STORYLINES

- Baylor travels to the Little Apple to play against Kansas State on Tuesday night at 8 p.m. CT on ESPN2.
- Head coach **Scott Drew** will face off against his former assistant coach and current interim head coach for Kansas State, **Matthew Driscoll**.
- Kansas State announced on Sunday night that it was parting ways with coach **Jerome Tang**, who worked underneath Drew for 19 years before being hired at KSU.
- Driscoll and Tang's relationship with Baylor and Drew dates back more than 20 years, as the two coached alongside each other for six seasons (2003-09) at Baylor as original members of head coach Drew's staff. The pair were part of 81 wins at Baylor, helping Drew rebuild the Bears into their first NCAA Tournament bid in 20 years in 2007-08. Driscoll was named the fourth head coach in North Florida history on April 7, 2009. Baylor never played North Florida during his tenure.
- Drew is 3-6 all time when facing a former assistant as a head coach.
- The Wildcats have won the last two meetings at Bramlage Coliseum, with Baylor not earning a win in Manhattan since Feb. 9, 2022, 75-60.
- Baylor assistant coach **Steve Henson** returns to his alma mater where he was a four-year starting point guard for the Wildcats from 1986-90.
- Kenpom has the Bears holding the No. 1 toughest opponent defensive strength of schedule in the country.
- Additionally, BU's overall strength of schedule ranks as 6th in the nation and 3rd in the Big 12.
- BU's 3-8 conference start is the worst since 2013-14, where the Bears ended 9-9 and made it to the NCAA Sweet 16.
- Baylor is shooting 46.3-percent from the field and averaging 76.6 points in its last five games versus 40.1-percent field goals and an average of 66.8 points in its first five games of the conference season.
- Undefeated with halftime leads, Baylor has won 90-percent of its games (279-37) when leading at the half in the last 14 seasons and is 13-0 this season when taking the halftime advantage.
- The Bears are 94-5 (.949) over the last 10 seasons when hitting at least 50.0 percent from the field, sixth best in Division I (min. 20 games).
- BU went against two top-25 opponents last week, versus #22 BYU at home and #24 Louisville in a neutral-site game.
- Against the two, freshman **Tounde Yessoufou** averaged 26.5 ppg, including a career-best of 37 points against BYU.
- His 37 points were the most by any Baylor player against a ranked team in program history, which contributed to career highs in field goals (12), field goals attempted (19) and threes (5).
- It was the most points put up by a freshman since since **LaceDarius Dunn** (38) vs. Texas Tech (3/8/08).
- Yessoufou played all but four minutes across the two games and found five steals in the week. He is the only DI freshman this season to be averaging at least 15.0 points and 2.0 steals per game.
- **Cameron Carr** has reached double-figures in the first half in 18 of 25 games this season.
- Carr leads the Bears and is fifth in the Big 12 with 19.2 points per game.
- Carr was recognized on the Big 12 Starting Five for his performances against CU and ISU.
- Through two games, Carr played all but four minutes and was fifth in the league in scoring with 21.5 ppg.

BAYLOR BRAGS

- One of only two teams in the league with 10+ Big 12 wins in each of the last five seasons, Baylor owns seven consecutive seasons with double-digit conference wins
- BU joins Gonzaga and Houston as one of three teams to win a game in each of the last six NCAA Tournaments.
- The Big 12 Freshman of the Year, **VJ Edgcombe**, was taken as the third pick in the first round of the 2025 NBA Draft, becoming Baylor's highest draft pick in program history. Selected by the Philadelphia 76ers, Edgcombe became the fifth player from BU to earn a top-10 pick, the previous highest being Ekpe Udoh at No. 6 overall in 2010 by the Golden State Warriors. The Bears are the only program in the country with top-19 picks in each of the last five drafts (**Ja'Kobe Walter** 19th overall to New Orleans, **Keyonte George** 16th overall to Utah, **Jeremy Sochan** 9th overall to San Antonio in 2022 **Davion Mitchell** 9th overall to Sacramento in 2021).
- The Bears have had 14 picks in the last 13 drafts, which is the most in the state of Texas and second-most in the Big 12 since 2012.
- The Bears have gone to 11 NCAA Tournaments and two National Invitation Tournaments since 2012.
- BU is 91-15 in home games since 2019-20 season.
- Baylor is 35-33 against ranked teams over the last seven seasons, including a 17-10 mark at home.
- Baylor wrapped up its first full season in the brand-new state of the art Foster Pavilion last season, recording a 13-3 record at home.
- Baylor has reached the 25-win milestone in three of the last six seasons and in 7 of the last 16 years. Prior to that, BU reached 25 wins just once in the program's first 103 years (25-5 in 1945-46).
- Baylor's 77-40 Big 12 record over the last seven seasons is the second best record of any Power-5 team in that span.
- Head coach **Scott Drew** is in his 23rd season at Baylor with a school-record 477 career victories.
- **Drew** is tied for the seventh longest-tenured head coach in Division I men's college basketball.
- Baylor is playing its 747th game of the 23-year Drew era – more than half (395) have been as a ranked team.
- Over the last six seasons, Baylor is 126-14 when leading at the half and 138-23 when taking a 2nd-half lead.
- Baylor has won 89% of its games when leading at the half since 2011-12 (276-32).
- The Bears had been ranked in 103 of the last 120 AP Polls, after having it's 36-week streak snapped on Dec. 9th 2024.
- BU spent a school-record 54-straight weeks ranked in the top-10 of the AP Poll, from Dec. 16, 2019-Dec 5, 2022.
- BU set a school-record streak of 65-straight weeks ranked in the AP Top 25 from Nov. 5, 2019 to Jan 9, 2023 (1,161 days).
- Baylor and Kansas are the only Power-5 schools to win 18+ games every year since 2008.
- BU has built double-digit leads in 148 of 188 games over the last five seasons (138-10).
- Baylor's 350 wins since 2011-12 are third-most in the Big 12 for teams that have been in a power conference in that span, trailing only Kansas (400) and Arizona (378).
- Baylor is 443-201 since 2007-08, the first year Drew's staff had a full allotment of scholarships.
- Thirteen of Baylor's 14 starting point guards under Drew have earned All-Big recognition (17 of last 18 seasons).
- Baylor is 160-59 over the last 6 seasons, the nation's third-best winning percentage among Power-5 teams in that span (.751%)

NOTABLE MARKS

- BU is 121-6 since 2019 when shooting a higher percentage than its opponent (Were 96-1 entering last year).
- Baylor has won 77 of it's last 80 games when shooting 50% or higher (only losses 1/25/25 @ BYU, 2/10/25 @ Houston, 1/24/26 vs. TCU, 2/10/26 vs. BYU).

