his alma mater after a year as the offensive coordinator at Bethune-Cookman. With the Wildcats, James coached tight end standout Kemari Averett, who earned All-SWAC First Team, AFCA/FCS Coaches All-American First Team, Stats Perform FCS All-American Second Team, and HERO All-American Second Team honors. Prior to his stop in the SWAC, James spent nine years at SIAC conference member Miles where he served as the offensive coordinator, a role he was in for three years with the Golden Bears before serving as the quarterback coach for eight of the nine seasons, along with serving as the wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator previously.

During his time with the Golden Bears, James coached 24 players who earned All-SIAC honors in his nine seasons, including 12 First Team and 12 Second Team honorees. Running back Justin Hardy highlighted the honorees by winning SIAC MVP, Offensive Player of the Year, and earning First Team honors in 2017. James has also been a part of four SIAC championship squads, in 2011, 2015, 2018, and 2019, while also coaching on the 2012 team that made Miles' first-ever Division II playoff appearance. He was instrumental in helping quarterback David Whipple earn First Team All-SIAC honors in 2016. His final year at Miles, the offense averaged better than 28 points per game in 2019 while going 9-3 en route to a conference championship and D2 playoff berth.

James has also been a part of four SIAC championship squads, in 2011, 2015, 2018, and 2019, while also coaching on the 2012 team that made Miles' first-ever Division II playoff appearance. He was instrumental in helping quarterback David Whipple earn First Team All-SIAC honors in 2016. His final year at Miles, the offense averaged better than 28 points per game in 2019 while going 9-3 en route to a conference championship and D2 playoff berth. James brings a wealth of experience and knowledge to the coaching staff, after serving as former quarterbacks coach at Lane College. His career also includes a stay at Clark Atlanta as their quarterback coach and a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Tuskegee, and an assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Bullock County High School. James was a star quarterback for Tuskegee from 1998-2001, where he compiled an impressive record of 42-5 as a starter. He has the most wins of any signal-caller in school history.

Golden Tigers history. He won three SIAC championships during his career, led the Golden Tigers to a 12-0 season and HBCU National Championship in 2000, was an All-Conference selection after the 2001 season and played professionally for the Alabama Lightning of the NAFL in 2004, where he led the league in passing yards and touchdowns. His 91-yard touchdown run record from scrimmage is atop the Golden Tigers list. James is a native of Pritchard, Alabama and a graduate of Tuskegee, where he holds a Bachelor's degree in History. He is married to Rosie James and he has two daughters, Erin Morrisette and Layla James.

SCOUTING ALABAMA STATE

- Alabama State is 2nd in the SWAC in fewest sacks allowed (1.3/24th FCS). Alabama State's offensive line did not allow a quarterback sack over the previous five straight games but had the streak snapped last week at PVA&M. The offensive front has still protected Damon Stewart, giving up four sacks in the last 131 pass attempts.
- The Alabama State defense has a allowed 12.7 points per game over last five games and 30 points over the past 14 quarters, including a string of five straight scoreless quarters.
- The Hornets defense has been the main story line for much of the season, ranking 2nd in the SWAC and in the top 10 in three FCS categories. ASU is 2nd the SWAC in scoring defense (15.6/5th FCS), rush defense (96.2/7th FCS), and total defense (287.4/5th FCS) The Hornets rank 3rd fumbles recovered(11/8th FCS) and 7th tackles for loss (6.2), 6th in sacks (2.3), and 4th in pass defense (191.2).
- The SWAC named Damon Stewart as its football Newcomer of the Week on Monday for the week ending Nov. 18, 2023. Stewart had the best day of his Horner career, completing 27-of-38 passes for 372 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions. He has completed 117-of-183 passes for 1,465 yards with eight touchdowns. The Hattiesburg, Miss., native ranks first in the SWAC in pass efficiency (141.6), and four in yards per completion (12.77).

GOLDEN TIGERS AND HORNETS SERIES HISTORY

- The Golden Tigers have dominated the series with Alabama State historically, leading 62-38-3. The series has been back-and-forth of late, as the programs have split the last ten meetings, while Tuskegee holds a 14-11 edge in the last 25 meetings against the Hornets. The first game played between the two teams was in 1901, with Tuskegee winning, 37-0. Alabama State took the last matchup, earning a Turkey Day Classic win in 2021 with a 43-9 result in Montgomery.

