STORY LINES

NEW BEGINNINGS

Nicki Collen was announced as the fifth head coach in Baylor women's basketball history on May 3, 2021.

Collen came to Baylor from the WNBA's Atlanta franchise, where she spent the last three seasons at the helm for the Dream. Her first year in Atlanta resulted in a 23-11 season in 2018, where she earned WNBA Coach of the Year honors and helped the team to the WNBA Playoff Semifinals.

Collen's collegiate coaching career spanned for nine seasons prior to her WNBA arrival. She spent two seasons as an assistant at Colorado State (2000-02), one season at Ball State (2002-03), one at Louisville (2003-04), three at Arkansas (2011-14) and two at Florida Gulf Coast (2014-16).

Her teams combined record in nine seasons as an NCAA Division I assistant was 214-74. As an assistant, Collen guided four different squads to the NCAA Tournament, reaching the second round in three of those seasons.

PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

Jordan Lewis, NaLyssa Smith and Queen Egbo received national accolades before the start of the season.

Lewis, a graduate transfer from Alabama, was named to the Nancy Lieberman Award Preseason Watch List. She was also named the Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year. The 5-6 guard put up career numbers for the Crimson Tide a year ago as she averaged career-bests with 17.0 points and 4.2 assists per game.

Smith, named the Preseason Big 12 Player of the Year, was named to the Katrina McClain Award Preseason Watch List. The senior forward won the award a season ago, in addition to taking home the Wade Trophy as the WBCA's National Player of the Year. Smith also garnered All-American honors by five different entities after averaging 18.0 points and 8.9 rebounds per game.

Egbo, a Preseason All-Big 12 Team member, was named to the Lisa Leslie Award Preseason Watch List. The senior center made it to the Final Five for the award last season after averaging 11.1 points, 8.6 rebounds and 1.9 blocks per game. Egbo moved to ninth all-time on Baylor's career list for blocks (120) with 56 as a junior.

BAYLOR VS. THE STATE OF TEXAS

In Baylor women's basketball history, the Bears are 376-226 (.625) against opponents from the state of Texas.

Since 2011, Baylor has played 91 games against in-state opponents and only lost three times.

NEW FACES

Nearly half the Baylor roster make their BU debut this season.

Transfers **Lewis** and **Ja'Mee Asberry** come in as sharpshooters from the perimeter after stellar careers at Alabama and Oklahoma State, respectively.

Freshman **Kendra Gillispie** will add some depth to the front court for the Bears, and freshman walk-on **Andrea Katramados** brings some shooting power of her own.

While senior **Kamaria McDaniel** was on the Baylor roster last season, the Penn State transfer missed the entire season due to injury. She is fully cleared and ready to add her All-Big Ten talent to the mix.

LET IT FLY

Baylor has been toward the bottom in the Big 12 in 3-point shooting in years past. That won't be the case this season.

Keep track of Baylor's program records for 3-pointers made (210, 2016-17) and attempted (596, 2013-14) because those numbers are sure to fall.

Last season, the Bears went 110-332 (.331) from the 3-point line. Transfers Jordan Lewis and Ja'Mee Asberry combined to go 125-312 (.401) last season at Alabama and Oklahoma State, respectively.

In Baylor's first exhibition of the season against Texas A&M-Commerce, BU went 10-for-23 from behind the arc. Andrews alone went 5-for-5.

THE BAYLOR BEARS REGIME

2019 NCAA CHAMPIONS

The 2018-19 Bears became just the third women's program in NCAA history to win three titles when Baylor beat Notre Dame 82-81 April 7 in Tampa, Fla. **Chloe Jackson's** go-ahead scoop layup with under five seconds left propelled her to NCAA Final Four Most Outstanding Player honors to go along with a team-high 26 points in the game. The Bears rode the wave of two All-American posts with **Kalani Brown** and **Lauren Cox** each earning multiple all-America honors. The pair led Baylor to its 10th regular-season and tournament championship in the Big 12 and **Kim Mulkey** was honored as national coach of the year by the USBWA, the *Associated Press* and the WBCA.

2012 NCAA CHAMPIONS

The 2011-12 Bear season was as perfect as it could be. En route to claiming its second NCAA Championship in seven years, Baylor ran the table, posting an unprecedented 40-0 mark and claiming both Big 12 Conference crowns. **Brittney Griner** and Mulkey swept player of the year and coach of the year honors, earning WBCA, USBWA, Associated Press, Naismith and Big 12 Conference recognition. Baylor was ranked No. 1 wire-to-wire in both polls and raced through conference play with a Big 12-record 18-0 mark. Griner and **Odyssey Sims** were named consensus All-Americans, while **Destiny Williams** was a WBCA All-America honorable mention honoree.