ONE OF THE GREATEST REBUILDS IN NCAA HISTORY

- **Scott Drew** became Baylor's head coach in 2003, starting of one of the greatest rebuilds in NCAA history.
- Drew is one of just seven active coaches with at least 450 wins at their current institution (Mark Few, Tom Izzo, Bill Self, Greg Kampe, Randy Bennett, Matt Painter).
- Drew is one of two active coaches to have won an NCAA Title and an NIT Title. He is the only active coach to have won both at the same school (John Calipari NCAA: Kentucky, NIT: Memphis).
- Drew was named 2020 NBC Sports National Coach of the Year and 2017 Basketball Times National COY.
- Drew is now in his 23rd season at Baylor and is the school's all-time wins leader (477).
- Baylor has a .695 winning percentage (443-200) since Drew's first year with no scholarship restrictions in 2007-08. and a .704 winning percentage (352-153) over the last 12 seasons since 2011-12.
- Drew (55) is the third-youngest active collegiate head coach to win a National Championship (Golden, Hurley).
- Drew is one of just seven active coaches with at least 450 wins at their current institution (Mark Few, Tom Izzo, Bill Self, Greg Kampe, Randy Bennett, Matt Painter).
- In Drew's first 22 seasons at Baylor, 59 players have gone on to professional careers.
- Was announced as a member of the Texas Sports Hall of Fame Class of 2023.
- He was the 23rd BU player or coach to be inducted into the Texas Sports Hall of Fame.
- Drew is one of eight active men's Division I coaches with at least 400 wins at their current school.

JUST HOW THEY DREW IT UP

- Drew is a part of the second-winningest college basketball family. Entering the 2025-26 season, Scott, his brother Bryce (GCU) and their Dad Homer combined for 1,408 wins, 225 wins behind the Iba Family (1,633 wins) for most wins among father/son combinations in division I college basketball.

LAST TIME VS. THE WILDCATS AT BIG 12 CHAMPIONSHIPS

- Jayden Nunn sank his first five shots to build an early double-digit lead, leading the No. 7 seed Bears to a 70-56 win over No. 10 seed Kansas State in the second round of the 2025 Big 12 Championships.
- Baylor (19-13) cruised past Kansas State (16-17) to advance to the quarterfinals of the Big 12 Championships and play No. 2 seed and No. 9/9 ranked Texas Tech.
- In the midst of the comfortable win, the Bears got a historic outing from Norchad Omier, who shattered the program record with his 20th double-double of the year, and his school-record eighth straight. He finished with 12 points and 14 rebounds in 36 minutes.
- Omier passed Tim Duncan and Armando Bacott for second in NCAA history with his 88th career double-double and sits shy of first-place Tom Golla's 96, which came for La Salle.
- Nunn totaled 18 points on 7-of-10 shooting with three 3-pointers. Baylor also got 19 points and 10 rebounds from Edgcombe, his second career double-double.

FRESHMAN STANDOUT NIGHT VS. BYU

- Baylor freshman Tounde Yessoufou had a standout game with 37 points, going 12-for-19 from the field with six rebounds, three assists and one steal in Baylor's 99-94 loss to No. 22 BYU.
- Yessoufou earned a career-best in points (37), FGs (12), FGA (19) and 3FGs (5) in his 40-minute performance.
- Yessoufou's 37 points are the most by any Baylor player against a ranked team in program history.
- It was the most points put up by a freshman since since LaceDarius Dunn (38) vs. Texas Tech (3/8/08).
- BYU's AJ Dybantsa (36) and Baylor's Yessoufou (37) are the first opposing freshmen to score at least 35 points in the same D-I game in 12 years.
- Wednesday was the first time ever there were three 30-point scorers in a game involving at least one Big 12 team.

SCOTT DREW COACHING TREE

- Five current Division I head coaches took their first DI head coaching jobs after stints on Scott Drew's BU staff.
- **Bill Armstrong** is in his first year as head coach at McNeese State after being an assistant coach from 2024-25.
- **Jerome Tang** served as the head coach for four years at Kansas State. He was a member of Drew's original Baylor staff in 2003-04 and spent 19 years with Drew.
- **Grant McCasland** is in his third season as head coach at Texas Tech. He spent five years as a Baylor assistant before taking over as Arkansas State head coach for one season in 2016-17.
- **Paul Mills** is in his third season as head coach at Wichita State. He was a member of Drew's original Baylor staff in 2003-04 and spent 14 years with Drew, the final eight as an assistant coach.
- **John Jakus** is in the midst of his second season at Florida Atlantic after seven seasons on the Baylor bench as an assistant, also serving as a graduate assistant for **Drew** from 2012-14.
- All three former assistants have led their teams to NCAA Tournaments – McCasland took Tech to the Elite Eight in the 2025 tourney and UNT to the 2021 Second Round while Mills took ORU to the 2021 Sweet 16.
- Additionally, McCasland led North Texas to the NIT Championship in 2023, prior to leaving for Texas Tech.
- Drew is 3-6 all time when facing a former assistant as a head coach.
- **Matthew Driscoll** stepped down after the 2024-25 season at North Florida after spending 16 seasons as head coach. Driscoll spent six seasons as a Baylor assistant.

ASSISTANT COACH STEVE HENSON RETURNS TO ALMA MATER

- A native of McPherson, Kan., Henson was a four-year starting point guard at Kansas State from 1986-90. He earned All-Big Eight Conference honors as a junior and senior and also was named an honorable mention All-American and team captain during each of his final two seasons. He was the first player in school history to play in four consecutive NCAA Tournaments and as a sophomore in 1987-88, he helped guide the Wildcats to a 25-9 record and a spot in the Elite Eight.
- Henson led Kansas State in scoring his final two years by averaging 18.5 points per game as a junior and 17.4 points per game as a senior. He holds three of the top four single-season free throw percentages in school history, including an NCAA-leading .925 mark as a sophomore, while he finished second in the country as a junior (.920).
- He still holds all-time program records for assists (582), assists per game (4.58), free-throw percentage (.900), minutes played (4,474), minutes per game (35.2), starts (118), consecutive games played (127) and consecutive starts (118). Henson ranks among the best in school annals in nine other categories, including 3-point field goals (240/2nd), 3-point field goal percentage (.447/2nd), steals (190/2nd), 3-point field goal attempts (537/3rd), free throws (361/4th), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.98/4th), scoring (1,655/6th), games played (127/7th) and field goals (527/7th).
- Henson also was a decathlete at Kansas State, placing third as a sophomore and junior at the Big Eight Championships.