GOLDEN TIGERS vs. HORNETS SECOND-LONGEST IN SCHOOL HISTORY

- Tuskegee and Alabama State will be meeting for the 104th time for the second-most played series in school history, trailing only Morehouse (113), while being ahead of Clark Atlanta (83), Miles (66) and Morris Brown (54) to round out the five longest in TU history.

LAST MEETING vs. ALABAMA STATE

- In their last meeting, Tuskegee dropped 2021 matchup between programs, falling 43-9 inside of ASU Stadium, meeting of Thanksgiving in Montgomery for the first time since 2012.
- ASU outrushed Tuskegee 188-68, while also outgaining the Golden Tigers through the air 223-144. The Hornets gained 22 first downs to just nine from Tuskegee, while the total yardage gained was separated by nearly 200 yards with Alabama State leading 411-212.
- Then-sophomore QB **Bryson Williams** led the team offensively, going 5-for-19 through the air for 110 yards and a 43-yard touchdown, while RB **Terry Bryant** added 61 yards on the ground on nine carries, including a long of 44. LB **Carl Matthews** recorded 13 total tackles on the day (nine solos), followed by LB **Woodly Appolon** and DL **Fredrick Austin** with nine tackles each, and LB **Wesley Appolon** with eight tackles in the loss.

TUSKEGEE VERSUS THE STATE OF ALABAMA

- Tuskegee is 163-100-7 (.604) all-time against teams from the state of Alabama. Overall, the Golden Tigers are 21-27-3 against Alabama A&M, 62-38-3 versus Alabama State, 3-0 against Birmingham Industrial, 1-0 versus Concordia-Selma, 1-0 against Jacksonville State, 1-0 versus Maxwell Air Force Base, 48-18-1 against Miles, 0-4 versus North Alabama, 9-1 against Stillman, 11-7-6 versus Talladega, 0-1 against Troy, 6-4 versus West Alabama.

TUSKEGEE POSTS SIX ON ALL-SIAC POSTSEASON TEAM

- As announced by the conference on Tuesday, November 14, a duo of Tuskegee student-athletes were named First-Team All-SIAC, and four more were named as Second-Team All-SIAC honorees.
- Sophomore defenders **Mikael King** and **Malik Moore** both earned first team All-SIAC honors, while sophomore OL **Damion Clark**, senior P **Ryan Duff**, sophomore WR **Antonio Meeks**, and junior S **Christian Ramsey** all earned second team honors.
- This is the second consecutive season that the Golden Tigers have had at least six players earn All-SIAC honors, and second straight to have multiple defensive players on the first team. In 2022, TU had three first team All-SIAC members in RB **Taurean Taylor**, S **Zelly Aldridge**, and LB **Vincent Hill**. Meanwhile, DL **Jeremy Dees**, LB **Davir Hamilton-Jackson**, OL **Nathan Harrison**, and K **Arnes Huskic** all earned second team honors.

CONNECTIONS BETWEEN TUSKEGEE AND ALABAMA STATE

- Tuskegee wide receivers coach **Clinton Smith Jr.** and running backs coach **James Thompson** both spent the 2021 spring and fall seasons at Alabama State under former head coach Donald Hill Eley.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Tuskegee now has four quarterbacks on its roster with touchdowns through the air this season in senior QB **Bryson Williams** with four, followed by redshirt junior QB **Ryan Nettles**, who threw his touchdown against Central State. Senior QB **Malik Davis** threw for two combined scores against Central State and Lane, while junior QB **Christopher Roberson**, has added two. This is the second consecutive season that the Golden Tigers have used four quarterbacks in a season.

- Tuskegee has been outscored 56-41 in the fourth quarter this season, but has outscored its opponents 189-169 the remainder of the game, including two overtime periods. The third quarter has been key for the Golden Tigers, as it is their largest point differential quarter at 67-61. They lead the first quarter 44-41 and 64-59 in the third quarter. Tuskegee outscored Lane 14-8 in its only overtime game.