2005 NCAA CHAMPIONS

The squad posted a 33-3 record and claimed the Big 12 Conference title with a 14-2 mark. En route to the program's first NCAA Championship, the Bears defeated three No. 1 seeds. **Steffanie Blackmon** and **Sophia Young** were both named All-Americans. In addition to earning Big 12 Coach of the Year honors, **Mulkey** received the New York Athletic Club's prestigious Winged Foot Award.

NCAA TOURNAMENT STAPLE & 11+-YEAR DOMINANCE

- The Bears have made 17 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and 19 overall. Those appearances have resulted in three national championships (2005, 2012, 2019), four Final Fours (2005, 2010, 2012, 2019), 10 Elite Eights and 14 Sweet Sixteens.
- The Bears are 23-time Big 12 Champions—most in Big 12 history—capturing 11 consecutive regular season titles, 12 overall & 11 tournament titles.
- Baylor is 368-28 (.931) over the past 11 seasons while posting a 187-9 (.954) mark in Big 12 play and 27-1 (.964) in Big 12 Tournament play.
- 317 of Baylor's 368 wins since 2010-11 have been by 10 or more points, and only 17 times in that span has its winning margin been five or fewer points (most recently five, 67-32, at South Florida, Dec. 1, 2020).
- In Baylor's last 526 games, only five times (Texas, .516 and .515; Stanford, .509; West Virginia, .500; South Carolina, .528) has a team shot 50 percent or above.

BIG 12 DYNASTY

- Baylor women's basketball has won a league-leading 23 Big 12 Conference titles, 12 regular season and 11 tournament championships.
- Baylor has run the table in the conference four times (2012, 2013, 2018, 2019). It has only happened six times in Big 12 history (Oklahoma: 16-0 in 2006; Nebraska: 16-0 in 2010).
- Baylor has advanced to the Big 12 Championship game 10 times in a row and 14 times in program history.
- The Bears have won nine of the last 10 Big 12 Championship titles, besting No. 17/20 West Virginia, 76-50, in the 2021 final.

HEAD COACH NICKI COLLEN • 1ST SEASON



Nicki Collen was introduced as the fifth Head Coach in Baylor women's basketball history on May 5, 2021.

Collen comes to Baylor from the WNBA's Atlanta franchise, where she spent the last three seasons at the helm for the Dream. Her rookie season in Atlanta resulted

in a 23-11 season in 2018, where she earned WNBA Coach of the Year honors and helped the franchise to the WNBA Playoff Semifinals.

Prior to her arrival in Atlanta, she spent two seasons under head coach Curt Miller of the Connecticut Sun, helping the franchise improve from fifth in the East Division to second from 2016 to 2017, respectively.

"I am thrilled to be the head coach at Baylor University. I believe it is the top job in the country for women's basketball," said Collen. "I am excited to begin working with this extremely talented team and I am grateful for the unwavering support of President Livingstone and Mack Rhoades. The success of this program speaks for itself, and I will begin working today to ensure Baylor women's basketball continues to be a program that excels at the highest levels."

Collen's collegiate coaching career spanned for nine seasons prior to her WNBA arrival. She spent two seasons as an assistant at Colorado State from 2000-2002, one season at Ball State from 2002-2003, one at Louisville from 2003-2004, three at Arkansas from 2011-2014 and two at Florida Gulf Coast from 2014-2016.

Her teams' combined record in nine seasons as an NCAA Division I assistant was 214-74, good for a .743 win percentage. As an assistant, Collen guided four different squads to the NCAA Tournament, reaching the second round in three of those seasons.

She spent six of her nine seasons as an assistant under her husband, Tom Collen's head-coaching tenures at Colorado State, Louisville and Arkansas. She also coached under Tracy Roller at Ball State and Karl Smesko at Florida Gulf Coast, who has the third-highest active winning percentage in NCAA Division I. Collen helped the FGCU program to a 64-9 record and the school's first NCAA Tournament win in her two-year tenure.

In her nine seasons at the collegiate level, Collen coached three All-Americans and saw three players selected in the WNBA Draft.

Collen's collegiate playing career began at Purdue in 1993-94, when the Boilermakers made an NCAA Final Four run with a 29-5 overall record and a 16-2 mark in the Big Ten. Her sophomore season, Purdue made another deep run with an Elite Eight appearance to go with a 24-8 overall record. She transferred to Marquette, where she tallied 421 assists in her final two seasons, averaging 7.0 per game in her last 60 collegiate games. She helped the Golden Eagles to two-straight NCAA Tournament appearances in 1997 and 1998.

Nicki and her husband Tom have three children, Connor, Reese and Logan.