CARR FINDS BIG 12 STARTING FIVE AFTER PERFORMANCES VS. COLORADO & IOWA STATE

- Baylor's Cameron Carr was recognized on the Big 12 Starting Five for his performances in Baylor's win versus Colorado and on the road at Iowa State, the conference announced on Monday, Feb. 9.
- Through two games, Carr was fifth in the league in the Big 12 in scoring with 43 points, averaging 21.5. The redshirt sophomore guard put up double-figures in both games, with 24 at No. 7 Iowa State, just four points shy of tying his career-best. His 24 points was a conference season-best, which contributed to tying his career-high in made threes (5) and three-field goal attempts (10).
- Carr played all but four minutes across the two games and found nine dimes on the week, averaging 4.5 assists a game.

YESSOUFOU "A MAN AGAINST BOYS" VERSUS THE BUFFALOES

- On Wednesday night, Colorado had a particularly difficult time stopping the 6-5 **Tounde Yessoufou**, who scored at all three levels to finish with 27 points, one off his career high. He knocked down 4-of-7 from distance and 3-of-4 from the line and hit some sweet jumpers off post-ups.
- Colorado head coach Tad Boyle said the freshman guard was "a man against boys tonight."
- **Tounde Yessoufou**, **Cameron Carr** and **Obi Agbim** knocked down seven first-half 3-pointers to help the Bears blow out to a 24-point lead on the way to an 86-67 win over the visiting Buffaloes Wednesday night before a crowd of 7,012 at the Foster Pavilion.

BEARS FIND SOME HOPE IN HOPE COLISEUM AT WEST VIRGINIA

- In a must-win game, Baylor men's basketball showcased gritty toughness at Hope Coliseum on Saturday afternoon to earn its second conference win, returning to Waco with a 63-53 victory.
- Baylor grabbed its ninth program win in Morgantown, snapping West Virginia's 16-home game winning streak, the longest home winning streak in the Big 12 dating back to last year. BU's nine wins at Hope Coliseum underneath head coach **Scott Drew** are the most by any Big 12 team.
- BU was led by three Bears in double-figures, including **Cameron Carr** and **Obi Agbim** both with 16 points with six made field goals. Agbim put up the most points in his Big 12 conference season with the help of four made threes. Carr earned his third double-double of the season with a career-high of 12 rebounds.
- Freshman **Tounde Yessoufou** finished with 11 points with **Dan Skilings Jr.** right behind him with nine points on five rebounds.
- The first half proved to be crucial on the offensive end for Baylor, who shot 56-percent in the first 20 minutes compared to WVU's 41-percent to go into the half leading 38-30. Baylor is undefeated when leading at the half this season.

FIRST CONFERENCE WIN OF 2026, 10TH STRAIGHT WIN IN GALLAGHER-IBA ARENA

- Baylor had something to prove on Tuesday night at Gallagher-Iba Arena and dictated Oklahoma State on the road, earning its first conference win 94-79.
- Baylor earned its 10th straight win in Stillwater while snapping Oklahoma State's 11-game home winning streak.
- BU is the only visiting team to have 10 straight road wins in the historic Gallagher-Iba Arena history.
- A hot first half fueled BU to its 15-point margin of victory, tying the program record in a Big 12 road game.
- Baylor's 73.3-percent field goal percentage in the first half (22-30) was its highest ever in the first half in a Big 12 game.
- Five of the seven Bears in rotation ended in double-figures with Tounde Yessoufou leading BU with 23 points on 11 made baskets from the field. Behind him was Michael Rataj (19 points), Cameron Carr (17 points), Obi Agbim (15 points) and Isaac Williams IV (14 points), all contributing to Baylor's dominant Big 12 win.

JAMES NNAJI JOINS BAYLOR ROSTER

- Head coach Scott Drew announced roster updates for the 2025-26 season on Christmas Eve, including the addition of center **James Nnaji**. Drew also confirmed that **Juslin Bodo Bodo** will remain out for the rest of the season.
- The 7'0 center comes to Waco after spending the last four seasons playing in the EuroLeague.
- Nnaji was selected as the 31st overall pick in the 2023 NBA Draft by the Detroit Pistons before his rights were traded to the Charlotte Hornets and later the New York Knicks.
- The Makurdi, Nigeria, native was ranked as the 24th-best prospect in the ESPN Top 100.
- Statement from Coach Drew: "James is a really talented young player with a ton of potential, and we're excited to

welcome him to the Baylor Family. Any time you add someone to the roster midseason, it's going to be a process to get them acclimated and up to speed, but we know James will do everything he can to make it a seamless transition. Our immediate focus is on helping him take things step by step to ensure it's best for both him and the team when he's able to take the court."

- Bodo Bodo will remain out for the remainder of the season after suffering an arm injury over the summer.

NNAJI MAKES COLLEGIATE DEBUT AT TCU

- **James Nnaji** made history as the first former NBA Draft Pick to score points in a collegiate game, *after* being drafted.
- Nnaji's first points in his collegiate career came from a second-chance slam dunk at Schollmaier Arena in Fort Worth.
- The mid-year addition finished with five points, four rebounds, an assist and four fouls. Nnaji was the only Baylor player in the positives +/- at +5 in Baylor's 63-69 loss to the Horned Frogs.

YESSOUFOU DOUBLE-DIGIT STREAK

- Prior to this season, the last Big 12 freshman with a streak of 10+ consecutive double-digit scoring games to begin their college careers was Cade Cunningham (Ok State) with 10 in 2020-21. Below are all the Big 12 freshmen to begin their collegiate career with a streak of at least 10 double-digit scoring games in the conferences history:

- Additionally, 14 of the 38 NBA Draft picks from Texas colleges since 2012 have come from Baylor. Texas (eight), Houston (five), SMU (three), Texas Tech (three), Texas A&M (two), North Texas (one), TCU (one) and UT Arlington (one) have also had players selected in the last 13 NBA Drafts.

WINNING WAYS IN WACO

- Baylor athletics is in the midst of a historic run of success, including national and conference titles in men's and women's basketball, and football coming off a Big 12 Conference Championship in 2021 and the 2022 Sugar Bowl.
- Since 2011, and as of the end of the 2024-25 athletics season, no other school can compete with Baylor's run, as the Bears lead the nation in wins combined among football, and men's and women's basketball. Baylor has 32 more wins than the next closest school, UConn. The next closest in the Big 12 is BYU, who has 732 wins, 150 shy of Baylor despite playing as an independent until the 2023 season.

BREAKTHROUGH IN BIG 12

- BU is 175-117 in Big 12 play in 15 seasons since 2010 after going 59-149 in the league's first 13 seasons.
- BU is 189-135 in Big 12 play in 17 seasons since 2008 after going 45-131 in the league's first 11 seasons.
- Baylor is 69-63 in Big 12 road games since 2012, second-best in the league behind only Kansas
- BU is 87-49 in Big 12 play since 2019, second only to Kansas (90-41).
- BU is 35-25 in Big 12 Road games since 2019-20, The best mark in the league in that span.
- BU has won 8+ Big 12 games in 14-straight seasons after winning 8+ just 3 times in the league's first 15 years.
- BU has double-digit Big 12 wins in seven-straight seasons, 10 of the last 11 years and 12 of the last 15 seasons. BU didn't reach double-digit Big 12 wins in any of its first 13 years in the league before reaching 10+ for the first time in 2010.