TUSKEGEE vs. CONFERENCE OPPONENTS

- Tuskegee has won seven of its last ten conference home games, along with being 18-7 (.720) in its last 25 conference home games. Overall, TU is 38-12 (.760) in its last 50 home games inside of Cleve L. Abbott Memorial Alumni Stadium.
- Tuskegee is 18-7 (.720) in its last 25 games in November, and 30-11 (.732) in the month dating back to the 2013 season, which includes a 11-4 (.733) home record, 9-6 (.600) on the road, and 11-1 (.917) record in neutral site games.
- Tuskegee is 326-126-8 (.709) all-time against current football members of the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference with a 74-30-7 record vs. Morehouse, 63-16-3 record vs. Clark Atlanta, 47-17-1 record vs. Miles, 32-22-2 record vs. Fort Valley State, 22-19-1 record vs. Albany State, 25-1-0 record vs. Lane, 22-11-0 record vs. Kentucky State, 15-6-0 record vs. Savannah State, 14-1-0 record vs. Benedict, 7-1-0 record vs. Central State, 2-1-1 record vs. Allen, 3-1-0 record vs. Edward Waters. They also have a 3-2 record vs. LeMoyne-Owen and a 32-18-4 record vs. Morris Brown, former football members of the conference.

GOLDEN TIGERS FALL IN SIAC FINALE TO RIVAL MILES

- Tuskegee had no answer for Miles and the passing attack on Saturday afternoon as the Golden Tigers dropped a 35-10 decision to the Golden Bears at Sloan-Alumni Stadium. The Golden Tigers lost their second conference game and second in the last four games to fall to 7-3 overall and 6-2 in SIAC play. Miles improved to 6-2, 5-2.
- Tuskegee finished with just 309 yards of total offense, including 70 on the ground and 239 through the air. Williams and Christopher Roberson split time behind center, with Williams going 18-for-21 for 159 yards and a touchdown, despite four sacks. Roberson went 3-for-10 on the day for 39 yards, while Malik Davis was 1-for-5 in the loss.
- Miles finished with 425 yards, finishing 18-for-27 for 312 yards and two touchdowns through the air. The Golden Tigers rushed for 82 yards on the ground. Mile's run game helped pace the game in the second half — with six different rushers recording a carry.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Tuskegee is 4-1 in one-score games under head coach Aaron James, following its 21-14 win at Savannah State. TU lost at home to Edward Waters, 41-38, on the final play of the game for their only one-score loss of the last two seasons.

TUSKEGEE BREAKING IN LOTS OF NEW PLAYERS THIS FALL

- Tuskegee has had 15 players make their first-career start through eight weeks of the season. Furthermore, TU has had 16 players appear in the first-ever collegiate football game this year and 39 players have made their Golden Tiger debut this fall.

STEADY QUARTERBACK ROOM

• Tuskegee has played four different starting quarterbacks for the second straight year, under the offensive system of Coach James. Senior QB **Bryson Williams** started the first two games of the year, before an ankle injury forced him to miss the next two games, as redshirt junio QB **Ryan Nettles** started against Central State, while senior QB **Malik Davis** earned the start against Lane. Junior QB **Christopher Roberson** also saw action in garbage time against Alabama A&M before scoring three total touchdowns (1 pass, 2 rush) in the win over Morehouse, and starting the last two games, against Edward Waters at home and on the road against Savannah State.

JAMES AS OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR AND PLAYCALLER

• Along with his head coaching responsibilities, **Aaron James** is also serving as the offensive coordinator and play caller this season. Last season, James served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, seeing the TU offense leads the SIAC in and fifth in the nation in red zone offense (.919), ranked second in the SIAC in first downs (208), third in average time of possession (32:04), sixth in scoring (27.2 ppg), sixth in rushing (159.5 ypg), eighth in passing (174.7 ypg), and eighth in total offense (334.2 ypg).

TURKEY DAY CLASSIC RIVALRY RETURNS IN 2023

• Tuskegee and Alabama State will resume one of the oldest college football rivalries in 2023 with a matchup in the 99th Turkey Day Classic on Thanksgiving Day. The two programs met in the 2021 Turkey Day Classic for the first time since 2012, and have met in the Classic in all but 12 occasions all-time, accounting for 102 total meetings, with Tuskegee holding a 62-38-3 edge in the series. The Golden Tigers took the first ever meeting between the two programs with a 37-0 victory in 1901, however Alabama State has won the last three contests, including a 43-9 win on November 25, 2021.

SIAC ANNOUNCES PARTICIPATION IN THE 2023 FLORIDA BEACH BOWL

• The Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC) has announced its participation in the 2023 Florida Beach Bowl. With kickoff slated for 7:30 p.m. ET, this inaugural event will showcase two outstanding programs from the SIAC and the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA) on Wednesday, December 13, 2023, at Miami's DRV PNK Stadium.