FOURTH-MOST WINS AMONG BIG 12 TEAMS IN LAST 14 YEARS

- Baylor's 352-152 record since 2011-12 trails only Kansas (401-113) and Arizona (381-119), and Houston (363-129) among Big 12 teams.
- BYU (324-151) is fifth, Cincinnati (331-155) is sixth, Iowa State (304-180) is seventh, Colorado (298-193) is eighth, West Virginia (272-197) is ninth, Texas Tech (269-193) is 10th, Kansas State (267-200) is 11th, Utah (249-205) is 12th, TCU (244-220) is 13th, Oklahoma St. (244-213) is 14th, UCF (244-195) is 15th and Arizona State (239-212) is 16th.
- Baylor has averaged 24.5 wins per season over the last 13 seasons since 2011-12.

WELCOME HOME, DOUG McNAMEE!

- Baylor named **Doug McNamee**, a two-time graduate of the institution, the Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics on Dec. 8, 2025.
- McNamee returns to Baylor after successful stints as President of Waco-based Magnolia, the nationally recognized lifestyle and media company, and most recently as President of the re-imagined Field & Stream, where he led the revitalization of the iconic outdoor brand into a modern, multi-platform media and consumer lifestyle company.
- In his previous stint at Baylor, McNamee was responsible for all major revenue-generating and brand-facing units, including fundraising, marketing, communications and premium ticketing. He also served on the search committee that hired former head football coach Matt Rhule, and he played a key role in the fundraising, planning and opening of McLane Stadium.
- Originally from Lake Jackson, Texas, McNamee earned his bachelor's degree in speech communications from Baylor in 2003. He went on to earn his master's degree in sport management, also from Baylor, in 2005. As a student, McNamee worked for Baylor Baseball, Men's Basketball and Baylor Student-Athlete Services.

NEW SEASON, NEW TEAM

- The Bears went through a roster overhaul this offseason, returning zero players from the past season.
- BU is one of three high-major programs, including Miami and Memphis, with zero returning players. The Bears are additionally one of seven Power-Five teams to return zero points from the 2024-25 season.
- This is the first time in program history Baylor has had zero returning players, losing four out of eligibility, nine to the transfer portal and one to the NBA.
- Baylor's 10 transfers is tied for fourth in the nation with the most transfers joining a team for the upcoming season. BU is one of seven teams in the power-five conferences with double-digit transfers.

- Baylor welcomes new faces to the 2025-26 squad, aiming to replace their five starters off of last year's team, including No. 3 draft pick in VJ Edgecombe. **Drew** and the Bears have recruited a consensus top-25 class, highlighted by McDonald's All-American, **Tounde Yessoufou**, **Andre Iguodala II**, **Mayo Soyoye** and **Maikcol Perez**. Additionally the Bears brought in experienced veteran transfers of **Dan Skillings Jr.** (Cincinnati), **JJ White** (Omaha), **Obi Agbim** (Wyoming), **Michael Rataj** (Oregon State) and **Caden Powell** (Rice), as well as **Isaac Williams IV** (Corpus-Christi), **Juslin Bodo Bodo** (High Point) and **Cameron Carr** (Tennessee).

YESSOUFOU DRAWING EYES IN NON-CONFERENCE SEASON

- Freshman standout **Tounde Yessoufou** had a successful non-conference season to begin his collegiate debut.
- Yessoufou earned three conference honors in the two month span (Big 12 Newcomer of the Week – Dec. 8, Big 12 Starting Five – Dec. 22, Big 12 Starting Five – Dec. 30)
- The freshman averaged 19.3 ppg in the non-con slate, ranking fifth in the nation among true freshman.
- Yessoufou reached double-figures in all 12 games, becoming the first Baylor player in program history to begin their collegiate career with the active streak.
- In the final non-con game against Arlington Baptist, Yessoufou became the first Baylor player in program history to

record a 25-5-5-5 stat line in game and only the second Big 12 player in history to do so with 28 points.

IMPRESSIVE NON-CONFERENCE NUMBERS AT HOME

- Baylor is No. 2 in the country in active non-conference home winning streak, holding strong with 52 straight wins.
- Baylor is 96-4 in its last 100 non-conference home games dating back to Nov. 20, 2013.
- BU's last loss at home to a non-conference team was 12/18/18 against Stephen F. Austin, 59-58.
- Baylor is 172-16 in non-conference home games in the Drew era, including 152-8 since 2007-08.
- Baylor is 109-12 in home games against unranked opponents (including Big 12 play) since 2016.

BREAKING RECORDS IN LAST THREE NON-CON GAMES

- Baylor held nothing back in its final three non-conference games with final scores of 113-56 vs. Alcorn State, 111-67 vs. Southern and 124-61 vs. Arlington Baptist.
- Baylor and Texas A&M are the first teams in the Major Conferences (ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-12 (1996-97 - 2023-24), SEC) to have three consecutive games with 110+ points.

- Baylor has appeared in 15 of 16 postseasons since 2008. Prior to that, Baylor's only postseason berths were in 1946 (NCAA), 1948 (NCAA), 1950 (NCAA), 1987 (NIT), 1988 (NCAA), 1990 (NIT) and 2001 (NIT).

CAM CARR. BUY STOCK NOW.

- Baylor's **Cameron Carr** has had a showstopping start to the season, recording big numbers in every game for the month of November. Carr surpassed his point total from his past two seasons (42) in his first two-and-half games with the Bears.
- Carr has started the season putting up a minimum of 16 points in all seven games this season. Carr is the first Bear since **Tevis Stukes** (1999-2000) to begin the season recording at least 16 points in the first seven games.
- Carr is fifth in the nation and second in the Big 12 in points per game (23.0).
- The Eden Prairie, Minn. native holds a .500 three-point clip which ranks second the Big 12 and 14th in the nation.
- Carr's 161 points this season ranks third in the Big 12 and 54th in the nation.
- Carr leads the team in dunks, showing off with ten dunks through the first seven games with the help of his 7-foot wingspan.

RECORD BREAKING DAY AGAINST ARLINGTON BAPTIST

- Baylor posted a commanding win over Arlington Baptist on Monday afternoon to end its non-conference season, shooting a program-record 73.5-percent from the field and earning the most points in the Scott Drew era, 124-61.
- Baylor held nothing back in its final game of the calendar year, dominating Arlington Baptist with a 63-point marginal victory, ranking tied for fourth in program history. All nine Bears in rotation put points on the board, including two 20-point performances from Tounde Yessoufou and Isaac Williams IV.
- Yessoufou, reigning Big 12 Starting Five honoree, tied his career-best with 28 points along with seven rebounds, six steals and five assists. His six steals tied for 13th in program history. The freshman is the first player in Baylor history to record a 25-5-5-5 game.
- Williams earned his first start of the season and posted 22 points on 9-for-11 buckets, four steals and three rebounds.

SECOND HALF SURGE VERSUS SOUTHERN

- The Bears posted a 71-percent field goal clip in the second half, going 24-of-34 from the field and 12-of-17 from the three to boost 71 points in the final 20 minutes to win 111-67.
- In total, Baylor made 17 buckets from three-point range over Southern. The last time BU sank 17 from far was versus Kansas State in 2021. On the defensive end, BU forced nine turnovers while only committing a season-low of four.
- Freshman all-star Tounde Yessoufou grabbed a career-best 28 points, sinking eight-for-14 and going nearly perfect nine-for-10 at the line, along with snagging eight boards and six assists.
- Behind the freshman was Cameron Carr with 22 points, six assists and six rebounds. Carr has reached double-figures in the first half in an impressive 10 of Baylor's 11 games this season.

57-POINT MARGIN OF VICTORY AGAINST ALCORN STATE

- With the help of the seventh program-best field goal percentage of 64.6, Baylor put up 113 points and tied for 11th in program history, the most points since facing off against Mississippi Valley State (11/07/22). The 57-point margin of victory additionally tied for ninth in program history.
- The contest between the Bears and Alcorn State marked the fourth game this season that the Green and Gold had six players in double-digits with Cameron Carr (24), Isaac Williams IV (21), Michael Rataj (18), Tounde Yessoufou (17), Obi Agbim (14) and Dan Skillings Jr. (12) all earning double-figures.
- Leading the team in rebounds was the Waco native, Caden Powell, who posted a career-high 16 rebounds and earned his 500th career rebound. Agbim also earned his 1,500th career point.
- BU's win against the Braves marks the 50th straight home non-conference win.

67 67 67 67 - SCREAM GAME FUN AGAINST NORFOLK STATE

- With 4,500 of the Bears closest friends, BU earned the Future Bears Day victory over Norfolk State, 97-67.
- When the Spartans hit 67 points in the final minute of the game, the dB level in Foster Pavilion hit 127 dBs. Comparable sounds would be an air raid siren or a firecracker pop.
- The Bears' defense locked down the rim, blocking 10 Spartan shots, the most blocked shots since versus TCU in 2019. Of the 10, four came from **Cameron Carr**, leading the team with a career-high in blocks along with a 9-of-11 stat line from the field.
- Carr is the first Baylor guard player to block four shots in a game, dating back to 1996.
- **Caden Powell** earned a season-high in points along with seven rebounds, two assists and a blocked shot.
- **Obi Agbim** additionally tied his season-high with 18 points, reaching four-from-nine from beyond the arc to tie his season-high in three-pointers made and attempted. The senior also dished out five assists, the most for Agbim since the first game of the season against UTRGV.

BEARS FALL AT MEMPHIS ON THE ROAD

- Baylor fell to Memphis in its first road test of the season at the FedExForum on Saturday afternoon, 78-71.
- Memphis (4-4) held Baylor to under 35-percent from the field and forced 13 turnovers, the most for Baylor (6-2) since facing Tarleton State earlier this season.
- Baylor's **Tounde Yessoufou** put up his third game this season with 20-plus points, finishing with 22 points with an eight-for-15 clip. The true freshman has shot above 50-percent from the field in the last three games for BU.
- **Cameron Carr** continued his double-figure streak with 13 points and a career-best of 10 rebounds on the day,

marking his first double-double of his career. **Isaac Williams IV** brought in valuable minutes off the bench with eight points and four assists.

FEELING 110% AGAINST SACRAMENTO STATE

- Baylor men's basketball earned the Holiday Hoops victory over Sacramento State 110-88 at Foster Pavilion.
- The contest between the Bears and Hornets marked the seventh consecutive game that the Green and Gold had four players in double digits. **Tounde Yessoufou** (27), **Cameron Carr** (25), **Michael Rataj** (18), **Dan Skillings Jr.** (12), **Isaac Williams IV** (11) and **Obi Agbim** (10) all earned double-digit points.
- Marked the first time BU had two 25-point scorers since Jo Lual-Acuil Jr. (31), Manu Lecomte (25) vs. Savannah State (12/17/17).
- BU put up 60 points in the paint which was the most since the Bears earned 66 against John Brown in the 2023-24 season.
- Yessoufou made a career-high with his 27 points and 11 made field goals, while Rataj earned his second double-double with a season-high of 18 points along with 10 rebounds. The Big 12 Starting Five honoree of Carr tied his career-bests in field goals made and attempts, going 10-for-16.
- Skillings Jr. led the team in rebounds with a season high of 14, accomplishing his 500th career rebound and now holding 510 career rebounds.
- The whopping 110 points is the most points made by Baylor since versus MVSU on Nov. 7, 2022.

VEGAS BABY! RECAP

- BU competed in the Players Era Tournament from Nov. 24-26 in Las Vegas, Nev., where the Bears went 2-1.
- The Bears averaged 84.3 ppg in Vegas with a +0.7 scoring margin against opponents. Overall, BU shot a .435 FG-percentage at the Michelob ULTRA Arena in its three games.
- Additionally, BU averaged 43.0 rebounds a game, outrebounding opponents by a dominant 12.7 on the glass.
- Of the total 129 boards, 58 were offensive, averaging 19.3 offensive rebounds a game in Vegas.
- **Cameron Carr** and **Tounde Yessoufou** both put up double-figures in all three games, with Carr averaging 21.7 ppg and Yessoufou 14.7 ppg in Vegas.

WIN OUT IN PLAYERS ERA OVER SAN DIEGO STATE

- Baylor put together an all-around team effort with all seven Bears in rotation securing a bucket, five Bears in double-figures, in its 91-81 win over San Diego State.
- The Bears outrebounded the Aztecs 36-29, including a 10-6 offensive clip. BU shot 53-percent from the floor with the help of a strong second-half from **Obi Agbim** who secured 15 of his 18 points in the final 20 minutes, while going four-from-eight from beyond the arc on the night.
- **Tounde Yessoufou** led the Bears' offensive change with 18 points, shooting an efficient 7-14 from the field while contributing seven rebounds and two assists. **Cameron Carr** added 17 points on 5-11 shooting, while recording six rebounds and three assists.
- **Dan Skillings Jr.** contributed 11 points along with eight rebounds and five steals, showcasing his two-way impact on the game. **Isaac Williams IV** chipped in 13 points off the bench in just 19 minutes.