In showcasing the talents and determination of student-athletes, selected programs must meet specific criteria to be considered for the matchup: six regular season wins and good academic standing within their respective conferences.

TUSKEGEE ANNOUNCES 2024 HOMECOMING DATE AND OPPONENT

• Tuskegee University has set its 2024 homecoming date for November 9, 2024. The 100th Homecoming celebration will be the final conference game of the year, as the Golden Tigers will host Miles College inside of Abbott Memorial Alumni Stadium.





/// OFFENSE PLAYER NOTABLES ///

PAIR OF OFFENSIVE PERFORMERS ON ALL-SIAC SECOND TEAM

• Sophomore OL **Damion Clark** and WR **Antonio Meeks** were both named to the All-SIAC team after the 2023 season, as Clark helped an offensive that had the Golden Tigers ranked No. 4 in the SIAC and No. 82 in the nation in rushing offense in 2023, averaging 141.4 rushing yards per game. Meeks joins them on the Second Team, as he was one of the most explosive receivers in the SIAC for the second straight year in his sophomore season, averaging 19.5 yards per catch.

TUSKEGEE CONTINUES TO USE MULTITUDE OF RUNNING BACKS

• Tuskegee continues to have success using a stable of running backs in the sophomore trio of **Johnny Morris III**, **Chase Sellers**, and **Karon Taylor**, along with true freshmen **Zina Mulbah** and **Desmond Leverette**. The group has been steady so far this year, rushing for a combined 1,061 yards on 205 carries (5.2 ypc) and scored 12 of the 17 total touchdowns on the ground for the Golden Tigers.

MEEKS SURPASSES 1,000 CAREER RECEIVING YARDS AND TEN TOUCHDOWN MARK

• Meeks wasted no time getting back to form in his first game back due to injury. The sophomore catch a career-high nine passes for 179 yards, including a 59-yard touchdown — the 10th of his career — against Edward Waters. He also surpassed the 1,000 career receiving mark with his performance in just 15 games, with career totals of 71 catches for 1,388 yards and 11 touchdowns.

WILLIAMS SURPASSES 25 TOTAL TOUCHDOWNS IN GOLDEN TIGER CAREER

• With a touchdown pass earlier this season against Kentucky State, senior QB **Bryson Williams** surpassed 25 total touchdowns in his Tuskegee career. During his collegiate career, which includes three different head coaches, the left-hander has now thrown for 18 touchdowns and rushed for nine.

ROBERSON STARTS AGAIN AGAINST SAVANNAH STATE

• Junior QB **Christopher Roberson** earned his second-straight start last weekend, while playing in the fourth game of his career, in his last outing against Savannah State as he was 10-of-25 (400) for 135 yards with an interception.

• In his previous game, Roberson scored multiple touchdowns for the second time on the year, setting career marks through the air, going 21-for-34 for 323 yards and two touchdowns against Edward Waters. The junior also added a rushing touchdown on the day.

• Since entering the game off the bench against Morehouse (10/7), Roberson is 34-for-62 (548) passing for 556 yards with three touchdowns and three interceptions in his last ten quarters of football against Edward Waters and Savannah State.

• Prior to his starting experience, he was named SIAC Newcomer of the Week after accounting for three touchdowns against Morehouse in the second half. The McComb, Miss. product completed all three of his pass attempts for 98 yards and one touchdown. He also rushed for 35 yards and two scores.

MORRIS HAS SIX TOUCHDOWNS IN HIS LAST THREE GAMES

• Junior RB **Johnny Morris III** has been a strong performer in his last three games as he has recorded 44 carries for 333 yards (7.6 ypc) and five touchdowns. Last weekend against Savannah State, he had ten carries for 53 yards and a touchdown (2). In his previous game against Edward Waters, he had 13 carries for 66 yards and two touchdowns (4, 28). And, in his game prior to that against Morehouse, he had a career-day with 214 rushing yards and two touchdowns (33, 11) on 21 carries. Of his five touchdown in his last three games, three have been for at least 10 yards.

• Morris III, who now has two-career games with multiple touchdowns, enters this weekend's game with 72 rushes for 4443 yards and six touchdowns in 12 career outings.