ST. JOHN'S HANDS FIRST LOSS OF THE SEASON

- Baylor couldn't hold onto its perfect start to the season, falling to 14/15 St. John's 96-81 in the second round of the Players Era Tournament.
- St. John's shot a blistering 57.4% from the field, including 11 of 22 on 3-pointers. Baylor shot a season-low 37.2%, hitting just 29 of 78 from the field. The Bears hadn't finished below 43.1% in any of their first four games.
- **Cameron Carr** led all scorers with 27 points, and **Michael Rataj** had 12 points and 12 rebounds for Baylor. **Tounde Yessoufou** finished with 15 points and nine rebounds, and **Isaac Williams IV** scored 14 off the bench.
- Surprisingly, the Bears dominated the boards in the first half, outrebounding St. John's 25-14, including a whopping 17-3 edge on the offensive glass.

BEARS DOMINATE THE BLUEJAYS ON THE GLASS

- Baylor earned its first win of the week of the Players Era Tournament against Creighton, 81-74.
- Baylor outrebounded Creighton 45-28 on the glass, grabbing 22 offensive rebounds, the most by the Bears against a high-major team since versus Kansas State in 2024.
- As a result, Baylor scored 27 points off of second-chance, the most second-chance points since at Oklahoma in 2023.
- With the help of all five starters of **Cameron Carr** (21 points), **Dan Skillings Jr.** (14 points), **Obi Agbim** (13 points), **Tounde Yessoufou** (11 points) and **Michael Rataj** (10 points), the Bears never trailed against the Bluejays, the first time never trailing in a game since versus Utah (12/31/24).
- It marked the first time all five starters finished in double-figures since versus Sam Houston (11/12/24).

3-0 START WITH WIN AGAINST TARLETON STATE

- Baylor moved to 3-0 on the season with a 94-81 victory over Tarleton State on Friday night at Foster Pavilion.
- The Bears shot an impressive 57.9% from the field, including 40.7% from three, and put five players in double-figures while posting 21 assists on 33 made baskets.
- **Cameron Carr** delivered another standout performance, scoring 27 points on an ultra-efficient 10-for-13 shooting night, adding three made threes, and finishing 6-for-7 at the line.
- **Isaac Williams** provided a major spark from the bench with 16 points, knocking down 6-of-8 from the floor and adding five assists.

GAME 26 — at KANSAS STATE

- **Dan Skillings Jr.** recorded 13 points, 7 rebounds, 5 assists, 2 steals, and a block in a complete two-way performance that helped set Baylor's tempo early.
- Baylor dominated efficiency categories, posting a 68% effective field-goal percentage, winning the paint 42-40, and outscoring Tarleton 17-14 on second-chance points.

BEARS TAME THE HUSKIES

- In their first power-4 test of the season, **Scott Drew's** squad held tough, limiting the Huskies to 41% shooting (28-68) from the floor and 15% beyond the arc (3-20) while forcing 12 turnovers. Washington was led by guard Zoom Diallo (15 points), who scored most of his points on contested mid-range jumpers over the arms of Baylor defenders.
- The bench provided a big lift for the Bears, with **Caden Powell** and **Isaac Williams IV** producing a total of 24 points and 12 rebounds, including a double-double from **Powell**.
- Additionally, six Bears found themselves in double-figures to lead BU to a 78-69 victory at home. It marked the first time since vs. St. John's last season that the Bears had six double-figure scorers.

WORTH THE WAIT FOR BAYLOR DEBUT GAME

- In BU's first official game of the season, Baylor took down UTRGV at Foster Pavilion on Monday night, 86-81.
- The Bears showcased serious depth with four players in double-figures, the first time since vs. Utah (12/31/24) that Baylor had four players score 15+ points.
- Redshirt sophomore **Cameron Carr** had a career-game, earning a career high in points (28), field goals (nine), three-pointers (three), and free throws (seven).
- Fifth-year senior guard **Obi Agbim** (16), senior guard **Dan Skillings Jr.** (15), and freshman guard **Tounde Yessoufou** (24) all earned double-figures in scoring as well in a strong showing for the Green and Gold.

HOT START FOR CAM & TOUNDE

- After only competing in 18 games and averaging just 2.3 points per game over the past two seasons, **Cameron Carr** had his moment, going 9-for-14 (.643) in field goals, three-for-six (.500) in 3FGs with five rebounds and three blocks to end with 28 points on the night.
- Carr's 28 points tied with **Ja'Kobe Walter** (2023) for most points in a Baylor debut game.
- In the true freshman **Tounde Yessoufou's** first collegiate game, he put up 24 points on 10-of-16 (.625) field goals. Despite starting the game 0-for-6, Yessoufou hit his stride and went on a 10-for-10 heater to close out the game.
- Yessoufou is tied for 5th in the nation among true freshman in points and tied for 3rd in made field goals put up in debut games this season.

BEARS LEFT OUT OF AP PRESEASON POLL

- This is only the third time in the last 11 seasons Baylor has been unranked in the preseason AP Top 25.
- Both prior preseason unranked teams went on to win NCAA Tournament games, including the 2016-17 team that received no preseason votes before rising to No. 1 for the first time in program history.
- 2016-17 - started 15-0, reached Sweet 16 (won 27 games)
- 2018-19 - advanced to NCAA Second Round (won 20 games)
- Opening the 2024-25 season, the Bears were ranked No. 8 and had been ranked in the top-10 for a sixth-straight year, one of just four programs (Duke, Gonzaga and Kansas) to accomplish that feat.

BEARS REPRESENT TEAM USA IN GERMANY OVER THE SUMMER

- Over the summer, Baylor represented Team USA in the FISU World University Games, held in Essen, Germany.
- Through eight days of competition, Baylor faced off against six different opponents with players from across the globe. Advancing all the way to the finals, Team USA finished with a silver medal, going 5-1 overseas.
- **Obi Agbim**, who averaged over 20 points in the tournament and scored a high of 30 in the final against Brazil, was named Most Valuable Player and Best Guard.
- Another Bear who earned recognition was **Michael Rataj**, who competed for Team Germany. Rataj was named Best Forward of the tournament, averaging nearly 17 points per game and seven rebounds.
- No international athletes were able to compete for Team USA during the tournament, limiting the full roster.

MID-MAJORS TO THE BIG 12

- Several new faces on the Baylor men's basketball roster bring valuable experience from mid-major programs to the Big 12 stage. Transfers **Obi Agbim** (Wyoming), **Juslin Bodo Bodo** (High Point), **Caden Powell** (Rice), **JJ White** (Omaha) and **Isaac Williams IV** (Corpus-Christi) each began their careers at mid-major schools before coming to BU.
- Together, the five combine for 375 games played and 3,606 points to add to the BU roster.

BEARS VERSUS BAYLOR IN THE PAST

- Before transferring to Baylor, two players have tipped off against their now current team.
- **Dan Skillings Jr.** has matched up against Baylor four times while playing for the Cincinnati Bearcats:
 - On January 13, 2024: Skillings scored 24 points in a 62-59 loss to Baylor, playing 33 minutes on 9-of-14 shooting (including 4-of-6 three-point) and grabbing six rebounds.
 - His 17 points in the second half tied the Foster Pavilion record for most points in a half by an opponent
 - On March 14, 2024 (Big 12 tournament quarterfinal): He scored 15 points for Cincinnati in a 68-56 loss to Baylor in the tournament.
 - On January 8, 2025: He scored 18 points in a 68-48 loss to Baylor, leading Cincinnati in scoring that night.
 - On Feb. 25, 2025: He faced off against BU in Cincinnati, playing for 15 minutes with four points to help guide the Bearcats to a 69-67 win.
- **Michael Rataj** faced off against Baylor on Nov. 22, 2023 in a neutral-site game at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York with the Beavers losing to the Bears 88-72.
 - Rataj played for 18 minutes and had seven rebounds and two points.

NBA LINEAGE

- Baylor has two products of NBA legends on its roster this season with **Cameron Carr** and **Andre Iguodala II**.
- Carr's father, Chris Carr, was selected in the 1995 NBA Draft in the 2nd round (56th overall) by the Phoenix Suns.
- He played six seasons in the NBA, for multiple teams: Phoenix Suns, Minnesota Timberwolves, New Jersey Nets, Golden State Warriors, Chicago Bulls and Boston Celtics.

- Notably: He participated in the 1997 NBA All-Star Weekend Slam Dunk Contest and finished runner-up to Kobe Bryant.
- Iguodala's father, Andre Iguodala, retired from the NBA in October of 2023 after 19 NBA seasons, finishing with four championships and a reputation as one of the most intelligent and impactful role players in league history.
- Iguodala began his career with the Philadelphia 76ers (2004-12), and went on to play for the Denver Nuggets (2012-13), Golden State Warriors (2013-19, 2021-23) and Miami Heat (2020-21).
- Iguodala retired as a 4x NBA Champion with the Warriors, the 2015 NBA Finals MVP, 2012 NBA All-Star, 2x All-Defensive Team Selection (2011, 2014) and Olympic Gold Medalist (Team USA, 2012 London)

BIGGER THAN BASKETBALL FOR TOUNDE

- Baylor freshman **Tounde Yessoufou** is making an impact that reaches well beyond Waco.
- A native of Cotonou, Benin, Yessoufou remains dedicated to supporting his hometown community. He has given back through donations of basketball shoes and equipment, mentorship for young players, and efforts to grow access to the sport in his home country.
- Yessoufou recently built a basketball court in his home village that is now run and operated by his mother.

DREW ADDS RON SANCHEZ TO COACHING STAFF

- **Ron Sanchez** was hired as an associate head coach on May 30, 2025.
- The 29-year coaching veteran joins **Scott Drew's** staff after serving the last two seasons with the Virginia Cavaliers, most recently as interim head coach for the 2024-25 season.
- Sanchez is the third assistant on Drew's staff with head-coaching experience, bringing another unique perspective to the bench.
- Sanchez helped build one of the nation's premier defensive programs and contributed to the Cavaliers' 2019 national championship. He also spent five seasons as the head coach at Charlotte, guiding the 49ers to steady improvement and a postseason title in the 2023 CBI.

WITH THE THIRD PICK OF THE 2025 NBA DRAFT...

- The Big 12 Freshman of the Year, **VJ Edgecombe**, was taken as the third pick in the first round of the 2025 NBA Draft, becoming Baylor's highest draft pick in program history. Selected by the Philadelphia 76ers, Edgecombe became the fifth player from BU to earn a top-10 pick, the previous highest being Ekpe Udoh at No. 6 overall in 2010 by the Golden State Warriors. The Bears are the only program in the country with top-19 picks in each of the last five drafts (**Ja'Kobe Walter** 19th overall to New Orleans, **Keyonte George** 16th overall to Utah, **Jeremy Sochan** 9th overall to San Antonio in 2022 **Davion Mitchell** 9th overall to Sacramento in 2021).
- The Bears have had 14 picks in the last 13 drafts, which is the most in the state of Texas and second-most in the Big 12 since 2012.

BATTLE OF THE DREW BROTHERS

- Baylor went up against GCU on Oct. 10 for a preseason exhibition, coming away with a 79-72 win at Foster Pavilion.
- The scrimmage marked a matchup of brothers Scott and Bryce Drew, with Scott in his 23rd season leading the Baylor program, and Bryce in his sixth season directing the Lopes.
- **Cameron Carr**, **Dan Skillings Jr.**, and **Tounde Yessoufou** each charted double-figure scoring games.
- In a tight game that saw Grand Canyon lead by seven five minutes into the game, the Bears were able to reached a double-digit margin midway through the second half and held on for the win in the first two preseason exhibition games.

BEARS COME UP SHORT IN INDY SHOWDOWN

- Baylor men's basketball narrowly fell short to Indiana at Gainbridge Fieldhouse in Indianapolis, 76-74 in its final exhibition before kicking off the 2025-26 season.
- In its first time returning to Indy since winning the 2021 National Championship, RV/- Baylor shot 40-percent from the field and sank 18-of-24 free throws with four Bears putting up double-digits.
- A strong first half from the Bears put BU up early, but a high of 16 turnovers kept the Bears at bay and unable to hold momentum for RV/- Indiana to take over in the second half and win the contest.

THIRD NATION'S-BEST 35-30 VS. RANKED TEAMS OVER LAST SIX SEASONS

- Baylor is 35-30 against AP Top-25 ranked teams since 2019-2020, the third-best mark in the nation.
- BU is 17-9 at home vs. ranked teams in the last five seasons – wins vs. #12 Arizona (Dec. 2019), #18 Butler (Dec. 2019), #14 West Virginia (Feb. 2020), #9 Kansas (Jan. 2021), #17 Oklahoma State (March 2021), #18 Texas Tech (March 2021), #6 Villanova (Dec. 2021), #20 Texas (Feb. 2022), #5 Kansas (Feb. 2022), #9 Kansas (Feb. 2023), #8 Texas (Feb. 2023), #18 BYU (Jan. 2024), #12 Iowa State (Feb. 2024), #23 Texas Tech, #25 Oklahoma, No. 7 Kansas (March 2024), and No. 11 Kansas (Feb. 2024) and losses by 3 points to #3 Kansas (Feb. 2020) and #19 Texas Tech (Jan. 2022).
- The record includes 18-21 away from home, with neutral wins vs. #17 Villanova (Nov. 2019), vs. #5 Illinois (Nov. 2020), vs. #18 Villanova (March 2021), vs. #10 Arkansas (March 2021), vs. #6 Houston (April 2021), #1 Gonzaga (April 2021), #8 UCLA and #14 Gonzaga, with road wins at #22 Texas Tech (Jan. 2020), at #4 Kansas (Jan. 2020), at #15 Texas Tech (Jan. 2021), at #6 Texas (Feb. 2021), at #6 West Virginia (March 2021), at #8 Iowa State (January 2022), at #21 Texas (Feb. 2022), at #17 TCU (Feb. 2023) and vs. Arkansas (Nov. 2024)