PETTY POSTS SECOND CAREER 100-YARD RECEIVING GAME AND SCORES FIRST CAREER TD

• Sophomore WR **Corey Petty** posted his second 100-yard receiving game of the season and career as he caught two passes for 102 yards, including a career-long 71-yard touchdown, the first of his career, against Morehouse last weekend. Petty has now caught multiple passes in three of the five games this season.

LEVERETTE HAS CAREER GAME IN ROAD LOSS

• Freshman RB **Desmond Leverette** posted career highs in the road game against Alabama A&M last weekend, rushing 10 times for a team-high 75 yards against the Bulldogs in the loss. Saturday was Leverette's first action in the backfield for the Golden Tigers, and he is the third true freshman to carry the ball for TU this season.

King, a sophomore from Tuskegee, Ala., intercepted two passes, both in the fourth quarter as the Tigers held on to defeat Savannah State 21-14 on the road.

OTHER DEFENSIVE NOTABLES VERSUS SAVANNAH STATE

- Sophomore ILBs Vincent Hill and Malik Moore led the team with seven tackles each, with Moore having 2.0 tackles-for-loss, one sack, and one fumble recovery. Junior S Christian Ramsey finished with six tackles, including one tackle-for-loss and one sack, followed by four tackles, with 2.0 tackles-for-loss and one sack from freshman S **Noah Holton**. Freshman DL Javeion Miller finished with three tackles, with one tackle-for-loss, while sophomore CB Mikael King and freshman S **Rossie Grimes** both finished with two solo tackles in the win.

DEFENSIVE UNIT EARNS THIRD PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR OF THE SEASON

- Prior to this week, sophomore ILB **Vincent Hill** was named the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Week after his standout performance in the home double overtime win against Lane. TRUE FRESHMEN PROVIDING DEPTH ON DEFENSIVE UNIT

- A number of true freshman made impacts so far this season, led by two in the defensive secondary in **Rossie Grimes** who has played in all eight games at safety, accounting for 23 tackles and two pass breakups on the year, and DB **Noah Holton** with 23 total tackles, including 3.0 tackles-for-loss, two pass breakups, two sack, one fumble recovery, and one interception returned for a touchdown. DL **Javeion Miller** has added pressure on the defensive front, posting 19 tackles, including 5.5 tackles for loss and three sacks, followed by LB **Kaquan Kimber** who has 14 total tackles and 1.0 tackle-for-loss and LB **LaShun Mays** with 10 total tackles and 0.5 tackles-for-loss. In total, 15 true freshman have made an appearance on the defensive side of the ball this season.

- Currently ranks second in the country and leading the SIAC in interceptions per game (0.8), trailing only Tanner Volk at Central Washington (1.0). King is 12th nationally and second in the SIAC in passes defended per game (1.5).
- Named the BOXTOROW HBCU National Player of the Week (10/23/23) as he set a new career high with two interceptions against Savannah State to give him six interceptions this season in his first in the secondary. He also had two solo tackles against the Tigers.
- Has recorded a tackle in every game this season and has three-plus tackles in six of his last seven games. Also has five interceptions and five pass breakups in the span.

LORCAN SURPASSES 50-POINT MARK ON THE SEASON

• Sophomore PK **Lorcan Ryans** surpassed the 50-point mark on the season after making all three of his extra point attempts against Savannah State last weekend. The Limerick, Ireland native has handled all place kicking and field goals for the Golden Tigers in his first season, and has made 10 field goals and gone 24-26 on extra points attempts.

THREE GOLDEN TIGERS ACCOUNT FOR 100+ KICKOFF RETURN YARDS

• Three Tuskegee returners have accounted for at least 100 kickoff return yards on the year in freshman WR **DeJuan McGhee** (258 yds/25.80 avg/1 TD), sophomore RB **Karon Taylor** (141 yds/17.63 avg), and redshirt senior WR **Grantis Poole** (119 yds/17.0 avg).

DUFF SETS SCHOOL RECORD AGAINST LANE

• In Tuskegee's Week 4 win, senior P **Ryan Duff** punted nine times, averaged 40.1 gross yards per punt and had all nine punts downed inside the 20-yard line. Duff was the first punter in school history to have at least nine punts downed inside the 20-yard line without a touchback, and is also a school record.

FUENTES FORCES FUMBLE IN FIRST CAREER GAME

• In his first career collegiate game, freshman LS **Josiah Fuentes** immediately found a way to impact the game, not only serving as the full-time long snapper, but also forcing a fumble in the first quarter on a 44-yard punt from Tuskegee, that the Golden Tigers recovered. Fuentes is the younger brother of former Golden Tiger Johnny Fuentes, who played for TU from 2017-21.

TUSKEGEE OFFENSIVE STATISTICAL RANKINGS

• Offensively, Tuskegee is second in the SIAC in turnovers lost (15) and turnover margin (1.10 pg) for 13th and 41st in the nation, second in the conference and 19th nationally in time of possession (32:08 avg), second in the league and 25th in the country in fourth down conversion percentage (.583), second in the SIAC and 22nd in the nation in passes had intercepted (6), third in the SIAC and 37th in the nation in passing yards per completion (13.98 ypc), and fourth in rushing offense (141.1 ypg). TU is also fifth in the league and 107th nationally in red zone offense (.735), sixth in the SIAC and 87th nationally in completion percentage (.564), sixth in the league in first downs (180), sixth in the SIAC and 67th in the country in team passing efficiency (131.22), sixth in the SIAC and 78th in the country in scoring offense (25.4 ppg), sixth in the SIAC and 89th in the country in total offense (332.9 ypg), seventh in the SIAC in third down conversion percentage (.348), and seventh in the SIAC and 87th in the nation in passing offense (191.5 ypg).

TUSKEGEE DEFENSIVE STATISTICAL RANKINGS

• Defensively, Tuskegee is fifth in the nation in interceptions (14), and is also second in the conference in and sixth in the nation with 21 turnovers forced, third in the SIAC and 26th nationally in team sacks (2.75 pg), fourth in the SIAC and 42nd in the nation in third down conversion percentage defense (.333), fourth in the SIAC and 26th in the nation with two defensive touchdowns, leading the conference in both categories, and fourth in the conference and 25th in the nation in red zone defense (.667). The Golden Tigers are fifth in the SIAC and 28th in the nation in fumbles recovered with seven, fifth in the SIAC and 74th in the nation in rushing defense (137.8 ypg), fifth in the conference and 86th nationally in passing efficiency defense (128.93), fifth in the SIAC and 87th nationally in first down allowed (147), sixth in the SIAC and 45th in the nation tackles for loss (7.0 pg), sixth in the SIAC and 49th in the nation in fourth down conversion percentage defense (.375), sixth in the SIAC and 99th in scoring defense (27.4 ppg), eighth in the SIAC in total defense (378.1 ypg), and 11th in the SIAC in passing yards allowed (240.4 ypg).

GOLDEN TIGERS IN THE SIAC AND NCAA RANKINGS

• Individually, freshman WR **DeJuan McGhee** leads the conference and is eighth in the nation with one kickoff return touchdown and seventh in the SIAC in kick return yards (311). Sophomore CB **Mikael King** is fourth in the nation and first in the SIAC in interceptions (0.6 pg) and second in the SIAC and 14th in the nation in passes defended (1.3 pg). Sophomore K **Lorcan Ryans** is 19th in the nation and second in the SIAC with 1.0 field goals per game, third in the SIAC and 21st in the nation in field goal percentage at .733, fifth in the SIAC in scoring at 6.0, as well as sixth in the conference in total points scored with 60. Sophomore RB **Karon Taylor** is second in the SIAC and 18th nationally in punt return average (10.2). Sophomore WR **Antonio Meeks** is fourth in the SIAC and 33rd in the nation in receiving yards per game (77.3 ypg), fourth in the SIAC and 55th in the nation in receiving yards (696), fifth in the league and 60th nationally in receptions per game (4.4 rpg), and sixth in the SIAC in receiving touchdowns (4). Sophomore RB **Johnny Morris III** is seventh in the SIAC and 78th in the nation in rushing touchdowns (7), seventh in the SIAC in rushing yards (489), seventh in the SIAC in rushing yards per game (48.9 ypg), and ninth in the SIAC in total touchdowns. Sophomore ILB **Malik Moore** is fifth in the SIAC and 66th in the nation in total tackles (7.5 pg) and eight in SIAC in solo tackles per game (3.9). Senior P **Ryan Duff** is fifth in the conference and is 79th in the nation in yards per punt (36.9 ypp). Junior S Christian Ramsey is fifth in the SIAC and 69th nationally in interceptions per game (0.3 pg), while sophomore ILB **Vincent Hill** is ninth in the SIAC in total tackles (6.7 pg).