SUCCESS IN TOURNAMENTS

- Baylor is 45-15 in regular-season tournaments during the Drew era, including titles in 4 of the last 6 tournaments.
- BU is 32-7 in its 12 regular-season tournaments since 2013-14, going 1-0, 3-1, 3-1, 3-1, 4-0, 4-0, 3-1, 3-0, 3-0, 1-1, 2-0 and 1-1
- BU advanced to championship games in the 2007 Paradise Jam (won), 2008 76 Classic (lost), 2011 Las Vegas Classic (won), 2013 Maui Invitational (lost), 2014 Las Vegas Invitational (lost), 2016 Battle 4 Atlantis (won), 2017 Hall of Fame Classic (won), 2019 Myrtle Beach Invitational (won), 2021 Battle 4 Atlantis (won), the 2023 Preseason NIT (won) and the Baha Mar Bahamas Championship (Lost)
- Baylor has won seven regular-season tournament titles under Drew – 2023 NIT Season Tip-Off, 2021 Battle 4 Atlantis, 2019 Myrtle Beach Invitational, 2017 Hall of Fame Classic, 2016 Battle 4 Atlantis, 2011 Las Vegas Classic and 2007 Paradise Jam.

POINT GUARDS THRIVE IN DREW'S SYSTEM

- Fifteen of Baylor's 16 starting point guards during the **Scott Drew** era have earned All-Big 12 recognition.
- Baylor's starting point guard has earned All-Big 12 recognition in 18 of 19 seasons since 2004-05.
- VJ Edgecombe (2025), Adam Flagler (2023), James Akinjo (2022), Jared Butler (2019, 2020, 2021), Davion Mitchell (2020, 2021), Makai Mason (2019), Manu Lecomte (2017, 2018), Lester Medford (2016), Kenny Chery (2014, 2015), Pierre Jackson (2012, 2013), Tweety Carter (2010), Curtis Jerrells (2007, 2008, 2009) and Aaron Bruce (2005, 2006, 2007) have earned All-Big 12 recognition.

59 PRO PLAYERS IN DREW ERA

- In Scott Drew's 21 years at Baylor, 59 of his players have gone on to professional careers.
- Nine Bears are currently on NBA rosters (including two-way contracts) – RayJ Dennis (Pacers), VJ Edgecombe (Sixers) Keyonte George (Jazz), Yves Missi (Pelicans), Davion Mitchell (Heat), Royce O'Neale (Suns), Taurean Prince (Bucks), Jeremy Sochan (Spurs) and Ja'Kobe Walter (Raptors).
- In addition to the nine current NBA players, 12 more of Drew's former players have played in the NBA (most recent team) – Quincy Acy (Raptors), Jalen Bridges (Suns), Kendall Brown (Pacers), Jared Butler (Sixers), Freddie Gillespie (Raptors), Pierre Jackson (Mavs), Cory Jefferson (Suns), Perry Jones III (Thunder), Quincy Miller (Kings), Johnathan Motley (Clippers), Ekpe Udoh (Jazz) and Ish Wainright (Portland)
- **Missi** (2025), **Sochan** (2023 & 24) and **George** (2024) have each participated in the Rising Stars Challenge in each of the last three seasons. 2024 was Baylor's first two All-Star Weekend participants.

BAYLOR BASKETBALL ON THE RADIO

- Baylor basketball is aired live via the Baylor Sports Media Network from Playfly on ESPN Central Texas and Flagship station 1660AM/92.3 FM ESPN Radio (KRZI) in Waco and worldwide on Sirius/XM Radio.
- Games are broadcast by the "Voice of the Bears" **John Morris**, who was named NSMA 2019 Texas co-Sportscaster of the Year on Jan. 13, 2020, and Baylor Hall of Famer **Pat Nunley**.
- In early November, **Morris** was awarded the 2024 Chris Schenkel Award by the National Football Foundation
- First presented in 1996, the award recognizes individuals who have had long, distinguished careers broadcasting college football with direct ties to a specific university or platform
- **Morris** is in his 42nd year doing BU broadcasts (31st full-time), and **Nunley** is in his 45th season as analyst.
- A year after his Baylor Hall of Fame induction, **Nunley** was honored by the Baylor Chamber of Commerce with the Frank Fallon Award prior to the season.
- The award, named for Nunley's longtime broadcast partner, Frank Fallon, is presented annually to someone who has made a significant impact on basketball in McLennan County.
- At 30 years together, **Morris** and **Nunley** rank in the top-5 of the longest radio duo's in men's college basketball
- All of Baylor's games can be heard live on the Internet at <https://www.centexsportsfan.com>.

DREW IS THIRD BIG 12 COACH TO REACH 150 CONFERENCE WINS

- **Scott Drew** joined Rick Barnes and Bill Self as the only coaches to reach 150 Big 12 wins on March 4, 2021 vs. OSU.
- Drew needed 136 games over 2,940 days for his first 50 Big 12 wins (50-86), 88 games over 1,821 days for his next 50 Big 12 wins (50-38) and only 77 games over 1,493 days for his next 50 Big 12 wins (50-27).

BIG 12 BALL BUDDY

- Four of the last six national championship games have featured a Big 12 school, including Houston's appearance in the game last season. The run is highlighted by back-to-back national championships by **Baylor** in 2021 and Kansas in 2022. Texas Tech reached the title game in 2019.
- The Big 12 led the nation with a 66.7 winning percentage in the 2025 NCAA Tournament. It was the 11th consecutive tournament to feature at least six Big 12 schools, with the league getting at least seven bids in eight of those seasons.
- The Big 12 has been the top ranked Conference in NET/RPI (prior to 2019) in nine of the past 12 seasons.
- Every Big 12 team had an AP Top 25 win last season, the only league to accomplish the feat.
- The Big 12 has produced a first-round selection in each of the last 26 NBA Drafts.

GRADUATING 91 PERCENT OF SENIORS

- Since **Scott Drew** took over the Baylor Basketball program in 2003, 40 of 44 scholarship players who have played their final years of collegiate eligibility under Drew have graduated from Baylor.
